- LSU opens the 2016 Women's College World Series on Thursday against Michigan in Oklahoma City
- The Tigers are in the WCWS for the second consecutive year for the first time in program history
- It's the fifth WCWS appearance for the Tigers in program history
- LSU won the 2016 NCAA Harrisonburg Regional, winning both games on the final day after dropping the opener
- It's the 15th time since 2005 that a team has won a super regional after dropping the super regional opener
- The last time LSU won a winner-take-all super regional game three was 2012 at Missouri
- The Tigers have now won a super regional on the road twice in the last five years
- The team has won 20 of its last 24 games overall heading into the WCWS
- LSU is 8-8 all-time in WCWS games
- The Tigers finished third overall in last year's event
- LSU is taking on Michigan in the WCWS for the second-straight season
- LSU is 2-2 in WCWS openers all-time
- The last time LSU and Michigan met in a WCWS opener, LSU won 3-2 in 13 innings in 2004

A Look Back - NCAA Harrisonburg Super Regional

- LSU claimed the 2016 NCAA Harrisonburg Super Regional by taking two of three games against No. 8 James Madison.
- The Tigers dropped the first game 3-2 on a walk-off hit in the bottom of the seventh inning last Friday, staving off elimination by winning the first game on Saturday 2-0 and holding on to win 3-2 in the finale.
- LSU became the 15th team since 2005, and first since Alabama last season, to win a super regional after dropping the first game of the series.
- The Tigers have now won two super regional titles on the road in the last five seasons.
- LSU hit .222 in the series against one of the best pitching rotations in the country, earning 16 hits over the course of the weekend.
- The team had a .319 slugging percentage and .313 on-base percentage against JMU in the series.
- Of the 16 hits, three were for extra bases including a double and two home runs.
- LSU had a .977 overall fielding percentage over the course of the super regional.
- Five LSU players finished with multiple hits in the series, led by Amber Serrett who went 3-for-8 for a .375 average and had a perfect fielding percentage at shortstop.
- Savannah Jaquish hit .333 with three hits, as she caught all 14 innings behind the plate on Saturday.
- Kellsie Kloss led the group with two RBIs in the series, belting one of the two home runs and had two sacrifice hits.
- Sandra Simmons had the other home run among her two hits, as she scored twice, slugged .714 and had an on-base percentage of .500.
- The only other player with multiple hits was Constance Quinn with two also, as she made a diving stop late in the finale to help clinch the super regional.
- The LSU pitching staff had a combined ERA of 1.35, holding JMU to a .234 overall batting average over the course of the three games.
- Allie Walljasper earned a win and a save on the weekend, as she scattered six hits and did not give up a run in 10.0 innings of work.
- Walljasper threw the 22nd NCAA tournament shutout in LSU history in the 2-0 win Saturday, holding an opponent batting average of .167.
- Sydney Smith picked up her first LSU postseason win on Saturday, allowing two runs, one earned, on four hits in four innings of work in the finale.
- Walljasper and Carley Hoover combined for 14 of the staff's 15 strikeouts, having seven each.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

On to the #Next

LSU claimed the NCAA Harrisonburg Super Regional, taking two of three games at James Madison to advance to the Women's College World Series. The Tigers dropped the opener 3-2 in a walk-off last Friday, but rallied to take both elimination-style games on Saturday to advance to Oklahoma City for the fifth time in program history and the first time ever in back-to-back seasons. It's the second time in the last five years that LSU has advanced to the finals site from a road super regional since taking two of three at Missouri in 2012.

Nifty Fifty

For the 11th time in program history the LSU softball team has earned 50 wins in a single season, earning consecutive 50-win campaigns for the first time since the 2006 and 2007 seasons. LSU is two wins shy of tying last year's mark, which was the most wins under head coach Beth Torina in her LSU tenure. Out of the five LSU head coaches in LSU history, Torina is just one of three to have multiple 50-win seasons, joining Yvette Girouard and Glenn Moore as the only coaches to do so. LSU has won at least 40 games in four of Torina's five seasons, now adding 50 in each of the last two.

