NEXT UP

- ▶ LSU opens its 2018 home slate on Saturday against Southeastern Louisiana. LSU has won 12 straight home openers, a streak that dates back to a 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in 2006.
- ▶ Kickoff is set for 6:02 p.m. CT and will be televised by ESPN2.
- ▶ LSU and Southeastern Louisiana meet for just the second time – the first meeting came on November 19, 1949 in Baton Rouge where LSU posted a 48-7 victory.
- ▶ LSU and Southeastern Louisiana are separated by just 47.1 miles making the Lions the closest opponent in terms proximity that the Tigers have ever played. The only university that the Tigers could potentially play that is closer to the LSU campus is Southern University, which is just 11.3 miles away.
- ▶ Orgeron, who took over the Tigers four games into the 2016 season, is 16-6 as LSU's head coach (6-2 in 2016; 9-4 in 2017, 1-0 in 2018). Over his last 30 games as a head coach, Orgeron has produced a 22-8 mark – a stretch the also includes a 6-2 record with Southern Cal in 2013.
- ▶ In 22 games under Orgeron, LSU's has gone without a turnover 11 times. LSU went without a turnover in eight games last year and then opened the 2018 season without giving the ball up against Miami. LSU has gone without a turnover in four of its last five games dating back to last year. The only turnover in that span came against Texas A&M (fumble by JD Moore).
- ▶ With 125 yards rushing against Miami, Nick Brossette became the eighth 100-yard rusher for LSU under offensive coordinator Steve Ensminger. During Ensminger's interim season as offensive coordinator in 2016, the Tigers had seven different players go over the 100-yard mark (with 3 of those being 200-yard games).
- ▶ By limiting Miami to 83 rushing yards, LSU has held opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards 11 times (in 26 games) since Dave Aranda took over as defensive coordinator in 2016. LSU is 11-0 in those games.
- ▶ Going back to 2001 when LSU's football program won its first SEC Championship since the 1980s, LSU has played 205 of its 222 games ranked in the Top 25, which includes 18 of 22 games under Orgeron. LSU is 12-6 as a Top 25 team under Coach O.

BY THE NUMBERS

18
LSU opened the 2018 season riding a streak of 18 straight years with at least 8 wins, while also appearing in a bowl 18 consecutive seasons. The 18 straight years with at least 8 wins ties Oklahoma as the longest such streak among Power 5 schools.

11
LSU used 11 first-time starters in its win over Miami last week. The Tigers had seven first-time starters on offense and four on defense. The list of first-time LSU starters included a pair of graduate transfers in QB Joe Burrow and DB Terrence Alexander.

13
13 of LSU's 16 wins under Orgeron have come by double-digits, which includes last week's 33-17 victory over No. 8 Miami. LSU's last five victories (1 in 2018, last 4 in 2017) have all come by double-digits (Ole Miss by 16, Arkansas by 23, Tennessee by 20, Texas A&M by 24).

Ed Orgeron grew up a Tiger fan. He developed a passion for the Tigers at an early age, becoming a fan of some of the all-time LSU greats in the 1970s. Players like Bert Jones, Ronnie Estay, Tommy Casanova and Charles Alexander ignited a purple and gold fire under Orgeron that still burns today.

Now in his second full season as head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron has leveraged his passion and love for LSU into a determination and drive that sees him spend nearly every waking moment focused on LSU football and his vision for the program. Winning championships will always be the goal for the program, but it's what Orgeron and his staff are doing to develop and mentor players off the field, in an atmosphere that fosters inclusion and accountability, that will ultimately set Tigers apart.

His quick impact on the LSU program was evident in 2016 when he was elevated from defensive line coach to interim head coach just four games into the season. The results were immediate and impressive, turning a 2-2 team with little confidence following a loss at Auburn, into a squad that played with swagger and energy. Orgeron earned the title of permanent head coach on November 26, 2016, two days after LSU beat Texas A&M, 54-39, to wrap up the regular season with a 7-4 mark, which included a 5-2 mark under Coach O.

