NEXT UP

- ▶ LSU dropped its Southeastern Conference opener on Saturday night in Starkville to Mississippi State, 37-7.
- ▶ The Tigers return to Tiger Stadium to face Syracuse at 6 p.m. Saturday on ESPN2.
- ▶ The Orange are coming off of a 41-17 win over Central Michigan and own a 2-1 record this season.
- LSU owns a streak of 48 straight nonconference victories at home. The Tigers have not lost a home non-conference game since 2000
- ▶ RB **Derrius Guice** finished as the Tigers' leading rusher with 76 yards on 15 attempts. This season, Guice has rushed for 300 yards on 57 attempts at 100 yards per game.
- ▶ Guice owns 2,123 rushing yards for his career which ranks 14th on LSU's career rushing list. Guice passed Domanick Davis on Saturday night.

- ▶ RB **Darrel Williams** scored the Tigers' lone touchdown on Saturday night, a 10-yard run for 14th of his career and fourth of the season. Williams is 10 yards away from reaching 1,000 career rushing yards.
- ▶ LB **Arden Key** appeared in his first game of the season and totaled three tackles and half sack. Key owns 17.5 sacks and is just a half sack away from moving into the top-10 of LSU's career sack rankings.
- ▶ DE Christian LaCouture and LB Devin White led the Tigers on Saturday night with 11 tackles. Both recorded career highs and White has led the team in tackles in all three games this season
- > DJ Chark is the Tigers' leading receiver with 203 yards. Eleven Tigers have recorded receptions this season.

BY THE NUMBERS

The number of games LSU has won in a row against non-conference opponents in Tiger Stadium. The last loss to a non-conference foe in Tiger Stadium came in 2000 vs. UAB.

The number of times LSU has turned the ball over this season. It's the second time since 1937 LSU has gone through the first three games of a season without a turnover. LSU is one of just two teams in the nation without a turnover in three games.

The number rushing attempts by LSU since it last lost a fumble. The last time LSU lost a fumble on a rushing attempt came in the second quarter against Florida in 2016

Ed Orgeron Head Coach

Overall Record: 24-30 LSU Record: 8-3 (Second year)

Ed Orgeron, who led the Tigers to a 5-2 mark as interim coach over the final two months of the 2016 season was named LSU's permanent head football coach on Nov. 26, 2016, two days after the Tigers defeated Texas A&M, 54-39 to finish the regular season with a 7-4 mark.

Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, is LSU's 33rd head football coach, and the first Louisiana native to serve as head coach of the Tigers since West Monroe native Jerry Stovall held the position for four seasons in the early 1980s.

Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 12-4 in his past 16 games as a head coach. Overall, Orgeron has a 22-29 overall mark as a collegiate head coach, which includes a 6-2 record at LSU and a 6-2 mark as Southern Cal's interim coach in 2013. Of Orgeron's six wins in his LSU debut season, four came against Southeastern Conference foes and all were by double-digits.

In his first game as LSU's permanent head coach, Orgeron guided the Tigers to a 29-9 win over No. 13 Louisville and its Heisman Trophy quarterback Lamar Jackson in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl.

The win against Louisville capped a remarkable turnaround for the Tigers under Orgeron, who assumed the role as interim coach of the Tigers a day after a disappointing 18-13 setback at Auburn.

Orgeron wasted little time in getting the attention of the Tigers as he immediately instilled energy and enthusiasm into the program, shortened practices with crisp, high intensity workouts, kept the players fresh with more time in the meeting room and held the players accountable for all areas of the program.

With the "One Team. One Heartbeat" motto, the Tigers seemingly became a different team overnight and the results that LSU sought soon followed. As the head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron said he was going to "flip the script" and he assigned a theme for the daily practices.

LSU's practices have a descriptive name for each day of the week, one of the ways that Orgeron and his staff hold the players accountable and focused both prior to and during the workout. The daily practice nicknames are as follows: **Tell the Truth Monday, Competition Tuesday, Turnover Wednesday, No Repeat Thursday** and **Focus Friday**.

