KENTUCKY RETURNS TO CONFERENCE PLAY, TRAVELS TO LSU

Behind a 5-1 start to a season for the first time since 2007, the Kentucky football team looks to keep its winning ways going this weekend as it travels to Baton Rouge, La., to face the LSU Tigers on Saturday.

Kentucky is coming off a come-from-behind 48-14 victory last weekend against ULM, moving the Wildcats to 5-1 for only the seventh time in the modern era of UK football (since 1945). UK's defense was impressive in the win, returning two interceptions for touchdowns and only allowing ULM 71 yards of total offense in the second half. It was UK's second consecutive comeback victory.

Offensively, UK had a 100-yard rusher (Stanley "Boom" Williams 104 yards) and 100-yard receiver (Javess Blue 109 yards) in the same game for the first time since 2012. Quarterback Patrick Towles threw for 216 yards in the win and three touchdowns, two to Blue and one to freshman WR Blake Bone.

QUICK NOTES

- Kentucky is in its second season under head coach Mark Stoops, who has re-energized the UK fan base with the two highest ranked recruiting classes in program history, the nation's second-largest attendance increase last season and a strong start to the 2014 campaign.
- The Wildcats are off to a 5-1 start to the season, which is its best start to a season since 2007 and only the seventh time since 1950 that UK has won five of its first six games.
- UK is 2-1 in SEC action for the first time since 2007 and has won consecutive SEC games for the first time since taking down Vanderbilt and Georgia in 2009.
- Kentucky scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter against South Carolina to post its first fourth-quarter comeback win since a 2011 win over Ole Miss. UK erased a 14-point deficit in the fourth quarter to win the game, which is the largest fourth-quarter comeback in program history. Last weekend vs. ULM, UK trailed 14-3 at the end of the first quarter before 45 unanswered points to claim a 48-14 victory.
- Senior DE/LB Alvin "Bud" Dupree has been picked as one of the top five athletic "freaks" in college football by NFL.com and Fox Sports. Dupree currently leads all active SEC players in sacks with 19.0, ranking tied for second in UK history. More on page 16.
- After having just three interceptions last season, Kentucky has 11 in its first six games in 2014, which ranks fourth nationally and second in the SEC. The 11 picks are the most by UK since 2010.
- UK's defense ranks high in several national categories, including 20th in passing yards allowed, 15th in scoring defense, 12th in team passing efficiency defense and eighth in turnovers gained. The UK defense returned two interceptions for a TD against ULM, the first time UK has accomplished that since 1986.
- A total of 73% of UK's rushing yards in 2014 (1,105) have come from student-athletes who did not play for UK in 2013. Overall, 67% (147 of 171 points) of all of Kentucky's points have been scored this season by players who did not play last season.
- UK is receiving votes in both the AP Top 25 and USA Today Top 25 for the second consecutive week. It is the first time UK has received votes in both polls back-to-back weeks since Oct. 12-Oct. 19, 2008.
- The University of Kentucky campus is in the midst of \$1 billion of construction, featuring new academic buildings, dormitories and athletic facilities. Included in that is a \$120-million reinvention of Commonwealth Stadium that will transform it into a state-of-the-art facility for the 2015 season. In addition, UK will build a \$45 million football complex that will be attached to the Nutter Field House, with construction taking place in 2015-16. UK Athletics also is contributing \$65 million for the construction of the new Academic Science Building on campus.
- UK had an attendance increase nearing 10,000 fans last season, which was the second-largest attendance increase in the nation. UK averaged 59,472 fans last season to finish top 30 in average attendance.
- This is the 124th season of intercollegiate football for the UK football program.

SECOND SEASON**

- Named the 37th head coach of the Kentucky football program on Nov. 27, 2012
- First task as UK coach was to put together a bright and energetic coaching staff. Accomplished that feat by hiring two of the best up-and-coming coordinators in the game in D.J. Eliot and Neal Brown.
- Inherited a recruiting class ranked in the 60s by the national evaluation services before Stoops and Co. hit the trail hard to sign a top-30 class, which was the highest ranked class in program history before Stoops' most recent class was a unanimous top-25 class.
- UK averaged almost 10,000 more fans per game last season than in 2012, which is the second largest attendance increase in the nation.
- Accomplished major defensive turnarounds at Arizona and Florida State.
- During Stoops' three seasons at FSU, the Seminoles went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.
- Developed many players to NFL careers, including Antoine Cason, Michael Johnson, Philip Buchanon, Kelly Jennings, Brandon Meriweather, Ed Reed, Antrel Rolle, Mike Rumph, Sean Taylor and Brian Lee.

GAME NOTES VS. LSU

SERIES RECORD VS. LSU

- Kentucky and LSU will meet for the 57th time in program history on Saturday with LSU leading the all-time series 39-16-1, including a 23-5-1 mark in games played in Baton Rouge, La.
- The first-ever meeting between the two teams came in 1949 in Baton Rouge with the Wildcats claiming a 19-0 victory. UK won back-to-back games against LSU in 1998 and 1999 before the Tigers have won five of the last six meetings in the series. The only loss during that stretch was UK's 43-37 triple-overtime victory over top-ranked LSU at Commonwealth Stadium in 2007.
- LSU won the last meeting between the two teams with a 35-7 victory in Baton Rouge on Oct. 1, 2011. The Wildcats' last win in Tiger Stadium was a 39-36 victory over No. 21 LSU in 1998.
- UK and LSU met annually from 1952 to 2002 but the two schools have only met three times since - 2006, 2007 and 2011.
- Saturday will mark the 12th time in 57 meetings that UK and LSU will meet with UK having 4 wins or more. The Wildcats lead the series in those game, 6-5.
- Biggest UK win: 26 (31-5) in 1999 in Lexington
- Biggest LSU win: 49 (49-0) in 2006 in Baton Rouge
- Games decided by 7 points or less: LSU leads series 11-5-1

SCOUTING LSU

- LSU enters Saturday's game with a 5-2 record, including a 1-2 mark in SEC play. The Tigers are coming off a dramatic 30-27 victory over Florida in The Swamp last weekend with a 50-yard field goal by Colby Delahoussaye in the final seconds of the game. The Tigers started the season with three straight wins over highly ranked Wisconsin, Sam Houston State and ULM before dropping a home game to then-unranked Mississippi State. LSU responded to the loss against the Bulldogs with a non-conference win over New Mexico State before falling at highly ranked Auburn two weeks ago before its win at Florida last weekend.
- Offensively, LSU is scoring 34.9 points per game this season, averaging 209.1 rushing yards per game and 205.0 passing yards per game. The Tigers are led offensively by true freshman running back Leonard Fournette, who has 504 rushing yards and six rushing touchdowns this season, while senior running back Kenny Hilliard has 324 rushing yards and six rushing touchdowns. Overall, the Tigers have 19 rushing touchdowns this season and 12 receiving touchdowns. Quarterbacks Anthony Jennings and Brandon Harris have both seen time this season with Jennings completing 50% of his passes for 928 yards and six touchdowns, while Harris is completing 56.8% of his passes for 452 yards and six touchdowns. Their favorite target this season has been sophomore wide receiver Travin Dural, who has a team-high 24 receptions for 626 yards and six touchdowns. True freshman wide receivers Trey Quinn and Malachi Dupre have played well with Quinn gathering 14 catches for 148 yards, while Dupre has 11 catches for 257 yards and four touchdowns.
- On the defensive side of the ball, the Tigers are allowing only 19 points per game, while opponents are rushing for 175.6 per game and passing for 157.7 per game. Junior linebacker Kwon Alexander leads the team in tackles with 46, including 3.5 tackles for loss, four quarterback hurries and two fumbles forced. Junior defensive end Danielle Hunter has 40 tackles with six tackles for loss, one sack and one quarterback hurry. Sophomore defensive back Tre'Davious White has 15 tackles this season, adding two interceptions, three pass breakups and one quarterback hurry, while safety Rickey Jefferson also has two interceptions, including one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry. The Tigers defense has eight interceptions and eight fumble recoveries this season.

