SEC Leading Tigers Rides Winning Streak into Friday's Match at Arkansas

The SEC-leading LSU Tigers have an opportunity to earn a signature win on Friday night when they make the trip to Fayetteville, Ark., to take on the Arkansas Razorbacks in a match that is set to kick off at 7 p.m. CT at Razorback Field. The Tigers (6-3-2, 2-0-1 SEC) find themselves alone in first place atop the Southeastern Conference table through only three league matches after scoring a 3-2 double overtime victory over Mississippi State in Baton Rouge on Sunday afternoon. In fact, LSU has played three-straight overtime matches in league play as they opened up the SEC season with a 2-1 overtime victory at Vanderbilt on Sept. 21 before playing Tennessee to a 1-1 draw in Baton Rouge on Sept. 27. The Tigers hold a narrow one-point lead on the SEC table over eight other SEC teams with matching 2-1 records and six points to this point of the season, including Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Ole Miss, Missouri, South Carolina and Texas A&M. The Razorbacks (8-3, 1-2) are in the midst of their best season in more than a decade as they have a qualifying spot in the 2013 NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Tournament squarely in their sights. The Razorbacks checked in at No. 21 nationally in the NCAA's most recent Ratings Percentage Index released on Monday, which is the primary ranking system used to select teams for at-large qualification to the NCAA Tournament. While Arkansas is off to just a 1-2 start in SEC play, it had an impressive 3-0 shutout of the 14th-ranked Kentucky Wildcats on the road in Lexington on Sept. 27 for their first league win of the campaign. The Razorbacks have only dropped one match on their home field this season with a 2-1 setback to Ole Miss in their SEC opener on Sept. 20. Arkansas owns a 5-1 mark this season in matches played at Razorback Field. LSU is riding a nine-game winning streak in the series and five-game winning streak in Fayetteville since 2004.

STORYLINES

- The Tigers will look to run their unbeaten record to five games when they face Arkansas on Friday with a 3-0-1 mark in their last four games.
- Freshman **Emma Fletcher** is the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week after scoring her first career goal on a 25-yard free kick in the 31st minute of LSU's 1-1 draw with Tennessee on Sept. 27 and assisting **Megan Lee's** game-winning Golden Goal in a 3-2 double OT win over Mississippi State on Sunday afternoon.
- The Tigers are riding a nine-game winning streak and five-game winning streak in matches played at Razorback Field in Fayetteville, Ark., since the 2004 season.
- The Tigers have dominated their series with Arkansas as they lead the way at 12-5-1 since their inaugural season in 1995. The last win for the Razorbacks in the series came with a 3-2 result in Fayetteville in 2003.
- LSU is 5-4 all-time in matches held at Razorback Field, including a four-game losing streak from 1997-2003 and a five-game winning streak from 2004 to the present.
- **Brian Lee** is a perfect 8-0 in his head coaching career against Arkansas as the Tigers have won each of their eight matches in the series since Lee was appointed head coach in 2005. LSU has outscored Arkansas by a 20-7 margin during the streak.
- The Tigers scored a 3-2 comeback victory in their last meeting with the Razorbacks in Baton Rouge a year ago. After falling behind 2-0 in the first half, **Jodi Calloway** (43'), **Jade Kovacevic** (70') and **Fernanda Pina** (86') all found the net to lead LSU to a victory.
- LSU features a diverse attack as 11 different Tigers have found the scoresheet with 18 goals scored through 11 matches this season.
- After playing 13 SEC games in the first year of SEC expansion in 2012, each of the 14 league teams will play an 11-game conference schedule in 2013. LSU will not face Auburn and South Carolina in the regular season.

Series Record: LSU leads, 12-5-1

Series Notes: The Tigers have enjoyed great success against the Arkansas Razorbacks during their 19-year history as they own a commanding 12-5-1 mark in the series that dates back to their inaugural season in 1995. LSU is riding a nine-game winning streak against its former SEC West rival with a 9-0 mark dating back to the 2004 season. That includes a 3-2 comeback win for the Tigers in their last meeting in Baton Rouge to wrap up the 2012 regular season. The Tigers are riding a five-game winning streak in matches played at Razorback Field in Fayetteville, including a 3-0 triumph in their last trip to Arkansas in 2011 to clinch their third SEC Western Division championship in four years and claim a second-place finish in the final SEC regular season standings. LSU is 5-4 all-time in matches played in Fayetteville.