With a "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto and high-energy practices that focus on being crisp and efficient, the players have bought into the Orgeron system, both on and off the field and the results are hard to ignore. Orgeron has guided the Tigers to a 15-6 overall mark in his 21 games as the LSU head coach, which includes a 7-3 record against SEC Western Division opponents and six victories against teams ranked in the Top 25. Of LSU's six losses under Orgeron, three have come by six points or less and two others came against the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Furthermore, of Orgeron's 15 LSU wins, 10 have come against SEC foes and 12 have been by double-digits.

In 2017, Orgeron led the Tigers to a 9-4 overall mark, a second straight appearance in the Citrus Bowl and a No. 18 final national ranking. While LSU came up just short in claiming a 10-win season, Orgeron and the Tigers gave plenty of reasons to show that the program is on the rise. A total of 20 true freshmen – the second-highest figure nationally – saw playing time for the Tigers last year and the group of rookies combined for 44 starts.

The Coach O Way

With the "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto, the Tigers seemingly became a different team overnight under Orgeron and the results that LSU sought soon followed. As the head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron said he was going to "flip the script" and he assigned a theme for the daily practices. The purpose of the descriptive practice themes for each day during the week is one of the ways that Orgeron and his staff hold the players accountable and focused both prior to and during the workout. The daily practice nicknames are as follows: Tell the Truth Monday, Competition Tuesday, Turnover/No Turnover Wednesday, No Repeat Thursday, and Focus Friday.

Orgeron has also opened the doors for former LSU players to come back and be active in the program. Having former players actively involved is a way for the current Tigers to get a better understanding of who helped build the foundation for the program, while also letting them see firsthand what it means to be a LSU Tiger and the responsibility that goes along with it.

Offseason Moves

Coach O bolstered his staff during the offseason with the promotion of Steve Ensminger to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. It will be Ensminger's second stint as offensive coordinator under Orgeron as he held that spot for eight games during the head coach's transition year in 2016. Under Ensminger, LSU's offense thrived, setting numerous records and proving that he is the right man for the job.

He also added longtime NFL veteran and former LSU assistant Jerry Sullivan to the staff on a fulltime basis as the senior offensive assistant and passing game coordinator. James Cregg, another coach with NFL experience, joined the staff and his impact has already paid off as the offensive line is expected to be one of the strengths for the Tigers this year. Defensively, Bill Busch, who spent three years working alongside Dave Aranda at Wisconsin and Utah State, joined the Tiger staff as safeties coach. Greg McMahon, who won a Super Bowl with the Saints and spent 11 years coaching special teams for the franchise, was elevated from analyst in 2017 to LSU's special teams coordinator in 2018.

Orgeron Coaching History

Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, is LSU's 33rd head football coach, and the first Louisiana native to serve as head coach of the Tigers since West Monroe native Jerry Stovall held the position for four seasons in the early 1980s.

Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 15-6 at LSU. His career mark as a collegiate head coach is 31-33, however he's 21-8 over his last 29 games. Orgeron went 6-2 as Southern Cal's interim head coach in 2013, taking over a USC team that stumbled to a 3-2 mark over the first five games of the year. Orgeron rallied the Trojans as USC closed out the regular season with wins in six of its final eight games.

In his first game as LSU's permanent head coach, Orgeron guided the Tigers to a 29-9 win over No. 13 Louisville and its Heisman Trophy quarterback Lamar Jackson in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl.

Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 mark over that span.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojans' defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. Orgeron coached under Paul Hackett at USC for three years from 1998 to 2000 and was one of just a handful of coaches retained by Pete Carroll when he took over as the Trojans' head coach in 2001.

He added the title of recruiting coordinator for USC in 2001 and helped the Trojans to top five signing classes for three straight years from 2002-04. Rivals.com and Sporting News named him the 2004 National Recruiter of the Year.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005-07.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988-92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line. During his tenure, the Hurricanes won the national championship twice (1989 and 1991), finished second in the AP poll once (1988) and third twice (1990 and 1992) while appearing in five New Year's Day bowls (1989 Orange, 1990 Sugar, 1991 Cotton, 1992 Orange, 1993 Sugar).

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87).

As a player, Orgeron was a four-year starter on the defensive line for Northwestern State, capturing the Demons as a senior in 1983. He received his bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Northwestern State in 1984. In 2007, Orgeron was named to the Northwestern State Top 100 Players which was part of the school's Centennial Football Celebration.