UK FOOTBALL LANDS CONSENSUS TOP-25 RECRUITING CLASS

In Feb. 2014, Coach Mark Stoops and his relentless staff brought home Kentucky's highest-rated class in the Internet era of recruiting evaluation, scoring a No. 17 ranking on Rivals.com, No. 20 by ESPN.com, No. 21 by Scout.com and No. 22 by 247Sports.com.

Fifteen members of the 28-man class received a four-star ranking in at least one of the above-mentioned services. Ten of the signees were listed at least once in the Rivals Top 250 players, the ESPN Top 300, the Scout Top 300 or the 247 Top 300.

Can Kentucky Ride its Improved Recruiting to SEC Success?

Stoops and his staff have not hesitated to compete against big-name programs on the recruiting trail. And Kentucky has won more than a few of those battles: The Wildcats beat out Louisville, Tennessee and South Carolina for Barker; Auburn, Clemson and LSU for all-purpose back Stanley Williams; and Alabama, Notre Dame and Ohio State for Elam.

Signing Day: The Hot Fad in Recruiting is the Hand-Written Letter

One day last April, Kentucky bombarded Matt Elam, a 340-pound tackle from Elizabethtown, Ky., with 69 letters. It followed up several months later with 182 letters. Not to be outdone, Notre Dame shipped Elam 270 letters in November, a postage play that Fighting Irish recruiters call a "pot of gold." The outsize attention paid off for Kentucky last week when Elam—who said he received 50 letters on a normal day—chose the Wildcats over not only Notre Dame but also Alabama, which has won three of the last five national titles and is expected to land the nation's top recruiting class this year.

- LSU quarterback Anthony Jennings and UK defensive backs Daron and Zack Blaylock are each from Marietta, Ga. Jennings went to Marietta High School while the Blaylock twins went to Walton High School.

ON THIS DATE IN WILDCAT HISTORY ...

- Saturday marks the 19th time in program history that Kentucky has played on October 18th with the Wildcats holding a 10-8 record all-time on games played on this date.
- Kentucky's first ever game on this date came in 1899 when it defeated Miami (Ohio) 18-5 in Lexington. The Wildcats have won three consecutive games on this date dating back to 1997.
- The Wildcats are 2-6 all-time against SEC teams on this date. UK and LSU have met four times on this date with the Tigers winning all four games.
- On Oct. 18, 1997, UK had 22 first downs by passing against Northeast Louisiana, which ranks fourth most in single season history.
- On Oct. 18, 1997, UK great Tim Couch tossed six touchdown passes against Northeast Louisiana, which is tied for the second-most TD passes thrown in a game in UK history.

LAST TIME VS. LSU

The No. 1-ranked Louisiana State University Tigers used their swift, physical defense to keep their unblemished record intact by taking down the University of Kentucky 35-7 in a rare morning kickoff at Tiger Stadium in front of 92,660.

The Tigers' defense limited UK to 155 yards of total offense, including 89 rushing yards and 66 passing yards. The Kentucky defense also performed well, keeping LSU under 200 yards rushing and receiving in the game, including limiting LSU to only 14 points in the first half.

LSU started the scoring in the opening quarter, putting together a 12-play, 68-yard drive that ended in a one-yard touchdown rush by Jordan Jefferson. The Tigers put seven more points on the board with 11 minutes to go in the half when quarterback Jarrett Lee connected with Odell Beckham for a 51-yard touchdown reception.

In the third quarter, LSU put together a 10-play, 68-yard drive that ended with an Alfred Blue one-yard touchdown rush, giving the top-ranked Tigers a 21-0 lead. On Kentucky's next offensive set, Tyrann Mathieu forced a fumble and then picked up the loose ball and took it 23 yards for a touchdown to give LSU a 28-0 lead.

UK got on the board with just over four minutes to go in the fourth quarter when Morgan Newton connected with Matt Roark for a four-yard touchdown reception, capping off a 12-play, 70-yard drive.

Kentucky defense got double-figure tackle games from linebacker Danny Trevathan (13 tackles), safety/linebacker Winston Guy (12, plus two tackles for loss), a career-high 11 from Ronnie Sneed and safety Martavius Neloms (10).

BIG GAMES VS. LSU

1976 - An upset 21-7 victory over the 16th-ranked Bayou Bengals in Lexington gave the Wildcats a 4-2 record, marking the first time in 10 years that a Wildcat team had won four of its first six games. UK's big play came in the first quarter after a punting exchange gave the Tigers possession on their 15-yard line. QB Pat Lyons'

intended pass to TB Charles Alexander was under thrown on the UK 44. Dallas Owens made a spectacular one-handed interception and went all the way to paydirt.

1977 - After defeating the 16th-ranked Tigers the year before in Lexington, Kentucky had a return trip to Baton Rouge in 1977 against another 16th-ranked Tiger team. The 1977 version was much of the same as Kentucky rolled to a 33-13 win over the Tigers.

1998 - Seth Hanson made a 33-yard field goal as time expired as UK defeated No. 21 Louisiana State, 39-36, in Baton Rouge. Taking the ball at their own 24-yard line, with the score tied at 36 with two minutes to go, the Wildcats seemed to be playing for overtime with a pair of running plays into the line. But, on third-and-12, Quentin McCord ran an end-around and broke loose for 38 yards. A 14-yard pass from Tim Couch to Jimmy Haley put the Cats in position for the field goal and Hanson drilled the game-winner right down the middle. The victory was UK's first road win over a ranked opponent since 1977.

2007 - Heading into the game with a 5-1 record and boasting a top-20 national ranking for the first time since 1985, Kentucky continued a storybook season in 2007 by taking down the No. 1-ranked and eventual National Champion LSU Tigers at Commonwealth Stadium. The game, which went to three overtimes, is considered the biggest win of the Rich Brooks Era and was the first time Kentucky had defeated a top-ranked team since defeating Ole Miss in 1964. UK took a six-point lead in the third overtime and then stopped the Tigers on fourth and two to seal the win.

A WIN SATURDAY VS. LSU WOULD ...

- ... give Kentucky its first four-game winning streak since defeating Louisville, Norfolk State, Middle Tennessee State and WKU to start the 2008 season.
- ... give Kentucky a three-game SEC winning streak for the first time since defeating Mississippi State, Georgia and Vanderbilt consecutively in 2006.
- ... give Kentucky six wins in a season for the first time since the 2010 team finished 6-7.
- ... make UK 6-1 overall, marking the first time since 2007 UK has won six of their first seven games.
- ... mark only the fourth time since 1950 that UK has started a season with six wins or more in its first seven games (1950, 1977, 2007).
- ... make Mark Stoops the only UK coach since 1915 to lead UK to a 6-1 start to a season in just two years or less on the job. Five UK coaches accomplished the feat prior to 1915.
- ... make UK 3-1 in the SEC for the first time since 1999 when it opened conference play with a loss to Florida but defeated Arkansas, South Carolina and LSU in the weeks to follow.
- ... give UK its first win in Tiger Stadium since 1998.
- ... give Kentucky 17 wins over LSU, the second-most against a SEC West opponent all-time. UK has 21 wins over Mississippi State.

WILDCATS START 5-1 FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2007

- With its win against ULM last week, Kentucky is 5-1 to start a season for the first time since 2007 and only the seventh time since 1950 (1950, 1976, 1977, 1983, 1984, 2007)
- The Wildcats are 5-0 at Commonwealth Stadium this season, marking the first time a UK team has accomplished that since the 2007 team went 5-0.
- Two of UK's five wins have come against SEC foes. The win over South Carolina marked the first time that Kentucky has won back-to-back SEC games since Georgia and Vanderbilt in 2009.
- Kentucky is 2-1 in SEC play for the first time since starting 2-1 in league action in 2007. That year, the Wildcats opened SEC play with a win over Arkansas, before falling to South Carolina and beating No. 1 LSU.

STOOPS IN THE SAME COMPANY AS THE "BEAR"

Hall of Fame coach Paul "Bear" Bryant coached at Kentucky from 1946-53 and is the all-time wins leader for the Wildcats. When Mark Stoops and Co. took down South Carolina at Commonwealth Stadium on Oct. 4, Stoops accomplished something that hasn't been done at UK since Bear walked the sidelines.

