Tigers Take SEC Lead into Friday's Match with Missouri in Baton Rouge

The LSU Tigers (8-3-2, 4-0-1 SEC) remain the only unbeaten team in SEC play through five conference matches this season as their hold on first place in the league standings will be on the line when they welcome the Missouri Tigers to Baton Rouge on Friday night for a match that is scheduled to kick off at 7 p.m. CT. The Tigers are off to their best start in SEC play in their history with their first five-game unbeaten streak to open the conference schedule for the first time. They top the SEC standings with a 4-0-1 mark and 13 points through five matches, followed by Kentucky, South Carolina and Texas A&M in a tie for second place with 12 points and Alabama, Florida and Ole Miss in a tie for fifth place with nine points. Missouri (6-6-1, 2-2-1 SEC) is looking to close the gap as they enter the weekend in a tie for eighth place on the table with Tennessee as each team has charted seven points through five conference matches. Friday's match features two of the SEC's top offensive teams as Missouri has scored 26 goals and LSU has scored 25 goals in 13 matches on the year. Missouri is led in the attack by junior midfielder Kaysie Clark, who scored the lone goal for the squad in LSU's 3-1 victory in Columbia in the inaugural match between the two teams on Oct. 21, 2012. Clark has scored a team-leading six goals on the season, including three goals in SEC play. Junior midfielder Taylor Grant is Missouri's second-leading scorer this season with four goals and 10 points, while sophomore striker Reagan Russell and freshman midfielder Melanie Donaldson have added three goals apiece in Missouri's diverse attack. Missouri owns one of the most impressive wins in SEC play this year, blanking No. 8-ranked Florida by a score of 1-0 at Audrey J. Walton Stadium in Columbia on Sept. 29. Missouri has a 2-2-1 mark in five road matches on the 2013 season as they make the trip to Baton Rouge this weekend.

- . The Tigers will look to run their unbeaten run to seven games when they face Missouri on Friday with a 5-0-1 mark in their last six games.
- · LSU won its inaugural meeting with Missouri on the soccer pitch a year ago after taking home a 3-1 win at No. 17-ranked Missouri in Columbia late in the 2012 regular season.
- Freshman Summer Clarke is the reigning TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's College National Player of the Week and SEC Offensive Player of the Week after scoring five of LSU's eight goals in an SEC road sweep at Arkansas and Alabama last weekend. Clarke is the SEC's leading goal scorer in SEC play with six in five matches.
- Freshman Emma Fletcher is the two-time defending SEC Freshman of the Week after assisting four of Clarke's five goals last weekend, including both game-winning goals in a 5-3 win at Arkansas and 2-1 double overtime win at Alabama.
- Emma Fletcher has set LSU's freshman record with 10 assists on the year, which ranks No. 1 in the SEC and tied for No. 3 in the NCAA for the 2013 season. She is also tops in the SEC with six assists in SEC play.
- The Tigers are unbeaten in five matches to open SEC play for the first time in program history as they sit in first place on the league table with an impressive 4-0-1 mark and 13 points.

- The Tigers enter Friday's match with Missouri riding an eight-game unbeaten streak in SEC regularseason matches, which dates back to a 3-2 overtime win at Ole Miss on Oct. 19 of last season.
- LSU features a diverse attack as 13 different Tigers have found the scoresheet with 25 goals scored through 13 matches this season.
- After playing 13 SEC games in the first year of SEC expansion in 2012, each of the 14 league teams will play an 11-game conference schedule in 2013. LSU will not face Auburn and South Carolina in the regular season.

Series Notes: LSU and Missouri had never met on the soccer pitch before the 2012 season when the two sides met at Audrey J. Walton Stadium in Columbia, Mo., for their inaugural match on Oct. 21 of last season. Coming off of a 3-2 overtime win at Ole Miss in their previous match, LSU continued their momentum by earning an impressive 3-1 road win over 16th-ranked Missouri in the first ever meeting between the two teams. After Missouri took a 1-0 lead through Kaysie Clark in the 24th minute, LSU stormed back with three unanswered goals by **Tori Sample** just 25 seconds later in the 24th minute, **Colby Maffei** in the 38th minute and **Nina Anderson** in the 64th minute to secure the victory. It was the second in a three-game SEC winning streak for the Tigers to wrap up the 2012 regular season.

LAST TIME OUT: LSU 2, ALABAMA 1 (20T) • TUSCALOOSA, ALA.

