LSU TO FACE LOUISVILLE AND HEISMAN TROPHY QB IN CITRUS BOWL

LSU, now 5-2 under head coach **Ed Orgeron**, will make its 17th-straight appearance in a post-season bowl when the 20th-ranked Tigers face 13th-ranked Louisville and its Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Lamar Jackson in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl on Saturday, Dec. 31. Kickoff is scheduled for 10 a.m. CT from Camping World Stadium (65,000). The game will be televised on ABC with Dave Pasch (play-by-play), Greg McElroy (analyst) and Tom Lugenbill (sideline reporter) calling the action. LSU enters the game coming off a 54-39 win over Texas A&M on Thanksgiving Night. The win over the Aggies improved LSU to 7-4 overall and the Tigers tied for second in the SEC Western Division with a 5-3 league mark. Louisville, members of the ACC, brings a 9-3 overall mark into the contest. The Cardinals won nine of their first 10 games and climbed to No. 5 the College Football Rankings before losing their last two games of the regular season. The Citrus Bowl contest will mark the first-ever meeting between LSU and Louisville on the gridiron. LSU has faced Louisville coach Bobby Petrino before as the Tigers are 2-2 against Petrino-coached teams with all four games coming while he was head coach at Arkansas. Orgeron is 21-29 overall (5-2 at LSU, 6-2 at Southern Cal, 10-25 at Ole Miss) and he's 11-4 in his last 15 games as a head coach. LSU brings one of the nation's top defenses into the game as the Tigers have allowed just 16 touchdowns all season, the second-lowest total among all FBS teams. Overall, LSU ranks No. 2 in the SEC in rush defense (121.8), No. 3 in scoring defense (16.4) and total defense (323.0) and No. 4 in pass defense (201.2). Offensively, LSU is averaging 28.3 points and 425.7 total yards (238.1 rushing, 184.6 passing) per game. Since taking over after 2-2 start, LSU's offensive numbers under Orgeron jump to 32.4 points and 475.0 total yards (264.6 rushing, 210.4 passing) during the seven-game span. RB **Derrius Guice** leads LSU and ranks No. 2 in the SEC with 113.5 yards rushing per game. Guice has rushed for 1,249 yards and 14 touchdowns, which includes a school-record 285 yards on the ground against Texas A&M. QB **Danny Etling** is 6-3 as the starter for the Tigers and has completed 144-of-240 passes for 1,906 yards, nine touchdowns and four interceptions. His top targets are **Malachi Dupre** (34 rec., 454 yards, 3 TDs), **Travin Dural** (28 rec., 280 yards, 1 TD), and **D.J. Chark** (24 rec., 419 yards, 3 TDs). Defensively, LB **Kendell Beckwith** (out with knee injury) leads the Tigers in tackles with 91. Other defensive leaders for LSU include LB **Duke Riley** (85 tackles, 9.0 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, 1 Int.), All-America S **Jamal Adams** (70 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, 1 Int.), DT **Davon Godchaux** (55tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 5.5 sacks), OLB/DE **Arden Key** (50 tackles, 12.5 tackles for loss, 10.0 sacks, 10 QB hurries, 3 forced fumbles) and All-America CB **Tre'Davious White** (31 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss, 1 Int., 13 PBU's).



LSU TALKING POINTS

- LSU is 5-2 in the Season of **Orgeron**, winning the five games by a combined 130 points. LSU scored at least 38 points in all five victories under Orgeron. Overall under Coach "O", LSU has outscored the opposition 227-103 or 32.4-14.7 per game.
- Under Orgeron and acting offensive coordinator **Steve Ensminger**, LSU's offense produced two 600-yard games (634 vs. Missouri, 622 vs. Texas A&M) and two 500-yard games (515 vs. Ole Miss, 547 vs. Arkansas).
- LSU was the last remaining team in the FBS to hold its opponents to 21 points or less when Texas A&M scored 39 points against the Tigers in the season finale.
- LSU has given up just 27 first quarter points and 33 third quarter points this year. LSU didn't allow a first quarter TD until the sixth game of the season (Southern Miss). Only three teams scored first quarter TDs against LSU (Southern Miss, Ole Miss, Texas A&M).
- Under Coach Orgeron, LSU has held its opponent scoreless in 14 of 28 quarters, including scoreless first halves against both Alabama and Missouri. LSU also held Ole Miss scoreless in the second half.

Ed Orgeron

LSU HEAD COACH

Ed Orgeron, who led the Tigers to a 5-2 mark as interim coach over the final two months of the season was named LSU's head football coach on November 26.

Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, becomes the 33rd head football coach in LSU history. Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 11-4 in his past 15 games as a head coach, which includes a 6-2 mark as interim coach at USC.

"This is a great day for LSU and for all of Louisiana," LSU Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva said. "We got our man and he's been here all along. Coach Orgeron has demonstrated his ability to run this program with excellence, even under difficult circumstances. Coach 'O' earned this job.

"I worked closely with (LSU) President Alexander and board leadership throughout a very deliberate process. By the end of that process, our decision was clear. Coach Orgeron took us step by step through every aspect of his plans for this program and there was no question that he is the man to lead LSU football."

Since taking over as interim coach of the Tigers on Sept. 25, Orgeron guided LSU to a 5-2 mark, beating four Southeastern Conference opponents – Missouri, Ole Miss, Arkansas and Texas A&M – all by double-digits. LSU's two losses during that span came by a total of 16 points as the Tigers held top-ranked Alabama scoreless for three quarters and came up a yard short in falling to Florida, 16-10.

In his LSU debut, Orgeron led the Tigers to a 42-7 win over Missouri. The 35-point margin of victory ranks as the second-largest for a LSU head coach in his Tiger debut. Orgeron and the Tigers followed that with a 45-10 win over Southern Miss as LSU's combined 87 points in Orgeron's first two games were the most for any coach in his first two games at the school. Orgeron also became the first LSU football coach in the SEC era to win his first two games by 30 or more points and the first coach to win his first three by double-digits.

In seven games under Orgeron, LSU set offensive records

for most yards in a SEC game (634 vs. Missouri), longest scoring play from scrimmage (Derrius Guice 96-yard TD run vs. Arkansas), and twice set the school single-game rushing record (Leonard Fournette 284 yards vs. Ole Miss, Derrius Guice 285 yards vs. Texas A&M).

Defensively, LSU held opponents scoreless for 14 of 28 quarters under Orgeron and limited the opposition to an average of 10.3 points per game over the seven contests. With 39 points, Texas A&M became the only team to score more than 21 points against LSU this year. Overall, LSU's defense, under Dave Aranda, ranks in the top three in the SEC in three major categories – scoring, total defense and rushing defense.

Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

In his first year with the Tigers in 2015, Orgeron's defensive front served as a catalyst for a Tiger defense that ranked No. 3 in the SEC in both rushing yards (122.9 yards per game) and sacks (34). Six times in 2015 LSU's defense held opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing in a game, including limiting Mississippi State to 43 yards in the season-opener and Texas Tech to 29 in the Texas Bowl.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 mark over that span.

While at Southern Cal, Orgeron was named by Sporting News as the nation's No. 2 recruiter in 2012. A year earlier, Scout.com named him the National Recruiter of the Year, ESPN/ESPN The Magazine named him the top recruiter in college football (and third-best in all of collegiate athletics) and Rivals.com ranked him as the second-best recruiter of the previous 10 years (2002-11) in college football.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojan's defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. He added the title of recruiting coordinator for USC in 2001 and helped the Trojans to top five signing classes for three-straight years

from 2002-04. Rivals.com and Sporting News named him the 2004 National Recruiter of the Year.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005-07. In three head coaching stints, Orgeron has a 21-29 overall mark.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988-92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line. During his tenure, the Hurricanes won the national championship twice (1989 and 1991), finished second in the AP poll once (1988) and third twice (1990 and 1992) while appearing in five New Year's Day bowls (1989 Orange, 1990 Sugar, 1991 Cotton, 1992 Orange, 1993 Sugar).

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87). The Razorbacks were in the 1987 Orange Bowl and 1987 Liberty Bowl. He worked in private business in 1993.

As a player, Orgeron was a four-year starter on the defensive line for Northwestern State, captaining the Demons as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Northwestern State in 1984.

He starred in football, basketball and track at South Lafourche High in Galliano, La. On the big screen, Orgeron played himself in the 2009 Oscar-nominated movie, "The Blind Side."

Born July 27, 1961, he and his wife, Kelly, have 3 sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody. Tyler is a member of the LSU football support staff, while twins Parker and Cody are in their first year as part of the McNeese State football team.

JULY

23

LSU senior kicker **Colby Delahoussaye** somehow escapes serious injury when a car he's a passenger in skids off a slick highway and crashes into a tree, killing both the driver and the passenger in the front seat. Killed in the accident, which took place in Merton, Wisc., were current Nebraska punter Sam Foltz and former Michigan State punter Mike Sadler. Delahoussaye spends the night in the hospital and returns to Baton Rouge on Monday, July 25 with burns on his legs, but no other significant injuries.

AUGUST

4

LSU reports to practice for one of the most anticipated seasons in school history. LSU enters the year ranked as high as No. 5 in the nation.

9

Starting defensive lineman **Christian LaCouture** suffers a season-ending knee injury in practice.

12

Rain starts in Baton Rouge and doesn't stop for at least three straight days causing historic flooding in Baton Rouge and surrounding parishes. Over 7.1 trillion gallons of water - enough to fill Lake Pontchartrain four times - fell in south Louisiana during this 3-day span.

13

LSU cancels Media Day and Fan Day, which was scheduled for Sunday, Aug. 14, due to historic flooding in south Louisiana. The flooding affects the families of several LSU football players, including **Christian LaCouture**, **Russell Gage**, **Caleb Roddy** along with assistant coach **Steve Ensminger** and a number of athletic department employees.

18

The LSU football teams visits those families displaced by the flooding at Celtic Studios, which was serving as a shelter for over 1,500 people during the month of August.

23

Leonard Fournette injures ankle in football scrimmage, 11 days before the Tigers are scheduled to open the season against Wisconsin at Lambeau Field.

