LSU Opens Year No. 11 Under Les Miles as Tigers Welcome McNeese To Tiger Stadium

LSU begins its 11th year under **Les Miles** on Saturday when the No. 13/14 Tigers host in-state opponent McNeese State at 6:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised nationally on SEC Network-alternate channel with Adam Amin (pxp), Kelly Stouffer (analyst) and Olivia Harlan (sideline) on the call. LSU enters the year ranked in the Top 25 for the 15th straight season and the Tigers go into 2015 riding a streak of 15 consecutive years of making a bowl appearance and winning at least eight games. LSU posted an 8-5 mark a year ago and played in the Music City Bowl. McNeese State is coming off a 6-5 mark a year ago as injuries decimated a Cowboy team that lost in the final seconds to Nebraska in the 2014 season opener. It will be just the second meeting between LSU and McNeese, the other coming in 2010 when the Tigers beat the Cowboys, 32-10, in Tiger Stadium. Miles brings a 103-29 mark with the Tigers into the game, making him the second-winningest coach in school history. Overall, Miles is 131-49 in 14 seasons as a head coach (10 at LSU, 4 at Oklahoma State). LSU returns 14 starters on offense (8) and defense (6) as well as all of its specialists from a year ago. Leading the way on offense for the Tigers is **Leonard Fournette**, who set an LSU freshman record with 1,034 rushing yards a year ago. LSU also returns two quarterbacks with 14 combined starts in junior **Anthony Jennings** and sophomore **Brandon Harris**. Jennings is 9-4 as a starter, and Harris is 0-1. Defensively, the Tigers will be dominant up the middle as LSU returns its two starting defensive tackles in **Christian LaCouture** (40 tackles, 2.5 sacks in 2014) and **Davon Godchaux** (42 tackles, 1.5 TFL in 2014), along with mike linebacker **Kendell Beckwith** (77 tackles in 2014) and safety **Jamal Adams** (66 tackles, 5.0 TFL in 2014). The Tigers return all starting specialists, including senior punter **Jamie Keehn** who enters his third season as a starter and junior **Colby Delahoussaye** who has served as LSU's starting placekicker since 2013.

TALKING POINTS

- LSU has won a school-record 12 straight season-openers heading into the McNeese State contest. LSU hasn't lost a season-opener since a 26-8 setback to Virginia Tech in 2002. The Virginia Tech loss is also the last time the Tigers dropped a non-conference regular-season game. **Les Miles** is 10-0 in season-openers at LSU.
- LSU currently has the nation's longest regular-season non-conference winning streak at 49 straight games. **Les Miles** is 39-0 in non-conference regular-season games as head coach of the Tigers.
- LSU has also won 43 consecutive games against non-SEC teams in Tiger Stadium, a streak that dates back to the 2001 season. **Les Miles** is 31-0 against non-conference teams in Death Valley.
- LSU's last non-conference home loss came against UAB in 2000 by a 13-10 margin.
- LSU enters the year ranked for the 15th straight season dating back to 2001. LSU has played 127 of its 132 games under Miles ranked in the Top 25. LSU is 98-28 in those games.
- Including tight end **Dillon Gordon**, LSU's offensive line has combined to start 98 games for LSU. Senior RT **Vadal Alexander** leads the way with 34 starts (25 at LG, 9 at RT), followed by LT **Jerald Hawkins** with 26 (25 at RT, 1 at LT). Others include Gordon with 25 (all at TE), and **Ethan Pocic** with 13 (8 at RG, 5 at C).
- LSU has never shied away from playing true freshmen. Under **Les Miles**, 100 true freshmen have seen the field for the Tigers, including 17 in 2014 and 14 in 2013. Of the players on LSU's depth chart for the McNeese game, 36 of them played as a true freshman.
- The Tigers go into 2015 as the winningest program in the SEC over the past 10 years with 103 victories. LSU is also No. 4 nationally in wins since 2005 as the Tigers rank behind only Boise State (113), Ohio State (109) and Oregon (105).
- LSU is 35-4 under **Les Miles** in the month of September. The Tigers went undefeated in the month of September in six straight seasons from 2007-12.

Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • 11TH SEASON

It's called the "Miles Method" and it's the mission of LSU football program under 11th-year head coach Les Miles. The "Miles Method" lays the foundation for the organization and it calls for LSU to run the finest football program in the country, one where players can have an experience that's second to none and gives them every opportunity to compete for championships on the field, earn a degree and grow personally by giving back to the community.

In his 11th year, the "Miles Method" has proved to be a winning formula as the Tigers have won more games than any program in the Southeastern Conference over that span (103), while capturing a pair of SEC titles (2007, 2011), played in 10 bowl games, including the BCS National Championship Game twice. LSU won the BCS title in 2007, a year after beating Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl.

Since Miles took over in 2005, LSU has registered five top 10 finishes with three coming in the top five, won double-figure games seven times, produced 20 first-team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. LSU also leads the SEC with 64 NFL Draft picks during that span, which includes 13 first round selections. LSU led the nation with nine NFL Draft picks in 2014, which tied the school record set in 2013.

Miles has climbed to second in school history in career victories with 103, trailing only Charles McClendon, who won 137 games in 18 years with the Tigers. Miles is also

the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it now three times - and in 2005, he became the only first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's title game.

In the classroom, 224 football players have earned their degree since Miles took over. Under Miles, LSU has produced over 150 players who have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status.

LSU's community service presence is impactful as football players routinely donate time giving back to the Baton Rouge area through a variety of avenues, including appearances at schools, hospitals and many other charitable causes. It's through these community service ventures that Miles and his team get a better understanding of what it means to wear an LSU uniform and the impact that can be made on those who are less fortunate.

As Miles heads into his 11th season with the Tigers and coming off a recruiting class that was ranked No. 5 in the nation, the foundation for LSU football is stronger than ever. With wins coming at a record-setting pace, graduation rates among the best for any public university in the SEC, and with eight-straight recruiting classes rated among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of the premier programs in college football, setting a standard that has the rest of the nation chasing.

LSU and McNeese State meet for just the second time in football when the Cowboys come to Tiger Stadium for the season-opener for both teams ... LSU won the only other meeting between the teams in 2010 by a 32-10 count ... LSU is 10-0 against members of the Football Championship Subdivision (formerly 1-AA) with its last game coming against Sam Houston State last year ... LSU has played four current members of the Southland Conference and the Tigers are 14-0 all-time against the SLC ... LSU is 11-0 vs. Northwestern State (last played in 2011), 1-0 vs. McNeese (last played in 2010), 1-0 vs. Sam Houston State (last played in 2014), and 1-0 vs. Southeastern Louisiana (last played in 1949).

LSU Owns FBS Record for Consecutive Non-Conference Regular Season Wins With 49

LSU will put a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) record on the line again in the season-opener as the Tigers have won 49 consecutive non-conference regular season games dating back to the 2002 season. Last season, LSU added to its record by going 4-0 against non-conference opponents in the regular season, including a 28-24 win against No. 14 Wisconsin in the opener. The Tigers broke the FBS record for consecutive non-conference regular season wins in 2012, surpassing the mark of Kansas State who claimed 39 straight from 1993-2003. The Tigers haven't lost a non-conference regular season game since falling at Virginia Tech, 26-8, in the 2002 season opener in Blacksburg, Va., on Sept. 1. **Les Miles** has accounted for 39 of the 49 wins during the streak, and he is 39-0 all-time in non-conference regular season games in his 10 previous seasons at LSU. Former coach Nick Saban accounted for the 10 other victories from 2002-04. Under Miles, the Tigers have outscored non-conference regular season opponents a combined 1,988-526. Here is a look at the top four in FBS all-time consecutive non-conference regular season wins:

LSU in Season Openers

LSU brings an 88-28-5 overall mark in season openers into the McNeese State game. The Tigers have won 12 straight and 18 of their last 19 season-openers. LSU's only season-opening loss over the past 19 years came at Virginia Tech by a 26-8 count in 2002. Last year, the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over Wisconsin in Houston. LSU's 12-game season opener win streak ranks eighth in the nation. Here is a list of the longest current season-opener win streaks in FBS:

Les Miles In Season Openers

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 11-3 in season openers during his 14 years as a head coach, which includes a 10-0 record with the Tigers. Miles is the only coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to a season-opening win in each of his first 10 years. In 10 years with the Tigers, Miles' LSU teams have outscored its season-opening opponent, 373-186. Four of those opponents were ranked, and seven of those games were away from Tiger Stadium.

