LSU's High-Powered Offense Meets SEC's Top Defense On Saturday in Tiger Stadium

LSU's high-powered offense will face its toughest test of the season on Saturday when the No. 10/11 Tigers host No. 17 Florida at 2:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on CBS with Verne Lundquist, Gary Danielson and Tracy Wolfson on the call. LSU upped its record to 5-1 overall and 2-1 SEC in play following its 59-26 win over Mississippi State last week. Florida beat Arkansas, 30-10, to run its record to 4-1 overall and 3-0 in conference action. LSU has won five straight and 27 of its last 28 games in Tiger Stadium. Saturday's game will mark the 10th straight year that both LSU and Florida - permanent cross-divisional opponents - enter the game ranked in the Top 25. Saturday's game will also feature an LSU offense that ranks among the league leaders in scoring (3rd at 45.5), passing (3rd at 291.5) and total offense (4th at 488.8) against a Florida defense that leads the league in scoring (12.2), total defense (217.0), pass defense (152.0) and rushing defense (65.0). LSU has topped the 400-yard mark in all six games this year - a first in school history - and they've scored at least 30 points in every game thus far - also a first for the Tigers. QB **Zach Mettenberger** leads the SEC in pass efficiency with a 190.1 rating as he's completed 107-of-152 passes for 1,738 yards and 15 touchdowns with only two interceptions. He's on pace to set the school record for passing yards and passing TDs in a season. LSU's wide receiver tandem of **Jarvis Landry** (42 rec., 616 yards, 7 TDs) and **Odell Beckham Jr.** (35 rec., 686 yards, 6 TDs) is the most productive in college football in terms of combined receptions (77) and yards (1,302). RB **Jeremy Hill** had his 7th career 100-yard rushing game vs. Mississippi State with 157 yards. Hill leads the SEC and ranks No. 2 in the nation with 9 rushing TDs and his 118.8 rushing average is No. 2 in the SEC and 11th in the nation. Defensively, LSU is allowing 24.7 points and 367.0 total yards (159.5 rushing, 207.5 passing) per game. LB **Lamin Barrow** leads the Tigers with 36 tackles, while DE **Jermauria Rasco** has 29 tackles, including 3.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. DT **Anthony Johnson** leads LSU with 4.5 tackles for loss to go with 21 total tackles, a sack and an interception. PK **Colby Delahoussaye** leads the SEC in scoring by kickers with 57 total points as he's connected on all seven of his field goal attempts and his 36-of-36 PATs.

NOTEABLES

- QB **Zach Mettenberger** has thrown for 300 yards or more in back-to-back games joining Tommy Hodson (1989), Rohan Davey (2001) and Matt Flynn (2007) as the only players in school history to accomplish the feat.

- QB **Zach Mettenberger** has thrown 7 punt ret., 19 kickoff ret., 35 rec., 1 ret. of missed FG).

- Tyler had 37 consecutive starts from 1995-98. Mettenberger is 15-4 as LSU's starting quarterback.

- **Odell Beckham Jr.** and **Jarvis Landry** form the nation's top wide receiving tandem as they've combined for 77 receptions for 1,302 yards and 13 TDs.

- **Jarvis Landry** has caught 42 passes this year with 31 of them going for first downs. Of those 27 first down receptions, 14 came on third down.

- **Zach Mettenberger** was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Monday for his play in LSU's win over Mississippi State. With 1,738 passing yards and 15 TDs, Mettenberger is on pace to set the school record in both categories.

- LSU has scored 30 or more points in the first six games of a season for the first time in school history and they've accounted for 400 or more total yards in all six games - also a first for LSU. For the first time in school history, the Tigers have scored at least 35 points in six straight games.

- LSU has played 14 true freshmen so far this season. The 14 true freshmen rank as the nation's third-highest total, trailing Texas A&M (17) and UCLA (16). In nine years under Miles, LSU has sent a total of 87 true freshmen to the field.

- **Odell Beckham Jr.** leads the nation in all-purpose yards with 228.2 per game and he's averaging 21.1 yards every time he touches the football. He's accumulated 1,369 all-purpose yards on 65 touches this year (3 rush,

- QB **Zach Mettenberger** has started 19 straight games, the longest streak by an LSU quarterback since Herb

- LSU has won 35 of its last 36 games when scoring at least 30 points. Under **Les Miles**, LSU is 63-5 when hitting the 30-point mark.

Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • NINTH SEASON

It's called the "Miles Method" and it's the mission of LSU football program under ninth-year head coach Les Miles. The "Miles Method" lays the foundation for the organization and it calls for LSU to run the finest football program in the country, one where players can have an experience that's second to none and gives them every opportunity to compete for championships on the field, earn a degree and grow personally by giving back to the community.

In eight years, the "Miles Method" has proved to be a winning formula as the Tigers have won more games than any program in the Southeastern Conference over that span (90), while capturing a pair of SEC titles (2007, 2011) and reaching the BCS National Championship Game two times (LSU won the 2007 national title).

Since Miles took over in 2005, LSU has registered five top 10 finishes with three coming in the top five, won double-figure games six times, produced 18 first-team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. LSU also leads the SEC with 51 NFL Draft picks during that span, which includes 12 first round selections.

Miles has climbed to second in school history in career victories with 90, trailing only Charles McClendon, who won 137 games in 18 years with the Tigers. Miles is also the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it now three times - and in 2005, he became the only first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's title game.