Beating the Odds

While dropping the opener of a super regional doesn't kill your chances of advancing to the WCWS, it poses the idea of having to win twice in a single day to advance. Coming into last Saturday, only 14 teams since the new format was implemented in 2005 had ever advanced out of a super regional when losing the first game, as LSU became the 15th with its 3-2 heart-stopping win in the finale, the first since Alabama last year. It's even harder when doing so from the road, as of the now 15, LSU is one of five to ever do so.

Off The Wall(Jasper)

While primarily using her bat to make the difference for LSU toward the end of the regular season, sophomore Allie Walljasper in the Harrisonburg Super Regional pitched 10.0 shutout innings in earning a win and a save against JMU to help the Tigers advance. Facing elimination, Walljasper scattered five hits, struck out five and issued just one walk in a 2-0 win, while making her entrance in the finale in a tough spot and pitching three more scoreless innings in the 3-2 win to send LSU to Oklahoma City. She improved her overall record to 11-5 on the year, while the save was her second of the season.

You Ain't Seen Bouncin' Back

The Tigers have never been a group to dwell on losses for too long, and the Harrisonburg Super Regional was another example of the Fighting Tigers roaring to life in a big way. After dropping the super regional opener in heartbreaking fashion last Friday 3-2, the numbers show that LSU was up for the task of turning it around as going into Saturday the Tigers won nine games immediately following a loss, making it 10 with the 2-0 win Saturday.

LSU Claims NCAA Baton Rouge Regional

LSU claimed the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional last weekend, sweeping all three opponents to advance to the super regional round for the second consecutive year for just the second time in program history. The Tigers defeated LIU Brooklyn, McNeese State and Arizona State in order to advance, sweeping a home regional for the first time since 2006. It was the first time since 2012 that LSU needed just three games to

advance, that coming on the road at Texas A&M. Bailey Landry, Sandra Simmons and Savannah Jaquish were named to the All-Regional Team, with Carley Hoover also making it and being named the MVP.

Pick Your Poison

With her win in the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional finale, Allie Walljasper improved to 10-5 on the season, giving LSU three pitchers with at least 10 wins for the second time ever in program history. In 1997, Sara KnifeChief (21) Brandi Landry (13) and Julie Stashko (10) combined for 44 wins, while LSU's trio of Walljasper (11), Carley Hoover (20) and Sydney Smith (13) have 44 to tie.

Hoover Nets 20 Season Wins

After her complete-game win over McNeese State in the winner's bracket game of the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional, LSU sophomore pitcher Carley Hoover earned 20 wins on the season, becoming the first player since Rachele Fico in 2012 to reach the mark. The Clemson, South Carolina, native's new season high for wins makes her just the tenth LSU pitcher in program history to reach the milestone and 20th time overall that LSU has had a pitcher win 20 games in a season.

Seven Named NFCA All-South Region

Before the start of the NCAA regional, seven LSU players were named NFCA All-South Region, the most for any school in the region. Landing on the first team was Bianka Bell at third base, Savannah Jaquish at DP/Utility and Allie Walljasper at Utility/Pitcher. On the second team was Carley Hoover at Pitcher and Bailey Landry in the Outfield and on the third team at First Base was Sandra Simmons and at Catcher.

LSU Claims No. 10 Overall Seed for NCAA Tournament; Host Regional

After a big run in the SEC tournament last week, the LSU softball team was selected as the nation's overall No. 10 seed for the 2016 NCAA Softball Championship, selected to host an opening round regional. It's the second consecutive year Baton Rouge has been a host site for the opening round and the third time in the last four years. The Tigers are hosting a regional for the eighth time and ninth time overall after also hosting a super regional last season. LSU has qualified for the postseason 18 times now, extending the program's record long streak to 11 straight seasons.