LSU vs. The Football Championship Subdivision (FCS)

Saturday's game against McNeese State marks the 11th time that LSU will face a team from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). LSU is 10-0 all-time against FCS teams, which includes a 70-14 win over Arkansas State on Oct. 12, 1991; a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season; a 35-10 win over The Citadel on Sept. 7, 2002; a 35-7 victory over Western Illinois, on Sept. 13, 2003; a 24-0 win over Appalachian State on Nov. 5, 2005, a 41-13 victory over Appalachian State to open the 2008 season, a 32-10 victory over McNeese State on Oct. 16, 2010, a 49-3 win over Northwestern State on Sept. 10, 2011, a 38-22 victory over Towson on Sept. 29, 2012, a 48-16 win over Furman on Oct. 26, 2013 and a 56-0 victory over Sam Houston State on Sept. 6, 2014. Les Miles is 7-0 against FCS teams in his tenure at LSU having outscored them 288-64.

LSU-McNeese State Ties

McNeese State sports information director Matthew Bonnette is the brother of LSU communications director Michael Bonnette ... Louis Bonnette, Michael and Matthew's father, was the SID for 46 years at McNeese State before retiring recently ... McNeese special teams coordinator/running backs coach Slade Nagle served as a special teams administrative assistant at LSU in 2009 ... McNeese assistant strength coach Jordan Free worked as an intern under LSU strength and conditioning coach Tommy Moffitt ... LSU tight ends coach Steve Ensminger served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at McNeese from 1984-86 ... LSU defensive line coach Ed Orgeron worked as a graduate assistant at McNeese in 1985.

No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Tre'Davious White

A tradition established in 2003 continues as junior cornerback **Tre'Davious White** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2015 season. White was presented the jersey by coach **Les Miles** following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp on Wednesday, Aug. 5. White is one of LSU's leading returners on defense after recording 33 tackles, two interceptions and one sack. He also returned a punt for a touchdown last season against Kentucky. Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

LSU Brings Back Six Starters in 2015 from the No. 1 Ranked Total Defense in the SEC A Season Ago

LSU finished the 2014 season as the SEC's top-ranked team in total defense. The Tigers gave up 316.8 yards per game to rank No. 1 in the league and No. 9 nationally. Additionally, LSU led the conference and ranked No. 3 nationally in passing yards allowed at 164.2 per game. LSU finished the season No. 1 in the SEC and No. 3 nationally in team passing efficiency defense with a rating of 101.62. Defensive tackles **Christian LaCouture** and **Davon Godchaux**, linebackers **Kendell Beckwith** and **Lamar Louis**, and defensive backs **Jalen Mills** and **Tre'Davious White** return as starters off the 2014 squad.

LSU is 45-3 Overall in Non-Conference Games Under Les Miles

LSU brings a 45-3 record in non-conference games into the season opener against McNeese State. LSU's only three non-conference losses under **Les Miles** came against Penn State in the Capital One Bowl to end the 2009 season, Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31, 2012 and Notre Dame in the Music City Bowl on Dec. 30, 2014. Of the 45 wins under Miles against non-conference opponents, 13 have come against Top 25 teams, 37 have come by double-digits and LSU has scored 40 or more points in 27 of the 45 games.

LSU Is 26-2 Under Les Miles Following a Loss

LSU is 26-2 since 2005 under **Les Miles** following a loss. Three times this season LSU has been victorious the following week after losing. The only times LSU has lost back-to-back games under Miles came in 2008 when the Tigers dropped November games to Ole Miss and Arkansas and this November with losses to Alabama and Arkansas. LSU has never lost consecutive games in Tiger Stadium under Miles, nor has LSU lost three straight games under Miles.

