LSU TRAVELS TO ARKANSAS THIS WEEK FOR FIRST ROAD GAME UNDER COACH "O"

LSU, now 3-1 under head coach **Ed Orgeron**, hits the road for its first away game under Coach "O" when the Tigers travel to face Arkansas in Fayetteville on Saturday night. Kickoff between the Tigers and Razorbacks is set for 6 p.m. and the game will be televised on ESPN with Dave Pasch (play-by-play), Greg McElroy (analyst) and Tom Luginbill (sideline) on the broadcast. LSU, which is coming off a 10-0 loss to top-ranked Alabama, is 5-3 overall and 3-2 in Southeastern Conference play. The Tigers have lost their three games by a combined 17 points and allowed just 2 touchdowns (1 to Wisconsin, 1 to Alabama) in those three losses. LSU enters the Arkansas game ranked No. 19 in the both the Amway Coaches Poll and the AP Poll and No. 24 in the College Football Playoff rankings. Arkansas, now No. 25 in the CFP rankings, is coming off a 31-10 win over Florida last week and brings a 6-3 overall mark and 2-3 SEC record into the game. Arkansas has won two straight over LSU – winning 31-14 in Baton Rouge last year and 17-0 in Fayetteville in 2014. LSU is 37-22-2 all-time against the Razorbacks, which includes a 1-2 mark against Arkansas in Fayetteville. LSU's only win in Fayetteville came in 2012 by a 20-13 count. LSU enters the Arkansas game ranked in the Top 25 for the eighth straight year and for the 13th time in the last 14 seasons. Orgeron is 19-28 overall (3-1 at LSU, 6-2 at Southern Cal, 10-25 at Ole Miss). LSU brings one of the nation's top defenses into the game as the Tigers have allowed just nine touchdowns all season, the fewest in the FBS. LSU ranks No. 2 in the SEC in rushing defense (118.1), No. 3 in total defense (315.0) and No. 4 in pass defense (196.9). The Tigers are allowing only 14.4 points per game, which ranks third in the league. Offensively, the Tigers are averaging 26.1 points and 386.4 total yards per game (214.0 rushing, 172.4 passing). RB **Leonard Fournette** leads the Tigers with 705 rushing yards (141.0 yards per game) and five TDs. He's followed by **Derrius Guice**, who has rushed for 629 yards and seven scores. QB **Danny Etling** is 4-2 as the starter for the Tigers and has completed 100-of-171 passes for 1,221 yards, seven touchdowns and four interceptions. His top targets are **Malachi Dupre** (26 rec., 305 yards, 2 TDs), **Travin Dural** (25 rec., 249 yards, 1 TD), and **D.J. Chark** (19 rec., 314 yards, 3 TDs). Defensively, LB **Kendell Beckwith** is coming off a career-best 16 tackles vs. Alabama and leads the Tigers with 85 tackles. Other defensive leaders for LSU include LB **Duke Riley** (68 tackles, 7.0 tackles for loss, 1 Int.), S **Jamal Adams** (56 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, 1 Int.), DT **Davon Godchaux** (41 tackles, 4.0 sacks), OLB/DE **Arden Key** (39 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss, 8.0 sacks, 8 QB hurries, 3 forced fumbles).

LSU TALKING POINTS

- LSU is now 3-1 in the Season of **Orgeron**, winning the three games by a combined 84 points. In four games under Coach "O", LSU has allowed just 5 touchdowns and outscored opponents 73-17 in the second half.
- LSU's defense has allowed only 9 touchdowns all season, the fewest for the Tigers in the first 8 games of a season since the 2006 team gave up 6 during that span. Prior to that, you have to go back to 1982 to find a season when LSU allowed fewer TDs in the first 8 games of a season (8).
- The 9 touchdowns allowed by the LSU defense is the fewest in the nation. LSU has given up just 20 first quarter points and 13 third quarter points this year. LSU didn't allow a first quarter TD until the sixth game of the season (Southern Miss). Wisconsin is the only team to score a third quarter TD on the Tigers this year.
- Under Coach Orgeron, LSU has held its opponent scoreless in 10 of 16 quarters, including scoreless first halves against both Alabama and Missouri. LSU also held Ole Miss scoreless in the second half.
- LSU's backfield features three running backs who have rushed for 100-plus yards in a game this season. **Leonard Fournette** has rushed for 100 or more yards times this year, while **Derrius Guice** has three 100-yard games to his credit. **Darrel Williams** is LSU's other 100-yard back in 2016.
- LSU LB **Kendell Beckwith** had a career-best 16 tackles vs. Alabama. Beckwith now leads the SEC in tackles per game with 10.6 a contest. In 8 games, Beckwith has 85 tackles and 6 tackles for loss.

Series Record: LSU leads 37-22-2

Series Notes: LSU and Arkansas meet for the 62nd time with the Tigers holding a 37-22-2 advantage in the series ... LSU is 14-8 vs. Arkansas since the Hogs joined the league in 1992 ... LSU enters the game Arkansas game ranked in the Top 25 for the eighth straight year and the 14th time in 15 years ... It's the first time since 2011 that both LSU and Arkansas enter the game ranked in the Top 25 ... That year, LSU was No. 1 and the Razorbacks were No. 3 ... This is third time since Arkansas joined the league in 1992 that the Tigers and Razorbacks aren't scheduled to play in the regular-season finale ... LSU and Arkansas played each other in the final game of the regular-season from 1992 thru 2000 and then again from 2002 to 2013 ... The one exception during that stretch came in 2001 when the 9/11 attacks moved the LSU-Auburn game to December, the week after the Tigers were scheduled to end the season against Arkansas ... The teams play annually for the Boot, which is a 24-karat trophy molded into the shape of Louisiana and Arkansas, and LSU holds an 12-8 record against the Razorbacks since the two teams began playing for the trophy that weighs 175 pounds and is believed to be one of the heaviest trophies in a college football rivalry ... LSU is 1-2 against Arkansas in Fayetteville .. LSU will be playing Arkansas in Fayetteville for just the fourth time ... The teams also played in Fayetteville in 1992 (Arkansas won 30-6), in 2012 (LSU won 20-13) and 2014 (Arkansas won 17-0) ...The teams have played in Shreveport, La., more than any other location with 25 games being played in the hometown of Kent Lowe ... LSU and Arkansas also met in the Cotton Bowl twice, tying 0-0 in the 'Ice Bowl' on Jan. 1, 1948 and LSU winning, 14-7 against the No. 2 Razorbacks on Jan. 1, 1967.

