## LSU Travels to Auburn For Key SEC Western Division Matchup

LSU will go after its third straight win on Saturday when the No. 17/18 Tigers travel to face Auburn at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Kickoff is set for 5 p.m. and the game will be televised on ESPN with Mark Jones (pxp), Rod Gilmore (analyst) and Quint Kessenich (sideline) on the call. LSU (2-1, 1-0 SEC) enters the game coming off a 23-20 win over Mississippi State last week, while Auburn (1-2, 0-1 SEC) dropped a 29-16 decision to Texas A&M. LSU has won four of the last five, seven of nine and eight of 11 against Auburn dating back to 2005. Last year, **Leonard Fournette** rushed for 228 yards and 3 TDs in leading LSU to a 45-21 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. LSU coach **Les Miles**, the Dean of SEC Football Coaches, enters the game with a 114-33 mark at LSU, making him the second-winningest coach in school history. Overall, Miles has a 142-54 record, which includes four years at Oklahoma State. Offensively, the Tigers are averaging 23.7 points and 340.0 total yards (182.3 rushing, 157.7 passing) per game. Since taking over at QB in the second quarter in week 2, **Danny Etling** has guided an LSU offense that has converted 14-of-25 3rd-down conversions over the last 7 quarters. Overall, Etling, a Purdue transfer, has completed 25-of-44 passes for 315 yards, 2 TDs and 1 interception. He's also rushed six times for 29 yards. Fournette leads the Tigers with 285 yards and 2 TDs, while **Derrius Guice** follows with 177 yards and a score. Senior WR **Travin Dural** leads the Tigers with 10 receptions for 95 yards and a TD. Defensively, under first year coordinator **Dave Aranda**, LSU has allowed just four TDs in the first three games and is limiting opponents to 16.3 points and 325.7 yards per game (103.3 rushing, 222.3 passing). The Tigers have recorded 11 sacks with DE/OLB **Arden Key** leading the way with an SEC-best 5. Other defensive leaders for LSU include MLB **Kendell Beckwith** (24 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 1.0 sacks), S **Jamal Adams** (17 tackles), DE **Lewis Neal** (17 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 2.5 sacks) and Key (14 tackles, 5.5 TFL, 5.0 sacks). CB **Tre'Davious White** has returned both an interception (21 yards vs. Wisconsin) and a punt return (60 yards vs. Jacksonville State) for touchdowns. He also has 9 tackles, a PBU and a fumble recovery.

### TALKING POINTS

- LSU coach **Les Miles** has won 64 SEC games (62 regular-season, 2 championship games) during his career with the Tigers leaving him one shy of tying Charles McClendon's school record for wins in SEC play of 65.
- DE/OLB **Arden Key** leads the SEC and ranks No. 2 in the nation in sacks with 5.0 total (1.67 per game). Key's 5 sacks thru 3 games is the most for any LSU player during that span dating back to 1980. (Note: The NCAA rarely included sacks in game stats prior to 1980).
- RB **Leonard Fournette** rushed for 100+ yards for the 17th time (10 coming in SEC play) in his 27-game LSU career last week vs. Mississippi State. LSU is 14-3 when Fournette reaches the 100-yard mark, which includes a 9-1 record in SEC games.
- Under Les Miles, LSU is 57-7 when a running back reaches the 100-yard mark, including a 4-0 record against Auburn.
- LSU has yet to allow a point in the first quarter this year and the Tigers are limiting opponents to just 24% 3rd-down conversion rate (11-of-46), which ranks No. 2 in SEC.
- LSU has been good up front on both sides of the ball as the Tigers are No. 3 in the SEC in both sacks (11) and sacks allowed (3).
- With 8 wins over Auburn, Les Miles has more wins over the Tigers than any coach in LSU history. Next closest is Charles McClendon, who beat Auburn all four times he faced them (1969-70-72-73).
- Dating back to last year, LSU has had a 100-yard rusher in six straight games and the Tigers are 5-1 in those games.
- Tre'Davious White** is now one punt return shy of tying the school record for punt returns for a touchdown following his spectacular 60-yard return last week vs. Jacksonville State. White has returned three punts for TDs during his career, one shy of tying Skyler Green's school record.
- LSU RB Leonard Fournette became the quickest player to 3,000 rushing yards in school history last week when he eclipsed the mark against Wisconsin. Fournette did it in 26 games and 491 attempts to better Kevin Faulk, who reached the milestone in 28 games and 572 attempts.

# Les Miles

2011 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR • 12TH SEASON

LSU coach Les Miles evaluates his program based on the "full measure of success", a process that puts equal importance on graduation as it does with victories on the football field. Miles says that in order to experience the full measure of success, student-athletes must accomplish both and that one without the other doesn't truly define success.

That motto has been the foundation for which Miles has sustained the LSU football program for the past 11 years, a span that has seen the Tigers average 10 wins a year. With 112 victories during that timeframe, LSU has won more games than any other program in the SEC since 2005. In 11 years with the Tigers, Miles has climbed to become the second-winningest coach in school history in both overall wins (112) and in SEC regular season victories (63).

