SERIES RECORD vs. Southeastern Louisiana

• LSU leads the overall series with Southeastern Louisiana, 63-17, and the Tigers defeated the Lions, 13-1, last season (Feb. 22) in Baton Rouge. LSU has won 17 of the last 18 meetings between the schools -- SLU's win in that stretch came in 2008, a 6-3 victory over the Tigers in the original Alex Box Stadium. LSU has a 36-3 mark against Southeastern Louisiana since 1990. Wednesday's game marks LSU's first trip to Hammond since March 10, 2009, when the Tigers posted a 16-5 victory.

NOTES ON THE TIGERS

• LSU coach Paul Mainieri is in his 32nd season as a college coach with six seasons at St. Thomas University (1993-88), six seasons at Air Force (1989-94), 12 seasons at Notre Dame (1995-2006) and eight seasons at LSU (2007-present) ... his overall record is 1,182-625-7 and he is 318-133-2 in his eighth season at LSU ... he was inducted in January 2014 into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame ... Mainieri is one of only 11 NCAA Division I active coaches with over 1,100 career victories ... he earned National Coach of the Year recognition in 2008 and 2009 ... Mainieri directed LSU to the 2009 College World Series title, and he also led the Tigers to CWS appearances in 2008 and 2013 ... under Mainieri, the Tigers have won four SEC Tournament titles (2008, 2009, 2010, 2013), four SEC Western Division titles (2008, 2009, 2012, 2013) and the 2009 and 2012 SEC regular-season championships.

• LSU has won 33 consecutive regular-season midweek games, dating back to a 5-2 loss to Northwestern State in Baton Rouge on April 12, 2011. That was also the Tigers' last loss to a Louisiana school. LSU has won 31 consecutive games against in-state opponents, including wins this season over New Orleans (twice) and Grambling.

• LSU is ranked No. 2 in the USA Today preseason poll. The preseason No. 2 ranking is LSU's highest since 2010, when the Tigers also began the year at No. 2.

LSU junior left-hander Cody Glenn, who pitched one relief inning in Sunday's win over Grambling, will start Wednesday night's game at Southeastern. Glenn, a Houston native, was 7-3 in 2013 with a 2.68 ERA and 38 strikeouts in 84 innings, working primarily as the Tigers' No. 3 weekend starter. Glenn was the 15th-round selection of the Toronto Blue Jays in the 2011 MLB Draft.

• LSU opened the 2014 season with three straight victories, defeating New Orleans on Friday and Saturday, and Grambling State on Sunday. All 17 LSU position players and 13 pitchers saw action over the weekend, and 15 players made their first appearances in LSU uniforms over the course of the three games. The LSU pitching staff fired two shutouts while recording a 1.33 ERA and a .163 opponent batting average, and the Tigers committed just one error in three games (109 chances).

• LSU sophomore shortstop Alex Bregman is off to a hot start, batting .545 (6-for-11) with one double, three RBI and one run scored. Sophomore centerfielder Andrew Stevenson also enjoyed a productive weekend at the plate, hitting .500 (4-for-8) with two RBI. Stevenson's three hits in Sunday's win over Grambling State marked the first three-hit game of his LSU career.

• Junior second baseman Conner Hale also batted .500 (4-for-8) over the weekend with one RBI and three runs scored ... LSU's first home run of the season was produced by sophomore catcher/first baseman Chris China, who launched a solo shot Sunday versus Grambling.

• Friday night's win over New Orleans at Alex Box Stadium, Skip Bertman Field drew a paid attendance figure of 12,472, the second-highest attendance mark in LSU history. LSU's largest paid attendance figure is 12,727 established on April 27, 2013 against South Carolina.