All-Tournament Trio

For their efforts during the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament, Bianka Bell, Carley Hoover and Sandra Simmons were named to the SEC All-Tournament Team, giving LSU the most on the team since the 2010 season. Simmons was one of the top performers of the tournament, hitting two home runs and driving in six with five hits, as those marks led all players in the tournament. Bell led LSU hitting .400 in the event with a home run and three walks, while Hoover was picked after earning all three of LSU's wins in the circle, leading the tournament with 18 strikeouts.

Run for the Ages

The Tigers went into the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament as the seventh seed, but left as one of the hottest teams in the country as LSU made it all the way to the tournament final for the 10th time in program history and first time since 2010. LSU was able to earn wins over Texas A&M, Kentucky and Tennessee, all in dramatic fashion before falling

in the tournament final to Auburn. The Tigers were the lowest seed to make the final since 2000, as LSU has now won 40 games in the SEC tournament, the most for any other league school.

Bell, Hoover Named All-SEC

LSU's pre-season duo of Bianka Bell and Carley Hoover were both named to the post-season All-SEC teams the league announced, with Bell making it on to the first team list for the second time, while Hoover was named to the second team list. Bell has been an All-SEC performer in three of her four years at LSU, earning consecutive spots on the first team list after her junior season last year. Hoover was named to the All-SEC team for the second consecutive year after making the cut last season.

Smith Named USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Week

The awards continued to roll in for LSU Freshman Sydney Smith, as on Tuesday May 10 she was named the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Week. Smith is the seventh player in the history of the LSU program to claim the award, the fifth pitcher in LSU history to claim the prize and the second this season following Bianka Bell who earned the award back in March. Smith earned two wins over No. 13 Washington to help LSU to the series win to end the regular season.

Smith Named SEC Pitcher of the Week

After her two-win performance against Washington in the regular season series finale, freshman pitcher Sydney Smith was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week May 9, earning her first league weekly award this season. Smith allowed just a single run in 13.2 innings, shutting out the Huskies for the first time all season in the opener, while pitching 6.2 innings of relief to help claim the series that Sunday.

Walljasper Walk-Off

Out-doing her previous heroics from earlier in the year, sophomore Allie Walljasper belted the game-winning solo home run in the bottom of the ninth inning to claim the series against Washington in the regular season finale May 8. It was Walljasper's second of the year, and first since helping LSU to a comeback victory against Georgia (See: Pinch Hit Power).

Jaquish Repeats as SEC Player of the Week

For the second time this season, junior Sahvanna Jaquish was named the SEC's Player of the Week the league announced on May 2. Jaquish had 10 RBIs in four wins for LSU against McNeese State and Arkansas, slugging .938 with a .647 on-base percentage. It's the second consecutive year Jaquish has earned the award twice in the season.

A Grand Win

LSU's 9-1 win over Arkansas on May 1 not only earned LSU its second-straight sweep, but win No. 1,000 for the program. It took just a shade over 1,300 games for the program to reach the milestone, beginning back in 1979 with the first over LSU-Alexandria, 11-0. Softball was played for three seasons from 1979-81 before the program was restarted in 1997 after shutting down, as since that time LSU has won at least 40 games 17 times, and have finished with a winning record since adoption by the SEC in 19 out of 20 seasons.

Smith Reaches Double Digits

With her 10th victory of the season May 1, LSU freshman pitcher Sydney Smith became the 14th freshman in program history to win at least 10 games in her debut season. It was the third consecutive win for the Maple Grove, Minnesota, native, as its the 17th time in LSU history an LSU pitcher in their first season has won at least 10 games in the circle.

We Love Free Bases

The LSU softball team isn't shy about its love for free bases. That case is no more evident than the past four seasons that drawing a walk leads to more offense and chances to score runs. For the third consecutive season the squad has broken the team walks record, earning 264 so far this year, six more than the team had all of last year. Since 2013 LSU's walks received have increased, with this team still having a series and postseason left to go.

#Consistency

In the history of the LSU softball program, seven players have finished a season with at least 50 RBIs, but only two have done it consistently over three years, that being LSU senior Bianka Bell and junior Savannah Jaquish. The duo are the only two to have at least 50 in each of their first three seasons, while Bell is currently over fifty, as she is the first to do so all four years. Jaquish, who set the record for RBIs in a single season with 76 last year, is second all-time in RBI only to Bell was the first to set the career mark with over 200.

