Two Of College Football's Winningest Teams Since '05 Open Season In Cowboys Classic

LSU opens its ninth season under head coach **Les Miles** on Saturday when the 12th-ranked Tigers face 20th-ranked TCU in the Cowboys Classic in Arlington, Texas. The LSU-TCU matchup will feature two of the winningest programs in major college football since the 2005 season. LSU has won 85 games over the past eight years to rank No. 2 nationally behind Boise State (93), while TCU is tied for third with 84 wins. Kickoff between LSU and TCU is scheduled for 8:06 p.m. CT and the game will be televised on ESPN. Saturday's game will be the first between the LSU and TCU since 1968 and it marks the fourth time under Miles that the Tigers open the year against a Top 25 opponent. It's also the third time in four years that the Tigers will open at a neutral site. LSU brings the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak into the game at 41 straight, a run that goes back to the 2002 season. LSU goes into the season-opener ranked No. 12 in the Associated Press poll and No. 14 in the USA Today Coaches poll. LSU returns 14 starters (8 offense, 4 defense, 2 special teams) from last year's squad that posted a 10-3 record. TCU, members of the Big 12 conference, was 7-6 a year ago and dropped a 17-16 decision to Michigan State in the Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl. The Horned Frogs, who are coached by Gary Patterson, return 17 starters (6 offense, 9 defense, 1 special teams) from last year. Now in his ninth season at LSU, Miles is 85-21 with the Tigers with an overall head coaching record of 113-42. Offensively, LSU returns starting quarterback **Zach Mettenberger** (2,609 yards, 12 TDs in 2012) along with its top rusher in **Jeremy Hill** (755 yards, 12 TDs) and its top four receivers in **Jarvis Landry** (56 rec., 573 yards, 5 TDs), **Odell Beckham Jr.** (43 rec., 713 yards, 2 TDs), **Kadron Boone** (26 rec., 348 yards, 4 TDs) and **James Wright** (18 rec., 242 yards). Defensively, linebacker **Lamin Barrow** (104 tackles, 7.5 TFL) and safety **Craig Loston** (55 tackles, 3 interceptions) are back to lead the Tigers.

STORYLINES

- LSU's won a school-record 10 straight season-openers heading into the TCU contest. LSU hasn't lost a season-opener since a 26-8 setback to Virginia Tech in 2002. The Virginia Tech loss is also the last time the Tigers dropped a non-conference regular-season game. **Les Miles** is 8-0 in season-openers at LSU.

- LSU is 31-0 under **Les Miles** in non-conference regular-season games. Miles is 34-17 vs. ranked teams.

- LSU enters the year ranked for the 13th straight season dating back to 2001. LSU is riding a streak of 65 consecutive appearances in the AP Top 25, which ranks as the nation's second-longest streak behind Alabama.

- LSU is 5-2-1 all-time against TCU but the teams haven't played in

- 45 years. LSU and TCU last played in 1968 when the Tigers won 10-7 in Tiger Stadium. LSU has won five straight against the Horned Frogs.

- LSU is making its third appearance in AT&T Stadium and the first since a 40-27 win over No. 3 Oregon to open the 2011 season. LSU beat Texas A&M, 41-24, in the Cotton Bowl in AT&T Stadium to cap the 2010 season.

- QB **Zach Mettenberger** is 10-3 as a starter and joined Matt Flynn (10 in 2007) and Warren Rabb (11 in 1958) as the only first-year starters at that position to win double-figures games for the Tigers.

- Senior LB **Lamin Barrow** is the first LSU player to return following a 100-tackle season since Kelvin Sheppard in 2010.

- LSU returns its top two receivers for the first time since 2006 when Dwayne Bowe and Craig Davis led the Tigers in receiving in 2005.

- TCU is the 18th ranked opponent LSU has faced in its last 30 games. No other team in the nation has played as many games vs. ranked teams in that span.