In 2015, Miles extended LSU's streak of consecutive seasons with at least eight wins to 16 straight, the longest such streak among the Power 5 Conferences, and the Tigers have stretched their mark of consecutive seasons with a bowl appearance to 16 in a row.

Now the Dean of SEC Football Coaches, Miles led the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Championship, the third national title in the history of the program. LSU has also claimed a pair of SEC titles – in 2007 and 2011 – while reaching the league's title game three times. LSU has also appeared in 11 bowl games under Miles, winning seven of them, and won 10 or more games a school-record eight times, which includes 13-0 regular season mark in 2011 when the Tigers were ranked No. 1 in the nation for 11 consecutive weeks.

Since taking over in 2005, Miles has guided LSU to five top 10 finishes with three coming in the top five, won double-figure games seven times, produced 22 first team All-Americans and had players win 11 national awards. LSU also leads the SEC with 69 NFL Draft picks during that span, which includes 13 first round selections. LSU led the nation with nine NFL Draft picks in 2014, a year after the Tigers originally set the school mark with nine in 2013. In 2015, LSU had an

NFL-best 40 players on opening day rosters and had five former Tigers – all of which played for Miles – make the Pro Bowl.

Miles' 112 overall wins at LSU ranks him behind only Charles McClendon, who won 137 games in 18 years with the Tigers, while is 63 SEC regular season victories are just two shy of tying McClendon's school record of 65. Miles is also the only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season – doing it three times – and in 2005, he became the first first-year coach in SEC history to lead a team to the league's title game.

In the classroom, 242 football players have earned their degree since Miles took over, and two out of the last four years LSU has ranked No. 2 in the SEC in graduation rates. Under Miles, LSU has produced 187 players who have earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status.

Known by his players as being compassionate, caring and as their coach for a lifetime, the true impact that Miles has on his team and the role that he plays in their development on and off the field was easily witnessed following LSU's 19-7 win over Texas A&M on Nov. 28, 2015 when the Tigers carried their coach off the field on their shoulders in what was one of the most magnificent moments in Tiger Stadium history.

That moment, coupled with LSU's overwhelming win over Texas Tech in the Texas Bowl, has helped serve as a springboard to an offseason of success stories for the Tigers. In January, LSU added one of the nation's top defensive coordinator's in Dave Aranda to the staff. That was soon followed by an announcement that all but one underclassman had decided to remain in school for 2016 thus giving LSU one of its biggest senior classes ever under Miles. With as many as 18 starters returning and with a consensus top 5 signing class, Miles and LSU are poised to make another national splash this year as the Tigers continue to solidify their standing as one of the premier programs in college football.

### Series Notes:

LSU and Auburn face each other for the 51th time with LSU holding a 28-21-1 lead in the series ... The teams have met every year since the SEC expansion in 1992 (24 games) with LSU holding a 13-11 advantage during that span ... Prior to 1992, the teams played only eight times from 1969 to 1989 ... The home team has won 14 of the last 16 games in the series with the exceptions coming in 2008 (LSU won at Auburn, 26-21) and 2012 (LSU won at Auburn, 12-10) ... LSU has won eight of last 11 games vs. Auburn ... Between 1996-99, the visiting team won each game ... Seven of last 12 games have been decided by a touchdown or less ... In games between 1988 and 1997, the contest was decided by a touchdown or less seven of eight times ... Dating back to 2000 (a span of 17 games including this year) at least one team has been ranked in the Top 25 for the contest every year and both teams have been ranked 11 times ... LSU coach Les Miles is 8-3 vs. Auburn and has a 2-2 record at Jordan-Hare.

## NOTEBOOK

### Home Team Has Won 14 Of Last 16 Games In Series

The home team in the LSU-Auburn series has won 14 of the last 16 meetings dating back to 2000 when Auburn beat LSU 34-17 in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Auburn win at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2000 started a streak that saw the home team win eight straight games in the series. The streak was snapped in 2008 when LSU rallied for a 26-21 fourth quarter win at Auburn. The home team streak started again in 2009 with LSU winning in Tiger Stadium, followed by an Auburn victory in Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2010 and an LSU win in 2011 in Baton Rouge. Prior to the 2008 game, the last time a road team won in the series came in 1999 when Auburn posted a 41-7 victory over LSU in Tiger Stadium. Ironically, that was the fourth straight game in which the road team had won in the series. LSU beat Auburn at Auburn in 1996 and 1998, and Auburn won in Tiger Stadium in 1997 and 1999. In 2014 Auburn defeated LSU 41-7, while LSU rolled to a 41-25 victory over Auburn in Tiger Stadium last season.

### Expect The Unexpected When LSU and Auburn Get Together

Since 1988, the LSU-Auburn series has become one of close calls and one in which the teams and the fans have come to expect the unexpected. The following is a listing of some of the notable happenings in the series since 1988:

**1988:** LSU's Tommy Hodson hit Eddie Fuller in the back of the endzone on fourth down with 1:41 left to lift the Tigers to a 7-6 win over fourth-ranked Auburn. The noise from the stadium crowd after the play registered on a seismograph across campus prompting the game to be titled "The Earthquake Game."