Smith Named To NFCA FOY Top 25 List

LSU freshman pitcher Sydney Smith was named to the Schutt Sports/NFCA Division I National Freshman of the Year Top 25 list on April 21, the third consecutive year a Tiger has been named to the list. Smith won each of her first five starts before suffering her first loss, as this season she's thrown the fourth perfect game in LSU history to go along with a pair of one-hitters. She was one of nine selected from the SEC.

Going The Distance

In a see-saw game April 16 on the road at Mississippi State, the Tigers withstood the longest game of the season, coming out on top with a 5-2 win over the Bulldogs in 12 innings. It was the fourth time in program history that an LSU team has played a 12-inning contest, improving its record to 2-2 in those games, as it was the first since the 2014 season. It was the second-longest game by inning for an SEC team this season.

LSU Plays Third-Longest Game Ever

LSU's win over Mississippi State on April 16 took four hours and 21 minutes to finish, winding up as the third longest game the team has played in program history. It was the third time that an LSU softball game has lasted four hours in length, with the last being a four hour, 31 minute contest against Alabama on April 18, 2011. The first, and the longest, was a four hour, 45 minute game against Florida on March 9, 2002. By comparison, game one and three of the MSU series combined to last four hours and 31 minutes.

Professional Tigers

On Thursday, April 14, three senior members of the LSU softball team were picked by National Pro Fastpitch teams in Bianka Bell, Kelsi Kloss and Sandra Simmons during the NPF College Draft presented by Bownet. Kloss was the first selected, picked 17th overall by the Chicago Bandits, while Simmons was selected 23rd overall by the Akron Racers and Bell being picked 36th by the Pennsylvania Rebellion. Two of them have teams have LSU ties, as former LSU player A.J. Andrews was selected by the Bandits last season, while former Tiger pitchers Rachele Fico and Brittany Mack were selected by the Racers.

Simmons Swag

Against Southeastern Louisiana on April 13, senior Sandra Simmons went 4-for-5 with two RBIs and two runs scored in a 9-1 win for the Tigers. The four hits is a career high for the Californian, as she became one of five players to earn four hits on the season. Before Monday's

game against Kentucky, she rode a nine-game hitting streak which was also a career long and the fourth longest for an LSU player this season.

Torina Hits 200

LSU's 5-1 win over Georgia on April 2 not only clinched a big road series for the Tigers, but also gave head coach Beth Torina her 200th win as LSU's head coach. Now in her fifth season, Torina, already the second-winningest coach in program history, needed just 285 games to reach the milestone as coming into this season she has half of LSU's Women's College World Series appearances and averaging over 40 wins per season.

Pinch-Hit Power

With two strikes and two outs in the top of the seventh, sophomore Allie Walljasper helped spark LSU's furious comeback on the road at Georgia by hitting her first home run of the season, a pinch hit two-run shot, to pull LSU within one. The Tigers would score four runs in the inning to take the lead, winning game one 5-4, leading to the team winning its first series win against Georgia in Athens since 2001.

Broken Record (Book)

LSU's 30-8 win over Louisiana Tech on March 15 was one of the most prolific offensive displays in Tiger softball history, scoring 15 runs in the sixth and setting a host of records in the process. It was the largest margin of victory in an LSU win in program history, as the hits are a new SEC record, while the runs and home runs tied conference records. The team also tied the record for at-bats in a single game with 48.

Tough 'Em All

Senior catcher Kelsi Kloss set a new program record for total bases in a single game with 14 against Louisiana Tech, breaking Ashlee Ducote's mark of 13 set in April of 2000. Kloss went 4-for-6 with a double, three home runs, four RBIs and four runs scored.

Nice Night for Nine

In a record that stood solo for all of 19 games, Bianka Bell tied Kelsi Kloss' record for most RBIs in a single contest with nine against Louisiana Tech, which was originally set against Bethune-Cookman on February 19 in California. Bell was 4-for-5 in the game, as three of the four hits were home runs, scoring four times. On the year, four LSU players have combined for eight games with four or more RBIs on the season.