- LSU has won an FBS record 41 consecutive non-conference regular season games dating back to 2002.

- LSU is 19-1 under **Les Miles** following a loss. LSU has lost back-to-back games just one time under Miles that coming in November of 2008 when the Tigers fell to Ole Miss and Arkansas in consecutive weeks.

- LSU owns a 28-15 record against teams in the current Big 12.

Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • NINTH SEASON

It's called the "Miles Method" and it's the mission of LSU football program under ninth-year head coach Les Miles. The "Miles Method" lays the foundation for the organization and it calls for LSU to run the finest football program in the country, one where players can have an experience that's second to none and gives them every opportunity to compete for championships on the field, earn a degree and grow personally by giving back to the community.

In eight years, the "Miles Method" has proved to be a winning formula as the Tigers have won more games than any program in the Southeastern Conference over that span (85), while capturing a pair of SEC titles (2007, 2011) and reaching the BCS National Championship Game two times (LSU won the 2007 national title).

Since Miles took over in 2005, LSU has registered five top 10 finishes with three coming in the top five, won double-figure games six times, produced 18 first-team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. LSU also leads the SEC with 51 NFL Draft picks during that span, which includes 12 first round selections.

Miles has climbed to second in school history in career victories with 85, trailing only Charles McClendon, who won 137 games in 18 years with the Tigers. Miles is also the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it now three times - and in 2005, he became the only first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's title game.

In the classroom, 172 football players have earned their degree since Miles took over and for the second straight year, LSU ranked second to only Vanderbilt in the SEC in graduation rates at 77 percent. Under Miles, LSU has produced 134 players who have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status.

LSU's community service presence is impactful as football players routinely donate time giving back to the Baton Rouge area through a variety of avenues, including appearances at schools, hospitals and many other charitable causes. It's through these community service ventures that Miles and his team get a better understanding of what it means to wear an LSU uniform and the impact that can be made on those who are less fortunate.

Now in his ninth season with the Tigers, the foundation for LSU football is stronger than ever. With wins coming at a record-setting pace, graduation rates the most for any public university in the SEC, and with six-straight recruiting classes rated among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of the premier programs in college football, setting a standard that has the rest of the nation chasing.

Series Notes:

LSU and TCU meet for the ninth time, and the first since a 10-7 Tiger victory in 1968 ... LSU has won five straight in the series that dates back to a 3-0 TCU victory in Ft. Worth on Sept. 26, 1931 ... The teams tied in Baton Rouge the following year, 3-3 ... TCU's only other win over LSU came in the 1936 Sugar Bowl by a 3-2 count ... Since that loss, LSU has reeled off five wins over the Horned Frogs, the first coming in 1943 by a 14-0 count ... LSU won 10-0 in 1959 in Tiger Stadium, 5-0 in Baton Rouge in 1962, and 28-14 in Baton Rouge in 1963 ... This will be **Les Miles'** first contest against TCU as a head coach.

NOTEBOOK

LSU Owns FBS Record For Consecutive Non-Conference Regular Season Wins With 41

LSU will put a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) record on the line again in the season-opener as the Tigers have won 41 consecutive non-conference regular season games dating back to the 2002 season. Last season, LSU broke the FBS record for consecutive non-conference regular season wins, surpassing the mark of Kansas State who claimed 39 straight from 1993-2003. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular season game since falling at Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va., on Sept. 1. **Les Miles** has accounted for 31 of the 41 wins during the streak, and he is 31-0 all-time in non-conference regular season games in his eight previous seasons at LSU. Former coach Nick Saban accounted for the 10 other victories from 2002-04. Under Miles, the Tigers have outscored non-conference regular season opponents a combined 1,217-317. Here is a look at the top four in FBS all-time consecutive non-conference regular season wins:

LSU In Season-Openers

LSU brings an 86-28-5 overall mark in season-openers into the TCU game. The Tigers have won 10 straight and 16 of their last 17 season-openers. LSU's only season-opening loss over the past 17 years came at Virginia Tech by a 26-8 count in 2002. Last year, the Tigers posted a 41-14 win over North Texas in Tiger Stadium. This will be the third time in four seasons that the Tigers open the season against a ranked opponent away from home. Two years ago, LSU opened its season with a 40-27 win over No. 3 Oregon in the Cowboys Classic in AT&T Stadium. The Tigers held off No. 18 North Carolina, 30-24, in the 2010 season-opener in Atlanta. The trend is likely to continue next year as last week it was announced that LSU will open the 2014 season vs. Wisconsin at Reliant Stadium in Houston on Aug. 30.

Les Miles In Season Openers

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 9-3 in season openers during his 12 years as a head coach, which includes an 8-0 record with the Tigers. Miles is the only coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to a season-opening win in each of his first eight years. In eight years with the Tigers, Miles' LSU teams have outscored its season-opening opponent, 308-135. Three of those opponents were ranked and five of those games were away from Tiger Stadium.

AT&T Stadium Kind To LSU

Saturday's tilt will be the third time LSU has played in AT&T Stadium and the first since the Tigers defeated No. 3 Oregon, 40-27, in the 2011 season-opener on Sept. 3. The Tigers also played in the 2011 AT&T Cotton Bowl on Jan. 7, beating No. 18 Texas A&M, 41-24.

LSU vs. Big 12

LSU owns a 28-15 record against teams in the current Big 12, including three straight wins dating back to the 2004 BCS Championship Game victory over Oklahoma. TCU is only the third current Big 12 team that the Tigers have faced in the **Les Miles** era. LSU defeated No. 22 West Virginia, 20-14, on Sept. 25, 2010 in Tiger Stadium. The following season, the Tigers upended the No. 16 Mountaineers, 47-21, on Sept. 24, 2011 in Morgantown, W.V. The last time LSU lost to a Big 12 team was Jan. 1, 2003, when No. 9 Texas beat the Tigers, 35-20, in the Cotton Bowl. This is the first time that LSU has opened a season against a team in the current Big 12 since a 3-3 tie against TCU on Sept. 24, 1932 in Baton Rouge. It is also only the third time the Tigers have done so. TCU beat LSU, 3-0, in Fort Worth in the 1931 season-opener. Here is a look at LSU's all-time records vs. current Big 12 teams: Baylor (8-3), Iowa State (1-0), Kansas (0-0), Kansas State (1-0), Oklahoma (1-1), Oklahoma State (1-0), TCU (5-2-1), Texas (7-9-1), Texas Tech (2-0), West Virginia (2-0).

LSU vs. The Ranked

When the Tigers lineup against TCU, LSU will be facing a Top 25 opponent for the seventh time in nine games dating back to last year. A year ago, LSU capped the season by facing a Top 25 team in six of its last eight games. Since the first game in October of last year, the only two non-ranked opponents that LSU has faced were Ole Miss and Arkansas. The ranked opponents for LSU during that stretch included No. 6 Florida on Oct. 6, No. 3 South Carolina on Oct. 13, No. 20 Texas A&M on Oct. 20, No. 1 Alabama on Nov. 3, No. 22 Mississippi State on Nov. 10, and No. 17 Clemson on Dec. 31. TCU is the 18th ranked opponent LSU has faced in its last 30 games. No other team in the nation has played as many games vs. ranked teams in that span. Alabama is next closest having played 14. Since the start of the 2011 season, LSU has played (15) and won (11) more games over ranked teams than any team in the nation.

LSU's At Home In A Dome

LSU will be making its 33rd overall appearance in a domed stadium against TCU. LSU is 24-8 all-time in domed stadiums, which includes a 13-5 mark at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, a 9-2 record at the Georgia Dome, a 2-0 record at AT&T Stadium and an 0-1 mark at the Astrodome. LSU has dropped its last two games in a domed stadium, last year's Chick-fil-A Bowl and the 2012 BCS National Championship Game in the Superdome.

