## SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ No. 10 LSU squares off with Georgia, who is receiving votes in the NFCA Top 25 poll, Thursday in the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals. First pitch is slated for 12:30 p.m. CT with Pam Ward, Michele Smith and Holly Rowe serving as the ESPN U announcing team.
- ▶ LSU finished in fourth place overall in the SEC standings and won the program's conference-leading ninth SEC Western Division title. It was the program's first division crown since 2007.
- ▶ The Tigers won six of their eight SEC series but dropped both of their games with Georgia last weekend in Athens. It marked the first time in program history that LSU has given up double digit runs in back-to-back games.

2013 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU has collected a 40-13 record and a 15-8 mark in SEC play highlighted by a 10-game winning streak (Feb. 13-23) in addition to a nine-game winning streak (March 10-23).
- The Tigers enter the quarterfinal round of the SEC Tournament versus Georgia winners of 12 of their last 18 outings (March 30-May 5) and 22 of their last 30 games (March 10-May 5).
- The back-to-back losses to Georgia (May 3 & 5) marked the first time that LSU has lost consecutive games since the UCLA (Feb. 24) and Oregon (March 1).
- The Tigers have lost nine of their last 10 outings to Georgia dating back to the 2010 season. The Bulldogs scored 10 runs in consecutive games, the first time LSU has allowed this feat.
- The 40 wins for LSU marks the 12th time in program history that the Tigers have accomplished the feat during the regular season. The last time LSU reached 40 regular season victories was during the 2010 season.
- LSU has won six of their eight SEC series and won the program's first SEC Western Division title going back to the 2007 season. The Tigers have won a SEC-leading nine division crowns.
- LSU has picked up 12 wins over ranked opponents which include No. 22 North Carolina (8-0 • Feb. 10), No. 14 Arizona (3-0 • Feb. 23) and No. 14 Michigan (14-6 • March 2) in non-conference play.
- In SEC action, the Tigers swept No. 17 Kentucky (7-1 • March 15; 4-3 • March 16; 3-2 • March 17) and No. 4 Alabama (3-2 • April 25; 2-1 • April 26; 4-3 • April 27). LSU also garnered two wins at No. 10 Texas A&M (9-6 • April 13; 10-2 • April 14) and became the first team in 2013 to shutout No. 12 Missouri (8-0 • April 20).
- The 12 wins for LSU over NFCA Top 25 opponents is the program's best output since the Tigers notched 17 victories over ranked foes during the 2006 campaign.
- LSU's sweep of Alabama marked the first time that the Crimson Tide have lost all three games of a SEC weekend series since the Tigers accomplished the same feat in 2011. Anissa Young was named SEC and USA Softball Player of the Week for her two walkoff extra-inning home runs, while Brittany Mack garnered SEC Pitcher of the Week honors for her two victories.
- As a team, LSU has already passed its 2012 season totals in runs (270 vs. 208), hits (401 vs. 342), home runs (40 vs. 13) and stolen bases (85 vs. 74).
- LSU's offense has turned in a .290 team batting average compared to a .229 hitting clip through 53 games last season.
- The Tigers are averaging 5.1 runs per game compared to a 3.5 runs per game through 53 games last season.
- LSU has already cranked 40 home runs through 53 games which is

more than triple the amount of the team's total from 2012.

- LSU's freshmen trio of Bianka Bell, Kelsi Kloss and Sandra Simmons have accounted for 21 of the team's 40 homers. As a team, the Tigers have six players with three or more longballs.
- LSU has come away with double digit hits on 13 occasions most recently an 11-hit effort at Georgia (May 3).
- LSU collected a season's best 17 hits during a 14-6 victory over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). The 17 hits were the most for LSU since the Tigers posted 18 hits at Arkansas on April 21, 2007.
- After going 197 games without a ground slam dating back to the Arizona State game at the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, the Tigers have already hit a trio of slams this season. The first two came eight games apart versus BYU (Feb. 21) and No. 14 Michigan (March 2) followed by one at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- LSU also went 135 games between having a player connect for two home runs during the same game. Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray accomplished this feat three games apart versus Georgia Southern (March 19) and South Carolina (March 23).
- LSU's pitching staff has tossed 16 shutouts and recorded 338 strikeouts over 362.1 innings pitched. The 338 Ks enter the SEC Tournament rank fifth in the SEC.

