5 #RAZORFACTS

- Junior RB Jonathan Williams topped 2,000 rushing yards for his career in the Mississippi State game. With 2,008 yards, Williams ranks 16th all-time in school history.
- Senior DE Trey Flowers is third in school history with 41.5 TFL. He needs just five more to move into second place all time.
- RBs Jonathan Williams and Alex Collins need just 133 and 160 yards respectively to top the 1,000-yard mark this season.
- Five of Arkansas' nine opponents this season have been ranked in the Top 10 at the time of the contest.
- Arkansas will play the toughest schedule in the nation in 2014 according to the NCAA's strength of schedule method, with its opponents combining for a 103-54 (.656) record in 2013.

STORY LINES

- Arkansas and LSU rekindle the Battle for the Boot rivalry in Fayetteville. The 2014 meeting marks just the third time the rivalry has been played on Arkansas' campus, with the Razorbacks taking the 1992 (30-6) matchup and LSU winning the 2012 (20-13) affair. The two programs have met in Little Rock nine times since Arkansas joined the SEC in 1992.
- Arkansas faces off against #20 LSU in a school-record seventh consecutive SEC game against a ranked opponent, dating back to the LSU contest last year. It is the first time that Arkansas has played a conference game against a team not ranked in the Top 10 this season, snapping a streak of five straight SEC games against Top 10 teams.
- Nov. 15 marks the earliest date the Battle for the Boot has been played since Arkansas joined the SEC.
- Arkansas is the only team in the nation with two players to rush for 800-plus yards. Junior Jonathan Williams ranks fourth in the SEC with 877 yards while sophomore Alex Collins ranks sixth with 840 rushing yards.
- Bret Bielema is 15-10 (.600) in his head coaching career in the month of November.

ARKANSAS NEWS AND NOTES

THE RAZORBACKS

- Arkansas has already played five Top 10 teams and outgained its opponent in six of nine games this season by an average of 86.8 yards per game.

- Arkansas is keeping the ball away from the opponent's offense, posting time of possession of 34:00 or greater in each of the past seven games. The Razorbacks now rank first in the SEC and fourth nationally with an average TOP of 34:15 per game. Against Texas Tech, the Razorbacks possessed the ball for the final 9:01 to seal the non-conference road win.
- The Razorbacks have started quickly this season, scoring on five of its nine game-opening drives. Arkansas has scored on three of its five game-opening drives against SEC opponents. The Razorbacks opened games against Texas A&M and Georgia with touchdowns and kicked a field goal in their first drive at Mississippi State.
- The Arkansas defense has made great strides in the first nine games of the 2014 season compared to the first nine games in 2013:

- Remaining disciplined has been a staple of Bielema's coaching career. In each of the past five years, Bielema-coached teams have ranked in the Top 30 nationally in fewest penalties per game. The 2014 Razorbacks also rank in the Top 30 nationally in the category.

- As a former walk-on himself, Bret Bielema has made it a priority to build the walk-on program at Arkansas. The Razorbacks currently have eight players that began their careers as walk-ons and earned scholarships from Bielema, including FB Patrick Arinze, SNP Alan D'Appollonio, OG Adam Deacon, TE A.J. Derby, K John Henson, DL Mitchell Loewen, WR Scotty Thurman and TE Alex Voelzke.

- During fall camp, the football student-athletes elected four teammates to serve as captains for the 2014 season. This year's captains are junior QB Brandon Allen, senior OT Brey Cook, senior DE Trey Flowers and senior S Alan Turner.

