Tigers Open Postseason Play vs. Auburn in SEC Tournament First Round

After not facing one another during the 2013 regular season, the LSU Tigers (9-8-2, 5-5-1 SEC) and Auburn Tigers (7-8-4, 3-5-3 SEC) will kick off this year's SEC Women's Soccer Tournament on Monday afternoon with the opening match for the event at 4 p.m. CT at the Orange Beach Sportsplex in Orange Beach, Ala. This marks the ninth-straight season in which the SEC Tournament will be held in Orange Beach as LSU is making its seventh-straight appearance and eighth appearance in nine seasons under head coach **Brian Lee**. It will be the fifth meeting between LSU and Auburn at the SEC Tournament as LSU owns a narrow 2-1-1 margin in their four previous matches in postseason play. It has been a series of streaks in recent seasons with LSU posting a five-game unbeaten streak with a 4-0-1 mark from 2008-10 before Auburn's current three-game winning streak in the series over the past two seasons. Auburn has outscored LSU by a 9-2 margin in their last three meetings, which includes a 3-1 win in Baton Rouge in the regular season and a 3-0 shutout in the first round of the SEC Tournament in 2011 and a 3-1 win in Auburn in the regular season in 2012. The two teams are on opposite runs of form for the past few weeks as LSU looks to snap a five-game losing skid and Auburn looks to add to its three-game winning streak and six-game unbeaten streak entering Monday's contest. Auburn is led in the attack by freshman striker Casie Ramsier and junior midfielder Tori Ball as they have combined to score 15 of the team's 26 goals on the year. Ramsier has netted a team-leading nine goals during her rookie campaign, while Ball follows with six goals of her own to lead the Tiger attack. Following three-straight draws against Georgia (0-0) at home and Tennessee (1-1) and Missouri (1-1) on the road, Auburn has won its last three games against Arkansas (3-1) and Vanderbilt (2-1) at home and Alabama (1-0) on the road.

STORYLINES

- The Tigers are looking to snap a five-match losing streak as they enter postseason play with a first-round match against Auburn on Monday at the SEC Tournament.

- Auburn is LSU's most frequent opponent at the SEC Tournament as the sides have met four times with LSU holding a 2-1-1 edge in their four meetings all-time in the postseason. Auburn won the last match with a 3-0 win in the opening round in 2011.

- It was a historic first match between LSU and Auburn at the SEC Tournament in 2002 as LSU became the first team in tournament history to knock off the No. 1 seed in the first round with a 1-0 win.

- Following LSU's five-match unbeaten streak in the series from 2008-10, Auburn has now won each of the last three meetings, including 3-1 in the regular season and 3-0 in the first round of the SEC Tournament in 2011 and 3-1 in 2012 during the regular season.

- Freshman **Summer Clarke** is the first LSU Tiger to score 10 goals in a season since **Taryne Boudreau's** 12 goals in an All-SEC campaign in 2011.

- Emma Fletcher** has set LSU's freshman record with 12 assists on the year, which ranks No. 1 in the SEC and tied for No. 5 in the NCAA for the 2013 season. She is also tops in the SEC with eight assists in SEC play.

- The SEC West championship trophy resided in either Baton Rouge, La., or Auburn, Ala., in seven of the last eight years before the SEC eliminated divisional play in 2013. LSU won four division titles in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011, while Auburn claimed a pair of titles in 2006 and 2010.

- LSU features a diverse attack as 13 different Tigers have found the scoresheet with 30 goals scored through 19 matches this season.

- After playing 13 SEC games in the first year of SEC expansion in 2012, each of the 14 league teams played an 11-game conference schedule in 2013. LSU did not face Auburn and South Carolina in the regular season.

Two goals by freshman striker **Summer Clarke** and a season-high 13 saves by senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** were not enough as the LSU Soccer team dropped a 3-2 decision to the 23rd-ranked Texas A&M Aggies in its regular-season finale for 2013 played Thursday night at Ellis Field in College Station, Texas. The Tigers (9-8-2, 5-5-1 SEC) suffered their fifth defeat on the spin in Southeastern Conference play while locking up the No. 7 seed in the 2013 SEC Women's Soccer Tournament to be held this week. Kinneman nearly matched her season-high for saves in the first half as she stopped eight shots by the Aggies in the first 45 minutes to keep the Tigers within striking distance heading into the break. Kinneman added five saves in the second half to finish the match with a season-best 13 saves against the Aggies, marking her highest total since setting a career single-game high of 15 saves in a 2-2 draw at Georgia on Sept. 30 of last season.

