Tigers Open SEC Play on Saturday with Road Match at Vanderbilt

The LSU Soccer team will look to build momentum as it opens Southeastern Conference play on Saturday night with a trip to Nashville, Tenn., to face the Vanderbilt Commodores in a match that is set to kick off at 7 p.m. CT at the VU Soccer Complex. The Tigers wrapped up their non-conference season on Sunday after with a hard-fought 1-0 victory over the Rice Owls at the Rice Soccer Stadium in Houston, Texas. It marked LSU's first victory in the series as the Tigers leveled their mark at 1-1-1 all-time against the Owls on the soccer pitch. They also posted a 1-0 shutout of Vanderbilt in their last meeting in the series when then-freshman **Haley Emerson** came off the bench for the first time in the game in the second overtime period to score the game-winning Golden Goal in the 108th minute for her first career goal as an LSU Tiger. The victory also improved LSU's record of 5-3-1 against Vanderbilt in eight previous seasons with head coach **Brian Lee** leading the program. Vanderbilt turned out some impressive results during the non-conference season, including a 2-2 draw at home with Oklahoma State on Aug. 25, a 2-1 win at Memphis on Aug. 30 and a 4-3 road win over 23rd-ranked Wisconsin on Sept. 6. LSU earned one of the most impressive victories by any SEC team during the non-conference season with a 1-0 shutout of the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the team's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic on Sept. 8. The Commodores are led by the likes of sophomore striker Cheyna Williams, who has bagged an SEC-leading eight goals and 18 points on the year as one of the breakout stars in the league. Vanderbilt has scored the second-most goals in the SEC as a team with 21 goals on the year, while the Commodores have also allowed the most goals of any SEC team with 19 goals allowed to their opponents through eight matches on the year.

STORYLINES

- This weekend marks the start of Southeastern Conference play as LSU and Vanderbilt will play Saturday.
- The Tigers scored a 1-0 double overtime victory over the Commodores in the last meeting for the two clubs at the LSU Soccer Stadium in Baton Rouge a year ago.
- LSU snapped a two-game losing skid to Vanderbilt with their win a year ago as then-freshman **Haley Emerson** netted the game-winner in the 108th minute in overtime.
- Emerson, who scored her first collegiate goal in double overtime of last year's match, is redshirting this season with a knee injury.
- The Tigers and Commodores are each coming off victories in their last outings as LSU pitched a 1-0 road shutout at Rice and Vanderbilt defeated Georgia State at home by a 4-0 margin last Sunday.
- While the Tigers have only posted a 6-9-2 mark in the all-time series with Vanderbilt, they own a winning 5-3-1 mark in eight previous seasons under head coach **Brian Lee**.
- While the teams have gone back and forth over the last three seasons, LSU posted a four-game winning streak and five-game unbeaten streak against the Commodores with a 4-0-1 record from 2006-09.
- The Tigers are 4-2-2 in SEC openers under Lee's direction, despite dropping their conference opener by a score of 1-0 against 10th-ranked Texas A&M in Baton Rouge last year.
- Saturday's match marks the end of a five-game road swing for the Tigers as they open up SEC play in Nashville. They opened the season with a four-game homestand in Baton Rouge.
- After playing 13 SEC games in the first year of SEC expansion in 2012, each of the 14 league teams will play an 11-game conference schedule in 2013. LSU will not face Auburn and South Carolina in the regular season.

Series Record: Vanderbilt leads, 9-6-2

Series Notes: The LSU Tigers have enjoyed great success in SEC openers in eight previous seasons under head coach **Brian Lee** as they have posted a 4-2-2 mark in their first league matches since 2005. LSU scored a 1-0 double overtime victory over the Commodores in their last meeting in Baton Rouge on Oct. 7 of last season when then-freshman **Haley Emerson** scored her first career goal in the 108th minute after checking into the game for the first time at the start of the second overtime. While the Tigers trail the Commodores by a 6-9-2 mark in the series, they own a winning 5-3-1 record in the series in eight previous seasons under Lee's direction. LSU is 3-5 in eight previous matches played at the VU Soccer Complex in Nashville, Tenn., but has won two of its last three meetings.