Orgeron's first duty as interim head coach was to appoint veteran assistant and former LSU quarterback Steve Ensminger from tight ends coach to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The move paid immediate dividends as Ensminger injected life into the Tiger's offense by diversifying the play calling and bringing a culture of inclusion to the offensive staff room.

In eight games under Orgeron, LSU set offensive records for most yards in an SEC game (634 vs. Missouri), longest scoring play from scrimmage (Derrius Guice 96-yard TD run vs. Arkansas), and twice set the school single-game rushing record (Leonard Fournette 284 yards vs. Ole Miss, Derrius Guice 285 yards vs. Texas A&M).

Defensively, LSU held opponents scoreless for 15 of 32 quarters under Orgeron and limited the opposition to an average of 15.3 points per game over the eight contests. In 12 games, LSU allowed only 16 touchdowns all season, which led the nation. The Tigers also gave up just 1.3 TDs a contest, also first nationally.

Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 mark over that span.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojans' defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. Orgeron coached under Paul Hackett at USC for three years from 1998 to 2000 and was one of just a handful of coaches retained by Pete Carroll when he took over as the Trojans' head coach in 2001.

He added the title of recruiting coordinator for USC in 2001 and helped the Trojans to top five signing classes for three straight years from 2002-04. Rivals.com and Sporting News named him the 2004 National Recruiter of the Year.

On the field, Orgeron was part of a Southern Cal staff that led the Trojans to a 12-1 mark and an AP National Championship in 2003 and a 13-0 record and another national title in 2004.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005-07.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988-92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line. During his tenure, the Hurricanes won the national championship twice (1989 and 1991), finished second in the AP poll once (1988) and third twice (1990 and 1992) while appearing in five New Year's Day bowls (1989 Orange, 1990 Sugar, 1991 Cotton, 1992 Orange, 1993 Sugar).

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87).

As a player, Orgeron was a four-year starter on the defensive line for Northwestern State, captaining the Demons as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Northwestern State in 1984.

He starred in football, basketball and track at South Lafourche High in Galliano, La. On the big screen, Orgeron played himself in the 2009 Oscar-nominated movie, "The Blind Side."

Born July 27, 1961, he and his wife, Kelly, have three sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody. Tyler is a member of the LSU football support staff, while twins Parker and Cody are entering their second season as part of the McNeese State football team.

NOTEBOOK

LSU Against the ACC

- ▶ LSU is 36-27 all-time against current Atlantic Coast Conference member institutions in program history.
- ▶ The Tigers are familiar with the conference after having played Syracuse, Clemson, North Carolina and Louisville in recent history.
- ▶ Its most recent meeting with an ACC team came against Louisville in the 2016 Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, a 29-9 win .

LSU-Syracuse Notes of Interest

- ▶ Two current members of LSU's Sports Radio Network were part of two of the Tigers' games against Syracuse. In the 1965 Sugar Bowl, LSU analyst Doug Moreau scored on a 57-yard TD reception and kicked a 28-yard field goal in the 13-10 Tiger victory.
- ▶ In the 1989 Hall of Fame Bowl, current LSU sideline reporter Gordy Rush, as an up-back, returned a pooch kick 11 yards in the first quarter of the 23-10 LSU loss. When Rush returned to sidelines, head coach Mike Archer told the New Orleans native, "if I wanted you to return kicks I would put you deep."
- ▶ Two other LSU Athletic Administrators were starters in the 1989 Hall of Fame Bowl vs. Syracuse Deputy AD Verge Ausberry (started at middle linebacker) and Senior Associate AD Ronnie Haliburton (started at tight end)
- ▶ Tommy Powell, a former staff member at LSU's Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes, is an assistant provost for student-athlete development at Syracuse.
- ▶ LSU Assistant Vice-Chancellor/Executive Director of the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student Athletes Kenneth Miles worked at Syracuse. Miles served as the assistant dean for student services from 2002-06 before taking over as executive director for diversity, enrollment management and graduate admissions for Syracuse's iSchool. Miles also served as the Orange's associate AD for student-athlete support prior to taking over at LSU.

