## NEXT UP

- ▶ LSU opens its second full season under head coach **Ed Orgeron** when the Tigers face No. 8 Miami at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas on Sunday, September 2. It's the first meeting between LSU and Miami since the Tigers posted a 40-3 win over the Hurricanes at the 2005 Peach Bowl. LSU leads the overall series with the Hurricanes, 9-3.
- ▶ Orgeron is 4-0 all-time in season-openers as a head coach (1-0 at LSU; 3-0 at Ole Miss).
- ▶ Orgeron, who took over the Tigers four games into the 2016 season, is 15-6 as LSU's head coach (6-2 in 2016; 9-4 in 2017). Over his last 29 games as a head coach, Orgeron has produced a 21-8 mark — a stretch that also includes a 6-2 record with Southern Cal in 2013.
- ▶ LSU is 1-0 in season-openers under Orgeron and the Tigers have won 14 of their last 15 season-opening contests dating back to 2003. The only loss during that span came in 2016 against Wisconsin (L, 16-14) at Lambeau Field in Green Bay, Wisconsin.
- ▶ LSU enters the season ranked in both the Associated Press Top 25 and the Coaches Poll for the 18th straight year, a streak that dates back to the start of the 2001 season. LSU is 15-2 in those openers (only other loss came at Virginia Tech by a 26-8 count in 2002).
- ▶ LSU is 10-2 all-time in season-openers where both teams enter the game ranked in the Top 25. The Tigers have won five straight season-opening games where both teams are ranked, which includes a 28-24 win over Wisconsin in 2014 in Houston (the last time a ranked LSU team opened the season against a ranked opponent).
- ▶ The Miami game will mark the third straight year LSU starts a year with a new QB-RB combination.
- ▶ All-America LB **Devin White** was credited with a tackle on one of every 4.6 plays run by the opponent that resulted in a tackle last year. White had 133 tackles last year and the opposition ran 608 plays that resulted in a tackle.

LSU opens the 2018 season riding a streak of 18 straight years with at least 8 wins, while also appearing in a bowl 18 consecutive seasons. The 18 straight years with at least 8 wins ties Oklahoma as the longest such streak among Power 5 schools.

LSU is 3-0 all-time in games played at AT&T Stadium with all three wins coming over teams ranked in the Top 25 (No. 18 Texas A&M, 2011 Cotton Bowl; No. 3 Oregon in 2011; No. 20 TCU in 2013).

Ed Orgeron grew up a Tiger fan. He developed a passion for the Tigers at an early age, becoming a fan of some of the all-time LSU greats in the 1970s. Players like Bert Jones, Ronnie Estay, Tommy Casanova and Charles Alexander ignited a purple and gold fire under Orgeron that still burns today.

Now in his second full season as head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron has leveraged his passion and love for LSU into a determination and drive that sees him spend nearly every waking moment focused on LSU football and his vision for the program. Winning championships will always be the goal for the program, but it's what Orgeron and his staff are doing to develop and mentor players off the field, in an atmosphere that fosters inclusion and accountability, that will ultimately set Tigers apart.

His quick impact on the LSU program was evident in 2016 when he was elevated from defensive line coach to interim head coach just four games into the season. The results were immediate and impressive, turning a 2-2 team with little confidence following a loss at Auburn, into a squad that played with swagger and energy. Orgeron earned the title of permanent head coach on November 26, 2016, two days after LSU beat Texas A&M, 54-39, to wrap up the regular season with a 7-4 mark, which included a 5-2 mark under Coach O.

With a "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto and high-energy practices that focus on being crisp and efficient, the players have bought into the Orgeron system, both on and off the field and the results are hard to ignore. Orgeron has guided the Tigers to a 15-6 overall mark in his 21 games as the LSU head coach, which includes a 7-3 record against SEC Western Division opponents and six victories against teams ranked in the Top 25. Of LSU's six losses under Orgeron, three have come by six points or less and two others came against the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Furthermore, of Orgeron's 15 LSU wins, 10 have come against SEC foes and 12 have been by double-digits.

In 2017, Orgeron led the Tigers to a 9-4 overall mark, a second straight appearance in the Citrus Bowl and a No. 18 final national ranking. While LSU came up just short in claiming a 10-win season, Orgeron and the Tigers gave plenty of reasons to show that the program is on the rise. A total of 20 true freshmen – the second-highest figure nationally – saw playing time for the Tigers last year and the group of rookies combined for 44 starts.

