Tigers Look to Keep Pace at Top of SEC Table at Florida on Sunday

The LSU Tigers (9-4-2, 5-1-1 SEC) saw their seven-game unbeaten streak snapped on Friday night while suffering their first Southeastern Conference loss of the 2013 season with a 1-0 defeat to No. 24-ranked Ole Miss at the LSU Soccer Stadium in Baton Rouge. The Tigers were the final unbeaten team in SEC play heading into the weekend, but slipped into second place on the league table with a 5-1-1 mark and 16 points through seven conference matches. The Texas A&M Aggies took over the top spot with a 3-0 shutout at Alabama on Friday night to top the charts with a 6-1 mark and 18 points in SEC play. The No. 8-ranked Florida Gators (11-3-1, 5-2) took a big step toward defending their SEC Championship with a dominating 3-0 shutout of 14th-ranked Kentucky on their home field at James G. Pressly Stadium in Gainesville. The Gators are a consensus Top 20 team in all of the major polls this week, while climbing as high as No. 8 nationally in the National Soccer Coaches Association of American/Continental Tire Top 25 poll released on Tuesday. Florida has been in fine form with a three-game winning streak heading into Sunday's match as the Gators have outscored their opponents by a 7-0 margin on the spin. The Gators have surrendered a league-low four goals in seven SEC matches as they boast the SEC's top defensive unit this season. They are also potent on the offensive end of the field while scoring 15 goals in league play and 33 goals in all games to rank No. 3 in the conference in both categories. Leading the way for the Gators is freshman striker Savannah Jordan, who has scored 13 goals and 27 points as the team's top scorer this season. Jordan ranks No. 2 among all goal scorers and tied for No. 3 among all point scorers in the SEC in 2013. Sunday's match kicks off at noon CT as it will air to a regionally-televised broadcast by Fox Sports Net.

STORYLINES

- The Tigers saw their 7-game unbeaten streak this season and 9-game unbeaten streak in SEC regular-season games come to an end with a 1-0 defeat to Ole Miss on Friday night in Baton Rouge.

- LSU's last trip to Gainesville two years ago proved historic as the Tigers earned their first ever win over the Gators with a 1-0 victory at James G. Pressly Stadium on Oct. 23, 2011.

- The Tigers are just 1-13-2 in their all-time series with Florida as the Gators were victorious in the last meeting between the two teams with a 2-0 win in Baton Rouge a year ago. The Tigers are also 1-7-1 in the series under head coach **Brian Lee**.

- Freshman striker **Summer Clarke** has been a revelation for the Tigers with her performance in SEC play as she is the SEC's leading scorer with six goals and 14 points in league play. Clarke is LSU's leading scorer with her eight goals and 19 points on the year.

- Emma Fletcher** has set LSU's freshman record with 10 assists on the year, which ranks in a tie for No. 1 in the SEC and No. 6 in the NCAA for the 2013 season. She is also tops in the SEC with six assists in SEC play.

- The Tigers were unbeaten in six matches to open SEC play for the first time in program history as they opened with a 5-0-1 mark and 16 points before Friday's defeat.

- Florida is the fourth nationally-ranked opponent LSU has faced this season as the Tigers defeated No. 13 Southern California, 1-0, on Sept. 8 while also dropping a 4-2 decision to No. 6 BYU on Sept. 2 and a 1-0 defeat to No. 24 Ole Miss on Friday.

- LSU features a diverse attack as 13 different Tigers have found the scoresheet with 26 goals scored through 15 matches this season.

- After playing 13 SEC games in the first year of SEC expansion in 2012, each of the 14 league teams will play an 11-game conference schedule in 2013. LSU will not face Auburn and South Carolina in the regular season.

Series Notes: The Tigers will look to continue their hot start to the SEC season on Sunday afternoon when they travel to Gainesville, Fla., to take on the No. 8-ranked Florida Gators with kickoff set for noon CT at James G. Pressley Stadium. Their last trip to Gainesville proved to be one to remember as the Tigers scored a historic 1-0 victory over the 11th-ranked Gators for their first victory in the series in program history. It also marked just the fourth SEC defeat for the Gators on their home field and their first home loss in SEC play since the 2006 season at that time. The victory remains LSU's only win in the series as the team heads to Gainesville with a 1-13-2 all-time record against Florida, including a 1-7-1 mark during the eight previous seasons under head coach **Brian Lee**.