QUARTERBACKS

- Brandon Allen set career highs with 296 passing yards and 28 completions against Georgia. The junior signal caller has topped 200 yards in four consecutive games for the first time in his career and has now thrown for 199-plus yards in his past six games.
- Allen's four consecutive 200-plus passing games marked the first time an Arkansas quarterback has tossed for over 200 passing yards in four consecutive games since Tyler Wilson threw for 200-plus in five consecutive games to close the 2012 season.
- Allen has completed 50 percent of his passes or better in his last 12 consecutive games. If the season ended today, his 57.8 completion rate would rank 11th in single-season school history.
- Of Arkansas' 150 completions, 93 of them have gone for a first down or TD (62.0 percent).
- Facing the nation's second-best rush defense against Alabama, the Razorbacks turned to Brandon Allen and the passing game. Allen passed for 246 yards including a 54-yard touchdown to TE AJ Derby. The touchdown pass was the longest of Allen's career.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- When rushing on third down, Arkansas converts 61 percent of the time. The Razorbacks boast a 76 percent conversion rate when rushing on a third and short situation.
- The massive Arkansas starting offensive line totals 1,642 pounds. At 328.4 pounds per player, the Razorback bigs are larger than any NFL starting offensive line in Week 7.

- Arkansas has given up 10 sacks this season, tied for 16th nationally and third in the SEC.
- The Razorbacks have one of the largest offensive lines in the nation, spearheaded by 6'10" left tackle Dan Skipper. Skipper is the second tallest player in FBS this season.

- This season, Arkansas leads the SEC in runs of 70+ yards (3), 80+ yards (3) and 90+ yards (1). The Razorbacks lead the nation in runs of 80+ and 90+ yards.

RUNNING BACKS

- Jonathan Williams (10) and Alex Collins (10) are tied for the fourth-most rushing TDs in the SEC and have already set career highs in the category. The 10 rushing TDs each by the duo are the most by a Razorback since Knile Davis (13) in 2010.
- Collins' tenth trip to the end zone against MSU marked the first time two Arkansas running backs have collected 10-plus rushing TDs since 2007 when Darren McFadden collected 16 and Felix Jones tallied 11.
- Through nine games, the Razorbacks are tied for 10th in the FBS with 27 rushing TDs – 13 more than they had in all of 2013 and the most rushing TDs in a single season since 2007 (33 TDs).
- Arkansas is the only team in the nation with two RBs to score 10 or more rushing TDs – Williams (10) and Collins (10).
- Williams has rushed for a 10-plus yard gain in 16 consecutive games and has rushed for a TD in seven of nine games this season.
- The Arkansas rushing attack has tremendous balance. Under Coach Bielema, Williams and Collins have both lead the Razorbacks in rushing 10 times a piece.

- Jonathan Williams rushed for 145 yards and 4 TDs at Texas Tech. The 4 TDs were the most rushing TDs by a Razorback since Darren McFadden rushed for 4 TDs against FIU in 2007.
- Alex Collins ran for a career-high 212 yards and 2 TDs in the 49-28 win at Texas Tech. It was the 9th-best single-season rushing total in school history and most since Darren McFadden's 321 yard performance vs. S. Carolina in 2007.



ARKANSAS NEWS AND NOTES

- Kody Walker rushed for a 5-yard TD against UAB for his first score since the season-opener in 2012 against Jacksonville State. Walker's score marked the first time three Razorback RBs have scored in the same game since the Jacksonville State game in 2012.

WIDE RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

- Junior Keon Hatcher leads the team with 32 receptions for 410 yards (12.8 avg) and three TDs. He has caught a pass and converted a first down in 13 consecutive games.
- Twenty of Hatcher's 32 receptions (62.5 percent) have gone for first downs. Earlier this season he set a career high with 107 receiving yards in the win against Northern Illinois.
- Arkansas has completed passes to 16 different receivers this season and 10 different players have caught TDs. The Razorbacks completed passes to 13 different targets in 2013.
- Sophomore tight end Hunter Henry has been targeted 16 times on third downs this season and has converted 12 of those 16 targets for first downs.
- Against top-ranked Mississippi State, Henry was the go-to target on fourth downs. Allen went to Henry twice in the situation, including a fourth and 15 play that resulted in a 36-yard reception for Henry that kept alive the Razorbacks' final drive of the game.
- Derby caught a 54-yard TD against Alabama. It was the longest reception of Derby's career, longest pass of Allen's career, and longest Razorback pass since 2012 against Kentucky.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- Ted Hendricks Award candidate and preseason All-SEC first team honoree Trey Flowers has 14.0 career sacks, tying him for third among the SEC's active career leaders and ranking him 12th on the school's all-time career sacks list.