## The Coach O Way

With the "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto, the Tigers seemingly became a different team overnight under Orgeron and the results that LSU sought soon followed. As the head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron said he was going to "flip the script" and he assigned a theme for the daily practices. The purpose of the descriptive practice themes for each day during the week is one of the ways that Orgeron and his staff hold the players accountable and focused both prior to and during the workout. The daily practice nicknames are as follows: Tell the Truth Monday, Competition Tuesday, Turnover/No Turnover Wednesday, No Repeat Thursday, and Focus Friday.

Orgeron has also opened the doors for former LSU players to come back and be active in the program. Having former players actively involved is a way for the current Tigers to get a better understanding of who helped build the foundation for the program, while also letting them see firsthand what it means to be a LSU Tiger and the responsibility that goes along with it.

## Offseason Moves

Coach O bolstered his staff during the offseason with the promotion of Steve Ensminger to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. It will be Ensminger's second stint as offensive coordinator under Orgeron as he held that spot for eight games during the head coach's transition year in 2016. Under Ensminger, LSU's offense thrived, setting numerous records and proving that he is the right man for the job.

He also added longtime NFL veteran and former LSU assistant Jerry Sullivan to the staff on a fulltime basis as the senior offensive assistant and passing game coordinator. James Cregg, another coach with NFL experience, joined the staff and his impact has already paid off as the offensive line is expected to be one of the strengths for the Tigers this year. Defensively, Bill Busch, who spent three years working alongside Dave Aranda at Wisconsin and Utah State, joined the Tiger staff as safeties coach. Greg McMahon, who won a Super Bowl with the Saints and spent 11 years coaching special teams for the franchise, was elevated from analyst in 2017 to LSU's special teams coordinator in 2018.

## Orgeron Coaching History

Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, is LSU's 33rd head football coach, and the first Louisiana native to serve as head coach of the Tigers since West Monroe native Jerry Stovall held the position for four seasons in the early 1980s.

Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 15-6 at LSU. His career mark as a collegiate head coach is 31-33, however he's 21-8 over his last 29 games. Orgeron went 6-2 as Southern Cal's interim head coach in 2013, taking over a USC team that stumbled to a 3-2 mark over the first five games of the year. Orgeron rallied the Trojans as USC closed out the regular season with wins in six of its final eight games.

In his first game as LSU's permanent head coach, Orgeron guided the Tigers to a 29-9 win over No. 13 Louisville and its Heisman Trophy quarterback Lamar Jackson in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus

Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 mark over that span.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojans' defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. Orgeron coached under Paul Hackett at USC for three years from 1998 to 2000 and was one of just a handful of coaches retained by Pete Carroll when he took over as the Trojans' head coach in 2001.

He added the title of recruiting coordinator for USC in 2001 and helped the Trojans to top five signing classes for three straight years from 2002-04. Rivals.com and Sporting News named him the 2004 National Recruiter of the Year.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005-07.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988-92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line. During his tenure, the Hurricanes won the national championship twice (1989 and 1991), finished second in the AP poll once (1988) and third twice (1990 and 1992) while appearing in five New Year's Day bowls (1989 Orange, 1990 Sugar, 1991 Cotton, 1992 Orange, 1993 Sugar).

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87).

As a player, Orgeron was a four-year starter on the defensive line for Northwestern State, captaining the Demons as a senior in 1983. He received his bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Northwestern State in 1984. In 2007, Orgeron was named to the Northwestern State Top 100 Players which was part of the school's Centennial Football Celebration.

He starred in football, basketball and track at South Lafourche High in Galliano, La. On the big screen, Orgeron played himself in the 2009 Oscar-nominated movie, "The Blind Side."

Born July 27, 1961, he and his wife, Kelly, have three sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody. Tyler is a member of the LSU football coaching staff, while twins Parker and Cody just completed their second season as part of the McNeese State football team. Parker is a starting wide receiver for the Cowboys, while Cody is competing for snaps at quarterback heading into his redshirt sophomore season in 2018.