SEPTEMBER

3

LSU drops first season-opener since 2002, falling to Wisconsin, 16-14, in first major college football game at historic Lambeau Field. After the game, LSU team plane has mechanical issues causing a delay of over three hours. Team doesn't return home until well after midnight from a 2:30 p.m. CT game. **Leonard Fournette** becomes the fastest player in LSU history to reach 3,000 rushing yards for a career. **Chris Blair** makes his debut as "Voice of the Tigers" for a football game broadcast, succeeding the legendary Jim Hawthorne, who served in that capacity for over three decades

10

LSU opens home slate with 34-13 win over Jacksonville State. **Danny Etling** comes off the bench to ignite a stagnant LSU offense and takes over as the Tiger quarterback for the remainder of the season.

12

LSU announces that the team will wear Gold jerseys along with other throwback-style accessories, a white helmet with numeral on the side, and white pants for its game vs. Mississippi State on Sept. 17. The uniform was modeled after the color and style the Tigers wore in the 1940s.

17

Up 23-3 at halftime, LSU holds off Mississippi State, 23-20, to improve to 2-1 overall and 1-0 in league play.

24

LSU falls to 2-2 overall despite holding Auburn without a touchdown in a 18-13 loss at Jordan-Hare Stadium. LSU appeared to have won the game on the final play, however replay reversed what would have been a 15-yard TD pass from **Danny Etling** to **D.J. Chark** as time expired. Replay showed that the game clock expired before LSU could get the final snap off.

25

Les Miles and offensive coordinator **Cam Cameron** are relieved of their coaching duties at LSU. **Ed Orgeron** named interim head coach and is introduced as such to the team by vice chancellor and director of athletics Joe Alleva at a 5 p.m. team meeting that day.

Coach Orgeron elevates **Steve Ensminger** to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach and promotes **Dennis Johnson** to linebackers coach and **Eric Mateos** to tight ends coach. Orgeron also hires longtime LSU assistant **Pete Jenkins** as defensive line coach.

1

The **Ed Orgeron** era at LSU gets off to a flying start as the Tigers overwhelm Missouri, 42-7, in Tiger Stadium. LSU sets the school-record for yards in an SEC game with 634 total yards in the win over Missouri.

6

SEC announces that due to the uncertainty of Hurricane Matthew, the LSU-Florida game scheduled for Oct. 8 in Gainesville would be postponed. No future arrangements for the LSU-Florida game were announced that day.

8

LSU gets an un-scheduled open date due to the postponement of the Florida contest.

11

Mike VI, LSU's beloved live mascot, passes away after a lengthy battle with cancer. Mike was originally diagnosed with cancer on May 23 and received radiation treatment on June 1.

13

It's announced by the SEC Office that the LSU-Florida game will be played on Nov. 19 in Tiger Stadium. LSU's game against South Alabama, scheduled for that, is cancelled. It's also announced that LSU will play in Gainesville in both 2017 and 2018 to make up for the back-to-back trips to Tiger Stadium by the Gators in 2015 and 2016.

Starting safety **Rickey Jefferson** suffers season-ending injury during a non-contact drill in practice.

15

LSU wins its second game under Coach Orgeron with a 45-10 victory over Southern Miss in Tiger Stadium. **Derrius Guice** rushes for 162 yards and **D.J. Chark** scores on an 80-yard TD reception in the victory. Guice becomes quickest player to 1,000 rushing yards in school history.

22

Leonard Fournette returns to action for the first time since the Auburn game and rushes for a school-record 284 yards in the 38-21 win over Ole Miss.

29

LSU has its second open date of the month as the Tigers take a break before hosting top-ranked and undefeated Alabama on Nov. 5.



2016 SEASON TIMELINE

NOVEMBER

5

The college football world descends on Baton Rouge as the Tigers host Alabama. ESPN's College GameDay goes live from the Quad in the middle off the LSU campus for its weekly preview show. **Coach Orgeron** also makes an appearance on the show that featured **Lil' Wayne** as the guest picker.

LSU holds Alabama scoreless for three quarters before the Crimson Tide scores 10 points in final 13 minutes to escape Tiger Stadium with a 10-0 victory.

12

LSU plays its first road game under **Coach Orgeron**, which is also the away contest for the Tigers in 49 days, the second-longest span between road games in school history. LSU rebounds with resounding 38-10 win over the Razorbacks in a game that featured a 96-yard run by **Derrius Guice**, the longest play from scrimmage in LSU history. Guice rushes for 252 yards in the victory, the second-best rushing performance in school history as the Tigers become bowl-eligible for the 17th straight season.

19

SEC Nation, the SEC Network's preview show, goes live from Tiger Stadium the morning of the Florida game.

LSU honors 18 seniors during a pre-game ceremony prior to noon kickoff between the Tigers and Gators. LSU is stopped at the 1-yard line as time expires as the Gators clinch a berth in the SEC Championship Game with a 16-10 win over the Tigers. Senior All-America linebacker **Kendell Beckwith** suffers season-ending injury in first half.

24

On a short week, LSU travels to Texas A&M for a Thanksgiving Night contest. Playing without **Leonard Fournette**, **Derrius Guice** breaks the school's single-game rushing record with 285 yards and 4 TDs on 37 carries in the 54-39 win in College Station. The win improved the Tigers to 5-2 under Orgeron. The Tigers finish the year 7-4 overall and 5-3 in the SEC Western Division. The win over Texas A&M marked the first time in LSU history the Tigers featured a 300-yard passer (**Danny Etling** – 324 yards) and a 200-yard rusher (**Derrius Guice** – 285 yards) in the same game.

26

LSU officially names **Ed Orgeron** its 33rd head football at a press conference on campus.

DECEMBER

2

Senior CB **Tre'Davious White** pens letter to LSU and its fans thanking them for the opportunity to be a Tiger and what it has meant to him and his family. The letter goes viral and becomes one of the most talked about things on the internet for LSU fans.

4

LSU is invited to face Louisville and its Heisman Trophy quarterback **Lamar Jackson** in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl on Dec. 31 in Orlando. It will be LSU's fourth trip to the Citrus Bowl, but the first-ever meeting between the Tigers and Cardinals on the gridiron.

6

Former LSU great **Bert Jones** is honored as part of the 2016 Hall of Fame Class at the annual National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame Awards Dinner in New York City.

7

LSU and Orgeron announce that defensive coordinator **Dave Aranda** has been promoted to associate head coach and will remain with the Tigers with a three-year contract extension.

9

Six current members of the LSU football team, along with **Tre'Davious White** and **Ethan Pocic**, both first team All-Americans in 2016, receive their college diploma.

14

LSU hires **Matt Canada** as its offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Canada comes to LSU from Pittsburgh, where he helped the Panthers to an 8-4 mark and average 42 points per game in 2016.

15

LSU defensive end **Christian LaCouture** announces that he will return to play for the Tigers in 2017 as a fifth-year senior.

16

Leonard Fournette announces that he will not play in the Citrus Bowl.

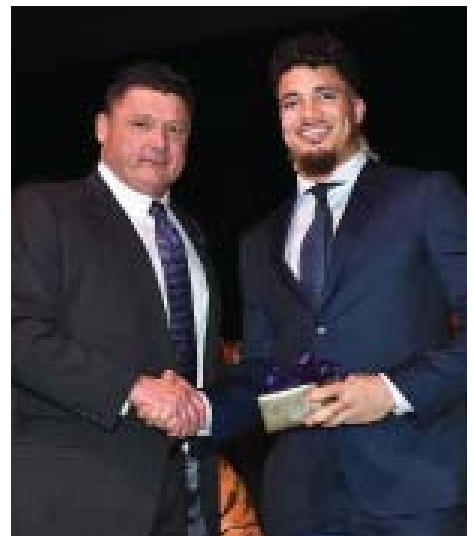

Series Notes: This is the first meeting between LSU and Louisville in football... LSU is 35-27 all-time against current members of the ACC... The bowl game will be the program's fifth meeting against Louisville coach Bobby Petrino, holding a 2-2 mark from when he was the coach at Arkansas from 2008-11... LSU earned a 41-17 win over Petrino and the Razorbacks in his final season at Arkansas before going to the NFL's Atlanta Falcons.

LSU has twice faced Louisville in the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament ... Louisville and Dr. Dunkenstein eliminated LSU, 86-66, in the Elite Eight in 1980 ... In 1986, the Cardinals beat the Tigers, 88-77, in the Final Four in Dallas ... LSU is 1-8 all-time against Louisville in men's basketball with the lone Tiger victory coming by a 84-70 count in at the Sugar Bowl Classic in New Orleans ... LSU is 1-4 vs. Louisville in women's basketball ... LSU's beat the Cardinals, 65-46, in Baton Rouge in 2002 ... Two of Louisville's wins over the Lady Tigers came in NCAA play - a 62-52 victory in the second round in Baton Rouge in 2009 followed by a 73-47 win in Louisville in the Sweet 16 in 2014 ... LSU's softball team beat the Cardinals, 13-9, in the NCAA Regional opening game at Tuscon in 2014 ... LSU and Louisville have never met in postseason play in baseball.



MORE ON THE TIGERS

- LSU's roster features 3 first team All-America's, including consensus All-America DB **Tre'Davious White**. Other first team All-Americas include C Ethan Pocic and DB Jamal Adams.
- In its 4 losses, LSU allowed only 3 TDs. The 4 losses were by a combined 23 points and the outcome of the 2 of LSU's 4 losses were decided on the final play of the game (Auburn and Florida).
- LSU is one win away from extending its streak of consecutive seasons with at least 8 victories to 17 straight. LSU's current streak of 16 seasons with at least 8 wins ranks as the longest among all Power 5 teams. Overall, Boise State stands as the only FBS school with more consecutive 8-wins seasons (18) than LSU.
- LSU is making its 48th bowl appearance in program history in the Citrus Bowl on New Year's Eve. The 17 consecutive bowl games is the second-longest streak in the SEC behind Georgia.

NOTEBOOK

LSU Goes Bowling For School-Record 17th Straight Season

LSU will make its 17th straight appearance in a bowl game - a school record - when the Tigers face Louisville in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl on Dec. 31. LSU has played in a bowl game each year since 2000. LSU's current streak of 17 straight bowl appearances ranks No. 5 nationally, trailing only Florida State (35), Virginia Tech (24), Georgia (21), and Oklahoma (18).