MORE ON THE TIGERS

- OLB/DE **Arden Key** ranks No. 3 in the SEC in sacks (8.0), No. 9 in tackles for loss (9.5) and leads the SEC in fumbles forced with 3.
- In its 3 losses, LSU allowed only 2 TDs. The 3 losses have been by a combined 17 points.
- On 96 possessions by the opponent, LSU's defense has allowed TDs on back-to-back possessions just one time (vs. Mississippi State).
- When LSU kicks off against Arkansas on Saturday, it will be 49 days (Sept. 24-Nov. 12) between road games for the Tigers. The 49 days between road games represents the second-longest stretch in modern day school history, bettered only by the 56 days between road contests in 1941 (Oct. 4-Nov. 29).
- LSU's defense has allowed its opponent to penetrate the redzone 23 times and the Tigers have allowed just 7 TDs on those occasions. LSU's 7 redzone TDs allowed ranks No. 2 in the SEC, one behind Alabama.
- Dating back to 2000, LSU has lost back-to-back games a total of 6 times.
- Since 2000, LSU has played 52 of its 60 games during the month of November ranked in the Top 25. And, since 2002, the Tigers have played 52 of their 55 November games ranked in the Top 25.
- LSU is one win shy from becoming bowl-eligible for the 17th straight year, a streak that dates back to 2000.

NOTEBOOK

LSU and Arkansas Battle For "The Boot"

For the 21st consecutive year, LSU and Arkansas will battle for "The Boot," a 24-karat gold trophy in the shape of the states of Arkansas and Louisiana that resembles a boot. LSU has won the trophy 12 times - 1996, 1997, 1999, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2009, 2011, 2012 and 2013 while Arkansas has claimed the trophy 8 times 1998, 2000, 2002, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2014 and 2015. "The Boot" will sit on the Arkansas sidelines during game and will be given to the winning team after the contest.

LSU's Defense Has Allowed Just 9 TDs In 8 Games

LSU's defense has given up just nine touchdowns in the first eight games of the season. The nine TDs leads the SEC and the nation and the Tigers are the only team in the country that hasn't allowed an opponent to score more than 21 points in a game. The Tigers are No. 6 in the FBS in scoring defense, allowing just 14.4 points per game, and have given up just 115 points total which is third nationally.

Tiger Defense Ranks Among Top 3 in SEC in Scoring, Rushing and Total Defense

The LSU defense has been one of the best in both the SEC and nation as the Tigers have allowed just nine touchdowns all season. Overall, LSU ranks No. 3 in the SEC in scoring defense (14.4 points per game), No. 3 in the SEC in total defense (315.0 yards per game), and No. 2 in rushing defense (118.1 yards per game). Opposing teams are averaging 4.6 yards per play, with 3.1 yards per carry average on the ground. Last week, LSU held Alabama scoreless in the first half for the first time since 2007 (vs. Florida State) and limited the Crimson Tide to season-lows for points (10), total yards (323) and passing yards (107).

DE Lewis Neal Earns SEC Defensive Lineman of Week Honors vs. Alabama

LSU senior DE Lewis Neal picked up his first SEC honor of the season on Monday as he was named the league's defensive lineman of the week following the loss to Alabama. Against Alabama, Neal recorded a career-best 11 tackles, to go with a tackle for loss and two QB hurries as the Tigers held Alabama to season lows for points (10), total yards (323) and passing yards (107). It was also the first time since 2007 (vs. Florida State) that Alabama was held scoreless in the first half. LSU players have been recognized for their performance eight times by the SEC. LSU's A Win Away From Being Bowl-Eligible For Record 17th Straight Season

LSU goes into the Arkansas game needing one win to become bowl-eligible for a school-record 17th consecutive season. LSU has played in a bowl game each year since 2000. LSU's current streak of 16 straight bowl appearances ranks No. 5 nationally, trailing only Florida State (34), Virginia Tech (23), Georgia (19), and Oklahoma (17).

LSU Looks To Keep 8-Win Season Streak Alive

With a 5-3 overall mark, LSU is still within striking distance of winning 8 games this year, which would extend its streak of seasons with at least 8 victories to 17. Currently, LSU has won at least 8 games every year dating back to 2000. LSU's current streak of 16 seasons with at least 8 wins is the longest active streak among the Power 5 schools and ranks second to only Boise State (17) in the FBS.

Arden Key Third in SEC in Sacks, Ranks Third in Nation in Sacks Per Game

LSU sophomore OLB/DE **Arden Key** is second the SEC and ranks third in the nation in sacks per game with 8.0 and 1.00, respectively. Key has registered at least a .5 sack in six of eight games this year as he is now in the top 10 in the single-season category at LSU all-time, four away from Oliver Lawrence's record of 12 set back in 1989. His 9.5 tackles for loss ranks ninth in the SEC. Key also leads the SEC and ranks 12 in the nation in fumbles forced with three. Key is averaging 1.00 sacks per game which is third nationally, while .38 forced fumbles per game is 12th.

Etling Is 4-2 as Starter at LSU

LSU junior QB **Danny Etling** came off the bench to lead the Tigers to a win over Jacksonville State in week 2. Etling, a transfer from Purdue, has started six straight games for the Tigers and is now 4-2 as LSU's starting quarterback earning wins over JSU, Missouri, Southern Miss and Ole Miss, with the only losses coming at the last second on the road at Auburn and against Alabama.

