No. 8 LSU Looks To Continue September Streak Against Kent State

LSU plays the second of three straight home games on Saturday when the No. 8 Tigers host Kent State of the Mid-American Conference at 6:02 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on ESPNU with Clay Matvick, Matt Stinchcomb, and Dawn Davenport on the call. LSU enters the game with a 2-0 mark following last week's 56-17 win over UAB. Kent State, which won 11 games a year ago and came up one victory shy of reaching the Orange Bowl, is 1-1 overall. The Golden Flashes beat Liberty to open the season and then lost to Bowling Green, 41-22, last week. Saturday's game will be the first meeting between LSU and Kent State. LSU brings a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) record 43-game winning streak against non-conference regular season opponents into Saturday's contest. LSU hasn't lost a non-conference regular season game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener. The Tigers have also won 27 consecutive games played in the month of September – the longest current streak in major college football. The other streak at stake on Saturday for LSU includes 38 straight wins against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium, 26 of which have come under current head coach **Les Miles**. LSU goes into the Kent State game averaging 46.5 points and 446.5 total yards (174.5 rushing, 272.0 passing) per game. QB **Zach Mettenberger** set a school-record with 5 TDs last week vs. UAB and he's connected on 32-of-51 passes for 533 yards and an SEC-best 6 scores in two games. WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** leads the nation in all-purpose yards with 603 through two games, which includes 331 yards against UAB and 272 against TCU. Both of those marks are in the top 10 in LSU single-game annals. Beckham is second on the team with 10 catches for 254 yards and 3 scores. Defensively, the Tigers are allowing 22.0 points and 277.5 total yards (137.0 rushing, 140.5 passing) per game. DE **Jermauria Rasco** leads the Tigers with 11 tackles, 2 QB hurries and 1.5 sacks.

NOTEABLES

- **Zach Mettenberger's** 6 TD passes and 533 passing yards are the most by any quarterback through the first two games in LSU history.
- **Odell Beckham Jr.** leads the nation in all-purpose yards with 603 through two games, an average of 251.5 per contest. His 331 all-purpose yards last week vs. UAB ranked third in school history and eighth in SEC history.
- In the win over UAB, LSU had nine players rush the football and nine players with at least one reception.
- LSU is 33-0 under **Les Miles** in non-conference regular-season games.
- The 93 points in its first two games is the most for LSU since 2007 when the Tigers scored 93 points in wins over Mississippi State (45-0) and Virginia Tech (48-7).
- LSU has played 14 true freshmen in two games – 8 played in the season-opening win over TCU and then 14 played vs. UAB. In nine years under **Les Miles**, a total of 87 true freshmen have seen the field.
- LSU has won 32 straight games when reaching 30 points and the Tigers are 60-4 under **Les Miles** when hitting the 30-point mark.
- All four running backs listed on the LSU depth chart have led the Tigers in rushing for at least one game in their career after **Terrence Magee's** 95-yard effort vs. TCU to open the year. **Jeremy Hill** leads all active Tigers with 7 games as LSU's top rusher, followed by **Alfred Blue** (5), and **Kenny Hilliard** (5).
- LSU is riding a streak of 67 consecutive appearances in the AP Top 25, which ranks as the nation's second-longest streak behind Alabama.
- LSU QB **Zach Mettenberger** is now 12-3 as the starting quarterback for the Tigers. Dating back to last year, Mettenberger has thrown for 250 yards or more in 5 of LSU's last 7 games.
- Dating back to last season, junior WR **Jarvis Landry** has caught 46 passes in LSU's last seven games. Landry has hauled in at least one TD pass in four straight games dating back to last year's Arkansas game.
- LSU's 93 points in first two games is most for the Tigers in first 2 games of season since 2007 when LSU scored 93 points in wins over Miss. State (45-0) and Va. Tech (48-7).

Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • NINTH SEASON

It's called the "Miles Method" and it's the mission of LSU football program under ninth-year head coach Les Miles. The "Miles Method" lays the foundation for the organization and it calls for LSU to run the finest football program in the country, one where players can have an experience that's second to none and gives them every opportunity to compete for championships on the field, earn a degree and grow personally by giving back to the community.