Tigers Set To Make 48th Bowl Appearance

The LSU football program will be making its 48th appearance in a bowl game when the squad takes on Louisville at Camping World Stadium in Orlando, sporting a 24-22-1 all-time mark in bowl games. Last year, LSU beat Texas Tech, 56-27, in the Texas Bowl in Houston. The 24 bowl victories is 10th nationally and fourth in the SEC.

LSU's Citrus Bowl History

LSU's date against the Louisville Cardinals on New Years Eve will be the program's fourth appearance in what is now the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, the first since 2010 when it was known as the Capital One Bowl. The Tigers are 1-2 in the bowl all-time, earning a 34-10 win over Wake Forest in 1979, falling to Iowa 30-25 in 2005 and most recently dropping a 19-17 decision to Penn State in 2010.



Dec. 22, 1979

LSU 34, Wake Forest 10

LSU's win over Wake Forest in 1979 marked the final game of the legendary coaching career of the winningest coach in LSU history Charles McClendon. The win over Wake Forest was the 138th for McClendon at LSU, a mark that still stands as the most in school history. The game also featured a quarterback named Steve Ensminger, who is currently the acting offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Tigers. Against Wake Forest, Ensminger scored on a 4-yard run in the fourth quarter for LSU's final points. Ensminger rushed for 43 yards and completed 5-of-7 passes for 74 yards in the contest as he platooned with David Woodley at quarterback.

Jan. 1, 2005

Iowa 30, LSU 25

In what was the final game of Nick Saban era at LSU, Iowa scored on a 56-yard pass as time expired to shock the Tigers, 30-25. LSU rallied from a 24-12 fourth quarter deficit with a pair of JaMarcus Russell TD passes to Skyler Green. The first was a 22-yard strike with 8:21 to go that cut the deficit to 24-19 and then with 36 seconds left Russell hit Green with a 3-yard TD pass to give the Tigers a 25-24 lead – their first advantage of the game. Iowa needed just three plays to go 71 yards in 46 seconds, capped by the last-second Hail Mary that gave the Hawkeyes a 30-25 victory.

Jan. 1, 2010

Penn State 19, LSU 17

A sloppy field held LSU's explosive offense in check as the Tigers once again lost another Citrus Bowl late in the fourth quarter, this time coming at the hands of Penn State. The Nittany Lions kicked a 21-yard field goal with 57 seconds left to beat LSU, 19-17. LSU took its only lead of the game early in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard run by Stevan Ridley, putting the Tigers up 17-16. Penn State went 65-yards on 12 plays to setup the game winning kick with less than a minute left.

LSU vs. the ACC

LSU is 35-27 all-time against current Atlantic Coast Conference member institutions in program history. The Tigers are familiar with the conference after having played Syracuse, Clemson and North Carolina in recent history, with Syracuse on the schedule in 2017. The Tigers have played Georgia Tech the most at 19 times since 1915.

LSU Against Heisman Trophy Winners in Bowls

When LSU squares off with Louisville in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, it'll be the third time in program history that the Tigers will be facing the newly crowned Heisman Trophy winner in a bowl, as Cardinal quarterback Lamar Jackson was named the winner on December 10. The last time LSU faced off with a Heisman winner weeks after the award was given out was in 2004 when LSU and Oklahoma's Jason White met for the BCS National Championship in the New Orleans Superdome. The first time was in 1974 when LSU faced Penn State's John Cappelletti in the Orange Bowl. LSU won the game and national title against White's Sooners, while dropping the Orange Bowl to the Nittany Lions and Cappelletti. In all, LSU has played against seven Heisman winners since the 2003 season. Below is a look at how the Heisman Trophy winner fared statistically against the Tigers in those bowls:

LSU Tabs Matt Canada Offensive Coordinator; Joins Tigers After Bowl

LSU head football coach Ed Orgeron today announced the hiring of **Matt Canada** as the new offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Tigers on December 14. Canada, who was the only offensive finalist for the Broyles Award this year as the nation's top assistant coach, joins the LSU staff after spending the 2016 season at Pittsburgh, where as offensive coordinator and quarterback coach, he guided a Panther offense that ranked No. 10 in the nation in scoring (42.3) and averaged 447.5 total yards per game. The Panthers also led the nation in redzone touchdown percentage at 82 percent. Canada comes to LSU with 25-years of coaching experience with stops at North Carolina State (2013-15), Wisconsin (2012), North Illinois (1998-2003; 2011) and Indiana (2004-10). At Pitt, Canada's 2016 offense scored 76 points in a win over Syracuse to cap the regular season and the Panthers also beat Big 10 champion Penn State, 42-39, and topped second-ranked Clemson, 43-42. Pitt is the only Power 5 team in the nation to score at least 28 points in every game this year. Canada earned his B.A. in Business (1993) and M.A. in Sports Administration (1995) at Indiana University.

LSU In The Polls

LSU goes into the Citrus Bowl ranked in the Top 20 in all three major polls. LSU stands at No. 19 in the AP Top 25 and No. 20 in both the College Football Playoff Rankings and in the Coaches Poll. Going back to 2001 when LSU's football program won its first SEC Championship since the 1980s, LSU has played 193 of its 207 games during that span ranked in the Top 25. LSU has been ranked for 10 of its 11 games this year as the Tigers opened the year ranked No. 5 in the nation. The only game LSU wasn't ranked this year came in a 42-7 win over Missouri in what was the debut for new coach Ed Orgeron.

LSU Is 66-7 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

Going back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 66-7 against non-SEC foes during that span. Of the seven losses, only two have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field). The other five losses have come in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame). LSU hasn't lost a non-conference home game since September of 2000 when UAB kicked a last-second field goal to beat the Tigers, 13-10.

Etling Will Be 5th Bowl QB For Tigers In 6 Years

When the Tigers take the field against Louisville, **Danny Etling** will become the fifth bowl quarterback for the Tigers in their last six appearances. Over the past 6 years Anthony Jennings is the only LSU quarterback to start consecutive bowl games for the Tigers (2014 Outback Bowl, 2014 Music City Bowl). Other starting QBs for the Tigers in last six bowl trips include: Jordan Jefferson (2012 BCS), Zach Mettenberger (2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl) and Brandon Harris (2015 Texas Bowl).

LSU Makes Second Appearance on ABC This Season

The Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl will be LSU's second appearance on ABC this season, following the team's season-opening game against Wisconsin at Lambeau Field. It'll be LSU's 54th appearance on the channel in program history, which is the third most games on any television network behind CBS and ESPN. LSU has 18 wins on the channel and will be going for its first win on the network since defeating West Virginia 47-21 in 2011.

LSU's Defense Has Allowed Just 16 TDs In 11 Games

LSU's defense has given up just 16 touchdowns through the team's 11 games of the season. The 16 TDs ranks second in the nation behind only Alabama. Prior to Texas A&M scoring 39 points in the regular season finale, LSU was the final FBS team that had yet to give up more than 21 points in a game. The Tigers are No. 6 in the FBS in scoring defense, allowing just 16.4 points per game, and have given up just 180 points total which is fourth nationally. If LSU can hold Louisville to fewer than 20 points, it'll be the 10th time in the last 30 years that a Tiger team has given up less than 200 points in a season.



Tiger Defense Ranks Among Top 3 in SEC in Scoring, Rushing and Total Defense

LSU's defense under first-year coordinator **Dave Aranda** has been outstanding as the Tigers head into bowl season ranked among the top 3 in the SEC several major categories. LSU is No. 2 in the league in rushing defense, allowing only 121.8 yards per game. The Tigers are No. 3 in the SEC in scoring defense (16.4 points per game) and total defense (323.0 yards per game). LSU ranks No. 4 in the SEC in pass defense at 201.2 yards per game and the Tigers' 28 sacks is the fourth-highest total in the league. Overall, LSU is allowing 4.9 yards per play (No. 3 in the SEC) and only 3.4 yards per rush (No. 2 in the league). Under head coach Ed Orgeron and Aranda, LSU has held teams scoreless in 14 of a possible 28 quarters.

LSU Looks To Keep 8-Win Season Streak Alive

With a 7-4 overall mark, LSU is one win shy of extending its streak of consecutive 8-wins seasons to 17 straight. LSU currently has won at least 8 games every year dating back to 2000. LSU's streak of 16 straight seasons with at least 8 wins leads all Power 5 schools and ranks behind only Boise State, who has won 8 games for 18 straight year, in the FBS.

Tre'Davious White Earns Consensus All-America Status

LSU DB **Tre'Davious White** earned consensus All-America status this year after being named first team All-America by the America Football Coaches Association and Walter Camp along with picking up second team honors from the Football Writers Association of America and the Sporting News. White was also a finalist for the Thorpe Award as well as being and named first team All-SEC.

Adams and Pocic Named First Team All-America

S **Jamal Adams** and C **Ethan Pocic** joined **Tre'Davious White** on first team All-America lists following the 2016 season. Adams was named first team All-America by CBS Sports and picked up second team honors from the Associated Press and the American Football Coaches Association. Pocic, a finalist for the Rimington Award as the nation's top center, was a first team selection by the Football Writers Association of America, second team by Walter Camp and third team by the Associated Press. One other Tiger was cited for his performance in 2016 as LB Kendell Beckwith earned second team All-America honors from Walter Camp, Sporting News, Football Writers Association of America and American Football Coaches Association. He was also a third team pick by the Associated Press.

With two first team All-America defensive backs in 2016, LSU can easily back up its claim as being "DBU". With the addition of **Tre'Davious White** and **Jamal Adams**, LSU has now produced 10 first team All-American defensive backs since 2003. Overall, LSU claims 14 first team All-America defensive backs, including three-time selection Tommy Casanova (1969, 1970, 1971) and two-time pick Corey Webster (2003, 2004). In terms of the NFL, since 2007 LSU has had more defensive backs selected in the NFL Draft (15) than any other team in the nation. Of LSU's 15 NFL Draft picks since 2007, four have been first round picks and five came in either the second or third round.

Six Tigers Named to AP All-SEC Teams

LSU senior C **Ethan Pocic**, senior CB **Tre'Davious White**, junior S **Jamal Adams**, and sophomore DE **Arden Key** were named to the All-SEC first team by the Associated Press. Junior RB **Leonard Fournette** and senior OG **Josh Boutte** were also selected to the second team.