LSU Streak of Consecutive Weeks In AP Top 25 Reaches 65 Straight

LSU's streak of consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 has reached 65, which ranks second to only Alabama in terms of current streaks. This is the 13th consecutive season that the Tigers are ranked in the preseason polls as LSU comes in No. 12 in the Associated Press and No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches Top 25. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 123 of the 127 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 139 of 143 games ranked in the top 25, including 104 of 106 games under Miles. LSU has an 83-19 record in games played as a Top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 against Arkansas in the regular-season finale and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU finished the 2012 season ranked No. 12 in the Coaches poll and No. 14 in the AP. It was the fourth straight season the Tigers finished the year ranked. No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Lamin Barrow

A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior linebacker **Lamin Barrow** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2013 season. Barrow was presented the jersey by coach **Les Miles** following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp on Sunday, Aug. 4. Barrow is LSU's leading returning tackler after racking up 104 a year ago. He is the first LSU player to return following a 100-tackle season since Kelvin Sheppard in 2010. Jersey No. 18 was born when quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958 in 2003. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Four of the former No. 18s are still currently playing in the NFL. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

LSU Is 36-2 In Non-Conference Games Under Les Miles

LSU brings a 36-2 record in non-conference games into the TCU opener. LSU's only two non-conference losses under **Les Miles** came against Penn State in the Capital One Bowl to end the 2009 season and to Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31 last season. Of the 36 wins under Miles against non-conference opponents, 11 have come against Top 25 teams, 30 have come by double-digits and LSU has scored 40 or more points in 22 of the 38 games.

Tigers Are 9-4 In Neutral Sites Games Under Les Miles

LSU brings a 9-4 record in neutral site games under **Les Miles**. Among the nine wins, include five victories in the Georgia Dome, two in the Mercedes Benz Superdome and two in AT&T Stadium. LSU has outscored its opponents 386-242 in the 13 games and the Tigers have scored 40 or more points five times and 30 or more points eight times.

LSU's 44-7 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 44-7 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 19-5 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. The only seven losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005. In Miles' tenure at LSU, the Tigers have a combined turnover margin of +59. LSU was +20 in 2011 and +16 last season.

August Games Rare In LSU Football History

Saturday's contest will be just the fourth LSU football game ever played in the month of August. The Tigers are 3-0 in those previous games: def. Appalachian State, 41-13, on Aug. 30, 2008; def. Mississippi State, 45-0, on Aug. 30, 2007; and def. UL-Monroe, 49-7, on Aug. 30, 2003.

True Freshmen Under Les Miles

Les Miles has never shyed away from playing true freshmen in his eight previous seasons at LSU. A total of 73 true freshmen have seen the field under his watch, including a high of 15 last year. That total of 15 ranked second nationally with Ohio State behind only TCU and Texas, who each had 16 true freshmen play. Expect that trend to continue this year.

Lone Star Tigers

Nine players on the current LSU roster hail from the state of Texas. Junior place kicker **James Hairston** is a native of Dallas, while cornerback **Jalen Mills** and offensive tackle **Evan Washington** played their high school ball just 23 miles away from AT&T Stadium in DeSoto, Texas.

LSU Running Backs Have Gone 296 Carries Without Losing A Fumble

LSU running backs have gone 296 straight carries without a lost fumble dating back to last year's Towson game in week five when Michael Ford lost the ball in the third quarter. Zach Mettenberger Back as LSU's Starting Quarterback

Senior quarterback **Zach Mettenberger** enters his second season as a starter for the Tigers. He owns a 10-3 mark as a starter in his career. Last season, Mettenberger threw for 2,609 yards and 12 touchdowns on 207-of-352 passing. His 50:1 (only seven interceptions) ratio of passes to interceptions was an LSU single-season record. His passing yardage total also ranked fifth-best in LSU single-season annals. Mettenberger has worked with new offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron** since spring practice.