FROM THE BATTER'S BOX

- A.J. Andrews, an All-SEC First-Team selection is only player to start in all 53 games and has batted leadoff in every game for the Tigers. She has posted a team-high .359 batting average.
- Andrews is the seventh outfielder in program history to garner All-SEC First-Team honors, the last was former All-American Kirsten Shortridge during the 2009 and 2010 seasons.
- Andrews has registered a team-high 65 hits, good enough for seventh place on the SEC leaderboard. She also has tallied a team-leading 18 multi-hit efforts which includes a pair of two-hit efforts to conclude the Alabama series (April 26 & 27).
- Andrews has collected hits in 14 of her last 18 outings (March 30-May 5). During that run, she has produced a .419 hitting clip (26-for-62) with 20 runs scored and 15 RBIs.
- Andrews has garnered a pair of career-long nine-game hitting streaks (Feb. 21-March 2, March 8-19) during the season. She has registered a hit during 34 of her last 42 games (Feb. 21-May 5) which includes 17 of her 23 SEC contests.
- Andrews has scored a team-high 44 runs and tallied multiple runs on 14 occasions which includes a career-high three runs at Arkansas (April 5) and at McNeese State (April 17). LSU is 25-3 on the season when Andrews scores a run.
- Andrews has gone 19-for-21 in the stolen base department. Her 19 steals are 10th in the SEC rankings. She had a streak of 22 straight steal attempts come to a close earlier this season at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 14).
- Andrews notched a 2-for-3 performance and tied a career-best three RBIs courtesy of a three-run home run during the Georgia

opener (May 3).

- Andrews delivered the game-tying RBI single with two outs during the fifth inning of LSU's series finale with Alabama (April 27).
- With the score tied at 6-6, Andrews provided the go-ahead RBI single on a bunt down the first base line during LSU's three-run eighth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Andrews played a major role as LSU erased a four-run deficit at Arkansas (April 7). She knocked an infield single and scored a run during the team's three-run fifth followed by the game-tying RBI triple with two outs in the sixth inning. Andrews scampered home with the game-winning run after an Arkansas wild pitch.
- With LSU trailing 2-1 in the sixth inning of the Kentucky series finale, Andrews deposited the go-ahead two-run, two out single to right field. She also notched the game-tying hit during LSU's 4-3 comeback win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Andrews garnered a 4-for-4 effort during LSU's 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She also knocked her first career home run, a solo shot, during the 14th inning of the team's SEC opener at Mississippi State (March 8).
- Jacee Blades has started in 49 of LSU's last 50 games, mostly between left field (38) and right field (11). The only game she missed was the Missouri finale (April 21) due to an injury. She also has occupied the two-hole in the lineup 49 times.
- Blades, one of three Tigers to come away with All-SEC Second-Team honors, has compiled a .354 batting average to rank second on the team. Her 57 also are second on the squad and tied for 14th in the SEC.
- The 57 hits for Blades has more than doubled her career total entering her junior season. She has garnered 15 multi-hit efforts to rank third on the team, seven of those performances have come over her last 22 appearances (March 22-May 5).
- Blades had a career-long eight-game hitting streak come to a close in game two versus Georgia Southern (March 8-19). She has hit safely in 32 of her last 42 games (Feb. 21-May 5) which includes 17 of 22 SEC outings.
- Blades has collected a quartet of three-hit performances versus Virginia (Feb. 15), UNLV (Feb. 22), Syracuse (March 1) and South Carolina (March 23).
- Blades became the 32nd player in program history to collect 100 career hits after a 2-for-3 effort during game two of the Alabama series (April 26). She also added the go-ahead, RBI single on a chopper to shortstop with two outs in the fifth inning of the Alabama finale (April 27).
- Blades tacked on a RBI single as part of LSU's three-run eighth inning during a 9-6 win at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Blades provided the game-winning single during LSU's 4-3 nine-inning comeback win over Kentucky (March 16). She also added a RBI single to spark the Tigers to erase a four-run deficit in the series finale at Arkansas (April 7).
- Bianka Bell has started 51 of 53 games between shortstop (46)

- Bell, one of three Tigers named to the All-SEC Second Team, also became the second player in program history to earn SEC Co-Freshman of the Year award. She joins teammate Rachele Fico, who won the honor in 2010.
- Bell has tallied a .357 hitting clip to go along with a team-leading 12 home runs and 47 RBIs. The 12 homers and 47 RBIs are tied for 12th, while the 47 RBIs are tied for 10th in the SEC rankings.
- Over her last 26 games (March 17-May 5), Bell has secured a .407 batting average (33-for-81) to go along with nine home runs and 32 RBIs. She cranked her first career grand slam at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27).
- Bell secured two SEC Freshman of the Week selections (April 1 & April 8). The last time a LSU player won back-to-back SEC weekly awards was Rachele Fico during the 2010 campaign.
- Bell has recorded RBIs in her last 16 of her last 20 games (March 26-May 5) highlighted by a program record run of 12 straight games (March 26-April 17). The previous mark was held by Sara Fitzgerald (Feb. 15-28, 2003) and Stephanie Hill (Feb. 20-28, 2004) with nine consecutive RBI efforts.
- Bell has collected 16 multi-hit games and 56 total hits to rank second and third on the team, respectively. She has hit safely in 17 of her last 20 games (March 26-May 5) which includes nine multi-hit performances.
- Bell has garnered a team-leading 12 multi-RBI efforts, eight of those performances have come during LSU's last 25 games (March 19-May 5).
- Bell recently put together a season's best six-game hitting streak (April 14-25) for the third time on the season. Earlier this season, Bell produced a pair of six-game runs (Feb. 15-22 & March 2-13).