He starred in football, basketball and track at South Lafourche High in Galliano, La. On the big screen, Orgeron played himself in the 2009 Oscar-nominated movie, "The Blind Side."

Born July 27, 1961, he and his wife, Kelly, have three sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody. Tyler is a member of the LSU football coaching staff, while twins Parker and Cody just completed their second season as part of the McNeese State football team. Parker is a starting wide receiver for the Cowboys, while Cody is competing for snaps at quarterback heading into his redshirt sophomore season in 2018.

LSU To Celebrate 125 Seasons of Football In 2018

- ▶ LSU will celebrate its 125th season of football in 2018.
- ▶ Started in 1893, LSU is one of college football's most storied programs, winning three national titles (1958, 2003, and 2007) and claiming 11 SEC championships (1935, 1936, 1958, 1961, 1970, 1986, 1988, 2001, 2003, 2007, and 2011).
- ▶ LSU is the 12th-winningest program in NCAA history by victories with 788 and the Tigers are No. 14 all-time in terms of winning percentage (.650). LSU has an all-record of 788-412-47 in 125 seasons.

LSU In Home Openers

- ▶ LSU has won 13 straight home openers dating back to a 45-3 win over Louisiana-Lafayette in 2006.
- ▶ Last year, LSU opened its home slate with a 45-10 victory over Chattanooga.
- ▶ Overall, LSU is 98-21-4 in home openers, which includes a 70-19-4 mark in Tiger Stadium.
- ▶ LSU's last home opener loss came against Tennessee in 2005 when the Vols beat the Tigers, 30-27, in overtime in what was a Monday night game.
- ▶ LSU hasn't lost a "Saturday Night" home opener since dropping a 18-13 decision to Texas A&M in 1994.

LSU vs. Louisiana Schools

- ▶ The Tigers bring a 134-25-8 mark all-time against teams from Louisiana into the Southeastern Louisiana game.
- ▶ The Tigers have won 29 straight games against in-state opponents.
- ▶ LSU's last loss to an in-state foe came in 1982 when Tulane posted a 31-28 win over LSU in Tiger Stadium.
- ▶ LSU's record against in-state schools include: 69-22-7 vs. Tulane; 22-0 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette; 18-1 vs. Louisiana Tech; 11-0 vs. Northwestern State; 4-1 vs. Loyola (New Orleans); 3-0 vs. Louisiana-Monroe; 3-1-1 vs. Centenary; 2-0 vs. Louisiana College; 1-0 vs. McNeese State; and 1-0 vs. Southeastern Louisiana.

LSU vs. the Southland Conference

- ▶ LSU is 14-0 all-time against current members of the Southland Conference.
- ▶ LSU is 11-0 vs. Northwestern State and 1-0 against McNeese State, Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State.

LSU's Defense Scores In Season-Opener For Second Time In Three Years

- ▶ When Jacob Phillips returned an interception 45 yards for a TD against Miami, it marked the second time in three years the Tigers scored a defensive touchdown in the season-opener.
- ▶ LSU also scored a TD against Wisconsin at Lambeau Field to open the 2016 season when Tre'Davious White returned an interception 31 yards for a score.
- ▶ Dating back to the 1982 season, LSU has had an interception returned for a touchdown 55 times.
- ▶ The LSU defense has had at least one interception returned for a touchdown in 27 of the last 37 seasons.
- ▶ Only 11 of the 55 interceptions returned for a touchdown have been by a linebacker.

