ABOUT THE GAME

- ▶ No. 20 TCU opens the 2013 season Saturday at 8 p.m. CDT when it faces No. 12 LSU in the Cowboys Classic at AT&T Stadium.
- ▶ The Horned Frogs are opening in the Cowboys Classic for the second time in the last four seasons. In its first Cowboys Classic appearance in 2010, TCU defeated Oregon State 30-21 en route to a 13-0 campaign and Rose Bowl championship.
- ▶ TCU's last win over LSU was a 3-2 decision in the 1936 Sugar Bowl, giving the Horned Frogs their first national championship.
- ▶ TCU is facing an SEC opponent for the first time since a 30-14 win over Vanderbilt on Sept. 20, 2003.
- ▶ As TCU's head coach, Patterson is 14-10 against ranked teams and 1-0 versus SEC opponents.

SERIES NOTES

- ▶ LSU holds a 5-2-1 series lead over TCU.
- ▶ The Horned Frogs and Tigers are meeting for the first time since a 10-7 LSU win on Oct. 26, 1968 in Baton Rouge, La.
- ▶ TCU is 1-0 versus LSU in Fort Worth, 0-5-1 in Baton Rouge and 1-0 at neutral sites (1936 Sugar Bowl).
- ▶ LSU has won the last five meetings with each contest taking place in Baton Rouge.

SEASON OPENERS

- ▶ TCU is opening away from home for the 10th time in Gary Patterson's 13 seasons as head coach.
- ▶ TCU is 9-3 in season debuts under Patterson and 69-38-9 overall in openers.
- ▶ The Horned Frogs have won nine of their last 10 season openers, including victories over No. 5 Oklahoma in 2005 and No. 22 Oregon State in 2010.
- ▶ No. 12 LSU represents the highest-ranked opponent TCU has played in a season opener since a 17-10 win at No. 5 Oklahoma in 2005.

LOUISIANA CONNECTIONS

- ▶ Four of TCU's five Louisiana natives are on the defensive line with three from West Monroe.
- ▶ Defensive tackles Chucky Hunter and Terrell Lathan and defensive end James McFarland are

West Monroe High School graduates. Also hailing from Louisiana are a pair of true freshmen in safety Jermaine Antoine (Loreauville) and defensive tackle Tevin Lawson (Denham Springs).

- ▶ Hunter, a junior, was an All-Big 12 selection last season, while Lathan and McFarland lettered in reserve roles as true freshmen in 2012.

TCU AT AT&T STADIUM

- ▶ TCU is making its third appearance in the last four seasons at AT&T Stadium (formerly Cowboys Stadium).
- ▶ In addition to a 30-21 Cowboys Classic win over Oregon State in 2010, TCU defeated BYU 38-28 in 2011.

FASHION STATEMENT

- ▶ TCU will be wearing a new Nike uniform on Saturday.
- ▶ The Horned Frogs have a three-game winning streak when debuting a new Nike uniform for a specific game. TCU defeated Utah in 2009 before a season-opening win over Oregon State and a Rose Bowl victory versus Wisconsin in the 2010 campaign.

TCU NOTABLES

- ▶ The Horned Frogs have just 10 scholarship seniors on this year's roster.
- ▶ TCU was picked third in the preseason Big 12 poll. The Horned Frogs received nine first-place votes and were just 18 points behind preseason favorite Oklahoma State.
- ▶ TCU returns eight starters from a defense last season that led the Big 12 in six categories and ranked 16th nationally, despite having faced five of the nation's top-13 offenses.
- ▶ TCU tied Texas for the national lead last season by playing 16 true freshmen.
- ▶ The Horned Frogs tied LSU and North Carolina for the most combined true and redshirt freshmen (28) to play in 2012.
- ▶ Nearly 70 percent of players who saw action for TCU last season were freshmen or sophomores.

CREDENTIAL PICK UP

Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game at the TCU Media Relations Office located in Daniel-Meyer Coliseum Room 104. Thereafter, credentials may be picked up on game day at Media Will Call located in the ticket booth situated between Gates 2 and 3 at the southwest entrance of Amon G. Carter Stadium.

HOME SWEET HOME

▶ The \$164 million rebuild of Amon G. Carter Stadium, completed in 2012, was funded entirely by donor support. The new stadium features a seating capacity of 45,000.