Tigers Claim Nine Spots on Coaches All-SEC Team

Sophomore RB **Derris Guice**, sophomore OG **Will Clapp**, senior C **Ethan Pocic**, senior LB **Kendell Beckwith**, and senior CB **Tre'Davious White** were all selected to the All-SEC first team by the league coaches. Junior RB **Leonard Fournette**, junior S **Jamal Adams**, and sophomore LB **Arden Key** earned second team honors. Guice was selected to the second team at the all-purpose position.

ON THIS DAY IN LSU HISTORY - New Year's Eve

LSU is 2-2 all-time on New Year's Eve in program history

2012: Jeremy Hill ran for 124 yards and two touchdowns, but LSU dropped a nail-biter on a last-second field goal to Clemson in the Chick-Fil-A Bowl in Atlanta, 25-24

2008: Charles Scott ran for three touchdowns, Jordan Jefferson completed 16 passes for 142 yards and a touchdown as LSU raced past No. 14 Georgia Tech in the Chick-Fil-A Bowl 38-3.

1987: Wendell Davis was named the game's MVP after catching nine passes for 132 yards and three touchdowns as LSU defeated No. 8 South Carolina 30-13 in the Gator Bowl in Jacksonville

1977: Charles Alexander set a pair of Sun Bowl records with his 31 carries and 197 yards rushing, but LSU fell to Stanford 24-14 in the Sun Bowl in El Paso.

Guice Breaks Single-Game Rushing Mark With 285 Yards vs. Texas A&M

LSU RB **Derrius Guice** broke the school's single-game rushing record on Thanksgiving Night when the sophomore rushed for 285 yards on 37 carries against Texas A&M. The 285 yards edged out the previous mark of 284, which was set by **Leonard Fournette** against Ole Miss in game 7 of the 2016. Prior to Fournette and Guice's rushing marks, the previous record of 250 yards by Alley Broussard vs. Ole Miss in 2004 stood for nearly 12 years. In the season finale against Texas A&M on Thanksgiving night in College Station, sophomore RB Derrius Guice broke Leonard Fournette's LSU single-game rushing record by a yard with 285 and four touchdowns in LSU's 54-39 win over the Aggies. Guice carried the ball 37 times in the victory and out-rushed the entire Texas A&M unit by himself as he became the first LSU player in program history to have two games of 250 yards or more when coupled with his 252 against Arkansas just two weeks prior. In SEC history, he is only the fourth player ever to do so joining the likes of Herschel Walker, Bo Jackson and Moe Williams.

Guice Joins Elite SEC Company With 2 250-Yard Rushing Games in 2016

With a pair of 250-yard rushing games in 2016, sophomore RB **Derrius Guice** joined elite SEC company as he along with Moe Williams of Kentucky are the only two players in league history to have two 250-yard rushing games in the same season. Williams did it in 1995 with 299 yards vs. South Carolina and 272 vs. Cincinnati. Guice had 252 yards vs. Arkansas in week 9 and then followed that with a record-setting day of 285 yards vs. Texas A&M in week 11. Guice joins Williams are joined by Auburn's Bo Jackson and Georgia's Herschel Walker as the only four players in SEC history with two 250-yard games to their credit in a career.

Arden Key Second in SEC in Sacks, First in Sacks Per Game Ranking Sixth in the Nation

LSU sophomore OLB/DE **Arden Key** is second the SEC in total sacks with 10.0 and ranks sixth in the nation and tied for first in the conference in sacks per game with 1.00. Key has registered at least a .5 sack in eight of 11 games this year as he is now tied for third in the single-season category at LSU all-time, two away from Oliver Lawrence's record of 12 set back in 1989. His 12.5 tackles for loss ranks 10th in the SEC. Key is also second in the SEC and ranks 19th in the nation in fumbles forced with three.

Etling, Guice Become First LSU Duo to Have 300-Yard Passing/200-Yard Rushing In Same Game

For the first time in program history an LSU game featured a 300-yard passer and a 200-yard rusher at the same time, as junior quarterback **Danny Etling** threw for an LSU-best 324 yards and two touchdowns, while sophomore running back **Derrius Guice** ran for 285 yards and four touchdowns against Texas A&M in College Station. Etling connected with eight different receivers in the win and had four players with 50 receiving yards, while Guice had more rushing yards by himself than Texas A&M team combined.

Seven LSU Players Earn SEC Weekly Honors This Season

Over the course of the season, senior DB **Tre'Davious White**, sophomore LB **Arden Key**, freshman P **Josh Growden**, sophomore RB **Derrius Guice**, senior C **Ethan Pocic**, junior RB **Leonard Fournette** and senior DE **Lewis Neal** all earned SEC weekly honors.

Both Growden and White were named SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week. White, the electric return man, earned the honor after his 60-yard punt return for a touchdown against Jacksonville State. Growden averaged 49.2 yards per punt, including longs of 65 and 61 in the Tigers' win over Mississippi State.

Guice earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors after three games. The first honor for the Baton Rouge native came against Missouri when he ran for a then career high 163 yards and three touchdowns. In the final stretch of the season, Guice earned the honor after totaling 252 yards against Arkansas and a school record 285 rushing yards against Texas A&M. Guice became just the fourth player in SEC history to have multiple 250-yard rushing games. Fournette also earned his seventh career SEC weekly honor after his record-setting performance against Ole Miss.

Pocic earned three weekly honors as the anchor of the offensive line that paved the way to record games for Guice, Fournette and the Tiger offense. Against Missouri, LSU totaled 634 yards of total offense for a school conference record. Fournette also rushed to a school record 284 rushing yards against Ole Miss and Guice totaled 252 rushing yards and two touchdowns against Arkansas.

Neal and Key were both named Defensive Lineman of the Week in 2016. Neal totaled 11 tackles against Alabama and limited the Crimson Tide to 10 points for their lowest total of the year. Key finished with five tackles, a force fumble and two sacks in the win over Mississippi State.

Coates Award as the team's top student-athlete as the Tigers held their annual football banquet at the Raising Cane's River Center Dec. 18. The Percy E. Roberts Outstanding Offensive Player was shared by a trio of Tigers in Leonard Fournette, Derrius Guice and center Ethan Pocic. The Percy E. Roberts Outstanding Defensive Player was presented to a trio of defenders – cornerback **Tre'Davious White**, linebacker **Kendell Beckwith** and safety **Jamal Adams**. The 2016 permanent team captains as voted on by members of the team include Pocic and wide receiver Travin Dural on offense, Riley, White and Adams on defense and kicker **Colby Delahoussaye** on special teams. The Jeff Boss Unsung Hero Award was presented to defensive end **Lewis Neal**, offensive guard **Josh Boutte**, tight end **DeSean Smith**, wide receiver **D.J. Chark** and Dural. The Butch Duhé Award, which is given to the player or players whose character and contributions to the team most personify the idea of unselfishness, dependability and commitment, went to tight end **Colin Jeter**, defensive end/outside linebacker **Tashawn Bower** and quarterback **Danny Etling**. Nose tackle **Davon Godchaux** was named the recipient of the George M. Wallace Memorial Award, which is presented to the defensive player who distinguished himself by performance, leadership and commitment to team. Other awards handed out on Sunday night include White and Pocic being named to LSU's all-time Strength and Conditioning Team, while linebacker **Donnie Alexander** won the Wild Tiger Championship Trophy for special teams performance.

Six Tigers Named Permanent Team Captains for 2016

Six LSU players – two on offense, three on defense, and one on special teams – were selected as permanent team captains for the 2016 season. The permanent team captains for 2016 include: C **Ethan Pocic** and WR **Travin Dural** on offense; LB **Duke Riley**, CB **Tre'Davious White** and S **Jamal Adams** on defense; and PK **Colby Delahoussaye** on special teams.

DE LaCouture To Return For a Fifth Season in 2017

LSU DE **Christian LaCouture** announced on Dec. 15 that he has decided to remain with the program for another season and will play for head coach **Ed Orgeron** and the Tigers in 2017. LaCouture missed all of the 2016 season with a knee injury that he suffered during preseason practice. In his three years on the field, LaCouture has played in 37 games with 23 starts and recorded 86 tackles, 8.0 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. LaCouture, who played as a true freshman in 2013, will be a fifth-year senior in 2017. LaCouture has already graduated as he earned his LSU degree in sports administration in the August of 2016. He will continue his pursuit of a Master's degree through the spring and into next year. In addition to LaCouture, defensive back Corey Thompson will attempt to return to the team in 2017 as well after missing all of 2016 with an injury.

Fournette, Guice First LSU RB Duo To Have 250-Yard Rushing Games In Same Season

With 284 yards against Ole Miss and 252 yards against Arkansas, LSU's **Leonard Fournette** and **Derrius Guice** have become the first Tiger running back duo to have 250-plus yard rushing games in the same season. It's only the second time in school history that multiple backs have had 200-yard rushing games in a year, as Cecil Collins (232) and Kevin Faulk (212) each did so in the 1997 season. Guice and Fournette also became the second duo nationally this year to rush for 200 yards, joining Tulsa's D'Angelo Brewer and James Flanders, while being the only set to have over 250.

Fournette Wraps Up Career Ranked No. 4 in LSU History With 3,830 Rushing Yards

RB **Leonard Fournette** will not play against Louisville in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, thus ending the career of the one of the top players in school history. Fournette was slowed most of the season by an ankle injury that he suffered in a scrimmage a week prior to the season opener against Wisconsin. Fournette still rushed for 843 yards and 8 TDs in just games for the Tigers in 2016. Fournette, a New Orleans native who was rated as the No. 1 high school recruit in the nation at St. Augustine High School, rushed for 100 or more yards four times in 2016 and briefly held the school's single-game rushing record with 284 yards in an October win over Ole Miss. Fournette finishes his LSU career ranked No. 4 in school history in rushing yards (3,830) and rushing touchdowns (40). His 119.7 rushing yards per game is a school-record and as his five 200-yard rushing games. Fournette ranks tied for third in LSU history in 100-yard rushing games with 19. Fournette holds LSU's single-season records for rushing yards (1,953 in 2015), rushing touchdowns (22 in 2015), overall touchdowns (23 in 2015), 200-yard games (4 in 2015), 100-yard games (10 in 2015), and rushing yards per game (162.8 in 2015). He's also the LSU single-game record holder for points (30 vs. Texas Tech, 2015) and touchdowns in a game (5 vs. Texas Tech, 2015). Fournette was a consensus All-America selection in 2015 as well as being a first team All-SEC pick that year. Despite only playing in seven games in 2016, Fournette earned second team All-SEC honors. Fournette earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors four times during his career, was SEC Freshman of the Week three times and earned National Player of the Week honors for his performance in LSU's win over Auburn in 2015.