Orgeron 3-1 As LSU Head Coach

Ed Orgeron is 3-1 as LSU's head coach, leading the Tigers to a 42-7 win over Missouri in his debut, a 45-10 win over Southern Miss, a 38-21 win over Ole Miss and 10-0 loss to No. 1 Alabama. The 35-point win over Mizzou was the second largest margin of victory for a LSU head coach in his first game with the Tigers. Nick Saban has the largest margin of victory in a debut, beating Western Carolina 58-0. However, the 87 points scored by Orgeron's LSU's teams in the first two games bests Saban's 86 in his first two games in charge. He's the first LSU football coach in the SEC era to win his first two games by 30 or more points and the first coach to win his first three by double-digits. Through four games LSU has outscored its opponents 125-48, which includes a 73-17 clip in the second half.

Orgeron Looks For Win In First SEC Road Game

After leading LSU to a 3-1 record with all four games coming at home in Baton Rouge, LSU coach **Ed Orgeron** will look to be the eighth coach to win his first SEC road game since 1935. Orgeron, who leads his team into Fayetteville with a game against Arkansas this weekend, will look to be just the second since 2000 to win his first conference road game, following Les Miles who won his against Mississippi State back in 2005. Since 1935, Bernie Moore, Paul Dietzel, Charles McClendon, Jerry Stovall, Mike Archer, Gerry DiNardo and Miles have all earned conference wins in their first true road tests. Of that list, Bill Arnsparger was the only to earn a tie, finishing with a 27-27 draw at Florida in 1984.

Beckwith, Riley Top Five In Tackles In The SEC

LSU senior linebackers **Kendell Beckwith** and **Duke Riley** both rank in the top five in the SEC in tackles heading into the Arkansas game. Beckwith leads the SEC with 10.6 tackles per game and his 85 total tackles stand at No. 2 in the SEC. Riley, who is in his first year as a starter for the Tigers, ranks No. 4 in the league with 8.5 tackles a contest. Riley has 68 total tackles for the season. Beckwith and Riley make up the only linebacking duo in the SEC that ranks in the Top 10 in the league in tackles. Beckwith is coming off a career-best 16-tackle effort vs. Alabama, while Riley had a career-high 15 tackles in the win over Ole Miss. Beckwith has four double-digit tackle games this year (10 vs. Jacksonville State, 12 vs. Auburn, 15 vs. So. Miss, 16 vs. Alabama), while Riley has done it three times (13 vs. Auburn, 11 vs. So. Miss, 15 vs. Ole Miss).

Guice Reaches 1,000 Yards, Ranks in Top 10 In SEC In Rushing, All-Purpose Yards

With a 21-yard rush late in the fourth quarter against Southern Miss, LSU sophomore running back **Derrius Guice** became the faster player in school history to reach the 1,000 career rushing yard mark. Guice, who is the 46th Tiger to rush for 1,000 yards in a career, reached the milestone in just 113 carries, which is 23 fewer than Charles Scott. Guice finished with 162 yards on 16 carries and a pair of scores in the win for LSU, as it was his fourth career 100-yard rushing game and the first time he's earned 100-plus yards and multiple touchdowns in consecutive contests. He needed just 113 attempts to do so in his 18th career game. In the SEC, Guice ranks ninth in rushing averaging 78.6 yards per game, while his 7.9 yards per carry is third in the nation. He's fourth in the conference with seven touchdowns, while his 103.1 all-purpose yards per game is eighth. Here is a list of the fastest LSU running backs to 1,000 yards by carry:

Tre'Davious White A Senior CLASS Award Finalist

LSU senior DB **Tre'Davious White** has been selected as one of 10 finalists at NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision institutions for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. White, a Shreveport, Louisiana, native majoring in sport administration has been a mainstay in the LSU defense since his career began in 2013, starting 43 of 45 game during that span. White has six interceptions and three punt return touchdowns in his career.

Etling, Moore Named To CoSIDA Academic All-District Team

LSU junior QB **Danny Etling** and FB/TE **J.D. Moore** were both named to the College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District Football Team for District 6. Recognizing the accomplishments of student-athletes both on the field and in the classroom, the duo were first team selections with Etling being the District 6 quarterback and Moore slotting in as the district's tight end. Majoring in mass communications with a concentration in public relations, Etling currently sports a 3.74 grade point average, while Moore has a 3.99 GPA in architecture. First-team Academic All-District honorees advance to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Team ballot, where first-, second- and third-team All-America honorees will be selected later this month. If either is selected, it would be the first time that LSU has had an Academic All-American since Rudy Niswanger did so in 2005.

Leonard Fournette Sets Single-Game Rushing Record in Win

Junior running back **Leonard Fournette** returned to the starting lineup against Ole Miss and set the school single-game rushing record with 284 yards on just 16 carries. Tehe LSU rushing record, passing Alley Broussard's record of 250, to go along with three touchdowns. Fournette had scoring runs of 59, 76 and 78 yards in the win over the Rebels, which moved him into a tie for 10th place in the SEC, while his 17.8 yard average is the second-most in an SEC game in conference history. The 284 yards is the fourth-most in a single game in the NCAA this season.

Etling-Fournette Third LSU Duo To Pass-Run For 200 Yards In Same Game

In Saturday's win against Ole Miss, LSU running back **Leonard Fournette** ran for a single-game record 284 yards, while quarterback **Danny Etling** went 19-for-28 for 204 yards and a touchdown. It marked just the third time in LSU history that the team had a quarterback throw over 200 yards while having a running back rush for 200 since Fournette had 212 yards on the ground while Brandon Harris had 261 in the air in the Texas Bowl. The first came when Kevin Faulk had 201 yards and Herb Tyler had 214 in 1998 against Alabama.

LSU In The Polls

LSU remained in the Top 25 for the fifth straight week on Sunday as the Tigers slid to No. 19 in both the Amway Coaches Poll and the AP Top 25. The Tigers are also No. 24 in the College Football Playoff Rankings, which were released on Tuesday. The Arkansas game will mark LSU's third straight contest against a Top 25 team. LSU beat No. 22/23 Ole Miss, 38-21, on Oct. 24 and dropped a 10-0 decision to No. 1 Alabama last week.

