

## **LSU Softball Postgame Notes – Women’s College World Series**

**No. 8 LSU vs. No. 5 Alabama – May 30, 2015**

**Oklahoma City, Oklahoma (ASA Hall of Fame Stadium – OGE Energy Field)**

### **Team Notes**

- LSU is making its fourth appearance at the Women’s College World Series. The last time the Tigers qualified for the WCWS was in 2012 during head coach Beth Torina’s first season in addition to 2001 and 2004 seasons under NFCA Hall of Fame coach Yvette Girouard.
- LSU moved its record to 8-7 in WCWS games and to 57-35 in NCAA Tournament games with tonight’s 5-3 victory over Alabama. The Tigers take on No. 3 Michigan Sunday at 2:30 p.m. televised by ESPN.
- LSU and Alabama met for the first time on the season, and the two programs have met during all 19 seasons. The Tigers are now 39-32 all-time against the Crimson Tide.
- LSU improved to 21-12 versus Top 25 opponents on the season. The 21 wins over Top 25 foes are a program record. The 2004 team compiled a 20-11 mark.
- LSU has won 28 of 31 games when scoring in the first inning this season. The Tigers erased a 1-0 deficit with five straight runs over the first and second innings.
- All four of LSU’s RBIs during tonight’s game came with two outs. In fact, all nine of LSU’s RBIs in the WCWS have come with two outs.

### **Individual Notes**

- Bailey Landry extended her hitting streak to 10 games. She is the only player to hit safely in all 10 of LSU’s NCAA Tournament games this season.
- With two hits, Landry garnered her 25th multi-hit game of the season which is tied with Bianka Bell for the team lead. The 25 multi-hit efforts are tied for sixth place on LSU’s single season list.
- Landry secured her 14th multi-hit RBI game with a two-run single in the second inning. The 14 multi-RBI performances are tied for seventh place in the LSU record book for a single season.
- Landry’s 88 hits are good enough for third place on LSU’s single-season list. She is one hit shy of tying former All-American Kirsten Shortridge (2010) for the No. 2 spot.
- Sahvanna Jaquish drove home her team-leading 76th RBI of the season with a single during the first inning. She has collected a RBI in five of LSU’s 10 NCAA Tournament games.
- Allie Walljasper made her WCWS debut and went six-plus innings to improve to 16-5 on the season. She was touched up for three runs on six hits.
- Carley Hoover collected her fifth save of the season. The five saves tied a LSU single-season mark previously held by Rachele Fico who also tallied five saves during the 2010 season.