- Bell has hit safely in 17 of 23 SEC outings and registered RBI in 12 league games. She has been involved in 36 percent (38-of-105) of LSU's runs scored during SEC play.
- Bell matched her career-high with three hits during the Georgia opener (May 3) and connected for her team-leading 12th dinger on the first inning.
- Bell's sacrifice fly in the third inning of game two versus No. 4 Alabama (April 26) proved to be the game-winning RBI. She also ripped a two-out, RBI single during LSU's four-run comeback win to wrap up the Arkansas series (April 7).
- Bell added her first career two homer game to open the Georgia Southern doubleheader (March 19) and provided the game-winning RBI double during the third inning of game two. She is the first LSU player since Anissa Young versus Fordham on Feb. 26, 2011 to hit a pair of dingers in the same game.
- Bell cranked a leadoff double to spark LSU's three-run sixth inning against No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which lead to a series sweep.
- Allison Falcon has played in 51 of 53 games and missed both games of the UGA series (May 3 & 5). She has split her starts between second base (41), shortstop (7) and designated player (3).
- Falcon, a 2012 NCAA College Station All-Regional and 2012 NCAA Columbia All-Super Regional pick, is fifth on the team with a .262 batting average and 39 total hits.
- Falcon's five home runs are tied for third on the team. She has driven home 27 RBIs, already passing her season total from 2012. The 27 RBIs also are fourth on the squad.
- Falcon has hit safely in five of her last 10 outings (April 12-27). She is tied for fourth on the team with eight multi-hit efforts and tied for second on the team with seven multi-RBI performances.
- Falcon started the season on a career-long eight-game hitting

streak (Feb. 8-15). She hit a two-run home run in the first inning of LSU's 3-0 win over No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23).

- Falcon notched LSWA Hitter of the Week (March 6) after she turned in four multi-hit efforts at the Diamond 9 Citrus Classic (March 1-3).
- Falcon ripped a two-run homer during the first inning of the Texas A&M finale (April 14). For Falcon, it was her first dinger since the Mississippi State game (March 10).
- Falcon smacked a RBI single with two outs during the first inning of the Missouri finale (April 21).
- Sandra Simmons has started 52 of 53 games at first base and has moved into the No. 5 spot during 15 of LSU's last 18 games (March 30-May 5) after primarily batting in the No. 6 hole.
- Simmons has garnered a .267 batting average, four home runs and 30 RBIs. Her 30 RBIs are third, while her 16 RBIs in SEC play are second on the squad.
- Simmons has hit safely in 21 of her last 32 games (March 8-May 5) which includes nine of her 16 outings (April 3-May 5). Her career-long seven-game run (March 19-27) came to a close during game one of the Samford twinbill.
- Simmons has racked up seven multi-RBI performances, tied with Allison Falcon for third on the squad. She collected three RBIs at Arkansas (April 5), drove home a team-leading four RBIs during the Texas A&M series (April 12-14) and added two critical RBIs versus Alabama (April 25-27).
- Simmons ripped a walkoff RBI single with two outs during the eighth inning to vault LSU to a 3-2 win over No. 4 Alabama in the series opener (April 25). She added a solo homer to right field, also with two outs, to knot the score at 2-2 during the fourth inning of the Alabama series finale (April 27).
- Simmons cranked a two-run double during LSU's 7-1 series opening win over No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She also knocked a two-run homer as part of LSU's 9-2 win over Mississippi State (March 8) during the series finale.
- With the score tied at 6-6 in the seventh inning, Simmons belted a grand slam to vault LSU to a 10-6 triumph over BYU (Feb. 21). It marked LSU's first grand slam since Ashley Langoni and Anissa Young accomplished the feat at No. 9 Arizona State (May 16, 2009) during the 2009 NCAA Tempe Regional, a span of 197 games.
- Rikki Alcaraz has started 28 of LSU's last 38 games (Feb. 22-May 5) and emerged as the primary option at designated player spot. She has racked up an impressive .322 batting average, three home runs and 20 RBIs.
- All 28 of Alcaraz's hits have come during a stretch where she has hit safely in 20 of her last 31 outings (Feb. 15-May 5). Her three-hit efforts versus UNLV (Feb. 23) and in game one against Georgia Southern (March 19) are career-highs.
- Alcaraz belted her first career home run, a two-run shot, in a 14-6 win over No. 14 Michigan (March 2). She added a RBI single to ignite LSU's three-run sixth inning versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 17) which led to a series sweep of the Wildcats.
- Alcaraz has added RBIs in nine of her last 20 appearances (March 16-May 5) and ripped a two-run double at Georgia (May 5). She put together a 2-for-3 performance and capped LSU's 8-0 victory over Missouri (April 20) with a RBI single.
- Kelsi Kloss has made 31 starts between catcher (25) and designated player (6). She has a .275 batting average, five home runs and 24 RBIs. Her five home runs are tied for third on the team.
- Kloss, an All-SEC Freshman-Team pick has found her way to the No. 6 position in eight of LSU's last 11 games (April 13-May 5). 13 of Kloss' 25 hits for the season have tallied RBIs.
- Kloss knocked a solo home run for her first career hit which proved to be the game-winner during LSU's 1-0 win over Purdue (Feb. 8).
- Kloss added a 2-for-5 effort and racked up six RBIs sparked by a 7th inning grand slam in a 14-6 victory over Michigan (March 2). The six RBIs were the most by a LSU player since Vanessa Soto versus Centenary during the 2007 season.
- Kloss provided a RBI single with two outs in the third inning that gave LSU a 3-2 lead during the middle game of the Texas A&M series (April 13).