Syracuse Playing In Louisiana For Seventh Time

- ▶ When LSU and Syracuse kickoff on Saturday, it will mark the seventh time the Orange have played a game in the state of Louisiana.
- ▶ Syracuse is 5-1 all-time in games played in Louisiana, which includes a 4-0 mark vs. Tulane, a 1-0 mark vs. McNeese State and an 0-1 record vs. LSU.
- ▶ Syracuse last played in Louisiana in 2011, beating Tulane, 37-34, on October 8 in the Superdome.
- ▶ Syracuse beat Tulane in New Orleans in 1996 (31-7), 1991 (24-0), and 1975 (31-13).
- ▶ The Orange beat an 11-0 McNeese State team in the 1979 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, 31-7.
- > Syracuse's only loss on Louisiana soil came against LSU in the 1965 Sugar Bowl by a 13-10 margin.

Orgeron is 2-0 Following a Loss

- ▶ Head Coach Ed Orgeron is 2-0 following a loss as the Tigers' head coach.
- ▶ Orgeron and the Tigers have outscored their opponents 92-49 with both wins coming on the road last season against Arkansas and Texas A&M.

Offense, Defense Winning Turnover Battle

- ▶ The LSU offense is just one of three teams without a turnover this season and one of two teams in the nation without a turnover in three games.
- ▶ This marks the second time in school history than an LSU team has not turned the ball over in its first three games.
- ▶ The defense has given LSU a +3 turnover margin with interceptions by **Andraez "Greedy" Williams** and true freshman **Kary Vincent Jr**. Williams has two interceptions through the first two games and Vincent Jr. intercepted his first ball against Chattanooga on a one-handed catch.

Guice Surpasses 2,000 Career Yards, Nearing Top-10 List

- ▶ RB **Derrius Guice** surpassed the 2,000 career rushing yard mark in LSU's win over Chattanooga. The Baton Rouge native became the 16th player in LSU history to rush for 2,000 or more yards in a career.
- ▶ Guice passed Leonard Fournette as the most efficient rusher to surpass 2,000 yards as he needed 271 attempts, 32 fewer than Fournette's 302. Guice is 93 yards away from moving into the top-10 of LSU's career rushing yard list.
- ▶ A year ago, Guice became the fastest player to reach 1,000 yards.

LSU Has Fifth-Longest Non-Conference Home Winning Streak Of All-Time

- ▶ With 48 consecutive wins over non-conference opponents at home in Tiger Stadium, the LSU football team can lay claim to having the longest among current teams and the fifth-longest in college football
- ▶ The last loss at home to a non-SEC opponent came in 2000 against UAB, but since 2001 LSU has gone unblemished when playing in front of their home fans. LSU has matched Miami from 1985-94 with the longest non-conference home win streak in the modern era.

- ▶ LSU is riding a streak of 12 consecutive non-conference games with a 100-yard rusher. LSU is 10-2 in those games with the setbacks coming in last year's season-opener against Wisconsin at Lambeau Field and the 2014 Music City Bowl against Notre Dame.
- ▶ The last time LSU failed to have a 100-yard rusher in a non-SEC game came in a 52-0 win over Louisiana-Monroe on September 13, 2014.

- ▶ When senior **Danny Etling** took the first snap against BYU, he became the most veteran LSU quarterback in terms of collegiate starts since Herb Tyler in 1998.
- ▶ Etling owns 25 career starts (13 at LSU, 12 at Purdue)
- ▶ Etling is 9-4 as LSU's starting quarterback. The LSU graduate has guided the Tigers to wins over Jacksonville State, Missouri, Southern Miss, Ole Miss, Arkansas, Texas A&M, Louisville in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, BYU and Chattanooga.

