## ORGERON MAKES LSU HEAD COACHING DEBUT AS TIGERS HOST MISSOURI FOR HOMECOMING

**Ed Orgeron** will make his LSU head coaching debut when the Tigers host Missouri at 6:30 p.m. for the school's annual Homecoming contest. The game will be televised on the SEC Network with Brent Musburger (play-by-play), Jesse Palmer (analyst) and Kaylee Hartung (sideline reporter). LSU brings a 2-2 overall mark and a 1-1 record in Southeastern Conference action into the contest. LSU is coming off an 18-13 road loss to Auburn. Missouri, behind the play of quarterback Drew Lock, who leads the league in passing yards per game (377.0) and passing touchdowns (14). Missouri is the only current SEC school that LSU has never beat in football. LSU is 0-1 vs. Missouri, losing to the Tigers in the 1978 Liberty Bowl, 20-15. This will be the first meeting between LSU and Missouri as SEC foes and the first time Mizzou has played in Tiger Stadium. Orgeron will serve as LSU's interim head coach for the remainder of the 2016 season. Orgeron, who has also served as a head coach at Ole Miss and interim head coach at Southern Cal, has a 16-27 overall mark (10-25 at Ole Miss, 6-2 at Southern Cal). LSU goes into Saturday's game with one of the top offensive and defensive players in the SEC. Junior RB **Leonard Fournette** leads the SEC in rushing with 128.7 yards per game (386 yards total, 2 TDs), while sophomore DE/OLB **Arden Key** has registered a league-best 6.5 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss (second in SEC) in four games. As a unit, LSU's offense, now under the direction of **Steve Ensminger**, is averaging 21.0 points and 339.5 total yards per game (191.8 rushing, 147.8 passing). Junior QB **Danny Etling** is 1-1 as LSU's starter and he's completed 40-of-71 passes for 433 yards, 3 TDs and 1 interception. Other offensive leaders for LSU include sophomore RB **Derrius Guice** (239 yards, 1 TD), senior WR **Travin Dural** (14 rec., 142 yards, 1 TD), junior WR **Malachi Dupre** (11 rec., 99 yards) and Fournette (9 rec., 69 yards). Other defensive leaders for the Tigers include: LB **Kendell Beckwith** (36 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 1.0 sacks), S **Jamal Adams** (30 tackles), and **Duke Riley** (28 tackles, 2.5 TFL). CB **Tre'Davious White** has returned both an interception (21 yards vs. Wisconsin) and a punt return (60 yards vs. Jacksonville State) for touchdowns. He also has 11 tackles, 2 PBUs and a fumble recovery.

## TALKING POINTS

- **Ed Oregon** makes his LSU head coaching debut on Saturday against Missouri. Orgeron will look to become the fourth straight coach to win his LSU debut – joining Hal Hunter (1999), Nick Saban (2000) and Les Miles (2005).
- LSU is 2-2 with both losses coming by a combined total of 7 points. LSU lost two games in September for the first time since 2000. LSU is 2-2 for the first time since 2001 when Tigers won eight of their last nine games to claim the SEC Championship (their first since 1988) and won the Sugar Bowl.
- LSU has won seven straight games played during the month of October (all four last year and final three in 2014).
- LSU hasn't lost a home game during the month of October since 2009 when top-ranked Florida beat the Tigers, 13-3 on Oct. 10. LSU's current October home winning streak stands at 16.
- DE/OLB **Arden Key** leads the nation in sacks per game with 1.63 a contest. In four games, Key has registered 6.5 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss. That's the most for any LSU player during the first four games of a season dating back to 1980. (Note: The NCAA rarely included sacks in game stats prior to 1980).
- RB **Leonard Fournette** rushed for 100+ yards for the 18th time (11 coming in SEC play) in his 28-game LSU career last week vs. Auburn. LSU is 14-4 when Fournette reaches the 100-yard mark, which includes a 9-2 record in SEC games.
- In four games, LSU's defense has allowed just 3 points in the first quarter. The Tigers have also allowed just 4 touchdowns this year, which is the fewest in the SEC. The 4 TDs allowed through four games ties for the 5th fewest in the nation this year. Miami is first with 2.
- LSU has yet to allow a touchdown in the first quarter this year and the Tigers are limiting opponents to just 24% 3rd-down conversion rate (11-of-46), which ranks No. 2 in SEC.
- LSU has been good up front on both sides of the ball as the Tigers are No. 2 in the SEC in sacks (14) and No. 4 in the league in sacks allowed (6).
- Dating back to last year, LSU has had a 100-yard rusher in seven straight games and the Tigers are 5-2 in those games.
- **Tre'Davious White** is now one punt return shy of tying the school record for punt returns for a touchdown following his spectacular 60-yard return vs. Jacksonville State. White has returned three punts for TDs during his career, one shy of tying Skyler Green's school record.
- LSU RB **Leonard Fournette** became the quickest player to 3,000 rushing yards in school history when he eclipsed the mark against Wisconsin. Fournette did it in 26 games and 491 attempts to better Kevin Faulk, who reached the milestone in 28 games and 572 attempts.