Phillips, Tracy Named SEC Players of the Week

- ▶ A pair of first-time LSU starters made a big impact for the Tigers in the season-opening win over No. 8 Miami and as a result, kicker Cole Tracy and linebacker Jacob Phillips were named SEC Players of the Week.
- ▶ Tracy, a graduate transfer playing in his first game as a Tiger, earned SEC Special Teams Player of the Week Honors after going 4-for-4 on field goal attempts in his LSU debut. Among Tracy's field goals included a school-record tying 54-yarder in the third quarter that extended the Tiger lead to 33-3.
- ▶ For the game, Tracy made field goals of 54, 43, 21 and 21 yards as well as three point-after conversions on his way to scoring 15 points, the fourth-highest single-game point total for a kicker in school history.
- ▶ Tracy's 54-yard field goal tied the previous mark set twice – Wade Richey vs. Kentucky in 1996 and Ron Lewis at North Carolina in 1985. Tracy also became the first kicker in school history to kick four field goals in his LSU debut.
- ▶ Phillips, a sophomore linebacker, earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors after recording seven tackles, an interception and a quarterback hurry. Phillips returned his first career interception 45 yards for a TD in the second quarter to put the Tigers up 27-3.
- ▶ In his first career start, Phillips helped pace a Tiger defensive unit that held the Hurricanes to 83 rushing yards and only 342 total yards. LSU also forced a pair of Miami turnovers and held the Hurricanes without a third-down conversion until midway through the third quarter.

Eleven Players Make First Start in 2018

- ▶ Eleven Tigers started for the first time in their careers in the season opener against Miami: RB **Lanard Fournette**, C **Lloyd Cushenberry III**, G **Damien Lewis**, WR **Jonathan Giles**, QB **Joe Burrow**, WR **Justin Jefferson**, WR **Terrace Marshall Jr.**, DE **Breiden Fehoko**, CB **Kristian Fulton**, CB **Terrence Alexander** and LB **Jacob Phillips**.
- ▶ Marshall became just the eighth true freshman to start a season opener since 2000.
- ▶ The following have started a season opener since 2000: Marshall Jr. (WR, 2018), Charles (RG, 2017), Chaisson (LB, 2017), Delpit (S, 2017), Taylor (LB, 2017), Kevin Toliver (CB, 2015), Trey Quinn (WR, 2014), Jalen Mills (CB, 2012) and Jessie Daniels (Nickel, 2003).

Brossette Carries the Load as LSU's Running Back

- ▶ RB Nick Brossette had a career night as LSU's premier running back against Miami with a career-high 22 attempts and 125 yards.
- ▶ Brossette is the fifth-straight 100-yard rusher in a season opener for LSU: Guice (2017), Fournette (2015, 16) and Kenny Hilliard (2014).
- ▶ The Baton Rouge native scored two touchdowns to set a new career high. He became the first LSU running back with two rushing touchdowns since Darrel Williams at Tennessee last year.

Tracy Makes Debut with School Record Kick

- ▶ PK Cole Tracy made his debut against Miami and finished 4-for-4 on field goals and 3-for-3 on extra points.
- ▶ The Assumption College graduate transfer tied the school record with a 54-yard field goal. The field goal tied Wade Richey vs. Kentucky (1996) and Ron Lewis vs. North Carolina (1985) for the longest in school history.
- ▶ Tracy's 54 yarder is tied with Gabriel Rui of Kansas for the longest in 2018.

LSU Returns to Tiger Stadium for Home Opener

- ▶ LSU hosts Southeastern in Tiger Stadium on Saturday night for the 2018 home opener.
- ▶ LSU is 98-21-4 in home openers and 70-19-4 in home openers in Tiger Stadium.
- ▶ Orgeron is 8-3 as the head coach in Tiger Stadium.

LSU vs. The Football Championship Subdivision (FCS)

- ▶ Saturday's game against Southeastern marks the 14th time that LSU will face a team from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).
- ▶ LSU is 13-0 all-time against FCS teams, which a 45-10 win over Chattanooga last season.
- ▶ Other wins over FCS teams include: a 70-14 win over Arkansas State on Oct. 12, 1991; a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season; a 35-10 win over The Citadel on Sept. 7, 2002; a 35-7 victory over Western Illinois, on Sept. 13, 2003; a 24-0 win over Appalachian State on Nov. 5, 2005, a 41-13 victory over Appalachian State to open the 2008 season, a 32-10 victory over McNeese State on Oct. 16, 2010, a 49-3 win over Northwestern State on Sept. 10, 2011, a 38-22 victory over Towson on Sept. 29, 2012, a 48-16 win over Furman on Oct. 26, 2013 a 56-0 victory over Sam Houston State on Sept. 6, 2014, a 34-13 victory over Jacksonville State on Sept. 10, 2016

