SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU travels for the final road series of the regular season, heading to Oxford to take on the Ole Miss Rebels for a three-game Southeastern Conference series at the Ole Miss Softball Complex this Friday-Sunday.
- ▶ LSU and Ole Miss met just one time last year in a non-conference midweek game early in the season with LSU winning 9-1 in six innings.
- ▶ The Tigers have won nine of the last ten meetings against the Rebels, leading the overall series 43-7.
- ▶ LSU has not dropped a series to Ole Miss since the 2008 season and has never lost more than three games consecutively to the Rebels.
- ▶ The team is coming off of a 6-1 win over No. 20 South Alabama on Wednesday, in LSU's final non-conference home game of the season.

BATON ROUGE - The No. 23 LSU softball team rode Rachele Fico's right-arm to a masterful three-hit performance and garnered a 4-0 victory over Ole Miss Friday to open a SEC weekend series at Tiger Park.

The Tigers (31-14, 12-6 SEC) won their seventh straight contest versus Ole Miss (16-27, 3-17 SEC) and 20 of the 23 match-ups in Baton Rouge. LSU also posted their fourth consecutive shutout against the Rebels, a streak of 30.1 consecutive inning stretching back to the 2010 season.

Fico was touched up for a trio of singles and moved to 15-6 on the season. The junior right-hander racked up seven strikeouts against two walks as she pulled within 17 Ks of reaching 500 career strikeouts.

Ashley Langoni, Morgan Russell, Juliana Santos and Tammy Wray contributed RBIs to spark LSU's offense. The victory allowed the Tigers to secure a spot in May's SEC Tournament and move back into sole possession of fourth place in the overall SEC race after Alabama's 8-3 victory over Georgia.

"Every SEC win is a big win - I don't care who you're playing," head coach Beth Torina said. "Every time we can go out and find a way to get it done, I think, is important. Rachele had a really great performance for us tonight. I think she knew, for the team, she had to get us back on the positive. I don't think she did anything out of the ordinary - I think she's done that for us all year. I thought she threw great and did a very great job."

LSU manufactured the game's first run during the second inning. Santos drew a leadoff walk and advanced to second base on Allison Falcon's sacrifice hit. An Ashley Applegate ground out enabled Santos to move to third base. On a 2-2 offering, Wray chopped a RBI single through the middle to give the Tigers a 1-0 edge.

"Obviously, Ashley Langoni and Juliana Santos have been hitting consistent all season long so we have all the faith in the world in them when they step up to the plate," Wray said. "I feel like the bottom of the lineup has been drastically stepping up. We've been working on our confidence and just been going out there with a positive attitude."

Langoni and Santos drove home a pair of runs in the fifth inning to extend the LSU advantage to 3-0. Langoni notched her 39th walk of the season to break former All-American Ashlee Ducote's single-season record set during the 2000 season.

Fico started the game on-fire and fanned five of the first six batters she retired. She carried a no-hit bid two outs into the fifth inning before Cali Overbeck's single to right field.

Ole Miss' best opportunity to score came in the sixth inning. With runners on first and second base, Fico got out of trouble with a tremendous inning-ending 1-5-3 double play.

The Tigers tacked on another run during the home-half of the frame. Applegate collected a leadoff walk, and pinch runner Alex Boulet swiped her seventh stolen base of the season. Two batters later, Russell ripped a RBI single past a drawn-in Ole Miss infield to plate Boulet for the final margin of 4-0.

"I knew I had to start working harder," Fico said. "I knew I didn't have my best outing last weekend at Tennessee, and I knew I just really had to get back to my fundamentals in the bullpen. [I] just needed to bear down, focus on my mechanics and just get better. I have to be better for my team."

Ole Miss' Kendall Bruning was dealt the loss and fell to 12-14 for the season. She was tagged for four runs on five hits and tallied two strikeouts versus three walks.

