SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU will open play at the 2014 SEC Softball tournament at the Carolina Softball Stadium in Columbia, S.C. as the sixth seed and take on No. 3 seed Missouri at 10 a.m. Thursday.
- ▶ The Tigers have made the trip to the league's postseason tournament every year since 1997.
- ▶ LSU is tied with Alabama for the most tournament titles in the SEC with five. The Tigers last won the conference tournament in the 2007 season after claiming its eighth division title.
- ▶ The team will be looking to advance past its opening round game for the first time since 2010.
- ▶ The Tigers have won each of their last five series leading into the tournament.
- ▶ LSU has won eight of its last ten and 12 of its last 15 games heading into the tournament.

BATON ROUGE, LA. - The No. 11 LSU softball team was handed a 6-1 defeat by No. 12 Missouri during Friday's series opener as 1,490 fans gathered at Tiger Park.

Missouri (25-6, 10-5 SEC) rode two-time All-American hurler Chelsea Thomas to a complete game effort in the circle. The senior right-hander picked up 13 strikeouts and fanned a batter in each of her seven innings of work. She limited LSU's offense to one run on two hits.

"She (Chelsea Thomas) did a really good job," head coach Beth Torina said. "She threw strikes early and worked ahead. She was impressive tonight. We had some good at-bats during the middle of the game. Bianka (Bell) squared one up and hit it pretty hard. I didn't think we had quality at-bats throughout the entire game. She (Thomas) was really good. I don't think we did a good job taking the pitches out of the zone and swinging at pitches in the zone."

LSU (36-10, 11-5 SEC) has dropped the series opener in back-to-back weeks, but the Tigers remained in sole possession of first place in the SEC Western Division after Alabama was handed a 3-2 setback by Mississippi State.

For LSU, Rachele Fico was tagged with the loss and dropped to 22-8 on the season. She was touched up for six runs, three earned, on nine hits. The Connecticut native issued six walks versus three strikeouts.

"I just need to throw better pitches earlier in the count," Fico said. "I need to trust my pitches and trust what is being called. I need to hit my spots. I think this team is capable of so much more. We are a better team than how we played tonight. I know we will bounce back. We are a resilient group. I have all the faith in the world in our team, and we will come back fighting tomorrow."

Missouri grabbed a 1-0 edge in the third inning. With two outs, the Tigers pieced together a pair of singles and a walk to fill the bases. Kelsea Roth was hit-by-a-pitch to force home the game's first run.

LSU evened the ledger at 1-1 during the fourth inning. Jacee Blades chopped an infield single and advanced to third base as Bianka Bell ripped a double down the left field line on a 0-2 offering. Two batters later, Blades sprinted home with the equalizer on a Sandra Simmons' ground ball.

Missouri fired back and regained a 3-1 advantage in the fifth inning. Nicole Hudson opened the frame with an infield single on a slow roller to the shortstop. She raced around the bases with the go-ahead run on Angela Randazzo's RBI double that dropped in just past the diving A.J. Andrews in right centerfield. Roth tacked on a RBI single to give Mizzou a two-run edge.

Missouri added three more runs during the sixth inning. With bases loaded and two outs, Corrin Genovese lifted a fly ball to left centerfield. Blades was unable to make the catch, and the ball kicked away to clear the bases and give Missouri its winning margin of 6-1.

Thomas sat down the first eight batters she faced fueled by six Ks. After the Bell double, Thomas retired the final 12 LSU hitters courtesy of seven strikeouts.

"Our kids are definitely mentally tough," Torina said. "They will be able to bounce back from it. I thought they played a real timid game tonight, and I thought they were a little too passive. I think they had too much built up about this game. Hopefully, they will come out and be themselves the rest of this weekend."