True Freshmen Continue to Play Big Roles at LSU

- ▶ So far this season, 20 true freshmen have played for the Tigers, which is the most in the nation after three weeks of the season.
- ▶ Against BYU, 17 true freshmen saw action for the most by an LSU team in a season opener since at least 1995
- LSU tied Georgia and Miami for the most true freshmen to play in a season opener in the nation. - ▶ With Charles' start against BYU, he became the first true freshman to start a season opener on the offensive line since at least World War II.

Chark Returns TD, Sets Career High

- ▶ Senior WR **DJ Chark** returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown against Chattanooga for his first career special teams touchdown.
- ▶ The punt return was the first since DB Tre'Davious White returned a 60-yard punt against Jacksonville State on Sept. 10, 2016.
- ▶ Chark also totaled three catches for a career-high 103 yards. The Alexandria, Louisiana native surpassed 100 receiving yards for the first time in his career.

Louisiana's Own Takes the Field as Head Coach of the Tigers

- ➤ Coach Orgeron became the first Louisiana native to take the field as the head coach of the Tigers in a season-opener since 1983 when West Monroe native Jerry Stovall coached the Tigers. Stovall and the Tigers lost to Florida State, 40-35, to open the 1983 season.
- ▶ Prior to Stovall, the last time LSU was coached by a Louisiana native came from 1948-54 when Homer native Gaynell Tinsley was coach of the Tigers.
- ▶ Orgeron, Stovall and Tinsley are the only Louisiana natives to serve as head coach of the Tigers in the SEC era.

Dominant Defense Shuts Out BYU

- ▶ The LSU defense allowed just 97 total yards in the season opener and -5 yards on the ground. The 97 yards were the fewest since limiting ULM to 93 in 2014. The rushing yards were the fewest allowed since Ole Miss had -50 yards on Oct. 3, 1982.
- The BYU offense's average start was its own 19-yard line. The LSU defense did not allow BYU to cross the 50-yard line. LSU became the fifth FBS team in the last 10 seasons to now allow its FBS opponent to cross midfield. The following are the times a defense has not allowed its opponent to cross midfield: BYU vs LSU (Saturday); FIU vs Louisville (2013); UMASS vs Uconn (2012); New Mexico St vs Ohio St (2009); Washington St vs USC (2008).

Brumfield Named SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after BYU Performance

- Junior Garrett Brumfield was named the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after his
 performance in the season opener against BYU.
- Brumfield played 70 offensive snaps at left guard, leading the Tigers with 12 knockdown blocks in the win over the Cougars.
- It marked Brumfield's first honor and the first individual award for the Tigers in 2017.

Weather Impacted Games for LSU Football

- ▶ LSU played a weather-impacted game for the fourth time in three years against BYU. Following the devastating rain from Hurricane Harvey in Houston, the season opener was moved to New Orleans and the Mercedes Benz Superdome.
- Last year, LSU's game against Florida was relocated to Baton Rouge and moved to Nov. 19 following Hurricane Matthew. In 2015, LSU's home opener against McNeese State was canceled due to a nearly four-hour lightning delay. Then, in week five, horrific flooding in the state of South Caroline forced LSU to host the Gamecocks in tiger Stadium.

- ▶ This season, Thompson will play alongside some LSU true freshmen who were in eighth grade when Thompson saw his first action as an LSU Tiger in 2012.
- ▶ Thompson graduated from LSU in December of 2015 with a degree in sports administration. At the time of Thompson's college graduation, members of LSU's 2017 freshman class were only sophomores in high school.

- ▶ With a pair of 250-yard rushing games in 2016, RB **Derrius Guice** joined elite SEC company as he along with Moe Williams of Kentucky are the only two players in league history to have two 250-yard rushing games in the same season. Williams did it in 1995 with 299 yards vs. South Carolina and 272 vs. Cincinnati.
- ▶ Guice had 252 yards vs. Arkansas in week 9 and then followed that with a record-setting day of 285 yards vs. Texas A&M in week 11.
- ▶ Guice joins Williams are joined by Auburn's Bo Jackson and Georgia's Herschel Walker as the only four players in SEC history with two 250-yard games to their credit in a career.