LSU Is 57-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 132 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 98-12 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 58-5. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 57-0. LSU is 46-5 Under Les Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 46-5 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2015 roster, LSU has five career 100-yard games to its credit as **Leonard Fournette** has all five. As a freshman in 2014, Fournette totaled 122 rushing yards against New Mexico State, 140 yards at Florida, 113 vs. Ole Miss, 146 at Texas A&M and 143 vs. Notre Dame in the Music City Bowl. LSU's only five losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came vs. Notre Dame in 2014 (Leonard Fournette, 143 yards), vs. Clemson in 2012 (Jeremy Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards); Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

LSU's 54-9 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 54-9 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 22-6 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. LSU defeated No. 14 Wisconsin, 28-24, and forced two Badgers' turnovers while only committing one. The Tigers forced three turnovers at Florida while committing none in LSU's 30-27 win. The only nine losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Mississippi State and Auburn in 2014, Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005. In Miles' tenure at LSU, the Tigers have a combined turnover margin of +66. LSU was +20 in 2011 and +16 in 2012.

LSU Has Been Ranked in 127 of 132 Games Under Miles

Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and Amway Coaches' Poll 154 of the 162 weeks. The exception came during the final three polls of the 2008 season and five weeks in 2014. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 161 of 168 games ranked in the top 25, including 127 of 132 games under Miles. LSU has a 98-28 record in games played as a Top 25 team under Miles going into the McNeese game. The only five games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 against Arkansas in the regular-season finale and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl, and this season at Florida, vs. Kentucky and at Texas A&M. This year marked the 15th consecutive season that the Tigers were ranked in the preseason polls as LSU came in at No. 14 in both the Associated Press and No. 13 in the Amway Coaches Top 25 polls. The opener against McNeese State will be the 127th game under Miles in which LSU is ranked.

True Freshmen Play Big Roles at LSU Under Les Miles

LSU coach **Les Miles** has never shied away from playing true freshmen. In his 10 years with the Tigers, a total of 100 true freshmen have seen action for LSU, including 17 in 2014. Of the 100 true freshmen who have played under Miles, 33 have started at least once during their freshman season.

Colby Delahoussaye Ranks Second in LSU Career FG Percentage

Placekicker **Colby Delahoussaye** is ranked second in LSU history for career field goal percentage. He has booted 24-of-29 field goals for a .828 percentage. He was 11-of-15 in field goal attempts in 2014, including a game-winning, career-long 50-yard attempt at Florida. As a freshman in 2013, Delahoussaye shattered the LSU record for most consecutive field goals to start a career by converting his first nine attempts. The previous record was seven straight by David Browndyke in 1986. Delahoussaye also ranks seventh in LSU history for career PATs made at 90. Delahoussaye is two field goals shy of cracking the Top 10 for most field goals made in a career in LSU history. He currently has 24 entering his junior season in 2015.

The Aussie Punting Connection

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. Senior **Jamie Keehn** took over punting duties in 2013 and enters his third season as punter this year. Keehn, a native of Queensland, is the oldest player on the LSU team after turning 26 on August 4. Keehn did not play high school football and did not start punting until August 2011. Wing and Keehn did not know each other until both arrived at LSU. The Tigers' backup punter is true freshman **Josh Crowden**, a native of Sydney, Australia, who will look to keep the Aussie Connection going in 2016.

Jamie Keehn Ranks Third in LSU History in Career Punting Average

Senior punter **Jamie Keehn** enters his third season as LSU's starting punter, and he ranks third in program history with a 43.4-yard career punting average. The second-team All-SEC selection in 2014 set the school record with 3,189 punting yards a year ago and finished with the third-highest punting average in single-season history at 44.92 yards per punt in 2014.