LSU Defense Has Allowed TDs on Consecutive Possessions Just Once This Year

LSU's defense goes into the Arkansas game having allowed touchdowns on consecutive possessions just one time this year, that coming against Mississippi State in week 3. In 96 possessions by the opponent, LSU's defense has yielded just 9 TDs and 17 field goals. Wisconsin kicked two field goals and scored a TD on three straight possessions in the first game of the season and Auburn kicked field goals on three consecutive possessions in a 18-13 win over LSU. Those are the only two teams that have scored on 3 straight possessions this year. Ole Miss and Alabama are the only other teams to score on back-to-back possessions, scoring at TD and a field goal against the Tigers.

Another LSU Game Impacted Due to Weather

LSU had a contest impacted by weather for the third time in two years as the Florida game, originally scheduled for October 8 was postponed indefinitely, before an agreement was reached by both schools to move the contest to Baton Rouge on November 19. This time, Hurricane Matthew forced the postponement of the game, as the agreement meant that LSU's opponent that day (South Alabama) and Florida's opponent (Presbyterian) were bought out to allow the game to happen. LSU will now travel to Florida in 2017 and 2018. Last year, LSU's home-opener against McNeese State was canceled just four minutes into the contest because of lightning. Then, in week 5, horrific flooding in the state of South Carolina forced LSU to host the Gamecocks in Tiger Stadium in a contest that was originally scheduled to be played in Columbia. Chark First With 70-Plus Yard Touchdown Plays Rushing and Receiving

With his 80-yard TD reception vs. Southern Miss, LSU WR **D.J. Chark** became the first (and only) player in school history to score TDs of 75 yards or more both rushing and receiving. Last year, Chark scored on a 79-yard run vs. Texas Tech in the Texas Bowl.

Tre'davious White Nearing Punt Return Record

Tre'Davious White is one punt return shy of tying the school record for punt returns for a touchdown following his spectacular 60-yard return vs. Jacksonville State in week 2. White has returned three punts for TDs during his career, one shy of tying Skyler Green's school record. Overall, White has scored four touchdowns during his career (3 punt returns, 1 interception return)

Shuffling The Deck

Snake bitten by the injury bug, the LSU offensive line has seen its fair share of changes throughout much of the 2016 season, as four different starting offensive line combinations have been used through six games of the Tigers' season. By comparison, there were only three combinations used in 12 total games for LSU last season and four in 13 games in 2014. Lasting Legacy Of Mike The Tiger

After a four-month battle with spindle cell sarcoma, a rare form of soft-tissue cancer, LSU's beloved living tiger mascot Mike VI was humanely euthanized Oct. 11th at the age of 11. "Roscoe," soon to become Mike VI, came to LSU at the age of two in 2007 and was the first LSU mascot to make use of the new, \$5 million, state-of-the-art habitat on campus next to Tiger Stadium. In a tradition that dates back to 1934, a search for Mike VII is currently underway. Here's a look at notable moments during the reign of each of the previous Mike's in LSU history:

LSU Produces Pair of 100-Yard Rushers and 200-Yard Passer vs. Missouri For Just 6th Time in School History

LSU's offense produced a pair of 100-yard rushers along with a 200-yard passer in the debut of **Ed Orgeron** and offensive coordinator **Steve Ensminger**. **Derrius Guice** rushed for 163 yards and 3 TDs, **Darrel Williams** added 130 yards and 3 TDs and **Danny Etling** threw for 216 yards in the win. Last year, LSU produced a 200-yard passer (**Brandon Harris** 228 yards) and two 100-yard rushers (**Derrius Guice** 161 yards; **Leonard Fournette** 158 yards) in the win over South Carolina. Prior to that, LSU hadn't had done it in an SEC game since 1997 vs. Kentucky when Kevin Faulk rushed for 212 yards, Rondell Mealey had 131 yards and Herb Tyler passed for 213 yards. Overall, LSU's had two 100-yard rushers and a 200-yard passer in only six games in school history. Here's a look at the games that it's happened:

Racking Up The Yards

LSU's 634 yards of total offense against Missouri last week was a new school record for the most yards in an SEC contest, four more than the previous high which was set in 1987 against Ole Miss (630) and 1967 against Mississippi State (630). On the ground, the team's 418 yards were the most in a contest since 1996 against Houston (433), and the most against a conference opponent since 1976 against Ole Miss (426). For fifth straight season, LSU produced a pair of 100-yard rushers in a game when **Derrius Guice** and **Darrel Williams** reached the milestone in the 42-7 win over Missouri. Guice led the way with a career-best 163 yards and 3 TDs, while Williams followed with his own career-highs of 130 yards and 3 TDs. LSU has had 30 games in which two players have reached the 100-yard mark and the Tigers are 27-3 in those games, which includes its current 11-game winning streak when it happens.

Sharing the Wealth

So far this season, LSU quarterback **Danny Etling** has completed passes to 12 different players in the seven games he's played in. Four players in **Malachi Dupre, Travin Dural, D.J. Chark** and **Leonard Fournette** having double-digit receptions on the year at 26, 25, 19 and 13, respectively. Last season just five players had double-digit receptions, with 16 total catching passes on the year. Etling has passed for 200-plus yards in four of the seven games he's played in, while completing 58.5 percent of his passes.

White Second in Career Punt Return TD's, One Away From Record

With his 60-yard punt return for a touchdown against Jacksonville State, senior **Tre'Davious White** moved into a tie for No. 2 all time with his third score off of a punt in his LSU career. White has scored each of the last three special teams touchdowns dating back to 2014 for the Tigers, and is one away from tying former Tiger Skyler Green who holds the career record with four from 2002-05. White is the fourth LSU player ever to have three in a career, with the rest of the list as follows:

Fournette Becomes Fastest Back To 3,000 Rushing Yards in LSU History

In his fourth carry of the game against Wisconsin, junior running back **Leonard Fournette** eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark, becoming just the fourth player in program history to do so and the fastest, needing just 26 games and 572 total rushing attempts. Fournette finished the game with 138 yards on the ground on 23 carries, his 16th career 100-yard rushing game at LSU, and for his career is averaging 126.1 yards on the ground, 6.4 yards per carry on 19.7 attempts per game. Two Tigers Have Scored Defensive TDs

Two current Tigers – CB **Tre'Davious White** and LB **Kendell Beckwith** – have scored defensive touchdowns for the Tigers. White scored on a 21-yard interception return against Wisconsin in the season opener this year, while Beckwith scored on a 29-yard interception return against New Mexico State in 2014. LSU has scored at least one defensive TD for the past three years and for 14 of the last 15 seasons going back to 2002.