- Ted Hendricks Award candidate and preseason All-SEC first team honoree Trey Flowers is tied for the team lead with 9.5 TFL this season, giving him 41.5 TFL for his career. The senior is the active career leader in the SEC and ranks third on Arkansas' all-time career TFL charts.

- All-SEC candidate Darius Philon is tied for sixth in the SEC and leads all SEC defensive tackles with 9.5 TFL.
- Taiwan Johnson and Philon rank third and fourth respectively in sacks among all SEC defensive tackles. The two have combined for six of Arkansas' 13 sacks on the season (3.5 from Johnson, 2.5 from Philon).

LINEBACKERS

- In Martrell Spaight's second season in Fayetteville, the senior leads the team and ranks second in the SEC with 9.7 tackles per game (87 total, 42 solo).
- Sophomore Brooks Ellis ranks second on the team with 51 tackles. His four pass breakups are the most among any linebacker on the team.
- With less than a minute remaining in the first half of Arkansas' contest against Mississippi State, Ellis tallied his first-career interception, returning it 27 yards to the Bulldogs' 42-yard line.
- Ellis started ten consecutive games before missing the Georgia and UAB contests due to injury. The Fayetteville, Ark. native has recorded three or more tackles in 11 career starts.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- All-Freshman candidate Henre' Toliver drew the assignment of covering Heisman-candidate WR Amari Cooper in the Alabama game. Toliver and the Razorback defense held the wideout to just two catches for 22 yards. Cooper ranks second nationally with 135.0 receiving yards per game and third with 8.8 receptions per game.
- Senior captain Alan Turner has started 21 consecutive games, the most of any Razorback.
- In Arkansas' matchup at Mississippi State, Turner picked-off Heisman candidate QB Dak Prescott just three plays into the Bulldogs' game-opening drive. The interception was Turner's first of the season and fourth of his career.
- Senior Tevin Mitchel has manned the nickel spot for the Razorbacks and leads the team with eight passes defended. He recorded his first interception of the season in the win against UAB.
- Jared Collins was tested early against UAB with Toliver out due to injury. The sophomore responded with two tackles for loss on the first possession. He finished with four tackles, three for loss, a pass breakup and a sack in his best game of the season.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Razorbacks have the ninth-best kickoff return unit in the nation, averaging 25.20 yards per return. Speedster Korliss Marshall took the opening kickoff 97 yards for a TD against NIU.
- Sebastian Tretola earned the No. 2 spot on Sportscenter's Top 10 Plays on Oct. 25 after he threw a TD pass to long snapper Alan D'Appollonio against UAB. On the play, Arkansas lined up in a field goal formation and shifted. The 350-pound Tretola motioned into the QB position, rolled right and delivered a 6-yard TD pass to D'Appollonio.
- Punter Sam Irwin-Hill had his best collegiate game against Texas A&M when the Australian rushed for a 51-yard TD on a fake punt towards the end of the first half. Irwin-Hill also punted seven times for 304 yards (43.4 avg.). None of his seven punts were returned for positive yardage giving him a net average of 43.6.

COACHING STAFF

- Bielema and his assistants have combined for 4 nat'l championships, 29 conference championships, 210 all-conference honorees, 33 All-Americans, 27 major award winners and 157 NFL Draft picks, including 27 1st-rounders.
- The coaching staff is a collection of renowned recruiters and highly respected teachers with a combined 181 years of coaching experience.