- LSU picked up its first comeback win of the season and overcame a 2-1 deficit courtesy of three-run frames during the fourth and fifth innings.
- Bianka Bell started the rally with a leadoff single to open the fourth inning. Two batters later, she crossed the plate with the equalizer on a Sandra Simmons RBI double.
- After Tammy Wray walked and Kelsi Kloss added an infield single to load the bases, Katie Guillory lifted a bloop RBI single to right centerfield to push the Tigers ahead by a 3-2 margin. LSU tacked on another run on Lauren Houston bases loaded walk to give the Tigers a two-run cushion.
- Bell added her first career home run, and the Tigers scored two more runs via wild pitches for the 7-2 victory.

**MEMPHIS • FEB. 16 • W, 5-4 WALK-OFF WIN**

- Trailing 4-3 during the seventh inning, LSU put together a rally. The top of the order, A.J. Andrews and Jacee Blades set the table with back-to-back singles with one out.
- After an Allison Falcon popup and with LSU down to its final out, Bianka Bell came up with a clutch RBI single through the right side to even the tally at 4-4. On the throw to the plate, Bell and Blades advanced to second and third base.
- Four pitches later, Blades scampered home with the winning run on a wild pitch which gave LSU a 5-4 walkoff victory.

**VS. UNLV • FEB. 22 • W, 6-1**

- With LSU behind 1-0 in the third inning, Rikki Alcaraz laced a one-out single through the left side. Simone Heyward and Jacee Blades added singles of their own to fill the bases. Alcaraz scooted home with the equalizer on a wild pitch.
- In the next inning, Alcaraz ripped a RBI single with two outs to drive home Tammy Wray to give the Tigers a 2-1 edge.
- LSU tacked on four more runs during the sixth inning after another RBI single from Alcaraz followed RBI hits from Blades and Allison Falcon.

**VS. SYRACUSE • MARCH 1 • W, 7-6**

- LSU had to execute three different comebacks (1-0, 4-2, 6-5) to snatch a 7-6 victory.
- Down 6-5 heading into the bottom of the 6th inning, the Tigers started their final rally as Simone Heyward smacked a one-out double down the right field line followed by an A.J. Andrews walk.
- After Blades reached via a fielder's choice, Falcon lifted a 0-2 offering that fell in for a two-run double in-front of a diving SU right fielder Shirley Daniels.

**VS. MICHIGAN • MARCH 2 • W, 14-6**

- LSU erased an early 2-0 deficit and exploded for six runs while sending 12 batters to the plate.
- Simone Heyward was hit-by-pitch, and Andrews cranked a double into the left centerfield gap to put the tying runs into scoring position.
- Jacee Blades chopped a RBI single that stayed on the infield followed by Falcon's execution of a squeeze bunt to even the tally at 2-2.
- The Tigers surged ahead 4-2 after Bianka Bell and Tammy Wray pieced together consecutive RBI singles.
- Three batters later, Kloss smashed a two-run single through the middle to complete the 6-run outburst and make it 6-2.
- LSU completed the 14-6 triumph as Kloss completed a six RBI game with a grand slam during the 7th inning.