**Series Notes:** This is the first meeting between LSU and Missouri as conference foes, and just the second ever meeting between the two teams ... Missouri leads the series, 1-0 ... LSU and Missouri last meet on Dec. 23, 1978 in the Liberty Bowl in Memphis ... Missouri won that contest, 20-15 ... Missouri is the only current SEC member that LSU has yet to face since the league expanded in 2012 ... Missouri is also the last remaining SEC opponent that LSU has yet to beat.

## NOTEBOOK

### The Tigers on Homecoming

LSU will play its 90th homecoming game on Saturday when the Tigers host Missouri in Tiger Stadium. LSU has an overall record of 62-24-3 all-time on homecoming. LSU has won 15-straight homecoming games coming into the weekend, as this will be the third time in the last five seasons that the Tigers will host a conference opponent, earning wins over a third-ranked Ole Miss team in 2014 and 22nd-ranked Mississippi State squad in 2012. During the streak, LSU has shutout three opponents, while holding teams to fewer than 20 points in 12 games.

### LSU In October Games

LSU is 297-145-19 when playing in the month of October. The Tigers have not dropped an October home game since 2009, as during that time the team is 22-5 overall. LSU's current October home winning streak stands at 19.

### Arden Key Leading The Nation In Sacks

LSU sophomore linebacker **Arden Key** has already exceeded his entire 2015 career mark with 6.5 sacks through four games of the 2016 season, as he became the first Tiger since LaRon Landry in 2004 to earn a sack in each of the first three LSU contests of a season. His five were the most through the first three since Anthony "Booger" McFarland had four after the first three games of the 1998 season and the most for an LSU player since 1980 since stats were officially kept in games. Key currently leads the nation in total sacks and sacks per game, averaging 1.63, as his 45 total sack yards is third nationally.

### Fournette Leads SEC in Rushing Yards Per Game

Picking up from where he left off from his sophomore campaign, LSU junior running back **Leonard Fournette** currently leads the Southeastern Conference in rushing as he is averaging 128.7 yards per game. With three 100-plus yard contests through four outings, Fournette is averaging 5.8 yards per touch, tied for sixth individually with a pair of touchdowns as well. The New Orleans product won the rushing crown last season and is currently 10th overall nationally in the category. Fournette is also leading the nation in all-purpose yards, with a 151.7 average, a shade over 10 yards better than the next closest player.

### Stingy Defense Ranks Highly

With a highly-touted group returning this year, the LSU defense has been one of the best in the conference and nationally overall, as the Tigers have only given up four touchdowns which is the fewest allowed by any SEC team so far this season and is third overall averaging 341.2 yards per game given up. The four touchdowns allowed is tied for fifth nationally, while ranking in the top 50 in total defense. LSU has only given up 67 points through these first four games and has given up just a field goal in the first quarter alone, 19 fewer than the defense gave up in 2015 and is the eighth time in 10 years that the team has not given up 70 points through the first third of a season.

### White Second in Career Punt Return TD's, One Away From Record

With his 60-yard punt return for a touchdown against Jacksonville State, senior **Tre'Davious White** moved into a tie for No. 2 all time with his third score off of a punt in his LSU career. White has scored each of the last three special teams touchdowns dating back to 2014 for the Tigers, and is one away from tying former Tiger Skyler Green who holds the career record with four from 2002-05. White is the fourth LSU player ever to have three in a career, with the rest of the list as follows:

### Fournette Becomes Fastest Back To 3,000 Rushing Yards in LSU History

In his fourth carry of the game against Wisconsin, junior running back **Leonard Fournette** eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark, becoming just the fourth player in program history to do so and the fastest, needing just 26 games and 572 total rushing attempts. Fournette finished the game with 138 yards on the ground on 23 carries, his 16th career 100-yard rushing game at LSU, and for his career is averaging 120.2 yards on the ground, 6.1 yards per carry on 19.6

#### Etling The 13th LSU QB To Make First Tiger Stadium Start

LSU junior QB **Danny Etling** was the 13th QB to make his first Tiger Stadium start last Saturday against Mississippi State. Etling, a transfer from Purdue, came off the bench in LSU's third offensive series of the game against Jacksonville State and led the Tigers to three touchdowns on the next four scoring drives as the Tigers defeated the Gamecocks 34-13. LSU quarterbacks in their first Tiger Stadium start have won 13 consecutive games, a streak that dates back to the 2002 season. The last time an LSU quarterback lost his first start in Tiger Stadium came in 1999 when Josh Booty and the Tigers dropped a 31-10 decision to eighth-ranked Florida. #### Etling The Ninth Quarterback To Make First Career LSU Start In SEC Game, 15th Overall

With earning the start last Saturday at home against Mississippi State, **Danny Etling** was the ninth quarterback in LSU history to make his first career start against an SEC opponent and the 15th quarterback to do so since the Southeastern Conference went to divisions following expansion in 1992. The last to do so was **Brandon Harris**, who earned his first start as a true freshman on the road against Auburn back in 2014 and before that, Jarrett Lee against the Bulldogs at home in 2008. ### No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Tre'Davious White

A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior cornerback **Tre'Davious White** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2015 and 2016 seasons. White was presented the jersey following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp in 2015 and then again this year. White is one of LSU's leading returners on defense after recording 44 total tackles, with 30 on the solo end and 1.5 tackles for losses. Against Syracuse in the Carrier Dome, White cleared 69 yards in a shade over nine seconds on a punt return for a touchdown in the win over the Orange. Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

### LSU Brings Back 17 Starters in 2016 from the SEC's Top Five Total Offense and Defense in the SEC a Season Ago

LSU ended the 2015 season as one of the most potent offenses in the conference and provided a formidable defense to stop any opposing side earning top five rankings in both total offense and defense. Going into 2016, the Tigers return 17 starters from both sides of the line, including bringing back six players who were eligible in the draft as juniors in **Kendell Beckwith**, **Travin Dural**, **Rickey Jefferson**, **Lewis Neal**, **Ethan Pocic** and **Tre'Davious White**. Backed by consensus All-American **Leonard Fournette**, and All-SEC performers **Jamal Adams**, **Arden Key** and others, LSU will forge into a new season as one of the most talented Tiger teams in recent history.

### Three Tigers Honored in 2016

LSU senior **Tre'Davious White**, sophomore **Arden Key** and freshman **Josh Growden** have all earned SEC honors this season. White was named the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week the second week of the year after he returned a punt 60 yards against Jacksonville State to become the first non-offensive player to score touchdowns in the first two games of the season in LSU history. Key and Growden were instrumental in LSU's 23-20 win over Mississippi State to open conference play as Key was named the SEC's Defensive Lineman of the Week and Growden was named the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week. Key had five tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss, including a forced fumble and two sacks. Growden averaged 49.2 yards per punt with a 65 and 61-yarder, with the latter coming in the waning minutes of the fourth quarter.

### This Day vs. Night Thing in Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 242-64-4 (.780) at night under the lights compared to a 34-25-3 (.573) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 100-15 (.868) overall at home, which includes a 76-9 (.893) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 24-6 (.800) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 64-0. ### Since 2005 LSU is 57-8 When A Running Back Reaches 100-Yards

LSU is 57-8 when a running back reaches 100 yards in a game. Of the running backs who make up the 2016 roster, LSU has 20 career 100-yard games to its credit as Leonard Fournette has 18 and Derrius Guice has two. Fournette has gone over the 100-yard mark in three of the four games this season, while Guice has done so in one game. LSU is 14-4 when Fournette reaches 100 yards, which included a 9-1 2015 record. LSU's only eight losses when having a back reach the 100-yard mark came against Wisconsin (Leonard Fournette, 138) and Auburn (Leonard Fournette, 101) in 2016, at Ole Miss in 2015 (Leonard Fournette, 108 yards), vs. Notre Dame in 2014 (Fournette, 143 yards), vs. Clemson in 2012 (Jeremy Hill, 124 yards), Alabama in 2012 (Hill, 107 yards), Georgia in 2008 (Charles Scott, 144 yards) and Arkansas in 2007 (Jacob Hester, 126 yards).