The Aussie Punting Connection

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. This season, sophomore **Jamie Keehn** takes over punting duties. Keehn, a native of Queensland, is the oldest player on the LSU team after turning 24 on August 4. He did not play high school football and did not start punting until August 2011. Wing and Keehn did not know each other until both arrived at LSU. Keehn punted in two games last season for the Tigers, including 12 times for an average

of 43.7 yards. He averaged 44.6 yards per punt in the Chick-fil-A Bowl against Clemson and five of his nine punts in that game traveled at least 50 yards.

LSU Has Scored 19 Special Teams TDs In Les Miles Era

LSU has recorded 19 special teams touchdown under **Les Miles**, including the most recent one when **Odell Beckham Jr.** returned a punt 89 yards for a touchdown against Ole Miss last season. Under Miles, LSU has returned 11 punts for touchdowns, 3 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, and 1 on a fake field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all eight previous seasons under Miles. LSU is 17-1 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. In addition, LSU holds the nation's longest consecutive years streak (12) of returning a punt or kickoff for a touchdown. The Tigers have returned at least one punt or kickoff back for a score every season dating back to 2001. The following is a breakdown of LSU's special teams touchdowns under Miles:

In 106 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 79-8 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 50-4. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 49-0. LSU is 31-4 Under Les Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 31-4 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2013 roster, LSU has seven career 100-yard games to its credit. **Jeremy Hill** has four, **Kenny Hilliard** has one and **Alfred Blue** has two. LSU's only four losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came vs. Clemson in 2012 (Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards); Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

LSU The New DBU

Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL Draft with 12. Alabama and Texas are the next closest with nine. The Tigers have produced a defensive back selection in seven consecutive drafts. Six LSU defensive players were selected in the first three rounds of the 2013 NFL Draft, the most selected from any school in modern draft history. A total of 13 former LSU defensive backs are on current NFL rosters, including 11 of those who played for **Les Miles**.

LSU: The SEC's Winningest Team Since 2005

LSU is the winningest program in the SEC since the start of **Les Miles'** tenure as head coach in 2005 as the Tigers have posted an 85-21 mark during that span. The 85 victories for LSU are two better than Florida, while the Tigers are also tops in final poll rankings. LSU is also second nationally in wins since 2005 behind only Boise State (93).

LSU Defense Comes Up Big In 10-7 Win Over TCU in 1968

For the second consecutive week, No. 18 LSU scored a come-from-behind 10-7 victory over TCU of the Southwest Conference. TCU asserted its authority early in the game when halfback Norman Bulaich took a screen pass from Bill Fay and scampered 36 yards for a touchdown. A successful conversion put the Frogs out front 7-0, a lead that stood up until the first play in the second quarter. The Tigers' lone touchdown drive of the night actually began on the kickoff following the TCU score. Maurice LeBlanc returned to the 25 and the Tigers began a 75-yard sustained drive that consumed 13 plays. The big gainer in the drive was a 30-yard pass from quarterback Fred Haynes to fullback Kenny Newfield. After moving to the TCU four, Haynes ended the driver on a keeper play over the right guard. Mark Lumpkin's conversion knotted the count at 7-7. It remained that way until the fourth quarter. LSU got its chance when sophomore safety Craig Burns intercepted a TCU aerial on the one-yard line and the speedster ran it out to the 19. Haynes mixed a running and passing attack to advance the ball to the TCU 19 where the drive stalled. Facing a fourth-and-two situation at the Frog 19, the Tigers elected to go for the field goal. Lumpkin booted it through on a 37-yard attempt to push the Tigers ahead 10-7 with 5:25 left in the game. The Tiger defense then checked the TCU attack to preserve the victory.