We Tried to Tell You... (See: Fool Me Once...)

Never before had LSU have a player hit more than two home runs in a single game going into the contest against Louisiana Tech. That record was broken and doubled in one night as senior Kelsi Kloss became the first to hit three, with Bianka Bell following soon after in the same inning. Kloss already had a pair of two home run contests coming into the game, as she also matched her mark of hitting a homer in the same inning in the sixth. Going into the weekend, Bell had just one home run, as over the course of the next three games of the Alabama series and one against LaTech, hit five to increase that total to six in four contests.

More Awards For Tigers

Just before the game against Louisiana Tech March 15, Bianka Bell and Carley Hoover were named the LSWA's Player and Pitcher of the Week. Bell earns the LSWA award for the first time this season, while Hoover has earned the award for the second consecutive week and third overall on the season.

Bell Named USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Week

Already the SEC Player of the Week, senior Bianka Bell was named the USA Softball Collegiate National Player of the Week the organization announced on March 15. Bell is the second player in program history to earn the award twice in a career, as she won the award around the same time during the 2015 season. Emily Turner was the last, winning the award in 2006 and 2007.

Bell Named SEC Player of the Week

After hitting .467 with seven hits, a 1.000 slugging percentage, six RBIs and seven runs scored, LSU senior infielder Bianka Bell was named the SEC Player of the Week March 14. Four of Bell's seven hits were for extra bases, including belting two home runs in the series against Alabama. She was walked twice and hit twice, having a .579 on-base percentage as LSU went 4-1 last week.

Topping 200

Going into the weekend series against Alabama already the career leader in RBIs, senior Bianka Bell became the first LSU softball player in program history to cross the 200 threshold in the finale against the Crimson Tide March 13. With 196 heading into the series, Bell moved to 199 after her three on Friday, as the two she drove in on Sunday pushed her to 201 with much of the year remaining. At the NCAA regional, junior Savannah Jaquish became the second, needing just three seasons to do so.

Hoover Moves to 10-0 to Tie Record

With her 10th victory of the season on Sunday, Carley Hoover became just the second LSU pitcher to win 10 games without suffering a loss to start a season. It's the first since 2013, and with one more victory will own the record.

NCAA Active Leaders

With a four-year career nearly in the books, senior Bianka Bell is among some of the best in the country over that span, among the nation's leaders in RBIs and total bases. Currently, Bell is second in RBIs, while fifth in total bases. She's one of three players currently in the SEC in RBIs and two in total bases.

NFCA Tabs Hoover as National Pitcher of the Week

Hours before taking the circle later that night against Longwood on March 9, sophomore Carley Hoover pulled in another award as the National Fastpitch Coaches Association named her the Division I National Pitcher of the Week. She is the first LSU pitcher to earn the award and the ninth to earn one of the NFCA's weekly awards in program history.

Hoover Named SEC Pitcher of the Week

On Monday, March 7, sophomore pitcher Carley Hoover was named the SEC Player of the Week, giving the Clemson, South Carolina, native her first league weekly award of the season. It's the second for her in her LSU career. Hoover was 3-0 on the weekend with a 0.00 ERA and 26 strikeouts in 13.2 innings of work, allowing just two hits.

Hoover Earns First No-Hitter

In the LSU Invitational finale against Tennessee Tech March 6, sophomore Pitcher Carley Hoover earned her first no-hitter after striking out seven Golden Eagle batters and only three reaching base during the contest. It's the 37th no-hitter in LSU history and the 23rd to be done in six or fewer innings.

Jaquish Sets Career Multi-HR Mark

With her two solo home runs against Liberty on March 5, junior Savannah Jaquish set a new LSU record for most career multi-home run games with five. The previous record was four, set by Julie Wiese from 2001-04. The next closest is Kelsi Kloss who has four, earning three of those games this season and Bianka Bell with three.

