### Tigers Look to Extend Unbeaten Streak vs. Mississippi State Bulldogs

The LSU Tigers find themselves just two points out of first place in the SEC regular season standings after two conference games following Friday's 1-1 draw against the Tennessee Lady Volunteers at the LSU Soccer Stadium in Baton Rouge. They extended their unbeaten run to three games with the result after also pitching a 1-0 shutout at Rice on Sept. 15 and claiming a 2-1 overtime victory at Vanderbilt in their SEC opener on Sept. 21. With a 1-0-1 start to the conference season, the Tigers find themselves in a tie for third place on the 14-team league table with Tennessee as each team has posted four points. The defending SEC champion Florida Gators and Georgia Bulldogs are the only unbeaten and untied teams in SEC play through two games with matching 2-0 records and six points in league play. Mississippi State is still seeking its first league win of the season following a 3-1 home defeat to Missouri on Sept. 20 and an 8-0 road defeat at 24th-ranked Texas A&M on Friday night. The Tigers are riding an eight-game winning streak and 11-game unbeaten streak in the series into Sunday's SEC derby as they are an impressive 10-0-1 against the Bulldogs dating back to their last defeat in 2001. The Tigers have won all eight matches against their former SEC West rivals in eight previous seasons under head coach **Brian Lee**, including a 1-0 victory in Starkville, Miss., in their last meeting a year ago. The Bulldogs are led once again this season by senior All-SEC striker Elisabeth Sullivan, who earned Second-Team All-SEC honors as one of the league's feared strikers a season ago. Sullivan has scored nine of Mississippi State's 15 goals on the season as the third-leading goal scorer in the SEC to this point in the 2013 season. The Bulldogs have struggled defensively as they have allowed an SEC high 26 goals to their opponents during the season. Sunday's game will kick off at 1 p.m. CT at the LSU Soccer Stadium in Baton Rouge.

#### STORYLINES

- The Tigers will look to run their unbeaten record to four games when they face Mississippi State on Sunday with a 2-0-1 mark in their last three.
- Freshman **Emma Fletcher** is finding her scoring boots after netting her first career goal on a 25-yard free kick in the 31st minute of LSU's 1-1 draw with Tennessee on Friday night. Fletcher already leads the team with five assists on the season as she is just three assists shy of setting a new LSU freshman record.
- The Tigers extended their home unbeaten streak against Tennessee to four-straight games with Friday's 1-1 draw as they are now 3-0-1 in the series in Baton Rouge since 2007.
- The Tigers have dominated their series with Mississippi State unlike any other as they own a 15-2-1 mark all-time, including an eight-game winning streak and 11-game unbeaten streak since 2002.
- Interestingly enough, each of LSU's two defeats in the series have come in Baton Rouge with a 1-0 home defeat in 1997 and a 2-0 home defeat during the 2001 season.
- **Brian Lee** is a perfect 9-0 in his head coaching career against Mississippi State as he not only owns an 8-0 mark as the LSU manager, but he scored a 10-1 win over Mississippi State as the head coach at Furman in the 2000 season.
- The Tigers scored a 1-0 victory in their last meeting with the Bulldogs in Starkville, Miss., a year ago. It was **Tori Sample** scoring the game-winner en route to being named the SEC Freshman of the Week for her efforts.
- LSU features a diverse attack as nine different Tigers have found the scoresheet with their 15 goals scored through 10 matches as they head into Sunday's match against the Bulldogs.
- After playing 13 SEC games in the first year of SEC expansion in 2012, each of the 14 league teams will play an 11-game conference schedule in 2013. LSU will not face Auburn and South Carolina in the regular season.