LSU To Celebrate 125 Seasons of Football In 2018

- ▶ LSU will celebrate its 125th season of football in 2018.
- ▶ Started in 1893, LSU is one of college football's most storied programs, winning three national titles (1958, 2003, and 2007) and claiming 11 SEC championships (1935, 1936, 1958, 1961, 1970, 1986, 1988, 2001, 2003, 2007, and 2011).
- ▶ LSU is the 12th winningest program in NCAA history by victories with 787 and the Tigers are No. 14 all-time in terms of winning percentage (.650). LSU has an all-record of 787-412-47 in 124 seasons.

Sunday Night Football Rare for the Tigers

- ▶ When LSU and Miami meet on Sunday night, it will be just the fourth Sunday game in program history.
- ▶ LSU is 2-1 in Sunday games dating back to the program's first against Notre Dame on Dec. 28, 1997, a 27-9 win in the Independence Bowl.
- ▶ LSU lost to No. 16 Virginia Tech, 26-8, on Sunday afternoon in Blacksburg to open the 2002 season.
- ▶ The last Sunday game was against No. 3 Oklahoma in the New Orleans Superdome to win the BCS National Championship Game. The Tigers won the program's second national championship with a 21-14 win over the Sooners.
- ▶ The last player to score on a Sunday for LSU is DE Marcus Spears. Spears returned an interception 20 yards to give LSU a 21-7 lead in the third quarter.

Season Opener Success

- ▶ LSU is 90-29-5 in season openers entering the 2018 opener versus Miami.
- ▶ The Tigers have won 20 of their last 22 season-openers. The only two losses during that stretch have come at Virginia Tech in 2002 and against Wisconsin at Lambeau Field in 2016.
- ▶ Last year, LSU shutout BYU, 27-0, in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans to open the season.

Neutral Site Season Openers

- ▶ Since 2010, LSU has played six of eight season openers at a neutral site and the Tigers own a 5-1 record in those games.

LSU's At Home In A Dome

- ▶ LSU will be making its 38th overall appearance in a domed stadium against Miami.
- ▶ LSU is 29-8 all-time in domed stadiums, which includes 3-0 record in AT&T Stadium.
- ▶ LSU's record in other domed venues include: 14-5 in Mercedes-Benz Superdome, a 9-2 record at the Georgia Dome, a 2-0 mark in NRG Stadium (Houston), a 1-0 record in the Carrier Dome (Syracuse), and a 0-1 mark at the Astrodome.

LSU-Miami Ties

- ▶ LSU head coach Ed Orgeron spent five years as an assistant coach at Miami from 1988-92.
- ▶ During that span, Orgeron was part of two national title teams in 1989 and 1991. Miami went a combined 55-5 in the five years with Orgeron on staff, which included three 11-1 seasons, along with a 12-0 mark in 1991 and a 10-2 record in 1990.
- ▶ LSU running backs coach Tommie Robinson served in the same capacity at Miami for three years from 2007-09.
- ▶ Former LSU offensive line coach Stacy Searles is in his third year as offensive line coach for Miami. Searles coached the Tigers for four years from 2003-06.

Lonestar Tigers

- ▶ Twenty players on the current LSU roster hail from the state of Texas.
- ▶ Senior safety **Ed Paris** is from Arlington and played for Mansfield Timberview High School.
- ▶ Freshman linebacker **Jarell Cherry** is from Dallas and played for Carter High School.
- ▶ Junior wide receiver **Dee Anderson** played his high school ball at DeSoto, which is just 23 miles from AT&T Stadium.
- ▶ Junior wide receiver **Jonathan Giles** and junior defensive lineman **Breiden Fehoko** played at Texas Tech before transferring to LSU. Giles is from Missouri City, Texas.

LSU vs. the ACC

- ▶ LSU is 37-27 all-time against current Atlantic Coast Conference member institutions in program history.
- ▶ The Tigers are familiar with the conference after having played Louisville, Syracuse, Clemson and North Carolina in recent history.
- ▶ The Tigers have played Georgia Tech the most at 19 times since 1915.

**LSU Goes Into 2018 Ranked In Preseason Top 25 For 18th Straight Year**

- ▶ LSU goes in the Miami game ranked No. 24 in the Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the AP Poll marking the 18th consecutive year the Tigers enter the season ranked in the Top 25.
- ▶ The streak goes back to the 2001 season when the Tigers were No. 14 in the AP Poll and the No. 16 in the Coaches Poll.
- ▶ Last year, LSU was ranked for 11 of its 13 games and finished the season ranked No. 18 in both polls.
- ▶ Going back to 2001 when LSU's football program won its first SEC Championship since the 1980s, LSU has played 204 of its 221 games ranked in the Top 25.
- ▶ Under Orgeron, LSU has played 17 of 21 games ranked in the Top 25 and the Tigers are 11-6 in those games.