- Kloss came away with a 2-for-2 effort and added a two-run single during LSU's 8-0 victory over No. 12 Missouri (April 20).
- Kloss cranked a two-run homer to straight-away centerfield versus No. 4 Alabama (April 25) during the series opener. The dinger came with two outs in the fourth inning.
- Kloss belted a career-best three hits and cranked a two-run single during the regular season finale at Georgia (May 5).
- Tammy Wray is one of two players to see action in all 53 games, starting 52 contests at third base. She has notched a .191 batting average to go along with a seven homers and 23 RBIs. The seven dingers are second, while the 23 RBIs are sixth on the team.
- Wray has batted in the No. 7 position during LSU's last 31 games (March 9-May 5) and notched a season's best six-game hitting streak (Feb. 16-22) while spending time in the No. 5 slot.
- Wray belted a pair of three-run shots during LSU's wins over No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8) and Ole Miss (Feb. 13) along with a two-run homers versus BYU (Feb. 21), at Mississippi State (March 10) and South Carolina (March 23). She added a solo longball versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Wray's two-homer performance during the South Carolina game was LSU's first against a SEC opponent since Rachel Mitchell versus Arkansas (April 27, 2008) at the original Tiger Park.
- 13 of Wray's 25 hits have produced a RBI which includes a RBI single as part of LSU's seven-run fourth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 14).
- Wray has drawn a team-leading 27 walks which includes 18 free passes over her last 27 outings (March 13-May 5).
- Lauren Houston has checked in with 28 starts at catcher. She is batting .215 with one homer and 8 RBIs on the season. Her lone longball came on a two-run shot at Ole Miss (Feb. 13).
- Houston collected a two-run single to finish off an 8-0 five-inning win versus Georgia Southern (March 19).
- Houston scored a career-best three runs where she reached base on a hit, a walk and a hit batter during LSU's 5-4 comeback win at Florida State (April 3).
- Simone Heyward has started 34 of LSU's last 38 games in the outfield (Feb. 24-May 5). She has picked up all 30 of her hits on the season during that stretch en route to a .345 batting average.
- The .345 hitting clip is Heyward's highest mark of the season and her current five-game hitting streak (April 21-May 5) has tied a career-high.
- Heyward has raised her play in SEC action and connected for a team-leading .365 batting average. 12 of her 15 stolen bases also have come during SEC play which are tied for second place.
- Heyward has notched hits in 19 of those 34 starts (Feb. 24-May 5) highlighted by her first career three-hit performance to open the Kentucky (March 15) and Georgia series' (May 3). She reached base in all four of her plate appearances and scored two runs during LSU's 14-6 win over Michigan (March 2).
- Heyward played a key role in LSU's 5-4 comeback win at Arkansas (April 7). She battled back from a pair of 0-2 counts to draw walks during the fifth and sixth innings. The California native crossed the plate both times which included the game-tying run on A.J. Andrews RBI triple with two outs.
- Heyward has secured hits in eight of her last 11 starts (April 12-May 5) and went 2-for-4 with two runs scored in the middle game at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13). She added her first RBI of the season on a bases loaded walk during the A&M finale (April 14).
- Heyward scored either the game-winning or game-tying run in all three games in the sweep of No. 4 Alabama (April 25-27) and contributed two key outfield assists.
- During the Alabama opener (April 25), Heyward went 2-for-3 at the plate and provided a leadoff single to start the eighth. She crossed the plate on Sandra Simmons' walkoff RBI single.
- In the Alabama series finale (April 27), Heyward pinch ran for Katie Guillory and crossed the plate with the game-tying run on A.J. Andrews' RBI single.
- Heyward replaced Guillory defensively and made her presence felt when she threw out the potential game-tying run at third base with a magnificent one-hop throw from the right field line.

**2013 COMEBACK WINS****KENTUCKY • MARCH 15 • W, 7-1**

- LSU opened the first of three straight comeback victories versus the Wildcats and wiped away an early 1-0 hole with a two-run second and two-run third innings.
- Tammy Wray and Lauren Houston connected back-to-back RBI hits in the second followed by Simmons' two-out double during the third
- The Tigers tacked on three more runs in the fifth inning highlighted by A.J. Andrews two-run double for the 7-1 win.

