- ▶ LSU will close out the regular season in Tiger Park, hosting the Mississippi State Bulldogs in Baton Rouge.
- ▶ The entire weekend will be senior weekend, as the squad will honor Alex Boulet, Tammy Wray, Jacee Blades, Simone Heyward, Allison Falcon and Ashley Czechner prior to the contests.
- ▶ LSU has won seven of its last eight conference games.
- ▶ The Tigers defeated the Southeastern Louisiana Lions to push its winning streak to five games.
- ▶ LSU is 47-6 all-time against the Bulldogs, winning 22 of the last 23 meetings overall against MSU.
- ▶ The Tigers are currently seventh in the conference standings, one game back of Florida and Georgia.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - Rachele Fico turned in a pitching performance for the ages and racked up 22 strikeouts to not only set a program single-game record but equal a SEC single-game mark as the LSU softball team garnered a 1-0 victory in 14 innings over Mississippi State Friday during the SEC opener for both teams at the MSU Softball Stadium.

LSU (18-4, 1-0 SEC) scored the game's only run when A.J. Andrews lifted a 0-1 offering over the centerfield fence for her first career home run.

Fico sat down 25 of the last 27 batters she faced and wrapped up the 1-0 win in style with her 22nd strikeout of the contest. Former Tennessee All-American Monica Abbott also picked up 22 strikeouts during a 1-0 win in 10 innings versus Florida back on March 19, 2007.

The previous LSU single-game mark was set by former All-American Britni Sneed with 19 Ks versus Oklahoma at the 2001 Women's College World Series.

"Rachele provided one of the most gutsy performances I've ever witnessed," head coach Beth Torina said. "She was fantastic, battled back from last weekend and fought through feeling under the weather. She didn't have a ton of confidence coming out of Orlando but was able to grind out for a big win."

"I was in a situation today where I woke up and was feeling under the weather," Fico said. "I wanted to do everything I could for my team. This is my team, and I wouldn't want to do this with anyone else. I'm always going to give them everything I have. I was coming off a weekend where it wasn't my best performance. My goal was to play as hard as I could, and I get to get back on the right foot for them. I took it one pitch at a time, thought about making quality pitches and playing my game."

After starting the game 0-for-5 at the plate, Andrews smacked a pitch up in the zone. The ball carried and just cleared the centerfield fence past MSU's Jessica Offutt leaping attempt.

"I wanted to make an adjustment at the plate," Andrews said. "I was making solid contact with my slapping, but I was hitting the ball right at them. I decided to swing away in my last at-bat. It worked out for me. I looked up and saw the ball go over the fence as I rounded second base. I got really excited and was so happy when I touched home plate."

"Good for A.J. that she was able to make an adjustment at the plate," Torina said. "That's what we need to take away from this game. Her adjustment was to go away from the slapping and swing full. It worked out for her in a big way."

"I knew A.J. could do it, there was no doubt in my mind," Fico said "It was such an awesome feeling to see that ball go over the fence. She is such a talented player and a gamer. We're lucky to have her on our team. She always works so hard, and I love feeding off of her energy."

Mississippi State (15-5, 0-1 SEC) nearly scored a run during the second inning. After Jessica Cooley drew a one-out walk, Erin Nesbit knocked a chopper off of Fico's glove. The ball bounced into left field, and Cooley scampered towards third base. An errant throw by LSU left fielder Jacee Blades allowed Cooley to head towards the plate. LSU third baseman Tammy Wray collected the ball and fired to catcher Lauren Houston, who applied the tag to keep the score tied at 0-0. With Nesbit at third base, Fico got Shelby Fisher to line out to first baseman Sandra Simmons and end the threat.

LSU put the leadoff runner in the 10th inning courtesy of a Bianka Bell leadoff single. Pinch runner Alex Boulet advanced to second base on Tammy Wray's sacrifice bunt and moved to third base on a field pickoff attempt by MSU catcher Logan Foulks.

Allison Owen worked her way out of the jam and induced consecutive pop outs to keep the Tigers off the scoreboard. Owen was the tough-luck loser and fell to 9-2 for the season. The reigning two-time SEC Pitcher of the Week tallied 10 strikeouts against zero walks.

"Every win is a big win when you're playing in the nation's toughest conference," Torina said. "We're going to enjoy the win and plan to have to fight hard tomorrow."

