Tigers Return to LSU Soccer Stadium to Host Tennessee on Friday Night

In the wake of a 2-1 overtime victory over the Vanderbilt Commodores in its Southeastern Conference opener in Nashville last weekend, the LSU Soccer team returns home on Friday night to play host to the Tennessee Lady Volunteers in a match that is set to kick off at 7 p.m. CT at the LSU Soccer Stadium in Baton Rouge. The Tigers are riding a hot streak entering Friday's match as winners of three of their last four fixtures, including a pair of 1-0 road victories over 13th-ranked Southern California at the Minnesota Gold Classic in Minneapolis, Minn., on Sept. 8 and Rice in Houston, Texas, on Sept. 15 to wrap up the non-conference season. The Tigers and Lady Volunteers are both coming off narrow victories in their SEC openers as Tennessee took down 20th-ranked Texas A&M on their home field by a score of 1-0 last Friday night. Tennessee enjoyed a strong non-conference season as well, highlighted by a 2-1 road win at 17th-ranked Central Florida in Orlando on Aug. 30. The Lady Volunteers are led by preseason All-American striker Hannah Wilkinson as the New Zealand international has already scored five goals and dished out three assists for 13 points on the season as she leads the team in all three scoring categories this season. The Lady Volunteers earned an impressive 1-0 victory over the Aggies in their SEC opener last weekend while playing without their star striker as Wilkinson was called into duty with the New Zealand Women's National Team competing over the past week at the inaugural Valais Women's Cup in Switzerland. The inaugural event, which has also featured Brazil, China and Mexico, ended Thursday night with the championship match. Wilkinson did not feature in New Zealand's 1-0 victory over Brazil on Tuesday night en route to a spot in the final. Senior All-SEC star Caroline Brown has also scored three goals for the Lady Volunteers to this point in the 2013 season.

STORYLINES

- The Tigers are looking to start 2-0 in SEC play for just the sixth time in the teams 19-year history following a 2-1 overtime win at Vanderbilt.

- Sophomore **Fernanda Pina** scored her team-leading fourth goal of the season in the 95th minute of OT at Vanderbilt on Saturday night. In only nine appearances this season, Pina has already equaled her team-leading total of four goals in 21 appearances as a freshman last fall.

- Sophomore **Heather Magee** opened her account for 2013 in the 27th minute of a 2-1 win over Vanderbilt as eight different goal scorers have now scored the team's 14 goals this year.

- The Tigers and Lady Volunteers are each coming off victories in their SEC openers after Tennessee scored a 1-0 shutout of 20th-ranked Texas A&M in their SEC opener in Knoxville, Tenn., held last Friday night.

- While the Tigers have only posted a 4-11-2 mark in the all-time series with Tennessee, they own a 4-5-2 mark in eight previous seasons under head coach **Brian Lee** after posting a 0-6 mark before his arrival.

- The Tigers own an impressive three-game home winning streak over the Lady Volunteers entering Friday's match, while outscoring Tennessee by a 10-1 margin in their three meetings in Baton Rouge since 2007.

- The Tigers are now 5-2-2 in SEC openers in nine seasons under Lee's direction of the team following a 2-1 overtime road victory at Vanderbilt last Saturday night.

- Friday's match against the Tennessee Lady Volunteers marks LSU's return to the LSU Soccer Stadium for the first time since a 4-2 defeat to No. 6-ranked BYU on Sept. 2 following a five-game road swing.

- After playing 13 SEC games in the first year of SEC expansion in 2012, each of the 14 league teams will play an 11-game conference schedule in 2013. LSU will not face Auburn and South Carolina in the regular season.

Series Notes: While the Lady Volunteers own a commanding 11-4-2 mark in the all-time series, the LSU Tigers have been impressive in recent seasons while posting a 4-5-2 record in eight previous seasons under head coach **Brian Lee**. After a trio of defeats in Lee's first two seasons, the Tigers have enjoyed great success in the series while earning a 4-2-2 mark since 2007. In fact, the Tigers enter Friday's match riding a three-game home winning streak against Tennessee dating back to the 2007 season as they have outscored the Lady Volunteers by a 10-1 margin in those three victories. LSU earned its first victory over a Top 10 team in program history with a 3-0 shutout of No. 6-ranked Tennessee in 2007, following by a 5-1 win in 2009 and a 2-0 shutout of 10th-ranked Tennessee in 2011 in matches played in Baton Rouge.