Stoops became the fifth coach since 1945 to lead a UK team to a 4-1 record to start a season in two years or less on the job. However, Stoops is the first since Bear to accomplish that feat with two of the four wins coming against SEC opponents.

MILESTONES TO WATCH FOR ...

- Senior defensive end Bud Dupree has 19 career sacks, needing 7 more to tie for the most all-time in school history with Oliver Barnett (1986-89).
- Dupree currently leads all active SEC players in sacks.
- Junior punter Landon Foster has a career average of 41.9 yards per punt (155 punts, 6,502 yards) which ranks third in school history.
- Senior wide receivers Demarco Robinson and Javess Blue have 781 and 811 career receiving yards, respectively. They hope to become the 23rd and 24th players in school history with 1,000+ receiving yards.

Commonwealth Stadium

On game day, Commonwealth Stadium often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.

- The Wildcats are in their 42nd season at Commonwealth Stadium, which is currently undergoing a \$120 million reinvention to be completed for 2015.
- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 266 games within the friendly confines of Commonwealth Stadium. UK has a 143-121-4 record (.541) in CWS.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 63,408 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance for 13 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years.
- The playing surface is named C.M. Newton Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

Commonwealth Stadium Renovations on the Way:

Through a \$120-million reinvention, Commonwealth Stadium will be transformed into a state-of-the-art facility in time for the start of the 2015 season. As the Kentucky football program enters a new era, the Big Blue Nation will enjoy an intimate game-day atmosphere to match. The experience will begin outside the stadium, as the longtime home of the Wildcats will undergo a dramatic external facelift. The new Commonwealth Stadium will take on a modern look, but one that remains uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Commonwealth will be reduced over the course of the two-year project, but the value of all remaining seats will be increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses will revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches will reap the benefits of the new Commonwealth Stadium as well, as new home-team facilities will be built, while a new multi-purpose recruiting room will play host to future Wildcats on their on-campus visits. Facts and Figures on Commonwealth Stadium:

Seating Capacity: 62,093, including the Commonwealth Suites.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage. The interior seating bowl also has LED ribbon boards.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

Game Day Experiences

The "Cat Walk": Fans are encouraged to greet the team when the Wildcats arrive for the "Cat Walk." The team buses will arrive at the Nutter Field House approximately two hours and 15 minutes before the game and the players will make the "Cat Walk" to their stadium entry point at Gate 1. Fans are encouraged to line up on the sidewalk and cheer the players as they enter the stadium. A siren will be sounded while the team buses are on their way to the stadium. That's the fans' cue to proceed to the Cat Walk area to greet the team.

Wildcat Refuge: Fans of all ages, but especially the younger Wildcats, will enjoy playing at the Wildcat Refuge, located outside of the southwest corner (outside Gate 9) of Commonwealth Stadium. There are five giant inflatable games that are available two hours before kickoff.

• After UK's win last weekend against non-conference foe ULM, Stoops became just the third UK coach in the modern era of Kentucky football (1945-present) to start a season 5-1 or better in his first two years on the job. The others to accomplish that feat were Bear in 1947 and Jerry Claiborne in 1983.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS: GAINED ON OFFENSE, STOPPED ON DEFENSE

• Kentucky head coach Mark Stoops, offensive coordinator Neal Brown and defensive coordinator D.J. Eliot talk a lot about explosive (long yardage) plays. So far this season, both coordinators should be happy about how the team has performed.

• Kentucky has 12 offensive plays this season of 40+ yards, which is tied for 9th most in the nation. The Wildcat offense has seven plays of 50+ yards, which ranks tied for 10th nationally, four plays of 60+ yards, which ranks tied for 12th nationally, three plays of 70+ yards, which ranks tied for 8th nationally and one play of 80+ yards, which ranks tied for 13th nationally. UK has 37 offensive plays this season of 20+ yards, which ranks tied for 19th nationally. UK is one of just 15 teams in the nation that has 37 or more plays of 20+ yards and has played six games or fewer.

• Kentucky's defense has been impressive in limiting the explosive plays this season, ranking tied for 30th nationally in fewest 10+ yard plays allowed. The UK defense has been really stingy down the field, only allowing six plays this season of 30+ yards, which is tied for fifth best in the nation. The UK defense is one of just 10 teams nationally that has played six games or more and allowed six or fewer 30+ yard plays. Kentucky has only allowed two 40+ yard plays this season, which is tied for third nationally in that category. UK ranks tied for ninth nationally with only one 50+ yard play allowed and tied for 1st in the nation by not allowing a play this season over 60 yards.

• The longest play against the UK defense this season came in the Florida game when Jeff Driskel connected with Demarcus Robinson for 51 yards. The UK defense stiffened up after the long play, allowing a four-yard rush after the long play before an incomplete pass and an interception stopped the Florida drive.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR U ... K'S OFFENSE?

• Although just entering his second season as Kentucky's offensive coordinator, Neal Brown is no stranger to the UK football program having lettered at Kentucky in 1998 and 2000 as a wide receiver. Born and raised in the Commonwealth Brown is a lifelong member of the Big Blue Nation.

• During his time as a player in 1998, Kentucky - led by All-America quarterback Tim Couch - posted the best two offensive performances in school history with 801 yards of total offense vs. Louisville and 679 yards of total offense against Vanderbilt.

• If you flash forward to Brown's most current tenure in Lexington, his offense has registered the third- and fourth-best offensive performances in program history with 675 yards of total offense vs. Miami (Ohio) last season and 656 yards of total offense against UT Martin to start the 2014 season.

YOUNG 'UNS Y'ALL

• A total of 53% (117 of 219 points) of all of Kentucky's points this season have been scored by a redshirt or true freshmen. Redshirt freshman kicker Austin MacGinnis has 57 points, while true freshman Stanley "Boom" Williams has 18 points, and fellow rookies Garrett Johnson, Mikel Horton and Blake Bone each have 12 points. True freshman Dorian Baker has six points. Six of UK's 10 receiving touchdowns this season have been by true freshmen.

• A total of 73% of UK's rushing yards in 2014 (1,105) have come from student-athletes who did not play for UK in 2013. Sophomore Jojo Kemp, who leads UK in rushing with 297 yards, is the lone Wildcat to see playing time last season and record a rushing yard this season.

• A total of 67% (147 of 171 points) of all of Kentucky's points have been scored this season by players who did not play last season. On top of the true/redshirt freshmen listed above, transfer Braylon Heard has 18 points and redshirt sophomore Patrick Towles has 12 points.

• Kentucky's underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) have accounting for 171 of the 219 points scored this season, which is 78% of the scoring. Of the 15 players that have recorded a point for Kentucky this season, 10 are underclassmen. Of the 11 offensive players that have scored points this season, nine are underclassmen.

GETTIN' FRESH | STOOPS AND CO. GAINING EXPERIENCE

- A total of 15 primary offensive (seven) and defensive (eight) starters from 2013 returned for the Wildcats this season, including 36 players that have started at least one game entering the 2014 season.
- That number of players with starting experience has grown in UK's first few games of the 2014 season as eight players earned their first career starts in UK's first game, while three players started for the first time in their careers against Ohio and one against Florida, Vanderbilt and ULM. The South Carolina game was the only time this season that UK has not had a first-time starter.
- A total of 25 players saw their first playing time as a Wildcat in the season opener, including nine true freshmen, 10 redshirt freshmen, five transfers and sophomore Jeff Witthuhn. If you count Patrick Towles, Josh Clemons, J.D. Harmon, Jabari Johnson and Zack Blaylock - who did not see game action in 2013 - a total of 30 players that did not play in 2013 played in UK's 2014 season opener.

OFFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- Kentucky started the season by posting 400+ yards of total offense in each of its first three games, marking the first time a UK team achieved that to start a season since 2010.
- UK has posted 219 points this season, which is the most in the first six games to start a season since 2007.
- The UK offense has been very balanced this season with 228 rushing plays and 199 passing plays. The Wildcats are averaging 4.8 yards per rush and 13.0 yards per reception this season. UK's running backs are averaging 6.2 yards per rush this season.
- UK has outscored its opponents 113-41 in the first half and 96-37 in the second half this season.
- The Wildcats rushed for 230 yards in each of their first two games. It's the first time a UK offense has rushed for 230+ yards in two straight games since 2009. UK rushed for 180+ yards in four of its first five games to start the season for the first time since 2007.
- Kentucky's offense has posted 380+ yards of total offense in each of its first three SEC games for the first time since 1998 when UK posted 448 vs. Florida, 507 vs. Arkansas and 526 vs. South Carolina.