In eight years, the "Miles Method" has proved to be a winning formula as the Tigers have won more games than any program in the Southeastern Conference over that span (87), while capturing a pair of SEC titles (2007, 2011) and reaching the BCS National Championship Game two times (LSU won the 2007 national title).

Since Miles took over in 2005, LSU has registered five top 10 finishes with three coming in the top five, won double-figure games six times, produced 18 first-team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. LSU also leads the SEC with 51 NFL Draft picks during that span, which includes 12 first round selections.

Miles has climbed to second in school history in career victories with 87, trailing only Charles McClendon, who won 137 games in 18 years with the Tigers. Miles is also the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it now three times - and in 2005, he became the only first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's title game.

In the classroom, 172 football players have earned their degree since Miles took over and for the second straight year, LSU ranked second to only Vanderbilt in the SEC in graduation rates at 77 percent. Under Miles, LSU has produced 134 players who have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status.

LSU's community service presence is impactful as football players routinely donate time giving back to the Baton Rouge area through a variety of avenues, including appearances at schools, hospitals and many other charitable causes. It's through these community service ventures that Miles and his team get a better understanding of what it means to wear an LSU uniform and the impact that can be made on those who are less fortunate.

Now in his ninth season with the Tigers, the foundation for LSU football is stronger than ever. With wins coming at a record-setting pace, graduation rates the most for any public university in the SEC, and with six-straight recruiting classes rated among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of the premier programs in college football, setting a standard that has the rest of the nation chasing.

NOTEBOOK

LSU Extends FBS Record For Consecutive Non-Conference Regular Season Wins To 43

LSU extended its Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) record of consecutive non-conference regular season wins to 43 with its victory over UAB. Last season, LSU broke the FBS record for consecutive non-conference regular season wins, surpassing the mark of Kansas State who claimed 39 straight from 1993-2003. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular season game since falling at Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va., on Sept. 1. **Les Miles** has accounted for 33 of the 43 wins during the streak, and he is 33-0 all-time in non-conference regular season games in his nine seasons at LSU. Former coach Nick Saban accounted for the 10 other victories from 2002-04. Under Miles, the Tigers have outscored non-conference regular season opponents a combined 1,310-361. Here is a look at the top four in FBS all-time consecutive non-conference regular season wins:

LSU's Dynamic Receiving Duo of Odell Beckham, Jr. and Jarvis Landry

LSU's offense under new offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron** has thrived in its first two games as both **Odell Beckham Jr.** and **Jarvis Landry** have combined for 23 receptions for 434 yards and six receiving touchdowns. Beckham Jr. and Landry are tied for the SEC lead in receiving TDs with Javonte Herndon of Arkansas with three apiece.

- Both **Beckham Jr.** (118) and **Landry** (109) went over 100 yards receiving against TCU. It marked the first time that two LSU players went over 100 yards receiving in the same game since Josh Reed (239) and Michael Clayton (120) did it in the 2002 Sugar Bowl against Illinois. It was also the first time LSU had two 100-yard receivers in a season-opener since Reed (137) and Jerel Myers (117) did it in 2000 against Western Carolina.

- **Landry** has caught 46 passes in LSU's last seven games with seven touchdowns. He's caught eight passes or more in four of LSU's last seven games. Landry has recorded at least one receiving touchdown in four straight games dating back to last year's Arkansas contest. He is the first LSU player to do that since Dwayne Bowe and Early Doucet did so in the 2006 season.

- With his 136 receiving yards against UAB, **Beckham Jr.** became the first LSU player with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Dwayne Bowe did it in 2006. Bowe had 111 against Kentucky (Oct. 14, 2006) and 106 against Fresno State (Oct. 21, 2006). Beckham Jr. is also the first LSU player to open a season with back-to-back 100-yard receiving contests since Michael Clayton did it as a freshman in the first three games of 2003. Beckham Jr. has now accounted for four career 100-yard games and three out of LSU's last four contests dating back to Arkansas last season.