**1994:** Auburn intercepted five passes in the fourth quarter, returning three for TDs as the Tigers rally to post a 30-26 win over LSU in a game that become known as "The Interception Game."

**1995:** LSU donned white jerseys at home for the first time since the early 1980's and promptly went out and upset fifth-ranked Auburn, 12-6. LSU preserved the win with an interception in the endzone on the last play of the game. The contest was dubbed the "Bring Back the Magic" game.

**1996:** With the old Auburn Sports Arena burning to the ground a couple hundred yards away, LSU beat Auburn, 19-15, in a game titled "The Night the Barn Burned."

**1997:** Titled "The Comeback," Auburn QB Dameyune Craig engineered a 10-play, 80-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to spark the Tigers to a 31-28 upset of 10th-ranked LSU.

**2004:** Titled "The Call," Auburn appeared to have missed an extra point with 1:14 left that would have left the game tied at 9-9. However, LSU was called for a penalty on the extra point, thus giving Auburn a second chance at winning the game. The second PAT was good, and Auburn held on for a 10-9 win, snapping LSU's 10-game winning streak.

**2005:** Auburn missed five field goals, including one in overtime, as LSU held on for a 20-17 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The win helped propel LSU to the SEC Western Division title and the game is now known as the "Field Goal Game."

**2007:** "Can't See Me" Demetrius Byrd caught a 22-yard TD pass from Matt Flynn with just one second left to send LSU to a 30-24 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The play seemed to have caught Auburn off-guard as the Tigers could have attempted a 39-yard field goal for the win. However, LSU took one final shot at the endzone as Flynn connected with Byrd for the score, who then gave the "Can't See Me" gesture to the LSU student section after coming up with the catch.

**2008:** Freshman quarterback Jarrett Lee led LSU on a 7-play, 54-yard capped with an 18-yard TD pass to Brandon LaFell as the LSU Tigers rallied for a 26-21 win over Auburn. It marked the second straight year that LSU scored in the closing moments of the game to beat Auburn.

**2010:** Cam Newton rushed for 217 yards and 2 TDs in fourth-ranked Auburn's 24-17 win over undefeated and sixth-ranked LSU in Jordan-Hare Stadium. As a team, Auburn rushed for 440 yards, the most ever given up by an LSU team.

**2011:** LSU stepped out of its usual home attire and donned the Nike Pro Combat uniforms and responded with a 45-10 win in Tiger Stadium in what was the most lopsided victory (for either team) in the series.

**2012:** Trailing 10-9 at the half, No. 2 LSU held off an unranked Auburn team using a third-quarter field goal to prevail 12-10. Drew Alleman's field goal proved to be the only points for either team in the second half. Sam Montgomery had a safety and finished with 3.5 tackles for loss.

### Les Miles vs. The SEC

LSU coach **Les Miles** is 64-29 against SEC teams (all games) since taking over for the Tigers in 2005. The 64 wins include two victories in the SEC Championship Game, while two of the 29 losses include a defeat to Georgia in the 2005 SEC title game and the loss to Alabama in the 2012 BCS National Championship game. In games that count toward the SEC standings, Miles is 62-27. LSU is 36-10 under Miles in SEC home games and 26-17 in SEC road games.

### Arden Key Leading The Way in Sacks

LSU sophomore linebacker **Arden Key** has already matched his entire 2015 career mark with five sacks through the first three



games of the 2016 season, becoming the first Tiger since LaRon Landry in 2004 to earn a sack in each of the first three LSU contests of a season. His five are the most through the first three since Anthony "Booger" McFarland had four after the first three games of the 1998 season and the most for an LSU player since 1980 since stats were officially kept in games.

#### White Second in Career Punt Return TD's, One Away From Record

With his 60-yard punt return for a touchdown against Jacksonville State, senior **Tre'Davious White** moved into a tie for No. 2 all time with his third score off of a punt in his LSU career. White has scored each of the last three special teams touchdowns dating back to 2014 for the Tigers, and is one away from tying former Tiger Skyler Green who holds the career record with four from 2002-05. White is the fourth LSU player ever to have three in a career, with the rest of the list as follows:

#### Fournette Becomes Fastest Back To 3,000 Rushing Yards in LSU History

In his fourth carry of the game against Wisconsin, junior running back **Leonard Fournette** eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark, becoming just the fourth player in program history to do so and the fastest, needing just 26 games and 572 total rushing attempts. Fournette finished the game with 138 yards on the ground on 23 carries, his 16th career 100-yard rushing game at LSU, and for his career is averaging 120.2 yards on the ground, 6.1 yards per carry on 19.6 attempts per game. #### Etling The 13th LSU QB To Make First Tiger Stadium Start

LSU junior QB **Danny Etling** was the 13th QB to make his first Tiger Stadium start last Saturday against Mississippi State. Etling, a transfer from Purdue, came off the bench in LSU's third offensive series of the game against Jacksonville State and led the Tigers to three touchdowns on the next four scoring drives as the Tigers defeated the Gamecocks 34-13. LSU quarterbacks in their first Tiger Stadium start have won 13 consecutive games, a streak that dates back to the 2002 season. The last time an LSU quarterback lost his first start in Tiger Stadium came in 1999 when Josh Booty and the Tigers dropped a 31-10 decision to eighth-ranked Florida.

