#### LSU Takes Top 10 Ranking And 4-0 Record On Road To Face No. 9/10 Georgia

LSU takes its No. 6 national ranking and 4-0 overall record on the road for its biggest test of the season on Saturday as the Tigers face No. 9 Georgia at 2:30 CT at Sanford Stadium in Athens, Ga. The LSU-Georgia game is this week's premier matchup in college football with CBS televising the contest and ESPN's College GameDay also being on site for an extensive preview. LSU, winners of 29 straight games during the month of September going back to 2006, opened SEC play last week with a 35-21 win over Auburn in Baton Rouge. The Tigers are off to a 4-0 start for the seventh straight year. LSU has yet to trail this year and the Tigers have outscored their opponents 173-88, which includes a 62-3 advantage in the first quarter. Georgia is 2-1 overall and 1-0 in league play after its 45-21 non-conference win over North Texas on Saturday. Saturday's meeting will be the eighth straight time that both teams go into the game ranked in the Top 25 and it will also be the 10th consecutive meeting that at least one of the teams go into the game ranked in the Top 10. The LSU-Georgia game will feature the top two quarterbacks in the SEC in terms of pass efficiency in **Zach Mettenberger** and Aaron Murray along with two of the top 3 running backs in **Jeremy Hill** (No. 3 at 117.0 yards per game) and Todd Gurley (No. 1 at 125.7 ypg). Hill leads the SEC in scoring with six rushing TDs (12.0 points per game), while Gurley is second with 10.0 points a contest (5 total TDs). LSU goes into the game No. 3 in the SEC in scoring (43.2), No. 6 in total offense with 480.2 yards per game (221.0 rushing, 259.2 passing), and No. 3 in total defense with 310.0 yards a contest (136.2 rushing, 173.8 passing). The Tigers are also allowing just 19.5 points per game, which ranks No. 5 in the league. Individually, Mettenberger has connected on 59-of-91 passes for 1,026 yards and 10 TDs (the most in school history through 4 games), while Hill has rushed for 351 yards and six scores. WRs **Jarvis Landry** (24 rec., 364 yards, 6 TDs) and **Odell Beckham Jr.** (20 rec., 389 yards, 4 TDs) have combined for 44 of LSU's 66 receptions and all 10 of the Tigers' TDs in the passing game. Beckham Jr. leads the SEC and ranks No. 4 nationally in all-purpose yards (197.5). Defensively, LB **Lamin Barrow** leads the team with 22 tackles, while DT **Ego Ferguson** (21 tackles) and S **Micah Eugene** (21) follow.

### NOTEABLES

- For the first time in the SEC Era, LSU has opened a season by scoring 30 points or more in its first four games. Prior to joining SEC, LSU did it in 1911 and 1928.

- LSU hasn't trailed this year, leading for all 240 minutes of actual game time.

- LSU has outscored its opponents 62-3 in the first quarter this year.

- LSU has won 29 consecutive games during the month of September, a streak that goes back to the 2006 season. LSU's last loss in September came on Sept. 16 at Auburn by a 7-3 count.

- LSU has played 14 true freshmen so far this season. The 14 true freshmen

- rank as the nation's third-highest total, trailing Texas A&M (17) and UCLA (15). In nine years under **Les Miles**, LSU has sent a total of 87 true freshmen to the field.

- LSU has won 34 straight games when reaching 30 points and the Tigers are 62-4 under **Les Miles** when hitting the 30-point mark.

- All four running backs listed on the LSU depth chart have led the Tigers in rushing for at least one game in their career and all four have at least one 100-yard game to their credit.

- LSU is riding a streak of 69 consecutive appearances in the AP Top 25, which ranks as the nation's second-longest streak behind Alabama.

- **Zach Mettenberger** is now 14-3 as the starting quarterback for the Tigers. Dating back to last year, Mettenberger has thrown for 250 yards or more in 6 of LSU's last 9 games.

- Dating back to last season, junior WR **Jarvis Landry** has caught 57 passes in LSU's last nine games and he's caught at least one TD pass in six straight and eight of last nine contests.

- LSU has recorded 400-plus yards of total offense in each of the first four games of a season for the first time in school history. The 1,921 yards are the most through the first four games of a season since the 1977 team had 1,950.

# Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • NINTH SEASON

It's called the "Miles Method" and it's the mission of LSU football program under ninth-year head coach Les Miles. The "Miles Method" lays the foundation for the organization and it calls for LSU to run the finest football program in the country, one where players can have an experience that's second to none and gives them every opportunity to compete for championships on the field, earn a degree and grow personally by giving back to the community.

In eight years, the "Miles Method" has proved to be a winning formula as the Tigers have won more games than any program in the Southeastern Conference over that span (89), while capturing a pair of SEC titles (2007, 2011) and reaching the BCS National Championship Game two times (LSU won the 2007 national title).

Since Miles took over in 2005, LSU has registered five top 10 finishes with three coming in the top five, won double-figure games six times, produced 18 first-team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. LSU also leads the SEC with 51 NFL Draft picks during that span, which includes 12 first round selections.

Miles has climbed to second in school history in career victories with 89, trailing only Charles McClendon, who won 137 games in 18 years with the Tigers. Miles is also the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it now three times - and in 2005, he became the only first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's title game.