- **Beckham Jr.** ranks second in the SEC and 10th nationally in receiving yards per game with 127.0. His three receiving TDs in the UAB game tied for third in LSU single-game history and were the most by an LSU player since Terrence Toliver hauled in three against Texas A&M in the 2011 Cotton Bowl.

Second of Three Straight Weeks in Tiger Stadium

Ranked annually as the top venue in college football, LSU football in Tiger Stadium enters its 90th year dating back to 1924 when the stadium was built. It's also the 83rd year of Saturday night football in Tiger Stadium. LSU has put together an impressive 51-7 home record under **Les Miles**, which includes a 26-0 mark against non-conference foes. With a capacity of 92,542, Tiger Stadium ranks eighth nationally and that number will grow to 100,000 when the South endzone project of the stadium is completed prior to the 2014 season. LSU owns a 393-144-18 (.725) all-time record in Tiger Stadium.

All-Purpose OBJ3

Odell Beckham Jr. leads the nation in all-purpose yards with 301.5 per game highlighted by the first missed field goal return for a touchdown in school history when he raced 100 yards for a score on a missed 59-yard attempt with 2:11 remaining in the third quarter. Beckham Jr. is up for the Paul Hornung Award this year, which is presented annually to college football's most versatile player, and he has been selected to the Hornung Honor Roll two weeks in a row.

- **Beckham Jr.** is believed to be the first FBS player to return a missed short field goal for a touchdown since Richie Iuzzi of Clemson did it vs. Georgia on Sept. 28, 1968 (108 yards, 100 statistically). Others who have done it: Don Guest of California, 109 yards vs. Washington on Sept. 17, 1966; James Elmore of Tennessee, 95 yards vs. Carson-Newman on Sept. 25, 1926.

- **Beckham Jr.** has racked up 603 all-purpose yards in two games: 254 receiving yards, 33 rushing yards, 59 punt return yards, 157 kick return yards and 100 miscellaneous yards (which is a new category created by the NCAA following his missed field goal return for a touchdown).

- **Beckham's** 272 all-purpose yard game against TCU tied the sixth-best mark in LSU single-game annals (also held by Kevin Faulk vs. Kentucky, 1997), while his 331 yard all-purpose game against UAB was third in LSU single-game history and the most AP yards by an LSU player since Josh Reed had 338 against Alabama on Nov. 3, 2001. It also tied for eighth in SEC single-game history and was the most by an SEC player since Darren McFadden had 355 against South Carolina on Nov. 3, 2007.

- **Beckham Jr.** has now recorded three special teams touchdowns in his career: one missed field goal return in 2013 and two punt returns in 2012.

- **Beckham Jr.** recorded four total touchdowns against UAB in week 2, becoming the first LSU player to achieve that feat since LaBrandon Toefield did it with four rushing TDs against Utah State on Sept. 8, 2001.

Zach Mettenberger On Record Pace, Shatters Single-Game Touchdown Record

Senior quarterback **Zach Mettenberger** is on a record-breaking pace two weeks into the season. His six passing touchdowns are the most by a quarterback in the first two games in LSU history. Alan Risher had 5 in 1982 (2 vs. Oregon State and 3 vs. Rice) and JaMarcus Russell had 5 in 2006 (3 vs. UL-Lafayette, 2 vs. Arizona). Mettenberger's 533 passing yards are also the most through the first two games in LSU history. His 32 completions in the first two games are the most by an LSU QB since Rohan Davey had 32 to open the 2001 season (19 vs. Tulane, 13 vs. Utah State).

- **Mettenberger** shattered the LSU single-game passing touchdown record with five against UAB in week 2, including three in the first half. As a team, the five passing touchdowns for LSU against UAB were the most by the squad since recording five in the 2000 season-opener against Western Carolina. Mettenberger became the first LSU QB to throw three or more TDs in a half since JaMarcus Russell fired three in the first half of the Mississippi State game on Sept. 30, 2006.

- Dating back to last year, **Mettenberger** has thrown for 250 yards or more in five of LSU's last seven games. He owns a 12-3 mark as a starter in his career.