NOTEBOOK

Ole Miss Snaps LSU's School Record Unbeaten SEC Start

LSU suffered its first SEC defeat of the 2013 season on Oct. 18 with a 1-0 home defeat to No. 24-ranked Ole Miss to drop to 9-4-2 on the season and 5-1-1 in SEC play at the time. It marked the end of LSU's school-record unbeaten run to start SEC play as the Tigers were unbeaten in their first six SEC matches for the first time in the program's 19-year history at 5-0-1 entering the match. They improved upon their previous best unbeaten conference start of 4-0 during the 2009 and 2011 seasons. The Tigers finished both of those seasons in second place in the final SEC standings. LSU also had a seven-game unbeaten streak this year and nine-game unbeaten streak in SEC regular-season matches snapped against Ole Miss.

Clarke Finds Scoring Touch in SEC Play as Team's Top Scorer

Freshman striker **Summer Clarke** has certainly found her scoring touch in SEC play as she is the team's leading goal scorer with 10 goals and 23 points on the season as the Tigers enter postseason play at the SEC Tournament. She scored five of LSU's eight goals in an SEC road sweep in early October while scoring her first career hat trick in a 5-3 win at Arkansas on Oct. 4 and both goals in a 2-1 double overtime win at Alabama on Oct. 6. Clarke actually scored LSU's first hat trick in nearly four years when former All-American **Malorie Rutledge** scored three goals in a 7-0 shutout of Arkansas-Pine Bluff in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Nov. 13, 2009. She posted her third multi-goal game of the season in LSU's regular-season finale while scoring both goals in a 3-2 defeat at No. 23 Texas A&M on Thursday night.

Clarke Named TopDrawerSoccer.com National Player of the Week

After scoring five goals in LSU's road sweep at Arkansas and Alabama two weeks ago, Clarke was honored as both the TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's National Player of the Week and SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 7. Three other Tigers have earned National Player of the Week honors in program history with **Michelle Makasini** (Oct. 9, 2007), **Mo Isom** (Sept. 2, 2008) and **Rachel Yopez** (Sept. 28, 2009) being named Soccer America National Players of the Week.

Fletcher Climbs NCAA Charts with LSU Freshman Assists Record

Freshman standout **Emma Fletcher** has lived up to her reputation as one of the top attacking midfielders to join the NCAA Division I ranks as a freshman in 2013 following her career as a Canadian and New Zealand youth international. She is LSU's second-leading point scorer this season with 14 points, which includes one goal and 12 assists in 19 starts on the season. Fletcher's 12 assists this season is an LSU freshman record, eclipsing the previous mark of eight assists set by now senior defender **Addie Eggleston** during the 2010 season. Fletcher's 12 assists also tops the SEC scoring chart and ties her for the No. 5 spot in the NCAA rankings heading into Monday's match. Fletcher now has her sights set on LSU's single-season record of 18 assists set by former Tiger All-American **Malorie Rutledge** during her senior season in 2009.

Tigers Feature Diverse Scoring Attack in 2013

The Tigers have featured a diverse attack during the 2013 season as 13 different goal scorers have accounted for the team's 30 goals thus far on the campaign. Freshman **Summer Clarke** is the team's leading goal scorer with 10 goals on the year, while sophomore **Fernanda Pina** follows with four goals to match her career-high for a single season and junior **Jodi Calloway** has scored a career-high three goals this year. Junior **Alex Arlitt**, sophomore **Heather Magee** and freshman **Rebecca Pongetti** have scored two goals apiece this season, while seniors **Nina Anderson**, **Megan Kinneman**, **Danielle Murphy** and **Alex Ramsey**; sophomore **Lexi Gibbs** and freshmen **Emma Fletcher** and **Megan Lee** have also opened their account with a goal of their own. In addition, nine different Tigers have scored the team's 16 goals in SEC play through seven games as Anderson, Calloway Clarke, Fletcher, Lee, Magee, Murphy, Pina and Pongetti have found the scoresheet.