BATON ROUGE - On a night where the No. 23 LSU softball program wore teal jerseys to celebrate survivors and spread awareness during its inaugural "Strikeout Ovarian Cancer" event, it was only fitting that Ashleigh Kuhn secured the game-winning RBI to propel the Tigers to a 2-1 victory over Ole Miss Saturday in-front of a season's best 1,815 fans at Tiger Park.

"I thought it was a great effort by the fans," head coach Beth Torina said. "They all showed up wearing their teal. I feel like the women that we honored tonight were also very excited about the game. I feel like they really appreciated all of the effort of the Baton Rouge community. Hopefully, we were able to spread some awareness and gave those women some extra strength and support. I just really appreciate all they've had to go through in their lives."

Kuhn, whose mother is a 10-year survivor of Cervical Cancer, provided a RBI groundout to break a 1-1 tie during the bottom of the fourth inning. The heroics were set up by an Allison Falcon leadoff single, and pinch runner Alex Boulet's back-to-back steals of second and third base.

"We really need the wins, and we're getting our confidence back," Kuhn said. "We've been working really hard in practice. It was really great to get the game-winning RBI tonight, and I bet my mom was screaming in the stands."

Brittany Mack went the distance in the circle and ended a four-game losing streak. She scattered eight hits and was touched up for an unearned run to improve to 13-8 on the season. The senior right-hander racked up 11 strikeouts versus two walks and reached double figure Ks for the fifth time in 2012.

"She did a great job tonight," Torina said. "I like seeing all the strikeouts. She definitely kept Ole Miss fooled and kept them off-balance. It was nice to see her bounce back from some of the things she's been through lately."

LSU dented the scoreboard with the game's first run during the bottom of the third inning. A.J. Andrews ripped a leadoff triple into the right centerfield gap.

Two batters later, Andrews scampered home on Ashley Langoni's sacrifice fly. It was Langoni's 128th career RBI which enabled her to match Quinlan Duhon (2005-08) for seventh place on LSU's all-time list.

Ole Miss fired back with an unearned run in the fourth inning. The Rebels took advantage of a Londen Ladner leadoff walk followed by a Kendall Bruning single.

A passed ball allowed both runners to move into scoring position, and pinch runner Jayla Hubbard crossed the plate with the equalizer on a Marina Parra RBI single. Mack fired back and struck out the side to keep the score at 1-1.

Down 2-1, Ole Miss had an opportunity to draw even again during the sixth inning. Erinn Jayjohn connected for a one-out single and swiped second base. Mack registered consecutive Ks of pinch hitter Kelly Chandler and Cali Overbeck to secure the 2-1 triumph.

"My drop ball was definitely the key factor tonight," Mack said. "Last year [against Ole Miss], I threw a lot of off-speed curves, so I was thinking that maybe they might be waiting on that tonight. I definitely wanted to make sure I mixed it up my pitches more this year than last year. Also, my drop ball was really getting them to chase. I was able to keep it low enough, and they were definitely going after it."

BATON ROUGE - Kendall Bruning tossed her fourth shutout of the season as Ole Miss claimed a 1-0 decision over the No. 23 LSU softball team Sunday during the series finale of a SEC weekend series at Tiger Park.

Ole Miss (17-28, 4-18 SEC) scored the game's only run during the sixth inning. Brittany Broome knocked a leadoff triple into the right centerfield gap and came around to score on Allison Brown's RBI groundout.

LSU (32-15, 13-7 SEC) attempted to rally in the home half of the frame. Pinch hitter Simone Heyward chopped a leadoff single in-front of the pitching circle and advanced to second base on Morgan Russell sacrifice bunt.

Two batters later, pinch hitter Kailey McCasland coaxed a four-pitch walk. The rally ended when Ashley Langoni flew out followed by a Juliana Santos ground out on consecutive pitches.

"Obviously, our offense has to do a better job at making adjustments," head coach Beth Torina said. "Kendall Bruning threw a good game today, sometimes it happens. There are days where you just don't have your best game and a kid on the other team is just better that day."