LAST TIME OUT: #25 LSU 0, #24 Ole Miss 1 • BATON ROUGE, LA.

The LSU Soccer team saw its seven-game unbeaten streak snapped at the hands of Ole Miss on a drizzly Friday night at the LSU Soccer Stadium with All-SEC striker Rafaele Souza scoring the only goal of the match for the Rebels on a corner kick in the 28th minute as the Tigers fell by a score of 1-0 on their home field. The Tigers (9-4-2, 5-1-1 SEC) were the last team to be knocked from the ranks of the unbeaten in Southeastern Conference play to drop into second place in the league standings with 16 points. The 24th-ranked Rebels (12-3-1, 5-2) moved into a four-way tie for third place in the SEC standings with Florida, Kentucky and South Carolina as just three points separates the top six teams. Texas A&M jumped LSU for first place on the table with its 3-0 shutout at Alabama on Friday night as the only team in the league with a 6-1 mark and 18 points in conference play.

NOTEBOOK

Ole Miss Snaps LSU's School Record Unbeaten SEC Start

LSU suffered its first SEC defeat of the 2013 season on Friday night with a 1-0 home defeat to No. 24-ranked Ole Miss to drop to 9-4-2 on the season and 5-1-1 in SEC play. It marked the end of LSU's school-record unbeaten run to start SEC play as the Tigers were unbeaten in their first six SEC matches for the first time in the program's 19-year history at 5-0-1 entering the match. They improved upon their previous best unbeaten conference start of 4-0 during the 2009 and 2011 seasons. The Tigers finished both of those seasons in second place in the final SEC standings. LSU also had a seven-game unbeaten streak this season and nine-game unbeaten streak in SEC regular-season matches snapped on Friday.

Clarke Finds Scoring Touch in SEC Play as Team's Top Scorer

Freshman striker **Summer Clarke** has certainly found her scoring touch pass the Tigers through the midway point in SEC play as she is now the team's leading goal scorer with eight goals and 19 points on the season. She scored five of LSU's eight goals in an SEC road sweep two weeks ago while scoring her first career hat trick in a 5-3 win at Arkansas on Oct. 4 and both goals in a 2-1 double overtime win at Alabama on Oct. 6. Clarke actually scored LSU's first hat trick in nearly four years when former All-American **Malorie Rutledge** scored three goals in a 7-0 shutout of Arkansas-Pine Bluff in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Nov. 13, 2009. She scored a goal in three-straight games that also included a 3-2 overtime win over Mississippi State on Sept. 29.

Clarke Named TopDrawerSoccer.com National Player of the Week

After scoring five goals in LSU's road sweep at Arkansas and Alabama two weeks ago, Clarke was honored as both the TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's National Player of the Week and SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 7. Three other Tigers have earned National Player of the Week honors in program history with **Michelle Makasini** (Oct. 9, 2007), **Mo Isom** (Sept. 2, 2008) and **Rachel Yopez** (Sept. 28, 2009) being named Soccer America National Players of the Week.

Fletcher Climbs NCAA Charts with LSU Freshman Assists Record

Freshman standout **Emma Fletcher** has lived up to her reputation as one of the top attacking midfielders to join the NCAA Division I ranks as a freshman in 2013 following her career as a Canadian and New Zealand youth international. She is LSU's second-leading point scorer this season with 12 points, which includes one goal and 10 assists in 15 starts on the season. Fletcher's 10 assists this season is an LSU freshman record, eclipsing the previous mark of eight assists set by now senior defender **Addie Eggleston** during the 2010 season. Fletcher's 10 assists also tops the SEC scoring chart and ties her for the No. 6 spot in the NCAA rankings heading into the weekend. Fletcher now has her sights set on LSU's single-season record of 18 assists set by former Tiger All-American **Malorie Rutledge** during her senior season in 2009.

Tigers Feature Diverse Scoring Attack in 2013

The Tigers have featured a diverse attack during the 2013 season as 13 different goal scorers have accounted for the team's 26 goals thus far on the campaign. Freshman **Summer Clarke** is the team's leading goal scorer with eight goals on the year, while sophomore **Fernanda Pina** follows with four goals to match her career-high for a single season. Juniors **Alex Arlitt** and **Jodi Calloway** and sophomore **Heather Magee** have scored two goals apiece through 14 matches this year, while seniors **Nina Anderson**, **Megan Kinneman**, **Danielle Murphy** and **Alex Ramsey**; sophomore **Lexi Gibbs** and freshmen **Emma Fletcher**, **Megan Lee** and **Rebecca Pongetti** have also opened their account with a goal of their own. In addition, eight different Tigers have scored the team's 14 goals in SEC play through seven games as Anderson, Clarke, Fletcher, Lee, Magee, Murphy, Pina and Pongetti have found the scoresheet in the league.