Pitch Perfect

In the opener of the LSU Invitational against Tennessee Tech on March 4, LSU freshman pitcher Sydney Smith earned the fourth perfect game in LSU history as the Tigers won 8-0 in five innings. It was the first perfect game since Rachele Fico's in 2011 against Southeastern Louisiana, as Smith is just the third pitcher in program history to pitch a perfect game solo. The Maple Grove, Minnesota, native needed just 54 pitches to get through the contest, striking out six as it was the fourth to be done in five innings.

Hoover named LSWA Co-Pitcher of the Month for February

Carley Hoover started her sophomore campaign at LSU by winning each of her five starts, holding an earned run average of 1.93 with a shutout, three complete games and 48 strikeouts in 29 innings of work. Hoover is tied for the pitching staff lead in appearances with seven, as she has given up just eight earned runs and 28 total hits. She has two double-digit strikeout games this year, as against Texas Tech she fanned 15 which is a career high and is in the top 10 of most in a seven-

inning game in LSU history.

Hoover Fans 15

LSU sophomore pitcher Carley Hoover struck out 15 Texas Tech batters in the team's 5-3 win over the Red Raiders on Feb. 28, netting a new career-high in the process. Hoover is the first pitcher to fan 15 in a game since 2008, while finishing two strikeouts shy of the record of 17 held by Britini Sneed for the most in a seven-inning game. It's tied for the 12th most in a game for a pitcher in LSU history and in the top 10 for most in a seven-inning contest.

Landry's Late-Inning Home Run Heroics

Coming into the season, junior outfielder Bailey Landry had not tallied a regular-season home run, with her career five all coming in the last two postseason LSU appearances. Two swings against Texas Tech changed all that as she drilled the walk off homer in extras on Feb. 27 and blasted a three-run shot on Feb. 28 in the finale of the Purple and Gold Challenge to give her two on the year. The first one was the first walk off home run in extra innings since 2011, and the 10th all-time in extra innings in program history.

Fool Me Once...Fool Me Twice??!

Kellsie Kloss has eight home runs this season, as seven of the eight have come in the same game, hitting two three-run home runs against Illinois State and two grand slams in the same inning against Bethune-Cookman. Dating back to last year, Kloss has four under her belt in her career. The only other player with more is junior Savannah Jaquish with five and Bianna Bell follows both with three.

Double Figure Scoring

11 of LSU's wins this season have come with LSU scoring 10 or more runs in a single contest. Since 2012, LSU has won 43 games when scoring in the double-digits, having 14 wins last year which was the most.

Record-Setting Kellsie

It took just two swings of the bat for senior catcher Kellsie Kloss to etch her name among LSU greats after her performance at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, as against Bethune-Cookman she belted two grand slams, becoming the first Tiger ever to do so in a single game. With those shots, she also drove in nine RBI, the most in a single game up until that point, besting the record of seven, most recently done by Stephanie Hill in 2007.

Clearing the Table

With five grand slams this season, the Tigers have tied their entire total from 2015 of five. It is the fourth time in program history that an LSU squad has had five in a season, matching the 2007, 2009 and 2015 teams. Since 2012, LSU has hit 16 grand slams, as from 1997-2009 there were 23, with none from 2009-2012.

Owning the Third

So far this season, LSU is outscoring its opponents 73-41 in the third inning alone. Even without the UConn 13-run frame, the Tigers would still be outscoring teams 60-41, scoring in the frame in 26 of the team's games so far this season. When LSU scores in the third, the Tigers are 24-2.

Jaquish Named SEC Player of the Week

Junior Savannah Jaquish was named the SEC's Player of the Week on Feb. 15 after her nine-hit, nine-RBI performance in the Tiger Classic. It's the third time in her career she's earned the award and fourth time she's been honored by the league as a Tiger.

Double-Digit Innings

Three times this season the Tigers have plated double-digit runs in a single inning, as LSU first scored double-digit runs in a single inning with 13 in the third against UConn. Since then the Tigers have done it twice more, tying the record of 15 on the road at Louisiana Tech in a 30-8 victory. Before the current staff took over, there were five instances of this happening, since then there have been 10.

