#### Tigers and Crimson Tide to Battle for SEC Lead in Tuscaloosa on Sunday

First place on the Southeastern Conference table will be up for grabs on Sunday afternoon when the Tigers (7-3-2, 3-0-1 SEC) makes the trip to Tuscaloosa, Ala., to take on Alabama (5-6, 3-1) in a match that is scheduled to kick off at 1 p.m. CT at the Alabama Soccer Stadium. The Tigers remain the only unbeaten team in SEC play through four conference matches as they sit alone atop the league table with a 3-0-1 mark and 10 points. LSU holds a narrow one-point lead over the likes of Alabama, Kentucky, South Carolina and Texas A&M with matching 3-1 records and nine points in SEC play. The Tigers held onto their SEC lead with a thrilling 5-3 victory at Arkansas on Friday night as freshman **Summer Clarke** scored her first career hat trick and freshman **Emma Fletcher** tied a school single-game record with three assists in the win. Clarke actually doubled her goal total entering the match as she now leads the team with six goals on the campaign, while Fletcher has now set the LSU freshman record with her team-leading nine assists for the season. The will look to help the Tigers extend their unbeaten streak to six-straight games as the Tigers are now unbeaten in their last five dating back to a 1-0 shutout at Rice on Sept. 15 in their non-conference finale. LSU also enters Sunday's contest with a seven-game unbeaten streak against Alabama with a 5-0-2 mark against their SEC rivals since the 2006 season, including a three-game winning streak in matches played at the Alabama Soccer Stadium in Tuscaloosa. The Crimson Tide are led by junior All-SEC striker Pia Rijdsdijk as she has scored a team-leading four goals and two assists for 10 points on the year. Sophomore Merel Van Dongen, the reigning SEC Freshman of the Year, also led the team with four goals this season before she was lost for the year with a season-ending injury earlier in the campaign.

### STORYLINES

- The Tigers will look to run their unbeaten record to six games when they face Alabama on Sunday with a 4-0-1 mark in their last five games.
- Freshman **Emma Fletcher** is the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week after scoring her first career goal on a 25-yard free kick in the 31st minute of LSU's 1-1 draw with Tennessee on Sept. 27 and assisting **Megan Lee's** game-winning Golden Goal in a 3-2 double OT win over Mississippi State on Sunday afternoon.
- **Emma Fletcher** has set LSU's freshman record with nine assists on the year after she tied the team's single-game record with three assists against Arkansas on Friday.
- The Tigers are riding a seven-game unbeaten streak in their series with Alabama with a 5-0-2 mark since the 2006 season, including a 1-1 draw in Baton Rouge a year ago.
- The Tigers are unbeaten in four matches to open SEC play for just the third time in team history at 3-0-1 on the season, after starting 4-0 in 2009 and 2011 en route to second-place finishes in the final SEC standings. They have never started off unbeaten in five SEC matches.
- The Tigers enter Sunday's match with a three-game winning streak in Tuscaloosa since 2007 following their 2-1 win in 2007, 3-0 shutout in 2009 and 2-0 shutout in 2011.
- LSU scored its largest margin of victory over an SEC opponent in 2008 when it shut out the Crimson Tide by a 7-0 margin in Baton Rouge during the 2008 regular season.
- LSU features a diverse attack as 13 different Tigers have found the scoresheet with 23 goals scored through 12 matches this season.
- After playing 13 SEC games in the first year of SEC expansion in 2012, each of the 14 league teams will play an 11-game conference schedule in 2013. LSU will not face Auburn and South Carolina in the regular season.

## MATCHDAY LIVE: LSU VS. ALABAMA

**Date/Time:** Sunday, Oct. 6 at 1 p.m. CT  
**Location:** Tuscaloosa, Ala. – Alabama Soccer Stadium (1,500)

**Series Record:** Alabama leads, 9-6-3

**Series Notes:** LSU and Alabama will battle for first place in the Southeastern Conference standings when they meet at the Alabama Soccer Stadium on Sunday afternoon in a match that is scheduled to kick off at 1 p.m. CT. The Tigers are riding a seven-game unbeaten streak in the series as they have posted a 5-0-2 mark against the Crimson Tide since the 2006 season. That includes a 1-1 draw in their last meeting in Baton Rouge a season ago. The Tigers are also riding a three-game winning streak in matches played in Tuscaloosa following a 2-1 win in 2007, a 3-0 shutout in 2009 and a 2-0 shutout in 2011 in their last three matches at the Alabama Soccer Stadium. Despite LSU's recent run of form, the Tide hold a 9-6-3 advantage in the all-time series that dates back to LSU's inaugural 1995 campaign.