LAST TIME OUT: LSU 2, VANDERBILT 1 (OT) • NASHVILLE, TENN.

After playing to a 1-1 draw in regulation, the Tigers were rewarded for their offensive pressure when sophomore **Fernanda Pina** flicked home the game-winning Golden Goal on a free kick by senior **Alex Ramsey** in the 95th minute as they took home a 2-1 overtime win over Vanderbilt in their SEC opener on Saturday night. Ramsey's floated ball found Pina's head inside the six-yard box as the Mexican international flicked home the game-winner at the 94:30 mark of the first overtime period to hand the Tigers (5-3-1, 1-0 SEC) a deserved 2-1 win over the Commodores (3-4-2, 0-1). Pina netted her team-leading fourth goal of the season as she has already matched her single-season career high of four goals set during her freshman season a year ago. Sophomore **Heather Magee** also opened her account for 2013 with her first goal of the year in the 27th minute to open the scoring. Simone Charley equalized for Vanderbilt in the 51st minute of the second half.

Tigers Continue Success in SEC Openers in Brian Lee Era

LSU Soccer has enjoyed great success in Southeastern Conference openers with a 5-2-2 mark in nine seasons under head coach **Brian Lee** after taking home a 2-1 overtime victory at Vanderbilt on Saturday night. They have also won five of their previous seven SEC openers since 2007, including a 1-0 home win over Mississippi State in 2007, at 4-1 win at Mississippi State in 2008, a 6-0 home win over No. 8-ranked Georgia in 2009 and a 5-1 home win over Mississippi State in 2011. The Tigers will look to improve to 2-0 in SEC play for just the sixth time in program history on Friday night when they play host to Tennessee in a match that is set to kick off at 7 p.m. CT at the LSU Soccer Stadium.

LSU Seeks 2-0 Start in SEC Play for Sixth Time in Team History

In 18 previous seasons in the program's history, LSU has started 2-0 in SEC play just five times, including twice under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**. They logged their best conference start at 4-0 in both the 2009 and 2011 seasons with Lee leading the way, while they also started 3-0 in 1995 and 2-0 in both 1999 and 2002. In addition, the Tigers were unbeaten in four matches to start SEC play in two other seasons under Lee's watch with matching 2-0-2 starts in SEC play in 2006 and 2007 while alternating results of win-draw-win-draw in their first four SEC results in both seasons.

Tigers Earn Best Non-Conference Win in Program History vs. USC Trojans

The Tigers earned perhaps their most impressive non-conference victory in the 19-year history of the program on the afternoon of Sunday, Sept. 8, when they scored a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the finale of the Minnesota Gold Classic held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 65th minute while making a season-high seven saves in goal on the defensive end. The Tigers defeated their highest ranked non-conference opponent in program history with just their second victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in the non-conference all-time. LSU has now won seven matches to go along with nine draws over nationally-ranked opponents under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

Tigers Feature Diverse Scoring Attack in 2013

The Tigers have featured a diverse attack during the 2013 season as eight different goal scorers have accounted for the team's 14 goals thus far on the campaign. Sophomore **Fernanda Pina** is the team's leading goal scorer with four on the year, while juniors **Alex Arlitt** and **Jodi Calloway** and freshman **Summer Clarke** have netted two goals apiece through nine matches on the year. Seniors **Megan Kinneman** and **Alex Ramsey** and sophomores **Lexi Gibbs** and **Heather Magee** have also opened up their account with a goal of their own. In addition, eight different Tigers have recorded at least one assist with freshman **Emma Fletcher** leading the way with five assists through nine matches in her rookie season.

Kinneman Poised for Record-Setting Senior Season in 2013

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has shown tremendous form in goal as the defensive leader for the Tigers this season as they have now opened up SEC play for 2013. Kinneman pitched five shutouts in eight matches during the non-conference season in wins over Louisiana Tech (1-0), UL-Monroe (6-0), Southern California (1-0) and Rice (1-0), as well as a scoreless draw against TCU earlier in the season. She is just one clean sheet shy of matching her career single-season high of six set during her true freshman season in 2010. Kinneman is also moving up the career charts at LSU as she is now alone in second place with 16 shutouts and in third place with 220 saves during her collegiate career in Baton Rouge.