ULM GAME ...

- UK's 83-yard TD pass in the second quarter (Towles to Blue) was its longest offensive play of the year.
- Kentucky scored over 30 points for the fourth time in 2014, its most 30-point games since six games in 2010. UK's 48 points marked the most points allowed by ULM in 2014.
- The Wildcats have scored at least 45 points three times on the year, its most 45+ point games in a season since 2010. UK has scored 45+ points in a game at least three times in a season just three times since 2005 (2007, 2010, 2014).

- Kentucky scored 45 unanswered points in the game, its most unanswered points scored since 49 against UTEP in 2002.
- Javess Blue had 109 yards receiving and Stanley "Boom" Williams had 104 yards rushing in the game, marking the first time UK had a 100-yard receiver and 100-yard rusher in the same game since Sept. 8, 2012 vs. Kent State.

SOUTH CAROLINA GAME ...

- Kentucky scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to post the largest fourth-quarter comeback in program history, surpassing the previous mark of a 13-point deficit. The fourth-quarter comeback was UK's first since 2011.
- Since 2008, UK has scored 21 points in the fourth quarter two times - both against South Carolina in the past two seasons.
- UK's touchdown drive to open the second half marked its first of the year.
- UK's 239 rushing yards in the game was the most against an SEC foe since posting 341 against Vanderbilt in 2010.

VANDERBILT GAME ...

- UK took it 99 yards on its opening possession to score a TD, its second opening-drive TD of the year. The 99-yard drive was the longest of the year in terms of plays (16), yards (99) and time (6:15).
- UK connected with 11 different receivers in the game, its most receivers targeted in a game since 2012.
- UK had 183 rushing yards in the game, its most vs. an SEC foe since posting 206 against Georgia in 2012.
- Kentucky out-gained Vanderbilt by 245 yards of total offense, which is the largest total offense margin for UK against an SEC foe since it out-gained Vanderbilt by 394 yards (679-285) in 1998.

FLORIDA GAME ...

- UK scored 30 points vs. the Gators, its highest scoring output vs. UF since scoring 37 vs. UF in 2007.
- Kentucky finished with 369 total yards passing, marking the most yards passing allowed by Florida since Michigan passed for 373 yards in a 2007 season bowl game. Florida has allowed just two 300+ yard passing outings since the 2008 season, allowing Georgia to throw for 313 yards in 2010.
- Florida's interception in the third quarter was UK's first turnover of the season after 10 straight quarters without a giveaway. Kentucky went the first 181 plays of the 2014 season before turning the ball over, with an interception in the third quarter snapping UK's streak.
- Kentucky had 11 explosive plays in the game (10+ yards rushing or 20+ yards passing).
- UK's 450 yards of total offense against Florida was the most against an SEC foe for the Wildcats since 2010 vs. Vanderbilt. It was the largest total offense output for UK in an SEC opener since 2000 against Florida.

OHIO GAME ...

- Kentucky defeated Ohio by 17 points. UK outscored its opponents by 62 points to open the year, marking its largest scoring margin through two games since a 76-point margin in 2007.
- UK had a 38:26 time of possession, marking its most time of possession since holding the ball 38:44 at Florida in 2000.
- UK's 14-play scoring drive in the third quarter was a season long. The Wildcats finished with 11 explosive plays (20+ yard pass plays and 10+ yard rush plays), just shy of the 12 explosive plays vs. UT Martin.

UT MARTIN GAME ...

- UK's 59-14 season-opening win over UT Martin marked its most points scored since hanging 63 on Western Kentucky in 2010. It was also the most points scored in a season-opening game since 68 vs. Louisville in 1998.

- UK's 45-point margin of victory over the Skyhawks was its most since a 77-17 win over UTEP in 2002.
- Kentucky had six rushing touchdowns vs. UT Martin, its most in a game since vs. Kent State in 2007.
- Kentucky finished with 656 yards of total offense vs. the Skyhawks, which was the fourth greatest single-game total in school-history. UK finished with 675 yards of total offense vs. Miami (Ohio) last season for the third-highest total in school history. UK's 446 yards of total offense in the first half vs. UT Martin was more yards than it gained in 11 of 12 games last season.
- The Wildcats finished with 422 yards passing vs. UTM, marking its best passing output since throwing for 430 yards in a 2007 game vs. Tennessee in four overtimes. The last time UK threw for over 422 yards in a regulation game was when it threw for 450 yards in a win over Vanderbilt in 2006.
- Kentucky had five consecutive touchdown drives against UT Martin that went for 75 yards or more. The Wildcats had four touchdown drives of 80+ yards in the season opener, while it only had five such drives of 80+ yards last season.

THE QUARTERBACKS

- Sophomore quarterback **Patrick Towles** - who won the starting job in fall camp - has completed 62.5 percent of his passes for 1,541 yards, 10 touchdowns and four interceptions. Towles' 1,541 passing yards and 10 passing touchdowns in just six games this season is the most by a UK quarterback since Mike Hartline had 3,178 yards and 23 touchdowns for the entire 2010 season.
- During his 2013 redshirt season and last winter, Towles made significant changes in his throwing mechanics -- primarily shortening his throwing motion -- that enabled him to get rid of the ball more quickly.
- Towles had a sparking debut vs. UT Martin in his first career start, going 20-for-29 for 377 yards and one touchdown. Towles also rushed for his first career touchdown, a career-long 23-yard run
- With 407 total yards of offense vs. UT Martin, Towles had the second-most yards from scrimmage for a UK quarterback making his first career start, just behind the 409 yards Dusty Bonner had in a 1999 game with Louisville.
- Towles played great against the Gators at The Swamp. The sophomore went 24-for-45 for 369 yards. Towles is the third UK quarterback to pass for 300+ yards against Florida in Gainesville and first to throw for 300+ yards against an SEC foe since Mike Hartline in 2010 vs. Georgia.
- With his strong game against Florida, Towles became the fifth UK player ever to throw for 360+ yards twice in his career. He is the first ever to accomplish that feat during his first three career starts.
- Towles impressed with his arm and legs against Ohio, going 17-for-31 for 170 yards and one touchdown, while rushing a career-best 22 times for a career-best 59 yards.
- Towles numbers don't jump off the page in UK's last two games, but he has completed 36-of-57 passes for 424 yards, four touchdowns, no interceptions and only three sacks. Towles 83-yard strike to Blue against ULM was UK's longest offensive play of the season and tied for the seventh longest pass play in UK history.
- Redshirt freshman quarterback **Reese Phillips** has played in two games and is 2-for-5 for 45 yards.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

- Sophomore wide receiver **Ryan Timmons** leads Kentucky in receiving with 27 catches for 315 yards. Timmons had a great game against Ohio, with a career-best 10 catches for a career-high 95 yards. Timmons has caught a TD pass in two of UK's last three games, including a 48-yard TD grab against South Carolina.
- True freshman **Garrett Johnson** was the star against Florida - his home state - ending with six catches for 154 yards and two touchdowns. He was named SEC Freshman of the Week. The 154 yards is the most ever by a true freshman in program history and the most by a UK player since Randall Cobb had 171 against Miss. State in 2010. Johnson is the first UK true freshman with two TD catches in a game since Cobb in 2008.
- Senior **Javess Blue** had a career game against ULM, catching three passes for 109 yards and two touchdowns. Both touchdowns were impressive as the first was an 83-yarder and the second was a one-handed grab that was a top play on ESPN's SportsCenter. Blue's 83-yard TD made him first player in UK history to have two receptions of 83 yards or longer in a career. The game also marked Blue's first multi-TD game of his career and second 100-yard receiving game. Blue has 12 catches for 225 yards and two touchdowns this season.
- Six of the 10 TD catches this season by a UK receiver are by true freshmen. **Blake Bone** was the lone wide receiver with a touchdown in UK's opener, catching two passes for 65 yards, including his 29-yard TD catch. Bone added a TD catch against ULM. Against Ohio, **Dorian Baker** - who earned his first career start in the game - scored UK's first touchdown with eight-yard catch. Baker ended the game with two catches for 41 yards, including a beautiful over-the-shoulder catch deep in Ohio territory.
- **Demarco Robinson's** 79-yard catch and run from Towles vs. UT Martin was the longest of his career. Robinson has 17 catches for 254 yards this season, averaging 14.9 yards per catch.