LAST TIME OUT: LSU 1, RICE 0 • HOUSTON, TEXAS

The Tigers took advantage of one of their five corner kicks in the match in the 70th minute of play when senior **Alex Ramsey's** first career goal proved to be the game-winner as the LSU Soccer team took home a 1-0 victory over the Rice Owls in its non-conference finale on Sunday afternoon at the Rice Soccer Stadium. After the initial service by freshman midfielder **Emma Fletcher** was cleared way, sophomore midfielder **Heather Magee** headed the ball back into the box creating a scramble in front of the net. While standing near the left post, Ramsey found herself on the receiving end of Magee's header as she chipped home the game-winner at the 69:24 mark for her first career goal in LSU's 1-0 victory. The Tigers (4-3-1) leveled their series with the Owls (2-3-2) at 1-1-1 all-time and are now unbeaten in each of their last two matches after the sides played to a 1-1 draw in Baton Rouge a year ago.

NOTEBOOK

Tigers Looking to Continue Success in SEC Openers

LSU Soccer has enjoyed great success in Southeastern Conference openers with a 4-2-2 mark in eight previous seasons under head coach **Brian Lee**. While the Tigers dropped a 1-0 decision to 10th-ranked Texas A&M in their conference opener in Baton Rouge in 2012, they had won four of their previous five SEC openers with a 1-0 home win over Mississippi State in 2007, at 4-1 win at Mississippi State in 2008, a 6-0 home win over No. 8-ranked Georgia in 2009, a 1-0 loss at 17th-ranked Georgia in 2010 and a 5-1 home win over Mississippi State in 2011. This weekend's match between the Tigers and Commodores is the only SEC match scheduled for Saturday as the other six league games will be played on Friday.

Tigers Feature Diverse Scoring Attack in 2013

The Tigers have featured a diverse attack during the 2013 season as seven different goal scorers have accounted for the team's 12 goals thus far on the campaign. Sophomore **Fernanda Pina** is the team's leading goal scorer with three on the year, while juniors **Alex Arlitt** and **Jodi Calloway** and freshman **Summer Clarke** have netted two goals apiece through eight non-conference matches. Seniors **Megan Kinneman** and **Alex Ramsey** and sophomore **Lexi Gibbs** have also opened up their account with goals of their own. In addition, six different Tigers have recorded at least one assist with senior **Addie Eggleston** and freshman **Emma Fletcher** leading the way with four apiece.

Kinneman Poised for Record-Setting Senior Season in 2013

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has shown tremendous form in goal as the defensive leader for the Tigers this season as they prepare to open up the SEC season with a match against the Vanderbilt Commodores in Nashville, Tenn., on Saturday night. Kinneman pitched five shutouts in eight matches during the non-conference season in wins over Louisiana Tech (1-0), UL-Monroe (6-0), Southern California (1-0) and Rice (1-0), as well as a scoreless draw against TCU earlier in the season. She is just one clean sheet shy of matching her career single-season high of six set during her true freshman season in 2010. Kinneman is also moving up the career charts at LSU as she is now alone in second place with 16 shutouts and in third place with 220 saves during her collegiate career in Baton Rouge.

Kinneman Continues Scoring Touch from Penalty Spot in Senior Season

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has not only provided the leadership for the Tigers on the defensive end of the field this season, but she has also proven herself as an asset on the offensive end of the field while scoring her third career goal from the penalty spot in the 65th minute of a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans back on Sept. 8 in LSU's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic. Kinneman is the top scoring goalkeeper in the program's history as she has found the back of the net on all three of her penalty kick opportunities over the past two seasons. That also includes a conversion in a 2-1 overtime defeat to 18th-ranked Kentucky and the game-winner in the 93rd minute in a 3-2 win at Ole Miss last year.

Tigers Earn Best Non-Conference Win in Program History vs. USC Trojans

The Tigers earned perhaps their most impressive non-conference victory in the 19-year history of the program on the afternoon of Sunday, Sept. 8, when they scored a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the finale of the Minnesota Gold Classic held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 65th minute while making a season-high seven saves in goal on the defensive end. The Tigers defeated their highest ranked non-conference opponent in program history with just their second victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in the non-conference all-time. LSU has now won seven matches to go along with nine draws over nationally-ranked opponents under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

Mexican International Pina Fluent in Language of Futbol

Much was expected of Mexican Under-20 international **Fernanda Pina** when she signed her National Letter of Intent with the Tigers as part of the Class of 2012, and she has certainly made an impact in the attack upon her arrival in Baton Rouge over the past two seasons. Pina is the team's leading goal scorer for the second-straight season as she has netted three goals as the Tigers prepare for the start of SEC play at Vanderbilt this weekend. Pina finished her freshman season in 2012 as the team's leading goal and point scorer with four goals and 12 points during her rookie campaign. Pina recorded her first career multi-goal game while scoring the first and last goals in a 6-0 rout of UL-Monroe on Aug. 27, while she also scored the first goal of the game in a 4-2 defeat at the hands of No. 6-ranked BYU on Sept. 2.