Freshman striker **Summer Clarke** bagged a brace with the first goal of the match in the 49th minute and the game-winning Golden Goal in the 102nd minute to lead the LSU Tigers to a 2-1 double overtime victory over Alabama on Sunday afternoon at the Alabama Soccer Stadium to remain atop the SEC standings. After the teams played to a scoreless draw in the first half, Clarke went to work early in the second half while scoring the breakthrough in the 49th minute for her team-leading seventh goal of the season. Freshman **Megan Lee** flicked the ball into space near the top of the penalty area as Clarke broke free for two touches and a 10-yard strike inside the right post past as the visitors took a 1-0 lead at 48:37. Clarke then scored the game-winning Golden Goal in the 102nd minute of the second overtime with an assist from fellow freshman **Emma Fletcher** to hand the Tigers a thrilling 2-1 victory.

NOTEBOOK

Tigers Look to Remain Unbeaten in SEC Play vs. Missouri

LSU Soccer is off to an unbeaten 4-0-1 start in SEC play as the Tigers are top of the league table with 13 points as they play host to Missouri on Friday night. They are unbeaten after their first five SEC matches for the first time in the program's 19-year history, besting their previous best conference start in five matches of 4-1 during the 2009 and 2011 seasons. The Tigers finished both of those seasons in second place in the final SEC standings. LSU is actually riding an eight-game unbeaten streak in SEC regular-season games with a 7-0-1 mark dating back to a 3-2 overtime win at Ole Miss on Oct. 19 of last season, while scoring 22 goals in those eight games for an average of 2.75 goals per match.

Clarke Finds Scoring Touch in SEC Play as Team's Top Scorer

Freshman striker **Summer Clarke** has certainly found her scoring touch as the Tigers near the midway point in SEC play as she is nwo the team's leading goal scorer with eight goals and 18 points on the season. She scored five of LSU's eight goals in an SEC road sweep last weekend while scoring her first career hat trick in a 5-3 win at Arkansas on Oct. 4 and both goals in a 2-1 double overtime win at Alabama on Sunday. Clarked actually scored LSU's first hat trick in nearly four years when former All-American **Malorie Rutledge** scored three goals in a 7-0 shutout of Arkansas-Pine Bluff in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Nov. 13, 2009. She has now scored a goal in three-straight games that also includes a 3-2 overtime win over Mississippi State on Sept. 29.

Clarke Named TopDrawerSoccer.com National Player of the Week

After scoring five goals in LSU's road sweep at Arkansas and Alabama last weekend, Clarke was honored this week as both the TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's National Player of the Week and SEC Offensive Player of the Week. Three other Tigers have earned National Player of the Week honors in program history with **Michelle Makasini** (Oct. 9, 2007), **Mo Isom** (Sept. 2, 2008) and **Rachel Yepez** (Sept. 28, 2009) being named Soccer America National Players of the Week.

Fletcher Climbs NCAA Charts with LSU Freshman Assists Record

Freshman standout **Emma Fletcher** has lived up to her reputation as one of the top attacking midfielders to join the NCAA Division I ranks as a freshman in 2013 following her career as a Canadian and New Zealand youth international. She is LSU's second-leading point scorer this season with 12 points, which includes one goal and 10 assists in 13 starts on the season. Fletcher's 10 assists this season is an LSU freshman record, eclipsing the previous mark of eight assists set by now senior defender **Addie Eggleston** during the 2010 season. Fletcher's 10 assists also tops the SEC scoring chart and ties her for the No. 3 spot in the NCAA rankings heading into the weekend. Fletcher now has her sights set on LSU's single-season record of 18 assists set by former Tiger All-American **Malorie Rutledge** during her senior season in 2009.

Tigers Feature Diverse Scoring Attack in 2013

The Tigers have featured a diverse attack during the 2013 season as 13 different goal scorers have accounted for the team's 25 goals thus far on the campaign. Freshman **Summer Clarke** is the team's leading goal scorer with eight goals on the year, while sophomore **Fernanda Pina** follows with four goals to match her career-high for a single season. Juniors **Alex Arlitt** and **Jodi Calloway** have scored two goals apiece through 13 matches this year, while seniors **Nina Anderson**, **Megan Kinneman**, **Danielle Murphy** and **Alex Ramsey**; sophomores **Lexi Gibbs** and **Heather Magee**; and freshmen **Emma Fletcher**, **Megan Lee** and **Rebecca Pongetti** have also opened their account with a goal of their own. In addition, eight different Tigers have scored the team's 13 goals in SEC play throgh four games as Anderson, Clarke, Fletcher, Lee, Magee, Murphy, Pina and Pongetti have found the scoresheet in the league.