Kinneman Poised for Record-Setting Senior Season in 2013

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has shown tremendous form in goal as the defensive leader for the Tigers this season. Kinneman pitched six shutouts this season in wins over Louisiana Tech (1-0), UL-Monroe (6-0), Southern California (1-0), Rice (1-0) and Missouri (1-0), as well as a scoreless draw against TCU. With a 1-0 shutout of Missouri on Oct. 11, Kinneman has now matched her career single-season high of six set as a freshman in 2010. She is also moving up LSU's career charts as she has set a school record with 277 saves and ranks No. 2 with 17 shutouts during her collegiate career.

Kinneman Continues Scoring Touch from Penalty Spot in Senior Season

Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** has not only provided leadership for the Tigers on the defensive end of the field this season, but she has also proven herself as an asset on the offensive end of the field while scoring her third career goal from the penalty spot in the 65th minute of a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans back on Sept. 8 in LSU's finale at the Minnesota Gold Classic. Kinneman is the top scoring goalkeeper in the program's history as she has found the back of the net on all three of her penalty kick opportunities over the past two seasons. That also includes a conversion in a 2-1 overtime defeat to 18th-ranked Kentucky and the game-winner in the 93rd minute in a 3-2 win at Ole Miss last year.

Mexican International Pina Fluent in Language of Futbol

Much was expected of Mexican Under-20 international **Fernanda Pina** when she signed her National Letter of Intent with the Tigers as part of the Class of 2012, and she has certainly made an impact in the attack upon her arrival in Baton Rouge over the past two seasons. Pina is the team's second-leading goal scorer this season as she has netted four goals in 18 appearances in 2013 as the Tigers take on Texas A&M on Thursday. That matches her output in 21 appearances in 2012 as she netted a team-leading four goals as a freshman a season ago. Pina recorded her first career multi-goal game while scoring the first and last goals in a 6-0 rout of UL-Monroe on Aug. 27, while she also scored against No. 6 BYU on Sept. 2 and netted the game-winning Golden Goal in a 2-1 overtime win at Vanderbilt on Sept. 20.

Tigers Earn Best Non-Conference Win in Program History vs. USC Trojans

The Tigers earned perhaps their most impressive non-conference victory in the 19-year history of the program on the afternoon of Sunday, Sept. 8, when they scored a 1-0 victory over the 13th-ranked USC Trojans in the finale of the Minnesota Gold Classic held at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Senior goalkeeper **Megan Kinneman** scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 65th minute while making a season-high seven saves in goal on the defensive end. The Tigers defeated their highest ranked non-conference opponent in program history with just their second victory over a nationally-ranked opponent in the non-conference all-time. LSU has now won seven matches to go along with nine draws over nationally-ranked opponents under the direction of head coach **Brian Lee**.

LSU Soccer's Recruiting Class Ranked in Top 15 Nationally for 2013

LSU Soccer's heralded 2013 recruiting class solidified its reputation as one of the nation's best during the preseason when it was selected the No. 1-ranked class in the SEC and the No. 14-ranked class in the NCAA ahead of the 2013 season by the editorial staff at AllWhiteKit.com. The Tigers welcomed five recruits with an international pedigree to campus for the 2013 season as junior transfer **Natalia Gomez-Junco** (Monterrey, Mexico) joined freshmen **Summer Clarke** (Richmond, British Columbia, Canada), **Emma Fletcher** (Victoria, British Columbia, Canada), **Megan Lee** (Massey, Auckland, New Zealand) and **Rebecca Pongetti** (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) to bolster a young but talented roster in 2013. Each earned starting experience for their countries at the FIFA Women's World Cup at the U-17 and U-20 levels as youths.

LSU Picked Second in SEC West by Coaches in Preseason Poll

The four-time SEC Western Division champion LSU Tigers were selected to finish in second place in the final SEC West standings during the 2013 season in a preseason vote of the league's 14 head coaches. The Tigers received one first-place vote to be crowned the SEC Western Division champion, although the league's athletic directors voted to eliminate the divisional format for women's soccer following the SEC's preseason release. LSU captured four SEC West titles in a five-year span under the previous format with wins in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011. Texas A&M was selected to defend its SEC West crown won in its inaugural season in the league in 2012, while also being tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC regular season title with eight first-place votes. The Florida Gators received six first-place votes to defend the SEC crown they won a season ago, as well as 11 first-place votes to repeat as the SEC Eastern Division champion.