**KENTUCKY • MARCH 16 • W, 4-3 WALKOFF WIN**

- LSU fell behind 3-2 in the top of the 9th inning after UK's Ansley Smith knocked a solo home run.
- The Tigers started their comeback courtesy of a Tammy Wray single to left field.
- Pinch runner Alex Boulet was inserted into the game. She moved to second base on a Rikki Alcaraz sacrifice bunt and scooted over to third on a wild pitch. Simone Heyward followed with a five-pitch walk and stole second base.

- Boulet has crossed the plate in 10 of her last 18 pinch running efforts (Feb. 15-April 25). She represented the game's tying run and scored on A.J. Andrews' squeeze bunt in the ninth inning of the middle game versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 16).
- Boulet crossed the plate with the game-winning run on another Andrews RBI bunt single during the eighth inning at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13).
- Over her career, Boulet has scored 33 times as a pinch runners and has collected 37 stolen bases.
- Alayna Falcon has made five pinch hitting appearances on the season. She has provided hits in her last two efforts versus Southeastern Louisiana (March 26) and Samford (March 30).
- Katie Guillory has collected 17 appearances and started in 11 games at right field. She has totaled a .242 batting average, one home run and 4 RBIs.
- Guillory has already doubled her career hit total and connected for her first career longball versus North Dakota State (Feb. 15).
- Guillory legged out an infield single with two outs to spark a two-run fifth inning rally versus No. 4 Alabama (April 27) on Senior Day.
- Kailey McCasland has made 17 appearances which includes 11 starts mostly at designated player spot. She has drawn 11 walks en route to a .390 on-base percentage.

- In SEC action, Fico turned in a 11-6 mark, 2.27 ERA and amassed 94 strikeouts over her 104.2 frames of action. All three of those feats are among the SEC's Top 4.
- Fico was the No. 1 overall pick by the Akron Racers during the 2013 NPF College Draft (April 1). It marked the second straight season that LSU has had the league's No. 1 pick - Brittany Mack (2012).
- Fico has already tossed 10 shutouts which are tied for eighth nationally - No. 22 North Carolina (Feb. 8), Tulsa (Feb. 9), North Dakota State (Feb. 15), Virginia (Feb. 16), Ohio State (Feb. 22), No. 14 Arizona (Feb. 23), Mississippi State (March 10), Georgia Southern (March 19), South Carolina (March 22) and Samford (March 30).
- Fico collected her second career no-hitter during the Ohio State game, her only other no-hitter was five-inning perfect game versus Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 15, 2011).
- Fico become the fourth pitcher in program history to surpass 700 career strikeouts during the series opener versus No. 17 Kentucky (March 15). She joins the illustrious company of former All-Americans Britni Sneed (1999-2002), Kristin Schmidt (2002-04) and Emily Turner (2004-07).
- Fico currently has totaled 780 Ks and has already passed former All-Americans Brittany Mack (2009-12) and Emily Turner (2004-07) along with Dani Hofer (2006-09) on the program's strikeout list during the 2013 season. She recently passed Turner during the series opener at Georgia (May 3).

- Fico turned in a memorable performance and notched a program single-game record with 22 strikeouts versus Mississippi State (March 10). The 22 Ks also equaled former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott's SEC single-game mark and enabled Fico to notch her second SEC Pitcher of the Week award of the season.
- Fico claimed her 69th career victory, a two-hit shutout of Georgia Southern (March 19), to move past Ashley Lewis (1999-2001) for fourth place on LSU's all-time list.
- Fico rebounded from back-to-back losses to South Carolina (March 24) and at No. 25 South Alabama (March 27) with a two-hit shutout of Samford (March 30). The seven runs allowed by Fico during the South Alabama game was the second-most this season only behind a career-high nine runs versus No. 10 Oregon (March 1).
- Fico joined fellow All-American Britni Sneed along with Ashley Lewis as the only three pitchers in program history to notch a trio of 20-win seasons during their careers.
- Fico added a pair of wins at No. 10 Texas A&M (April 13 & 14). She retired six of the seven batters she faced fueled by four strikeouts in her two innings of relief during the middle game.
- Fico returned to form after consecutive setbacks to No. 12 Missouri (April 19 & 21) and won both of her outings against No. 4 Alabama (April 25 & 27) to earn National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) National Pitcher of the Week.
- Fico became the sixth pitcher since 2008 to notch a pair of complete-game wins in a single series versus Alabama. The other five are fellow LSU All-American Brittany Mack in addition to Arizona State's Katie Burkhart, Kentucky's Kelsey Nunley, Missouri's Chelsea Thomas and Michigan's Jordan Taylor.
- Fico is the sixth LSU player to earn this prestigious national award. The senior right-hander joins Rachel Mitchell (March 24, 2009) along with fellow All-Americans Trena Peel (March 27, 2002), Britni Sneed (April 24, 2002), Kristin Schmidt (March 3, 2004) and Emily Turner (May 2, 2007) of Tiger players to accomplish this feat.
- Fico set the tone early and retired 18 of the first 21 Crimson Tide batters she faced in the series opener (April 25). She left the bases loaded in both the seventh and eighth innings which allowed Sandra Simmons to belt a walkoff RBI single with two outs.
- In her Senior Day start (April 27), Fico grinded out another complete game effort and retired the final four batters she faced sparked by two strikeouts to lock up a share of LSU's first SEC Western Division title since 2007.
- Two of the four Alabama hitters she retired were Kayla Braud and Haylie McCleney, a pair of USA Softball Top 25 Player of the Year award finalists, to secure the 4-3 triumph.
- In her lone start at Georgia (May 3), Fico was tagged for eight runs over 2.1 innings of work.
- Meghan Patterson has posted a 6-2 mark with a staff-low 1.73 ERA. She tossed a pair of complete game shutouts, a three-hitter versus Purdue (Feb. 8) along with a four-hitter against Nicholls State (Feb. 17).
- In her last start, Patterson fired a complete game effort at McNeese State (April 17). She sat down 11 of the last 13 batters she faced and limited the Cowgirls to one run on three hits.
- Patterson came away with seven strikeouts and threw 6.2 frames of four-hit ball against Southeastern Louisiana (March 26).
- Patterson recorded a season's best eight Ks versus Nicholls State (Feb. 17) and Georgia Southern (March 19). She has been LSU's Saturday starter during two of the first three SEC weekends.