#### Etling The Ninth Quarterback To Make First Career LSU Start In SEC Game, 15th Overall

The last to do so was **Brandon Harris**, who earned his first start as a true freshman on the road against Auburn back in 2014 and before that, Jarrett Lee against the Bulldogs at home in 2008. **LSU Is 29-4 Under Les Miles Following a Loss**

LSU is 29-4 since 2005 under **Les Miles** following a loss. After dropping the opener to Wisconsin at Lambeau Field to open the season, LSU bounced back by earning a 34-13 win over Jacksonville State on September 10. The only times LSU has lost back-to-back games under Miles came in 2008 when the Tigers dropped November games to Ole Miss and Arkansas, November 2014 with losses to Alabama and Arkansas and November 2015 with losses at Alabama, home vs. Arkansas and at Ole Miss. LSU has never lost consecutive games in Tiger Stadium under Miles.

**#NFLSU – Tigers Lead The Way On Week 1 NFL Rosters Since 2014**

Since 2014, the LSU football program has had the most former players on active NFL rosters heading into week one than any program in the nation with a combined 121. In 2016, LSU again leads the way with 43 former players on NFL 53-man squads, topping all other schools for the third-straight season, as it's also the second consecutive year there have been at least 40 Tigers on active rosters. The SEC makes up four of the top five over that span, while being five of six schools with at least 100 players in the NFL over that time.

**No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Tre'Davious White**

A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior cornerback **Tre'Davious White** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2015 and 2016 seasons. White was presented the jersey by coach Les Miles following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp in 2015 and then again this year. White is one of LSU's leading returners on defense after recording 44 total tackles, with 30 on the solo end and 1.5 tackles for losses. Against Syracuse in the Carrier Dome, White cleared 69 yards in a shade over nine seconds on a punt return for a touchdown in the win over the Orange. Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

### LSU Brings Back 17 Starters in 2016 from the SEC's Top Five Total Offense and Defense in the SEC a Season Ago

LSU ended the 2015 season as one of the most potent offenses in the conference and provided a formidable defense to stop any opposing side earning top five rankings in both total offense and defense. Going into 2016, the Tigers return 17 starters from both sides of the line, including bringing back six players who were eligible in the draft as juniors in **Kendell Beckwith, Travin Dural, Rickey Jefferson, Lewis Neal, Ethan Pocic** and **Tre'Davious White**. Backed by consensus All-American **Leonard Fournette**, and All-SEC performers **Jamal Adams, Arden Key** and others, LSU will forge into a new season as one of the most talented Tiger teams in recent history.

### LSU is 50-4 Overall in Non-Conference Games Under Les Miles

LSU is 50-4 record in non-conference games in **Les Miles'** LSU tenure. LSU's only four non-conference losses under Miles came against Penn State in the Capital One Bowl to end the 2009 season, Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31, 2012, Notre Dame in the Music City Bowl on Dec. 30, 2014 and Wisconsin in the Lambeau Field College Classic last week. Of the 49 wins under Miles against non-conference opponents, 13 have come against Top 25 teams, 41 have come by double-digits and LSU has scored 40 or more points in 30 of the 53 games.

### LSU Has Been Ranked in 141 of 147 Games Under Miles

Since **Les Miles** took over at LSU, the Tigers have been represented in the AP and Amway Coaches' Poll 171 of the 180 weeks. The exception came during the final three polls of the 2008 season, five weeks in 2014 and the week heading into the Texas A&M game last season. In addition, since the start of the 2002 season, LSU has played 175 of 183 games ranked in the top 25, including 141 of 147 games under Miles. LSU has a 109-32 record in games played as a Top 25 team under Miles. The only five games that LSU didn't play as a Top 25 team during the Miles era came in 2008 against Arkansas in the regular-season finale and Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl, in 2014 at Florida, vs. Kentucky and at Texas A&M, and in the 2015 regular season finale vs. Texas A&M. This year marked the 16th consecutive season that the Tigers were ranked in the preseason polls as LSU came in at No. 5 in the Associated Press and No. 6 in the Amway Coaches Top 25 polls.

### Three Tigers Honored in 2016

LSU senior **Tre'Davious White**, sophomore **Arden Key** and freshman **Josh Growden** have all earned SEC honors this season. White was named the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week the second week of the year after he returned a punt 60 yards against Jacksonville State to become the first non-offensive player to score touchdowns in the first two games of the season in LSU history. Key and Growden were instrumental in LSU's 23-20 win over Mississippi State to open conference play as Key was named the SEC's Defensive Lineman of the Week and Growden was named the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week. Key had five tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss, including a forced fumble and two sacks. Growden averaged 49.2 yards per punt with a 65 and 61-yarder, with the latter coming in the waning minutes of the fourth quarter.