In the classroom, 172 football players have earned their degree since Miles took over and for the second straight year, LSU ranked second to only Vanderbilt in the SEC in graduation rates at 77 percent. Under Miles, LSU has produced 134 players who have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status.

LSU's community service presence is impactful as football players routinely donate time giving back to the Baton Rouge area through a variety of avenues, including appearances at schools, hospitals and many other charitable causes. It's through these community service ventures that Miles and his team get a better understanding of what it means to wear an LSU uniform and the impact that can be made on those who are less fortunate.

Now in his ninth season with the Tigers, the foundation for LSU football is stronger than ever. With wins coming at a record-setting pace, graduation rates the most for any public university in the SEC, and with six-straight recruiting classes rated among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of the premier programs in college football, setting a standard that has the rest of the nation chasing.

### Series Notes:

LSU and Georgia, both Charter members of the SEC, meet for the 30th time on Saturday in Athens ... LSU leads the overall series with the Bulldogs, 16-12-1 ... Of the 29 previous meetings between the teams, three have come in the SEC Championship Game in Atlanta ... LSU is 2-1 vs. Georgia in those games, winning 34-13 in 2003 and 42-10 in 2011 ... Georgia claimed the 2005 SEC title with a 34-14 win over the Tigers ... CBS has televised seven straight LSU-Georgia games ... Saturday's meeting will be the eighth straight time that both teams go into the game ranked in the Top 25 ... This will also be the 10th straight time that at least one of the teams goes into the contest ranked in the Top 10 ... LSU has won last two meetings between teams which includes the 42-10 win in the 2011 SEC title game ... In the last regular-season meeting between the teams, LSU won 20-13 in Athens in 2009 ... LSU is 7-6 all-time against Georgia in Athens ... Teams played just twice in the 70s and twice in the 80s ... Since the SEC expansion in 1992, LSU and Georgia have met nine times with Georgia holding a 5-4 advantage in those games ... With his 2009 win over Georgia, Miles completed the sweep of having at least one victory over every SEC team (Note: that was before the addition of Texas A&M and Missouri to SEC) ... Counting Saturday's game and since 1999, the teams have played in Athens four times, Atlanta three times and Baton Rouge twice ... **Les Miles** is 2-2 vs. Georgia.

## NOTEBOOK

### Les Miles vs. The SEC

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 50-19 against SEC teams (all games) since taking over for the Tigers in 2005. The 50 wins include two victories in the SEC Championship Game, while two of the 19 losses include a defeat to Georgia in the 2005 SEC title game and the loss to Alabama in the 2012 BCS National Championship game. In games that count towards the SEC standings, Miles is 48-17.

### Les Miles Is 18-8 vs. SEC East

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 18-8 in all games against teams from the SEC Eastern Division, which includes a 2-1 mark in the SEC title game and a 15-7 record in SEC regular season contests. The Tigers have won eight of their last nine games against SEC East foes with the only during that span coming at No. 10 Florida on Oct. 6 last season. LSU is the only SEC Western Division team who has to play both Georgia and Florida during the regular season this year.

### LSU's Georgia Ties

LSU quarterback **Zach Mettenberger** originally signed with Georgia out of high school and played the 2009 season with the Bulldogs ... He did not see any game action and then transferred to Butler (Kan.) Community College for the 2010 season ... Mettenberger's mom - Tammy Mettenberger - is an administrative secretary in the Georgia Football Office ... Former LSU student equipment manager John Brooks is an associate AD for internal operations at Georgia ... Former LSU academic advisor Ted White is associate AD for academic services at Georgia.

### Peach State Tigers

LSU has seven players on its roster who call Georgia home: QB **Zach Mettenberger** (Watkinsville), QB **Anthony Jennings** (Marietta), WR **Quantavious Leslie** (Hogansville), FB **J.C. Copeland** (LaGrange), SNP **Reid Ferguson** (Buford), OL **Andy Dodd** (Lindale), and OG **Vadal Alexander** (Buford).

### LSU In Road Games Under Les Miles

LSU is 26-10 in road games under **Les Miles**, which includes a 22-10 mark in SEC road games. The Tigers have won eight of their last nine road games dating back to the start of the 2011 season. The only loss during that span was a 14-6 setback at No. 10 Florida on Oct. 6 last season. Four of those eight victories have come against Top 25 teams. The 26-10 mark does not include neutral site games.

### ESPN's College Gameday To Broadcast From Athens

ESPN College GameDay will be on hand in Athens and the show airs from 8-11 a.m. CT on ESPN. It will be the 21st time LSU is involved in a game with ESPN College GameDay on location. The Tigers will have now made at least one appearance on the popular show in each of the past 11 seasons. LSU is 14-5 in games in which ESPN College GameDay is on hand. ### Head Coach Les Miles – Making History With the Tigers

The following is a quick look at **Les Miles'** notable accomplishments during his nine years and 109 games (89-20 record) as head coach of the Tigers:

- Has led the Tigers to a 4-0 start for the seventh consecutive season, and he is the only coach in school history to do that.
- With 10 or more wins six times at LSU, Miles joined Bear Bryant (13 at Alabama), Steve Spurrier (9 at Florida), Philip Fulmer (9 at Tennessee), Mark Richt (8 at Georgia) and Vince Dooley (7 at Georgia) as the only coaches in SEC history to have six or more 10-win seasons at the same school.
- Fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), 70 wins (87 games), and 80 wins (98 games) in school history. With one more victory, he will become the fastest to reach 90 wins.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011 ... Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it three times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year, doing it twice (2010, '11).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 15 wins over coaches who have won national titles
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school - and to six overall (the most at the school).
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007).