LSU Goes Into 2018 Riding Streak of 18 Consecutive Years With At Least 8 Wins

- ▶ LSU goes into the 2018 season having won at least 8 games for 18 consecutive years, which ties with Oklahoma for the longest current streak among Power 5 schools.
- ▶ Only Boise State has a longer active streak among FBS teams as the Broncos have won 8 games for 19 consecutive seasons.
- ▶ LSU's current streak of seasons with at least 8 wins dates back to 2000 when the Tigers posted an 8-4 overall mark.
- ▶ LSU's streak of seasons with at least 8 wins also ranks as the longest of its kind in the history of the SEC, bettering Tennessee 16 (1989-2004); Florida 14 (1990-2003); Georgia 13 (1997-2009); and Alabama 13 (1971-83).

LSU Tied NCAA Record (And Set LSU Mark) For Fewest Turnovers In A Season in 2017 With 8

- ▶ With only eight turnovers in 2017 (4 interceptions, 4 fumbles), LSU tied the NCAA mark for fewest turnovers in a season.
- ▶ Only five other teams in NCAA history have gone an entire season with only eight turnovers. Clemson (2 fumbles, 6 interceptions) was the first to do it in 1940, followed by Miami (OH) in 1966 (4 fumbles lost, 4 interceptions); Notre Dame in 2000 (4 fumbles lost, 4 interceptions); Navy in 2015 (6 fumbles lost, 2 interceptions); and Western Michigan in 2016 (4 fumbles lost, 4 interceptions).
- ▶ LSU goes into 2018 having thrown 111 consecutive passes without an interception – a streak that dates back to Danny Etling's last pass of the first quarter against Alabama on November 4, 2017.

LSU Is 71-9 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

- ▶ Dating back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 71-9 against non-SEC foes during that span.
- ▶ Of the nine losses, only three have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field and 2017 vs. Troy).
- ▶ The other six losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame, 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame).

Streak of 100-Yard Rushing Games Extended to 18

- ▶ Dating back to November 2016, LSU has rushed as a team for more than 100 yards in 18-straight games.
- ▶ In that stretch of 18 games, 11 players have rushed for more than 100 yards in a game. Darrel Williams and Derrius Guice each ran for more than 100 yards in a game in 2017 against Ole Miss and Texas A&M.
- ▶ A year ago, LSU rushed for more than 100 yards in every regular season game for just the 14th time since 1949.
- ▶ Only 10 times has an LSU team rushed for 100 or more yards in every game including the bowl game.

Eight Tigers To Play in 2018 As a College Graduate

- ▶ During the 2018 season, eight Tigers are going to take the field as a college graduate, five of which are LSU graduates.
- ▶ LSU list of eight college graduates includes three graduate transfers – CB Terrence Alexander (Stanford), QB Joe Burrow (Ohio State) and PK Cole Tracy (Assumption College).

Louisiana's Foster Moreau Carries on No. 18 Tradition

- Senior tight end Foster Moreau was selected to continue the tradition of the prestigious No. 18 jersey. Moreau was presented with the jersey by coach Ed Orgeron in the first preseason meeting following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s.
- A native of New Orleans, Moreau was the final player to sign in the 2015 recruiting class. He is the second tight end to earn the honor. Richard Dickson wore the number in 2008 and 2009.
- Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007.

Ensminger In Second Stint as LSU's OC

- Steve Ensminger, a former quarterback at LSU, begins his second stint as the offensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2018.
- Ensminger served as LSU's offensive coordinator for eight games in 2016, a span that saw the Tigers thrive under his play-calling.
- Prior to Ensminger taking over play-calling duties in 2016, LSU's offense had scored only nine touchdowns and was averaging 18 points and 339.5 total yards per game. In eight games under Ensminger, LSU improved drastically in every offensive category as the Tigers averaged 32 points and 464.9 total yards per contest during that span. LSU scored 38 or more points five times under Ensminger, including 54 in a win over Texas A&M and 38 against both Arkansas and Ole Miss. The Tigers averaged 7.1 yards per play and converted 46-of-102 third-down opportunities during that eight-game stretch.
- Also under Ensminger, LSU's offense set school records for yards in a SEC game (634 vs. Missouri), single-game rushing yards by an individual (284 by Leonard Fournette vs. Ole Miss, 285 by Derrius Guice vs. Texas A&M), longest run from scrimmage (96 yards by Derrius Guice vs. Arkansas) and time of possession (42:33 vs. Missouri).

