### NEXT UP

#### LSU Gets Second-Chance At Season-Opener, This Time at Mississippi State

LSU will get another shot at a season-opener on Saturday as the Tigers travel to Mississippi State to face the Bulldogs in Starkville. The game comes a week after LSU's scheduled season opener against McNeese State was canceled just five minutes into the first quarter due to consistent lightning in Baton Rouge. The LSU-McNeese game was finally called sometime after 10 p.m. on Saturday and will not be re-scheduled. The Tigers now go to Starkville to open their season for the second time under **Les Miles** as LSU and Mississippi State started the 2007 season on Thursday, Aug. 30 (LSU won 45-0). The LSU-State game will be televised on ESPN and will carry an 8:20 p.m. CT kickoff. LSU brings a 12-game winning streak in season-openers into Saturday's game (Note: Due to cancellation of McNeese game, LSU will now consider the Mississippi State game as its 2015 season-opener). Mississippi State enters the game with a 1-0 record after its 34-16 road win over Southern Miss last week. Last year, Mississippi State snapped LSU's 14-game winning streak in the series with a 34-29 victory in Tiger Stadium. That win was the first by the Bulldogs over LSU since a 17-16 victory in Starkville in 1999. LSU QB **Brandon Harris** will get a second chance at making his second career start on Saturday, both coming on the road against SEC teams. Harris' first start came at Auburn last year. Miles brings a 103-29 mark with the Tigers into the game, making him the second-winningest coach in school history. Overall, Miles is 131-49 in 14 seasons as a head coach (10 at LSU, 4 at Oklahoma State). LSU returns 14 starters on offense (8) and defense (6) as well as all of its specialists from a year ago. Leading the way on offense for the Tigers is **Leonard Fournette**, who set an LSU freshman record with 1,034 rushing yards a year ago. Defensively, the Tigers will be dominant up the middle as LSU returns its two starting defensive tackles in **Christian LaCouture** (40 tackles, 2.5 sacks in 2014) and **Davon Godchaux** (42 tackles, 1.5 TFL in 2014), along with mike linebacker **Kendell Beckwith** (77 tackles in 2014) and safety **Jamal Adams** (66 tackles, 5.0 TFL in 2014).

### TALKING POINTS

- LSU has won seven straight games against Mississippi State in Starkville. LSU's last loss in Starkville came in 1999 by a 17-16 count. Overall, LSU has won 14 of last 15 and 21 of last 23 against the Bulldogs.
- Saturday's date of Sept. 12 will mark the latest LSU has opened a season since 1998 when the Tigers beat Arkansas State 42-6, on Sept. 12.
- LSU will be playing its fourth straight game away from Tiger Stadium on Saturday. It's the longest stretch of games for LSU without a home game since 1994-95 when the Tigers played their last 2 games on the road in 1994 followed by two road games to open 1995.
- LSU's won a school-record 12 straight season-openers heading into the Mississippi State contest.
- LSU hasn't lost a season-opener since a 26-8 setback to Virginia Tech in 2002. **Les Miles** is 10-0 in season-openers at LSU, which includes a 1-0 record vs. Mississippi State.
- LSU is 5-6-2 all-time in season-opening games against SEC opponents.
- Because of cancellation of McNeese State game, LSU will now open season with two straight SEC games (Mississippi State and Auburn). It's the first time in school history (dating back to SEC era in 1933) that LSU will play its first two games against SEC opponents.
- LSU opened the 2015 season ranked in the Top 25 for the 15th straight year, a streak that dates back to 2001. LSU has played 127 of its 132 games under **Les Miles** ranked in the Top 25. LSU is 99-28 in those games.
- Including tight end **Dillon Gordon**, LSU's offensive line has combined to start 98 games for LSU. Senior RT **Vadal Alexander** leads the way with 34 starts (25 at LG, 9 at RT), followed by LT **Jerald Hawkins** with 26 (25 at RT, 1 at LT). Others include **Ethan Pocic** with 13 (8 at RG, 5 at C).
- LSU has never shied away from playing true freshmen. Under **Les Miles**, 100 true freshmen have seen the field for the Tigers, including 17 in 2014 and 14 in 2013. Of the players on LSU's depth chart for the McNeese game, 36 of them played as a true freshman. In five minutes of action against McNeese State, five true freshmen saw the field (RB **Derrius Guice**, RB **Nick Brossette**, WR **Jazz Ferguson**, WR/DB **Donte Jackson**, CB **Kevin Toliver II**).