### LSU's Dynamic Receiving Duo of Odell Beckham, Jr. and Jarvis Landry

LSU's offense under new offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron** has thrived in its first four games as **Odell Beckham Jr.** and **Jarvis Landry** have combined for 44 receptions for 753 yards and 10 receiving touchdowns. Landry leads the SEC in receiving touchdowns with six, while Beckham Jr. is second with four.

- **Landry** has caught 57 passes in LSU's last eight games with 10 touchdowns. He's caught eight passes or more in four of LSU's last nine games. Landry has recorded at least one receiving touchdown in six straight games dating back to last year's Arkansas contest. He is the first LSU player to do that since Dwayne Bowe did it in seven straight games in 2005.
- **Landry's** six TDs are the most by an LSU player through the first four games of a season since Carlos Carson had six in 1977. Landry is tied for second nationally in receiving touchdowns with six, joining Louisville's Devante Parker, Troy's Eric Thomas and Wyoming's Dominic Ruffan. Brandin Cooks of Oregon State leads the nation with seven TDs through the first four games.
- **Landry** is the first LSU player to record at least one receiving touchdown in each of the first four games of a season.
- **Landry's** 24 catches are the most by an LSU player through the first four games of a season since Michael Clayton had 25 through the first four contests of 2003.
- **Landry** notched a career-high 118 receiving yards on seven catches in the win over Auburn in week four. It was his third career 100-yard receiving game and second of the season.
- **Beckham Jr.** has accounted for four career 100-yard games and two this season. His 97.2 receiving yards per game lead LSU and rank third in the SEC and 26th nationally. He has caught 20 passes for 389 yards.
- Both **Beckham Jr.** (118) and **Landry** (109) went over 100 yards receiving against TCU. It marked the first time that two LSU players went over 100 yards receiving in the same game since Josh Reed (239) and Michael Clayton (120) did it in the 2002 Sugar Bowl against Illinois. It was also the first time LSU had two 100-yard receivers in a season-opener since Reed (137) and Jerel Myers (117) did it in 2000 against Western Carolina.
- With his 136 receiving yards against UAB, **Beckham Jr.** became the first LSU player with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Dwayne Bowe did it in 2006. Bowe had 111 against Kentucky (Oct. 14, 2006) and 106 against Fresno State (Oct. 21, 2006). Beckham Jr. was the first LSU player to open a season with back-to-back 100-yard receiving contests since Michael Clayton did it as a freshman in the first three games of 2003.

### All-Purpose OBJ3

**Odell Beckham Jr.** leads the SEC and ranks fourth nationally in all-purpose yards with 197.5 per game highlighted by the first missed field goal return for a touchdown in school history when he raced 100 yards for a score on a missed 59-yard attempt with 2:11 remaining in the third quarter of the UAB game in week 2. He is averaging 21.4 yards every time he touches the ball. Beckham Jr. is up for the Paul Hornung Award this year, which is presented annually to college football's most versatile player.

- **Beckham Jr.** was believed to be the first FBS player to return a missed short field goal for a touchdown since Richie Iuzzi of Clemson did it vs. Georgia on Sept. 28, 1968 (108 yards, 100 statistically). Others who have done it: Don Guest of California, 109 yards vs. Washington on Sept. 17, 1966; James Elmore of Tennessee, 95 yards vs. Carson-Newman on Sept. 25, 1926.

- **Beckham Jr.** has racked up 790 all-purpose yards in two games: 389 receiving yards, 33 rushing yards, 78 punt return yards, 190 kick return yards and 100 miscellaneous yards (which is a new category created by the NCAA following his missed field goal return for a touchdown).

- **Beckham's** 272 all-purpose yard game against TCU tied the sixth-best mark in LSU single-game annals (also held by Kevin Faulk vs. Kentucky, 1997), while his 331 yard all-purpose game against UAB was third in LSU single-game history and the most AP yards by an LSU player since Josh Reed had 338 against Alabama on Nov. 3, 2001. It also tied for eighth in SEC single-game history and was the most by an SEC player since Darren McFadden had 355 against South Carolina on Nov. 3, 2007.

- **Beckham Jr.** has recorded three special teams touchdowns in his career: one missed field goal return in 2013 and two punt returns in 2012.

- **Beckham Jr.** recorded four total touchdowns against UAB in week 2, becoming the first LSU player to achieve that feat since LaBrandon Toefield did it with four rushing TDs against Utah State on Sept. 8, 2001.

### Zach Mettenberger On Record Pace In Second Year as Starter at QB

Senior quarterback **Zach Mettenberger** is on a record-breaking pace four weeks into the season. His 10 passing touchdowns are the most by a quarterback in the first four games in LSU history. Mettenberger's 1,026 passing yards are also the most through the first four games in LSU history. His 59 completions in the first three games are the most by an LSU QB since JaMarcus Russell had 63 to open the 2006 season (13 vs. UL-Lafayette, 13 vs. Arizona, 20 at Auburn, 17 vs. Tulane).