Etling Is 6-3 as Starter at LSU

LSU junior QB **Danny Etling** came off the bench to lead the Tigers to a win over Jacksonville State in week 2. Etling, a transfer from Purdue, has started nine-straight games for the Tigers and is now 6-3 as LSU's starting quarterback earning wins over JSU, Missouri, Southern Miss, Ole Miss, Arkansas and Texas A&M, with the only losses coming at the last second on the road at Auburn and at home to Florida and against Alabama.

Beckwith, Riley Top 10 In Tackles In The SEC

LSU senior linebackers **Kendell Beckwith** and **Duke Riley** both rank in the top 10 in the SEC in tackles on the season. Beckwith is second SEC averaging 9.1 tackles per game and his 91 total tackles stand at No. 2 in the SEC. Riley, who is in his first year as a starter for the Tigers, ranks No. 7 in the league with 7.7 tackles a contest. Riley has 85 total tackles for the season. Beckwith and Riley make up the only linebacking duo in the SEC that rank in the Top 10 in the league in tackles. Beckwith had a career-best 16-tackle effort vs. Alabama, while Riley had a career-high 15 tackles in the win over Ole Miss. Beckwith has four double-digit tackle games this year (10 vs. Jacksonville State, 12 vs. Auburn, 15 vs. So. Miss, 16 vs. Alabama), while Riley has done it three times (13 vs. Auburn, 11 vs. So. Miss, 15 vs. Ole Miss).

Guice Reaches 1,000 Career Yards, Ranks in Top 5 In SEC In Rushing, Touchdowns, All-Purpose Yards

With a 21-yard rush late in the fourth quarter against Southern Miss, LSU sophomore running back **Derrius Guice** became the fastest player in school history to reach the 1,000 career rushing yard mark. Guice, who is the 46th Tiger to rush for 1,000 yards in a career, reached the milestone in just 113 carries, which is 23 fewer than Charles Scott. Guice finished with 162 yards on 16 carries and a pair of scores in the win for LSU, as it was his fourth career 100-yard rushing game and the first time he's earned 100-plus yards and multiple touchdowns in consecutive contests. In the SEC, Guice ranks second in rushing averaging 113.5 yards per game, while his 8.0 yards per carry is fourth in the nation. He's tied for first in the conference with 14 touchdowns, while his 135.1 all-purpose yards per game is first. Here is a list of the fastest LSU running backs to 1,000 yards by carry:

Tre'Davious White A Senior CLASS Award Finalist

LSU senior DB **Tre'Davious White** has been selected as one of 10 finalists at NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision institutions for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. White, a Shreveport, Louisiana, native majoring in sport administration has been a mainstay in the LSU defense since his career began in 2013, starting 44 of 46 game during that span. White has six interceptions and three punt return touchdowns in his career.

Etling, Moore Named To CoSIDA Academic All-District Team

LSU junior QB **Danny Etling** and FB/TE **J.D. Moore** were both named to the College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District Football Team for District 6. Recognizing the accomplishments of student-athletes both on the field and in the classroom, the duo were first team selections with Etling being the District 6 quarterback and Moore slotting in as the district's tight end. Majoring in mass communications with a concentration in public relations, Etling currently sports a 3.74 grade point average, while Moore has a 3.99 GPA in architecture. First-team Academic All-District honorees advance to the CoSIDA Academic All-America Team ballot, where first-, second- and third-team All-America honorees will be selected later this month. If either is selected, it would be the first time that LSU has had an Academic All-American since Rudy Niswanger did so in 2005.



Leonard Fournette First To Set Single-Game Rushing Record in Win Over Ole Miss

Junior running back **Leonard Fournette** returned to the starting lineup against Ole Miss and was the first of two players this season set the school single-game rushing record with 284 yards on just 16 carries. The performance passed Alley Broussard's record of 250, to go along with three touchdowns. Fournette had scoring runs of 59, 76 and 78 yards in the win over the Rebels, which moved him into a tie for 10th place in the SEC, while his 17.8 yard average is the second-most in an SEC game in conference history. The 284 yards is the seventh-most in a single game in the NCAA this season.

Etling-Fournette Third LSU Duo To Pass-Run For 200 Yards In Same Game

In Saturday's win against Ole Miss, LSU running back **Leonard Fournette** ran for a single-game record 284 yards, while quarterback **Danny Etling** went 19-for-28 for 204 yards and a touchdown. It marked just the third time in LSU history that the team had a quarterback throw over 200 yards while having a running back rush for 200 since Fournette had 212 yards on the ground while Brandon Harris had 261 in the air in the Texas Bowl. The first came when Kevin Faulk had 201 yards and Herb Tyler had 214 in 1998 against Alabama.

LSU Defense Has Allowed TDs on Consecutive Possessions Just Twice This Year

LSU's defense goes into the Louisville bowl game having allowed touchdowns on consecutive possessions just twice time this year, that coming against Mississippi State in week 3 and Texas A&M in week 13. In 133 possessions by the opponent, LSU's defense has yielded just 16 TDs and 21 field goals. Wisconsin kicked two field goals and scored a TD on three straight possessions in the first game of the season, Auburn kicked field goals on three consecutive possessions in a 18-13 win over LSU and Texas A&M scored in three straight over the course of the third and fourth quarters after LSU went up big. Those are the only teams that have scored on 3 straight possessions this year. Ole Miss, Alabama and Florida are the only other teams to score on back-to-back possessions.

LSU Scores More Points Than Plays Run In Southern Miss Win

For the fourth time in program history, the LSU offense produced more points (45) than plays run (42) in a win over an opponent. Against Southern Miss last Saturday night, the Tigers scored touchdowns on drives of three plays twice and one play twice, scoring 35 unanswered points in the second half to pull away for good. Guice Becomes 7th Player in LSU History with 100 Rushing Yards in Two Halves

Sophomore **RB Derrius Guice** became only the seventh player in LSU history to rush for 100 or more yards in both the first half and second half of a game. Guice did it on his way to rushing for a school-record 285 yards against Texas A&M. Guice had 117 yards in the first half and then followed that with 168 yards in the second half. Chark First With 70-Plus Yard Touchdown Plays Rushing and Receiving

With his 80-yard TD reception vs. Southern Miss, LSU WR **D.J. Chark** became the first (and only) player in school history to score TDs of 75 yards or more both rushing and receiving. Last year, Chark scored on a 79-yard run vs. Texas Tech in the Texas Bowl.

Tre'Davious White Nearing Punt Return Record

Tre'Davious White is one punt return shy of tying the school record for punt returns for a touchdown following his spectacular 60-yard return vs. Jacksonville State in week 2. White has returned three punts for TDs during his career, one shy of tying Skyler Green's school record. Overall, White has scored four touchdowns during his career (3 punt returns, 1 interception return).

Shuffling The Deck

Injuries hit the LSU offensive line hard during the early portion of the season as the Tigers used four different combinations on the offensive line during the first six games of the season. Only two players – Ethan Pocic (10 at center, 1 at right guard) and K.J. Malone (11 at left tackle) have started every game on the offensive line for the Tigers in 2016. In all, LSU has used four different combinations on the offensive line and a total of seven different players have earned at least one start up front for the Tigers.

LSU Has Pair of 100-Yard Rushers vs. Missouri; Tigers 27-3 All-Time When That Happens

For fifth straight season, LSU produced a pair of 100-yard rushers in a game when **Derrius Guice** and **Darrel Williams** reached the milestone in the 42-7 win over Missouri. Guice led the way with a career-best 163 yards and 3 TDs, while Williams followed with his own career-highs of 130 yards and 3 TDs. LSU has had 30 games in which two players have reached the 100-yard mark and the Tigers are 27-3 in those games, which includes its current 11-game winning streak when it happens.

Lasting Legacy Of Mike The Tiger

After a four-month battle with spindle cell sarcoma, a rare form of soft-tissue cancer, LSU's beloved living tiger mascot Mike VI was humanely euthanized Oct. 11th at the age of 11. "Roscoe," soon to become Mike VI, came to LSU at the age of two in 2007 and was the first LSU mascot to make use of the new, \$5 million, state-of-the-art habitat on campus next to Tiger Stadium. In a tradition that dates back to 1934, a search for Mike VII is currently underway. Here's a look at notable moments during the reign of each of the previous Mike's in LSU history:

LSU Produces Pair of 100-Yard Rushers and 200-Yard Passer vs. Missouri For Just 6th Time in School History

LSU's offense produced a pair of 100-yard rushers along with a 200-yard passer in the debut of **Ed Orgeron** and offensive coordinator **Steve Ensminger**. **Derrius Guice** rushed for 163 yards and 3 TDs, **Darrel Williams** added 130 yards and 3 TDs and **Danny Etling** threw for 216 yards in the win. Last year, LSU produced a 200-yard passer (**Brandon Harris** 228 yards) and two 100-yard rushers (**Derrius Guice** 161 yards; **Leonard Fournette** 158 yards) in the win over South Carolina. Prior to that, LSU hadn't had done it in an SEC game since 1997 vs. Kentucky when Kevin Faulk rushed for 212 yards, Rondell Mealey had 131 yards and Herb Tyler passed for 213 yards. Overall, LSU's had two 100-yard rushers and a 200-yard passer in only six games in school history. Here's a look at the games that it's happened:

Racking Up The Yards

LSU's 634 yards of total offense against Missouri was a new school record for the most yards in an SEC contest, four more than the previous high which was set in 1987 against Ole Miss (630) and 1967 against Mississippi State (630). On the ground, the team's 418 yards were the most in a contest since 1996 against Houston (433), and the most against a conference opponent since 1976 against Ole Miss (426). Sharing the Wealth

So far this season, LSU quarterback **Danny Etling** has completed passes to 13 different players in the 10 games he's played in. Five players in **Malachi Dupre**, **Travin Dural**, **D.J. Chark**, **Leonard Fournette** and **Colin Jeter** have double-digit receptions on the year at 34, 28, 24, 15 and 10 respectively. Last season just five players had double-digit receptions, with 16 total catching passes on the year. Etling has passed for 200-plus yards in six of the 10 games he's played in, while completing 60.0 percent of his passes.