**LSU vs. Top 25 Opponents In Season Openers**

- ▶ Sunday's game against No. 8 Miami will mark the 26th time LSU will open a season against a team ranked in the Top 25.
- ▶ LSU is 11-13-1 all-time against Top 25 teams in season openers.
- ▶ That record improves to 10-2 when a ranked LSU team faces a Top 25 opponent in the season opener.
- ▶ LSU has won five straight season-openers against Top 25 teams, a stretch that dates back to a 35-31 victory over No. 15 Arizona State in 2005 (at Tempe). At No. 8, Miami is the highest ranked season-opening opponent for LSU since beating No. 3 Oregon, 40-27, in Arlington in 2011.

**LSU Goes Into 2018 Riding Streak of 18 Consecutive Years With At Least 8 Wins**

- ▶ LSU goes into the 2018 season having won at least 8 games for 18 consecutive years, which ties with Oklahoma for the longest current streak among Power 5 schools.
- ▶ Only Boise State has a longer active streak among FBS teams as the Broncos have won 8 games for 19 consecutive seasons.
- ▶ LSU's current streak of seasons with at least 8 wins dates back to 2000 when the Tigers posted an 8-4 overall mark.
- ▶ LSU's streak of seasons with at least 8 wins also ranks as the longest of its kind in the history of the SEC, bettering Tennessee 16 (1989-2004); Florida 14 (1990-2003); Georgia 13 (1997-2009); and Alabama 13 (1971-83).

**LSU Tied NCAA Record (And Set LSU Mark) For Fewest Turnovers In A Season in 2017 With 8**

- ▶ With only eight turnovers in 2017 (4 interceptions, 4 fumbles), LSU tied the NCAA mark for fewest turnovers in a season.
- ▶ Only five other teams in NCAA history have gone an entire season with only eight turnovers. Clemson (2 fumbles, 6 interceptions) was the first to do it in 1940, followed by Miami (OH) in 1966 (4 fumbles lost, 4 interceptions); Notre Dame in 2000 (4 fumbles lost, 4 interceptions); Navy in 2015 (6 fumbles lost, 2 interceptions); and Western Michigan in 2016 (4 fumbles lost, 4 interceptions).
- ▶ LSU goes into 2018 having thrown 111 consecutive passes without an interception – a streak that dates back to Danny Etling's last pass of the first quarter against Alabama on November 4.

**LSU Is 70-9 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001**

- ▶ Going back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 70-9 against non-SEC foes during that span.
- ▶ Of the nine losses, only three have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field and 2017 vs. Troy).
- ▶ The other six losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame, 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame).

**Eight Tigers To Play in 2018 As a College Graduate**

- ▶ During the 2018 season, eight Tigers are going to take the field as a college graduate, five of which are LSU graduates.
- ▶ LSU list of eight college graduates includes three graduate transfers – CB Terrence Alexander (Stanford), QB Joe Burrow (Ohio State) and PK Cole Tracy (Assumption College).

**Louisiana's Foster Moreau Carries on No. 18 Tradition**

- ▶ Senior tight end Foster Moreau was selected to continue the tradition of the prestigious No. 18 jersey. Moreau was presented with the jersey by coach Ed Orgeron in the first preseason meeting following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s.
- ▶ A native of New Orleans, Moreau was the final player to sign in the 2015 recruiting class. He is the second tight end to earn the honor. Richard Dickson wore the number in 2008 and 2009.
- ▶ Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007.

 ► Only Matt Mauck in 2002 and 2003, JaMarcus Russell in 2004 and 2005, Jordan Jefferson in 2009 and 2010, Zach Mettenberger in 2012 and 2013, and Brandon Harris in 2015 and 2016 have started consecutive openers for LSU.