In the classroom, 172 football players have earned their degree since Miles took over and for the second straight year, LSU ranked second to only Vanderbilt in the SEC in graduation rates at 77 percent. Under Miles, LSU has produced 134 players who have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status.

LSU's community service presence is impactful as football players routinely donate time giving back to the Baton Rouge area through a variety of avenues, including appearances at schools, hospitals and many other charitable causes. It's through these community service ventures that Miles and his team get a better understanding of what it means to wear an LSU uniform and the impact that can be made on those who are less fortunate.

Now in his ninth season with the Tigers, the foundation for LSU football is stronger than ever. With wins coming at a record-setting pace, graduation rates the most for any public university in the SEC, and with six-straight recruiting classes rated among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of the premier programs in college football, setting a standard that has the rest of the nation chasing.

Series Record: Florida leads 31-25-3

Series Notes:

LSU and Florida meet for the 60th time with the Gators leading the series, 31-25-3 ... Teams are meeting as Top 25 opponents for the 10th straight year dating back to the 2004 contest in Gainesville... Florida serves as LSU's permanent opponent in the SEC Eastern Division ... The teams have met every year since 1971 ... Dating back to 2000, Florida holds a 7-6 advantage in the series ... Florida won last year's meeting 14-6 in Gainesville ... LSU won last meeting in Tiger Stadium, 41-11, in 2011 ... Florida last won in Tiger Stadium in 2009 when the top-ranked Gators beat LSU, 13-3 ... LSU is 14-16 vs. Florida in Tiger Stadium ... LSU coach **Les Miles** is 4-4 vs. Florida, which includes a 3-1 record in Tiger Stadium ... The four wins makes Miles the second-winningest LSU coach against Florida as he trails only Charles McClendon, who beat the Gators eight times during his career.

NOTEBOOK

Les Miles vs. The SEC

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 51-20 against SEC teams (all games) since taking over for the Tigers in 2005. The 51 wins include two victories in the SEC Championship Game, while two of the 19 losses include a defeat to Georgia in the 2005 SEC title game and the loss to Alabama in the 2012 BCS National Championship game. In games that count towards the SEC standings, Miles is 49-18.

Les Miles Is 18-9 vs. SEC East

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 18-9 in all games against teams from the SEC Eastern Division, which includes a 2-1 mark in the SEC title game and a 15-8 record in SEC regular season contests. The Tigers have won eight of their last 10 games against SEC East foes with the only losses during that span coming at No. 10 Florida on Oct. 6 last season and at No. 9 Georgia on Sept. 28. LSU is the only SEC Western Division team who plays both Georgia and Florida during the regular season this year.

October Success

Since 2005, LSU owns a 23-7 record in the month of October under head coach **Les Miles**. The Tigers have won seven out of their eight games played in October with the only loss during that span coming at Florida last year on Oct. 6.

Les Miles Becomes Quickest LSU Coach To Reach 90 Wins

The following is a quick look at **Les Miles'** notable accomplishments during his nine years and 112 games (90-22 record) as head coach of the Tigers:

- With the win over Mississippi State, Miles became the quickest LSU coach to reach 90 victories doing so in 112 games. It took Charles McClendon 124 games to reach that milestone.
- Also the fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), 70 wins (87 games), and 80 wins (98 games) in school history
- With 10 or more wins six times at LSU, Miles joined Bear Bryant (13 at Alabama), Steve Spurrier (9 at Florida), Philip Fulmer (9 at Tennessee), Mark Richt (8 at Georgia) and Vince Dooley (7 at Georgia) as the only coaches in SEC history to have six or more 10-win seasons at the same school.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011 ... Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it three times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the regular season during the same year, doing it twice (2010, '11).
- Only first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005)
- Has 15 wins over coaches who have won national titles
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in three straight seasons - a first at the school - and to six overall (the most at the school).
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007).

LSU's Dynamic Receiving Duo of Odell Beckham, Jr. and Jarvis Landry

LSU's offense under new offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron** has thrived in its first six games as **Odell Beckham Jr.** and **Jarvis Landry** are arguably the top wide receiver duo in college football. The two have combined for 77 receptions for 1,302 yards and 13 receiving touchdowns. They have combined for more receiving yards than eight SEC teams have passed for the entire season. Landry leads the SEC in receiving touchdowns with seven, while Beckham Jr. is second with six.

• They are the only duo in the SEC to each average over 100 yards receiving per game this season. **Beckham** is third in the SEC and 13th in the nation (114.3), while Landry is fourth in the SEC and 20th nationally (102.7).

- **Landry** has caught 75 passes in LSU's last 10 games with 11 touchdowns. He's caught eight passes or more in six of LSU's last 11 games. Landry recorded at least one receiving touchdown in seven straight games from last year's Arkansas contest through the Georgia game in week five this year. That streak tied the school record also held by Dwayne Bowe, who caught a TD pass in seven straight games during the 2005 season. Landry's streak ended at Mississippi State on Oct. 5.

- **Landry's** seven TDs are the most by an LSU player through the first six games of a season since Carlos Carson had eight in 1977. Landry is tied for fourth nationally in receiving touchdowns with seven, while Beckham is tied for eighth with six. Brandin Cooks of Oregon State leads the nation with nine. The LSU school record for single-season receiving touchdowns is 12 held by Dwayne Bowe in 2006.

- **Landry** was the first LSU player to record at least one receiving touchdown in each of the first five games of a season.

- **Landry's** 42 catches are the most by an LSU player through the first six games of a season since Biletnikoff winner Josh Reed had 42 catches in 2001. Of the 42 catches by Landry, 32 of them have gone for first downs. Of those 32 first down receptions, 14 came on third down.