### Leonard Fournette in LSU Top Five for Career 100-Yard Rushing Games

Since joining the program as a freshman in 2014, running back **Leonard Fournette** has rocketed up the LSU rushing charts, including ranking in the top five in reaching at least 100 yards in multiple games. In 2016, Fournette rushed for 138 yards in the opener against Wisconsin in Green Bay and 147 yards against Mississippi State to get to 17, two shy of matching former Tiger great Dalton Hilliard. ### This Day vs. Night Thing in Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 242-64-4 (.780) at night under the lights compared to a 34-25-3 (.573) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 100-15 (.868) overall at home, which includes a 76-9 (.893) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 24-6 (.800) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. LSU is 40-5 in games played in September under **Les Miles** dating back to 2005. Two of the September losses have come on the road: at Auburn in 2006 and at Georgia in 2013. Overall, LSU is 27-2 in September home games under Miles. The only losses came to Tennessee in 2005 and Mississippi State in 2014. The Tigers went undefeated in the month of September in six straight seasons from 2007-12.

One look at LSU's results in relation to rushing the football and it's easy to figure out that head coach **Les Miles** is a former offensive lineman who understands the importance of running the football. In 147 games under Miles, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 109-14 under Miles when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 65-5. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 64-0. **LSU is 57-7 Under Les Miles When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards**

LSU is 57-7 under **Les Miles** when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2016 roster, LSU has 19 career 100-yard games to its credit as Leonard Fournette has 17 and Derrius Guice has two. Fournette has gone over the 100-yard mark in two of three games this season, while Guice has done so in one game. LSU is 14-3 when Fournette reaches 100 yards, which included a 9-1 2015 record. LSU's only seven losses under Miles when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came against Wisconsin in 2016 (Leonard Fournette, 138), at Ole Miss in 2015 (Leonard Fournette, 108 yards), vs. Notre Dame in 2014 (Fournette, 143 yards), vs. Clemson in 2012 (Jeremy Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards), Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

**LSU's 54-9 Under Les Miles When Winning The Turnover Battle**

LSU is 54-9 under **Les Miles** when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams under Miles, LSU is 22-6 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. The only nine losses for the Tigers under Miles when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Mississippi State and Auburn in 2014, Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005. In Miles' tenure at LSU, the Tigers have a combined turnover margin of +66. LSU was +20 in 2011 and +16 in 2012.

**The Aussie Punting Connection**

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. Jamie Keehn took over punting duties in 2013 and finished his career with the fourth-best punting average for a career last year as a senior while being a permanent team captain and was named to the 2015 SEC Academic Honor Roll. The next in the pipeline is redshirt freshman punter **Josh Growden**, a native of Sydney, Australia, who will look to keep the Aussie Connection going in 2016.

### Les Miles' Achievements at LSU

The following is a quick look at **Les Miles'** notable accomplishments during his 12 years and 144 games (112-32 record) as head coach of the Tigers:

- After defeating Florida 30-27 on Oct. 11, 2014, Miles became only the second coach in LSU history to earn 100 victories. Charles McClendon tallied 137 in his tenure at LSU.
- Miles recorded 100 wins at LSU in only 126 games. It took McClendon 141 games to reach the historic milestone at LSU.
- In fact, Miles became the third-fastest coach in SEC history to reach 100 wins behind only Steve Spurrier (120 games) and Robert Neyland (121).
- With the win over Mississippi State in 2013, Miles became the quickest LSU coach to reach 90 victories doing so in 112 games. It took Charles McClendon 124 games to reach that milestone.
- Also the fastest coach in LSU history to 10 wins (11 games), 20 wins (24 games), 30 wins (35 games), 40 wins (48 games), 50 wins (63 games), 60 wins (76 games), 70 wins (87 games), and 80 wins (98 games) in school history
- With 10 or more wins seven times at LSU, Miles joined Bear Bryant (13 at Alabama), Steve Spurrier (9 at Florida), Philip Fulmer (9 at Tennessee), Mark Richt (9 at Georgia), Vince Dooley (7 at Georgia) and Nick Saban (7 at Alabama) as the only coaches in SEC history to have seven or more 10-win seasons at the same school.
- Led LSU to only 12-0 and 13-0 records in school history in 2011...Led LSU to first 11-0 start since 1958 in 2011.
- Led LSU to 10-1 start three times in a 6-year span from 2005-10 ('05, '07, '10)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Auburn, Florida and Alabama in same season, and he's done it 3 times (2005, '07, '11)
- Only coach in LSU history to beat Florida and Tennessee in the reg. season during the same year; twice: 2010, '11.
- Became the first first-year coach in SEC history to lead team to league's title game (2005).
- Has 16 wins over coaches who have won national titles.
- Coached LSU to 10-plus wins in 4 straight seasons, a first at the school, and to seven overall (the most at the school).
- Only coach in LSU history to lead Tigers to three straight top five final rankings (2005, 2006, 2007).