# Les Miles

## 2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • 11TH SEASON

The dynasty that Les Miles has built at LSU reached another milestone in 2014 as the 11th year head coach guided the Tigers to a school-record 15th consecutive bowl game while becoming just the second coach in school history to win 100 games. It took Miles only 126 games to reach 100 wins at LSU making him the third-fastest coach to reach the mark in the history of the SEC, trailing only Steve Spurrier (120) and Robert Neyland (121).

Miles enters his 11th season with the Tigers in 2015 and his first decade at the school has seen the Tigers win more games, play in more major bowl games, and finish more seasons ranked in the Top 20 than any other 10-year period in the history of the program.

Miles has built a solid foundation for the LSU program based on principles laid out in the "Miles Method", a mission that calls for LSU to run the finest football program in the country in every phase that comes in contact with a player. It's the goal of the program for players to have a college experience that is second to none and one that gives them every opportunity to compete for championships on the field, earn a degree, and to grow personally by giving back to the community. Miles holds his players accountable and to a standard of excellence, both on and off the field.

The "Miles Method" has proved to be a winning formula as the Tigers have won more games than any program in the SEC since 2005 (103), while capturing a pair of SEC titles (2007, 2011), played in 10 bowl games, including the BCS National Championship Game twice. LSU won the BCS title in 2007, a year after beating Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl. Miles directed LSU to the school's only 13-0 regular-season in 2011 as the Tigers spent 11 consecutive weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation.

Since Miles took over in 2005, LSU has registered five top 10 finishes with three coming in the top five, won double-figure games seven times, produced 20 first-team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. LSU also leads the SEC with 64 NFL Draft picks during that span, which includes 13 first round selections. LSU led the nation with nine NFL Draft picks in 2014, which tied the school record set in 2013.

Miles' 103 wins at LSU ranks him behind only Charles McClendon, who won 137 games in 18 years with the Tigers. Miles is also the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season - and he's done it now three times - and in 2005, he became the only first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's title game.

In the classroom, 215 football players have earned their degree since Miles took over, and two out of the last three years LSU has ranked No. 2 in the SEC in graduation rates, trailing only Vanderbilt. Under Miles, LSU has produced over 150 players who have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status.

As Miles heads into his 11th season with the Tigers and coming off a recruiting class that was ranked among the Top 10 in the nation, the foundation for LSU football is stronger than ever. With wins coming at a record-setting pace, graduation rates among the best for any public university in the SEC, and with eight-straight recruiting classes rated among the top 10 in the nation, including the nation's No. 1 group in 2009, Miles and the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of the premier programs in college football, setting a standard that has the rest of the nation chasing.

Overall, LSU has won 14 of the last 15 and 21 of the last 23 against Mississippi State ... Prior to last year, Mississippi State last beat LSU 17-16 in 1999 in Starkville ... LSU hasn't lost back-to-back games against Mississippi State since 1990 and 1991 ... LSU is 14-6-1 all-time against the Bulldogs in Starkville ... LSU goes into the Mississippi State game ranked in the Top 25 for the 12th consecutive season ... With 71 wins in the series, LSU has more victories over Mississippi State than any other team in the history of the Tiger program ... The next closest is the 69 wins LSU has against Tulane ... The LSU-State series dates back to a 52-0 Tiger win in 1896 ... LSU coach Les Miles is 9-1 vs. Mississippi State, which includes a 5-0 record in Starkville ... Miles has more wins over Mississippi State (9) than any other team he's faced as a head coach.