- **Landry** notched a career-high 156 receiving yards and a career-best 10 catches at Georgia in week four. It was his fourth career 100-yard receiving game and third of the season. The 10 catches were the most by an LSU player in an SEC game since Michael Clayton had 12 at Alabama on Nov. 15, 2003.

- **Beckham Jr.** has accounted for six career 100-yard games and four this season. The six rank eighth in school history.

- **Beckham Jr.** delivered his career game when he caught nine passes for 179 yards and two touchdowns at Mississippi State on Oct. 5. The 179 yards were the most by an LSU player in an SEC game since the famous "Bluegrass Miracle" when Devery Henderson recorded 201 at Kentucky on Nov. 9, 2002.

- Both **Beckham Jr.** and **Landry** have gone over 100 yards in the same game twice this season, doing so against TCU and at Georgia. They are the first duo in school history to go over 100 yards twice in the same game in the same season. Prior to their 100-yard games against TCU in the opener, the last time an LSU duo each went over 100 yards receiving was the 2002 Sugar Bowl when Josh Reed and Michael Clayton did it.

- **Beckham Jr.'s** three receiving TDs in the UAB game tied for third in LSU single-game history and were the most by an LSU player since Terrence Toliver hauled in three against Texas A&M in the 2011 Cotton Bowl.

All-Purpose OBJ3

Odell Beckham Jr. leads the SEC and the nation in all-purpose yards with 222.8 per game highlighted by the first missed field goal return for a touchdown in school history when he raced 100 yards for a score on a missed 59-yard attempt with 2:11 remaining in the third quarter of the UAB game in week 2. He is averaging averaging 21.1 yards every time he touches the ball.

- **Beckham's** accounted for 1,369 all-purpose yards with 65 touches (3 rush, 35 rec., 7 punt ret., 19 kickoff ret., and 1 missed FG ret.). He is 78 yards away from cracking the LSU single-season top 10 in all-purpose yards. The single-season school record for all-purpose yards is 2,120 by Domanick Davis in 2002.

- **Beckham** set the LSU single-game school record with 175 kickoff return yards on seven returns at Georgia. The previous record was 164 yards by Trindon Holliday against Georgia in 2008. Beckham Jr. tied the LSU record for most kickoff returns in a game with seven, a mark previously set by Holliday against Georgia and Florida in 2008.

- **Beckham** accounted for 331 all-purpose yards against UAB in week two (third-highest total in school history) and 289 yards (sixth highest total in school history) at No. 9 Georgia in week four. The 289 against Georgia went down as the most all-purpose yards by an LSU player in an SEC game since Devery Henderson recorded 298 against Kentucky in 2002.

- **Beckham Jr.** was believed to be the first FBS player to return a missed short field goal for a touchdown since Richie Iuzzi of Clemson did it vs. Georgia on Sept. 28, 1968 (108 yards, 100 statistically). Others who have done it: Don Guest of California, 109 yards vs. Washington on Sept. 17, 1966; James Elmore of Tennessee, 95 yards vs. Carson-Newman on Sept. 25, 1926.

- **Beckham Jr.** has recorded three special teams touchdowns in his career: one missed field goal return in 2013 and two punt returns in 2012.

- **Beckham Jr.** recorded four total touchdowns against UAB in week 2, becoming the first LSU player to achieve that feat since LaBrandon Toefield did it with four rushing TDs against Utah State on Sept. 8, 2001.

Zach Mettenberger On Record Pace In Second Year as Starting QB

Senior quarterback **Zach Mettenberger** is on a record-breaking pace six weeks into the season. His 15 passing touchdowns are the most by a quarterback in the first six games in LSU history. Mettenberger's 1,738 passing yards are also the most through the first six games in LSU history.

- In just two seasons as a starter, **Mettenberger** has already entered the LSU career top 10 in passing yards with 4,439. That tally is eighth in school history as he surpassed Rohan Davey with his performance at Mississippi State.
- **Mettenberger** was named SEC Offensive Player of the Week after throwing for 340 yards on 25-of-29 passing with two touchdowns at Mississippi State on Oct. 5. The 25 completions were a career high and the most by an LSU QB in any game since Rohan Davey had 31 in the 2002 Sugar Bowl against Illinois. His .862 completion percentage was the fourth-highest in LSU single-game history.
- In one of the best outings by a quarterback in school history, **Mettenberger** made his return to Georgia a memorable one when he threw for a career-best 372 yards on 23-of-37 passes with three touchdowns. The 372 yards was the seventh-highest total in school history and the most by an LSU quarterback in a game since Rohan Davey tossed for 444 in the Sugar Bowl against Illinois on Jan. 1, 2002. Mettenberger's yardage was also the highest total by an LSU QB in an SEC game since Davey shattered the SEC record with 528 at Alabama on Nov. 3, 2001.
- **Mettenberger** was the only QB in LSU history to throw for 250 or more yards in each of the first three games of a season. Dating back to last year, the senior has thrown for 250 yards or more in eight of LSU's last 11 games. He owns a 15-4 mark as a starter in his career, including a 10-1 mark in Tiger Stadium.
- **Mettenberger** leads the SEC and ranks fourth nationally in pass efficiency (190.1) and he is sixth nationally in passing yards per completion (16.1). He leads the nation in pass completions of 20 yards or more with 35, which is one more better than Arizona State's Kelly who has 34.
- **Mettenberger** recorded 12 passing TDs all of last season. Through six games, he has surpassed that with 15, which leads the SEC. For his career, Mettenberger is up to 28 touchdown passes, which is one shy of the LSU top 10.
- **Mettenberger** has thrown just two interceptions this season. He started the season with 77 consecutive passes without a pick before throwing one on the first play of the third quarter against Auburn in week four. In the Mississippi State contest, Mettenberger completed 12 straight passes for fourth-best in LSU single-game history.
- **Mettenberger** shattered the LSU single-game passing touchdown record with five against UAB in week 2, including three in the first half. As a team, the five passing touchdowns for LSU against UAB were the most by the squad since recording five in the 2000 season-opener against Western Carolina. Mettenberger became the first LSU QB to throw three or more TDs in a half since JaMarcus Russell fired three in the first half of the Mississippi State game on Sept. 30, 2006.
- **Mettenberger's** 251 passing yards against TCU were the most in an LSU season-opener since JaMarcus Russell threw for 253 in the 2006 opener against Louisiana-Lafayette. He also converted 9-of-15 third-down passes in the TCU contest.