- **Mettenberger** recorded 12 passing TDs all of last season. Through two games, he is already half way to that with six, which is tied for the SEC lead with Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel.

- **Mettenberger's** 251 passing yards against TCU were the most in an LSU season-opener since JaMarcus Russell threw for 253 in the 2006 opener against Louisiana-Lafayette. He also converted 9-of-15 third-down passes in the TCU contest.

More On the LSU Offense

- LSU scored touchdowns on five consecutive possessions against UAB, representing the second time that has happened in the **Les Miles** era and the first time since the first five possessions of the Mississippi State game on Sept. 30, 2006.

- LSU's six passing touchdowns rank second in the SEC behind only Texas A&M's eight.

- LSU leads the SEC in redzone offense, converting all nine of its chances (six touchdowns, three field goals).

- The Tigers rank second in the SEC in third-down conversions, converting 17-of-27 for 63 percent. In the season-opener against TCU, LSU converted 13-of-19 third downs, the most in the **Les Miles** era and the most since converting 13 against Kentucky on Oct. 13, 2001.

LSU Streak of Consecutive Weeks In AP Top 25 Reaches 67 Straight After Week 2

LSU's streak of consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 has reached 67, which ranks second to only Alabama in terms of current streaks. The Tigers jumped to No. 8 in both the Associated Press and Coaches' polls following the UAB win. Since the start of the 2011 season, LSU has been ranked in the top 10 in now 33 of the 35 weeks of the AP poll. This was the

13th consecutive season that the Tigers were ranked in the preseason polls as LSU came in No. 12 in the AP and No. 13 in the Coaches Top 25. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 125 of the 129 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 141 of 145 games ranked in the top 25, including 107 of 109 games under Miles. LSU has an 85-19 record in games played as a Top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 against Arkansas in the regular-season finale and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. LSU finished the 2012 season ranked No. 12 in the Coaches poll and No. 14 in the AP. It was the fourth straight season the Tigers finished the year ranked. The following is a look at the longest current streaks for teams in the AP Top 25:

LSU Is 38-2 In Non-Conference Games Under Les Miles

LSU brings a 38-2 record in non-conference games into the Kent State contest. LSU's only two non-conference losses under **Les Miles** came against Penn State in the Capital One Bowl to end the 2009 season and to Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31 last season. Of the 38 wins under Miles against non-conference opponents, 12 have come against Top 25 teams, 32 have come by double-digits and LSU has scored 40 or more points in 23 of the 40 games.

LSU's 46-7 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 46-7 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 20-5 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. Through two games, the Tigers have a turnover margin of +2, committing one fewer turnover in the TCU and UAB contests. The only seven losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005. In Miles' tenure at LSU, the Tigers have a combined turnover margin of +61. LSU was +20 in 2011, +16 last season and +2 this year.

September Streaking: LSU Has Won 27 Straight Games During September

LSU brings a 27-game winning streak during the month of September into the Kent State game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 30-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count. LSU hasn't lost a game in Tiger Stadium in September since a 30-27 overtime loss to Tennessee in 2005 (Miles' first home game). LSU has also won 30 straight games during the months of August/September combined, which leads the nation. The TCU opener was just the fourth LSU football game ever played in the month of August. The Tigers are now 4-0 in those games: def. Appalachian State, 41-13, on Aug. 30, 2008; def. Mississippi State, 45-0, on Aug. 30, 2007; and def. UL-Monroe, 49-7, on Aug. 30, 2003.

14 True Freshmen Have Played This Season

Les Miles has never shyed away from playing true freshmen in his nine seasons at LSU. A total of 87 true freshmen have seen the field under his watch, including 14 this season (eight on defense, five on offense, one special teams only). That number ranks second nationally behind Texas A&M's 17. The following true freshmen have played this season: 16 **Tre'Davious White** (CB, special teams), 40 **Duke Riley** (LB, special teams), 49 **Melvin Jones** (special teams), 52 **Kendell Beckwith** (LB/special teams), 89 **DeSean Smith** (TE), 91 **Christian LaCouture** (DT), 10 **Anthony Jennings** (QB), 76 **Josh Boutte** (OT), **Jeryl Brazil** (RB), 21 **Rashard Robinson** (DB), 29 **Rickey Jefferson** (DB), 46 **Tashawn Bower** (DE), 77 **Ethan Pocic** (C) and 92 **Lewis Neal** (DE). Five of those true freshmen saw the field in the first quarter of the TCU season-opener and all 14 played in the UAB contest. Last year, 15 true freshmen played for LSU. That total of 15 ranked second nationally with Ohio State behind only TCU and Texas, who each had 16 true freshmen play. Expect the trend to continue.