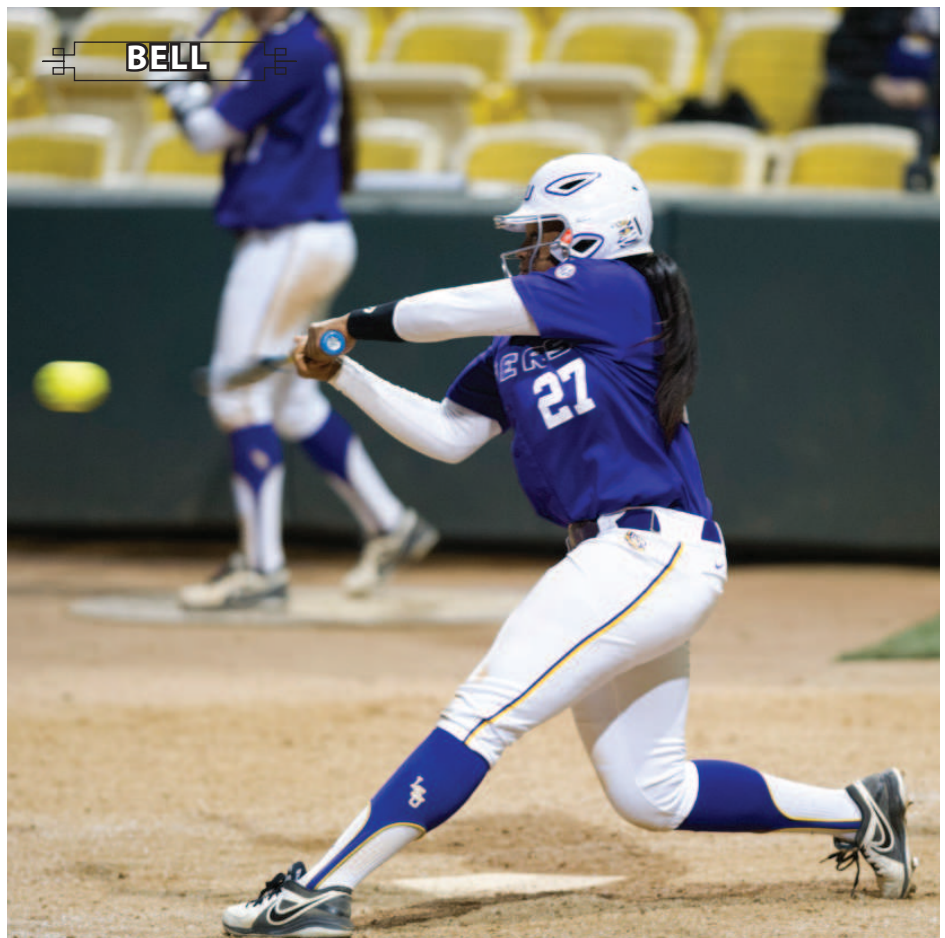

NO. 11 LSU 8, NO. 12 MISSOURI 0 - 4/20

BATON ROUGE, LA - The No. 11 LSU softball team bounced back in a big way and secured an 8-0 five-inning victory over No. 12 Missouri to even the three-game series Saturday in-front of a raucous 2,291 fans during the program's second-annual "Strikeout Ovarian Cancer" teal game at Tiger Park.

LSU (37-10, 12-5 SEC) wore teal jerseys in support of Ovarian Cancer awareness. Before the game, the program recognized survivors of the disease on the field during a special ceremony. The 2,291 fans was the third-largest crowd in program history.

Ashley Czechner was effective and efficient en route to a two-hit shutout. The junior right-hander fired in 11-of-17 first pitch strikes and tallied three strikeouts against one walk to improve to 9-0 for the season. It marked the first time that Missouri (25-7, 10-6 SEC) was shutout on the season, a streak of 54 games that dated back to April 13, 2012.

LSU's offense posted an eight-hit attack and was opportunistic by taking advantage of five Missouri errors. LSU was fueled by Kelsi Kloss' 2-for-2 effort with two RBIs, while Rikki Alcaraz turned in a 2-for-3 performance and added a RBI.

The victory enabled LSU to maintain sole possession of first place in the SEC Western Division race after Alabama secured an 11-3 victory earlier in the day.

LSU raced out to a 4-0 edge during the first inning. Jacee Blades reached base on an infield single deep in the hole at shortstop. She moved to second base on a fielding error by the Missouri second baseman. Allison Falcon smacked a single, and Blades raced home with the game's first run after a throwing error by the Missouri centerfielder.

Sandra Simmons was hit-by-a-pitch to fill the bases. On the first pitch of the sequence, Kloss ripped a two-run single through the right side to extend LSU's lead to 3-0. Kloss stole second base, and Simmons crossed the plate with LSU's fourth run courtesy of Missouri's third error of the frame, a throwing error by the catcher.

LSU added three more runs in the third inning. Bianka Bell laced a leadoff single to right centerfield, stole second base and scored after a dropped fly ball by the Missouri centerfielder to make it 5-0.

Kloss belted another single to place runners on the corners, and Simmons scampered home with LSU's sixth run after a Missouri starting pitcher Nicole Hudson uncorked a wild pitch. An Alcaraz single through the middle put runners back on the corners. LSU executed a double steal with Alcaraz and Kloss to push the margin to 7-0.

