SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU hosts No. 1 Florida for a three-game SEC series this Friday-Sunday, March 14-16 at Tiger Park in Baton Rouge.
- ▶ Beginning this week and over the course of the next five weekends, the Tigers will take on teams currently ranked in either the top 15 or top 20 according to the NFCA and USA Softball Top 25 polls.
- ▶ This is the second time in program history that LSU will take on a top-ranked Florida team at home, with the last instance coming in the 2009 season. The last time the Tigers hosted a No. 1 ranked squad was Alabama in 2011.
- ▶ LSU has won three of the last four against the No. 1 ranked team in the nation, with the last loss coming against Cal in the Women's College World Series in 2012.
- ▶ LSU is 16-13 against Top 10 teams at home.

2014 STREAKS, STORYLINES AND SIDEBARS

- LSU is 17-8 on the season after splitting four games last week.
- The Tigers earned a win over Northwestern State and the series opener against Auburn before dropping the last two on Saturday and Sunday.
- LSU moved to 15-3 in SEC series openers in the only win over Auburn. The Tigers dropped their first season opening conference series for the first time since 2011, as it was also the first series loss to Auburn since 2005.
- LSU was shut out in an SEC regular season game for the first time since the 2012 season.
- The Tigers have dropped consecutive games since dropping the first two to open the season in February.
- LSU had given up only five home runs through 22 games to opponents, as Northwestern State and Auburn combined for five by themselves.
- LSU has either tied or outhit its opponent in four of the last five games and in seven of the last 10 overall.
- The Tigers hit three home runs in Saturday's game, as they have now hit that many in a single contest three times this season, with eight team multi home run contests.
- Through 25 games this year, LSU his batting .319 at the plate, 20 points higher than the team did through the same amount of games last year.
- The Tigers have 13 more hits through 25 games than it did a year ago, and is three home runs shy of where the squad was at through this many games last year.
- LSU pitching has walked 113 batters so far this year and is 51 more than given up at this time last season.

- A.J. Andrews has started all 25 games out in center field and has batted in the leadoff position in every start.
- Andrews leads the team with a .407 batting average which is tenth in the Southeastern Conference
- Her 33 hits are a team-high and are fifth-most in the conference.
- Andrews' 95 total plate appearances is second in the SEC, as her 81 total at-bats is fourth.
- Andrews is 21-of-22 in stolen bases which leads the SEC, as her 0.84 stolen bases per game are ninth in the nation.
- Has stolen three bases in a game twice this season with four games of at least two.
- She is currently on a seven-game hitting streak which is the longest for Andrews this season.
- Andrews has a team-leading 10 multi-hit games on the season, with six, two-hit outings and four, three-hit outings.
- Andrews' six at bats against Harvard on Feb. 28 is an individual season high in the Southeastern Conference.
- Hit .538 against Auburn and Northwestern State, earning seven base knocks with a double, RBI and four runs scored with four stolen bases.
- Went 3-for-4 in the series opener against the Tigers, stealing two bases with a double, RBI and run scored.
- Hit .500 at the Mary Nutter Andrews hit .500 at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic with eight hits, which included a double and a triple, with four RBI.
- The four runs driven in were third on the team at the classic. She combined for five hits in nine plate appearances against Cal State Fullerton.
- Bianka Bell is second on the team with a .348 batting average, starting all 25 games at shortstop for the Tigers.

GAINESVILLE - LSU carried a 1-0 advantage down the final strike in the seventh inning before Ensley Gammel connected for a solo home run on a 1-2 pitch.

The Gators used a Michelle Moultrie RBI double that bounced off the chalk down the left field line to plate Jess Damico, who reached on a hit-by-pitch for the 2-1 extra-inning victory.

Rachele Fico turned in a masterful performance and equaled a season's best with 11 strikeouts. She limited the potent Florida lineup to a pair of hits in the first six frames.

LSU appeared to grab a 1-0 advantage in the fifth inning. Tammy Wray cranked a leadoff single through the middle, and pinch runner Alex Boulet alertly scooted to third base on Morgan Russell's ground out to the catcher.

Boulet scampered home on Dylan Supak's sacrifice fly, but home plate umpire Cindi Brunot ruled that Boulet left third base early after a highly-contested appeal by Florida head coach Tim Walton.

LSU broke through for the game's official first run during the sixth inning. Ashley Applegate coaxed a leadoff walk and advanced to second base on a Wray sacrifice bunt. That set the table for pinch hitter Kailey McCasland, who delivered a clutch RBI single to put the Tigers ahead by a 1-0 margin.

"We fought hard during that first game, but there were some things that didn't go our way," Applegate said. "Even though we weren't successful in the end, we knew we had to have a short memory and that we were capable to beat them in the second game."

LSU wraps up the home portion of its schedule and welcomes No. 12 Georgia for a SEC weekend series. Game times are slated for 6 p.m. [Friday], 4 p.m. [Saturday] and 1 p.m. [Sunday]. Following Sunday's contest, LSU will honor the eight members of its senior class with a special ceremony.

BATON ROUGE - Brittany Mack fired a four-hit shutout as the No. 23 LSU softball team grinded out a 1-0 victory to earn a split of a SEC doubleheader versus No. 2 Florida Tuesday at Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium.

It marked LSU's (33-16, 14-8 SEC) first win over Florida (42-6, 19-3 SEC) in Gainesville since the 2005 season. The Tigers also secured their second win over the No. 2 team in the nation under head coach Beth Torina. LSU knocked off then No. 2 Alabama by a 3-2 margin on April 7.

"It was a great day from top to bottom," head coach Beth Torina said. "I thought we played LSU softball. We manufactured runs on offense, played solid defensively and both pitchers were dominant. I didn't think we got one break in the first game. That one could have easily gone our way. If we continue to play with this type of effort and this level of intensity we played with today, I will be extremely happy, and we will be in a very good spot at the end of the season."

Mack notched eight strikeouts versus two walks to improve to 14-8 on the season. She escaped a bases loaded jam with one out during the sixth inning. The senior right-hander dug deep and forced Bailey Castro along with Ensley Gammel to pop out and ground out in succession.

"The key for Brittany was the sixth inning," Torina said. "We've been asking her all season to stop the bleeding when there are runners on-base. That is something Rachele has done a wonderful job with, and we've asked Brittany to do the same thing. Give credit to Brittany for stepping up, having a big performance and making the critical pitches when she needed them the most."

Florida also put a pair of base runners on in the seventh inning aided. Mack regrouped to record the final out of the game in-style. She fanned Sami Fagan to secure the 2-1 triumph.

"My goal was to try and establish strike one because I saw it worked so well for Fico in the first game," Mack said. "However, I wasn't able to do that consistently especially early in the game. I had to battle back more times than I wanted to. At the end of the day, it's a great feeling to pick up a win against a very talented Florida team."

The Tigers platted the contest's lone run during the second inning. With one out, Ashley Applegate worked her way back from a 1-2 count to a 3-2 situation. She proceeded to rip the payoff pitch into a triple to the right centerfield gap.

Two batters later, Applegate scored on Lauren Houston's RBI single with two outs. It was Houston's first RBI since the Oklahoma State game back on March 3.

"Ashley did a fantastic job and had strong at-bats all across the board," Torina said. "She was a lot more aggressive and had a better mentality at the plate. Lauren stepped up, and I tell the players all the time to be ready to hit when they step into the batter's box. There was no question that Lauren was ready and did that."