ABOUT THE 2014 SCHEDULE

- Arkansas plays nine opponents who received votes in the preseason AP Top 25 poll - tied with Tennessee for the most of any team in the country.
- The most Top 25 opponents Arkansas has ever played in a season is seven, when the Razorbacks went 3-4 against ranked foes in 2006.
- Arkansas picks up a new permanent crossover opponent for the 2014 season as Missouri replaces South Carolina, which had been the Razorbacks' permanent Eastern Division foe since both schools joined the SEC in 1992.

THE NATIONAL TITLE IN 64

The 2014 season marks the 50th anniversary of the proudest moment in Arkansas Razorback football history as the 1964 squad was the only undefeated team in the nation with an 11-0 record and won the National Championship given by the Football Writers Association of America and the Helms Athletic Foundation.

ALS ICE BUCKET CHALLENGE HITS CLOSE TO HOME

Junior offensive lineman Adam Deacon has Arkansas football in his blood. His older brother Tyler was a walk-on for the Razorbacks and earned himself a scholarship and a starting spot along the offensive line before his career was over. Adam also walked onto the team and has spent the past three seasons on the scout team. The Deacons tragically lost their mother, Leanne, to ALS in March of 2013. As the ALS Ice Bucket Challenge took the nation by storm this summer, Coach Bielema had an idea. He asked Adam to speak to the team about the debilitating disease at a team meeting. After Adam finished his speech, Coach Bielema asked the team to participate in the ALS Ice Bucket Challenge with him and donate money to the Arkansas chapter of the ALS Association. As Adam started heading back to his seat, Coach Bielema made another announcement - that Adam was being placed on scholarship. The next day, Adam said "it honestly brought tears to my eyes. I was so happy." All 105 student-athletes in fall camp donated to the cause and Coach Bielema matched it, bringing the collective donation to nearly \$3,000.

RAZORBACKS NAMED "RUNNING BACK U" FOR THE 2000'S BY ESPN.COM

This summer, ESPN.com announced that Arkansas was named "Running Back U" for the 2000's, edging out Oklahoma for the honor. The Hogs had six running backs drafted in the 2000's, including the Darren McFadden, Felix Jones and Peyton Hillis trio that shared the same backfield from 2005-07. McFadden won the Doak Walker Award in both 2006 and 2007, earning consensus All-American honors both seasons. In 2007, McFadden won the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award. But it wasn't just a three-year span where Arkansas running backs dominated. Fred Talley earned All-SEC first team honors in 2002 and Cedric Cobbs followed suit, being named All-SEC first team in 2003. Klnie Davis was a third-round selection in the 2013 NFL Draft and Kiero Small was chosen in the 2014 NFL Draft. Current running backs Jonathan Williams, Alex Collins and Korliss Marshall could add to the lengthy list of award-winners in 2014.

GEOGRAPHICALLY RECRUITING

The Arkansas coaching staff has done an excellent job of bringing in student-athletes from the recruiting hotbed of South Florida. The Razorbacks have nine players from Miami-Dade or Broward counties, the same amount as Florida, and more than every other school in the SEC.

5) We Earn Everything

HOGANESE

This offseason Coach Bielema and his coaching staff created a new language. Simply dubbed "Hoganese," the Razorbacks have taught themselves a language that helps them better communicate on the field. Hoganese uses words in the English language but changes their meaning. For instance, the word "rose" means a flower or a woman's name in English, but in Hoganese rose means a play-action pass. Coach Bielema says "Hoganese is a language and a verbage and a way of communicating that's unique to the Hogs." Hoganese will help the Razorbacks communicate more effectively during the game. The goal is to simplify communication from coaches to players and from players to players in a short amount of time, without letting the opponent know what's coming.