- Tight end **Steven Borden** leads UK's tight ends with three catches for 32 yards, while **Ronnie Shields** has two catches for 18 yards.

THE RUNNING BACKS

- Junior running back Braylon Heard made the most of his first two career touches as a Wildcat, taking both into the endzone for a touchdown in the opener. Heard ended the game with 116 yards on just two carries. Heard's first carry was for a 73-yard TD, followed by a 43-yard touchdown. Heard is second on the team in rushing with 38 carries for 282 yards and three touchdowns.
- Sophomore Jojo Kemp, the team's leading rusher a year ago, started in Heard's place vs. Ohio. He has a team-high (for running backs) 56 carries this season for 297 yards and four touchdowns. Kemp has been very successful in the WildKemp formation, especially against South Carolina, rushing a career-high 17 times for a career-best 131 yards and three touchdowns. Kemp was the first UK player with three rushing touchdowns since CoShik Williams in 2010.
- Both true freshman running backs have played this season. Stanley "Boom" Williams has 203 rushing yards, including a 53-yard scoring dash against Ohio and 58-yard TD rush against ULM. Boom had a good game against ULM, rushing for 104 yards and returning a kickoff 75 yards to open the game - UK's longest kickoff return since 2009. Boom showed his explosiveness with an amazing 25-yard TD catch in the first OT against Florida. Williams caught the ball in the right flat and reversed fields and used key blocks to score the go-ahead TD. Boom also leads the SEC with a 36.0 yards per kickoff return average. Boom is first true freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since Josh Clemons in 2011. Mikel Horton has 33 carries for 172 yards, including two touchdowns vs. UT Martin.
- Junior running back Josh Clemons is a great story of perseverance. Clemons, who lost the 2012 and '13 seasons because of injuries, had not played in a game in 1,057 days until participating in the season opener. He has eight carries for 30 yards this season.

THE OFFENSIVE LINE

- With four starting linemen returning from last season, the coaches were optimistic that the offensive line would take a lead role in the improvement sought by the offense.
- The offensive line allowed Kentucky to rush for 230+ yards in each of their first two games. It is the first time a UK offensive has rushed for 230+ yards in two straight games since 2009 vs. Vanderbilt and EKU.
- Two players earned their first career starts against UT Martin in redshirt freshmen Ramsey Meyers and Kyle Meadows. Redshirt freshman Cole Mosier made his first career start against Ohio for junior left guard Zach West, who was sidelined because of injury. Both Mosier and West were sidelined with injuries against Vanderbilt and redshirt freshman Nick Haynes earned his first career start.
- UK's youth on the offensive line showed against Florida with Zach West not playing because of injury and Darrian Miller leaving the game in the second quarter, UK played with three redshirt freshmen in the offensive line -- Nick Haynes at left tackle, Cole Mosier at left guard and Ramsey Meyers at right guard.
- UK's offensive line has allowed UK's running backs to rush for 6.2 yards per carry this season.
- Center Jon Toth was named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week following the win over Ohio and senior Darrian Miller earned the honor after UK's SEC win against Vanderbilt.
- The strong blocking on the line allowed UK rush for 180+ yards in four of its first five games to start a season for the first time since 2007. Overall, UK is averaging 4.8 yards per carry this season, which would be the largest average per rush total since 1987 when UK averaged 4.9 yards per rush.
- The offensive line has only allowed five total sacks in UK's three SEC games this season. The line has allowed two or less sacks in every game but one this season.

DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- Kentucky ranks seventh in the SEC and 32nd nationally in total defense, limiting the opponent to 343.5 yards per game. The Cats are third in the league in pass defense (191.5), eighth in rushing defense (152.0) and fifth in scoring defense (18.7).
- Kentucky ranks high in several defensive categories nationally, including fourth in interceptions and punt return defense, 20th in passing yards allowed, 15th in scoring defense, 12th in passing efficiency defense and eighth in turnovers gained and turnover margin.
- Kentucky did not allow a first-half offensive touchdown through the first four games for the first time since 1979. (Note: Vanderbilt got a touchdown in the first half on an interception return.)
- UK's streak of pitching a shutout in the first half was snapped after a second-quarter Florida field goal. UK went the first 82:47 of first-half play through three games without allowing its opponent to score.
- After just three total interceptions last season, the Wildcats now have 11 interceptions through six games, marking the most interceptions in a single season since the 2011 team had 15.
- In back-to-back weeks, Kentucky's defense returned interceptions for the go-ahead score.
- Against ULM, Kentucky had two interceptions returned for a touchdown, marking the first time UK has had two in a single game since vs. Cincinnati in 1986.
- Five of UK's 11 interceptions have come in the fourth quarter in 2014.
- UK's four defensive touchdowns this season are the most since 2008.
- UK has forced its opponent into a punt on its first possession in five of six games this season.
- Kentucky allowed only 43 points in regulation in its first three games this season, the least since allowing only 22 in its first four games in 2008.

ULM GAME ...

- Freshman DT Matt Elam's pass break-up led to junior LB Josh Forrest intercepting a pass and returning it 29 yards for a go-ahead touchdown in the second quarter.
- Sophomore S Marcus McWilson intercepted his second career pass and his second of 2014, returning it 36 yards for his first career touchdown in the third quarter.
- Bud Dupree recorded his 200th career tackle against ULM and finished with five tackles, 1.5 sacks and one quarterback hurry. He also blocked his first career kick, marking UK's first blocked field goal since Josh Forrest blocked a field goal vs. Louisville in 2013.

SOUTH CAROLINA GAME ...

- Alvin "Bud" Dupree's six-yard interception return for a touchdown with 2:29 remaining capped the biggest fourth-quarter comeback win in school history, a 45-38 victory over South Carolina at Commonwealth Stadium.
- Bud Dupree's game-winning interception was UK's first game-winning INT for a touchdown since John Rader vs. Indiana in 1998.
- The Kentucky defense followed with another crucial stop, an Ashely Lowery interception on UK's 30-yard line with just over 1:30 to play that all but sealed the Wildcats' victory.

VANDERBILT GAME ...

- Kentucky held Vanderbilt to just 139 yards of total offense and eight first downs, the fewest yards and first downs allowed in an SEC game since holding Vandy to 91 total yards and 8 first downs in 1996.
- The Wildcats only allowed Vandy 85 passing yards in the game, the fewest against an SEC foe since allowing Miss. State 79 in 2004.
- UK held Vandy to 54 rushing yards, its fewest rushing yards allowed since holding Samford to -2 yards in 2012. It marked the fewest rushing yards allowed by UK in an SEC game since 2008 vs. Mississippi State, surrendering 43 yards.
- Kentucky limited Vandy to 47 offensive plays, the fewest it has allowed since 2009 vs. Clemson in the Music City Bowl.

FLORIDA GAME ...

- UK held Florida to 20 points at the end of regulation, its best defensive output vs. UF since holding the Gators to 20 points in 2004. Along with the 2004 game, it marked the fewest points allowed to UF by the Wildcats since 1986.

OHIO GAME ...

- UK did not allow an offensive touchdown, marking the first time since a 2012 win over Samford.
- UK's defense forced six three and outs.

UT MARTIN GAME ...

- UK forced five turnovers, its most since 2008 vs. Louisville. UK has forced four turnovers on four occasions since 2008.
- After forcing just three interceptions in 2013, UK had two interceptions against UT Martin, its most since picking off two passes at Missouri in 2012.
- UK forced and recovered three fumbles, marking its most fumbles recovered since three at Georgia in 2011. Junior Khalid Henderson returned one of the fumbles for a touchdown, the first by a UK player for yardage since 2012.