Zach Mettenberger Becomes Fifth QB In LSU History With Back-to-Back 300-Yard Games

When Zach Mettenberger threw for 340 yards at Mississippi State on Oct. 5, he became only the eighth quarterback in LSU history to throw for 300 or more yards in two games in the same season. Mettenberger also became the fifth LSU QB to throw for 300 yards in back-to-back games and the first since Matt Flynn did it in 2007 (319 vs. Auburn, 353 at Alabama). Others who have thrown for 300 yards in back-to-back game: Rohan Davey (3 straight times in 2001), Jeff Wickersham (twice in 1983), and Tommy Hodson (twice in 1989).

More On the LSU Offense

- LSU has recorded over 400 yards of total offense in each of its first six games, which is a first in school history.
- LSU has scored over 30 points in each of the first six games for the first time in school history. It's also the first time in school history that the Tigers have scored over 35 points in six consecutive games at any point during a season.
- LSU's combined 214 points are the most through the first five games of a season in school history, surpassing the previous best of 201 by the 2003 national championship team.
- LSU scored 59 points in a 59-26 win at Mississippi State on Oct. 5. The 59 points were the most by the Tigers in an SEC game since a 63-28 win at Kentucky on Nov. 1, 1997.
- LSU's 2,933 yards of total offense is the most through the first six games of a season in school history. The previous best was the 2001 team with 2,739 yards through the first six games.
- LSU ranks second nationally in both plays of 10-plus yards from scrimmage (114) and plays of 20-plus yards from scrimmage (45). The Tigers lead the nation in passing plays of 20 yards or more with 35.
- LSU's 15 passing touchdowns rank second in the SEC behind only Texas A&M's 16.
- LSU has converted 27 of its 29 redzone chances (93.1 percent; 22 touchdowns, five field goals). Note: The victory formation to end the Kent State game does NOT count against LSU's redzone chances. The Tigers were a perfect 6-of-6 in red zone opportunities at Mississippi State with five scores coming on touchdowns and one via field goal. LSU has converted its last nine redzone opportunities dating back to the Georgia game.
- The Tigers lead the SEC and rank third nationally in third-down conversions, converting 42-of-72 for 58 percent. In the season-opener against TCU, LSU converted 13-of-19 third downs, the most in the **Les Miles** era and the most since converting 13 against Kentucky on Oct. 13, 2001. Even more impressive, the Tigers were a stellar 10-of-15 on third down in a hostile road

environment at Georgia in week four.

- LSU averaged 10.4 yards per play against Kent State in week 3, a figure that ranked second in school history. The record is 11.1 against Kentucky on Oct. 14, 2006.
- LSU outscored Mississippi State 28-0 in the fourth quarter on Oct. 5. The 28 points were the most by the Tigers in the fourth quarter of an SEC game since putting up 28 in a 61-17 win over Ole Miss on Dec. 5, 1970. It was LSU's most overall points in the fourth quarter since scoring 30 against Troy on Nov. 15, 2008.
- LSU is outscoring opponents 90-26 in first quarters this season. TCU managed a field goal in the season-opener and Georgia recorded two touchdowns.

Jeremy Hill Spearheading LSU Ground Game

Jeremy Hill was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in LSU's 35-21 win over Auburn on Sept. 21 in Tiger Stadium. Hill rushed for career-highs of 184 yards and three touchdowns on 25 carries in leading LSU past Auburn. The sophomore scored the first two times he touched the ball – going 49 yards on the first TD and then 12-yard on his next carry – to give LSU a 14-0 lead just minutes into the contest. Hill added a third touchdown on a 6-yard run in the third quarter that stretched LSU's lead to 28-7. He also set up LSU's third touchdown of the game when he raced 54-yards down to the Auburn 1-yard line.

- The 184 rushing yards by **Hill** against Auburn were the most by an LSU player since Alley Broussard set the school record with 250 yards in a win over Ole Miss in 2004. The 184 yards were also the most by an SEC player in any game this season.
- **Hill**, who has only played 16 career games, is already tied for sixth in LSU career 100-yard rushing performances with seven. He is tied with LaBrandon Toefield (2000-02), Rondell Mealey (1996-99) and Steve Van Buren (1941-43).
- The 184 yards against Auburn also propelled **Hill** over the 1,000 yard mark in his career. He now has 1,349 yards on 221 carries with 21 touchdowns and 0 fumbles lost heading into the Florida game. Hill was the second quickest running back in LSU history to reach 1,000 yards. Hill did it on 165 carries. Justin Vincent was the fastest running back in school history to do it on 154 carries.
- **Hill's** 21 career rushing touchdowns are just three shy of the LSU career top 10 and tying the mark of Billy Cannon.
- In games that **Hill** has at least 10 carries, he's scored a touchdown in 11 of those 12 games and he's reached 100 yards seven times.