- **Mettenberger** was the only QB in LSU history to throw for 250 or more yards in each of the first three games of a season. Dating back to last year, the senior has thrown for 250 yards or more in six of LSU's last nine games. He owns a 14-3 mark as a starter in his career, including a 10-1 mark in Tiger Stadium.

- **Mettenberger** ranks second in the SEC and sixth nationally in pass efficiency (193.6) and he is fourth nationally in passing yards per completion (17.4).

- **Mettenberger** recorded 12 passing TDs all of last season. Through four games, he is already up to 10 which ranks second in the SEC behind Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel who has 12. For his career, Mettenberger is up to 23 touchdown passes.

- **Mettenberger** shattered the LSU single-game passing touchdown record with five against UAB in week 2, including three in the first half. As a team, the five passing touchdowns for LSU against UAB were the most by the squad since recording five in the 2000 season-opener against Western Carolina. Mettenberger became the first LSU QB to throw three or more TDs in a half since JaMarcus Russell fired three in the first half of the Mississippi State game on Sept. 30, 2006.

- **Mettenberger's** 251 passing yards against TCU were the most in an LSU season-opener since JaMarcus Russell threw for 253 in the 2006 opener against Louisiana-Lafayette. He also converted 9-of-15 third-down passes in the TCU contest.

### More On the LSU Offense

- LSU has recorded over 400 yards of total offense in each of its first four games, which is a first in school history.
- LSU's 1,921 yards of total offense is the most through the first four games of a season since the 1977 squad registered 1,950 yards (320 vs. Indiana, school-record 746 vs. Rice, 455 vs. Florida and 429 vs. Vanderbilt).

- LSU ranks seventh nationally with 28 plays of 20-plus yards from scrimmage. Texas A&M leads the SEC with 31. The Tigers have also produced 75 plays of 10-plus yards, which is 11th nationally and second in the SEC. (A&M with 83).
- LSU's 10 passing touchdowns rank second in the SEC behind only Texas A&M's 14.
- LSU has converted 18 of its 20 redzone chances (14 touchdowns, four field goals). Note: The victory formation to end the Kent State game does NOT count against LSU's redzone chances. The Tigers were 3-of-5 in redzone opportunities against Auburn with a fumble and a failed fake field goal attempt.
- The Tigers rank third in the SEC in third-down conversions, converting 26-of-46 for 56.5 percent. In the season-opener against TCU, LSU converted 13-of-19 third downs, the most in the **Les Miles** era and the most since converting 13 against Kentucky on Oct. 13, 2001.
- LSU averaged 10.4 yards per play against Kent State in week 3, a figure that ranked second in school history. The record is 11.1 against Kentucky on Oct. 14, 2006.
- LSU is outscoring opponents 62-3 in first quarters this season. TCU managed a field goal in the season-opener.

### Jeremy Hill Named SEC Offensive Player of the Week After Auburn Performance

**Jeremy Hill** was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in LSU's 35-21 win over Auburn on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. Hill rushed for career-highs of 184 yards and three touchdowns on 25 carries in leading LSU past Auburn. The sophomore scored the first two times he touched the ball – going 49 yards on the first TD and then 12-yard on his next carry – to give LSU a 14-0 lead just minutes into the contest. Hill added a third touchdown on a 6-yard run in the third quarter that stretched LSU's lead to 28-7. He also set up LSU's third touchdown of the game when he raced 54-yards down to the Auburn 1-yard line.

- The 184 rushing yards by **Hill** against Auburn were the most by an LSU player since Alley Broussard set the school record with 250 yards in a win over Ole Miss in 2004. The 184 yards were also the most by an SEC player in any game this season.
- **Hill**, who has only played 14 career games, is already tied for ninth in LSU career 100-yard rushing performances with six. He is tied with Justin Vincent (2003-06) and Joseph Addai (2001-05).
- **Hill** is the first LSU player with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since he himself did it three in a row last season (vs. South Carolina, at Texas A&M, vs. Alabama).
- The 184 yards against Auburn also propelled **Hill** over the 1,000 yard mark in his career. He now has 1,106 yards on 184 carries with 18 touchdowns and 0 fumbles lost heading into the Georgia game.
- In games that **Hill** has at least 10 carries, he's scored a touchdown in nine of those 10 games and he's reached 100 yards six times.

### LSU Has Just 8th Game of 300+ Rushing Yards and 250+ Passing Yards In School History

For just the eighth time in school history, LSU had 300+ rushing yards and 250+ passing yards in the 45-13 win over Kent State in week 3. LSU finished the Kent State game with 571 total yards (307 rushing, 264 passing). It was the first time since the Louisiana Tech contest in 2007 that LSU had reached those numbers in the same game. Here's a look at the other games in school history that LSU recorded 300+ rushing yards and 250+ passing yards in the same contest:

### Terrence Magee's Onto The Scene

Entering the TCU season-opener, junior running back **Terrence Magee** had totaled only 28 carries in his career. Magee delivered a breakout game against the Horned Frogs, rushing for a game-high 95 yards on 13 carries with two touchdowns. The highlight came with 13:11 in the third quarter when he raced a career-long 52 yards for a score. Magee then went over the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career with nine carries for 108 yards -- all in the second half -- in the win over Kent State in week three. Magee ranks second on the team in rushing with 54.8 yards per game. All four LSU running backs -- Magee, **Alfred Blue**, **Kenny Hilliard** and **Jeremy Hill** -- have led the Tigers in rushing in a game before and all four have recorded multiple touchdown games in their careers. Hill leads the way with 18 career rushing TDs followed by Hilliard, (15) Blue (10) and Magee (4).