Fournette Becomes Fastest Back To 3,000 Rushing Yards in LSU History

In his fourth carry of the game against Wisconsin, junior running back **Leonard Fournette** eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark, becoming just the fourth player in program history to do so and the fastest, needing just 26 games and 572 total rushing attempts. Fournette finished the game with 138 yards on the ground on 23 carries, his 16th career 100-yard rushing game at LSU, and for his career is averaging 119.7 yards on the ground, 6.2 yards per carry on 19.2 attempts per game. Two Tigers Have Scored Defensive TDs

Two current Tigers – CB **Tre'Davious White** and LB **Kendell Beckwith** – have scored defensive touchdowns for the Tigers. White scored on a 21-yard interception return against Wisconsin in the season opener this year, while Beckwith scored on a 29-yard interception return against New Mexico State in 2014. LSU has scored at least one defensive TD for the past three years and for 14 of the last 15 seasons going back to 2002.

#NFLSU – Tigers Lead The Way On Week 1 NFL Rosters Since 2014

Since 2014, the LSU football program has had the most former players on active NFL rosters heading into week one than any program in the nation with a combined 121. In 2016, LSU again leads the way with 43 former players on NFL 53-man squads, topping all other schools for the third-straight season, as it's also the second consecutive year there have been at least 40 Tigers on active rosters. The SEC makes up four of the top five over that span, while being five of six schools with at least 100 players in the NFL over that time.

No. 18 Tradition Passed Down to Tre'Davious White

A tradition established in 2003 continues as senior cornerback **Tre'Davious White** was voted to wear the No. 18 jersey for the 2015 and 2016 seasons. White was presented the jersey following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s during the Tigers' first team meeting of fall camp in 2015 and then again this year. White is one of LSU's leading returners on defense after recording 44 total tackles, with 30 on the solo end and 1.5 tackles for losses. Against Syracuse in the Carrier Dome, White cleared 69 yards in a shade over nine seconds on a punt return for a touchdown in the win over the Orange. Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007. Here is a look at the jersey No. 18s:

This Day vs. Night Thing in Tiger Stadium

The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 245-65-4 (.780) at night under the lights compared to a 34-26-3 (.567) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since 2000, LSU is 103-17 (.858) overall at home, which includes a 79-10 (.886) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 24-7 (.775) record during the day. Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. In the last 153 games, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 114-16 when that happens. Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 68-5. An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 67-0. LSU 20-4 When Current Running Back Reaches 100-Yard Mark

LSU is 20-4 when a current running back reaches the 100-yard mark. On two occasions, LSU's had two running backs go over the 100-yard mark in the same game (**Leonard Fournette** and **Derrius Guice** vs. South Carolina, 2015; **Guice** and **Darrel Williams** vs. Missouri, 2016). LSU is 15-4 in games when Fournette reaches the 100-yard mark; the Tigers are 6-0 when Guice reaches the 100-yard mark; and LSU is 1-0 when Williams gets to 100 yards.

The Aussie Punting Connection

Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well. Jamie Keehn took over punting duties in 2013 and finished his career with the fourth-best punting average for a career last year as a senior while being a permanent team captain and was named to the 2015 SEC Academic Honor Roll. The next in the pipeline is redshirt freshman punter **Josh Growden**, a native of Sydney, Australia, who in 2016 was named the SEC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week and had a career-long 68-yard punt against Southern Miss which is tied for the longest in the SEC this season. Growden was also named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

LSU Has FBS' Best Record When Trailing in the Fourth Quarter Since 2005

Colby Delahoussaye Ranks Fourth in LSU Career FG Percentage

Placekicker **Colby Delahoussaye** is ranked fourth in LSU history for career field goal percentage. He has booted 33-of-41 field goals for a .805 percentage. He was 11-of-15 in field goal attempts in 2014, including a game-winning, career-long 50-yard attempt at Florida. As a freshman in 2013, Delahoussaye shattered the LSU record for most consecutive field goals to start a career by converting his first nine attempts. The previous record was seven straight by David Browndyke in 1986. Delahoussaye also ranks third in LSU history for career PATs made at 127. Delahoussaye is now in Top 10 for most field goals made in a career in LSU history. He has 33 through 2016 which is tied for eighth all-time.

LSU Features Eleven Graduates on its Roster

Eleven current LSU football players have already earned their undergraduate degree at the university. **Corey Thompson** and **Colby Delahoussaye** earned their degrees in the fall of 2015, **Marcus Roberts** and **Christian LaCouture** received their degrees in the spring and summer of 2016, respectively, and earlier this month **John Ballis**, **Travin Dural**, **Colin Jeter**, **Lewis Neal**, **Ethan Pocic**, **Dwayne Thomas** and **Tre'Davious White** received theirs on campus. Ballis, Delahoussaye and Jeter earned their degrees in general business, Dural's is in interdisciplinary studies, while Neal, Pocic, Thomas, White Roberts, Thompson and LaCouture earned theirs in sports administration.

Two Current Tigers Have Accounted For Four Special Teams Touchdowns

Two current Tigers have accounted for four special teams touchdowns – **Tre'Davious White** with 3 and **Leonard Fournette** with 1. White has returned three punts for touchdowns, while Fournette returned a kickoff 100 yards for a TD against Notre Dame in the Music City Bowl in 2015. FORBES RANKS LSU TOP 5

In Forbes Magazine's latest study in 2015, LSU was ranked as the nation's fourth-most valuable football team with a worth of \$111 million. Forbes ranked LSU as the fourth-most valuable football franchise in 2012, 2013 and the fifth most in 2014, clearly stating LSU is one of college football's most valuable teams.

Of LSU, Forbes said, "we apply the heaviest weight to money that goes towards academic programming, which includes both football scholarships and direct contributions to university initiatives like a library fund or non-athletic scholarship programs. A shining example of this is LSU, which last year contributed over \$7 million to academic programming."

Forbes said in its report that "athletic value, which is next in the weighting order, is the remaining football profit that goes toward supporting non-revenue sports like softball and soccer. The final two areas, conference and community, are comprised of money earned from playing in bowl games and the economic impact generated by home football games, respectively."

LSU set a school-record for attendance in 2014 as the Tigers averaged 101,723 fans for the seven home games. Overall, LSU drew a total of 712,063 fans to Tiger Stadium in 2014, the most combined fans for home games in school history.

LSU ATHLETICS TRANSFERS \$10 MILLION TO UNIVERSITY

The LSU Athletic Department transferred over \$10 million last fiscal year to other components of the university for use in supporting LSU's academic, research, public service and other missions, Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva announced in August 2015.

"Our athletic department is sincerely committed to supporting the academic mission of the university, and we're extremely proud to transfer over \$10 million this year," Alleva said. "These funds provide vital resources for our students, faculty and staff, and they help to sustain LSU as one of the top research institutions in the country."

The athletic department has contributed a total of \$43.5 million to the LSU-Baton Rouge campus over the past five fiscal years.

Beginning in 2012, the athletic department has annually presented \$7.2 million to the university in accordance with the Athletics Fund Transfer Policy approved by the LSU Board of Supervisors. The policy states that in years in which LSU Athletics yields a surplus, a portion of the surplus in addition to the \$7.2 million may be provided to the university.

The surplus produced by the athletic department in fiscal year 2014-15 will allowed an additional \$2.85 million to be channeled to the university, creating a total fund transfer last year of \$10.05 million.

LSU ATHLETICS FEATURES ACADEMIC CENTER THAT IS A 'MODEL OF EXCELLENCE'

LSU, in particular the efforts of the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes, is one of eight colleges and universities nationwide being honored by University Business magazine in its Spring 2016 Models of Excellence recognition program.

Sponsored by Higher One, a leading provider of financial services to college and university campuses across the U.S., the Models of Excellence program recognizes innovative approaches to encouraging and nurturing student success on campus.

Since the launch of the CCACSA in 2001, LSU's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) has continued an upward trend each year, which includes its most recent score of 84 percent, an all-time high for the school. The 84 percent is up significantly from the school's first score of 67 percent in 2005. LSU has also gone from a GSR score of 69 percent in 2008 to a score of 84 in 2015, which represents one of the best improvements in the Southeastern Conference during that span.

LSU FOOTBALL RATED AS NATION'S NINTH MOST VALUABLE PROGRAM

LSU is rated as college football's ninth most valuable program according to a study done by Ryan Brewer, a finance profession at Indiana University-Purdue University.

Brewer, who also had LSU ranked No. 9 a year ago, had his rankings published today in the Wall Street Journal as well as online at wsj.com.

According to Brewer, the LSU football program has a value of 612.30 million dollars, which puts it firmly among the Top 10 programs in the nation. Ohio State is listed No. 1 with a value of 946.61 million, followed by Texas (885.05 million), Michigan (811.30 million), Notre Dame (723.59 million) and Alabama (694.87).

The ranking of other SEC teams in Brewer's study include Tennessee No. 12 at 401.98 million, South Carolina No. 14 (398.18 million), Texas A&M No. 17 (359.14 million), Auburn No. 19 (319.32 million), Arkansas No. 20 (311.85 million), Ole Miss No. 32 (216.20 million), Kentucky No. 34 (208.00 million), Missouri No. 51 (108.88 million), Mississippi State No. 53 (103.03 million), and Vanderbilt No. 68 (55.64 million).

LSU RANKED TENTH IN ACADEMIC POLL OF TOP 25 FOOTBALL TEAMS

When it comes to measuring success of the nation's top football programs both in the classroom and on the playing field, LSU finds itself among an elite group of schools that are excelling both areas.

In a poll conducted by Washington D.C.-area think tank New America and published in Time Magazine, the results took into account a teams' national ranking based on the College Football Playoff Standings and its graduation success rate (GSR). LSU was ranked No. 20 in the final College Football Playoff Standings and were No. 10 among all college football teams in the Top 25 in GSR score.

Combine the two polls and LSU finds itself sitting at No. 15 in the nation, which ranks third among all Southeastern Conference schools. Alabama is first among league schools with a combined ranking of No. 2 followed by Ole Miss, who came in at No. 11. Other SEC schools in the combined Top 25 include Florida at No. 17, and Tennessee at No. 23.