LSU Has Just 8th Game of 300+ Rushing Yards and 250+ Passing Yards In School History

For just the eighth time in school history, LSU had 300+ rushing yards and 250+ passing yards in the 45-13 win over Kent State in week 3. LSU finished the Kent State game with 571 total yards (307 rushing, 264 passing). It was the first time since the Louisiana Tech contest in 2007 that LSU had reached those numbers in the same game. Here's a look at the other games in school history that LSU recorded 300+ rushing yards and 250+ passing yards in the same contest:

Terrence Magee's Onto The Scene

Entering the TCU season-opener, junior running back **Terrence Magee** had totaled only 28 carries in his career. Magee delivered a breakout game against the Horned Frogs, rushing for a game-high 95 yards on 13 carries with two touchdowns. The highlight came with 13:11 in the third quarter when he raced a career-long 52 yards for a score. Magee then went over the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career with nine carries for 108 yards -- all in the second half -- in the win over Kent State in week three. Magee ranks second on the team in rushing with 40.5 yards per game. All four LSU running backs -- Magee, **Alfred Blue**, **Kenny Hilliard** and **Jeremy Hill** -- have led the Tigers in rushing in a game before and all four have recorded multiple touchdown games in their careers. Hill leads the way with 21 career rushing TDs followed by Hilliard (19), Blue (11) and Magee (4).

LSU's 48-7 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 48-7 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 20-5 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. The only seven losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005. In Miles' tenure at LSU, the Tigers have a combined turnover margin of +62. LSU was +20 in 2011, +16 last season and +2 this year.

LSU Running Backs Rarely Fumble

Of the six running backs on the LSU roster, they have combined for 624 career carries and only lost fumbles five times during that stretch. The following is a look at LSU's current running backs and the numbers of carries since they have had since they lost a fumble as well as their career rushing attempts and career number of lost fumbles:

NON-CONFERENCE REGULAR SEASON WIN STREAK

LSU owns the nation's longest non-conference regular season winning streak, which stands at an NCAA FBS record 44 games. The last time the Tigers lost a non-conference regular season game was Sept. 1, 2002, at #16 Virginia Tech.

LSU is 35-4 Under Les Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 35-4 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2013 roster, LSU has 11 career 100-yard games to its credit. **Jeremy Hill** has seven, **Kenny Hilliard** has one, **Terrence Magee** has one and **Alfred Blue** has two. LSU's only four losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came vs. Clemson in 2012 (Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards); Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards). LSU has produced four 100-yard rushers in a game this season when both Hill (117 yards on 11 carries) and Magee (108 yards on 9 carries) did it against Kent State in week 3. Hill then followed up with a career-best 184 yards on 21 carries a week later in the win over Auburn and 157 yards at Mississippi State. Hill's seven 100-yard rushing games put him in a tie for sixth place in LSU career 100-yard rushing games.

14 True Freshmen Have Played This Season

Les Miles has never shyed away from playing true freshmen in his nine seasons at LSU. A total of 87 true freshmen have seen the field under his watch, including 14 this season (eight on defense, five on offense, one special teams only). That number ranks second nationally behind Texas A&M's 17. The following true freshmen have played this season: 16 **Tre'Davious White** (CB, special teams), 40 **Duke Riley** (LB, special teams), 49 **Melvin Jones** (special teams), 52 **Kendell Beckwith** (LB/special teams), 89 **DeSean Smith** (TE), 91 **Christian LaCouture** (DT), 10 **Anthony Jennings** (QB), 76 **Josh Boutte** (OT), **Jeryl Brazil** (RB), 21 **Rashard Robinson** (DB), 29 **Rickey Jefferson** (DB), 46 **Tashawn Bower** (DE), 77 **Ethan Pocic** (C) and 92 **Lewis Neal** (DE). Last year, 15 true freshmen played for LSU. That total of 15 ranked second nationally with Ohio State behind only TCU and Texas, who each had 16 true freshmen play. Expect the trend to continue.

LSU reloaded its roster after a loss of an NFL record eight underclassmen to the 2013 NFL Draft. Colby DelaWHOssaye?

Under **Les Miles**, LSU has produced three out of the top five most accurate career kickers in school history in Josh Jasper (2008-10), Drew Alleman (2011-12) and Colt David (2005-06). Redshirt freshman PK **Colby Delahoussaye**, a walk-on from New Iberia, takes over the field goal and extra point duties this season after the departure of Alleman. Delahoussaye immediately made an impact in his debut, booting 3-of-3 field goals and 4-of-4 PATs in the season-opening win over TCU. Delahoussaye's three made field goals were the most by an LSU kicker in his debut since Andre LaFleur was 3-of-4 against Mississippi State on Sept. 11, 1993. The freshman then booted a perfect 2-of-2 at No. 9 Georgia in week four, including a career-long 49-yarder, which matched the longest made field goal for the Tigers all of last season.

For the season and his career, he is a perfect 7-of-7 on field goals and 36-of-36 on extra points through three games. Delahoussaye is one of five kickers across the nation who are a perfect 7-of-7 or better on field goals this year.