Kinneman Poised for Record-Setting Senior Season in 2013

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has shown tremendous form in goal as the defensive leader for the Tigers this season. Kinneman pitched six shutouts this season in wins over Louisiana Tech (1-0), UL-Monroe (6-0), Southern California (1-0), Rice (1-0) and Missouri (1-0), as well as a scoreless draw against TCU. With a 1-0 shutout of Missouri last Friday, Kinneman has now matched her career single-season high of six set as a freshman in 2010. She is also moving up LSU's career charts as she is alone in second place with 17 shutouts and 244 saves during her collegiate career.

Kinneman Continues Scoring Touch from Penalty Spot in Senior Season

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has not only provided leadership for the Tigers on the defensive end of the field this season, but she has also proven herself as an asset on the offensive end of the field while scoring her third career goal from the penalty spot in the 65th minute of a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans back on Sept. 8 in LSU's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic. Kinneman is the top scoring goalkeeper in the program's history as she has found the back of the net on all three of her penalty kick opportunities over the past two seasons. That also includes a conversion in a 2-1 overtime defeat to 18th-ranked Kentucky and the game-winner in the 93rd minute in a 3-2 win at Ole Miss last year.

Mexican International Pina Fluent in Language of Futbol

Much was expected of Mexican Under-20 international **Fernanda Pina** when she signed her National Letter of Intent with the Tigers as part of the Class of 2012, and she has certainly made an impact in the attack upon her arrival in Baton Rouge over the past two seasons. Pina is the team's second-leading goal scorer this season as she has netted four goals in 15 appearances in 2013 as the Tigers take on Florida on Sunday. That matches her output in 21 appearances in 2012 as she netted a team-leading four goals as a freshman a season ago. Pina recorded her first career multi-goal game while scoring the first and last goals in a 6-0 rout of UL-Monroe on Aug. 27, while she also scored against No. 6 BYU on Sept. 2 and netted the game-winning Golden Goal in a 2-1 overtime win at Vanderbilt on Sept. 20.

Tigers Earn Best Non-Conference Win in Program History vs. USC Trojans

The Tigers earned perhaps their most impressive non-conference victory in the 19-year history of the program on the afternoon of Sunday, Sept. 8, when they scored a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the finale of the Minnesota Gold Classic held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 65th minute while making a season-high seven saves in goal on the defensive end. The Tigers defeated their highest ranked non-conference opponent in program history with just their second victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in the non-conference all-time. LSU has now won seven matches to go along with nine draws over nationally-ranked opponents under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

LSU Soccer's Recruiting Class Ranked in Top 15 Nationally for 2013

LSU Soccer's heralded 2013 recruiting class solidified its reputation as one of the nation's best during the preseason when it was selected the No. 1-ranked class in the SEC and the No. 14-ranked class in the NCAA ahead of the 2013 season by the editorial staff at AllWhiteKit.com. The Tigers welcomed five recruits with an international pedigree to campus for the 2013 season as junior transfer **Natalia Gomez-Junco** (Monterrey, Mexico) joined freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia, Canada), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada), **Megan Lee** (Massey, Auckland, New Zealand) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) to bolster a young but talented roster in 2013. Each earned starting experience for their countries at the FIFA Women's World Cup at the U-17 and U-20 levels as youths.

LSU Picked Second in SEC West by Coaches in Preseason Poll

The four-time SEC Western Division champion LSU Tigers were selected to finish in second place in the final SEC West standings during the 2013 season in a preseason vote of the league's 14 head coaches. The Tigers received one first-place vote to be crowned the SEC Western Division champion, although the league's athletic directors voted to eliminate the divisional format for women's soccer following the SEC's preseason release. LSU captured four SEC West titles in a five-year span under the previous format with wins in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011. Texas A&M was selected to defend its SEC West crown won in its inaugural season in the league in 2012, while also being tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC regular season title with eight first-place votes. The Florida Gators received six first-place votes to defend the SEC crown they won a season ago, as well as 11 first-place votes to repeat as the SEC Eastern Division champion.