Kinneman Poised for Record-Setting Senior Season in 2013

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has shown tremendous form in goal as the defensive leader for the Tigers this season. Kinneman pitched five shutouts during the non-conference season in wins over Louisiana Tech (1-0), UL-Monroe (6-0), Southern California (1-0) and Rice (1-0), as well as a scoreless draw against TCU. She is just one clean sheet shy of matching her career single-season high of six set as a freshman in 2010. She is also moving up LSU's career charts as she is now alone in second place with 16 shutouts and 240 saves during her collegiate career in Baton Rouge.

Kinneman Continues Scoring Touch from Penalty Spot in Senior Season

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has not only provided leadership for the Tigers on the defensive end of the field this season, but she has also proven herself as an asset on the offensive end of the field while scoring her third career goal from the penalty spot in the 65th minute of a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans back on Sept. 8 in LSU's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic. Kinneman is the top scoring goalkeeper in the program's history as she has found the back of the net on all three of her penalty kick opportunities over the past two seasons. That also includes a conversion in a 2-1 overtime defeat to 18th-ranked Kentucky and the game-winner in the 93rd minute in a 3-2 win at Ole Miss last year.

Mexican International Pina Fluent in Language of Futbol

Much was expected of Mexican Under-20 international **Fernanda Pina** when she signed her National Letter of Intent with the Tigers as part of the Class of 2012, and she has certainly made an impact in the attack upon her arrival in Baton Rouge over the past two seasons. Pina is the team's second-leading goal scorer this season as she has netted four goals in 13 appearances in 2013 as the Tigers take on Missouri on Friday. That matches her output in 21 appearances in 2012 as she netted a team-leading four goals as a freshman a season ago. Pina recorded her first career multi-goal game while scoring the first and last goals in a 6-0 rout of UL-Monroe on Aug. 27, while she also scored against No. 6 BYU on Sept. 2 and netted the game-winning Golden Goal in a 2-1 overtime win at Vanderbilt on Sept. 20.

Tigers Earn Best Non-Conference Win in Program History vs. USC Trojans

The Tigers earned perhaps their most impressive non-conference victory in the 19-year history of the program on the afternoon of Sunday, Sept. 8, when they scored a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the finale of the Minnesota Gold Classic held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 65th minute while making a season-high seven saves in goal on the defensive end. The Tigers defeated their highest ranked non-conference opponent in program history with just their second victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in the non-conference all-time. LSU has now won seven matches to go along with nine draws over nationally-ranked opponents under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

LSU Soccer's Recruiting Class Ranked in Top 15 Nationally for 2013

LSU Soccer's heralded 2013 recruiting class solidified its reputation as one of the nation's best during the preseason when it was selected the No. 1-ranked class in the SEC and the No. 14-ranked class in the NCAA ahead of the 2013 season by the editorial staff at AllWhiteKit.com. The Tigers welcomed five recruits with an international pedigree to campus for the 2013 season as junior transfer **Natalia Gomez-Junco** (Monterrey, Mexico) joined freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia, Canada), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada), **Megan Lee** (Massey, Auckland, New Zealand) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) to bolster a young but talented roster in 2013. Each earned starting experience for their countries at the FIFA Women's World Cup at the U-17 and U-20 levels as youths.

LSU Picked Second in SEC West by Coaches in Preseason Poll

The four-time SEC Western Division champion LSU Tigers were selected to finish in second place in the final SEC West standings during the 2013 season in a preseason vote of the league's 14 head coaches. The Tigers received one first-place vote to be crowned the SEC Western Division champion, although the league's athletic directors voted to eliminate the divisional format for women's soccer following the SEC's preseason release. LSU captured four SEC West titles in a five-year span under the previous format with wins in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011. Texas A&M was selected to defend its SEC West crown won in its inaugural season in the league in 2012, while also being tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC regular season title with eight first-place votes. The Florida Gators received six first-place votes to defend the SEC crown they won a season ago, as well as 11 first-place votes to repeat as the SEC Eastern Division champion.