▶ The six Founders' Club suites, located at midfield on the concourse level, were sold at \$15 million each to provide lead gifts totaling \$90 million.

▶ There are 25 suites, all sold, on the west side. One of those suites is located on the Champions level, next to the television booth.

▶ The press box has 132 seats to accommodate media.

▶ In August 2013, Yahoo! Sports ranked Amon G. Carter Stadium as the best stadium in the Big 12.

FROG FEVER

▶ TCU had five sellouts in six home games last season and has sold out 13 of its last 14 dates, and 15 of the past 20, at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

▶ For the second straight year, TCU sold out of its football season tickets and has a waiting list. This year's record number of season tickets sold is 31,425.

▶ TCU has set a school record for season ticket sales in each of the last four years.

▶ Three of the top-five home crowds in TCU history came last season. The 47,894 for Texas Tech ranked second, the 47,501 for Oklahoma was third and the 47,292 for Kansas State placed fifth. The top mark is 50,307 versus Utah in 2009.

▶ Nearly 35,000 TCU fans traveled to the 2011 Rose Bowl. Over 20,000 made the trip the previous year to the Fiesta Bowl.

TCU QUICK HITS

▶ The Frogs have finished in the top 25 in six of the last eight seasons.

▶ TCU is the only school in the nation to win at least 11 games in six of the last eight seasons.

▶ TCU is one of eight teams (Alabama, Florida, Ohio State, Oregon, Virginia Tech, Stanford, Wisconsin) to play in a BCS game two of the last four seasons.

▶ TCU is 4-2 in its last six games against opponents ranked in the top five.

▶ Since 2008, the Horned Frogs' 54 wins (54-9) trail only Alabama (60-7), Boise State (60-5) and Oregon (56-9).

▶ TCU has won 45 of its last 54 games and is 57-11 in its last 68 contests.

ST. LOUIS CARDINAL FACTOR

▶ Only St. Louis Cardinals pitcher Shelby Miller can say he's been a teammate of both TCU quarterback Casey Pachall and former Horned Frog and current Cardinals' All-Star second baseman Matt Carpenter.

▶ Miller and Pachall were friends growing up in Brownwood, Texas. On their seventh grade football team, Pachall was the tight end with Miller at quarterback.

▶ Miller and Pachall were later teammates on the baseball diamond at Brownwood High School. While Miller was impressing enough on the mound to be a first-round Cardinals' draft pick in 2009, Pachall was flashing the leather at third base.

IN THE HOUSE

▶ Former TCU linebacker and current Arizona Cardinal Pro Bowler Daryl Washington will be at AT&T Stadium on Saturday to support his alma mater.

► Pachall completed 66.0 percent (64-of-97) of his pass attempts for 948 yards with 10 touchdowns and just one interception last season.

► From 2009-11, TCU was the only school in the nation to have two different quarterbacks rank in the top 12 in passing efficiency.

► Pachall, who was fifth in the nation with a 180.0 rating when his season came to a close last year, was 12th in 2011 with a 158.0 mark. Andy Dalton finished fifth (166.5) in 2010 and eighth (151.8) as a junior in 2009.

THE 300 CLUB

► With 305 yards versus Virginia, Casey Pachall became the first Horned Frog to pass for 300 or more yards in consecutive games since Casey Printers in 2001 versus East Carolina (319) and UAB (310).

► Pachall's four career 300-yard games rank second all-time at TCU behind only Andy Dalton (5, 2007-10).

► Pachall is tied with Dalton (2007, 2008), Printers (2001), Matt Vogler (1990) and Steve Stamp (1981) for the most 300-yard games in a season with two.

PACHALL ON TARGET

► Beginning with his final two passes in the 2011 Poinsettia Bowl and extending through his first five attempts at Kansas, Casey Pachall set a TCU record with 16 consecutive completions over a three-game stretch.

► Pachall broke the previous Frog mark of 14 by Jeff Ballard (2006).

► Pachall was the last starting quarterback in the nation to have an incomplete pass attempt in 2012. His first incompleteness, on his 15th pass, came in the second quarter at Kansas (Sept. 15) during the season's third week. TCU had an open date the opening week of the season.

► Pachall set TCU single-season records in 2011 for completion percentage (66.5), passing yards (2,921) and completions (228).