THE LINEBACKERS

- In his first season as a starter, middle linebacker **Josh Forrest** leads the team and ranks tied for ninth in the SEC with 46 tackles, including 5.5 for loss.
 - o Intercepted a pass vs. ULM and returned it 29 yards for a go-ahead touchdown in the second quarter. It marked his first INT of the season and second of his career.
 - o Had a career-high 15 tackles vs. South Carolina, marking his second career double-digit tackle game as he also had 10 tackles at Florida.
 - o Originally came to UK as a wide receiver before moving to defense.
- Junior **Khalid Henderson** is second on the team in tackles with 35 stops. He also has two fumble recoveries, leading the SEC and ranking eighth nationally in that category.
 - o Recovered a fumble vs. UT Martin and returned it 89 yards for a touchdown.
 - o Notched his first tackle for loss vs. South Carolina and the fourth of his career.
- Junior LB **Ryan Flannigan** transferred to Kentucky after two seasons at Blinn College in Branham, Texas.
 - o Finished with six tackles in his UK debut vs. UT Martin and combined for a sack vs. Ohio.
 - o Made his first career start, totaling two tackles vs. ULM.

THE DEFENSIVE BACKS

- Junior cornerback **Fred Tiller** ranks tied for 14th in the SEC in total passes defended with five, including one interception and four pass breakups.
 - o Got the season off to a great start, with his first career interception in the UT Martin game, along with two pass breakups.
- During spring practice and preseason camp, UK coaches frequently talked about junior-college transfer **A.J. Stamps** being a big-play performer. Stamps has proven the coaches correct. He has interceptions in three of his first five career games and is sixth on the team in tackles with 27.
 - o Currently ranks 17th nationally and tied for third in the SEC in INTs.
 - o Had a spectacular one-handed interception (ESPN No. 3 "Play of the Day") in the season opener and he also had a tackle for loss among his game-high eight tackles vs. UT Martin.
 - o Led the team in tackles vs. Ohio with six and notched his first career pass breakup.
 - o Picked off his third career interception and finished with seven tackles and a career-high two pass break-ups vs. South Carolina.
 - o Last season at East Mississippi, he charted four interceptions and nine PBU while helping lead East Mississippi to the national junior-college championship.
 - o Became the first UK player with three interceptions through the first five games of a season since Marcus McClinton in 2008.
- Sophomore **J.D. Harmon**, who sat out last season after leading the team in 2012 with two interceptions, finished with six tackles, two tackles for a loss, one forced fumble and a quarterback hurry vs. UT Martin. Harmon also returned his first career kickoff, a 26-yard return in the fourth quarter.
 - o Finished with five tackles and forced his second fumble of the year vs. Vandy.
- Senior **Nate Willis** recorded his first career interception against Florida. Willis returned it 27 yards.
- Senior **Ashely Lowery** is in his third season as a starter at safety. He has 26 tackles and two interceptions on the season, including key fourth-quarter pickoffs against Vanderbilt and South Carolina. Overall, he has four INTs in his career.
- Sophomore safety **Marcus McWilson** has two INTs this season. He picked off his first career pass vs. Vanderbilt and intercepted his second career pass vs. ULM, returning it 36 yards for his first career touchdown.
- Junior CB **Cody Quinn** is tied for the team lead with four pass breakups. He now has 12 in his career.
- Sophomore nickelback **Blake McClain** has three pass break-ups on the year and eight in his career.

THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- Both of UK's returning starters at defensive end -- **Bud Dupree** and **Za'Darius Smith** -- received All-Southeastern Conference honors last season and after going through the National Football League evaluation process both decided to come back to UK for their final campaigns.
 - **Dupree**, who has started in 32 straight games, totaled 61 tackles while leading the team with 9.5 tackles for loss, including seven quarterback sacks last season. He also caused two fumbles and broke up a pass. He was a second-team all-league pick by The Associated Press and Phil Steele's College Football.
 - o Ranks fifth on the team with 28 tackles, including 4.5 for loss, a team-high 3.0 sacks, a pass breakup and three quarterback hurries.
 - o The SEC's active career sack leader has 19.0 sacks in his four-year career, tying him for second in UK career history.
 - o Made his first career interception vs. South Carolina, returning it six yards for the game-winning touchdown. It was Kentucky's first game-winning interception return since John Rader in 1998 vs. Indiana.

- o Blocked his first career kick vs. ULM, marking UK's first blocked field goal since Josh Forrest blocked a field goal vs. Louisville in 2013.
- **Smith** made 59 stops, 6.5 for loss, featuring six sacks last season. He led the team in quarterback hurries with six, broke up one pass and recovered a fumble. He was a third-team all-conference pick by CollegeSportsMadness.com.
- o Ranks third in tackles this season with 31 and has recorded two pass break-ups, two quarterback hurries and 1.5 sacks.
- o Has eight career sacks and three pass breakups in his career.
- o Had a great game vs. Florida with a career-high 11 tackles, one pass breakup and one-half sack.
- Senior **Mike Douglas** was key in UK's 45-38 win over South Carolina as he tipped a pass which Dupree caught and scored for the game-winning touchdown.
- o Notched his fourth career sack vs. UT Martin. He now has sacks in each season of his UK career.
- o Against Ohio, he had two tackles and half a tackle for loss. He now has six TFL in his career.
- Redshirt freshman DT **Regie Meant** finished with four tackles, two sacks and one fumbled forced in his collegiate debut vs. UT Martin.
- o Recovered his first career fumble vs. ULM.
- Junior DT **Cory "C.J." Johnson**, playing primarily on third down, has become a pass-rush specialist. He has 2.5 quarterback sacks, including two vs. ULM, and three QB hurries this season.
- o Recorded his first career sack and broke up his first career pass vs. Vandy.
- Sophomore DE **Jason Hatcher** has a team-high tying 5.5 tackles for loss, ranking 13th in the SEC.
- o Notched his first career start against Florida and played well. He finished with four tackles, one sack and two tackles for loss.
- Junior DT **Melvin Lewis** finished with three tackles against Florida and was credited with his first career sack. Against Vanderbilt, he notched his second tackle for loss this season.
- Freshman and 6-foot-7 DT **Matt Elam** has two pass breakups this season.
- o Notched his first career pass break-up vs. South Carolina and his PBU vs. ULM in the second quarter led to Josh Forrest's interception return for a touchdown.
- o Had a career-high three tackles vs. ULM.

DUPREE HAS "FREAK" ATHLETIC ABILITY

Senior defensive end/linebacker Alvin "Bud" Dupree has been labeled as one of the top five athletic "freaks" in college football, according to NFL.com and Fox Sports. Here's what Bruce Feldman of Fox Sports had to say:

"One of the best things about Wildcat football is this 6-3, 267-pound hybrid LB-DE who made 61 tackles and 9.5 TFLs last season. Dupree, who has vertical jumped 40.5 inches and broad-jumped 11 feet, should light up the NFL Combine. UK's sports performance coach Erik Korem, who came from FSU, said Dupree's speed was clocked at 21 miles per hour on their GPS system."

SPECIAL TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Kentucky returns starters at all of its specialist positions except placekicker, where redshirt freshman Austin MacGinnis won the job for kickoff, field goal and extra point duties. So far this season, MacGinnis is 10 of 15 in his first career field-goal attempts. He hit a 53-yard field goal against Ohio, which tied the school record for longest field goal. MacGinnis made some clutch field goals against Florida, tying the game with a 35-yarder at the end of the first half. He hit a 51-yarder towards the end of regulation to send the game to overtime and hit a 26-yarder in the second overtime to send the game to a third overtime.
- MacGinnis has a team-leading 36 points scored on the year and is a perfect 21 of 21 in PAT attempts.
- MacGinnis has also handled the kickoffs this season. He has 30 kickoffs in 2014, with 14 going for touchbacks.
- Junior Landon Foster has averaged 42.2 yards per punt during his three seasons as the starting punter for UK. So far in 2014, Foster has pinned UK opponents inside their own 20-yard line 17 times and has totaled 40 in his three-year career. Foster helped UK flip field position in its first half against Florida, punting six times in the first half and pinning the Gators inside their own 20-yard line five times.
- Foster had a season-long 55-yard punt vs. Vanderbilt.