Colby DelaWHOSSAYE?

Under **Les Miles**, LSU has produced three out of the top five most accurate career kickers in school history in Josh Jasper (2008-10), Drew Alleman (2011-12) and Colt David (2005-06). Redshirt freshman PK **Colby Delahoussaye**, a walk-on from New Iberia, takes over the field goal and extra point duties this season after the departure of Alleman. Delahoussaye immediately made an impact in his debut, booting 3-of-3 field goals and 4-of-4 PATs in the season-opening win over TCU. He connected from 28 yards and 23 yards twice. He was one of two freshmen kickers nationally who were 3-of-3 or better in week one, joining Phillips of Utah. Delahoussaye's three made field goals were the most by an LSU kicker in his debut since Andre LaFleur was 3-of-4 against Mississippi State on Sept. 11, 1993. He is 12-of-12 on extra points through two games

Terrence Magee's Breakout Game

Entering the TCU season-opener, junior running back **Terrence Magee** had totaled only 28 carries in his career. Magee delivered a breakout game against the Horned Frogs, rushing for a game-high 95 yards on 13 carries with two touchdowns. The highlight came with 13:11 in the third quarter when he raced a career-long 52 yards for a score. All four LSU running backs -- Magee, **Alfred Blue**, **Kenny Hilliard** and **Jeremy Hill** -- have led the Tigers in rushing in a game before and all four have recorded multiple touchdown games in their careers. Hilliard leads the way with 15 career rushing TDs followed by Hill (13) and Blue (10).

LSU Running Backs Have Gone 34 Carries Without Losing A Fumble

Heading into the Kent State contest, LSU running backs have gone 34 carries without a fumble dating back to the fourth quarter of the TCU game. The Tigers had a streak 331 straight carries without a lost fumble prior to **Alfred Blue's** fumble with 13:43 to go in the fourth quarter against TCU. The Aussie Punting Connection

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. This season, sophomore **Jamie Keehn** takes over punting duties. Keehn, a native of Queensland, is the oldest player on the LSU team after turning 24 on August 4. He did not play high school football and did not start punting until August 2011. Wing and Keehn did not know each other until both arrived at LSU. Keehn punted in two games last season for the Tigers, including 12 times for an average of 43.7 yards. He averaged 44.6 yards per punt in the Chick-fil-A Bowl against Clemson and five of his nine punts in that game traveled at least 50 yards. This season, Keehn is averaging 41.4 yards per punt through two games with one punt over 50 yards.

No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Lamin Barrow

A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior linebacker **Lamin Barrow** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2013 season. Barrow was presented the jersey by coach **Les Miles** following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp on Sunday, Aug. 4. Barrow is LSU's leading returning tackler after racking up 104 a year ago. He led the Tigers with seven tackles in the home-opening win over UAB. He is the first LSU player to return following a 100-tackle season since Kelvin Sheppard in 2010. Jersey No. 18 was born when quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958 in 2003. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Three of the former No. 18s are still currently playing in the NFL. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

LSU Is 49-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 108 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 82-8 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 50-4. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 49-0. LSU Has Scored 20 Special Teams TDs In Les Miles Era

LSU has recorded 20 special teams touchdown under **Les Miles**, including the most recent one when **Odell Beckham Jr.** became the first player in school history to return a missed field goal for a touchdown. Beckham caught a missed 59-yard field goal in the third quarter of the UAB game and raced a school-record 109 yards (statistically 100 yards) for the score. Under Miles, LSU has returned 11 punts for touchdowns, 3 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, 1 on a fake field goal and 1 on a missed field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all nine seasons under Miles. LSU is 18-1 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. In addition, LSU holds the nation's longest consecutive years streak (12) of returning a punt or kickoff for a touchdown. The Tigers have returned at least one punt or kickoff back for a score every season dating back to 2001. The following is a breakdown of LSU's special teams touchdowns under Miles:

LSU is 31-4 Under Les Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 31-4 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2013 roster, LSU has seven career 100-yard games to its credit. **Jeremy Hill** has four, **Kenny Hilliard** has one and **Alfred Blue** has two. LSU's only four losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came vs. Clemson in 2012 (Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards); Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 228-61-4 (.784) at night under the lights compared to a 29-25-3 (.518) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 81-12 (.871) overall at home, which includes a 62-6 (.912) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 19-6 (.750) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. The only two Saturday Night losses in Tiger Stadium for the Tigers under Miles came in 2009 when No. 1 Florida beat LSU, 13-3, and on Nov. 3, 2012 when top-ranked Alabama rallied for a 21-17 victory. Going back to 2000, LSU is 62-5 in Tiger Stadium in Saturday Night games with the only losses during that span came to unranked UAB (13-10) in 2000; unranked Ole Miss (35-24) in 2001; No. 10 Alabama (31-0) in 2002; No. 1 Florida (13-3) in 2009, and No. 1 Alabama (21-17) in 2012. LSU vs. The Ranked

The TCU opener was the seventh time in nine games dating back to last year that LSU had to face a ranked opponent. A year ago, LSU capped the season by facing a Top 25 team in six of its last eight games. Since the first game in October of last year, the only two non-ranked opponents that LSU has faced were Ole Miss, Arkansas and UAB last week. The ranked opponents for LSU during that stretch included No. 6 Florida on Oct. 6, No. 3 South Carolina on Oct. 13, No. 20 Texas A&M on Oct. 20, No. 1 Alabama on Nov. 3, No. 22 Mississippi State on Nov. 10, and No. 17 Clemson on Dec. 31. TCU was the 18th ranked opponent LSU faced in its last 31 games. No other team in the nation had played as many games vs. ranked teams in that span. Alabama was next closest having played 14. Since the start of the 2011 season, LSU has played (16) and won (12) more games over ranked teams than any team in the nation.

LSU The New DBU

Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL Draft with 12. Alabama and Texas are the next closest with nine. The Tigers have produced a defensive back selection in seven consecutive drafts. Six LSU defensive players were selected in the first three rounds of the 2013 NFL Draft, the most selected from any school in modern draft history. A total of 13 former LSU defensive backs are on current NFL rosters, including 11 of those who played for **Les Miles**.

LSU: The SEC's Winningest Team Since 2005

LSU is the winningest program in the SEC since the start of **Les Miles'** tenure as head coach in 2005 as the Tigers have posted an 87-21 mark during that span. The 87 victories for LSU are three better than Florida, while the Tigers are also tops in final poll rankings. LSU is also second nationally in wins since 2005 behind only Boise State (94).

LSU No. 1 in Graduation Success Rate Among SEC Public Schools

For the second straight year, LSU football owned the SEC's highest NCAA graduation rate among public schools and second overall behind only Vanderbilt when it was unveiled in December 2012. LSU's score of 77 was well above the national mark of 68 for all FBS schools. The NCAA began reporting GSR in 2006 and LSU has shown improvement with each year's report. A total of 170 student-athletes have graduated during **Les Miles'** tenure as head coach.

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 90th year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 83rd year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- Head coach **Les Miles** is 37-2 in Saturday Night home games. The only losses were to top-ranked teams -- No. 1 Florida on Oct. 10, 2009 and No. 1 Alabama on Nov. 3, 2012. LSU's last non-conference home loss was to UAB on Sept. 23, 2000.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 49 of the past 56 seasons.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 228-61-4 (.784) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. The Tigers are 26-26-3 (.500) at home during the day in that span.
- LSU has won 35 consecutive home games over non-conference opponents. **Les Miles** is 26-0 in non-conference home games.