Cobi Hamilton hauled in 10 passes for a team-high 98 yards.
Nov. 25, 2011 (Baton Rouge, La.) - No. 1 LSU 41, No. 3 Arkansas 17: In a battle of top-three teams, Arkansas jumped out to a quick 14-0 lead on the road. The Razorbacks finished with 254 yards of total offense, led by quarterback Tyler Wilson's 207 yards passing and one touchdown. Alonzo Highsmith also scored on a 47-yard fumble recovery for the Hogs.

- Nov. 27, 2010 (Little Rock, Ark.) - No. 12 Arkansas 31, No. 6 LSU 23: The Razorbacks had two scoring plays of over 80 yards as the Hogs outgained the Tigers 464-294. Ryan Mallett connected with Cobi Hamilton for touchdown passes of 85 and 80 yards, both coming in the second quarter. Mallett finished the day throwing for 320 yards and three touchdowns on just 13 completions. Cobi Hamilton caught three passes for 164 yards and two touchdowns. Knile Davis gashed the Tiger defense for 152 yards and a touchdown on 30 carries. A late fourth-quarter LSU field goal cut the Razorback lead down to eight, but the Razorbacks recovered the ensuing onside kick to seal the win.
Nov. 28, 2009 (Baton Rouge, La.) - No. 17 LSU 33, Arkansas 30 (OT): The Razorbacks took a late, three-point lead in the fourth quarter after Ryan Mallett found Joe Adams in the endzone for a 14-yard touchdown leaving just 1:18 left on the clock. In overtime, the Tigers kicked a 36-yard field goal on the first possession and Arkansas missed their field goal try, giving LSU the win. On Dec. 4, 2012 the University of Arkansas captivated the college football world by naming Bret Bielema the 32nd head coach in Razorback history. Bielema, who had spent seven years at Wisconsin, represented the qualities Arkansas was looking for: a leader of young men who holds student-athletes academically responsible and a coach who has a proven record of winning championships.

Bielema came to Fayetteville after leading the Badgers to three straight Rose Bowls by winning three consecutive Big Ten titles. Entering the 2014 season, Bielema owns a 71-33 (.683) career record as a head coach built behind strong offense, stifling defense and all-around disciplined play.

He made an immediate impact in the classroom as the team posted its highest GPA ever for a fall semester in 2013. The Athletic Department Honor Roll featured 31 of his student-athletes, while 28 were on the SEC honor roll, 10 made the AD list with a GPA of 3.5-3.99, 11 graduated in the fall of 2013, and 43 finished with a GPA of 3.0 or higher in the fall of 2013. When he arrived in Fayetteville, 32 student-athletes had GPAs below a 2.0. Today, every football student-athlete has a 2.0 GPA or higher.

On the field, the future is bright as five players were named Freshmen All-Americans in 2013; running back Alex Collins, offensive linemen Denver Kirkland and Dan Skipper, tight end Hunter Henry and defensive tackle Darius Philon. Collins was named the SEC Freshman of the Year after he became the second Razorback freshman to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season. Collins and Darren McFadden are the only two to do so in school history and the only two Razorbacks to be named SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2012, Bielema guided Wisconsin to its third straight Big Ten championship and the Badgers became the first team to represent the Big Ten in three straight Rose Bowls since Michigan qualified following the 1976-78 seasons. In his final game as Wisconsin head coach, Bielema led the Badgers to a 70-31 win over No. 14 Nebraska in the Big Ten Championship Game. Wisconsin became the second team to score 70 points in a conference championship game, matching the number scored by Texas in the 2005 Big 12 Championship Game. Wisconsin also had two 200-yard rushers in the same game for the first time in school history.

Also during the 2012 season, running back Montee Ball broke the NCAA career records for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns. Ball scored 82 total touchdowns, breaking the previous record of 78, and 76 rushing touchdowns, besting the old record of 73. As a team, the Badgers ranked in the top 25 in the country in rushing offense, total defense, scoring

defense, rushing defense, pass efficiency defense and pass defense.