STARKVILLE - The No. 12 LSU softball team dropped a 2-1 decision as Mississippi State rallied for a pair of runs during the sixth inning Saturday at the MSU Softball Stadium.

LSU (18-5, 1-1 SEC) had its 21-game winning streak over the Bulldogs (16-5, 1-1 SEC) which dated back to the 2005 season come to a close.

After posting five shutout frames to open up her first career SEC start, Meghan Patterson gave up a solo home run to Logan Foulks with one out during the sixth inning. The solo shot for Foulks was her team-leading sixth homer of the season and evened the score at 1-1.

The Bulldogs continued their charge after Sam Lenahan drew a one-out walk. Pinch runner Kayla Winkfield stole second base, and Jessica Cooley reached off a wild pitch after a strikeout to put runners on the corners. Shelby Fisher delivered a RBI single through the left side for the game winner.

Mississippi State turned to its ace Allison Owen out of the bullpen. She retired the Tigers in order to secure the 2-1 win and notch her third save of the season. Kylie Vry recorded a pair of strikeouts in her one inning of relief to earn the win and improve to 2-2 on the season.

Patterson tallied five strikeouts versus three walks over her 5.1 innings of work. She was touched up for two runs on four hits and fell to 3-2 for the season.

"Mississippi State did a good job," head coach Beth Torina said. "Foulks hit the ball well. Other than that, I thought Meghan had a very nice performance and did a good job in the circle. I would expect our offense to be able to score more runs."

LSU dented the scoreboard with the game's first run in the fifth inning. Kailey McCasland started the frame and was hit-by-a-pitch. After pinch runner Alex Boulet advanced to second base on Simone Heyward's sacrifice bunt, Boulet stole third base. She crossed the plate on A.J. Andrews perfect execution of a squeeze bunt.

"Alex always makes things happen for us when she's on-base," Torina said. "She's a special base runner, and I'm so confident she's going to score when she enters the game."

The Tigers were poised to extend their lead after Andrews stole second base, and Jacee Blades tacked on a single to right field.

Two batters later, Bianka Bell dropped a bunt down the first base line and avoided the tag attempt as Andrews scored. However, home plate umpire Will Lieske overruled his counterpart at first base and called Bell out of the baseline for the inning's final out.

"It's going to be a tough day without question," Torina said. "I'm sure we'll see Allison Owen pitch for them again. She's been good for them, and we'll definitely have our hard cut out for us."

BATON ROUGE - The No. 12 LSU softball team matched a season's best and connected for a quartet of home runs en route to a 9-2 victory over Mississippi State during the rubber game of a three-game series Sunday at the MSU Softball Stadium.

With the win, the Tigers (19-5, 2-1 SEC) moved into sole possession of first place in the SEC Western Division after one weekend of conference play. LSU also blasted four home runs in a 9-1 victory at Ole Miss back on February 13.

"We were a completely different team from yesterday," head coach Beth Torina said. "We spent a lot of time thinking about our offensive approach, and Coach Dobson really zoned them in. The players did a really good job of executing the plan, and hopefully our offense understands now where they need to be. This can be a really good lesson learned for future SEC games."

LSU struck early and posted a three spot on the scoreboard in the first inning. A.J. Andrews and Jacee Blades collected consecutive singles to start the frame. After an Allison Falcon sacrifice bunt moved both runners into scoring position, Bianka Bell crushed a towering three-run home run over the left field scoreboard to give the Tigers a 3-0 lead.

"Today was definitely a team win, we knew we had to make things happen at the top of our lineup early in the game," Bell said. "We had a better plan with our at-bats after seeing their pitcher for 14 innings on Friday. I wanted to take away the inside pitch from her, drive it hard somewhere and that's what I did in the first inning."

The Tigers added three more runs during the fourth inning as Sandra Simmons and Tammy Wray connected for back-to-back dingers to push the advantage to 6-0. It marked the 16th time in program history that LSU has gone for back-to-back homers, and the first time since the Nicholls State game on March 7, 2012 when Ashley Langoni and Dylan Supak accomplished the feat.

LSU made it 8-0 on Allison Falcon's fourth roundtripper of the season, a two-run bomb to left centerfield, in the fifth inning. Andrews got on in-front of Falcon and picked up her team-leading ninth multi-hit performance of the season.