**Ensminger In Second Stint as LSU's OC**

► Steve Ensminger, a former quarterback at LSU, begins his second stint as the offensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2018.  
 ► Ensminger served as LSU's offensive coordinator for eight games in 2016, a span that saw the Tigers thrive under his play-calling.  
 ► Prior to Ensminger taking over play-calling duties in 2016, LSU's offense had scored only nine touchdowns and was averaging 18 points and 339.5 total yards per game. In eight games under Ensminger that year, LSU improved drastically in every offensive category as the Tigers averaged 32 points and 464.9 total yards per contest during that span. LSU scored 38 or more points five times under Ensminger, including 54 in a win over Texas A&M and 38 against both Arkansas and Ole Miss. The Tigers averaged 7.1 yards per play and converted 46-of-102 third-down opportunities during that eight-game stretch.  
 ► Also under Ensminger, LSU's offense set school records for yards in a SEC game (634 vs. Missouri), single-game rushing yards by an individual (284 by Leonard Fournette vs. Ole Miss, 285 by Derrius Guice vs. Texas A&M), longest run from scrimmage (96 yards by Derrius Guice vs. Arkansas) and time of possession (42:33 vs. Missouri).

**Fulton Reinstated for 2018 Season**

► With just 10 days left before the season opener against Miami, head coach Ed Orgeron announced that cornerback Kristian Fulton was reinstated to the team by the NCAA.  
 ► Fulton's reinstatement came two weeks after the NCAA denied an appeal by Fulton.  
 ► On August 17, LSU Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva sent the NCAA a four-page letter request reclassification of Fulton's case.  
 ► Fulton has played in three games with no starts in his two seasons. He was regarded as the No. 1 overall prospect in Louisiana and No. 3 corner in the nation.

**White, Williams Tabled as Preseason All-Americans**

► Junior LB **Devin White** and sophomore CB **Greedy Williams** were named first team Associated Press Preseason All-Americans.  
 ► White and Williams return as the leaders of an LSU defense that ranked among the best in the nation last year, allowing only 18.9 points and 316.2 total yards per game.  
 ► Last year, White and Williams became the first set of players from the same team to lead the Southeastern Conference tackles and interceptions in the same year since 1993.  
 ► White paced the league with 10.2 tackles a contest and ranked No. 2 in the conference in total tackles with 133. Williams, as a redshirt freshman, topped the conference in both interceptions (6) and passes defended (13).  
 ► White earned second team All-America honors in 2017, in what was his first season as a starter, while Williams was a third team All-America selection.

**Nineteen First-Time Starters in 2018**

- ▶ Nineteen Tigers return to the team in 2018 after earning starts for the first time in 2017: DE **Ed Alexander**, RB **Nick Brossette**, OG **Garrett Brumfield**, TE/F **Tory Carter**, RG **Saahdiq Charles**, LB **K'Lavon Chaisson**, S **Grant Delpit**, WR **Derrick Dillon**, DE **Rashard Lawrence**, DE **Glen Logan**, OL **Adrian Magee**, S **Eric Monroe**, TE **Jamal Pettigrew**, WR **JaCoby Stevens**, WR **Stephen Sullivan**, LB **Ray Thornton**, Nickel **Kary Vincent Jr.**, CB **Greedy Williams** and LB **Devin White**.
- ▶ LSU's nine true freshmen starters in 2017 were the most since at least 2005.
- ▶ Twenty-two players earned starts for the first time in 2017 for the most in the nation.
- ▶ The four true freshmen (Charles, Chaisson, Taylor and Delpit) who started the season opener matched the total number between 2000-16.
- ▶ The four true freshmen starters were the most in the nation to start the 2017 season: 4 LSU (1 offense, 3 defense), 3 Arizona (0 offense, 3 defense), 3 Baylor (1 offense, 2 defense), 3 Illinois (0 offense, 3 defense).
- ▶ With Charles' start against BYU, he became the first true freshman to start a season opener on the offensive line since at least World War II.
- ▶ The following have started a season opener since 2000: Charles (RG, 2017), Chaisson (LB, 2017), Delpit (S, 2017), Taylor (LB, 2017), Kevin Toliver (CB, 2015), Trey Quinn (WR, 2014), Jalen Mills (CB, 2012) and Jessie Daniels (Nickel, 2003).