TOSSING FOR SIX

► Casey Pachall passed for at least two touchdowns in each of his four games last season with a pair of three-score games.

► Pachall has a touchdown pass in 14 of his 17 career starts with multiple scoring tosses in 12 of those contests.

RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCE

► TCU quarterbacks Casey Pachall and Trevone Boykin combined for 17-of-17 passing in last year's season opener against Grambling State, an NCAA FBS record for most team attempts without an incompleteness. The previous mark was Iowa going 12-of-12 against Northwestern on Nov. 9, 2002.

► The Horned Frogs also set an NCAA record that night for completion percentage (100.0) with a minimum of 15 team attempts.

► Pachall was 9-of-9 for 201 yards and three touchdowns in first-half action, while Trevone Boykin went 8-of-8 for 75 yards and a score.

ROAD SAVVY

► Trevone Boykin was 3-1 as a starting quarterback on the road in the Big 12. Boykin had wins at Baylor, West Virginia and Texas.

FROG OFFENSIVE NOTES

▶ Boykin had a team-best and career-high 77 yards rushing on 10 carries in the 20-13 victory at Texas. He also completed 7-of-9 passes for 82 yards.

▶ With the victory at Baylor, Boykin became TCU's first quarterback to win his first start on the road since Jeff Ballard at Wyoming in 2005 (28-14).

HISTORY MADE

▶ In just his third collegiate start, Trevone Boykin became the only quarterback in TCU history with four touchdown passes in back-to-back games with his performances versus Baylor and Texas Tech.

▶ Boykin also threw for a career-high 332 yards against the Red Raiders.

▶ The four touchdown passes versus Baylor and Texas Tech tied for fifth most in a game at TCU. During the Gary Patterson era, Boykin's four scoring tosses trailed only Casey Pachall's five against Boise State in 2011 and Jeff Ballard's five versus San Diego State in 2006.

CLUTCH PLAY

▶ Trevone Boykin showed a penchant for coming through in the clutch last season.

▶ The Horned Frogs trailed West Virginia by 10 points in the second half. After pulling TCU even, Boykin had to rally his team again with a 94-yard touchdown pass to Josh Boyce with 1:28 remaining to force overtime.

▶ With TCU down 36-26 and just 4:01 to play against Texas Tech, Boykin completed 7-of-9 passes for 122 yards, including a 60-yard touchdown to LaDarius Brown on a third-and-20, in leading the Horned Frogs on a pair of scoring drives to force overtime.

▶ Boykin was 13-of-13 on third-down pass attempts against Baylor with 11 of his completions going for first downs.

▶ All four of Boykin's touchdown passes at Baylor were on third-down throws.

SIDELINED, BUT NOW BACK

▶ Waymon James, TCU's leading rusher with 875 yards in 2011, suffered a season-ending injury in the Sept. 15 win at Kansas.

▶ James was averaging 9.9 yards per carry in leading TCU with 168 yards rushing in the opening two games of the 2012 campaign.

IT'S A RUSH

▶ TCU is 63-3 in its last 66 games when rushing for at least 167 yards.

▶ The Horned Frogs are 64-3 under Gary Patterson when rushing for at least 200 yards.

STEPPING UP

▶ As a true freshman last season, B.J. Catalon topped TCU in rushing with 582 yards and was fifth in receiving with 23 catches. He led TCU in rushing in six of the last nine games.

▶ Catalon's 582 yards rushing were the most by a TCU true freshman since Aaron Brown ran for 758 in 2005.

▶ Catalon became the first freshman to lead TCU in rushing since Robert Merrill with 1,107 yards in 2003.

▶ Prior to Catalon, the last true freshman to top TCU in rushing was Lonta Hobbs with 1,029 yards in 2002.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT

▶ LaDarius Brown ranked second among freshmen nationally last season with a TD catch every 5.4 receptions (minimum 25 catches):

▶ Brown had a career-best seven receptions for 67 yards, including an 18-yard touchdown, at Oklahoma State.

CARTER AND THE CENTURY MARK

▶ With eight receptions for 141 yards at Kansas and five catches for 128 yards against Virginia, Brandon Carter became the first Horned Frog since Cory Rodgers in 2004 to have consecutive 100-yard receiving games.

▶ Carter's 80-yard touchdown reception versus Oklahoma marked the longest play of his career, bettering a 75-yard scoring catch at Boise State in 2011.