- Long snapper Kelly Mason and holder Jared Leet have been very consistent in their roles.

STADIUM RENOVATION UNDERWAY

- Construction has begun on the \$120 million renovation of Commonwealth Stadium, a project that features a new look for the exterior of the stadium, wider and redesigned concourses, new concession stands and rest rooms, new suites and other premium seating, a recruiting room and a new press box.
- It's a two-year project but there should be minimal disruption for the 2014 season. Part of the southside upper deck has been removed in order to begin the new suite/press box complex and there will be some utility and other site preparation work done this year. Seating capacity for the stadium will be 62,093 for the 2014 campaign.
- The majority of the construction will begin immediately after the last home game on Nov. 8. The reworked stadium is expected to be complete in time for the 2015 season.
- Meanwhile, UK also has begun planning for a \$45 million football office/practice complex that will be built on the south end of the existing Nutter Field House. Construction of that facility is expected to commence following the season, with completion targeted for 2016.

UK REGISTERS NATION'S 2ND-LARGEST ATTENDANCE INCREASE

- The fan response to Coach Mark Stoops and his staff has been encouraging in the year-plus that the new coaches have been on board.
- "Stoops Troops" first responded when a school-record 50,831 turned out for the 2013 Blue/White Spring Game. It was the sixth-largest spring game attendance in the nation and numerous recruits who were there that day noted that the strong turnout played a key role in their eventual decision to sign with Kentucky.
- The 2013 regular season saw a sharp uptick in attendance. Kentucky averaged 59,472 per game in 2013, an increase of 9,781 from the previous season. It was the second-largest increase in the nation.
- Overall, Kentucky ranked 29th in the nation in average attendance per game. UK has ranked in the nation's top 30 in attendance 13 times since the 1999 season.

REMARKABLE RECRUITING

- Undoubtedly, the most amazing facet of Kentucky football since the arrival of Mark Stoops has been the remarkable recruiting done by the coach and his relentless staff.
- This season, Stoops and Co. registered a consensus top-25 recruiting class, which is the highest ranked class in program history. When Stoops was hired at UK in 2012, he inherited a class ranked in the 60s by the national services, but built the class to a top-30 ranking.
- For more on UK's recruiting, and the national media response, see page 5.

SCHEDULE CHANGES

- Three of UK's annual opponents – Louisville, Tennessee and Vanderbilt – will be played at different points in the schedule beginning in 2014. As requested by the SEC and the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Kentucky vs. Louisville game will be moved to the final game of the regular season on an annual basis. The leagues moved the game as a result of adjustments in scheduling brought on by the conference expansions undertaken in both the SEC and ACC.
- The switch of the Kentucky-Louisville game date means that there will be four SEC vs. ACC in-state rivalry matchups on the final weekend of the season. The Florida-Florida State, Georgia-Georgia Tech and South Carolina-Clemson tilts also are on that weekend.
- The UK vs. UofL game had been played early in the schedule since the series was renewed in 1994. For Kentucky, moving the game to the end of the regular season also will require another adjustment. Tennessee has been scheduled as the Wildcats' final foe since 1953 and the Volunteers will now move to Nov. 15, 2014, meaning that UK will close the regular season with a pair of rivalry games.
- One other significant timing change comes with the Vanderbilt game. Having played VU in November every season since 1953, the Wildcats hosted the Commodores on Sept. 27, 2014.

WILLIAMSON TAKEN IN 5TH ROUND BY TITANS

- Kentucky had one player selected in April's National Football League draft, line-

backer Avery Williamson, who was tabbed in the fifth round by the Tennessee Titans. Two other Wildcats signed free-agent contracts. During the last seven years, 48 Wildcats have been drafted or signed as free agents.

Three UK players, defensive end Alvin "Bud" Dupree, running back Braylon Heard and punter Landon Foster, enjoyed an interesting experience in May as the Wildcats traveled to Ethiopia for an educational/service trip. It was the fourth consecutive summer that UK football players made the service trip to Ethiopia. Guided by UK senior associate director of athletics Jason Schlafer, the players visited families, played with children, distributed food and did work projects.

DID YOU KNOW?

- The Kentucky cheerleaders have won an unprecedented 20 national cheerleading championships, including 16 of the last 20, at the annual Universal Cheerleaders Association championships.
- Kentucky is one of only 10 schools that have won an NCAA men's basketball championship while also having a claim on a national championship in football.
- UK is one of only seven universities in the U.S. that have programs in agriculture, engineering, law, medicine and pharmacy on a single campus.

FAMILY TIES AT KENTUCKY

- UK graduate assistant Sam Simpson's father (also named Sam) played football at UK from 1977-79.
- OL Zach Myers is the son of former UK offensive lineman Brad Myers (1984-87). Brad blocked for three of the top rushers in UK history - George Adams, Mark Higgs and Marc Logan.
- There is one set of twins on the team this season in Daron and Zack Blaylock. Daron was a sophomore last season playing in all 12 games, while Zack used a redshirt season in 2013 and is entering his sophomore season of eligibility.

Braylon Heard's first-half touchdown runs of 73 and 43 yards spurred Kentucky to a season-opening, 59-14 rout of Tennessee-Martin.

Quarterback Patrick Towles added a TD passing and running in his first career start for Kentucky, which out-gained the Skyhawks 656-398. The Wildcats' sophomore threw for 377 yards and accounted for 407 yards total offense. Kentucky's tailbacks set the tone by flying through huge holes and scoring virtually untouched, especially Heard, the junior transfer whose TDs were his only carries of the day. The scores propelled Kentucky to a 35-0 halftime lead and the Wildcats never looked back.

True freshman Mikel Horton also scored twice and sophomore Jojo Kemp added a TD run for Kentucky. Linebacker Khalid Henderson returned a third-quarter fumble 89 yards for a score.

UT Martin spoiled Kentucky's bid for its first shutout since September 2009 as Najee Ray and Caylo Weathers scored fourth-quarter TDs on 1-yard run and 15-yard reception, respectively.

By then the Wildcats had already overwhelmed the Skyhawks on both sides of the ball. The Wildcats' 656 yards were their fourth-highest total in a game. Besides the lopsided yardage margin, the UK defense claimed five turnovers, two interceptions and three fumble recoveries. Safety A.J. Stamps, a junior-college transfer in his first UK contest, made a spectacular one-handed interception and a tackle for loss. Stamps and Henderson shared game-high honors with eight tackles each.

Towles was great in his first career start, completing 20 of 29 attempts without an interception and the backfield rushed for 234 yards and ended up showing the scheme's big-play potential. Heard demonstrated that on both TDs, blazing through big holes on consecutive drives to put Kentucky up 21-0 after Kemp started the scoring with a two-yard rush.

True freshman Blake Bone and Horton added touchdowns before halftime to give the Wildcats a 35-0 lead. The Wildcats didn't let off the gas coming out of the locker room as UK forced a fumble on the opening kickoff and Towles rushed in from 23 yards out three plays later to put UK up 42-0.

Freshman kicker Austin MacGinnis nailed a 20-yard field goal later in the third quarter before Henderson's fumble return for a touchdown gave UK a 52-0 lead.

Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles threw for 170 yards and rushed for 59 more to lead the Wildcats to a 20-3 win over Ohio on Saturday at Commonwealth Stadium.

Towles completed 17-of-31 passes and one touchdown and led the Wildcats to their first 2-0 start since 2011. He got the Wildcats off to a fast start with touchdown drives on the first two possessions, including an 8-yard touchdown toss to freshman wide receiver Dorian Baker, followed by a 53-yard scoring burst by freshman running back Stanley "Boom" Williams.

Williams, Jojo Kemp, Josh Clemons and Mikel Horton split time in the backfield in the absence of starter Braylon Heard, who missed the game because of a sprained ankle. Williams led the Wildcats with 60 yards rushing on five carries, including the 53-yard TD. Towles

and the backs combined to rush for 232 yards, UK's second-consecutive game over the 200-yard rushing mark.

Towles had six rushes of 10 yards or more on 22 attempts, including a 16-yard jaunt in the second quarter. Towles made successful completions to four different receivers, with sophomore receiver Ryan Timmons catching 10 passes for 95 yards, both career highs. Baker had two catches for 41 yards, including the touchdown.