- ▶ 2017 marked the fourth-straight year LSU led all of college football with players on opening day NFL rosters at 51.
- ▶ Sixty-five LSU players have been selected in the NFL Draft over the past 10 years, which ranks No. 2 nationally. LSU is one of just three schools in college football to have 60 or more drafted players since the 2009 NFL Draft.
- ▶ Over the last decade, LSU has produced nine first round NFL Draft picks. The Tigers have had at least one player selected in the first round 11 of the past 15 years.
- ▶ We are DBU: Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL draft with 18, including six in the first round.
- ▶ At least one player has appeared in the Super Bowl for 17 consecutive years, which stands as the longest current streak in the SEC.
- ▶ Overall, 59 former Tigers have appeared on Super Bowl rosters, and LSU has had at least one Super Bowl in 39 of 52 championship games.

- ▶ In the last 1658 games, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 123-20 when that happens.
- ▶ Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 74-5.
- ▶ An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 73-0.

On This Day - September 2

September 2, 2000

LSU def. Western Carolina, 58-0, in Tiger Stadium

In the first game under new head coach Nick Saban, the Tigers routed Western Carolina 58-0, en route to an eight-win season and a win in the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl. The game marked the first contest in the newly expanded Tiger Stadium. With the renovations, 11,600 seats were added, bringing the seating capacity to 91,600. At the time, it made Death Valley the fourth-largest on-campus facility in the nation. LSU's offense sizzled in the contest, and amassed 507 yards of offense in the opening half of the contest and built a 37-0 lead heading into the break. The tandem of Josh Booty and Rohan Davey set the single-game school record for passing yardage in a game with 485 yards through the air. Booty was 12-for-15 for 291 yards and a pair of touchdowns and Davey was a perfect 11-for-11 with 194 yards and three touchdowns. LSU recorded 680 yards of total offense, which remains the second-highest total in school history and the highest total since the Tigers combined for a school-record 746 yards against Rice in 1977.

September 2, 2006

No. 8 LSU def. Louisiana-Lafayette, 45-3, in Tiger Stadium

LSU opened the 2006 campaign commemorating the 75th anniversary of playing night games in Tiger Stadium with the season opener against Louisiana-Lafayette. JaMarcus Russell picked up where his 2005 season left off as the eighth-ranked Tigers rolled to a 45-3 victory against Louisiana-Lafayette. Russell connected on 13-of-17 passes for 253 yards and threw a career-high three touchdown passes, including a 58-yarder to Brandon LaFell on the Tigers' first possession of the contest. LSU rolled up 469 yards of offense compared to just eight first downs and 176 yards for the Ragin' Cajuns. Alley Broussard led the rushing attack for LSU with 6 yards on eight carries in his first action since August 2005.

September 2, 2017

No. 13 LSU def. BYU, 27-0, in Mercedes-Benz Superdome

The Tigers opened the 2017 campaign with a dominant, 27-0 route of BYU in the Advocare Texas Bowl Kick-Off Classic in the New Orleans Superdome. The contest was relocated due to Hurricane Harvey. The LSU defense allowed just 97 total yards in the season opener and -5 yards on the ground. The 97 yards were the fewest since limiting ULM to 93 in 2014. The rushing yards were the fewest allowed since Ole Miss had -50 yards on Oct. 3, 1982. The LSU defense did not allow BYU to cross the 50-yard line. LSU became the fifth FBS team in the last 10 seasons to not allow its FBS opponent to cross midfield. Junior Garrett Brumfield was named the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week after playing 70 offensive snaps at left guard and led the Tigers with 12 knockdowns. Seven players caught a pass and ran the ball against the Cougars. It marked the second time in school history that has happened with the other time coming in 1977 against Mississippi State. The LSU offense combined for 296 yards on the ground to extend its streak to 11 straight non-conference games with 100 rushing yards or more.