Calling for Mercy

In the Tiger Classic, LSU run-ruled every team and won four of their games five games via mercy rule, earning a pair of 9-0 wins over Ohio State and North Florida, a 13-2 win over UConn and 10-1 win in the finale against Pacific. It's the first time in LSU history that the Tigers have run-ruled its first three opponents, and matches the 2008 team for most run-rule victories in the first five games. LSU has had 64 run-rule games since 2012, with 20 coming last season.

LSU Returns SEC-Best Five All-Americans

LSU had a record five All-American selections last season in the program's history in Bianna Bell, Savannah Jaquish, Carley Hoover, Bailey Landry and Allie Walljasper, tying for the most in the nation. This year, all five return giving LSU the most All-Americans on a single team in the SEC.

Season Openers

LSU has had the luxury of opening the season at home for the last six seasons, as coming into 2016 LSU is 15-4 all-time in season-opening contests, while holding a 17-2 mark in home season openers. LSU has won three of the last five in both coming into the opener against Ohio State.

Trio Named to USA Softball POY Top 50 Watch List

For the first time, LSU has had three players selected to the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 50 Watch List, as Bianna Bell, Carley Hoover and Bailey Landry all made the cut. The three selections tied for the most nationally along with Georgia and Michigan, as Bell is on the list for the second year, with Hoover and Landry are on the list for the first time in their careers.

Bell, Hoover Preseason All-SEC

LSU's duo of Bianna Bell and Carley Hoover were selected to the 14-member Preseason All-SEC Team before the start of the regular season. Bell earned a spot on the preseason list for the second consecutive year, while Hoover was picked for the first time in her LSU career as both finished last year as first team All-SEC selections. LSU was one of four member institutions to earn multiple selections on this year's list along with Florida and Auburn with three each and Alabama with two picks.

LSU Earns Top Three Preseason Rank

After finishing the season ranked in the top five after earning the program's fourth berth in the Women's College World Series, the LSU softball team will begin 2016 where they left off last year as the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN/USA Softball Division I Preseason Polls were released having the Tigers sitting in third place in both. LSU is no stranger to beginning the season in the top 10 in both polls, as this is the 10th time in team history that the Tigers have been slotted there by the NFCA and the fifth time being selected by USA Softball. The early ranking is the highest to start the year in program history, besting the 2002 ranking that had the Tigers open the year fourth by the NFCA and seventh by USA Softball in 2007 and 2008.

New Year, 'Not-So' New Tiger Park

After having a year with record crowds, fans in 2016 will notice some new enhancements to Tiger Park, such as new entrances, updated tailgating options and the renovation of the berm to the new Tiger Park Terrace. The section in the outfield has been updated and made safer, where over 900 fans can enjoy softball for the upcoming season.

Now, there is a walkway and steps that lead to the area that begins just before the left field foul pole and goes all the way into left center, stopping just short of reaching dead center. There is a new entrance in center where fans can enter to get to the Terrace, with tailgating in the grass area next to the soccer stadium where permanent restrooms will be available two hours prior to the first pitch of all LSU games.

Many Happy Returns

Losing just three players to graduation, LSU will return over 80 percent of its hits, runs and RBI producers in 2016. Also included are three pitchers that combined for 43 of the pitching victories, 33 complete games and 15 shutouts between them.

LSU Picked to Finish Second in SEC

In a vote of the league's head coaches, the Southeastern Conference released its annual preseason poll on Thursday as LSU was picked to finish second after earning three first place votes and 128 overall points. The Tigers finished fourth last year and have won at least 15 conference games in three of the last four years.

LSU Featured Nine Times Nationally

Nine of LSU's games this season will be nationally televised on the ESPN family of networks the Southeastern Conference announced today, with more than 70 contests featuring SEC teams scheduled for air this year. Now in its second year of operation, the SEC Network will serve as the outlet for six of the nine games which will begin in March right at the start of league play.