## LAST TIME OUT: LSU 5, ARKANSAS 3 • FAYETTEVILLE, ARK.

Friday night's match between LSU and Arkansas turned into an old-fashioned SEC West shootout as freshman **Summer Clarke** scored a hat trick and fellow freshman **Emma Fletcher** dished out three assists to lead the Tigers to a 5-3 victory on a record-setting night to maintain their SEC lead at Razorback Field. Clarke scored LSU's first hat trick in nearly four years with goals in the 20th, 60th and 63rd minutes to double her season total entering the match, while senior **Danielle Murphy** found the back of the net in the 44th minute and freshman **Rebecca Pongetti** scored her first career goal in the 86th minute to keep the Tigers (7-3-2, 3-0-1 SEC) at the top of the league table. Fletcher was also brilliant with her play in the midfield as she matched LSU's single-game record with three assists to set the team's freshman record with nine assists on the season. With the win, the Tigers extend their unbeaten streak to five-straight matches on the season.

## NOTEBOOK

### Tigers Look to Remain Unbeaten in SEC Play at Alabama

LSU Soccer is off to an unbeaten 3-0-1 start in SEC play as the Tigers are top of the league table with 10 points as they head to Alabama on Sunday afternoon. They are unbeaten after four SEC matches for just the third time in program history, as they raced out to a perfect 4-0 start in both 2009 and 2011 before finishing in second place in the final standings in both years. LSU has never been unbeaten in five-straight matches to start SEC play as the Tigers look to make history at Alabama on Sunday afternoon.

### Tigers Feature Diverse Scoring Attack in 2013

The Tigers have featured a diverse attack during the 2013 season as 13 different goal scorers have accounted for the team's 23 goals thus far on the campaign. Freshman **Summer Clarke** is the team's leading goal scorer with six goals on the year, while sophomore **Fernanda Pina** follows with four goals to match her career-high for a single season. Juniors **Alex Arlitt** and **Jodi Calloway** have scored two goals apiece through 12 matches this year, while seniors **Nina Anderson**, **Megan Kinneman**, **Danielle Murphy** and **Alex Ramsey**; sophomores **Lexi Gibbs** and **Heather Magee**; and freshmen **Emma Fletcher**, **Megan Lee** and **Rebecca Pongetti** have also opened their account with a goal of their own. In addition, eight different Tigers have scored the team's 11 goals in SEC play through four games as Anderson, Clarke, Fletcher, Lee, Magee, Murphy, Pina and Pongetti have found the scoresheet in the league.

### Canadian International Fletcher Sets LSU Freshman Record for Assists

Freshman standout **Emma Fletcher** scored a stunner for her first career goal with the Tigers as she buried a 25-yard free kick from outside the top of the box in the 31st minute of LSU's 1-1 draw with Tennessee on Sept. 27. She followed by serving up the primary assist on fellow freshman **Megan Lee's** game-winning Golden Goal in the 103rd minute of double overtime against Mississippi State on Sunday afternoon en route to claiming SEC Freshman of the Week honors this week. She followed by tying LSU's single-game record with three assists in a 5-3 win at Arkansas on Friday night as she recorded a new LSU freshman record with nine assists on the year, breaking the previous freshman mark of eight assists set by now senior defender **Addie Eggleston** during the 2010 season.

### Clarke Finds Scoring Touch in SEC Play as Team's Top Scorer

Freshman striker **Summer Clarke** doubled her goal total on the season in LSU's 5-3 win at Arkansas on Friday night as she scored the team's first hat trick in nearly four years in the victory. Clarke, who now leads the squad with six goals on the year and four goals in SEC play, found the net in the 20th, 60th and 63rd minutes to record the 20th hat trick all-time for the LSU Soccer program. It was the first hat trick by a LSU Tiger since **Malorie Rutledge** found the net three times in a 7-0 win over Arkansas-Little Rock in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Nov. 13, 2009.