### LSU's 47-7 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 47-7 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 20-5 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. The only seven losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005. In Miles' tenure at LSU, the Tigers have a combined turnover margin of +61. LSU was +20 in 2011, +16 last season and +1 this year.

### NON-CONFERENCE REGULAR SEASON WIN STREAK

LSU owns the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak, which stands at an NCAA FBS record 44 games. The last time the Tigers lost a non-conference regular season game was Sept. 1, 2002, at #16 Virginia Tech.

## September Streaking: LSU Has Won 29 Straight Games During September

LSU brings a 29-game winning streak during the month of September into the Georgia game. LSU coach **Les Miles** is 32-2 in September games at LSU. The last time LSU lost a game during the month of September came at Auburn during the 2006 season by a 7-3 count. LSU hasn't lost a game in Tiger Stadium in September since a 30-27 overtime loss to Tennessee in 2005 (Miles' first home game). LSU has also won 32 straight games during the months of August/September combined, which leads the nation.

## LSU is 34-4 Under Les Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 34-4 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2013 roster, LSU has 10 career 100-yard games to its credit. **Jeremy Hill** has six, **Kenny Hilliard** has one, **Terrence Magee** has one and **Alfred Blue** has two. LSU's only four losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came vs. Clemson in 2012 (Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards); Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards). LSU has produced three 100-yard rushers in a game this season when both Hill (117 yards on 11 carries) and Magee (108 yards on 9 carries) did it against Kent State in week 3. Hill then followed up with a career-best 184 yards on 21 carries a week later in the win over Auburn.

## 14 True Freshmen Have Played This Season

**Les Miles** has never shyed away from playing true freshmen in his nine seasons at LSU. A total of 87 true freshmen have seen the field under his watch, including 14 this season (eight on defense, five on offense, one special teams only). That number ranks second nationally behind Texas A&M's 17. The following true freshmen have played this season: 16 **Tre'Davious White** (CB, special teams), 40 **Duke Riley** (LB, special teams), 49 **Melvin Jones** (special teams), 52 **Kendell Beckwith** (LB/special teams), 89 **DeSean Smith** (TE), 91 **Christian LaCouture** (DT), 10 **Anthony Jennings** (QB), 76 **Josh Boutte** (OT), **Jeryl Brazil** (RB), 21 **Rashard Robinson** (DB), 29 **Rickey Jefferson** (DB), 46 **Tashawn Bower** (DE), 77 **Ethan Pocic** (C) and 92 **Lewis Neal** (DE). Last year, 15 true freshmen played for LSU. That total of 15 ranked second nationally with Ohio State behind only TCU and Texas, who each had 16 true freshmen play. Expect the trend to continue.

## Colby DelaWHossaye?

Under **Les Miles**, LSU has produced three out of the top five most accurate career kickers in school history in Josh Jasper (2008-10), Drew Alleman (2011-12) and Colt David (2005-06). Redshirt freshman PK **Colby Delahoussaye**, a walk-on from New Iberia, takes over the field goal and extra point duties this season after the departure of Alleman. Delahoussaye immediately made an impact in his debut, booting 3-of-3 field goals and 4-of-4 PATs in the season-opening win over TCU. He connected from 28 yards and 23 yards twice. Delahoussaye's three made field goals were the most by an LSU kicker in his debut since Andre LaFleur was 3-of-4 against Mississippi State on Sept. 11, 1993. For the season, he is 4-of-4 on field goals and 23-of-23 on extra points through three games.

## Ten First-Time Starters

Ten LSU players have made their first career starts in the first four games of the season (3 on offense, 7 on defense).

**Danielle Hunter** became the latest addition when he made his first start at defensive end against Auburn. **Tre'Davious White** is the only true freshman to start this year, doing so against Kent State and Auburn. White became the first true freshman to start at cornerback for LSU since Tyrann Mathieu started against UL-Monroe on Nov. 13, 2010.

## LSU Streak of Consecutive Weeks In AP Top 25 Reaches 69 Straight After Week 3

LSU's streak of consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 has reached 69, which ranks second to only Alabama in terms of current streaks. The Tigers remained No. 6 in the Associated Press poll and moved up to No. 6 in the USA Today Coaches' poll following the win over Auburn. Since the start of the 2011 season, LSU has been ranked in the top 10 in now 35 of the 37 weeks of the AP poll. This was the 13th consecutive season that the Tigers were ranked in the preseason polls as LSU came in No. 12 in the AP and No. 13 in the Coaches Top 25. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 127 of the 131 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 143 of 147 games ranked in the top 25, including 108 of 110 games under Miles. LSU has an 87-19 record in games played as a Top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 against Arkansas in the regular-season finale and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. ### No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Lamin Barrow