- ▶ Guice carried the ball 37 times in the victory and out-rushed the entire Texas A&M unit by himself as he became the first LSU player in program history to have two games of 250 yards or more when coupled with his 252 against Arkansas just two weeks prior.
- ▶ In SEC history, he is only the fourth player ever to do so joining the likes of Herschel Walker, Bo Jackson and Moe Williams.

LSU is **DBU**

- ▶ With two first team All-America defensive backs in 2016, LSU can easily back up its claim as being "DBU". With the addition of Tre'Davious White and Jamal Adams, LSU has now produced 10 first team All-American defensive backs since 2003.
- ▶ Overall, LSU claims 14 first team All-America defensive backs, including three-time selection Tommy Casanova (1969, 1970, 1971) and two-time pick Corey Webster (2003, 2004).
- ▶ In terms of the NFL, since 2007 LSU has had more defensive backs selected in the NFL Draft (17) than any other team in the nation. Of LSU's 17 NFL Draft picks since 2007, six have been first round picks and five came in either the second or third round.

LSU Welcomes Mike VII to Start Season

- ▶ LSU introduced the former Harvey as Mike VII on the first day of the fall semester, August 21, after a 10-month search for a new Tiger.
- ▶ Mike VII is a Siiberian-Bengal male Tiger and was donated to LSU from a sanctuary in Okeechobee, Fla., called "Wild at Heart Wildlife Center."
- ▶ Mikes IV, V and VI were also donated to LSU from rescue facilities. LSU has not purchased a tiger since Mike III in 1958, and LSU does not support the for-profit breeding of tigers.
- ▶ Here's a look at notable moments during the reign of each of the previous Mike's in LSU history:

- ▶ In the last 156 games, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 117-16 when that happens.
- ▶ Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 71-5.
- An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 70-0.

True Freshmen Play Big Roles at LSU

LSU recently has never shied away from playing true freshmen. In the last 12 years, a total of 148 true freshmen have seen action for LSU, including 20 in 2017. Of the 145 true freshmen who have played, 50 have started at least once during their freshman season.

Aranda Returns as Nation's Elite Coordinator

- LSU's defense under coordinator Dave Aranda allowed the fewest touchdowns (16) and fewest touchdowns per game (1.3) in college football in 2016.
- ▶ The Tigers' defense finished ranked No. 5 in points per game and No. 10 in total yards. In 2016, LSU held six of its 12 opponents to fewer than 300 total yards.
- LSU's most dominant performance came against Louisville and the Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson in the bowl game. Aranda's defense held Louisville to season lows for points and rushing yards as the Tigers recorded eight sacks, just one shy of tying the school record.

The Aussie Punting Connection

- ▶ Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well.
- ▶ Jamie Keehn took over punting duties in 2013 and finished his career with the fourth-best punting average for a career last year as a senior while being a permanent team captain and was named to the 2015 SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- > Sophomore **Josh Growden** has been the Tigers' punter over the last two seasons. Growden was selected to the All-SEC Freshman team after averaging 41.4 yards on 57 punts.

Aranda's LSU Defense Allowed Just Four First Half Touchdowns In Last Eight Games

- ▶ Dating back to the start of last year's Alabama game, LSU's defense, under the direction of Dave Aranda, has limited opponents to only four touchdowns in the first half of the final five games of the season through week three of 2017.
- Arkansas, Texas A&M and Mississippi State are the only teams to score first half TDs against the Tigers.

