

LSU FOOTBALL POSTGAME NOTES
Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl
LSU vs. Louisville
LSU December 31, 2016 – Camping World Stadium (Orlando, Florida)

1. LSU's game captains were 33 **Jamal Adams**, 4 **Duke Riley**, 42 **Colby Delahoussaye**, 83 **Travin Dural**, and 77 **Ethan Pocic**.
2. LSU won the toss and elected to receive. LSU defended the north end zone.
3. LSU improved to 25-22-1 all-time in bowl games with the victory. The win over Louisville marked the first bowl victory for head coach Ed Orgeron's career.
4. The win moved LSU's record to 67-8 vs. non-conference opponents
5. With an 8-4 overall mark, LSU extended its streak of consecutive eight-win seasons to 17 straight.
 - a. LSU has won at least eight games every year dating back to the 2000 season.
 - b. LSU's streak of 17-straight seasons with at least eight wins leads all Power 5 schools and ranks behind only Boise State, who has won eight games for 18 straight years, in the FBS.
6. The LSU defense totaled eight sacks on the game for minus-67 yards. It was just one sack shy of the school record of nine set against Tulane in 1994. (*Sacks became an official stat during the 1982 season*)
7. The Tigers also held Louisville without a touchdown for the first time since a 20-3 loss to Pittsburgh in 2010.
8. Heisman trophy winner Lamar Jackson was held to 10-for-27 with 153 yards. On the ground, Jackson rushed for 33 yards on 26 attempts. Jackson also turned the ball over on a fumble.
 - a. Jackson was held without a touchdown for the first time in 17 games.
9. LSU has now won four bowl games over Heisman winning quarterbacks. The victory made the Tigers the fourth team to defeat Heisman trophy winners in four different bowl games.
10. LSU improved to 68-0 when rushing for 100 yards and holding opponents to less than 100 yards.
11. LSU did not allow a Louisville touchdown in the contest. It was the first time that LSU has not allowed a touchdown in a bowl game since the 2008 Chick-Fil-A Bowl against Georgia Tech, a 38-3 victory.
12. LB **Arden Key** sacked Jackson for a safety. It was LSU's first safety since Sept. 22, 2012, against Auburn when DE Sam Montgomery made the tackle in the end zone. It was LSU's first safety in a bowl game since the 1974 Orange Bowl against Penn State.

Individual

1. WR **Malachi Dupre** totaled seven catches and 139 yards. Dupre's total in receptions and yards were new career highs.
2. QB **Danny Etling** finished the day 16-for-29 with 217 yards and two touchdowns.
3. RB **Derrius Guice** was named the Most Valuable Player after rushing for 139 yards and one touchdown on 26 carries.
 - a. Guice's 1-yd TD reception with 7:14 remaining the second quarter was the first of his career.
 - b. The sophomore added another touchdown on a 70-yard run in the third quarter. It was his eighth touchdown of the season of 20 or more yards.
 - c. For the season, Guice totaled 1,387 yards on the ground. The Baton Rouge native joined **Leonard Fournette** (1,973, 2015), **Charles Alexander** (1,686, 1977) and **Jeremy Hill** (1,401, 2013) as the only players to rush for more than 1,300 yards in a single season.

- d. For his career, Guice now owns 1,823 career rushing yards for 17th-most in school history to move ahead of Keiland Williams, Jacob Hester and Eddie Fuller.
4. LB **Arden Key** ended the day with six tackles and one sack.
 - a. Key set the school record for most sacks in a season with 12 in the beginning of the second half.
 - b. Key tied the school record for sacks when he sacked Louisville QB Lamar Jackson for a safety with 1:08 remaining in the second half. Gabe Northern previously set the record in 1994 with 11 (*the LSU media guide was incorrect when it labeled Oliver Lawrence as the single-season sack leader with 12*).
5. K **Colby Delahoussaye** finished the day 2-for-3 on field goals. Delahoussaye wrapped up his career with 35 made field goals, which is eighth in a career in school history. The senior's .795 field goal percentage for his career also ranks fifth in school history.
6. Junior backup snapper **John Ballis** saw his first action as a Tiger in the game.
7. DE **Rashard Lawrence** earned his first career sack with 3:00 remaining in the second half.