In the academic-only ranking for the Top 25 teams, LSU's No. 10 placement is second in the SEC behind only Alabama, who checked in at No. 6.

Clemson was ranked No. 1 in the football playoff poll, while Northwestern was No. 1 in the academic poll.

LSU GSR SCORE REACHES ALL-TIME HIGH AT 88 PERCENT

Success for LSU student-athletes in the classroom reached an all-time high as the NCAA reported in November the Graduate Success Rate score of 88 for the Tigers, four points better than the previous high which was set a year ago. LSU's GSR score of 88 ranks fourth along with Missouri among all Southeastern Conference institutions. LSU's score of 88 is four spots higher than the NCAA Division I average of 84.

LSU's score also continues a trend that has seen the school's score improve, or remain the same, since the inception of the report in 2005. Since taking over at LSU in 2008, vice chancellor and director of athletics Joe Alleva has put a premium on success in the classroom for LSU student-athletes and the results have been impressive. LSU's 19 percent improvement in the GSR since 2008 ranks as the best in the SEC during that span, topping Missouri (17 percent) and South Carolina (15 percent).

Under Alleva, LSU has seen its GSR scores rise from 69 percent in 2008 to 88 percent in 2016. LSU's first GSR score in 2005 was 66 percent. Eight sports led LSU with perfect scores of 100 – men's golf, men's tennis, women's golf, gymnastics, women's tennis, women's swimming, volleyball, and women's track/cross country. Additionally, LSU had three other sports record scores of 90 or higher led by men's swimming and diving at 96, followed by women's basketball (92) and women's soccer (92).

LSU-Louisville Set For First-Ever Meeting

LSU and Louisville will meet for the first time on the football field when the two meet at the 2016 Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl in Orlando on New Year's Eve. The Tigers, who finished the regular season 7-4 overall and 5-3 in the Southeastern Conference, won four of their last seven games of the regular season to be bowl eligible for the 17th consecutive year. LSU went undefeated in the month of October, the beginning of Ed Orgeron's time at the helm of the program, while splitting each of the final four games and the season with an emphatic 54-39 win over Texas A&M on Thanksgiving night. The opponents in the Cardinals found themselves as playoff contenders after storming out of the gate 4-0 on the season. Louisville scored no less than 59 points in each of their first four wins of the season, including defeating a ranked Florida State team 63-20. A loss to Clemson ended the perfect run, but Louisville went 9-1 before consecutive losses to Houston and Kentucky to end the year. The Cardinals boast the 2016 Heisman Trophy winner in quarterback Lamar Jackson, who combined for over 50 touchdowns on the ground and through the air. Louisville coach Bobby Petrino is no stranger to LSU, as for four years he was the head coach at Arkansas and went 2-2 against the Tigers.

Wisconsin Kicks Late Field Goal to Break LSU Streak

LSU rallied from a 13-point deficit at Lambeau Field before Wisconsin placekicker Rafael Gaglianone made a 47-yard field goal that proved to be the game winner, as LSU lost its season opener for the first time since 2002. LSU (0-1) scored twice in a 67-second span of the third quarter to take a lead, and after falling behind again, the Tigers had a first down at the Wisconsin (1-0) 30-yard line with a minute to play. However, quarterback **Brandon Harris** was intercepted at the Badgers 25. Cornerback **Tre'Davious White** had a 21-yard interception for touchdown and then recovered a fumble three plays later to setup a 10-yard touchdown reception by **Travin Dural** from Harris. Harris finished 12-of-21 passing for 131 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. Dural caught five passes for 50 yards. Running back **Leonard Fournette** had 23 rushes for 138 yards and added three catches for 38 yards. Gaglianone made field goals of 30 and 48 yards to give Wisconsin a 6-0 halftime lead. Fifth-year senior quarterback Bart Houston was 19-of-31 passing for 205 yards with two interceptions. Running back Corey Clement led the Badgers with 86 yards on 21 carries, while tight end Tony Fumagalli caught seven passes for 100 yards and a touchdown. LSU was outgained 339-257, as Wisconsin had a 36:57-23:03 advantage in time of possession.

Etling Leads Football Past Gamecocks, 34-13

Quarterback **Danny Etling** led the LSU football team to three-straight touchdowns and **Tre'Davious White** added a highlight-reel punt return, as No. 21 LSU used a 27-point second quarter to defeat FCS powerhouse Jacksonville State, 34-13, in Tiger Stadium. Etling, a junior transfer, energized the Tigers with a 46-yard touchdown pass to tight end **DeSean Smith** early the second quarter to give LSU a 6-3 lead. With **Leonard Fournette** unavailable due to injury, running back **Derrius Guice** carried 19 times for 155 yards including a 4-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. LSU added two more touchdowns in 47 seconds just before the half - a 2-yard dive by fullback **Bry'Kiethon Mouton** and a 60-yard punt return by White - and the Tigers took a 27-10 lead into the lockerroom. While Etling sparked the Tigers offense, the highlight of the game belonged to White. The senior fielded a punt at his 40-yard line, evaded tacklers and retreated all the way to the LSU 19 before turning up field and out-running everyone for a touchdown with 20 seconds left in the half. Etling finished 6-of-14 passing for 100 yards with one passing touchdown and a 2-yard bootleg score in the third quarter. He entered in the second quarter for **Brandon Harris**, who struggled to a 1-for-4 start. LSU amassed 244 rushing yards on 37 carries. **Kendell Beckwith** posted a team-leading 10 tackles followed by **Rickey Jefferson** with eight stops and **Donnie Alexander**, who also set a career mark with eight tackles.

Gold-Clad LSU Holds Off State, 23-20

Leonard Fournette had 147 rushing yards and scored twice and first-time starting quarterback Danny Etling threw for 215 yards, as LSU built a 20-point lead before holding off a rally by Mississippi State, 23-20. LSU led 23-3 after dominating the first 30 minutes of play. The Tigers held a 282-80 advantage in total offense in the first half. Mississippi State used an onside kick recovery to score twice in 40 seconds late in the fourth quarter. However, LSU linebacker Arden Key came up with LSU's fifth sack of the night and forced a fumble to seal the victory. Etling completed 19-of-30 passes for 215 yards with a touchdown. He became the 13th-straight Tiger quarterback to win his first start in Tiger Stadium. Fournette ran 28 times for 17 yards with touchdown runs of 5 and 25 yards in the first half. LSU outgained Mississippi State, 392-270, while converting 7-of-16 third downs. The Bulldogs managed only 1-of-14 third-down conversions. On the ground, LSU outgained the Bulldogs, 177-56. LSU grabbed a 7-0 lead at the 9:28 mark of the first quarter when Etling hit wide receiver D.J. Chark on a 37-yard touchdown connection in the back of the north endzone. The aerial culminated a seven-play, 64-yard drive and marked Chark's first career TD reception. Fournette dashed 25 yards for a touchdown with 8:25 remaining in the second quarter to give the Tigers a 20-0 lead after Colby Delahoussaye's PAT attempt was blocked. Delahoussaye booted a 27-yard field goal in the second quarter to lift LSU to 23-3. The Bulldogs recovered an onside kick and needed only two plays to pull within a field goal in the fourth quarter. Damian Williams completed passes of 25 and seven yards to Fred Ross, who leaped into the endzone with 3:30 to play. The Tigers defense came to life on the final series, forcing Williams into consecutive incomplete passes before Key came up with a game-clinching sack on fourth down with 42 seconds to play.

Winning TD Ruled Too Late at Auburn

Danny Etling's 15-yard game-winning touchdown pass to D.J. Chark was overturned by video review citing no time remaining on the clock, and LSU fell to Auburn, 18-13, on a steamy night at Jordan-Hare Stadium. On the previous play, LSU was flagged for an illegal shift after picking up a first down at the Auburn 2-yard line with 0:01 to play. With the clock starting on the official's whistle, Etling - who rolled out of the pocket and found Chark for a tip-toe grab in the back-right corner of the endzone - was ruled to have received the snap after time had expired. Auburn, which kicked six field goals in the contest, celebrated its first league win of the season by running the length of the field to its student section. Etling finished 15-of-27 passing for 118 yards with a touchdown. He was sacked three times and left the game for a play with cuts to his head and lip in the first half. Etling ran the ball 11 times for 23 yet yards including runs of 12 and 18 yards on the final drive. Running back Leonard Fournette had 16 carries for 101 net yards. Derrius Guice added 62 yards on three rushes, while Chark had an end-around for 35 yards. Auburn's Daniel Carlson made field goals of 51, 29, 29, 31, 37 and 29 yards were the only points the Tigers scored. Jamal Adams (13) Duke Riley (13) and Kendall Beckwith (12) all posted double-digit tackles in the game to mark the first time since the 2015 Western Kentucky game that three Tigers tallied double-digit stops in a single game.

Football Blasts Missouri in Orgeron Debut

In Ed Orgeron's debut, LSU amassed 634 yards of total offense and dominated Missouri on both sides of the ball to hand the first-time visitors to Tiger Stadium a 42-7 defeat. Orgeron took over as interim head coach on Sunday when Les Miles was relieved of his duties following a 2-2 start to the 2016 season. LSU running backs **Derrius Guice** and **Darrel Williams** led the Tigers to a school record for total offense in SEC games, previously 630 yards set in 1987 at Ole Miss and 1967 against Mississippi State. With **Leonard Fournette** sidelined with an injury, both had career nights. Guice carried 17 times for 163 yards, while Williams had 21 carries for 130 yards. Each scored three touchdowns. Quarterback **Danny Etling** also had a splendid outing, 19-of-30 for 216 yards. He completed passes to nine different receivers, with **Malachi Dupre** and **Travin Dural** catching four passes apiece. LSU's 418 rushing yards was its most in an SEC game since Oct. 30, 1976, against Ole Miss (426). The homestanding Tigers had possession for 42:33 - its highest on record (dating to 1978). LSU opened the scoring at the 6:46 mark of the first quarter on a brilliant 42-yard touchdown run by Guice. The dash, which featured a key block from wide receiver **Russell Gage**, culminated an 85-yard, nine-play march to give the Bayou Bengals a 7-0 lead. LSU halted a Missouri drive early in the second quarter when **Tre'Davious White** intercepted Mizou's Drew Lock at the Bayou Bengals' 11-yard line. The interception was the sixth of White's career and his second this season. LSU took advantage of the turnover, driving 89 yards on 13 plays, with the march ending on Guice's four-yard scoring burst. The touchdown gave Guice, a sophomore from Baton Rouge, the first multi-TD game of his career. Guice increased the lead to 21-0 with 4:40 left in the first half with a 37-yard touchdown sprint, capping a 93-yard, five-play march, the longest TD drive of the season for LSU. LSU started strong in the second half, covering 75 yards in eight plays on the first drive of the third quarter, with Williams finishing the drive on a 1-yard TD surge. LSU added another touchdown at the 10:00 mark of the fourth quarter, when Williams scored a on two-yard TD run to cap an 86-yard, 10-play march. Williams scored for the third time on a 9-yard run with just under five minutes left in the game. **Kendall Beckwith** led the way in tackles with nine stops, followed by **Duke Riley** and **Dwayne Thomas** who each posted five tackles.