In Bielema's eight seasons as at Wisconsin, he had 17 players earn All-America honors, including 11 first-team All-Americans. He also coached two Outland Trophy winners, one Doak Walker Award recipient, one winner of the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and one Lott IMPACT Trophy winner as well as finalists for numerous other individual awards, including the Heisman Trophy. In his last six years, 21 Badgers were taken in the NFL Draft, including three in the first round.

Bielema lettered from 1989-92 at Iowa after joining the program as a walk-on. He earned a scholarship after his first year and was a member of Iowa's 1990 Big Ten championship team. A starter as a junior in 1991, he was a team co-captain as a senior. Bielema signed a free agent contract with the Seattle Seahawks and later completed his playing career with the Milwaukee Mustangs of the Arena Football League.

A 1992 graduate of Iowa with a degree in marketing, Bielema married the former Jen Hielsberg on March 10, 2012.

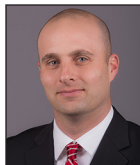

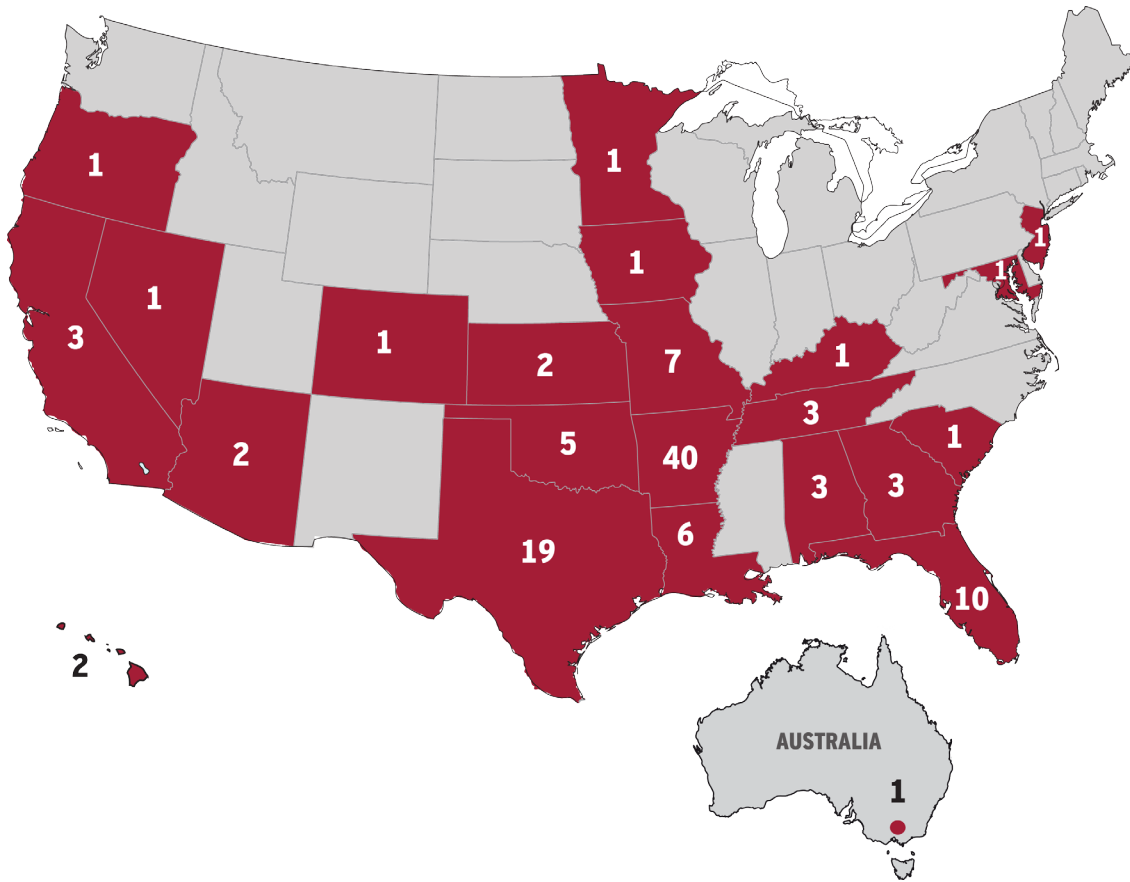

BATTLE FOR THE BOOT

THE COACHES

- Bret Bielema is coaching in his second Battle for the Boot and holds a 0–1 record in the game.
- Bielema is 10–4 (.714) in regular season rivalry trophy games in his head coaching career. Coach Bielema was 7–0 competing against Minnesota for Paul Bunyan’s Axe and 3–2 against Iowa with the Hartland Trophy on the line. At Arkansas, he is 0–1 against Texas A&M in the Southwest Classic and 0–1 against LSU in the Battle for the Boot.
- LSU head coach Les Miles is 6–3 all-time in the Battle for the Boot.

THE HISTORY OF THE BOOT

- Saturday’s contest will mark the 19th consecutive season that Arkansas and LSU have met in the Battle for the Boot. LSU has won 12 of the 18 previous iterations of the rivalry game.
- On Nov. 27, 1996 at the initial press conference at the Arkansas State Capital announcing the Battle for the Boot, Governor Mike Huckabee represented Arkansas and since Louisiana Governor Mike Foster could not attend, Lt. Gov. Kathleen Blanco represented LSU. Blanco went on to serve as the Governor of Louisiana.
- The home team has won 13 of the 18 previous Battles for the Boot.
- Since the first Battle for the Boot in 1996, the winner has won or shared the SEC West division title 44 percent of the time (8 of 14 years).