#NFLSU – Tigers Lead The Way On Week 1 NFL Rosters Since 2014

Since 2014, the LSU football program has had the most former players on active NFL rosters heading into week one than any program in the nation with a combined 121. In 2016, LSU again leads the way with 43 former players on NFL 53-man squads, topping all other schools for the third-straight season, as it's also the second consecutive year there have been at least 40 Tigers on active rosters. The SEC makes up four of the top five over that span, while being five of six schools with at least 100 players in the NFL over that time.

No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Tre'Davious White

A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior cornerback **Tre'Davious White** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2015 and 2016 seasons. White was presented the jersey following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp in 2015 and then again this year. White is one of LSU's leading returners on defense after recording 44 total tackles, with 30 on the solo end and 1.5 tackles for losses. Against Syracuse in the Carrier Dome, White cleared 69 yards in a shade over nine seconds on a punt return for a touchdown in the win over the Orange. Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

This Day vs. Night Thing in Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 245-65-4 (.780) at night under the lights compared to a 34-25-3 (.573) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 103-16 (.866) overall at home, which includes a 79-10 (.886) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 24-6 (.800) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 67-5. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 66-0. LSU 18-4 When Current Running Back Reaches 100-Yard Mark

LSU is 18-4 when a current running back reaches the 100-yard mark. On two occasions, LSU's had two running backs go over the 100-yard mark in the same game (**Leonard Fournette** and **Derrius Guice** vs. South Carolina, 2015; **Guice** and **Darrel Williams** vs. Missouri, 2016). LSU is 15-4 in games when Fournette reaches the 100-yard mark; the Tigers are 4-0 when Guice reaches the 100-yard mark; and LSU is 1-0 when Williams gets to 100 yards.

The Aussie Punting Connection

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. Jamie Keehn took over punting duties in 2013 and finished his career with the fourth-best punting average for a career last year as a senior while being a permanent team captain and was named to the 2015 SEC Academic Honor Roll. The next in the pipeline is redshirt freshman punter **Josh Growden**, a native of Sydney, Australia, who in 2016 was named the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week and had a career-long 68-yard punt against Southern Miss which is tied for the longest in the SEC this season.

Colby Delahoussaye Ranks Sixth in LSU Career FG Percentage

Placekicker **Colby Delahoussaye** is ranked sixth in LSU history for career field goal percentage. He has booted 29-of-37 field goals for a .784 percentage. He was 11-of-15 in field goal attempts in 2014, including a game-winning, career-long 50-yard attempt at Florida. As a freshman in 2013, Delahoussaye shattered the LSU record for most consecutive field goals to start a career by converting his first nine attempts. The previous record was seven straight by David Browndyke in 1986. Delahoussaye also ranks third in LSU history for career PATs made at 115. Delahoussaye is now in Top 10 for most field goals made in a career in LSU history. He has 29 through 2016 which is 10th all-time.

LSU Features Four Graduates on its Roster

Four current LSU football players have already earned their undergraduate degree at the university. **Corey Thompson** and **Colby Delahoussaye** earned their degrees in the fall of 2015, while **Marcus Roberts** and **Christian LaCouture** received their degrees in the spring and summer of 2016, respectively. Delahoussaye earned his degree in general business, while Roberts, Thompson and LaCouture earned theirs in sports administration.

Two Current Tigers Have Accounted For Four Special Teams Touchdowns

FORBES RANKS LSU TOP 5

In Forbes Magazine's latest study in 2015, LSU was ranked as the nation's fourth-most valuable football team with a worth of \$111 million. Forbes ranked LSU as the fourth-most valuable football franchise in 2012, 2013 and the fifth most in 2014, clearly stating LSU is one of college football's most valuable teams.

Of LSU, Forbes said, "we apply the heaviest weight to money that goes towards academic programming, which includes both football scholarships and direct contributions to university initiatives like a library fund or non-athletic scholarship programs. A shining example of this is LSU, which last year contributed over \$7 million to academic programming."

Forbes said in its report that "athletic value, which is next in the weighting order, is the remaining football profit that goes toward supporting non-revenue sports like softball and soccer. The final two areas, conference and community, are comprised of money earned from playing in bowl games and the economic impact generated by home football games, respectively."

LSU set a school-record for attendance in 2014 as the Tigers averaged 101,723 fans for the seven home games. Overall, LSU drew a total of 712,063 fans to Tiger Stadium in 2014, the most combined fans for home games in school history.

LSU ATHLETICS TRANSFERS \$10 MILLION TO UNIVERSITY

The LSU Athletic Department transferred over \$10 million last fiscal year to other components of the university for use in supporting LSU's academic, research, public service and other missions, Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva announced in August 2015.

"Our athletic department is sincerely committed to supporting the academic mission of the university, and we're extremely proud to transfer over \$10 million this year," Alleva said. "These funds provide vital resources for our students, faculty and staff, and they help to sustain LSU as one of the top research institutions in the country."

The athletic department has contributed a total of \$43.5 million to the LSU-Baton Rouge campus over the past five fiscal years.

Beginning in 2012, the athletic department has annually presented \$7.2 million to the university in accordance with the Athletics Fund Transfer Policy approved by the LSU Board of Supervisors. The policy states that in years in which LSU Athletics yields a surplus, a portion of the surplus in addition to the \$7.2 million may be provided to the university.

The surplus produced by the athletic department in fiscal year 2014-15 will allow an additional \$2.85 million to be channeled to the university, creating a total fund transfer last year of \$10.05 million.

LSU ATHLETICS FEATURES ACADEMIC CENTER THAT IS A 'MODEL OF EXCELLENCE'

LSU, in particular the efforts of the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes, is one of eight colleges and universities nationwide being honored by University Business magazine in its Spring 2016 Models of Excellence recognition program.

Sponsored by Higher One, a leading provider of financial services to college and university campuses across the U.S., the Models of Excellence program recognizes innovative approaches to encouraging and nurturing student success on campus.