## NOTEBOOK

### LSU's Game Vs. McNeese Canceled, Ruled No Contest

LSU's original 2015 season opener against McNeese State on Sept. 5 was canceled and ruled no contest after bad weather, specifically lightning, refused to leave the area throughout the night. The Tigers and Cowboys played nearly five minutes of the first quarter before lightning chased the teams off the field at 6:50 p.m. CT. Nearly four hours later at 10:36 p.m., officials canceled the game. It will not be made up. The game is believed to be the first in LSU history to be canceled after play began (the original delay came with 10:08 left in the first quarter). Because the game was ruled no contest, the Mississippi State game will be considered the season opener.

### LSU in Season Openers

LSU brings an 88-28-5 overall mark in season openers into the Mississippi State game. The Tigers have won 12 straight and 18 of their last 19 season-openers. LSU's only season-opening loss over the past 19 years came at Virginia Tech by a 26-8 count in 2002. Last year, the Tigers posted a 28-24 win over Wisconsin in Houston. LSU's 12-game season opener win streak now ranks seventh in the nation. Here is a list of the longest current season-opener win streaks in FBS:

### Les Miles in Season Openers

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 11-3 in season openers during his 14 years as a head coach, which includes a 10-0 record with the Tigers. Miles is the only coach in LSU history to lead the Tigers to a season-opening win in each of his first 10 years. In 10 years with the Tigers, Miles' LSU teams have outscored its season-opening opponent, 373-186. Four of those opponents were ranked, and seven of those games were away from Tiger Stadium.

### Les Miles vs. The SEC

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 58-26 against SEC teams (all games) since taking over for the Tigers in 2005. The 58 wins include two victories in the SEC Championship Game, while two of the 26 losses include a defeat to Georgia in the 2005 SEC title game and the loss to Alabama in the 2012 BCS National Championship game. In games that count toward the SEC standings, Miles is 56-24. LSU is 31-9 under Miles in SEC home games and 25-15 in SEC road games.

### LSU To Unexpectedly Open Season Against Conference Foe For First Time Since 2007

Mother Nature forced a cancellation of LSU's original season opener against McNeese State on Sept. 5, forcing the Tigers' contest at Mississippi State to serve as the season opener. LSU's season-opener against Mississippi State will mark the first time since 2007 and second time since 1991 that the Tigers will face a league opponent in their first game of the year. In 2007, LSU pummeled the Bulldogs 45-0 in Starkville on the way to winning the 2007 BCS National Championship. In all, the Tigers have opened a season against a conference opponent 13 times in the modern era (SEC era), and LSU is 5-6-2 in those games. The following is a look at how the Tigers have fared in those SEC games that served as the season-opener for LSU:

### LSU-Mississippi State Ties

Mississippi State wide receiver coach Billy Gonzales spent two years (2010-11) on the LSU coaching staff ... Mississippi State sports information director Bill Martin is a graduate of LSU and worked in the SID office at LSU for six years before taking over at State last year.

### September Success Under Les Miles

LSU is 35-4 in games played in September under **Les Miles** dating back to 2005. Two of the four September losses have come on the road: at Auburn in 2006 and at Georgia in 2013. Overall, LSU is 24-2 in September home games under Miles. The only losses came to Tennessee in 2005 and Mississippi State in 2014. LSU has played Mississippi State in September six times since 2005, and the Tigers are 5-1. The Tigers went undefeated in the month of September in six straight seasons from 2007-12.