LSU Streak of Consecutive Weeks In AP Top 25 Reaches 71 Straight After Week 5

LSU's streak of consecutive weeks in the AP Top 25 has reached 71, which ranks second to only Alabama in terms of current streaks. The Tigers remained at No. 10 in the Associated Press poll and No. 11 in the USA Today Coaches' poll following the win at Mississippi State. Since the start of the 2011 season, LSU has been ranked in the top 10 in now 37 of the 39 weeks of the AP poll. This was the 13th consecutive season that the Tigers were ranked in the preseason polls as LSU came in No. 12 in the AP and No. 13 in the Coaches Top 25. LSU has been ranked in both the Coaches and AP polls every week since the start of the 2009 season. Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and USA Today Coaches' Poll 129 of the 133 weeks. The exception came during the final four polls of the 2008 season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 145 of 149 games ranked in the top 25, including 110 of 112 games under Miles. LSU has an 88-20 record in games played as a Top 25 team under Miles. The only two games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 against Arkansas in the regular-season finale and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior linebacker **Lamin Barrow** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2013 season. Barrow was presented the jersey by coach **Les Miles** following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp on Sunday, Aug. 4. Barrow recorded a season-best 11 tackles and a fumble recovery in the win over Auburn in week three. He is the first LSU player to return following a 100-tackle season since Kelvin Sheppard in 2010. Jersey No. 18 was born when quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958 in 2003. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the

LSU The New DBU

Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL Draft with 12. Alabama and Texas are the next closest with nine. The Tigers have produced a defensive back selection in seven consecutive drafts. Six LSU defensive players were selected in the first three rounds of the 2013 NFL Draft, the most selected from any school in modern draft history. A total of 11 former LSU defensive backs are on active NFL rosters, which leads the nation. The 11 are the most from any school at any position in the entire league. LSU is also tops nationally in defensive tackles on NFL rosters with six.

LSU Is 50-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 112 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 85-8 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100-yards and the Tigers are 51-4. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100-yards, the Tigers are 50-0. LSU Has Scored 20 Special Teams TDs In Les Miles Era

LSU has recorded 20 special teams touchdown under **Les Miles**, including the most recent one when **Odell Beckham Jr.** became the first player in school history to return a missed field goal for a touchdown. Beckham caught a missed 59-yard field goal in the third quarter of the UAB game and raced a school-record 109 yards (statistically 100 yards) for the score. Under Miles, LSU has returned 11 punts for touchdowns, 3 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, 1 on a fake field goal and 1 on a missed field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all nine seasons under Miles. LSU is 18-1 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. In addition, LSU holds the nation's longest consecutive years streak (12) of returning a punt or kickoff for a touchdown. The Tigers have returned at least one punt or kickoff back for a score every season dating back to 2001. The following is a breakdown of LSU's special teams touchdowns under Miles:

LSU Extends FBS Record For Consecutive Non-Conference Regular Season Wins To 44

LSU extended its Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) record of consecutive non-conference regular season wins to 44 with its victory over Kent State. Last season, LSU broke the FBS record for consecutive non-conference regular season wins, surpassing the mark of Kansas State who claimed 39 straight from 1993-2003. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular season game since falling at Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va., on Sept. 1. **Les Miles** has accounted for 34 of the 44 wins during the streak, and he is 34-0 all-time in non-conference regular season games in his nine seasons at LSU. Former coach Nick Saban accounted for the 10 other victories from 2002-04. Under Miles, the Tigers have outscored non-conference regular season opponents a combined 1,355-374. This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 230-61-4 (.784) at night under the lights compared to a 29-25-3 (.518) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 83-12 (.872) overall at home, which includes a 64-6 (.913) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 19-6 (.750) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Florida Uses Second-Half Surge To Beat LSU, 14-6

Florida overcame a 6-0 halftime deficit with a pair of second half touchdowns as the 10th-ranked Gators handed No. 3 LSU its first regular season loss since November of 2010 with a 14-6 win in Gainesville. The loss snapped LSU's 18-game regular season winning streak, the longest in the nation, as the Tigers fell to 5-1 overall and 1-1 in league play. Despite a spectacular first half defensive effort that saw LSU hold Florida scoreless and to just 81 total yards, the Tigers wore down in the second half as the Gators used their running game to take control of the contest. Trailing 6-0, Florida took the lead for good, 7-6, on a 12-yard TD run by Mike Gillislee late in the third quarter. The Tigers had a chance to regain the lead however, **Odell Beckham Jr.** fumbled after catching a 56-yard pass from **Zach Mettenberger** that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 23-yard line. Florida responded with an 11-play drive, all rushes, to extend the lead to 14-6 early in the fourth quarter. LSU managed just two first downs on its following two possessions as the Gators held on for the victory. LSU's only points in the game came courtesy of a pair of Drew Alleman field goals. Alleman kicked 31-yard field goal to cap a 10-play, 64-yard drive on LSU's first possession of the game. Alleman added a 21-yard field goal just before halftime after the Tigers managed just three yards following a fumble recovery at the Florida 7-yard line. For the game, LSU was limited to just 8 first downs and 200 total yards (42 rushing, 158 passing). Mettenberger completed 11-of-25 passes for 158 yards and one interception. He was sacked four times. Kevin Minter led the LSU defense with 20 tackles, just one shy of tying the school-record, two sacks and a forced fumble.