A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior linebacker **Lamin Barrow** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2013 season. Barrow was presented the jersey by coach **Les Miles** following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp on Sunday, Aug. 4. Barrow is LSU's leading returning tackler after racking up 104 a year ago. He recorded a season-best 11 tackles and a fumble recovery in the win over Auburn. He is the first LSU player to return following a 100-tackle season since Kelvin Sheppard in 2010. Jersey No. 18 was born when quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958 in 2003. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Three of the former No. 18s are still currently playing in the NFL. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 110 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 84-8 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 51-4. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 50-0. ### LSU Has Scored 20 Special Teams TDs In Les Miles Era

LSU has recorded 20 special teams touchdown under **Les Miles**, including the most recent one when **Odell Beckham Jr.** became the first player in school history to return a missed field goal for a touchdown. Beckham caught a missed 59-yard field goal in the third quarter of the UAB game and raced a school-record 109 yards (statistically 100 yards) for the score. Under Miles, LSU has returned 11 punts for touchdowns, 3 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, 1 on a fake field goal and 1 on a missed field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all nine seasons under Miles. LSU is 18-1 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. In addition, LSU holds the nation's longest consecutive years streak (12) of returning a punt or kickoff for a touchdown. The Tigers have returned at least one punt or kickoff for a score every season dating back to 2001. The following is a breakdown of LSU's special teams touchdowns under Miles:

#### LSU Extends FBS Record For Consecutive Non-Conference Regular Season Wins To 44

LSU extended its Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) record of consecutive non-conference regular season wins to 44 with its victory over Kent State. Last season, LSU broke the FBS record for consecutive non-conference regular season wins, surpassing the mark of Kansas State who claimed 39 straight from 1993-2003. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular season game since falling at Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va., on Sept. 1. **Les Miles** has accounted for 34 of the 44 wins during the streak, and he is 34-0 all-time in non-conference regular season games in his nine seasons at LSU. Former coach Nick Saban accounted for the 10 other victories from 2002-04. Under Miles, the Tigers have outscored non-conference regular season opponents a combined 1,355-374. #### LSU The New DBU

Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL Draft with 12. Alabama and Texas are the next closest with nine. The Tigers have produced a defensive back selection in seven consecutive drafts. Six LSU defensive players were selected in the first three rounds of the 2013 NFL Draft, the most selected from any school in modern draft history. A total of 11 former LSU defensive backs are on active NFL rosters, which leads the nation. The 11 are the most from any school at any position in the entire league. LSU is also tops nationally in defensive tackles on NFL rosters with six.

#### LSU: The SEC's Winningest Team Since 2005

LSU is the winningest program in the SEC since the start of **Les Miles'** tenure as head coach in 2005 as the Tigers have posted an 89-21 mark during that span. The 89 victories for LSU are three better than Florida, while the Tigers are also tops in final poll rankings. LSU is also second nationally in wins since 2005 behind only Boise State (95).

## Big Second Half Leads LSU to SEC Championship Game Win over Georgia, 42-10

For the second straight week, LSU had to overcome a double-digit first half deficit as the Tigers used a punt return for a touchdown by Tyrann Mathieu to ignite a rally en route to a 42-10 win over Georgia in the SEC Championship Game. Trailing 10-0 after a listless first quarter, Mathieu got the Tigers going with a 62-yard punt return for a score that shifted the momentum heading into halftime. LSU went the entire first half without a first down as the Tigers managed only 12 total yards at halftime. While the LSU offense was struggling, the Tiger defense kept the game close, holding Georgia to one yard in the second quarter. The second half belonged to LSU as the Tigers forced a turnover on Georgia's opening possession and then scored two plays later on a 15-yard run by Kenny Hilliard for their first lead of the game at 14-10. Georgia was forced to punt on its next possession and Mathieu struck again, returning the punt 47 yards to the Bulldog 17-yard line. The Tigers needed just four plays to score, this time on a 4-yard run by Hilliard, stretching the lead to 21-10. Hilliard added an 8-yard receiving TD from Jordan Jefferson to close out the third quarter scoring for LSU with the Tigers leading 28-10. LSU tacked on two more TDs in the fourth quarter – one coming on a 48-yard run Alfred Blue and the other on a 45-yard interception return by Morris Claiborne as the Tigers outscored the Bulldogs, 35-0, in the second half. After falling behind 10-0, LSU's defense forced Georgia to either punt or into a turnover on 10 of its final 11 possessions of the game. Mathieu earned game MVP honors with four tackles, one tackle for loss, one fumble recovery and a punt return TD. LSU rushed for 207 yards and limited Georgia to just 296 total yards.