### LSU's 54-9 When Winning The Turnover Battle Since 2005

LSU is 54-9 when winning the turnover battle. Against ranked teams, LSU is 22-6 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent. The only nine losses for the Tigers when having fewer turnovers than their opponent have come against Mississippi State and Auburn in 2014, Alabama and Clemson in 2012, Arkansas in 2008, Arkansas and Kentucky in 2007, Auburn in 2006 and Tennessee in 2005.

### The Aussie Punting Connection

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. Jamie Keehn took over

punting duties in 2013 and finished his career with the fourth-best punting average for a career last year as a senior while being a permanent team captain and was named to the 2015 SEC Academic Honor Roll. The next in the pipeline is redshirt freshman punter **Josh Crowden**, a native of Sydney, Australia, who will look to keep the Aussie Connection going in 2016.

The final two areas, conference and community, are comprised of money earned from playing in bowl games and the economic impact generated by home football games, respectively."

LSU set a school-record for attendance in 2014 as the Tigers averaged 101,723 fans for the seven home games. Overall, LSU drew a total of 712,063 fans to Tiger Stadium in 2014, the most combined fans for home games in school history.

## LSU ATHLETICS TRANSFERS \$10 MILLION TO UNIVERSITY

The LSU Athletic Department transferred over \$10 million last fiscal year to other components of the university for use in supporting LSU's academic, research, public service and other missions, Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva announced in August 2015.

"Our athletic department is sincerely committed to supporting the academic mission of the university, and we're extremely proud to transfer over \$10 million this year," Alleva said. "These funds provide vital resources for our students, faculty and staff, and they help to sustain LSU as one of the top research institutions in the country."

The athletic department has contributed a total of \$43.5 million to the LSU-Baton Rouge campus over the past five fiscal years.

Beginning in 2012, the athletic department has annually presented \$7.2 million to the university in accordance with the Athletics Fund Transfer Policy approved by the LSU Board of Supervisors. The policy states that in years in which LSU Athletics yields a surplus, a portion of the surplus in addition to the \$7.2 million may be provided to the university.

The surplus produced by the athletic department in fiscal year 2014-15 will allow an additional \$2.85 million to be channeled to the university, creating a total fund transfer last year of \$10.05 million.

## LSU ATHLETICS FEATURES ACADEMIC CENTER THAT IS A 'MODEL OF EXCELLENCE'

LSU, in particular the efforts of the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes, is one of eight colleges and universities nationwide being honored by University Business magazine in its Spring 2016 Models of Excellence recognition program.

Sponsored by Higher One, a leading provider of financial services to college and university campuses across the U.S., the Models of Excellence program recognizes innovative approaches to encouraging and nurturing student success on campus.

Since the launch of the CCACSA in 2001, LSU's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) has continued an upward trend each year, which includes its most recent score of 84 percent, an all-time high for the school. The 84 percent is up significantly from the school's first score of 67 percent in 2005. LSU has also gone from a GSR score of 69 percent in 2008 to a score of 84 in 2015, which represents one of the best improvements in the Southeastern Conference during that span.

## LSU FOOTBALL RATED AS NATION'S NINTH MOST VALUABLE PROGRAM

LSU is rated as college football's ninth most valuable program according to a study done by Ryan Brewer, a finance professor at Indiana University-Purdue University.

Brewer, who also had LSU ranked No. 9 a year ago, had his rankings published today in the Wall Street Journal as well as online at wsj.com.

According to Brewer, the LSU football program has a value of 612.30 million dollars, which puts it firmly among the Top 10 programs in the nation. Ohio State is listed No. 1 with a value of 946.61 million, followed by Texas (885.05 million), Michigan (811.30 million), Notre Dame (723.59 million) and Alabama (694.87).

The ranking of other SEC teams in Brewer's study include Tennessee No. 12 at 401.98 million, South Carolina No. 14 (398.18 million), Texas A&M No. 17 (359.14 million), Auburn No. 19 (319.32 million), Arkansas No. 20 (311.85 million), Ole Miss No. 32 (216.20 million), Kentucky No. 34 (208.00 million), Missouri No. 51 (108.88 million), Mississippi State No. 53 (103.03 million), and Vanderbilt No. 68 (55.64 million).