MSU's Allison Owen exited the contest and surrendered eight runs. She tallied six strikeouts against zero walks and fell to 9-3 on the season. Entering the game, Owen had only been touched up for seven total runs in 78.0 previous innings of work.

"I'm proud of how our group played all day," Torina said. "I was happy that we were able to score and continue to score. This game was important to the players. They wanted to make sure that we won the series and wanted to have an answer after getting beat the day before."

Mississippi State responded with two runs of their own in the home half of the frame. The Bulldogs made the most of an infield single, a walk and a LSU error. Heidi Shape also provided a sacrifice fly to bring the tally back to 8-2.

LSU tacked on an insurance run during the seventh inning. Simone Heyward dropped a bunt single, stole second and crossed the plate on Jacee Blades RBI single for the final margin of 9-2.

Rachele Fico went the distance in the circle for the Tigers. She scattered six hits and allowed two runs, one earned, to claim her 12th victory of the season. The senior right-hander registered eight Ks versus three walks. She is now eight strikeouts away from becoming the fourth pitcher in program history to reach the 700-mark for her career.

"Rachele was fantastic for us all weekend," Torina said. "I enjoy watching her pitch and happy to see her take what she worked throughout the week in the bullpen to the field."

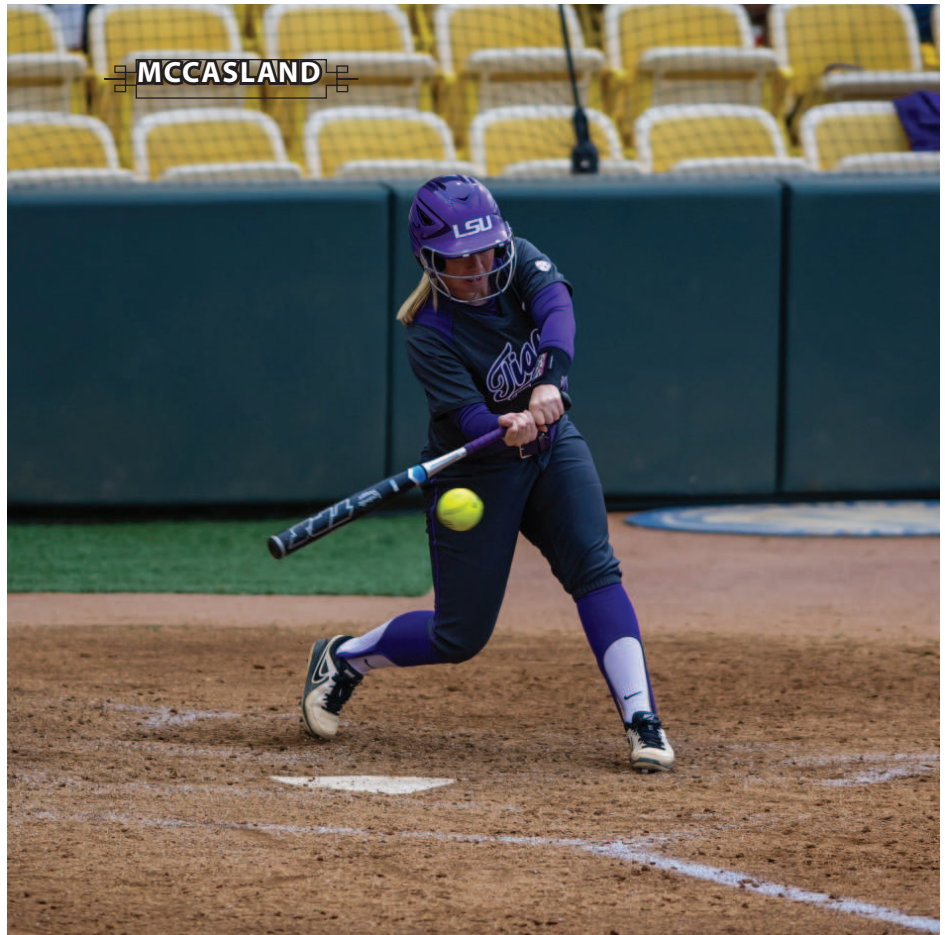