No. 12 LSU Wins Cowboys Classic, 37-27

Zach Mettenberger connected on 16-of-32 passes for 251 yards and the LSU defense limited TCU to 249 total yards as the 12th-ranked Tigers opened 2013 with a 37-27 victory over the 20th-ranked Horned Frogs in the Cowboys Classic. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers kicked a field goal on the opening possession of the game and then recovered a TCU fumble on the ensuing kickoff. LSU tacked on another field goal for a 6-0 advantage before TCU took an offensive snap. After TCU pulled to within 6-3, J.C. Copeland extended the lead to 13-3 on a 1-yard dive to cap a 7-play, 80-yard drive for the Tigers. However, TCU responded on the very next play, returning the kickoff 100 yards to cut the margin to 13-10. LSU tacked on a third first half field goal as time expired in the second quarter for a 16-10 lead at halftime. After a Jalen Mills interception on TCU's first play of the second half, LSU's Terrence Magee raced 52-yards for a TD to stretch the lead to 23-10. TCU hung around, scoring on its next possession to get back to within 23-17. Another Magee TD run, this time a 3-yarder, stretched the lead to 30-17 late in the third quarter. A defensive stop by the Tigers forced TCU to punt on its next possession, pinning LSU inside its 5-yard line. A miscue on the quarterback exchange on a handoff to Alfred Blue resulted in a fumble at LSU's own 6-yard line. TCU scored two plays later to cut the deficit to 30-24 with 13 minutes to play. TCU kicked a field goal midway through the fourth quarter to get to within 30-27; however Odell Beckham Jr. returned the ensuing kickoff 75 yards to setup a 20-yard TD pass from Mettenberger to Jarvis Landry that sealed the victory for the Tigers. Mettenberger engineered an LSU offense that racked up 80 plays, 26 first downs, 448 yards of offense (197 rushing, 251 passing), and held the ball for 36 minutes. Defensively, LSU limited TCU to 249 total yards (114 rushing, 145 passing) and only 54 total plays. Magee led LSU with 95 rushing yards, while Landry caught 8 passes for 109 yards and score and Beckham Jr. added five receptions for 118 yards. Beckham Jr. accounted for 272 all-purpose yards, the sixth-highest total in school history.

Mettenberger Fires Five TDs as LSU Rolls Past UAB, 56-17

Zach Mettenberger threw for a school-record five TD passes and Odell Beckham Jr. scored four touchdowns and racked up 331 all-purpose yards as No. 9/11 LSU rolled past UAB, 56-17, in the home-opener for the Tigers. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers raced out to a 21-0 lead after the first quarter thanks to pair of Mettenberger-to-Beckham TD passes followed by a 1-yard run by Kenny Hilliard. LSU, which scored touchdowns on five straight first half possessions, extended the advantage to 28-0 on a 3-yard TD run by Jeremy Hill early in the second quarter. UAB scored 17 points in the second quarter to get to within 35-17 at halftime. Beckham scored his third TD of the game on a 27-yard pass from Mettenberger to open the third quarter for the Tigers, stretching the lead to 42-17. A Mettenberger-to-Jarvis Landry 14-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter increased the lead to 49-17 and broke the school's single-game touchdown pass record in the process. Beckham Jr. capped the scoring for the Tigers with a school-record 100-yard return of a missed 59-yard field goal by UAB to run the advantage to 56-17. The 100-yard return was the first of its kind in LSU history and pushed Beckham's all-purpose yardage to 331, the third-highest total in school history. For the game, LSU piled up 445 total yards (152 rushing, 293 passing), while limiting UAB to 296 total yards (160 rushing, 136 passing). Mettenberger hit on 16-of-19 passes for 282 yards and five scores with Beckham Jr. (5 for 136, 3 TDs) and Landry (5 for 71, 2 TDs) being the top targets. A total of nine players caught at least one pass for the Tigers. Hilliard led LSU in rushing with 54 yards on 11 carries, while Hill added 50 yards on six attempts. Lamin Barrow and Lamar Louis led the LSU defense with seven tackles apiece, while Jermauria Rasco had six tackles, two quarterback hurries and a sack.

No. 8 LSU Runs Past Kent State, 45-13

LSU racked up a season-high 571 total yards, including 307 on the ground, as the eighth-ranked Tigers jumped out to a 21-0 first quarter lead and never trailed in a 45-13 win over Kent State in Tiger Stadium. LSU improved to 3-0 with the win and ran the nation's longest non-conference regular-season winning streak to 44. LSU also ran its record to 34-0 under Les Miles in non-conference regular-season games. LSU scored on its first five possessions as the Tigers built a 31-10 lead at halftime. **Jeremy Hill** scored on runs of 58 and 12 yards in the first quarter, while **Jarvis Landry** caught first half TD passes of 21 and 31 yards for Zach Mettenberger. **Colby Delahoussaye** added a 25-yard field goal as the Tigers built a 31-10 lead at halftime. **Odell Beckham Jr.** scored on a 5-yard pass from Mettenberger to open the fourth quarter and **Terrence Magee** added a 12-yard TD run to cap the scoring for the Tigers. Hill led LSU with 117 rushing yards and a pair of TDs, while Magee had his first career 100-yard game with 108 yards and a score. Mettenberger connected on 13-of-18 passes for 264 yards and three TDs. For the game, the Tigers averaged 10.4 yards per play, the second-highest single-game total in school history. Defensively, LSU limited Kent State to 248 total yards (58 rushing, 190 passing). **Ego Ferguson** led the Tigers with 8 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