**GEORGIA 10, NO. 8 LSU 7 • 05/03**

**ATHENS, Ga.** - Bianka Bell and Simone Heyward posted a pair of three-hit efforts to equal career-highs, but the No. 8 LSU softball team was unable to overcome an eight-run third inning as Georgia claimed a 10-7 decision at Jack Turner Stadium.

The Tigers (40-12, 15-7 SEC) nearly erased a seven-run deficit and sent the tying run to the plate during the sixth inning. Georgia (36-18, 13-9 SEC) has won eight of its last nine meetings with LSU since 2009.

A.J. Andrews turned in a 2-for-3 performance highlighted by a three-run homer, while Sandra Simmons added a 2-for-4 effort and a RBI for the Tigers. In the circle, Meghan Patterson turned in a strong relief outing and allowed two runs on four hits over 3.2 innings. She tallied one strikeout against one walk.

The Bulldogs were led by Paige Wilson's two solo home runs, Christine Olney's three-run double and Niaja Griffin's two-run triple. UGA also received RBIs from Tina Iosefa, Kaylee Puaialoa and Anna Swafford.

"I was proud of our offensive effort," head coach Beth Torina said. "They were fantastic and fought back after their big inning. I thought that took a lot of heart and guts from our offense. It's nice seeing the slappers and the middle of the lineup continuing to do so well. Meghan came in under difficult circumstances and gave us a great effort. She did what we needed her to do. She fought hard for us and threw some great pitches."

LSU grabbed a 2-0 advantage during the first inning. Andrews coaxed a leadoff walk and advanced to second base on a passed ball. Two batters later, Bell blasted her team-leading 12th home run of the season over the left centerfield wall.

The Bulldogs cut the LSU lead down to 2-1 as Wilson connected for a solo shot of her own in the home half of the inning.

UGA put together an eight-run frame and grabbed a 9-2 advantage in the third inning. The Bulldogs filled the bases and got the equalizer after Iosefa was plunked. Puaialoa followed with a RBI single through the middle to give Georgia a 3-2 edge.

The Bulldogs cleared the bases and pushed their lead to 6-2 on a three-run double courtesy of Olney into the right centerfield gap. Two batters later, Griffin tacked on a two-run triple and Swafford capped the eight-run inning with a RBI groundout to make it 9-2.

LSU chipped away at the deficit and pulled back to 9-3 during the fourth inning. Lauren Houston opened the stanza by getting hit-by-a-pitch. After a Heyward double moved Houston into scoring position, she crossed the plate on a Jacee Blades infield single.

The Tigers continued to rally with a four-run sixth inning. Tammy Wray reached on a UGA fielding error, and Heyward added a bunt single to set the table for Andrews, who cranked a three-run bomb on a 1-1 offering to draw LSU to within 9-6.

Bell slapped her third hit of the contest, a single through the middle. She scampered home on Simmons' RBI triple that appeared to clear the left centerfield wall and bounce back into the field of play. With the tying run at the plate, Kells Kloss hit a hard ground ball to second base for the third out of the inning.

Wilson cranked her second dinger of the game over the scoreboard in left field with one out in the seventh inning for the final margin of 10-7.