LSU's Canadian Connection

The Tigers are excited to welcome a trio of Canadian Under-17 and Under-20 internationals into the squad this season as freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario) have made their collegiate debuts in 2013. Both Clarke and Pongetti featured in Canada's starting 11 at the 2012 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup last fall in Azerbaijan last fall, while Fletcher drove the engine for New Zealand's U-17 squad during the event. All three Tiger cubs are now among Canada's player pool that will be used to pick its team for the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup during the 2014 season. Fletcher is already tied for the team lead with four assists, while Clarke is tied for second on the team with two goals on the year.

Mexican International Gomez-Junco Redshirts During 2013 Season

Head coach **Brian Lee** and his staff received great news during the offseason when former University of Memphis standout **Natalia Gomez-Junco** elected to transfer to LSU following a brilliant two seasons in Memphis. Gomez-Junco proved to be one of the elite performers in Conference USA during her two seasons at Memphis, scoring 10 goals and dishing out a pair of assists for 22 points with the Tigers. She was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team in 2011 after scoring eight goals and 17 points as Memphis' second-leading scorer. After redshirting in 2013, Gomez-Junco will be a welcomed addition to LSU's midfield lineup in 2014 as a capped member of the senior Mexican Women's National Team. She was also one of Mexico's premier performers at the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup in 2010 and 2012.

LSU Soccer's Recruiting Class Ranked in Top 15 Nationally for 2013

LSU Soccer's heralded 2013 recruiting class solidified its reputation as one of the nation's best during the preseason when it was selected the No. 1-ranked class in the Southeastern Conference and the No. 14-ranked class in the NCAA ahead of the 2013 season by the editorial staff at AllWhiteKit.com. The Tigers welcomed five recruits with an international pedigree to campus for the 2013 season as junior transfer Natalia Gomez-Junco (Monterrey, Mexico) joined freshmen Summer Clarke (Richmond, British Columbia, Canada), Emma Fletcher (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada), Megan Lee (Massey, Auckland, New Zealand) and Rebecca Pongetti (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) to bolster a young but talented roster in 2013. Each earned starting experience for their countries at the FIFA Women's World Cup at the U-17 and U-20 levels as youths.

Tigers Return to National Polls to Start 2013 Campaign

The LSU Soccer team returned to the national rankings for the first time in two seasons when they opened 2013 as the No. 25-ranked team in the country in the TopDrawerSoccer.com Preseason Top 25 poll released on Aug. 14. The Tigers held the No. 25 position in the TopDrawerSoccer.com in each of the first two weeks of the season when the poll was released on Aug. 26 and Sept. 2 after getting off to an unbeaten 2-0-1 start with a 1-0 win over Louisiana Tech on Aug. 26, a 6-0 win over UL-Monroe on Aug. 27 and a 0-0 draw with TCU on Aug. 30. The Tigers have spent a total of 33 weeks in the national rankings during the nine-year tenure of head coach **Brian Lee**.

LSU Picked Second in SEC West by Coaches in Preseason Poll

The four-time SEC Western Division champion LSU Tigers were selected to finish in second place in the final SEC West standings during the 2013 season in a preseason vote of the league's 14 head coaches. The Tigers received one first-place vote to be crowned the SEC Western Division champion, although the league's athletic directors voted to eliminate the divisional format for women's soccer following the SEC's preseason release. LSU captured four SEC West titles in a five-year span under the previous format with wins in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011. Texas A&M was selected to defend its SEC West crown won in its inaugural season in the league in 2012, while also being tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC regular season title with eight first-place votes. The Florida Gators received six first-place votes to defend the SEC crown they won a season ago, as well as 11 first-place votes to repeat as the SEC Eastern Division champion.