LSU Has Scored 22 Special Teams TDs In Les Miles Era

LSU has recorded 22 special teams touchdown under **Les Miles**, including most recently when **Leonard Fournette** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against Notre Dame in the Music City Bowl on Dec. 30, 2014. Under Miles, LSU has returned 12 punts for touchdowns, 4 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, 1 on a fake field goal and 1 on a missed field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all 10 seasons under Miles. LSU is 19-2 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. Les Miles' Achievements at LSU

The following is a quick look at **Les Miles'** notable accomplishments during his 10 years and 131 games (103-29 record) as head coach of the Tigers:

- After defeating Florida 30-27 on Oct. 11, 2014, Miles became only the second coach in LSU history to earn 100 victories. Charles McClendon tallied 137 in his tenure at LSU.
- Miles recorded 100 wins at LSU in only 126 games. It took McClendon 141 games to reach the historic milestone at LSU.
- In fact, Miles became the third-fastest coach in SEC history to reach 100 wins behind only Steve Spurrier (120 games) and Robert Neyland (121).
- With the win over Mississippi State in 2013, Miles became the quickest LSU coach to reach 90 victories doing so in 112 games. It took Charles McClendon 124 games to reach that milestone.
- Also the fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), 70 wins (87 games), and 80 wins (98 games) in school history
- With 10 or more wins seven times at LSU, Miles joined Bear Bryant (13 at Alabama), Steve Spurrier (9 at Florida), Philip Fulmer (9 at Tennessee), Mark Richt (9 at Georgia), Vince Dooley (7 at Georgia) and Nick Saban (7 at Alabama) as the only coaches in SEC history to have seven or more 10-win seasons at the same school.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011...Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season, and he's done it 3 times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the reg. season during the same year; twice: 2010, '11.
- Became the first first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005).
- Has 15 wins over coaches who have won national titles.
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in 4 straight seasons, a first at the school, and to seven overall (the most at the school).
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007).

LSU Features Three College Graduates on the Roster

Three current LSU players have already earned their undergraduate degree at the university. **Reid Ferguson, Brad Kragthorpe** and **Christian Pittman** graduated in spring 2015 and are seniors on the 2015 football squad. Ferguson earned his degree in sport administration, while Kragthorpe earned his degree in general business and Pittman graduated with a degree in sociology.

LSU: The SEC's Winningest Team Since 2005

LSU is the winningest program in the SEC since the start of **Les Miles'** tenure as head coach in 2005 as the Tigers have posted a 103-29 mark during that span. The 103 victories for LSU are nine better than Florida and Georgia, while the Tigers are also tops in final poll rankings. LSU is also fourth nationally in wins since 2005 behind only Boise State (113), Ohio State (110) and Oregon (106).

This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 236-63-4 (.785) at night under the lights compared to a 32-25-3 (.558) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 92-14 (.868) overall at home, which includes a 70-8 (.897) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 22-6 (.786) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Ford and Ridley Power LSU Past McNeese, 32-10

Michael Ford rushed for a career-high 86 yards and two touchdowns and **Stevan Ridley** added a pair of scores as LSU won its seventh straight game with a 32-10 non-conference win over McNeese State in Tiger Stadium. In what was the first-ever meeting between the two teams in football, McNeese took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter after a **Jordan Jefferson** fumble gave the Cowboys the ball at the LSU 5-yard line. McNeese scored three plays later. LSU tied the game at 7-7 on its next possession when Ridley scored on a 2-yard run. Another LSU miscue setup another McNeese State score as the Cowboys took a 10-7 lead on a field goal at the 11:26 mark in the second quarter. The Tigers responded with an 8-play, 56-yard drive to take the lead for good at 14-10 on a 10-yard run by Ridley. LSU added a safety for a 16-10 lead at halftime. Ford scored on a 6-yard run midway through the third quarter to run the score to 22-10. **Josh Jasper** added a 31-yard field goal to run the score to 25-10 with nine minutes left in the game. Ford added the game's final points on a 36-yard run with just over a minute left in the contest. For the game, LSU limited McNeese to 219 total yards, but the Cowboys became the first team this year to rush for 100 net yards against the Tigers, finishing with 101 yards on the ground on 34 carries. LSU managed 282 total yards, which included 179 rushing yards. **Jarrett Lee** connected on 9-of-14 passes for 75 yards. **Russell Shepard** led all receivers with seven catches for 53 yards. Shepard added 25 rushing yards on three carries. **Kelvin Sheppard** led the Tiger defense with 10 tackles and a fumble recovery, while **Ryan Baker** added nine tackles and a pair of sacks.