LAST TIME OUT: LSU 3, MISSISSIPPI STATE 2 (20T) • BATON ROUGE, LA.

After falling behind 2-0 inside of eight minutes from the opening kickoff, senior **Nina Anderson** and freshmen **Summer Clarke** and **Megan Lee** each found the scoresheet to lead the Tigers to a 3-2 comeback win in double overtime over Mississippi State on Sunday afternoon at the LSU Soccer Stadium. The Tigers emerged victorious while playing their third-straight overtime match as they extended their unbeaten streak to four-straight games with Sunday's result. After playing to a 2-2 draw into the second overtime period, Lee provided the heroics for the Tigers just over two minutes from the restart by scoring the game-winning Golden Goal for her first goal as an LSU Tiger. Fellow freshman **Emma Fletcher** served up her team-leading sixth assist of the season as Lee buried a strike from the top of the box for the Golden Goal. Clarke scored her third goal of the season in the 11th minute, while Anderson found the net in the 42nd minute.

NOTEBOOK

Tigers Look to Remain Unbeaten in SEC Play at Arkansas

LSU Soccer is off to an unbeaten 2-0-1 mark in SEC play as the Tigers are top of the league table with seven points as they head to Arkansas on Friday night. They are seeking just their fifth four-game unbeaten run to open up SEC play in program history, following 2-0-2 starts in both 2006 and 2007 and perfect 4-0 starts in both 2009 and 2011. The Tigers have never been unbeaten in five-straight matches to open the conference season, while each of their four-game unbeaten runs have come under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

Tigers Earn Best Non-Conference Win in Program History vs. USC Trojans

The Tigers earned perhaps their most impressive non-conference victory in the 19-year history of the program on the afternoon of Sunday, Sept. 8, when they scored a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the finale of the Minnesota Gold Classic held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 65th minute while making a season-high seven saves in goal on the defensive end. The Tigers defeated their highest ranked non-conference opponent in program history with just their second victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in the non-conference all-time. LSU has now won seven matches to go along with nine draws over nationally-ranked opponents under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

Tigers Feature Diverse Scoring Attack in 2013

The Tigers have featured a diverse attack during the 2013 season as 11 different goal scorers have accounted for the team's 18 goals thus far on the campaign. Sophomore **Fernanda Pina** is the team's leading goal scorer with four on the year, while freshman **Summer Clarke** has netted three goals and juniors **Alex Arlitt** and **Jodi Calloway** have scored two goals apiece through 11 matches on the year. Seniors **Nina Anderson**, **Megan Kinneman** and **Alex Ramsey**; sophomores **Lexi Gibbs** and **Heather Magee**; and freshmen **Emma Fletcher** and **Megan Lee** have also opened up their account with a goal of their own. Interestingly enough, six different Tigers have scored the team's six goals in SEC play through three games as Anderson, Clarke, Fletcher, Lee, Magee and Pina have found the scoresheet in the league. In addition, nine different Tigers have recorded at least one assist this year with Fletcher leading the way with a team-best six assists in 2013.

Canadian International Fletcher Finds Her Scoring Boots in Conference Play

Freshman standout **Emma Fletcher** scored a stunner for her first career goal with the Tigers as she buried a 25-yard free kick from outside the top of the box in the 31st minute of LSU's 1-1 draw with Tennessee on Sept. 27. She followed by serving up the primary assist on fellow freshman **Megan Lee's** game-winning Golden Goal in the 103rd minute of double overtime against Mississippi State on Sunday afternoon en route to claiming SEC Freshman of the Week honors this week. While Fletcher has scored just the one goal on the season, she leads the Tigers and is tied for the No. 3 spot on the SEC's scoring table with six assists for the year. She is just two assists shy of tying LSU's freshman record of eight assists that is currently held by now senior defender **Addie Eggleston**.

Kinneman Poised for Record-Setting Senior Season in 2013

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has shown tremendous form in goal as the defensive leader for the Tigers this season. Kinneman pitched five shutouts during the non-conference season in wins over Louisiana Tech (1-0), UL-Monroe (6-0), Southern California (1-0) and Rice (1-0), as well as a scoreless draw against TCU. She is just one clean sheet shy of matching her career single-season high of six set as a freshman in 2010. She is also moving up LSU's career charts as she is now alone in second place with 16 shutouts and 229 saves during her collegiate career in Baton Rouge.