Big-Play LSU Too Much for USM, 45-10

LSU had five touchdown drives of three plays or less, as the quick-strike Tigers shook off an unexpected week of rust to defeat Southern Miss, 45-10, on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. **Danny Etling** connected on touchdown passes of 80 and 63 yards, while running back **Derrius Guice** had touchdown runs of 61 and 20 yards in a 28-point third-quarter outburst that ended the Eagles' upset bid. The Tigers extended a non-conference winning streak to 47 games in Tiger Stadium. Etling completed 11-of-18 passes for a season-high 276 yards with three touchdowns and his first interception in 104 pass attempts. **Malachi Dupre** caught two of the touchdowns and finished with three catches for 100 yards, while **D.J. Chark** added 91 yards on three grabs with an 80-yard touchdown. Guice, who moved over 1,000 career rushing yards, needed only 16 carries to gain 162 of LSU's 182 net yards. He scored back-to-back touchdowns early in the third quarter. After being tied at 10-10 at halftime, the Tigers outscored Southern Miss 35-0 in the second half and outgained the Eagles, 338-107. LSU was 5-of-9 on third downs. Entering the contest, Southern Miss ranked No. 4 nationally allowing only 14 third-down conversions in six games this season. The Tigers averaged 10.9 yards per play - 459 yards on 42 plays - a modern-day school record. Defensively, the Tigers allowed only 81 rushing yards on 36 attempts. **Kendell Beckwith** led the way with a career-best 15 tackles including two behind the line.

While Fournette Runs Wild, LSU 'D' Shuts Down Rebels

Leonard Fournette set a school record with 284 rushing yards, as 25th-ranked LSU pitched a second-half shutout of No. 23 Ole Miss, 38-21, on a late Saturday night in Tiger Stadium. LSU, which was tied 21-21 at the half, dominated the final 30 minutes of play, allowing only 54 yards of total offense in the second half until the game's final drive. With the game decided, Ole Miss added 50 more as fans poured to the parking lots during the game's final drive. Fournette needed only 16 carries to break Alley Broussard's 2004 record of 250 yards, which was also set against Ole Miss. He scored on runs of 59, 76 and 78 yards, averaging a school-record 17.8 yards per carry (minimum 15 carries). Meanwhile, quarterback **Danny Etling** completed 19-of-28 passes for 204 yards with a 40-yard touchdown pass to **D.J. Chark**. **Malachi Dupre** caught a game-high five passes for 52 yards, while **Travin Dural** added four catches for 48 yards. After allowing 221 yards in the opening half, LSU's defense gave up only 37 in the third quarter while building a 10-point advantage. **Derrius Guice** slammed the door shut with a 6-yard touchdown run that capped an 11-play, 70-yard drive that lasted 6:03. Guice also had 16 carries for 67 yards. LSU outgained Ole Miss, 515-325. Ole Miss quarterback Chad Kelly, the SEC's leading passer, was held nearly 100 yards below his season average of 308.2 by a swarming LSU defense. **Duke Riley** logged a career-high 15 tackles in the contest. He had five solo stops as well as 1.5 TFL and an interception.

Hurts Leads Alabama Past LSU Late, 10-0

No. 13 LSU played No. 1 Alabama to a scoreless tie through three quarters, but the Tide scored on consecutive fourth-quarter possessions to win 10-0 Saturday night in Tiger Stadium. Alabama (9-0, 6-0 SEC) was shutout in the first half for the first time in 127 games, but quarterback Jalen Hurts' shook loose in the final quarter to secure the victory. Hurts ran for 114 yards and the game's only touchdown, while passing for 107 yards with an interception. Alabama managed 323 yards of total offense, though the Tide didn't score until Hurts' 21-yard run with 13:08 to play. LSU struggled to move the ball against the Tide defense, managing only 125 yards of total offense. Quarterback **Danny Etling** was 11-of-24 passing for 92 yards with an interception. He was sacked five times. **Leonard Fournette** ran 17 times for 35 net yards. Both teams missed field goals in the first half. **Kendell Beckwith** led LSU with a career-best 16 tackles, while **Lewis Neal** also added a career-best with 11 to go along with two quarterback hurries. LSU safety **Jamal Adams** intercepted Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts on the Tide's first drive, giving the Tigers possession at the Alabama 33-yard line. The pick was Adams' first of the season and the fifth of his career. The Tigers, however, were not able to capitalize on the opportunity, as **Colby Delahoussaye's** 49-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Alabama defensive back Ronnie Harrison. The first half finished in a scoreless tie, marking the first time Alabama had been shut out in an opening half since 2007, when Florida State blanked the Tide through the first 30 minutes of play. LSU forced Hurts to fumble on a pass attempt, and the Tigers recovered at the Alabama 42-yard line with 5:42 left in the third quarter. Defensive tackle **Frank Herron** was credited with the sack, and outside linebacker **Arden Key** pounced on the football. Alabama responded by driving 90 yards on 12 plays for the game's first score, as Hurts dashed 21 yards to the end zone with 13:08 remaining in the contest. Hurts again led the Tide into the LSU redzone, rushing seven times for 47 yards. Adam Griffith finished off a nearly 10-minute drive with a 25-yard field goal from the right hash to push Alabama ahead, 10-0, with 2:41 to play.

No. 19 LSU Runs All Over Hogs, 38-10

Leonard Fournette scored three times and **Derrius Guice** had the second-best rushing performance in LSU history, as the No. 19 Tigers drummed Arkansas, 38-10, Saturday night. LSU (6-3, 4-2 SEC) became bowl eligible for the 17th-consecutive season while reclaiming "The Boot." Arkansas fell to 6-4 overall and 2-4 in the SEC. Fournette scored twice as the Tigers built a 21-0 lead in the first 20 minutes of play and never looked back. The junior ran 17 times for 98 yards with touchdown runs of 5, 7 and 3 yards. Guice, a sophomore from Baton Rouge, ran for 219 of his 252 rushing yards in the second half. Highlighting the effort was the longest play from scrimmage in LSU history: a 96-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. Guice's 252 yards trails only Fournette's 284 yards earlier this season against Ole Miss in LSU single-game history. Guice had a career-high 21 carries. LSU finished with 390 rushing yards, an average of 7.6 per carry. Quarterback **Danny Etling** was steady for LSU, completing 10-of-16 passes for 157 yards. The Tigers were 6-of-12 on third down and held the ball for 35:11. The Tigers defense continued to shine, allowing only 81 rushing yards with three sacks in the first half. Linebacker **Donnie Alexander's** interception setup an LSU touchdown and **Dwayne Thomas's** pick off kept Arkansas out of the endzone. LSU's **Kendell Beckwith** also recovered a fumble in the endzone. Ten of Arkansas's 13 drives lasted five plays or fewer.

LSU Miscues Costly in 16-10 Loss to Florida

Three failed chances in the redzone and a fumble on a kickoff return cost the LSU football team, as the No. 16-ranked Tigers lost to No. 21 Florida in the home finale, 16-10. LSU amassed 423 yards of total offense but was 2-of-5 in the red zone including a fourth-and-goal fumble by running back **Derrius Guice**, who was stretching the ball toward the goal line as time expired. Florida clinched the SEC Eastern Division title and will meet Alabama in the Championship Game. The Gators gained 270 yards of offense including a 98-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter. With **Leonard Fournette** hobbled, LSU quarterback **Danny Etling** put the Tigers in position to win with a 13-play, 74-yard drive that came up a yard short of paydirt. Etling was 14-of-25 passing for 204 yards. Fournette ran 12 times for 40 yards, while fellow Tiger running back Guice rushed 19 yards for 83 yards and a touchdown. Guice also had a fumble on first-and-goal at the Florida 7 in the second quarter. Wide receiver **DJ Chark** added 51 yards on three carries and added two catches for 46 yards. **Colby Delahoussaye** hit a 22-yard field goal to tie the game in the fourth quarter, after being robbed of a chance at a third-quarter field goal when the snap was bobbled. On its final drive, runs of 13 yards by Etling and 14 yards by Guice moved LSU into Florida territory. On fourth-and-10 from the Florida 48, Etling kept the drive alive with a 30-yard connection to Chark who ran to the Florida 18. Another first-down pass to **Malachi Dupre** setup first-and-goal from the Florida 7. Guice needed two runs to advance to the 1, but fullback **J.D. Moore** was stopped for no gain on third down and Guice fumbled attempting to stretch the ball to the goal line as time expired.

Guice, Etling Make History in Blowout of A&M

Derrius Guice ran for a school-record 285 yards while **Danny Etling** threw for 324, as No. 25 LSU beat No. 22 Texas A&M, 54-39, Thursday night at Kyle Field. LSU's 622 yards of total offense was second-most in a true road game in school history. This was the first game in LSU history in which the Tigers had a 300-yard passer and a 200-yard runner. Guice, a sophomore running back, carried 37 times for 285 yards, besting injured teammate **Leonard Fournette's** school record set 33 days ago against Ole Miss. Guice scored four times on runs of 45, 45, 6 and 1 yard. Etling, a junior transfer, had his best evening as a Tiger, completing 20-of-28 passes for 324 yards with touchdowns of 20 and 9 yards. Etling's favorite targets were **Russell Gage** (5 catches, 62 yards, 1 TD), **Malachi Dupre** (4 catches, 50 yards, 1 TD), and **D.J. Chark** (3 catches, 59 yards), who also scored a 7-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter.