Hill Carries LSU Past Auburn In SEC Opener, 35-21

Jeremy Hill rushed for a career-high 184 yards as the No. 6/7 Tigers raced out to a 21-0 lead and then held off a late Auburn rally for a 35-21 victory in a rain-soaked Tiger Stadium. For the fourth straight game, LSU scored first as the Tigers took a 7-0 lead on their first possession of the game when Hill raced 49-yards for a TD on LSU's third play of the game. Auburn's punter muffed the snap on its next possession, giving LSU the ball at the Auburn 10-yard line. One play later, Hill scampered 10 yards for the score and a 14-0 LSU advantage. LSU stretched the lead to 21-0 after a 54-yard run by Hill setup a 1-yard scoring plunge by fullback **J.C. Copeland** early in the second quarter. The score remained that way until early in the third quarter when Auburn got its first points following a **Zach Mettenberger** interception. LSU answered the Auburn TD with a 7-play, 75-yard drive capped on a 6-yard run by Hill, extending the cushion back to three touchdowns at 28-7. Auburn pulled to within 28-14 on a 10-play, 94-yard drive. However, LSU answered again, this time going 81 yards on 7 plays capped with a Mettenberger 32-yard TD toss to **Jarvis Landry** to extend the margin to 35-14. Auburn scored midway through the fourth quarter on pull to within 35-21, however, LSU's defense came up with an interception and then stopped Auburn on downs on its final two possessions to clinch the victory. For the game, LSU racked up 457 total yards (228 rushing, 229 passing). Mettenberger connected on 14-of-22 passes for 229 yards, one TD and an interception, his first of the year. Landry led the Tigers with seven receptions for 118 yards and a score. Defensively, LB **D.J. Welter** and LB **Lamin Barrow** each had 11 tackles to pace the Tigers.

Mettenberger and Tigers Come Up Short In Shoot-Out With No. 9 Georgia, 44-41

Zach Mettenberger threw for a career-high 372 yards and three TDs but LSU's last-minute chance at a comeback came up short as the sixth-ranked Tigers dropped a 44-41 road decision to No. 9 Georgia. In a game that featured five ties, five lead changes and with neither team leading by more than a touchdown at any point in the contest, LSU looked in position to win the game by taking a 41-37 advantage on an 8-yard run by **Jeremy Hill** with just over four minutes remaining. Georgia responded, going 75 yards on six plays to regain the lead at 44-41 on a 25-yard TD pass with 1:47 left in the contest setting up one last chance for Mettenberger and the Tigers. After a first down that got the Tigers their own 35-yard line, LSU turned the ball over on downs following four straight incompletions and Georgia ran out the clock for the victory. The game went back-and-forth from the start as Georgia scored on its first possession to take a 7-0 lead. LSU tied the game at 7-7 on its next possession starting a see-saw battle that had the teams tied at 14-14 at the end of the first quarter. Georgia led 24-17 at halftime as the scored on a 1-yard run with 20 seconds left in the second quarter. Down 27-20 in the third quarter, Mettenberger connected with **Jarvis Landry** on a 39-yard pass to tie the game at 27-27 late in the third quarter. **Kenny Hilliard** tied the contest at 34-34 on a 2-yard run early in the fourth quarter, but the Bulldogs answered with a 38-yard field goal just four minutes later to regain the lead at 37-34 with 8:09 to go. Mettenberger then guided LSU on a 75-yard, 8-play drive capped with Hill's 8-yard TD run that put the Tigers up 41-37 with four minutes to play. For the game, Mettenberger connected on 23-of-37 passes for 372 yards and three scores. Landry led LSU with 10 catches for 156 yards, while **Odell Beckham Jr.** had six receptions for 118 yards. Hill rushed for 86 yards and a TD for the Tigers. The 41 points marked the most by an LSU team in a loss in a regulation game in school history.

LSU Uses Fourth Quarter Outburst to Blow Out Mississippi State, 59-26

LSU blew open a tight game at halftime by outscoring Mississippi State 31-3 in the second half on its way to a 59-26 win over the Bulldogs in Starkville. The win was the 14th straight and the 21st in 22 tries for LSU over Mississippi State. In another offensive shootout, LSU came out on top this time around as the Tigers combined the passing of **Zach Mettenberger** along with a 100-yard rushing effort by **Jeremy Hill** to wear down the Bulldogs. LSU scored touchdowns on its first three possessions, two coming from **Kenny Hilliard**, to build a 21-9 advantage early in the second quarter. LSU's next three possessions came up empty and Mississippi State took advantage, taking a 23-21 lead at the 6:28 mark in the second quarter on a 59-yard passing play. LSU regained the lead just before halftime at 28-23 when Mettenberger led the Tigers on a 9-play, 70-yard drive capped with a 14-yard TD pass to **Odell Beckham Jr.** LSU never trailed again as the teams exchanged field goals in the third quarter before LSU used a 28-point fourth quarter scoring outburst to put the game out of reach. Beckham Jr. started the scoring for the Tigers in the final stanza with a 33-yard TD reception from Mettenberger. Hill followed with a 5-yard run following an interception by **Tre'Davious White** to run the lead to 45-26. **Alfred Blue** with a 17-yard run and Hilliard with his third rushing TD, a 4-yard scamper, closed out the scoring for the Tigers in what was the most points by an LSU team in a league game since 1997 (63 vs. Kentucky). For the game, LSU racked up 563 total yards with Mettenberger passing for 340 yards and 2 scores and Hill rushing for 157 yards and a pair of TDs. Hilliard scored three times and Beckham Jr. caught nine passes for 179 yards and a pair of TDs.