YOUTH IS SERVED

▶ TCU has no seniors among the 11 wide receivers who appear on the team's depth chart. The group is comprised of four juniors, five sophomores and two freshmen.

▶ The first-team offensive line features four sophomores and senior Eric Tausch.

▶ Fifteen of 20 players to start on offense last season had 14 or fewer career starts.

FROG DEFENSIVE NOTES

A TCU TRADITION

▶ Since the NCAA began tracking statistics in 1937, TCU only trails Alabama for the most times leading the nation in total defense. The Crimson Tide have been No. 1 six times, while all five No. 1 rankings for the Frogs are in the last 12 seasons.

▶ In 2010, TCU became just the third program in NCAA history to top the nation in total defense in three consecutive seasons (2008-10). The others are Toledo (1969-71) and Oklahoma (1985-87).

▶ TCU topped the Big 12 while ranking in the top-16 nationally in six major defensive categories:

▶ TCU's top-ranked defense in the Big 12 was 43.4 yards ahead of runner-up Texas Tech (367.3).

▶ The Horned Frogs' No. 16 national ranking in total defense came despite facing five of the nation's top-13 offenses in Baylor (2), Oklahoma State (4), West Virginia (10), Oklahoma (12) and Texas Tech (13).

SHUTTING THEM DOWN

▶ Six of TCU's opponents in 2012 had a season low in scoring against the Horned Frogs: Grambling State (0), Kansas (6), Virginia (7), Baylor (21), Kansas State (23) and Texas (13).

▶ Since 2010, TCU is tied for second nationally for most games holding an opponent to less than 10 points:

▶ TCU was second in the Big 12 in scoring defense at 22.6 points per game, trailing only Kansas State (22.1). The Horned Frogs would be No. 1 at 20.5 if not counting the 27 points scored by opponents in overtime games.

▶ TCU's 21 interceptions were its most in a season since a nation's-best 26 in 2005. The Horned Frogs had just 10 interceptions in 2011 and 12 in their 2010 Rose Bowl campaign.

YOUNG FACES

▶ Even with eight starters returning, TCU has just has three seniors (Jon Koontz, Elisha Olabode, Jason Verrett) in first-team positions on its depth chart.

▶ Eight of 11 defensive starters in 2012 had 14 or fewer career starts.

▶ Linebacker Kenny Cain was the lone senior on the depth chart for the TCU defense last season.

▶ TCU's defense forced several opponents into uncharacteristic performances in 2012:

▶ **Grambling State** - Had season-low totals in offense (70 yards) and passing (26 yards).

▶ **Kansas** - TCU was the only team to hold KU to under 150 yards rushing (77) in a game.

▶ **Virginia** - The 189 passing yards marked UVA's second-lowest total of the season.

▶ **SMU** - Had a season low in rushing yards (30) against TCU ... six of 21 turnovers in 2012 came against the Horned Frogs.

▶ **Baylor** - Held to a season-low in rushing offense (106) and the second-lowest total offense (432; lowest was 424 against OU) of the season ... threw a season-high four interceptions and allowed a season-high four sacks.

▶ **Texas Tech** - Punted a season-high eight times.

▶ **Kansas State** - Held K-State to a season-low 260 yards ... three sacks were most allowed by K-State.

▶ **Texas** - Produced its second-lowest outputs for rushing (86), passing (214) and total offense (300) ... only team to not allow a TD pass against UT ... four of Texas' 15 turnovers came against TCU.

► **Michigan State** – Season lows in first downs (13), passing offense (104) and total offense (227).

IMPRESSIVE YOUTH

► Despite its youth with just one senior on its depth chart and moving into the Big 12 where five of the nation's top-13 offenses were located, TCU's defense improved in 2012 over its 2011 effort.

► The Frogs allowed just 323.9 yards per game compared to 347.4 in 2011.

TAKING ADVANTAGE

► TCU's 121 points off its 32 takeaways ranked fourth nationally for teams in BCS automatic-qualifying conferences.

► TCU trailed only Oregon (171), Alabama (155) and Kansas State (128).

PRESSURING THE QB

► TCU was third in the Big 12 with 2.2 sacks per game, trailing only Texas (2.7) and Kansas State (2.5).

► Nine Horned Frogs combined for TCU's 29 sacks.