Redshirt freshman kicker Austin MacGinnis added a pair of field goals, including a 53-yarder in the second quarter that tied Doug Pelfrey's school record for longest field goal in school history.

Meanwhile, the Kentucky defense kept the visitors out of the end zone as the Wildcats held consecutive opponents scoreless in the first half for the first time since 1988. UK limited Ohio to just 223 total yards. Safety A.J. Stamps was the leading tackler with six stops and he was one of five Wildcats who had a pass breakup. Sophomore defensive end Jason Hatcher had 2.5 tackles for loss.

Ohio avoided the shut out on Josiah Yazdani's 44-yard field goal at the 12:12 mark of the third quarter.

Matt Jones' 1-yard touchdown plunge in the third overtime gave Florida a 36-30 home victory over Kentucky, ending one of the most exciting games in series history.

After Kentucky missed a field goal to begin the third frame, Jones followed with three runs that put Florida at the 1 and then slammed through the line on second down for the game-winner.

Overtime began with UK's Stanley "Boom" Williams taking a short pass, reversing field, and outrunning several tacklers to score from 25 yards out. Florida countered when Jeff Driskel hit Demarcus Robinson in the corner of the endzone on 4th-and-7 from the UK 9-yard line. The teams exchanged field goals in the second overtime.

The game began with a defensive struggle and was tied at 3-3 at halftime, Kentucky's third-consecutive game

without allowing a touchdown in the first half. A third-quarter offensive explosion saw both teams score two touchdowns, including Wildcat freshman wide receiver Garrett Johnson hauling in TD tosses of 60 and 33 yards from Patrick Towles. Johnson finished the game with six catches for 154 yards, a UK freshman record. Towles completed 24-of-45 passes for 369 yards and three touchdowns.

Kentucky kicker Austin MacGinnis, who made three field goals in the game, hit a clutch 51-yarder with 3:52 left in the game to deadlock it at 20-20. Florida missed a 52-yarder on the final play of regulation to put it to extra time.

Florida was led by Driskel, who threw for 295 yards and three touchdowns. Robinson caught 15 passes for 216 yards and two scores, while Jones had a game-high 156 rushing yards.

A stifling defensive effort limited Vanderbilt to 139 yards of total offense and propelled Kentucky to a 17-7 win on a perfect Saturday afternoon in front of a season-best 56,940 at Commonwealth Stadium.

Kentucky posted its first league win in the head coach Mark Stoops era, while showcasing a dominating defense that handcuffed Vanderbilt into just 85 passing and 54 rushing yards. In holding Vandy to just 139 yards, it marked the fewest yards allowed by UK in an SEC game since holding the Commodores to 91 yards in 1996.

The Wildcats jumped out to the lead on a 20-yard pass from UK sophomore quarterback Patrick Towles to wide receiver Ryan Timmons, completing a 13-play, 99-yard drive. Towles was 9-for-9 on the drive, connecting with eight different receivers.

The 'Dores evened the game on a 13-yard interception return for a touchdown by Darius Sims in the second quarter. UK answered immediately on the strength of a 44-yard field goal from freshman Austin MacGinnis, completing an 11-play, 47-yard drive. UK stretched the lead to the final margin with a 66-yard drive that concluded with Towles plunging in on third and one with eight seconds remaining in the first half. It improved UK's stretch of outscoring foes in the first half through four games to 72-10, with the UK defense not allowing a touchdown on the campaign.

With the Commodores facing a 10-point hole after intermission, UK's defense went to work, picking off three passes in the fourth quarter to clinch the conference win for UK, improving the Wildcats to 3-0 at home in 2014.

UK's defense totaled three interceptions and six pass breakups, charting four sacks and forcing VU quarterback Wade Freebeck into an 8-for-25 game. UK's front seven was paced by 1.5 sacks from senior defensive end Alvin "Bud" Dupree, with Ashley Lowery, Marcus McWilson and A.J. Stamps each recording interceptions. The interception for McWilson, a sophomore safety, marked his first career pick.

A native of Ft. Thomas, Ky., Towles was 23-for-30 from the air for 201 yards, notching rushing and receiving touchdowns. Senior Javess Blue hauled in a game-high four catches, collecting 35 yards. Timmons, who notched his third career touchdown and his first of the year, finished with three catches for 34 yards.

On the ground, junior Braylon Heard rushed a career-best 15 times for 64 yards, with sophomore Jojo Kemp totaling 60 yards on eight carries. Freshman Mikel Horton rushed six times for 31 yards, with freshman Stanley Williams charting 27 rushing yards on five carries, 39 yards on three catches and 56 yards on two kick returns.

KENTUCKY 45, SOUTH CAROLINA 38

Alvin "Bud" Dupree's six-yard interception return for a touchdown with 2:29 remaining capped the biggest fourth-quarter comeback win in school history, a 45-38 victory over South Carolina at Commonwealth Stadium.

In front of 62,135, Patrick Towles threw for 208 yards and a touchdown and Jojo Kemp had 131 yards rushing and three scores - most of them out of the Wildcat formation - to lead the Wildcats to their second consecutive Southeastern Conference victory. Kentucky improved to 4-1 and 2-1 in league play, while South Carolina fell to 3-3 and 2-2 in the SEC.

Kentucky found itself down by two scores twice, but continued to battle back. Trailing 38-24 early in the fourth quarter, UK tallied 21 unanswered points that was the game changer. UK's offense found the end zone on consecutive drives, both Kemp touchdown runs, to tie

the game at 38-38.

It was on South Carolina's possession after Kentucky tied the game that the UK defense made its biggest statement yet. With the Gamecocks on their own 20-yard line, defensive tackle Mike Douglas tipped a pass which Dupree gathered at the six-yard line and the senior went untouched into the end zone for the game-winning touchdown. The Kentucky defense followed with another crucial stop, an Ashely Lowery interception on UK's 30-yard line with just over 1:30 to play that all but sealed the Wildcats victory.

South Carolina scored the first 14 points of the game, with touchdowns on its first two possessions. A Mike Davis one-yard run capped a 19-play, 79-yard drive to open the night to give the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead. After Kentucky punted on its next possession, Davis scored from two yards out to end a 72-yard drive 18 seconds into the second quarter.

Kemp rushed in on UK's following drive to cut the lead in half and after a SC field goal made it 17-7, UK's Braylon Heard scored and A.J. Stamps had a key interception late in the half to set up a 47-yard field goal to tie the game 17-17 at the break.

Led by a strong defensive effort that included two interceptions returned for touchdowns, the Kentucky football team scored 45 unanswered points to defeat ULM, 48-14, at Commonwealth Stadium.

UK overcame a slow start to eclipse at least 45 points for the third time in 2014, the most since 2010. All but three of those points came after Kentucky spotted ULM a 14-3 advantage in the first quarter.

The UK defense, which had two interceptions returned for touchdowns in a game for the first time since 1986, held the Warhawks to 187 yards passing and just 77 yards on the ground. ULM was forced to punt eight times and fumbled five times, one which Kentucky recovered.

Kentucky entered the second quarter trailing 14-3, but after the UK defense forced ULM to punt with less than 10 minutes remaining in the quarter the Wildcats quickly began to cut away at the deficit. Patrick Towles hit Javess Blue for an 83-yard touchdown pass, the longest play of the season for Kentucky, to bring UK within four.

On the next ULM possession, linebacker Josh Forrest returned an interception 29 yards to give UK a 17-14 lead. Following Forrest's pick-six that resulted in the go-ahead score, the UK defense forced ULM into a three-and-out, and six plays later, Blake Bone caught a four-yard touchdown pass from Towles to give UK a 24-14 half-time lead.

UK scored three consecutive touchdowns in the third quarter -- Blue made a spectacular one-handed 21-yard grab from Towles; safety Marcus McWilson had a 36-yard interception return for a TD; and Stanley "Boom" Williams raced 58 yards for a score, part of his career-high 104 rushing yards. The TDs by Forrest and McWilson marked the first time since 2008 that UK returned two turnovers for touchdowns in one game, while the four defensive touchdowns are the most in one season since 2008.