### No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Tre'Davious White

A tradition established in 2003 continues as junior cornerback **Tre'Davious White** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2015 season. White was presented the jersey by coach **Les Miles** following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp on Wednesday, Aug. 5. White is one of LSU's leading returners on defense after recording 33 tackles, two interceptions and one sack. He also returned a punt for a touchdown last season against Kentucky. Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

### Harris Becomes 8th QB to Start Season-Opener Under Miles

When LSU opens the 2015 season against Mississippi State, sophomore **Brandon Harris** will become the eighth different quarterback to start a season-opener for the Tigers under **Les Miles**. Only three times during Miles' career at LSU have the Tigers started the same quarterback in back-to-back season-openers. JaMarcus Russell did it in 2005 and 2006, followed by Jordan Jefferson in 2009 and 2010, and Zach Mettenberger in 2012 and 2013. A year ago, **Anthony Jennings** started the season-opening win over Wisconsin. No matter the quarterback, LSU is 10-0 in season-openers under Miles. ### Harris is Third LSU QB Since 1965 to Make First and Second Career Starts at SEC Opponents

LSU sophomore quarterback **Brandon Harris** will be the first LSU QB since Melvin Hill in 1994 (at Florida, at Ole Miss) and third overall since 1965 to have his first two career starts come on the road vs. SEC opponents. Harris made his first career start last season as a true freshman at Auburn. Since the original 2015 season opener against McNeese State was canceled, Harris' second career start will come at Mississippi State. Mike Hillman also made his first two starts on the road against SEC opponents. In 1968 Hillman started at Alabama and at Tulane in a contest designated as a conference game by the SEC office.

### LSU Brings Back Six Starters in 2015 from the No. 1 Ranked Total Defense in the SEC A Season Ago

LSU finished the 2014 season as the SEC's top-ranked team in total defense. The Tigers gave up 316.8 yards per game to rank No. 1 in the league and No. 9 nationally. Additionally, LSU led the conference and ranked No. 3 nationally in passing yards allowed at 164.2 per game. LSU finished the season No. 1 in the SEC and No. 3 nationally in team passing efficiency defense with a rating of 101.62. Defensive tackles **Christian LaCouture** and **Davon Godchaux**, linebackers **Kendell Beckwith** and **Lamar Louis**, and defensive backs **Jalen Mills** and **Tre'Davious White** return as starters off the 2014 squad.

### LSU is 45-3 Overall in Non-Conference Games Under Les Miles

LSU brings a 45-3 record in non-conference games into the season. LSU's only three non-conference losses under **Les Miles** came against Penn State in the Capital One Bowl to end the 2009 season, Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31, 2012 and Notre Dame in the Music City Bowl on Dec. 30, 2014. Of the 45 wins under Miles against non-conference opponents, 13 have come against Top 25 teams, 37 have come by double-digits and LSU has scored 40 or more points in 27 of the 45 games.

### LSU Is 26-2 Under Les Miles Following a Loss

LSU is 26-2 since 2005 under **Les Miles** following a loss. Three times this season LSU has been victorious the following week after losing. The only times LSU has lost back-to-back games under Miles came in 2008 when the Tigers dropped November games to Ole Miss and Arkansas and this November with losses to Alabama and Arkansas. LSU has never lost consecutive games in Tiger Stadium under Miles, nor has LSU lost three straight games under Miles.

### LSU Is 57-0 Under Miles When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 132 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 98-12 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 58-5. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 57-0. ### LSU is 46-5 Under Les Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 46-5 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2015 roster, LSU has five career 100-yard games to its credit as **Leonard Fournette** has all five. As a freshman in 2014, Fournette totaled 122 rushing yards against New Mexico State, 140 yards at Florida, 113 vs. Ole Miss, 146 at Texas A&M and 143 vs. Notre Dame in the Music City Bowl. LSU's only five losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came vs. Notre Dame in 2014 (Leonard Fournette, 143 yards), vs. Clemson in 2012 (Jeremy Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards); Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

### LSU's 54-9 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle

LSU is 54-9 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 22-6 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. LSU defeated No. 14 Wisconsin, 28-24, and forced two Badgers' turnovers while only committing one. The Tigers forced three turnovers at Florida while committing none in LSU's 30-27 win. The only nine losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Mississippi State and Auburn in 2014, Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005. In Miles' tenure at LSU, the Tigers have a combined turnover margin of +66. LSU was +20 in 2011 and +16 in 2012.