► TCU had a sack in all but two games last season and at least three sacks in eight contests.

VERRETT ISLAND

► Walter Camp All-American Jason Verrett topped the Big 12 in interceptions (6) and passes defended (22) and was the only player in the nation to rank in the top 10 in both categories.

► Verrett tied for second nationally at 1.69 passes defended per game.

► Verrett tied for sixth in the nation in interceptions at 0.46 per game. His six picks were the most by a Frog since Jason Goss had eight in 2002.

► Verrett's team-high 16 pass breakups were the most by a Horned Frog since Goss had 24 in 2002.

► Verrett's seven career interceptions are tied for 11th nationally among active players.

FRESHMAN SENSATION

► As a true freshman in 2012, defensive end Devonte Fields was the Associated Press Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and the consensus National Defensive Freshman of the Year.

► Fields topped the Big 12 in tackles for loss (18 1/2) and was third in sacks (10). He led all freshmen nationally in both categories.

► Since the NCAA began tracking defensive stats in 2000, Fields was just the third freshman, and first since Missouri's Aldon Smith in 2009, with at least 10 sacks and 18 1/2 TFL.

► For true freshmen in the NCAA since 2000, Fields' average of 0.7 sacks per game last season trailed only the 0.9 by Arizona State's Terrell Suggs in 2000.

► Fields' nine sacks broke the TCU freshman record

of seven by eventual NFL All-Pro Aaron Schobel in 1997.

► Fields took part in a sack in nine of 13 games.

► His 53 tackles topped the defensive front and were seventh on TCU.

► Fields' first career interception came off Collin Klein on the opening series of the Kansas State game.

► Six of TCU's 13 opponents were held under 100 yards rushing.

► Only three teams in the offensive-oriented Big 12 topped 400 yards on TCU.

► The Horned Frogs allowed just 35 touchdowns in 13 games last season.

► TCU surrendered only 13 first downs, 104 yards passing and 227 yards of offense to Michigan State in the Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl.

► TCU forced four turnovers at Texas, held the Longhorns to one touchdown and its lowest point total (13) of the season. Texas had just 180 yards through three quarters, before finishing with 300.

► TCU held K-State to 12 first downs, 260 yards of offense and its second-lowest point total (23). The 12 first downs, 145 yards passing and 260 total yards marked TCU's best effort against a Big 12 opponent.

► The Horned Frogs forced two K-State turnovers and scored the first points of the season that the Wildcats allowed off a turnover. TCU also limited Collin Klein to 50 yards rushing on 15 carries and 12-of-21 passing with an interception by Devonte Fields.

► West Virginia's 338 yards came on 90 plays (3.8 yards per snap). The Mountaineers had 95 yards in the second half and just three passes of more than 15 yards. WVU was 6-of-22 on third-down conversions.

► TCU held Texas Tech to 172 yards of offense through the opening three quarters. The Red Raiders were at minus-1 yard on nine offensive snaps in the third quarter. TCU allowed Texas Tech just 71 yards rushing on 27 carries, 47 of which came on one run. The Red Raiders' other 26 rushes totaled 24 yards.

FROG DEFENSIVE NOTES

NO FRIEND OF RUNNING BACKS

▶ During his 152-game tenure as head coach, Gary Patterson has seen only 28 100-yard rushing games by opposing players.

▶ The Horned Frogs surrendered just three 100-yard games last season (Joseph Randle, Oklahoma State, 126; Damien Williams, Oklahoma, 115; Le'Veon Bell, Michigan State, 145).

▶ Randle's 126 yards came on 32 carries (3.9 per attempt). Williams had a 66-yard scoring run. His other 17 carries netted 49 yards. Bell had 32 rushing attempts (4.5 per carry) to get to 145 yards.

▶ Chris Hackett's 61 tackles last season were the most by a TCU freshman since Jason Phillips (71) and Robert Henson (69) in 2005.

▶ Free safety Elisha Olabode took part in a takeaway in six games. He had four interceptions, a forced fumble and fumble recovery.

▶ Olabode had two pick sixes among his four interceptions that tied for second on TCU.

▶ With his next interception return for a touchdown, Olabode would tie former linebacker and Rose Bowl hero Tank Carder (2008-11) for the most in TCU history (3).

BACK IN ACTION

▶ After playing as a true freshman on TCU's 2010 Rose Bowl championship team, defensive end Matt Anderson was sidelined the following two seasons due to injury.