## LSU RANKED TENTH IN ACADEMIC POLL OF TOP 25 FOOTBALL TEAMS

When it comes to measuring success of the nation's top football programs both in the classroom and on the playing field, LSU finds itself among an elite group of schools that are excelling both areas.

In a poll conducted by Washington D.C.-area think tank New America and published in Time Magazine, the results took into account a teams' national ranking based on the College Football Playoff Standings and its graduation success rate (GSR). LSU was ranked No. 20 in the final College Football Playoff Standings and were No. 10 among all college football teams in the Top 25 in GSR score.

Combine the two polls and LSU finds itself sitting at No. 15 in the nation, which ranks third among all Southeastern Conference schools. Alabama is first among league schools with a combined ranking of No. 2 followed by Ole Miss, who came in at No. 11. Other SEC schools in the combined Top 25 include Florida at No. 17, and Tennessee at No. 23.

In the academic-only ranking for the Top 25 teams, LSU's No. 10 placement is second in the SEC behind only Alabama, who checked in at No. 6.

Clemson was ranked No. 1 in the football playoff poll, while Northwestern was No. 1 in the academic poll.

It was virtually a flashback to the 1972 Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl for the LSU Tigers when the Bayou Bengals dropped a close 20-15 decision to the Missouri Tigers in the 1978 Liberty Bowl before the largest crowd in Liberty Bowl history. Back in that 1972 Houston battle against Tennessee, the Tigers spotted the vols a 24-3 first half lead before almost pulling out the game 24-17. This time around, LSU fell behind Missouri 20-3 before righting themselves and making a gutsy comeback. The first half was virtually all Missouri as the Tigers from the "Show-Me" state held a 14-7 first down advantage and a 233-117 margin in total offensive yardage. Led by running backs James Wilder and Earl Grant as well as quarterback Phil Bradley, Missouri was too much for LSU in the first half. But the Fighting Tigers proved their nickname the second half, driving 80 yards in 13 plays for a one-yard score by All-America running back Charles Alexander, playing his final game as a Tiger. Alexander was a key figure on the scoring push, running for gains of 15 and 19 yards. After Mike Conway's extra point kick, LSU was downonly 20-9. LSU marched right back two possessions later, driving down to the Missouri 30, but this time quarterback Steve Ensminger was intercepted to halt another Bayou Bengal push. Somewhat persistent, LSU finally scored with 1:33 left in the game on a four-yard run by Woodley, but the two-point conversion pass was intercepted and the LSU rally had fallen short.

## Wisconsin Kicks Late Field Goal to Break LSU Streak

LSU rallied from a 13-point deficit at Lambeau Field before Wisconsin placekicker Rafael Gaglianone made a 47-yard field goal that proved to be the game winner, as LSU lost its season opener for the first time since 2002. LSU (0-1) scored twice in a 67-second span of the third quarter to take a lead, and after falling behind again, the Tigers had a first down at the Wisconsin (1-0) 30-yard line with a minute to play. However, quarterback **Brandon Harris** was intercepted at the Badgers 25. Cornerback **Tre'Davious White** had a 21-yard interception for touchdown and then recovered a fumble three plays later to setup a 10-yard touchdown reception by **Travin Dural** from Harris. Harris finished 12-of-21 passing for 131 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. Dural caught five passes for 50 yards. Running back **Leonard Fournette** had 23 rushes for 138 yards and added three catches for 38 yards. Gaglianone made field goals of 30 and 48 yards to give Wisconsin a 6-0 halftime lead. Fifth-year senior quarterback Bart Houston was 19-of-31 passing for 205 yards with two interceptions. Running back Corey Clement led the Badgers with 86 yards on 21 carries, while tight end Tony Fumagalli caught seven passes for 100 yards and a touchdown. LSU was outgained 339-257, as Wisconsin had a 36:57-23:03 advantage in time of possession.