Fulton Reinstated for 2018 Season

- ▶ With just 10 days left before the season opener against Miami, head coach Ed Orgeron announced that cornerback Kristian Fulton was reinstated to the team by the NCAA.
- ▶ Fulton's reinstatement came two weeks after the NCAA denied an appeal by Fulton.
- ▶ On August 17, LSU Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva sent the NCAA a four-page letter request reclassification of Fulton's case.
- ▶ Fulton has played in three games with no starts in his two seasons. He was regarded as the No. 1 overall prospect in Louisiana and No. 3 corner in the nation.

White, Williams Tabbed as Preseason All-Americans

- ▶ Junior LB Devin White and sophomore CB Greedy Williams were named first team Associated Press Preseason All-Americans.
- ▶ White and Williams return as the leaders of an LSU defense that ranked among the best in the nation last year, allowing only 18.9 points and 316.2 total yards per game.
- ▶ Last year, White and Williams became the first set of players from the same team to lead the Southeastern Conference tackles and interceptions in the same year since 1993.
- ▶ White paced the league with 10.2 tackles a contest and ranked No. 2 in the conference in total tackles with 133. Williams, as a redshirt freshman, topped the conference in both interceptions (6) and passes defended (13).
- ▶ White earned second team All-America honors in 2017, in what was his first season as a starter, while Williams was a third team All-America selection.

Von Rosenberg One of Nation's Oldest Players

- ▶ At 27 years old, punter Zach Von Rosenberg is the sixth-oldest player in college football in 2018.
- ▶ Von Rosenberg played minor league baseball for six seasons before joining the team in the fall.
- ▶ James Stefanon of Colorado is the oldest player at 31 years old.

This is #NFLSU

- ▶ 2017 marked the fourth-straight year LSU led all of college football with players on opening day NFL rosters at 51.
- ▶ Sixty-five LSU players have been selected in the NFL Draft over the past 10 years, which ranks No. 2 nationally. LSU is one of just three schools in college football to have 60 or more drafted players since the 2009 NFL Draft.
- ▶ Over the last decade, LSU has produced nine first round NFL Draft picks. The Tigers have had at least one player selected in the first round 11 of the past 15 years.

We are DBU:

- ▶ Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL draft with 18, including six in the first round.
- ▶ At least one player has appeared in the Super Bowl for 17 consecutive years, which stands as the longest current streak in the SEC.
- ▶ Overall, 59 former Tigers have appeared on Super Bowl rosters, and LSU has had at least one Super Bowl in 39 of 52 championship games.

LSU Is 73-0 When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards

- ▶ In the last 1658 games, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 123-20 when that happens.
- ▶ Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 74-5.
- ▶ An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 73-0.

LSU Scores Historic GSR Rating

- ▶ The University scored an all-time high of 90 percent in the most recent Graduation Success Rate released by the NCAA.
- ▶ The 90 percent rating was up two points from last year's mark and up a staggering 21 point since vice chancellor and director of athletics Joe Alleva took over at LSU.
- ▶ The football team recorded a program-best 78 percent, which is significantly higher than the national average of 44 percent.

LSU Projected to Welcome Largest and Most Diverse Freshman Class Ever

- ▶ The university is projected to welcome its largest and most diverse freshman class ever. Preliminary numbers show that LSU is expected to welcome at least 5,800 new freshmen to campus this year, which would break the previous record of 5,725 new freshmen enrolled in 2012.
- ▶ Among incoming freshmen, the diversity population is up at 30 percent over last year's freshman class. In addition, the class also comes in with a GPA of 3.64, up from last year's mark at this time of a 3.56.