WHY THE BATTLE FOR THE BOOT?

LSU and Arkansas don’t have the longtime rivalry or trophy game that other SEC teams have, such as Alabama–Auburn, Ole Miss–Mississippi State, Florida–Florida State, Tennessee–Florida, Tennessee–Alabama, South Carolina–Clemson, Georgia–Georgia Tech and Georgia–Florida. The lack of an annual rival or trophy game for Arkansas–LSU, their location geographically, the intensity of each team’s zealous fans and the expectation that both will hopefully be challenging for the SEC West annually, make this game a good spot for a trophy matchup regardless of records or standing.

THE TROPHY

Some trophy games have been around for many decades and their trophy value is founded in a long history and sometimes the oddness of the trophy itself. Since the Arkansas–LSU trophy game was going to be a new one, the best way to create value and significance is to make it more unique than any other trophy. The “Boot” is made of 24–karat gold and is one of the most expensive trophies in all of college football. It weighs 175 pounds and requires teamwork to carry it off the field.

WHY ARKANSAS AND LSU?

Beside the fact mentioned above, LSU and Arkansas do you have some similar football background. Both the Tigers and Razorbacks have had a rich and storied football history over the past 100 years. From national championships for the Tigers in 1958 and the Razorbacks in 1964, to “The Great Runs” of Billy Cannon against Ole Miss and Ken Hatfield vs. Texas, both schools have great gridiron legacies. Since their first matchup in 1901, some of those legacies were created when the two teams played each other. The 1946 Cotton Bowl that ended in a 0–0 tie and is remembered by many as the “Ice Bowl”, featured such great players as Y.A. Tittle for LSU and Clyde “Smackover” Scott for Arkansas. The 1966 Cotton Bowl was the scene of a stunning upset as the 7–3 Tigers defeated the second ranked and 10–0 Hogs 14–7. Besides the great game history between LSU and Arkansas, both states even have a football connection off the field as LSU’s first Bengal Tiger mascot, Mike I, was purchased by the student body from the Little Rock Zoo in 1937.

ON THIS DATE

- Arkansas owns a 10–6 record in games played on Nov. 15, including a 7–5 mark in games played in the state of Arkansas. The Razorbacks have won six of its past seven games played on Nov. 15.