This Day vs. Night Thing in Tiger Stadium

- ▶ The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 246-65-4 at night under the lights compared to a 34-26-3 mark in Tiger Stadium during the day.
- Since 2000, LSU is 104-17 overall at home, which includes a 80-10 mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 24-7 record during the day.
- ▶ Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries.
- From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. The following is a breakdown of LSU's night record, day record and overall record in Tiger Stadium since 1960:



Fournette Has Another Career Outing As LSU Runs Past Syracuse, 34-24

Leonard Fournette rushed for a career-high 244 yards and a pair of touchdowns in leading No. 8 ranked LSU to a 34-24 win over Syracuse in what was a rare upstate New York trip for the Tigers. LSU improved to 3-0 overall and extended its nonconference regular-season winning streak to 50 straight games. LSU never trailed in the contest, taking a 7-0 lead late in the rest quarter on a 14-yard run by Fournette. Syracuse scored midway through the second quarter on a 43-yard field goal to pull within 7-3. The score remained that way until Trent Domingue connected on a 21-yard field goal on LSU's opening possession of the second half to give the Tigers a 10-3 margin. After LSU's defense forced a 3-and-out for the Orange on their first possession of the second half, Tre'Davious White returned a punt 69 yards for a touchdowns - the second of his career - to extend the lead to 17-3. The Orange hung around, scoring on a 40-yard TD pass on the ensuing possession, to cut the margin to 17-10. Fournette carried the load on LSU's next possession, covering all 75 yards on four carries, capped with a 62-yard TD run for a 24-10 Tiger lead. A pair of 15-yard defensive penalties on LSU aided Syracuse on its next TD drive as the Orange got within 24-17 early in the fourth quarter. Brandon Harris helped set up LSU's final TD with a 51-yard completion to Travin Dural. The Tigers scored a play later when Harris found Malachi Dupre in the endzone for a TD and a 31-17 LSU lead. The Tigers tacked on a 37-yard field goal to stretch the lead to 34-17 before the Orange closed out the scoring with a 16-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to get to within 34-24. LSU ran out the clock after Fournette broke a 30-yard run to increase his rushing total to 244 yards. For the game, the Tigers racked up 268 rushing yards and 425 total yards (157 passing), while limiting the Orange to 281 total yards (127 rushing, 154 passing). LSU hurt itself with 14 penalties totaling 120 yards, one of which called back what would have been an 87-yard TD run by Fournette in the third quarter. Harris finished 8-of-16 for 157 yards and a TD. Dupre led the Tigers with four catches for 73 yards and a TD. DE Lewis Neal (7 tackles, 1 FF) and LB Deion Jones (5 tackles, 1 Int.) led the Tiger defense.



LSU Dominates BYU in Superdome Opener, 27-0

After the 2017 Advocare Texas Kickoff was relocated to the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans due to Hurricane Harvey, LSU dominated BYU in all phases of the game to open the season with a 27-0 win. Following a scoreless first quarter, running back **Derrius Guice** ran the ball 10 times on a 13-play scoring drive and ended with a four-yard touchdown run. On the next play from scrimmage cornerback **Andraez Williams** intercepted BYU's Tanner Mangum to set up the next Tiger touchdown. A 52-yard hook-up from quarterback Danny Etling to wide receiver DJ Chark setup Guice's second touchdown of the game from 1 yard. LSU extended its advantage with a pair of field goals by placekicker Jack Gonsoulin from 23 and 29 yards in the third quarter. The Tigers took advantage of a failed fake punt to score the game's final touchdown, a one-yard run by running back **Darrel Williams**. Guice ran for 122 yards with two touchdowns, and Williams added 92 yards on 15 carries with a touchdown. Etling was nearly flawless, as the senior completed 14-of-17 passes for 171 yards. Gonsoulin connected on two-of-three field goals, missing a 34-yard attempt and made three extra point attempts. In his return to the field for the first time since 2015, **Corey Thompson** led the Tiger defense with two sacks, and linebacker **Devin White** recorded a team-best five tackles. The Tigers held the ball for more than two-thirds of the contest (41:54), committed no turnovers and did not allow a sack. The Tigers defense which started three true freshmen allowed only 97 yards of total offense including minus-5 rushing--the fewest by an opponent since 1982. BYU never crossed midfield in the contest, reaching its 47-yardline once. LSU (1-0) out gained BYU (1-1), 479-97, and earned its fourth shutout away from Tiger Stadium since 1987.