### Tigers Earn Best Non-Conference Win in Program History vs. USC Trojans

The Tigers earned perhaps their most impressive non-conference victory in the 19-year history of the program on the afternoon of Sunday, Sept. 8, when they scored a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the finale of the Minnesota Gold Classic held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 65th minute while making a season-high seven saves in goal on the defensive end. The Tigers defeated their highest ranked non-conference opponent in program history with just their second victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in the non-conference all-time. LSU has now won seven matches to go along with nine draws over nationally-ranked opponents under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

## Kinneman Poised for Record-Setting Senior Season in 2013

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has shown tremendous form in goal as the defensive leader for the Tigers this season. Kinneman pitched five shutouts during the non-conference season in wins over Louisiana Tech (1-0), UL-Monroe (6-0), Southern California (1-0) and Rice (1-0), as well as a scoreless draw against TCU. She is just one clean sheet shy of matching her career single-season high of six set as a freshman in 2010. She is also moving up LSU's career charts as she is now alone in second place with 16 shutouts and 235 saves during her collegiate career in Baton Rouge.

## Kinneman Continues Scoring Touch from Penalty Spot in Senior Season

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has not only provided leadership for the Tigers on the defensive end of the field this season, but she has also proven herself as an asset on the offensive end of the field while scoring her third career goal from the penalty spot in the 65th minute of a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans back on Sept. 8 in LSU's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic. Kinneman is the top scoring goalkeeper in the program's history as she has found the back of the net on all three of her penalty kick opportunities over the past two seasons. That also includes a conversion in a 2-1 overtime defeat to 18th-ranked Kentucky and the game-winner in the 93rd minute in a 3-2 win at Ole Miss last year.

## Mexican International Pina Fluent in Language of Futbol

Much was expected of Mexican Under-20 international **Fernanda Pina** when she signed her National Letter of Intent with the Tigers as part of the Class of 2012, and she has certainly made an impact in the attack upon her arrival in Baton Rouge over the past two seasons. Pina is the team's second-leading goal scorer this season as she has netted four goals in 12 appearances in 2013 as the Tigers take on Alabama on Sunday. That matches her output in 21 appearances in 2012 as she netted a team-leading four goals as a freshman a season ago. Pina recorded her first career multi-goal game while scoring the first and last goals in a 6-0 rout of UL-Monroe on Aug. 27, while she also scored against No. 6 BYU on Sept. 2 and netted the game-winning Golden Goal in a 2-1 overtime win at Vanderbilt on Sept. 20.

## LSU's Canadian Connection

The Tigers are excited to welcome a trio of Canadian Under-17 and Under-20 internationals into the squad this season as freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario) have made their collegiate debuts in 2013. Both Clarke and Pongetti featured in Canada's starting 11 at the 2012 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup last fall in Azerbaijan last fall, while Fletcher drove the engine for New Zealand's U-17 squad during the event. All three Tiger cubs are now among Canada's player pool that will be used to pick its team for the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup during the 2014 season.

## LSU Soccer's Recruiting Class Ranked in Top 15 Nationally for 2013

LSU Soccer's heralded 2013 recruiting class solidified its reputation as one of the nation's best during the preseason when it was selected the No. 1-ranked class in the SEC and the No. 14-ranked class in the NCAA ahead of the 2013 season by the editorial staff at AllWhiteKit.com. The Tigers welcomed five recruits with an international pedigree to campus for the 2013 season as junior transfer **Natalia Gomez-Junco** (Monterrey, Mexico) joined freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia, Canada), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada), **Megan Lee** (Massey, Auckland, New Zealand) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) to bolster a young but talented roster in 2013. Each earned starting experience for their countries at the FIFA Women's World Cup at the U-17 and U-20 levels as youths.

## LSU Picked Second in SEC West by Coaches in Preseason Poll

The four-time SEC Western Division champion LSU Tigers were selected to finish in second place in the final SEC West standings during the 2013 season in a preseason vote of the league's 14 head coaches. The Tigers received one first-place vote to be crowned the SEC Western Division champion, although the league's athletic directors voted to eliminate the divisional format for women's soccer following the SEC's preseason release. LSU captured four SEC West titles in a five-year span under the previous format with wins in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011. Texas A&M was selected to defend its SEC West crown won in its inaugural season in the league in 2012, while also being tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC regular season title with eight first-place votes. The Florida Gators received six first-place votes to defend the SEC crown they won a season ago, as well as 11 first-place votes to repeat as the SEC Eastern Division champion.