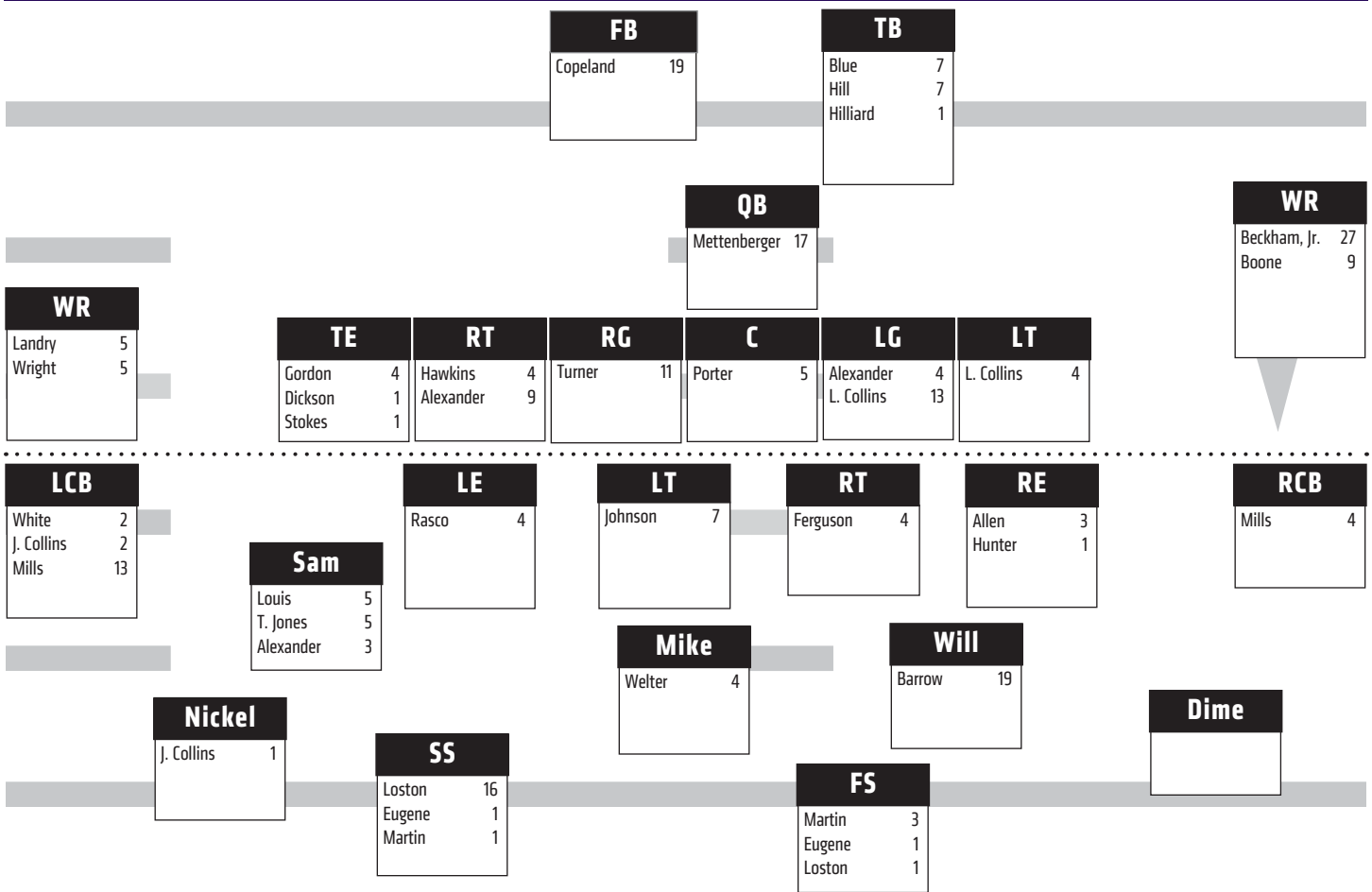

## No. 12 LSU Wins Cowboys Classic, 37-27

Zach Mettenberger connected on 16-of-32 passes for 251 yards and the LSU defense limited TCU to 249 total yards as the 12th-ranked Tigers opened 2013 with a 37-27 victory over the 20th-ranked Horned Frogs in the Cowboys Classic. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers kicked a field goal on the opening possession of the game and then recovered a TCU fumble on the ensuing kickoff. LSU tacked on another field goal for a 6-0 advantage before TCU took an offensive snap. After TCU pulled to within 6-3, J.C. Copeland extended the lead to 13-3 on a 1-yard dive to cap a 7-play, 80-yard drive for the Tigers. However, TCU responded on the very next play, returning the kickoff 100 yards to cut the margin to 13-10. LSU tacked on a third first half field goal as time expired in the second quarter for a 16-10 lead at halftime. After a Jalen Mills interception on TCU's first play of the second half, LSU's Terrence Magee raced 52-yards for a TD to stretch the lead to 23-10. TCU hung around, scoring on its next possession to get back to within 23-17. Another Magee TD run, this time a 3-yarder, stretched the lead to 30-17 late in the third quarter. A defensive stop by the Tigers forced TCU to punt on its next possession, pinning LSU inside its 5-yard line. A miscue on the quarterback exchange on a handoff to Alfred Blue resulted in a fumble at LSU's own 6-yard line. TCU scored two plays later to cut the deficit to 30-24 with 13 minutes to play. TCU kicked a field goal midway through the fourth quarter to get to within 30-27; however Odell Beckham Jr. returned the ensuing kickoff 75 yards to setup a 20-yard TD pass from Mettenberger to Jarvis Landry that sealed the victory for the Tigers. Mettenberger engineered an LSU offense that racked up 80 plays, 26 first downs, 448 yards of offense (197 rushing, 251 passing), and held the ball for 36 minutes. Defensively, LSU limited TCU to 249 total yards (114 rushing, 145 passing) and only 54 total plays. Magee led LSU with 95 rushing yards, while Landry caught 8 passes for 109 yards and score and Beckham Jr. added five receptions for 118 yards. Beckham Jr. accounted for 272 all-purpose yards, the sixth-highest total in school history.