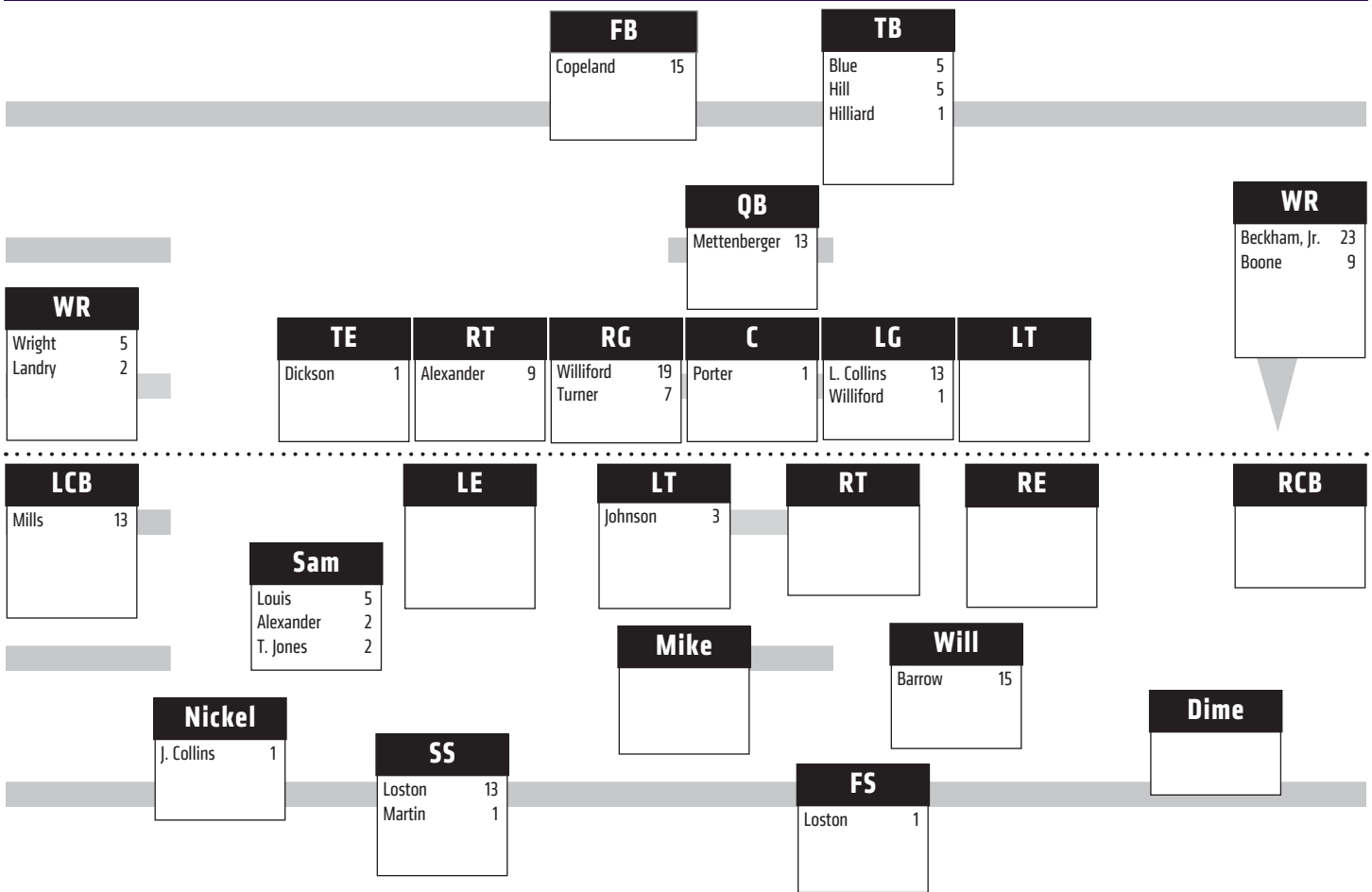