Kinneman Continues Scoring Touch from Penalty Spot in Senior Season

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has not only provided leadership for the Tigers on the defensive end of the field this season, but she has also proven herself as an asset on the offensive end of the field while scoring her third career goal from the penalty spot in the 65th minute of a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans back on Sept. 8 in LSU's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic. Kinneman is the top scoring goalkeeper in the program's history as she has found the back of the net on all three of her penalty kick opportunities over the past two seasons. That also includes a conversion in a 2-1 overtime defeat to 18th-ranked Kentucky and the game-winner in the 93rd minute in a 3-2 win at Ole Miss last year.

Mexican International Pina Fluent in Language of Futbol

Much was expected of Mexican Under-20 international **Fernanda Pina** when she signed her National Letter of Intent with the Tigers as part of the Class of 2012, and she has certainly made an impact in the attack upon her arrival in Baton Rouge over the past two seasons. Pina is the team's leading goal scorer for the second-straight season as she has netted four goals in 11 appearances in 2013 as the Tigers take on Arkansas on Friday night. That matches her output in 21 appearances in 2012 as she netted a team-leading four goals as a freshman a season ago. Pina recorded her first career multi-goal game while scoring the first and last goals in a 6-0 rout of UL-Monroe on Aug. 27, while she also scored against No. 6 BYU on Sept. 2 and netted the game-winning Golden Goal in a 2-1 overtime win at Vanderbilt on Sept. 20.

LSU's Canadian Connection

The Tigers are excited to welcome a trio of Canadian Under-17 and Under-20 internationals into the squad this season as freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario) have made their collegiate debuts in 2013. Both Clarke and Pongetti featured in Canada's starting 11 at the 2012 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup last fall in Azerbaijan last fall, while Fletcher drove the engine for New Zealand's U-17 squad during the event. All three Tiger cubs are now among Canada's player pool that will be used to pick its team for the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup during the 2014 season. Fletcher leads the team and ranks third in the SEC with six assists, while Clarke is second on the team with three goals on the year.

Mexican International Gomez-Junco Redshirts During 2013 Season

Head coach **Brian Lee** and his staff received great news during the offseason when former University of Memphis stand-out **Natalia Gomez-Junco** elected to transfer to LSU following a brilliant two seasons in Memphis. Gomez-Junco proved to be one of the elite performers in Conference USA during her two seasons at Memphis, scoring 10 goals and dishing out a pair of assists for 22 points with the Tigers. She was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team in 2011 after scoring eight goals and 17 points as Memphis' second-leading scorer. After redshirting in 2013, Gomez-Junco will be a welcomed addition to LSU's midfield lineup in 2014 as a capped member of the senior Mexican Women's National Team. She was also one of Mexico's premier performers at the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup in 2010 and 2012.

LSU Soccer's Recruiting Class Ranked in Top 15 Nationally for 2013

LSU Soccer's heralded 2013 recruiting class solidified its reputation as one of the nation's best during the preseason when it was selected the No. 1-ranked class in the SEC and the No. 14-ranked class in the NCAA ahead of the 2013 season by the editorial staff at AllWhiteKit.com. The Tigers welcomed five recruits with an international pedigree to campus for the 2013 season as junior transfer **Natalia Gomez-Junco** (Monterrey, Mexico) joined freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia, Canada), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada), **Megan Lee** (Massey, Auckland, New Zealand) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) to bolster a young but talented roster in 2013. Each earned starting experience for their countries at the FIFA Women's World Cup at the U-17 and U-20 levels as youths.

LSU Picked Second in SEC West by Coaches in Preseason Poll

The four-time SEC Western Division champion LSU Tigers were selected to finish in second place in the final SEC West standings during the 2013 season in a preseason vote of the league's 14 head coaches. The Tigers received one first-place vote to be crowned the SEC Western Division champion, although the league's athletic directors voted to eliminate the divisional format for women's soccer following the SEC's preseason release. LSU captured four SEC West titles in a five-year span under the previous format with wins in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011. Texas A&M was selected to defend its SEC West crown won in its inaugural season in the league in 2012, while also being tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC regular season title with eight first-place votes. The Florida Gators received six first-place votes to defend the SEC crown they won a season ago, as well as 11 first-place votes to repeat as the SEC Eastern Division champion.