▶ Anderson is returning to action this fall.

BALL HAWKS

▶ TCU's 21 interceptions last season tied for fourth nationally, trailing only Oregon (26), Kent State (23) and Fresno State (22).

▶ The Horned Frogs had at least one interception in 11 of their 13 games last season.

▶ Eight Horned Frogs had an interception with five players at two or more picks.

▶ TCU has returned four of its last 24 interceptions for touchdowns.

▶ TCU had five interceptions at SMU for a single-game high under head coach Gary Patterson.

SELECT COMPANY

▶ TCU is one of just eight schools nationally to have both its punter (Ethan Perry) and placekicker (Jaden Oberkrom) on watch lists for this year's Ray Guy Award and Lou Groza Award, respectively.

STRONG DEBUTS

▶ TCU's duo of punter Ethan Perry and placekicker Jaden Oberkrom had strong freshman seasons in 2012 and were both honorable-mention All-Big 12.

▶ Perry was a CBSSports.com and Scout.com Freshman All-American, while Oberkrom was a Lou Groza Award semifinalist.

STRONG LEG

▶ Ethan Perry's 44.5 average placed second for freshmen nationally and ranked 14th in the NCAA. It was the second-best mark in a season by a TCU punter, trailing only the school record of 46.1 by Chris Becker in 1986.

▶ Twenty of Perry's 63 punts went at least 50 yards with 19 placed inside the opponent 20-yard line.

▶ Three of his seven punts against Michigan State in the Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl went inside the Spartans' 20.

▶ Perry had a pair of punts over 60 yards in averaging 49.0 yards on eight attempts versus Oklahoma.

▶ His final punt at Texas went 52 yards to give the Longhorns a longer field to work with on their final possession.

SPLITTING THE UPRIGHTS

▶ Jaden Oberkrom was second in the Big 12 and 11th in the nation at 1.69 field goals per game.

▶ Oberkrom was 22-of-30 on field goals for the season and 42-of-42 on PATs.

▶ Oberkrom's 108 points ranked first nationally among freshman kickers and second in a single season at TCU, trailing only Nick Browne (122, 2003).

▶ Oberkrom set TCU and Big 12 records, while tying the NCAA freshman mark, with six field goals against Texas Tech. The NCAA single-game record is seven.

▶ Oberkrom was 6-of-6 on field goals versus the Red Raiders with his made kicks from 32, 41, 32, 45, 42 and 38 yards.

▶ His 42-yard field goal with 18 seconds left in regulation forced overtime.

▶ Oberkrom scored 23 points (six field goals, five PATs) to set TCU and Big 12 single-game records for points by kicking. He was one shy of the NCAA mark.

▶ Oberkrom was 3-of-3 in the Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl versus Michigan State. His 53-yard field goal with 2:42 remaining was a career-long kick and ranks third all-time in TCU history. It was the Horned Frogs' longest made field goal since Michael Reeder's school record 57-yard effort versus UTEP in 1996.

IN-AND-OUT OF THE END ZONE

▶ Jaden Oberkrom recorded 33 touchbacks on 70 kickoffs for the season. He had 24 touchbacks on 42 kickoffs over the final eight games.

Gary Patterson is TCU's all-time winningest football coach, while his 116-36 record (.763) ranks fourth among active coaches nationally.

Patterson is one of just seven current coaches with at least 100 victories at their current school. He became TCU's career wins leader with a 56-0 victory over Grambling State in the 2012 season opener, enabling him to break the previous mark of 109 wins by Dutch Meyer (1934-52).

In August 2011, Patterson was named the nation's top coach by Sports Illustrated and ESPN The Magazine. Sporting News tabbed him in January 2012 as the nation's third-best coach. He was fourth in an SI.com July 2013 ranking of the nation's best coaches.

In leading TCU to back-to-back BCS appearances in the 2009 and 2010 seasons, including a 2011 Rose Bowl championship, Patterson received 10 National Coach of the Year honors.

Patterson has produced at least 10 wins in eight of the last 10 years, including seven seasons of 11 or more victories. He has helped lead the Frogs to seven conference titles and 14 bowl games in 15 years.

In 12 seasons as TCU's head coach, Patterson has had 33 players drafted with 71 in NFL camps.