### Colby Delahoussaye Ranks Second in LSU Career FG Percentage

Placekicker **Colby Delahoussaye** is ranked second in LSU history for career field goal percentage. He has booted 25-of-30 field goals for a .833 percentage. He was 11-of-15 in field goal attempts in 2014, including a game-winning, career-long 50-yard attempt at Florida. As a freshman in 2013, Delahoussaye shattered the LSU record for most consecutive field goals to start a career by converting his first nine attempts. The previous record was seven straight by David Brownidyke in 1986. Delahoussaye also ranks fifth in LSU history for career PATs made at 100. Delahoussaye is a field goal shy of cracking the Top 10 for most field goals made in a career in LSU history. He has 25 through 2016.

### LSU Features Four Graduates on its Roster

Four current LSU football players have already earned their undergraduate degree at the university. **Corey Thompson** and **Colby Delahoussaye** earned their degrees in the fall of 2015, while **Marcus Roberts** and **Christian LaCouture** received their degrees in

the spring and summer of 2016, respectively. Delahoussaye earned his degree in general business, while Roberts, Thompson and LaCouture earned theirs in sports administration.

### LSU Has Scored 24 Special Teams TDs In Les Miles Era

LSU has recorded 24 special teams touchdown under **Les Miles**, including most recently when Tre'Davious White returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown against Jacksonville State. Under Miles, LSU has returned 14 punts for touchdowns, 4 kickoffs for touchdowns, 2 blocked field goals returned for touchdowns, 1 blocked punt return for a TD, 1 return on a fumbled punt, 1 on a fake field goal and 1 on a missed field goal. LSU has scored at least one special teams touchdown in all 12 seasons under Miles. LSU is 21-2 in games when scoring a special teams touchdown. **1988:** No. 18 Ohio State scored with 38 seconds left to rally for a 36-33 win over No. 9 LSU in Columbus. LSU led 33-20 with 4:29 left in game when Tommy Hodson connected with Alvin Lee on a 55-yard TD pass.

**1983:** Unranked LSU upset No. 9 Washington, 40-14, in Tiger Stadium. Dalton Hilliard rushed for 121 yards and a TD, while Jeff Wickersham accounted for four TDs (3 rushing, 1 passing) in the victory.

**1977:** Carlos Carson set the school-record with 5 receiving TDs as the Tigers cooked Rice, 77-0, in Tiger Stadium. Current LSU tight ends coach Steve Ensminger set a then school-record with four passing TDs.

### Notables

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 93rd year in the venerable stadium. This season marks the 86th year LSU has played under the lights in Death Valley. The Tigers defeated Spring Hill, 35-0, on Oct. 3, 1931 in the first night game in the stadium's history.
- Head coach **Les Miles** is 49-6 in Saturday Night home games. The only losses were to two top-ranked teams -- No. 1 Florida on Oct. 10, 2009 and No. 1 Alabama on Nov. 3, 2012 -- to another that became No. 1 in Mississippi State on Sept. 20, 2014, to No. 5 Alabama on Nov. 8, 2014 and to unranked Arkansas on Nov. 14, 2015. LSU's last non-conference home loss was to UAB on Sept. 23, 2000.
- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has finished in the nation's top 10 in average attendance in 52 of the past 59 seasons.
- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 240-64-4 (.786) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. The Tigers are 34-25-3 (.573) at home during the day in that span.
- LSU has won 42 consecutive home games over non-conference opponents. **Les Miles** is 33-0 in non-conference home games.

## FORBES RANKS LSU TOP 5

In Forbes Magazine's latest study in 2015, LSU was ranked as the nation's fourth-most valuable football team with a worth of \$111 million. Forbes ranked LSU as the fourth-most valuable football franchise in 2012, 2013 and the fifth most in 2014, clearly stating LSU is one of college football's most valuable teams.

Of LSU, Forbes said, "we apply the heaviest weight to money that goes towards academic programming, which includes both football scholarships and direct contributions to university initiatives like a library fund or non-athletic scholarship programs. A shining example of this is LSU, which last year contributed over \$7 million to academic programming."

Forbes said in its report that "athletic value, which is next in the weighting order, is the remaining football profit that goes toward supporting non-revenue sports like softball and soccer. The final two areas, conference and community, are comprised of money earned from playing in bowl games and the economic impact generated by home football games, respectively."

LSU set a school-record for attendance in 2014 as the Tigers averaged 101,723 fans for the seven home games. Overall, LSU drew a total of 712,063 fans to Tiger Stadium in 2014, the most combined fans for home games in school history.

## LSU ATHLETICS TRANSFERS \$10 MILLION TO UNIVERSITY

The LSU Athletic Department transferred over \$10 million last fiscal year to other components of the university for use in supporting LSU's academic, research, public service and other missions, Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva announced in August 2015.

"Our athletic department is sincerely committed to supporting the academic mission of the university, and we're extremely proud to transfer over \$10 million this year," Alleva said. "These funds provide vital resources for our students, faculty and staff, and they help to sustain LSU as one of the top research institutions in the country."

The athletic department has contributed a total of \$43.5 million to the LSU-Baton Rouge campus over the past five fiscal years.