Rachele Fico suffered the tough-luck loss for the Tigers and dropped to 15-7 for the season. She earned five strikeouts versus three walks and pulled to within 12 Ks of reaching 500 for her career. In her seven setbacks, the junior right-hander has received only three runs of support.

"We know we are better than that," Fico said. "We know that we were supposed to come out and perform better as a whole today. This isn't going to dictate our season. We are going bounce back and keep fighting. We are going to make some adjustments and be better in our next game."

With Dylan Supak at the plate, Boulet attempted a delayed steal of home plate. However, Bruning alertly threw the ball to the catcher for the final out of the frame.

The 1-0 victory enabled Bruning to improve to 13-14 on the season as the Rebels ended their 10-game losing streak.

"I didn't think there was any reason to beat them up about it because they already feel bad enough," Torina said. "What we are going to do next is prepare for Florida. I guess what our plan is going forward from here with practicing tomorrow and know the adjustments we need to make to make sure it doesn't happen again."

Prior to the game, children from the Miracle League Association and Baton Rouge schools joined Brittany Mack as her VIP guests as part of "Geaux Play" day at the park. The children were welcomed onto the field with a standing ovation from the 1,645 fans in the crowd.

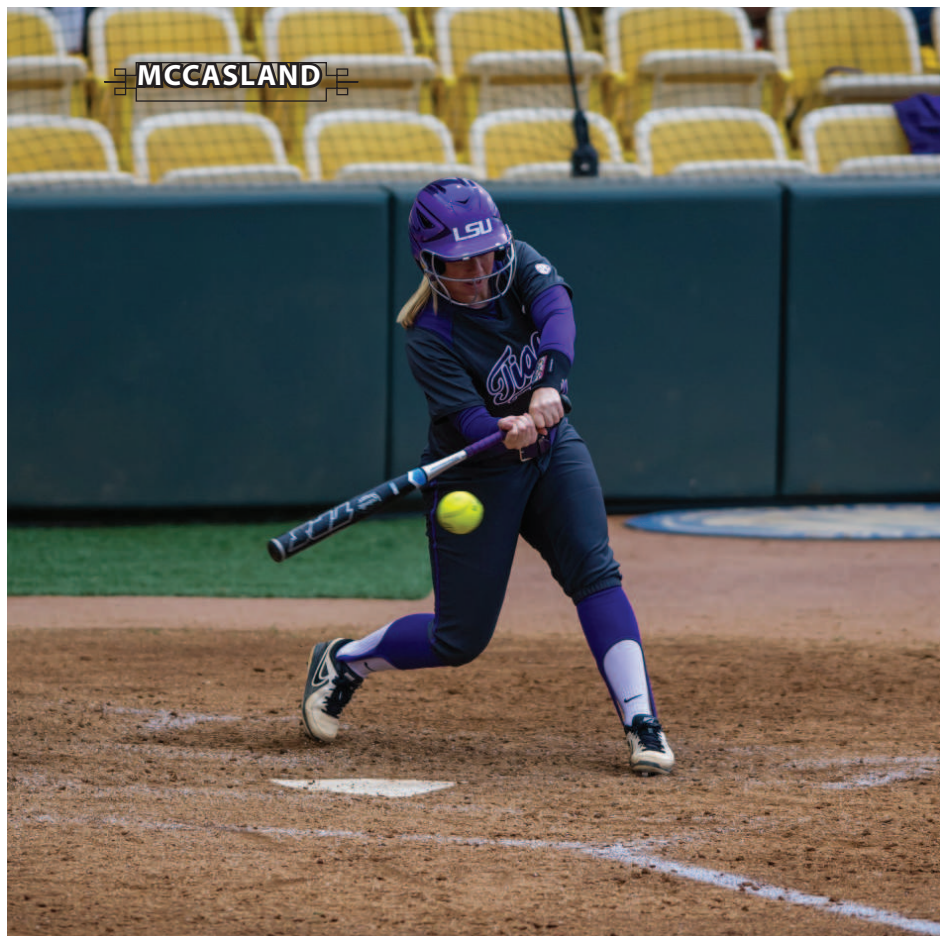