## LSU Has Been Ranked in 127 of 132 Games Under Miles

Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and Amway Coaches' Poll 154 of the 162 weeks. The exception came during the final three polls of the 2008 season and five weeks in 2014. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 161 of 168 games ranked in the top 25, including 127 of 132 games under Miles. LSU has a 98-28 record in games played as a Top 25 team under Miles going into the Mississippi State game. The only five games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 against Arkansas in the regular-season finale and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl, and this season at Florida, vs. Kentucky and at Texas A&M. This year marked the 15th consecutive season that the Tigers were ranked in the preseason polls as LSU came in at No. 14 in both the Associated Press and No. 13 in the Amway Coaches Top 25 polls. The opener against McNeese State will be the 127th game under Miles in which LSU is ranked.

## True Freshmen Play Big Roles at LSU Under Les Miles

LSU coach **Les Miles** has never shied away from playing true freshmen. In his 10 years with the Tigers, a total of 100 true freshmen have seen action for LSU, including 17 in 2014. Of the 100 true freshmen who have played under Miles, 33 have started at least once during their freshman season.

## Colby Delahoussaye Ranks Second in LSU Career FG Percentage

Placekicker **Colby Delahoussaye** is ranked second in LSU history for career field goal percentage. He has booted 24-of-29 field goals for a .828 percentage. He was 11-of-15 in field goal attempts in 2014, including a game-winning, career-long 50-yard attempt at Florida. As a freshman in 2013, Delahoussaye shattered the LSU record for most consecutive field goals to start a career by converting his first nine attempts. The previous record was seven straight by David Browndyke in 1986. Delahoussaye also ranks seventh in LSU history for career PATs made at 90. Delahoussaye is two field goals shy of cracking the Top 10 for most field goals made in a career in LSU history. He has 24 entering his junior season in 2015.

## The Aussie Punting Connection

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. Senior **Jamie Keehn** took over punting duties in 2013 and enters his third season as punter this year. Keehn, a native of Queensland, is the oldest player on the LSU team after turning 26 on August 4. Keehn did not play high school football and did not start punting until August 2011. Wing and Keehn did not know each other until both arrived at LSU. The Tigers' backup punter is true freshman **Josh Growden**, a native of Sydney, Australia, who will look to keep the Aussie Connection going in 2016.

## Jamie Keehn Ranks Third in LSU History in Career Punting Average

Senior punter **Jamie Keehn** enters his third season as LSU's starting punter, and he ranks third in program history with a 43.4-yard career punting average. The second-team All-SEC selection in 2014 set the school record with 3,189 punting yards a year ago and finished with the third-highest average in single-season history at 44.92 yards per punt in 2014.

## LSU Has Scored 22 Special Teams TDs In Les Miles Era

LSU has recorded 22 special teams touchdowns under **Les Miles**, including most recently when **Leonard Fournette** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against Notre Dame in the Music City Bowl on Dec. 30, 2014. Under Miles, LSU has returned 12 punts for touchdowns, 4 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, 1 on a fake field goal and 1 on a missed field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all 10 seasons under Miles. LSU is 19-2 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. ### Les Miles' Achievements at LSU

The following is a quick look at **Les Miles'** notable accomplishments during his 10 years and 131 games (103-29 record) as head coach of the Tigers:

- After defeating Florida 30-27 on Oct. 11, 2014, Miles became only the second coach in LSU history to earn 100 victories. Charles McClendon tallied 137 in his tenure at LSU.
- Miles recorded 100 wins at LSU in only 126 games. It took McClendon 141 games to reach the historic milestone at LSU.
- In fact, Miles became the third-fastest coach in SEC history to reach 100 wins behind only Steve Spurrier (120 games) and Robert Neyland (121).
- With the win over Mississippi State in 2013, Miles became the quickest LSU coach to reach 90 victories doing so in 112 games. It took Charles McClendon 124 games to reach that milestone.
- Also the fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), 70 wins (87 games), and 80 wins (98 games) in school history
- With 10 or more wins seven times at LSU, Miles joined Bear Bryant (13 at Alabama), Steve Spurrier (9 at Florida), Philip Fulmer (9 at Tennessee), Mark Richt (9 at Georgia), Vince Dooley (7 at Georgia) and Nick Saban (7 at Alabama) as the only coaches in SEC history to have seven or more 10-win seasons at the same school.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011...Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season, and he's done it 3 times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the reg. season during the same year; twice: 2010, '11.
- Became the first first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005).
- Has 15 wins over coaches who have won national titles.
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in 4 straight seasons, a first at the school, and to seven overall (the most at the school).
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007).

### LSU Features Three College Graduates on the Roster

Three current LSU players have already earned their undergraduate degree at the university. **Reid Ferguson, Brad Kragthorpe** and **Christian Pittman** graduated in spring 2015 and are seniors on the 2015 football squad. Ferguson earned his degree in sport administration, while Kragthorpe earned his degree in general business and Pittman graduated with a degree in sociology.

### LSU: The SEC's Winningest Team Since 2005

LSU is the winningest program in the SEC since the start of **Les Miles'** tenure as head coach in 2005 as the Tigers have posted a 103-29 mark during that span. The 103 victories for LSU are eight better than Florida and Georgia, while the Tigers are also tops in final poll rankings. LSU is also fourth nationally in wins since 2005 behind only Boise State (114), Ohio State (111) and Oregon (107).

## Late Rally Comes Up Short As LSU Falls to Mississippi State

A furious fourth quarter rally came up short as LSU saw its 14-game winning streak over Mississippi State come to an end with a 34-29 setback to the Bulldogs in Tiger Stadium. The win was the first over LSU for the Bulldogs since 1999 and the first in Tiger Stadium for Mississippi State since 1991. Despite falling behind 34-10 early in the fourth quarter following a Mississippi State field goal, LSU had the ball inside the Bulldog 49-yard line with seven seconds left and a shot at a game-winning "Hail Mary" pass. The Tigers fell just short as **Brandon Harris'** pass was intercepted at the 1-yard line to end the game. LSU outscored the Bulldogs 19-0 over the final 12 minutes of the contest to get within 34-29. Down 34-10, LSU strung together three straight TD drives, including two in a 28-second span, in the fourth quarter. **Kenny Hilliard** scored on a 1-yard run to get LSU to within 34-16. Harris connected with **Malachi Dupre** on a 31-yard TD pass with 1:55 to go to make it 34-22. Following a Mississippi State turnover, LSU needed just 15 seconds and two plays to score again, another Harris-to-Dupre TD pass, to make it 34-29. LSU forced Mississippi State to punt on its next possession, taking over with 20 seconds left at its own 20-yard line. Harris got LSU inside the MSU 50-yard line before his last-second heave fell short. MSU scored the first 17 points of the game and led 17-3 at halftime. LSU's **Danielle Hunter** pulled the Tigers within 17-10 with just 12 seconds into the second half when he picked up a fumble and ran 25 yards for a touch-down. MSU responded with two big scoring plays—a 56-yard run and a 74-yard pass—to stretch the margin to 31-10 midway through the third quarter. It stayed that way until MSU tacked on a field goal 11 seconds into the fourth quarter. For the game, MSU tallied 570 yards (302 rushing, 268 passing), while LSU managed 430 yards (89 rushing, 341 passing). **Anthony Jennings** connected on 13-of-26 passes for 157 yards, while Harris completed 6-of-9 for 140 yards and 2 scores. **Travin Dural** led LSU with 6 receptions for 124 yards, while Dupre had four catches for 120 yards and 2 TDs.