LSU closed the game out with another run during the fifth inning. Simmons picked up a leadoff single to centerfield and advanced to third base after a wild pitch and passed ball, respectively. Three batters later, Alcaraz scored the final run on a bunt down the third base line for the winning margin of 8-0.

Czechner retired eight of her final nine batters to secure her third shutout of the season. Missouri's best opportunity to score came in the third inning after putting the first two runners on-base. Czechner notched back-to-back strikeouts followed by a fly ball to escape the threat.

"I just really wanted to go right at them," Czechner said. "I didn't want to get behind in the count. I wanted to throw a first-pitch strike as often as I could. I know when I get behind, I get in a lot of trouble. That was my plan pretty much. I wanted to stay ahead of them and keep them off balanced as much as I could."

"I had so much fun catching Ashley today," Kloss said. "It was awesome to see her establish strikes right away. I felt like they didn't really know what to do. It was like they were so shocked at the first-pitch strike. They were flustered after that. It was fun to see Ashley thrive off of that. I just had so much fun watching her do so well. She held them to two hits and no runs."

BATON ROUGE - The No. 11 LSU softball team was handed its first SEC series loss on the season after No. 12 Missouri came away with the rubber game by a 3-2 margin Sunday at Tiger Park.

LSU's offense was led by Bianka Bell's 2-for-3 effort with a RBI and a run scored. Allison Falcon also secured a RBI, while A.J. Andrews and Simone Heyward picked up hits for the Tigers. In the circle, Rachele Fico was issued the loss and fell to 22-9. She gave up three runs on six hits and recorded five strikeouts against two walks.

Missouri (26-7, 11-6 SEC) received a pair of home runs from Nicole Hudson, who finished 3-for-4 with three RBIs. Chelsea Thomas also went the distance in the circle and emerged with 10 strikeouts versus one walk to improve to 17-4 on the season. She surrendered two runs and scattered five hits.

After Sunday's action, LSU (37-11, 12-6 SEC) is tied with Alabama for first place in the SEC Western Division standings after the Crimson Tide picked up a 9-8 win over Mississippi State.

"I thought we played really hard today," head coach Beth Torina said. "I thought we played a much better game facing (Chelsea) Thomas than we did on Friday. I thought she is a special pitcher. She is always going to be tough. The fact that we got two runs off of her was a good job by our offense. I think good pitchers are capable of making huge pitches in big time situations. She was able to step up and get the timely out whereas we weren't able to get the timely hit."

LSU charged out to a 1-0 advantage during the first inning. Heyward smacked a one-out single off the glove of the Missouri third baseman. She was erased at second base on a Bell ground ball out. Sandra Simmons worked her way to a walk to set up Falcon, who cranked a 1-1 offering through the left side for the game's first run.

Missouri fired back with two runs of its own in the third inning. Emily Crane connected for a slow-rolling single down the first base line. Two batters later, Hudson dialed up an opposite field two-run dinger onto the berm in left field to give Missouri a 2-1 edge.

Missouri pushed its lead to 3-1 during the fifth inning after Hudson struck again with a solo shot that ricocheted off the scoreboard in right field.

"I definitely feel like I threw better today than I did Friday," Fico said. "I got ahead in counts a lot more. I trusted my pitches, and my defense played really well behind me. It's just those two pitches that you wish you could take back. When it is all said and done, all you can do is learn from it and move on."

LSU rallied for a run in the home half of the frame. Andrews cranked a leadoff single to centerfield and stole second base. Two batters later, Bell jumped on the first pitch of the sequence and belted a RBI single to right centerfield to draw LSU back to within 3-2.

Thomas regrouped and sat down the final eight LSU batters she faced to secure the 3-2 win. She tallied five of her 10 Ks during that run and received a diving catch by Corrin Genovese from her shortstop post to get the second out of the seventh inning.

"She (Thomas) made adjustments when we made adjustments," Bell said. "When we started swinging at the low pitch, she started bringing the ball up in the zone. I guess we couldn't make that final adjustment with her. She definitely had a good day like she did on Friday. There's no doubt in my mind that she is good pitcher."

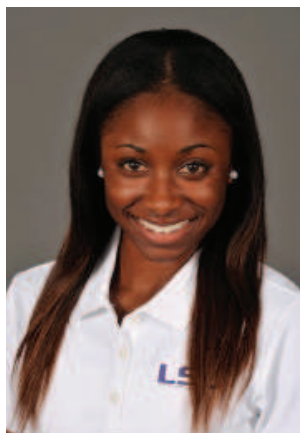