## Tigers Overwhelm Miami In 40-3 Win At Peach Bowl

Matt Flynn, subbing for an injured JaMarcus Russell, threw for 196 yards and a pair of touchdowns in leading 10th-ranked LSU to its most lopsided bowl victory ever in a 40-3 win over ninth-ranked Miami in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Joseph Addai, playing in his final game in an LSU uniform, rushed for 130 yards and a score, as the Tigers dominated the final three quarters of the contest. With the score tied at 3-3 at the end of the first quarter, the Tiger defense took over as LSU limited the Hurricanes to just two first downs and only 38 yards of offense over the final three quarters of the game. In all, Miami managed only six first downs and 153 yards of offense in the contest as LSU put together its most complete game of the season. With the Tiger defense holding the Hurricane offense at bay, the LSU offense came alive in the second quarter, first with a 51-yard TD pass from Flynn to Craig Davis. After a 47-yard field goal by Chris Jackson that put LSU up 13-3, the Tigers went on a nine-play drive just before the break, capped with a four-yard pass from Flynn to Addai to stretch the lead to 20-3 at halftime. The game was never in question after that as the Tigers added a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter followed by a pair of field goals in the fourth quarter. For the contest, LSU piled up 468 yards offense, including 272 yards on the ground. Flynn, starting for the first time in his career, earned offensive MVP honors, while Melvin Oliver was named the game's defensive MVP after recording five tackles, two tackles for losses and a sack.