Beginning in 2012, the athletic department has annually presented \$7.2 million to the university in accordance with the Athletics Fund Transfer Policy approved by the LSU Board of Supervisors. The policy states that in years in which LSU Athletics yields a surplus, a portion of the surplus in addition to the \$7.2 million may be provided to the university.

The surplus produced by the athletic department in fiscal year 2014-15 will allow an additional \$2.85 million to be channeled to the university, creating a total fund transfer last year of \$10.05 million.

## LSU ATHLETICS FEATURES ACADEMIC CENTER THAT IS A 'MODEL OF EXCELLENCE'

LSU, in particular the efforts of the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes, is one of eight colleges and universities nationwide being honored by University Business magazine in its Spring 2016 Models of Excellence recognition program.

Sponsored by Higher One, a leading provider of financial services to college and university campuses across the U.S., the Models of Excellence program recognizes innovative approaches to encouraging and nurturing student success on campus.

Since the launch of the CCACSA in 2001, LSU's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) has continued an upward trend each year, which includes its most recent score of 84 percent, an all-time high for the school. The 84 percent is up significantly from the school's first score of 67 percent in 2005. LSU has also gone from a GSR score of 69 percent in 2008 to a score of 84 in 2015, which represents one of the best improvements in the Southeastern Conference during that span.

## LSU FOOTBALL RATED AS NATION'S NINTH MOST VALUABLE PROGRAM

LSU is rated as college football's ninth most valuable program according to a study done by Ryan Brewer, a finance professor at Indiana University-Purdue University.

Brewer, who also had LSU ranked No. 9 a year ago, had his rankings published today in the Wall Street Journal as well as online at wsj.com.

According to Brewer, the LSU football program has a value of 612.30 million dollars, which puts it firmly among the Top 10 programs in the nation. Ohio State is listed No. 1 with a value of 946.61 million, followed by Texas (885.05 million), Michigan (811.30 million), Notre Dame (723.59 million) and Alabama (694.87).

The ranking of other SEC teams in Brewer's study include Tennessee No. 12 at 401.98 million, South Carolina No. 14 (398.18 million), Texas A&M No. 17 (359.14 million), Auburn No. 19 (319.32 million), Arkansas No. 20 (311.85 million), Ole Miss No. 32 (216.20 million), Kentucky No. 34 (208.00 million), Missouri No. 51 (108.88 million), Mississippi State No. 53 (103.03 million), and Vanderbilt No. 68 (55.64 million).

## LSU RANKED TENTH IN ACADEMIC POLL OF TOP 25 FOOTBALL TEAMS

When it comes to measuring success of the nation's top football programs both in the classroom and on the playing field, LSU finds itself among an elite group of schools that are excelling both areas.

In a poll conducted by Washington D.C.-area think tank New America and published in Time Magazine, the results took into account a teams' national ranking based on the College Football Playoff Standings and its graduation success rate (GSR). LSU was ranked No. 20 in the final College Football Playoff Standings and were No. 10 among all college football teams in the Top 25 in GSR score.

Combine the two polls and LSU finds itself sitting at No. 15 in the nation, which ranks third among all Southeastern Conference schools. Alabama is first among league schools with a combined ranking of No. 2 followed by Ole Miss, who came in at No. 11. Other SEC schools in the combined Top 25 include Florida at No. 17, and Tennessee at No. 23.

In the academic-only ranking for the Top 25 teams, LSU's No. 10 placement is second in the SEC behind only Alabama, who checked in at No. 6.

Clemson was ranked No. 1 in the football playoff poll, while Northwestern was No. 1 in the academic poll.

## Fournette, Tigers Run Past Auburn, 45-21

**Leonard Fournette** rushed for a career-high 228 yards and three touchdowns in just three quarters of action as 13th-ranked LSU ran past 18th-ranked Auburn, 45-21, in Tiger Stadium. The win was LSU's seventh straight over Auburn in Death Valley as the Tigers improved to 2-0 overall. Fournette and LSU wasted little time in setting the tone for a contest that saw the Tigers dominate the line of scrimmage. On the first play of the game, Fournette raced nearly untouched for 71 yards to set up LSU's first score, a 2-yard run by QB **Brandon Harris** for a 7-0 lead. LSU forced Auburn to punt on its first possession, and the Tigers responded by going 78 yards on 13 plays to take a 14-0 advantage on a 1-yard pass from Harris to tight end Colin Jeter. LSU tacked on a field goal and then extended the margin to 24-0 at halftime on a 40-yard highlight-reel TD run by Fournette, who finished the first half with 169 yards and two TDs on 15 carries. Auburn scored on its opening possession of the second half to pull to within 24-7, but LSU, behind a dominant offensive line, stretched the lead to 31-7 on a 29-yard run by Fournette. Fournette added a 1-yard TD run late in the third quarter to give the Tigers a 38-7 advantage. Auburn scored a pair of fourth quarter TDs for the final margin of 45-21 in a contest that wasn't as close as the final score indicated. LSU finished with 411 rushing yards and five rushing TDs, while limiting Auburn to just 260 total yards. LSU sacked Auburn's QB Jeremy Johnson five times and held Johnson to just 100 yards passing. DT **Davon Godchaux** led the LSU defense with two sacks, while LB **Deion Jones** had eight tackles and S **Rickey Jefferson** added six tackles and a sack. Harris rushed for 66 yards and a pair of TDs and completed 12 of 17 passes for 74 yards and a score to win his first Tiger Stadium start.