## MATCHDAY LIVE: LSU VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

**Series Notes:** The Tigers have enjoyed great success against the Mississippi State Bulldogs during their 19-year history as they own a commanding 15-2-1 mark in the series that dates back to their inaugural season in 1995. LSU is riding an eight-game winning streak and 11-game unbeaten streak against its former SEC West rival with a 10-0-1 mark dating to the 2002 season. The Bulldogs have gotten the better of the Tigers in Baton Rouge as both of their wins in the series have come at the LSU Soccer Stadium, including a 1-0 shutout in 1997 and a 2-0 shutout in 2001. LSU is 7-2 in nine previous meetings in Baton Rouge, while the Tigers are unbeaten with an 8-0-1 in nine matches played in Starkville, Miss., over the years. LSU is a perfect 8-0 in eight previous matches since 2005 under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

## LAST TIME OUT: LSU 1, TENNESSEE 1 • BATON ROUGE, LA.

Freshman midfielder **Emma Fletcher** fired a career-high nine shots on the night while opening her account in the 31st minute on a 25-yard free kick to open the scoring to lead the Tigers to a 1-1 draw against the powerful Tennessee Lady Volunteers in their SEC home opener on Friday night at the LSU Soccer Stadium. Fletcher certainly took advantage of her free kick opportunity in the 31st minute after senior defender **Addie Eggleston** was fouled just outside the top of the penalty area. The Tigers (5-3-2, 1-0-1 SEC) took their advantage into the halftime break, but the Lady Volunteers (6-2-2, 1-0-1) fired back in the 64th minute by way of All-SEC midfielder Caroline Brown, who scored her fourth goal of the year. The scoreboard read 1-1 after 110 minutes of action as the Tigers extended their home unbeaten streak against the Lady Volunteers to four-straight games as they are now 3-0-1 in Baton Rouge since the 2007 season.

## NOTEBOOK

### Tigers Continue Success in SEC Openers in Brian Lee Era

LSU Soccer has enjoyed great success in Southeastern Conference openers with a 5-2-2 mark in nine seasons under head coach **Brian Lee** after taking home a 2-1 overtime victory at Vanderbilt on Saturday, Sept. 21. They have also won five of their previous seven SEC openers since 2007, including a 1-0 home win over Mississippi State in 2007, at 4-1 win at Mississippi State in 2008, a 6-0 home win over No. 8-ranked Georgia in 2009 and a 5-1 home win over Mississippi State in 2011. The Tigers will look to improve to 2-0 in SEC play for just the sixth time in program history on Friday night when they play host to Tennessee in a match that is set to kick off at 7 p.m. CT at the LSU Soccer Stadium.

### Tigers Earn Best Non-Conference Win in Program History vs. USC Trojans

The Tigers earned perhaps their most impressive non-conference victory in the 19-year history of the program on the afternoon of Sunday, Sept. 8, when they scored a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the finale of the Minnesota Gold Classic held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 65th minute while making a season-high seven saves in goal on the defensive end. The Tigers defeated their highest ranked non-conference opponent in program history with just their second victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in the non-conference all-time. LSU has now won seven matches to go along with nine draws over nationally-ranked opponents under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

### Tigers Feature Diverse Scoring Attack in 2013

The Tigers have featured a diverse attack during the 2013 season as nine different goal scorers have accounted for the team's 15 goals thus far on the campaign. Sophomore **Fernanda Pina** is the team's leading goal scorer with four on the year, while juniors **Alex Arlitt** and **Jodi Calloway** and freshman **Summer Clarke** have netted two goals apiece through 10 matches on the year. Seniors **Megan Kinneman** and **Alex Ramsey**, sophomores **Lexi Gibbs** and **Heather Magee** and freshman **Emma Fletcher** have also opened up their account with a goal of their own. In addition, eight different Tigers have recorded at least one assist with freshman Fletcher eading the way this season with five assists through 10 matches midway through her rookie season.

### Kinneman Poised for Record-Setting Senior Season in 2013

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has shown tremendous form in goal as the defensive leader for the Tigers this season as they have now opened up SEC play for 2013. Kinneman pitched five shutouts in eight matches during the non-conference season in wins over Louisiana Tech (1-0), UL-Monroe (6-0), Southern California (1-0) and Rice (1-0), as well as a scoreless draw against TCU earlier in the season. She is just one clean sheet shy of matching her career single-season high of six set during her true freshman season in 2010. Kinneman is also moving up the career charts at LSU as she is now alone in second place with 16 shutouts and in third place with 220 saves during her collegiate career in Baton Rouge.