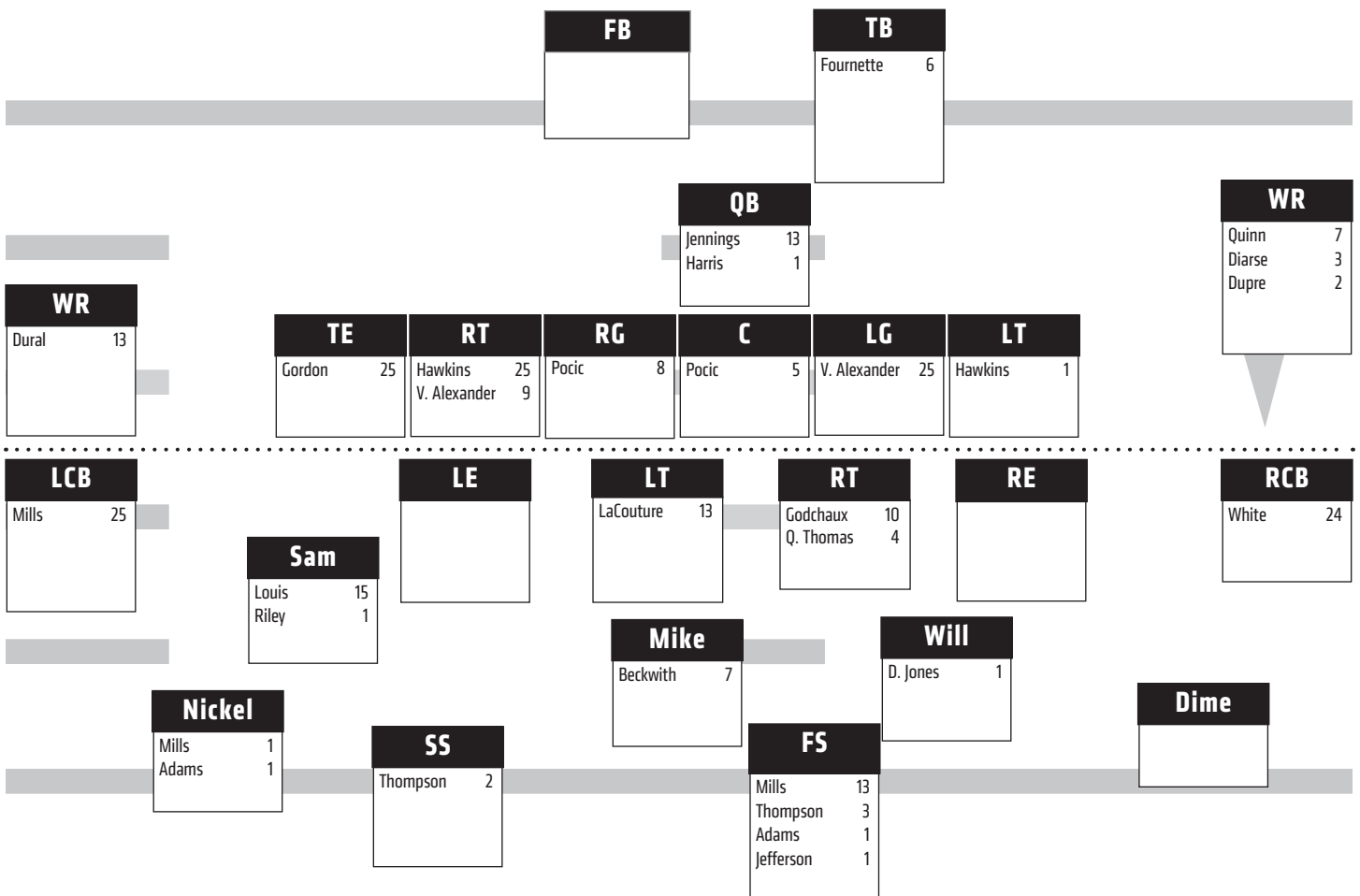