Rachele Fico, the reigning NFCA National Player of the Week, was issued the loss and dropped to 24-10 on the season. The senior right-hander was tagged for eight runs on five hits. She tacked on three strikeouts versus three walks.

UGA's Chelsea Wilkinson picked up the victory to improve her season's ledger to 7-4. She tossed 5.1 innings and gave up six runs, five earned, on nine hits. She totaled two strikeouts against three walks. The Bulldogs turned to Morgan Montemayor for the final five outs. She notched her second save sparked by two Ks and surrendered an unearned run on two hits.

"Rachele didn't have very good location," Torina said. "When doesn't have that, she's typically not very successful on the mound. We have to make a few adjustments with our pitching staff and figure out a way to get their hitters out. We can still be successful in this series if we get the pitching we're capable of to get with the great offense and defense we played tonight."

**ATHENS, Ga.** — The No. 8 LSU softball team was handed a 10-5 defeat by Georgia behind the Bulldogs seven-run rally in the sixth inning during the regular season finale for both teams as 1,202 fans gathered at Jack Turner Stadium.

Kelsi Kloss turned in a 3-for-4 performance with two RBIs to fuel the Tigers, the three hits for Kloss were a career-high. Bianka Bell added a 2-for-3 effort and scored two runs. For Bell, it was her 16th multi-hit game of the season. Sandra Simmons tacked on a RBI, while Rikki Alcaraz ripped a two-run double.

Ashley Czechner was tagged with her first loss of the season and fell to 10-1. She was touched up a career-best 10 runs, nine earned, on 10 hits. She registered two strikeouts against one walk.

Georgia was led by Paige Wilson's 3-for-4 performance and four RBIs. She belted a three-run homer followed by a Geri Ann Glasco solo shot to cap the Bulldogs seven-run sixth inning.

"It's tough for our team to have to go on the road the week before their final exams," head coach Beth Torina said. "Overall, I think it takes a toll on our team because they are spread in a lot of different directions. That's not taking anything away from Georgia, they are a quality program. They do a great job with their offense and are difficult outs up-and-down their lineup."

The Bulldogs ran out to a 2-0 advantage in the second inning. With runners on the corners and two outs, Anna Swafford attempted to steal second base. Her slide on the tag attempt by Bell jarred the ball loose and enabled Niaja Griffin to cross the plate with the game's first run. Wilson followed with a RBI double off the right field wall to make it 2-0.

LSU fired back with two runs of its own in the fourth inning. Bell opened the frame and reached base on a fielding error by the UGA second baseman. Two batters later, Kloss knocked a single into centerfield. Both runners were able to score as Alcaraz laced a 1-2 offering for a two-run double into the left centerfield gap to knot the score at 2-2.

The Tigers added three more runs during the fifth inning. Simone Heyward chopped a single into centerfield and advanced to second base as A.J. Andrews reached on another fielding miscue by the UGA second baseman.

A Jacee Blades ground out moved both runners into scoring position. Bell was issued a walk, and Simmons was hit-by-a-pitch to give LSU a 3-2 edge. Kloss smacked a two-run single to left field to extend the lead to 5-2.

Georgia got back to within 5-3 on a Swafford solo home run down the left field line to open up the home half of the fifth inning.

The Bulldogs sent 10 batters to the plate and exploded for seven runs during the sixth inning. LSU thought it had the frame's second out at third base, but an interference call on Alcaraz at second base for running into pinch runner Samantha LaZear put runners on the corners.

Katie Browne connected for a two-run double that knotted the score at 5-5 and found a spot on the grass past a diving Blades and Andrews in the left centerfield gap.

Griffin legged out an infield single to place runners on the corners. Swafford notched the go-ahead RBI on a fielding error by LSU third baseman Tammy Wray. Wilson and Glasco cranked back-to-back dingers to straight-away centerfield for the final margin of 10-5.

"Our defense wasn't as solid today as it usually is," Torina said. "It's hard to play perfect defense all the time because Georgia's offense hits the ball extremely hard and makes you cover the entire field. Ashley did a good job overall and kept them off-balanced for several innings. She just couldn't finish it and got a couple of tough breaks. I think it's tough for any pitcher to finish it against that type of offense."

LSU put together a threat in the seventh inning as the Tigers loaded the bases. However, pinch hitter Hailey Smith grounded out for the game's final out.

UGA's Morgan Montemayor fired two innings of three-hit ball in relief to tally the victory and improve to 12-6 on the season. Glasco went the first five innings for the Bulldogs in the circle and surrendered five runs, three earned, on six hits. She picked up four strikeouts versus one walk.