No. 12 LSU Wins Cowboys Classic, 37-27

Zach Mettenberger connected on 16-of-32 passes for 251 yards and the LSU defense limited TCU to 249 total yards as the 12th-ranked Tigers opened 2013 with a 37-27 victory over the 20th-ranked Horned Frogs in the Cowboys Classic. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers kicked a field goal on the opening possession of the game and then recovered a TCU fumble on the ensuing kickoff. LSU tacked on another field goal for a 6-0 advantage before TCU took an offensive snap. After TCU pulled to within 6-3, J.C. Copeland extended the lead to 13-3 on a 1-yard dive to cap a 7-play, 80-yard drive for the Tigers. However, TCU responded on the very next play, returning the kickoff 100 yards to cut the margin to 13-10. LSU tacked on a third first half field goal as time expired in the second quarter for a 16-10 lead at halftime. After a Jalen Mills interception on TCU's first play of the second half, LSU's Terrence Magee raced 52-yards for a TD to stretch the lead to 23-10. TCU hung around, scoring on its next possession to get back to within 23-17. Another Magee TD run, this time a 3-yarder, stretched the lead to 30-17 late in the third quarter. A defensive stop by the Tigers forced TCU to punt on its next possession, pinning LSU inside its 5-yard line. A miscue on the quarterback exchange on a handoff to Alfred Blue resulted in a fumble at LSU's own 6-yard line. TCU scored two plays later to cut the deficit to 30-24 with 13 minutes to play. TCU kicked a field goal midway through the fourth quarter to get to within 30-27; however Odell Beckham Jr. returned the ensuing kickoff 75 yards to setup a 20-yard TD pass from Mettenberger to Jarvis Landry that sealed the victory for the Tigers. Mettenberger engineered an LSU offense that racked up 80 plays, 26 first downs, 448 yards of offense (197 rushing, 251 passing), and held the ball for 36 minutes. Defensively, LSU limited TCU to 249 total yards (114 rushing, 145 passing) and only 54 total plays. Magee led LSU with 95 rushing yards, while Landry caught 8 passes for 109 yards and score and Beckham Jr. added five receptions for 118 yards. Beckham Jr. accounted for 272 all-purpose yards, the sixth-highest total in school history.

Mettenberger Fires Five TDs as LSU Rolls Past UAB, 56-17

Zach Mettenberger threw for a school-record five TD passes and Odell Beckham Jr. scored four touchdowns and racked up 331 all-purpose yards as No. 9/11 LSU rolled past UAB, 56-17, in the home-opener for the Tigers. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers raced out to a 21-0 lead after the first quarter thanks to pair of Mettenberger-to-Beckham TD passes followed by a 1-yard run by Kenny Hilliard. LSU, which scored touchdowns on five straight first half possessions, extended the advantage to 28-0 on a 3-yard TD run by Jeremy Hill early in the second quarter. UAB scored 17 points in the second quarter to get to within 35-17 at halftime. Beckham scored his third TD of the game on a 27-yard pass from Mettenberger to open the third quarter for the Tigers, stretching the lead to 42-17. A Mettenberger-to-Jarvis Landry 14-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter increased the lead to 49-17 and broke the school's single-game touchdown pass record in the process. Beckham Jr. capped the scoring for the Tigers with a school-record 100-yard return of a missed 59-yard field goal by UAB to run the advantage to 56-17. The 100-yard return was the first of its kind in LSU history and pushed Beckham's all-purpose yardage to 331, the third-highest total in school history. For the game, LSU piled up 445 total yards (152 rushing, 293 passing), while limiting UAB to 296 total yards (160 rushing, 136 passing). Mettenberger hit on 16-of-19 passes for 282 yards and five scores with Beckham Jr. (5 for 136, 3 TDs) and Landry (5 for 71, 2 TDs) being the top targets. A total of nine players caught at least one pass for the Tigers. Hilliard led LSU in rushing with 54 yards on 11 carries, while Hill added 50 yards on six attempts. Lamin Barrow and Lamar Louis led the LSU defense with seven tackles apiece, while Jermauria Rasco had six tackles, two quarterback hurries and a sack.