No. 12 LSU Football Runs Past Mocs, 45-10

The 12th-ranked LSU Football team used a balanced attack to amass 454 yards of total offense in a 45-10 victory against Chattanooga in Death Valley. LSU (2-0) had 222 yards and 232 passing yards, as the Tigers won a home opener for the 70th time in Tiger Stadium (since 1925). **Derrius Guice** led LSU in rushing with 102 yards on 15 attempts, as the junior running back became the 16th Tiger to surpass 2,000 career yards and now sits at 15th overall, passing Justin Vincent with 2,047 yards. Nick Brossette added 63 yards on a career-high 11 carries in relief of Guice, whose night was complete after the first drive of the second half. Quarterback **Danny Etling** used five passes of more than 25 yards to finish 8-of-14 passing for 227 yards with a touchdown. **DJ Chark**, who scored on a 65-yard punt return, caught three passes for a career-high 103 yards including receptions of 46 and 48 yards. Chattanooga (0-2) had 122 of its 242 yards of total offense in the fourth quarter, as the Mocs ended LSU's streak of not allowing a touchdown at 12. LSU, which forced two turnovers on interceptions by **Andraez** Williams and a one-hander by Kary Vincent Jr., did not commit a turnover for the second-straight game to start the season. The Tigers were plagued by penalties early on, committing 10 of its 11 before halftime. In the first quarter, Etling connected with sophomore WR **Drake Davis** for a 36-yard touchdown pass, marking the sophomore's second career reception, first touchdown and longest grab. On the defensive side, OLB K'Lavon Chaisson recorded two sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. For the second straight week. LB **Devin White** led the team in tackles and recorded a career-best of nine. MLB Donnie Alexander also tied his career-best with eight tackles.

Mississippi State Wins SEC Football Opener

On a steamy evening at Davis Wafe Stadium, self-inflicted wounds and Mississippi State quarterback Nick Fitzgerald were too much for LSU Football to overcome in teh SEC opener. LSU (2-1, 0-1 SEC), which had two players ejected for targeting in a nine-penalty game, fell to State (3-0, 1-0 SEC), 37-7. Meanwhile, Fitzgerald and the Bulldogs scored 30 unanswered points against LSU's defensive depleted from injury and disqualification. Running back **Derrius Guice** had 15 carries for 76 yards to lead LSU, while quarterback **Danny Etling** passed for 137 yards on 13-of-29 passing. LSU was outgained, 465-270. On the first drive of the contest, the Tigers had a 67-yard touchdown reception by DJ Chark from Etling called back for offensive pass interference on what was deemed a pick by Stephen Sullivan. State's Fitzgerald broke a scoreless tie with 13:38 to play in the first quarter, capping an eight-play, 65-yard drive with a 3-yard leap into the endzone. A 28-yard run by Aeris Williams Mississippi State led 7-0. LSU also ran eight plays for 65 yards to knot the game at 7-7 when **Darrel Williams** scored from 10 yards. State took the lead back with a 30-yard Jace Chhristmann field goal with 5:04 to play in the half. Then, the Bulldogs used Fitzgerald's legs to push the advantage to 17-7 with seven seconds left in the first half. An 18-yard rush by Williams setup a 45-yard field goal by Christmann, and MSU extended its lead to 20-7 with 10:53 left in the third quarter. After State converted a third-and-1 just past the yard to gain, Fitzgerald just avoided LSU linebacker Devin White on a blitz and found Keith Mixon all alone for a 45-yard touchdown. The Bulldogs led 27-7. The Bulldogs used a 24-yard run by Fitzgerald to get in the LSU redzone, however, LSU got off the field with only a 27-yard field goal by Christmann to trail 30-7 with 1:55 left in the third quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, a 20-yard touchdown pass from Fitzgerald to Deddrick Thomas extended the Mississippi State lead to 37-7 with 13:01 to play. LSU was led on the defensive front by Christian LaCouture and Devin White, who both posted career-best 11 tackles.