Kinneman Continues Scoring Touch from Penalty Spot in Senior Season

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has not only provided leadership for the Tigers on the defensive end of the field this season, but she has also proven herself as an asset on the offensive end of the field while scoring her third career goal from the penalty spot in the 65th minute of a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans back on Sept. 8 in LSU's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic. Kinneman is the top scoring goalkeeper in the program's history as she has found the back of the net on all three of her penalty kick opportunities over the past two seasons. That also includes a conversion in a 2-1 overtime defeat to 18th-ranked Kentucky and the game-winner in the 93rd minute in a 3-2 win at Ole Miss last year.

Mexican International Pina Fluent in Language of Futbol

Much was expected of Mexican Under-20 international **Fernanda Pina** when she signed her National Letter of Intent with the Tigers as part of the Class of 2012, and she has certainly made an impact in the attack upon her arrival in Baton Rouge over the past two seasons. Pina is the team's leading goal scorer for the second-straight season as she has netted four goals in nine appearances in 2013 as the Tigers prepare to host Tennessee on Friday night. That matches her output in 21 appearances in 2012 as she netted a team-leading four goals as a freshman a season ago. Pina recorded her first career multi-goal game while scoring the first and last goals in a 6-0 rout of UL-Monroe on Aug. 27, while she also scored the first goal of the game in a 4-2 defeat at the hands of No. 6-ranked BYU on Sept. 2.

LSU's Canadian Connection

The Tigers are excited to welcome a trio of Canadian Under-17 and Under-20 internationals into the squad this season as freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario) have made their collegiate debuts in 2013. Both Clarke and Pongetti featured in Canada's starting 11 at the 2012 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup last fall in Azerbaijan last fall, while Fletcher drove the engine for New Zealand's U-17 squad during the event. All three Tiger cubs are now among Canada's player pool that will be used to pick its team for the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup during the 2014 season. Fletcher leads the team and ranks third in the SEC with five assists, while Clarke is tied for second on the team with two goals on the year.

Mexican International Gomez-Junco Redshirts During 2013 Season

Head coach **Brian Lee** and his staff received great news during the offseason when former University of Memphis stand-out **Natalia Gomez-Junco** elected to transfer to LSU following a brilliant two seasons in Memphis. Gomez-Junco proved to be one of the elite performers in Conference USA during her two seasons at Memphis, scoring 10 goals and dishing out a pair of assists for 22 points with the Tigers. She was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team in 2011 after scoring eight goals and 17 points as Memphis' second-leading scorer. After redshirting in 2013, Gomez-Junco will be a welcomed addition to LSU's midfield lineup in 2014 as a capped member of the senior Mexican Women's National Team. She was also one of Mexico's premier performers at the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup in 2010 and 2012.

LSU Soccer's Recruiting Class Ranked in Top 15 Nationally for 2013

LSU Soccer's heralded 2013 recruiting class solidified its reputation as one of the nation's best during the preseason when it was selected the No. 1-ranked class in the SEC and the No. 14-ranked class in the NCAA ahead of the 2013 season by the editorial staff at AllWhiteKit.com. The Tigers welcomed five recruits with an international pedigree to campus for the 2013 season as junior transfer **Natalia Gomez-Junco** (Monterrey, Mexico) joined freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia, Canada), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada), **Megan Lee** (Massey, Auckland, New Zealand) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) to bolster a young but talented roster in 2013. Each earned starting experience for their countries at the FIFA Women's World Cup at the U-17 and U-20 levels as youths.

LSU Picked Second in SEC West by Coaches in Preseason Poll

The four-time SEC Western Division champion LSU Tigers were selected to finish in second place in the final SEC West standings during the 2013 season in a preseason vote of the league's 14 head coaches. The Tigers received one first-place vote to be crowned the SEC Western Division champion, although the league's athletic directors voted to eliminate the divisional format for women's soccer following the SEC's preseason release. LSU captured four SEC West titles in a five-year span under the previous format with wins in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011. Texas A&M was selected to defend its SEC West crown won in its inaugural season in the league in 2012, while also being tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC regular season title with eight first-place votes. The Florida Gators received six first-place votes to defend the SEC crown they won a season ago, as well as 11 first-place votes to repeat as the SEC Eastern Division champion.