## Mettenberger Fires Five TDs as LSU Rolls Past UAB, 56-17

Zach Mettenberger threw for a school-record five TD passes and Odell Beckham Jr. scored four touchdowns and racked up 331 all-purpose yards as No. 9/11 LSU rolled past UAB, 56-17, in the home-opener for the Tigers. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers raced out to a 21-0 lead after the first quarter thanks to pair of Mettenberger-to-Beckham TD passes followed by a 1-yard run by Kenny Hilliard. LSU, which scored touchdowns on five straight first half possessions, extended the advantage to 28-0 on a 3-yard TD run by Jeremy Hill early in the second quarter. UAB scored 17 points in the second quarter to get to within 35-17 at halftime. Beckham scored his third TD of the game on a 27-yard pass from Mettenberger to open the third quarter for the Tigers, stretching the lead to 42-17. A Mettenberger-to-Jarvis Landry 14-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter increased the lead to 49-17 and broke the school's single-game touchdown pass record in the process. Beckham Jr. capped the scoring for the Tigers with a school-record 100-yard return of a missed 59-yard field goal by UAB to run the advantage to 56-17. The 100-yard return was the first of its kind in LSU history and pushed Beckham's all-purpose yardage to 331, the third-highest total in school history. For the game, LSU piled up 445 total yards (152 rushing, 293 passing), while limiting UAB to 296 total yards (160 rushing, 136 passing). Mettenberger hit on 16-of-19 passes for 282 yards and five scores with Beckham Jr. (5 for 136, 3 TDs) and Landry (5 for 71, 2 TDs) being the top targets. A total of nine players caught at least one pass for the Tigers. Hilliard led LSU in rushing with 54 yards on 11 carries, while Hill added 50 yards on six attempts. Lamin Barrow and Lamar Louis led the LSU defense with seven tackles apiece, while Jermauria Rasco had six tackles, two quarterback hurries and a sack.

## No. 8 LSU Runs Past Kent State, 45-13

LSU racked up a season-high 571 total yards, including 307 on the ground, as the eighth-ranked Tigers jumped out to a 21-0 first quarter lead and never trailed in a 45-13 win over Kent State in Tiger Stadium. LSU improved to 3-0 with the win and ran the nation's longest non-conference regular-season winning streak to 44. LSU also ran its record to 34-0 under Les Miles in non-conference regular-season games. LSU scored on its first five possessions as the Tigers built a 31-10 lead at halftime. **Jeremy Hill** scored on runs of 58 and 12 yards in the first quarter, while **Jarvis Landry** caught first half TD passes of 21 and 31 yards for Zach Mettenberger. **Colby Delahoussaye** added a 25-yard field goal as the Tigers built a 31-10 lead at halftime. **Odell Beckham Jr.** scored on a 5-yard pass from Mettenberger to open the fourth quarter and **Terrence Magee** added a 12-yard TD run to cap the scoring for the Tigers. Hill led LSU with 117 rushing yards and a pair of TDs, while Magee had his first career 100-yard game with 108 yards and a score. Mettenberger connected on 13-of-18 passes for 264 yards and three TDs. For the game, the Tigers averaged 10.4 yards per play, the second-highest single-game total in school history. Defensively, LSU limited Kent State to 248 total yards (58 rushing, 190 passing). **Ego Ferguson** led the Tigers with 8 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

## Hill Carries LSU Past Auburn In SEC Opener, 35-21

**Jeremy Hill** rushed for a career-high 184 yards as the No. 6/7 Tigers raced out to a 21-0 lead and then held off a late Auburn rally for a 35-21 victory in a rain-soaked Tiger Stadium. For the fourth straight game, LSU scored first as the Tigers took a 7-0 lead on their first possession of the game when Hill raced 49-yards for a TD on LSU's third play of the game. Auburn's punter muffed the snap on its next possession, giving LSU the ball at the Auburn 10-yard line. One play later, Hill scampered 10 yards for the score and a 14-0 LSU advantage. LSU stretched the lead to 21-0 after a 54-yard run by Hill setup a 1-yard scoring plunge by fullback **J.C. Copeland** early in the second quarter. The score remained that way until early in the third quarter when Auburn got its first points following a **Zach Mettenberger** interception. LSU answered the Auburn TD with a 7-play, 75-yard drive capped on a 6-yard run by Hill, extending the cushion back to three touchdowns at 28-7. Auburn pulled to within 28-14 on a 10-play, 94-yard drive. However, LSU answered again, this time going 81 yards on 7 plays capped with a Mettenberger 32-yard TD toss to **Jarvis Landry** to extend the margin to 35-14. Auburn scored midway through the fourth quarter on pull to within 35-21, however, LSU's defense came up with an interception and then stopped Auburn on downs on its final two possessions to clinch the victory. For the game, LSU racked up 457 total yards (228 rushing, 229 passing). Mettenberger connected on 14-of-22 passes for 229 yards, one TD and an interception, his first of the year. Landry led the Tigers with seven receptions for 118 yards and a score. Defensively, LB **D.J. Welter** and LB **Lamin Barrow** each had 11 tackles to pace the Tigers.