Since the launch of the CCACSA in 2001, LSU's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) has continued an upward trend each year, which includes its most recent score of 84 percent, an all-time high for the school. The 84 percent is up significantly from the school's first score of 67 percent in 2005. LSU has also gone from a GSR score of 69 percent in 2008 to a score of 84 in 2015, which represents one of the best improvements in the Southeastern Conference during that span.

LSU FOOTBALL RATED AS NATION'S NINTH MOST VALUABLE PROGRAM

LSU is rated as college football's ninth most valuable program according to a study done by Ryan Brewer, a finance professor at Indiana University-Purdue University.

Brewer, who also had LSU ranked No. 9 a year ago, had his rankings published today in the Wall Street Journal as well as online at wsj.com.

According to Brewer, the LSU football program has a value of 612.30 million dollars, which puts it firmly among the Top 10 programs in the nation. Ohio State is listed No. 1 with a value of 946.61 million, followed by Texas (885.05 million), Michigan (811.30 million), Notre Dame (723.59 million) and Alabama (694.87).

The ranking of other SEC teams in Brewer's study include Tennessee No. 12 at 401.98 million, South Carolina No. 14 (398.18 million), Texas A&M No. 17 (359.14 million), Auburn No. 19 (319.32 million), Arkansas No. 20 (311.85 million), Ole Miss No. 32 (216.20 million), Kentucky No. 34 (208.00 million), Missouri No. 51 (108.88 million), Mississippi State No. 53 (103.03 million), and Vanderbilt No. 68 (55.64 million).

LSU RANKED TENTH IN ACADEMIC POLL OF TOP 25 FOOTBALL TEAMS

When it comes to measuring success of the nation's top football programs both in the classroom and on the playing field, LSU finds itself among an elite group of schools that are excelling both areas.

In a poll conducted by Washington D.C.-area think tank New America and published in Time Magazine, the results took into account a teams' national ranking based on the College Football Playoff Standings and its graduation success rate (GSR). LSU was ranked No. 20 in the final College Football Playoff Standings and were No. 10 among all college football teams in the Top 25 in GSR score.

Combine the two polls and LSU finds itself sitting at No. 15 in the nation, which ranks third among all Southeastern Conference schools. Alabama is first among league schools with a combined ranking of No. 2 followed by Ole Miss, who came in at No. 11. Other SEC schools in the combined Top 25 include Florida at No. 17, and Tennessee at No. 23.

In the academic-only ranking for the Top 25 teams, LSU's No. 10 placement is second in the SEC behind only Alabama, who checked in at No. 6.

Clemson was ranked No. 1 in the football playoff poll, while Northwestern was No. 1 in the academic poll.

Arkansas Uses Big Plays To Get Past No. 9 LSU, 31-14

Arkansas scored on runs of 80 and 69 yards and added a 52-yard TD pass as the Hogs upset No. 9 LSU, 31-14, in Tiger Stadium. LSU fell to 7-2 overall and 4-2 in league play, while the Razorbacks won their fourth straight and improved to 6-4 overall and 4-2 in SEC action. Arkansas raced out to a 21-0 lead in the first half thanks in part to a pair of big plays – the first a 52-yard TD pass from Brandon Allen to Dominique Reed and then an 80-yard run by Alex Collins. Following a fumble by **Brandon Harris** deep in LSU territory, the Hogs needed just two plays to go 11 yards to stretch the lead to 21-0 on a 5-yard run by Collins. LSU pulled to within 21-7 just before halftime when Harris connected with **Malachi Dupre** on a 5-yard TD pass. LSU opened the second half with an 8-play, 67-yard drive capped with a 2-yard run by **Leonard Fournette** to get the Tigers within 21-14. Arkansas regained the momentum on the ensuing kickoff with a 40-yard return midfield which led to 25-yard field goal and a 24-14 Arkansas advantage with 5:26 left in the third quarter. Arkansas put the game out of reach early in the fourth quarter on a 69-yard TD run to stretch the lead to what proved to be the final tally, 31-14. For the game, Fournette led LSU with 91 yards and a TD on 19 carries. Harris connected on 21-of-35 passes for 271 yards and a score. Dupre led the Tigers with eight catches for 109 yards and a TD. LSU held the SEC's No. 2 rated quarterback in Allen to just 9-of-16 passing for 141 yards. Arkansas rushed for 299 yards and finished with 440 total yards. LBs Lamar Louis (9 tackles) and Deion Jones (7 tackles, 1.0 sacks, 2.0 TFL) led the Tigers on defense.

Wisconsin Kicks Late Field Goal to Break LSU Streak

LSU rallied from a 13-point deficit at Lambeau Field before Wisconsin placekicker Rafael Gaglianone made a 47-yard field goal that proved to be the game winner, as LSU lost its season opener for the first time since 2002. LSU (0-1) scored twice in a 67-second span of the third quarter to take a lead, and after falling behind again, the Tigers had a first down at the Wisconsin (1-0) 30-yard line with a minute to play. However, quarterback **Brandon Harris** was intercepted at the Badgers 25. Cornerback **Tre'Davious White** had a 21-yard interception for touchdown and then recovered a fumble three plays later to setup a 10-yard touchdown reception by **Travin Dural** from Harris. Harris finished 12-of-21 passing for 131 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. Dural caught five passes for 50 yards. Running back **Leonard Fournette** had 23 rushes for 138 yards and added three catches for 38 yards. Gaglianone made field goals of 30 and 48 yards to give Wisconsin a 6-0 halftime lead. Fifth-year senior quarterback Bart Houston was 19-of-31 passing for 205 yards with two interceptions. Running back Corey Clement led the Badgers with 86 yards on 21 carries, while tight end Tony Fumagalli caught seven passes for 100 yards and a touchdown. LSU was outgained 339-257, as Wisconsin had a 36:57-23:03 advantage in time of possession.