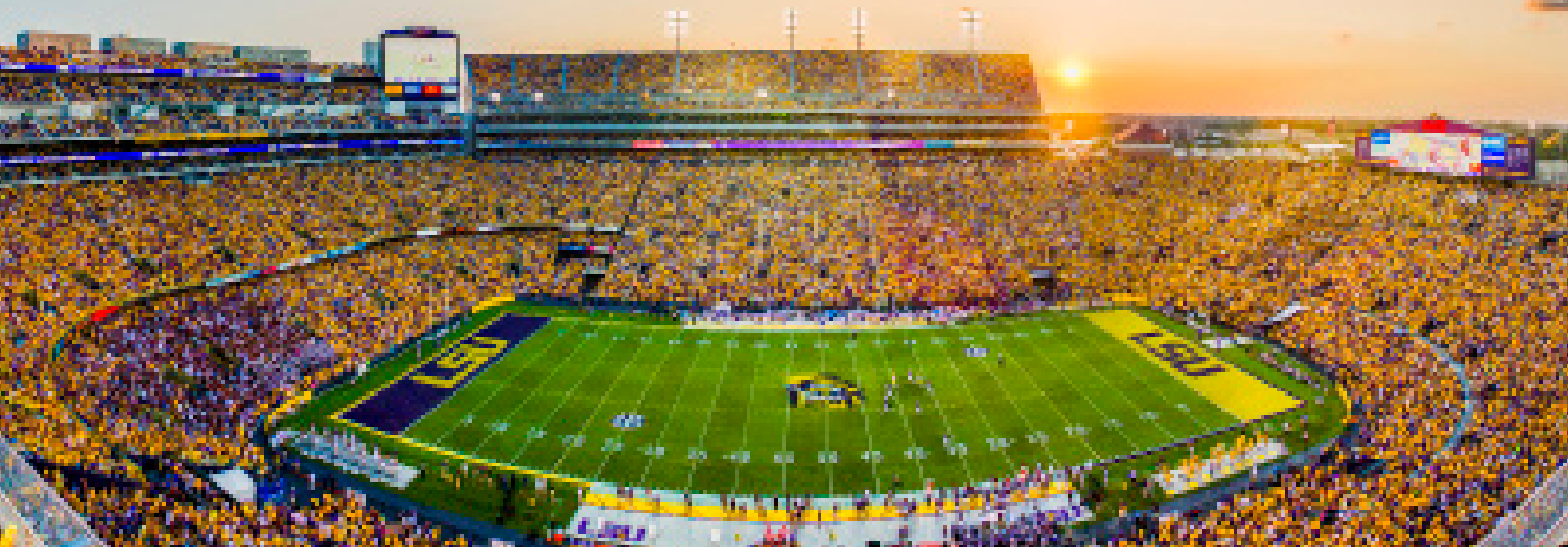
**Series Notes:** LSU and Miami will meet for the 13th time in football with the Tigers holding a 9-3 advantage in the series that dates back to 1946. The teams last played in the 2005 Peach Bowl when LSU posted a 40-3 win over the Hurricanes in Atlanta. This year's game will be the first regular season game between the teams in 30 years when third-ranked Miami beat No. 11 LSU, 44-3, in Tiger Stadium in a driving rainstorm. Current LSU head coach Ed Orgeron was an assistant coach for the Hurricanes in their 1988 contest against LSU. Current LSU cornerbacks coach Corey Raymond was a freshman at LSU in 1988 and saw action in backup role against the Hurricanes that night. That Miami coaching staff also included four coaches that went on to become head coaches in the NFL (Jimmy Johnson, Dallas Cowboys; Dave Wannstedt, Chicago Bears/Miami Dolphins; Butch Davis, Cleveland Browns; Dave Campo, Dallas Cowboys). The Tigers won the first 7 games in the series starting with a 20-7 win in Miami. Miami's first win over LSU came in Baton Rouge in 1967 by a 17-15 count. 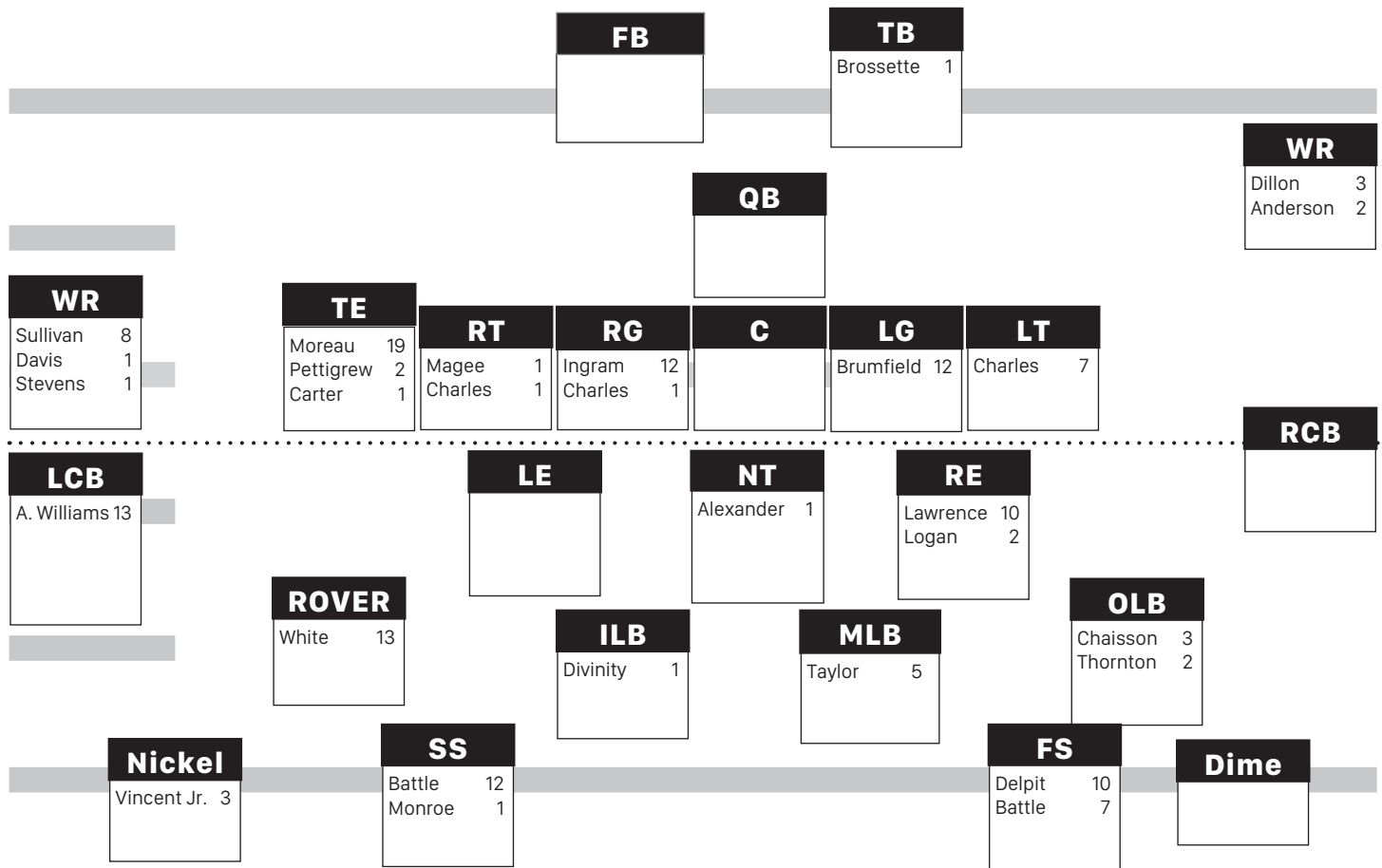