## Etling Leads Football Past Gamecocks, 34-13

Quarterback **Danny Etling** led the LSU football team to three-straight touchdowns and **Tre'Davious White** added a highlight-reel punt return, as No. 21 LSU used a 27-point second quarter to defeat FCS powerhouse Jacksonville State, 34-13, in Tiger Stadium. Etling, a junior transfer, energized the Tigers with a 46-yard touchdown pass to tight end **DeSean Smith** early the second quarter to give LSU a 6-3 lead. With **Leonard Fournette** unavailable due to injury, running back **Derrius Guice** carried 19 times for 155 yards including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. LSU added two more touchdowns in 47 seconds just before the half - a 2-yard dive by fullback **Bry'Kiethon Mouton** and a 60-yard punt return by White - and the Tigers took a 27-10 lead into the lockerroom. While Etling sparked the Tigers offense, the highlight of the game belonged to White. The senior fielded a punt at his 40-yard line, evaded tacklers and retreated all the way to the LSU 19 before turning up field and out-running everyone for a touchdown with 20 seconds left in the half. Etling finished 6-of-14 passing for 100 yards with one passing touchdown and a 2-yard bootleg score in the third quarter. He entered in the second quarter for **Brandon Harris**, who struggled to a 1-for-4 start. LSU amassed 244 rushing yards on 37 carries. **Kendell Beckwith** posted a team-leading 10 tackles followed by **Rickey Jefferson** with eight stops and **Donnie Alexander**, who also set a career mark with eight tackles.

## Gold-Clad LSU Holds Off State, 23-20

Leonard Fournette had 147 rushing yards and scored twice and first-time starting quarterback Danny Etling threw for 215 yards, as LSU built a 20-point lead before holding off a rally by Mississippi State, 23-20. LSU led 23-3 after dominating the first 30 minutes of play. The Tigers held a 282-80 advantage in total offense in the first half. Mississippi State used an onside kick recovery to score twice in 40 seconds late in the fourth quarter. However, LSU linebacker Arden Key came up with LSU's fifth sack of the night and forced a fumble to seal the victory. Etling completed 19-of-30 passes for 215 yards with a touchdown. He became the 13th-straight Tiger quarterback to win his first start in Tiger Stadium. Fournette ran 28 times for 17 yards with touchdown runs of 5 and 25 yards in the first half. LSU outgained Mississippi State, 392-270, while converting 7-of-16 third downs. The Bulldogs managed only 1-of-14 third-down conversions. On the ground, LSU outgained the Bulldogs, 177-56. LSU grabbed a 7-0 lead at the 9:28 mark of the first quarter when Etling hit wide receiver D.J. Chark on a 37-yard touchdown connection in the back of the north endzone. The aerial culminated a seven-play, 64-yard drive and marked Chark's first career TD reception. Fournette dashed 25 yards for a touchdown with 8:25 remaining in the second quarter to give the Tigers a 20-0 lead after Colby Delahoussaye's PAT attempt was blocked. Delahoussaye booted a 27-yard field goal in the second quarter to lift LSU to 23-3. The Bulldogs recovered an onside kick and needed only two plays to pull within a field goal in the fourth quarter. Damian Williams completed passes of 25 and seven yards to Fred Ross, who leaped into the endzone with 3:30 to play. The Tigers defense came to life on the final series, forcing Williams into consecutive incomplete passes before Key came up with a game-clinching sack on fourth down with 42 seconds to play.

## Winning TD Ruled Too Late at Auburn

Danny Etling's 15-yard game-winning touchdown pass to D.J. Chark was overturned by video review citing no time remaining on the clock, and LSU fell to Auburn, 18-13, on a steamy night at Jordan-Hare Stadium. On the previous play, LSU was flagged for an illegal shift after picking up a first down at the Auburn 2-yard line with 0:01 to play. With the clock starting on the official's whistle, Etling - who rolled out of the pocket and found Chark for a tip-toe grab in the back-right corner of the endzone - was ruled to have received the snap after time had expired. Auburn, which kicked six field goals in the contest, celebrated its first league win of the season by running the length of the field to its student section. Etling finished 15-of-27 passing for 118 yards with a touchdown. He was sacked three times and left the game for a play with cuts to his head and lip in the first half. Etling ran the ball 11 times for 23 yet yards including runs of 12 and 18 yards on the final drive. Running back Leonard Fournette had 16 carries for 101 net yards. Derrius Guice added 62 yards on three rushes, while Chark had an end-around for 35 yards. Auburn's Daniel Carlson made field goals of 51, 29, 29, 31, 37 and 29 yards were the only points the Tigers scored. Jamal Adams (13) Duke Riley (13) and Kendell Beckwith (12) all posted double-digit tackles in the game to mark the first time since the 2015 Western Kentucky game that three Tigers tallied double-digit stops in a single game.