Etling Leads Football Past Gamecocks, 34-13

Quarterback **Danny Etling** led the LSU football team to three-straight touchdowns and **Tre'Davious White** added a highlight-reel punt return, as No. 21 LSU used a 27-point second quarter to defeat FCS powerhouse Jacksonville State, 34-13, in Tiger Stadium. Etling, a junior transfer, energized the Tigers with a 46-yard touchdown pass to tight end **DeSean Smith** early the second quarter to give LSU a 6-3 lead. With **Leonard Fournette** unavailable due to injury, running back **Derrius Guice** carried 19 times for 155 yards including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. LSU added two more touchdowns in 47 seconds just before the half - a 2-yard dive by fullback **Bry'Kiethon Mouton** and a 60-yard punt return by White - and the Tigers took a 27-10 lead into the lockerroom. While Etling sparked the Tigers offense, the highlight of the game belonged to White. The senior fielded a punt at his 40-yard line, evaded tacklers and retreated all the way to the LSU 19 before turning up field and out-running everyone for a touchdown with 20 seconds left in the half. Etling finished 6-of-14 passing for 100 yards with one passing touchdown and a 2-yard bootleg score in the third quarter. He entered in the second quarter for **Brandon Harris**, who struggled to a 1-for-4 start. LSU amassed 244 rushing yards on 37 carries. **Kendell Beckwith** posted a team-leading 10 tackles followed by **Rickey Jefferson** with eight stops and **Donnie Alexander**, who also set a career mark with eight tackles.

Gold-Clad LSU Holds Off State, 23-20

Leonard Fournette had 147 rushing yards and scored twice and first-time starting quarterback Danny Etling threw for 215 yards, as LSU built a 20-point lead before holding off a rally by Mississippi State, 23-20. LSU led 23-3 after dominating the first 30 minutes of play. The Tigers held a 282-80 advantage in total offense in the first half. Mississippi State used an onside kick recovery to score twice in 40 seconds late in the fourth quarter. However, LSU linebacker Arden Key came up with LSU's fifth sack of the night and forced a fumble to seal the victory. Etling completed 19-of-30 passes for 215 yards with a touchdown. He became the 13th-straight Tiger quarterback to win his first start in Tiger Stadium. Fournette ran 28 times for 17 yards with touchdown runs of 5 and 25 yards in the first half. LSU outgained Mississippi State, 392-270, while converting 7-of-16 third downs. The Bulldogs managed only 1-of-14 third-down conversions. On the ground, LSU outgained the Bulldogs, 177-56. LSU grabbed a 7-0 lead at the 9:28 mark of the first quarter when Etling hit wide receiver D.J. Chark on a 37-yard touchdown connection in the back of the north endzone. The aerial culminated a seven-play, 64-yard drive and marked Chark's first career TD reception. Fournette dashed 25 yards for a touchdown with 8:25 remaining in the second quarter to give the Tigers a 20-0 lead after Colby Delahoussaye's PAT attempt was blocked. Delahoussaye booted a 27-yard field goal in the second quarter to lift LSU to 23-3. The Bulldogs recovered an onside kick and needed only two plays to pull within a field goal in the fourth quarter. Damian Williams completed passes of 25 and seven yards to Fred Ross, who leaped into the endzone with 3:30 to play. The Tigers defense came to life on the final series, forcing Williams into consecutive incomplete passes before Key came up with a game-clinching sack on fourth down with 42 seconds to play.

Winning TD Ruled Too Late at Auburn

Danny Etling's 15-yard game-winning touchdown pass to D.J. Chark was overturned by video review citing no time remaining on the clock, and LSU fell to Auburn, 18-13, on a steamy night at Jordan-Hare Stadium. On the previous play, LSU was flagged for an illegal shift after picking up a first down at the Auburn 2-yard line with 0:01 to play. With the clock starting on the official's whistle, Etling - who rolled out of the pocket and found Chark for a tip-toe grab in the back-right corner of the endzone - was ruled to have received the snap after time had expired. Auburn, which kicked six field goals in the contest, celebrated its first league win of the season by running the length of the field to its student section. Etling finished 15-of-27 passing for 118 yards with a touchdown. He was sacked three times and left the game for a play with cuts to his head and lip in the first half. Etling ran the ball 11 times for 23 yet yards including runs of 12 and 18 yards on the final drive. Running back Leonard Fournette had 16 carries for 101 net yards. Derrius Guice added 62 yards on three rushes, while Chark had an end-around for 35 yards. Auburn's Daniel Carlson made field goals of 51, 29, 29, 31, 37 and 29 yards were the only points the Tigers scored. Jamal Adams (13) Duke Riley (13) and Kendall Beckwith (12) all posted double-digit tackles in the game to mark the first time since the 2015 Western Kentucky game that three Tigers tallied double-digit stops in a single game.

Football Blasts Missouri in Orgeron Debut

In Ed Orgeron's debut, LSU amassed 634 yards of total offense and dominated Missouri on both sides of the ball to hand the first-time visitors to Tiger Stadium a 42-7 defeat. Orgeron took over as interim head coach on Sunday when Les Miles was relieved of his duties following a 2-2 start to the 2016 season. LSU running backs **Derrius Guice** and **Darrel Williams** led the Tigers to a school record for total offense in SEC games, previously 630 yards set in 1987 at Ole Miss and 1967 against Mississippi State. With **Leonard Fournette** sidelined with an injury, both had career nights. Guice carried 17 times for 163 yards, while Williams had 21 carries for 130 yards. Each scored three touchdowns. Quarterback **Danny Etling** also had a splendid outing, 19-of-30 for 216 yards. He completed passes to nine different receivers, with **Malachi Dupre** and **Travin Dural** catching four passes apiece. LSU's 418 rushing yards was its most in an SEC game since Oct. 30, 1976, against Ole Miss (426). The homestanding Tigers had possession for 42:33 - its highest on record (dating to 1978). LSU opened the scoring at the 6:46 mark of the first quarter on a brilliant 42-yard touchdown run by Guice. The dash, which featured a key block from wide receiver **Russell Gage**, culminated an 85-yard, nine-play march to give the Bayou Bengals a 7-0 lead. LSU halted a Missouri drive early in the second quarter when **Tre'Davious White** intercepted Mizzou's Drew Lock at the Bayou Bengals' 11-yard line. The interception was the sixth of White's career and his second this season. LSU took advantage of the turnover, driving 89 yards on 13 plays, with the march ending on Guice's four-yard scoring burst. The touchdown gave Guice, a sophomore from Baton Rouge, the first multi-TD game of his career. Guice increased the lead to 21-0 with 4:40 left in the first half with a 37-yard touchdown sprint, capping a 93-yard, five-play march, the longest TD drive of the season for LSU. LSU started strong in the second half, covering 75 yards in eight plays on the first drive of the third quarter, with Williams finishing the drive on a 1-yard TD surge. LSU added another touchdown at the 10:00 mark of the fourth quarter, when Williams scored a on two-yard TD run to cap an 86-yard, 10-play march. Williams scored for the third time on a 9-yard run with just under five minutes left in the game. **Kendall Beckwith** led the way in tackles with nine stops, followed by **Duke Riley** and **Dwayne Thomas** who each posted five tackles.