LSU rallied from a 13-point deficit at Lambeau Field before Wisconsin placekicker Rafael Gaglianone made a 47-yard field goal that proved to be the game winner, as LSU lost its season opener for the first time since 2002. LSU (0-1) scored twice in a 67-second span of the third quarter to take a lead, and after falling behind again, the Tigers had a first down at the Wisconsin (1-0) 30-yard line with a minute to play. However, quarterback **Brandon Harris** was intercepted at the Badgers 25. Cornerback **Tre'Davious White** had a 21-yard interception for touchdown and then recovered a fumble three plays later to setup a 10-yard touchdown reception by **Travin Dural** from Harris. Harris finished 12-of-21 passing for 131 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. Dural caught five passes for 50 yards. Running back **Leonard Fournette** had 23 rushes for 138 yards and added three catches for 38 yards. Gaglianone made field goals of 30 and 48 yards to give Wisconsin a 6-0 halftime lead. Fifth-year senior quarterback Bart Houston was 19-of-31 passing for 205 yards with two interceptions. Running back Corey Clement led the Badgers with 86 yards on 21 carries, while tight end Tony Fumagalli caught seven passes for 100 yards and a touchdown. LSU was outgained 339-257, as Wisconsin had a 36:57-23:03 advantage in time of possession.

## Etling Leads Football Past Gamecocks, 34-13

Quarterback **Danny Etling** led the LSU football team to three-straight touchdowns and **Tre'Davious White** added a highlight-reel punt return, as No. 21 LSU used a 27-point second quarter to defeat FCS powerhouse Jacksonville State, 34-13, in Tiger Stadium. Etling, a junior transfer, energized the Tigers with a 46-yard touchdown pass to tight end **DeSean Smith** early the second quarter to give LSU a 6-3 lead. With **Leonard Fournette** unavailable due to injury, running back **Derrius Guice** carried 19 times for 155 yards including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. LSU added two more touchdowns in 47 seconds just before the half - a 2-yard dive by fullback **Bry'Kiethon Mouton** and a 60-yard punt return by White - and the Tigers took a 27-10 lead into the lockerroom. While Etling sparked the Tigers offense, the highlight of the game belonged to White. The senior fielded a punt at his 40-yard line, evaded tacklers and retreated all the way to the LSU 19 before turning up field and out-running everyone for a touchdown with 20 seconds left in the half. Etling finished 6-of-14 passing for 100 yards with one passing touchdown and a 2-yard bootleg score in the third quarter. He entered in the second quarter for **Brandon Harris**, who struggled to a 1-for-4 start. LSU amassed 244 rushing yards on 37 carries. **Kendell Beckwith** posted a team-leading 10 tackles followed by **Rickey Jefferson** with eight stops and **Donnie Alexander**, who also set a career mark with eight tackles.

## Gold-Clad LSU Holds Off State, 23-20

Leonard Fournette had 147 rushing yards and scored twice and first-time starting quarterback Danny Etling threw for 215 yards, as LSU built a 20-point lead before holding off a rally by Mississippi State, 23-20. LSU led 23-3 after dominating the first 30 minutes of play. The Tigers held a 282-80 advantage in total offense in the first half. Mississippi State used an onside kick recovery to score twice in 40 seconds late in the fourth quarter. However, LSU linebacker Arden Key came up with LSU's fifth sack of the night and forced a fumble to seal the victory. Etling completed 19-of-30 passes for 215 yards with a touchdown. He became the 13th-straight Tiger quarterback to win his first start in Tiger Stadium. Fournette ran 28 times for 17 yards with touchdown runs of 5 and 25 yards in the first half. LSU outgained Mississippi State, 392-270, while converting 7-of-16 third downs. The Bulldogs managed only 1-of-14 third-down conversions. On the ground, LSU outgained the Bulldogs, 177-56. LSU grabbed a 7-0 lead at the 9:28 mark of the first quarter when Etling hit wide receiver D.J. Chark on a 37-yard touchdown connection in the back of the north endzone. The aerial culminated a seven-play, 64-yard drive and marked Chark's first career TD reception. Fournette dashed 25 yards for a touchdown with 8:25 remaining in the second quarter to give the Tigers a 20-0 lead after Colby Delahoussaye's PAT attempt was blocked. Delahoussaye booted a 27-yard field goal in the second quarter to lift LSU to 23-3. The Bulldogs recovered an onside kick and needed only two plays to pull within a field goal in the fourth quarter. Damian Williams completed passes of 25 and seven yards to Fred Ross, who leaped into the endzone with 3:30 to play. The Tigers defense came to life on the final series, forcing Williams into consecutive incomplete passes before Key came up with a game-clinching sack on fourth down with 42 seconds to play.