### Kinneman Continues Scoring Touch from Penalty Spot in Senior Season

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has not only provided leadership for the Tigers on the defensive end of the field this season, but she has also proven herself as an asset on the offensive end of the field while scoring her third career goal from the penalty spot in the 65th minute of a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans back on Sept. 8 in LSU's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic. Kinneman is the top scoring goalkeeper in the program's history as she has found the back of the net on all three of her penalty kick opportunities over the past two seasons. That also includes a conversion in a 2-1 overtime defeat to 18th-ranked Kentucky and the game-winner in the 93rd minute in a 3-2 win at Ole Miss last year.

## Mexican International Pina Fluent in Language of Futbol

Much was expected of Mexican Under-20 international **Fernanda Pina** when she signed her National Letter of Intent with the Tigers as part of the Class of 2012, and she has certainly made an impact in the attack upon her arrival in Baton Rouge over the past two seasons. Pina is the team's leading goal scorer for the second-straight season as she has netted four goals in nine appearances in 2013 as the Tigers prepare to host Mississippi State on Sunday afternoon. That matches her output in 21 appearances in 2012 as she netted a team-leading four goals as a freshman a season ago. Pina recorded her first career multi-goal game while scoring the first and last goals in a 6-0 rout of UL-Monroe on Aug. 27, while she also scored the first goal of the game in a 4-2 defeat at the hands of No. 6-ranked BYU on Sept. 2.

## LSU's Canadian Connection

The Tigers are excited to welcome a trio of Canadian Under-17 and Under-20 internationals into the squad this season as freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario) have made their collegiate debuts in 2013. Both Clarke and Pongetti featured in Canada's starting 11 at the 2012 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup last fall in Azerbaijan last fall, while Fletcher drove the engine for New Zealand's U-17 squad during the event. All three Tiger cubs are now among Canada's player pool that will be used to pick its team for the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup during the 2014 season. Fletcher leads the team and ranks fourth in the SEC with five assists, while Clarke is tied for second on the team with two goals on the year.

## Mexican International Gomez-Junco Redshirts During 2013 Season

Head coach **Brian Lee** and his staff received great news during the offseason when former University of Memphis stand-out **Natalia Gomez-Junco** elected to transfer to LSU following a brilliant two seasons in Memphis. Gomez-Junco proved to be one of the elite performers in Conference USA during her two seasons at Memphis, scoring 10 goals and dishing out a pair of assists for 22 points with the Tigers. She was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team in 2011 after scoring eight goals and 17 points as Memphis' second-leading scorer. After redshirting in 2013, Gomez-Junco will be a welcomed addition to LSU's midfield lineup in 2014 as a capped member of the senior Mexican Women's National Team. She was also one of Mexico's premier performers at the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup in 2010 and 2012.

## LSU Soccer's Recruiting Class Ranked in Top 15 Nationally for 2013

LSU Soccer's heralded 2013 recruiting class solidified its reputation as one of the nation's best during the preseason when it was selected the No. 1-ranked class in the SEC and the No. 14-ranked class in the NCAA ahead of the 2013 season by the editorial staff at AllWhiteKit.com. The Tigers welcomed five recruits with an international pedigree to campus for the 2013 season as junior transfer **Natalia Gomez-Junco** (Monterrey, Mexico) joined freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia, Canada), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada), **Megan Lee** (Massey, Auckland, New Zealand) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) to bolster a young but talented roster in 2013. Each earned starting experience for their countries at the FIFA Women's World Cup at the U-17 and U-20 levels as youths.

## LSU Picked Second in SEC West by Coaches in Preseason Poll

The four-time SEC Western Division champion LSU Tigers were selected to finish in second place in the final SEC West standings during the 2013 season in a preseason vote of the league's 14 head coaches. The Tigers received one first-place vote to be crowned the SEC Western Division champion, although the league's athletic directors voted to eliminate the divisional format for women's soccer following the SEC's preseason release. LSU captured four SEC West titles in a five-year span under the previous format with wins in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011. Texas A&M was selected to defend its SEC West crown won in its inaugural season in the league in 2012, while also being tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC regular season title with eight first-place votes. The Florida Gators received six first-place votes to defend the SEC crown they won a season ago, as well as 11 first-place votes to repeat as the SEC Eastern Division champion.