Big-Play LSU Too Much for USM, 45-10

LSU had five touchdown drives of three plays or less, as the quick-strike Tigers shook off an unexpected week of rust to defeat Southern Miss, 45-10, on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. **Danny Etling** connected on touchdown passes of 80 and 63 yards, while running back **Derrius Guice** had touchdown runs of 61 and 20 yards in a 28-point third-quarter outburst that ended the Eagles' upset bid. The Tigers extended a non-conference winning streak to 47 games in Tiger Stadium. Etling completed 11-of-18 passes for a season-high 276 yards with three touchdowns and his first interception in 104 pass attempts. **Malachi Dupre** caught two of the touchdowns and finished with three catches for 100 yards, while **D.J. Chark** added 91 yards on three grabs with an 80-yard touchdown. Guice, who moved over 1,000 career rushing yards, needed only 16 carries to gain 162 of LSU's 182 net yards. He scored back-to-back touchdowns early in the third quarter. After being tied at 10-10 at halftime, the Tigers outscored Southern Miss 35-0 in the second half and outgained the Eagles, 338-107. LSU was 5-of-9 on third downs. Entering the contest, Southern Miss ranked No. 4 nationally allowing only 14 third-down conversions in six games this season. The Tigers averaged 10.9 yards per play - 459 yards on 42 plays - a modern-day school record. Defensively, the Tigers allowed only 81 rushing yards on 36 attempts. **Kendell Beckwith** led the way with a career-best 15 tackles including two behind the line.

While Fournette Runs Wild, LSU 'D' Shuts Down Rebels

Leonard Fournette set a school record with 284 rushing yards, as 25th-ranked LSU pitched a second-half shutout of No. 23 Ole Miss, 38-21, on a late Saturday night in Tiger Stadium. LSU, which was tied 21-21 at the half, dominated the final 30 minutes of play, allowing only 54 yards of total offense in the second half until the game's final drive. With the game decided, Ole Miss added 50 more as fans poured to the parking lots during the game's final drive. Fournette needed only 16 carries to break Alley Broussard's 2004 record of 250 yards, which was also set against Ole Miss. He scored on runs of 59, 76 and 78 yards, averaging a school-record 17.8 yards per carry (minimum 15 carries). Meanwhile, quarterback Danny Etling completed 19-of-28 passes for 204 yards with a 40-yard touchdown pass to D.J. Chark. Malachi Dupre caught a game-high five passes for 52 yards, while Travin Dural added four catches for 48 yards. After allowing 221 yards in the opening half, LSU's defense gave up only 37 in the third quarter while building a 10-point advantage. Derrius Guice slammed the door shut with a 6-yard touchdown run that capped an 11-play, 70-yard drive that lasted 6:03. Guice also had 16 carries for 67 yards. LSU outgained Ole Miss, 515-325. Ole Miss quarterback Chad Kelly, the SEC's leading passer, was held nearly 100 yards below his season average of 308.2 by a swarming LSU defense. Duke Riley logged a career-high 15 tackles in the contest. He had five solo stops as well as 1.5 TFL and an interception.

Hurts Leads Alabama Past LSU Late, 10-0

No. 13 LSU played No. 1 Alabama to a scoreless tie through three quarters, but the Tide scored on consecutive fourth-quarter possessions to win 10-0 Saturday night in Tiger Stadium. Alabama (9-0, 6-0 SEC) was shutout in the first half for the first time in 127 games, but quarterback Jalen Hurts' shook loose in the final quarter to secure the victory. Hurts ran for 114 yards and the game's only touchdown, while passing for 107 yards with an interception. Alabama managed 323 yards of total offense, though the Tide didn't score until Hurts' 21-yard run with 13:08 to play. LSU struggled to move the ball against the Tide defense, managing only 125 yards of total offense. Quarterback **Danny Etling** was 11-of-24 passing for 92 yards with an interception. He was sacked five times. **Leonard Fournette** ran 17 times for 35 net yards. Both teams missed field goals in the first half. **Kendell Beckwith** led LSU with a career-best 16 tackles, while **Lewis Neal** also added a career-best with 11 to go along with two quarterback hurries. LSU safety **Jamal Adams** intercepted Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts on the Tide's first drive, giving the Tigers possession at the Alabama 33-yard line. The pick was Adams' first of the season and the fifth of his career. The Tigers, however, were not able to capitalize on the opportunity, as **Colby Delahoussaye's** 49-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Alabama defensive back Ronnie Harrison. The first half finished in a scoreless tie, marking the first time Alabama had been shut out in an opening half since 2007, when Florida State blanked the Tide through the first 30 minutes of play. LSU forced Hurts to fumble on a pass attempt, and the Tigers recovered at the Alabama 42-yard line with 5:42 left in the third quarter. Defensive tackle **Frank Herron** was credited with the sack, and outside linebacker **Arden Key** pounced on the football. Alabama responded by driving 90 yards on 12 plays for the game's first score, as Hurts dashed 21 yards to the end zone with 13:08 remaining in the contest. Hurts again led the Tide into the LSU redzone, rushing seven times for 47 yards. Adam Griffith finished off a nearly 10-minute drive with a 25-yard field goal from the right hash to push Alabama ahead, 10-0, with 2:41 to play.