GAME-BY-GAME HIGHLIGHTS- 2018 SEASON**Week One - vs. #8 Miami (Fla.)**

- ▶ LSU led Miami 27-3 at halftime. The 24-point lead at the half was the largest against a ranked opponent since Sept. 15, 2015 against Auburn when the Tigers held a 24-0 lead against the SEC West foe. It tied the fourth-largest halftime lead against a Top 25 team in program history.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 11-of-24 for 140 yards in his first game as a Tigers. His start marked the first time since 1959 that an LSU quarterback started his first game with the team. His first play from the line of scrimmage was a pass. It was the first time since 1989 that LSU completed a pass on its first offensive play of the season.
- ▶ Senior **Nick Brossette** earned his first 100-yard game, including touchdown runs of 1 and 50 yards. He finished the night with 125 yards on 22 carries.
- ▶ Kicker **Cole Tracy** and linebacker **Jacob Phillips** were named SEC Players of the week. Tracy played in his first game as a Tiger and went 4-for-4 on field goal attempts along with an LSU record-tying 54-yarder. Phillips recorded seven tackles, an interception and a quarterback hurry. The sophomore returned his first career interception 45 yards for a touchdown.
- ▶ The LSU defense held the Hurricanes to only 343 total yards and 83 rushing yards.

On This Day - September 8**September 8, 1990- LSU def. Georgia, 18-13, in Tiger Stadium**

LSU opened the 1990 season with a gritty, 18-13 win against Georgia in front of 76,751 people in Tiger Stadium. On a hot Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, quarterbacks Sol Graves and Chad Loup went 11-for-17 for 155 yards and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Todd Kinchen led the receivers with six grabs for 100 yards and one touchdown. The Tigers rolled up 23 first downs and 337 yards of offense and held the Bulldogs to just 12 first downs and 222 total yards. Linebacker Mike Hewitt led the defensive front, racking up eight tackles, two tackles for a loss of 14 yards and a pass breakup. The Tigers won the time of possession battle and had the ball for 34:02 of the contest and were 9-of-13 on third down conversions.

September 8, 2007- No. 2 LSU def. No. 9 Virginia Tech, 48-7, in Tiger Stadium

The Tigers dominated Virginia Tech, 48-7, in front of a school record 92,739 fans for the 2007 home opener. LSU's offense dismantled the well-reputed Virginia Tech defense, amassing 598 total yards. LSU's defense smothered speedy Virginia Tech offense, limiting the Hokies to a measly 149 total yards. LSU split the yards between rushing and passing almost directly down the middle, gaining 297 yards on 41 carries and 301 yards on a 22-of-32 performance by the quarterback combo of Matt Flynn and Ryan Perrilloux. Flynn finished with 17 completions in 27 tries and a rushing touchdown. Perrilloux completed all five of his pass attempts, two of which were touchdown passes of 34 and 28 yards. Keiland Williams paced the Tiger rushing attack by averaging an eye-popping 18 yards per carry on his way to 127 yards on just seven attempts, two of which were touchdowns. Jacob Hester contributed 81 yards on 12 carries and a touchdown. The game gave the Tigers a 2-0 record to start off the 2007 campaign, which ended with a national title.

September 8, 2012- No. 3 LSU def. Washington, 41-3, in Tiger Stadium

Third-ranked LSU held Washington to 26 yards rushing and shook off a fumble on the opening kickoff to thoroughly dominate the Huskies, 41-3, to improve to 2-0 on the season. The Tigers grabbed the lead early in the first quarter to tie the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision record with 39-straight non-conference wins in the regular season. The win also tied the school record of 19-straight victories in Tiger Stadium. Running back Alfred Blue eclipsed 100 yards for the second-straight game, as the junior led the way for the Tigers with 101 yards on 14 carries and the 21-yard touchdown run that gave LSU the lead. Quarterback Zach Mettenberger was efficient, completing 12-of-18 passes for 195 yards with a 32-yard touchdown pass to Kadron Boone in the third quarter. Wide receiver James Wright had a team high of 75 yards and five catches. Beckham Jr. finished with 40 yards on two catches. The Huskies suffered four sacks for minus-28 yards and netted 26 yards rushing on 24 attempts. LSU outgained Washington, 437-183, including a 242-26 advantage on the ground. The announced crowd of 92,804 was the second-largest against a non-conference opponent in Tiger Stadium history.

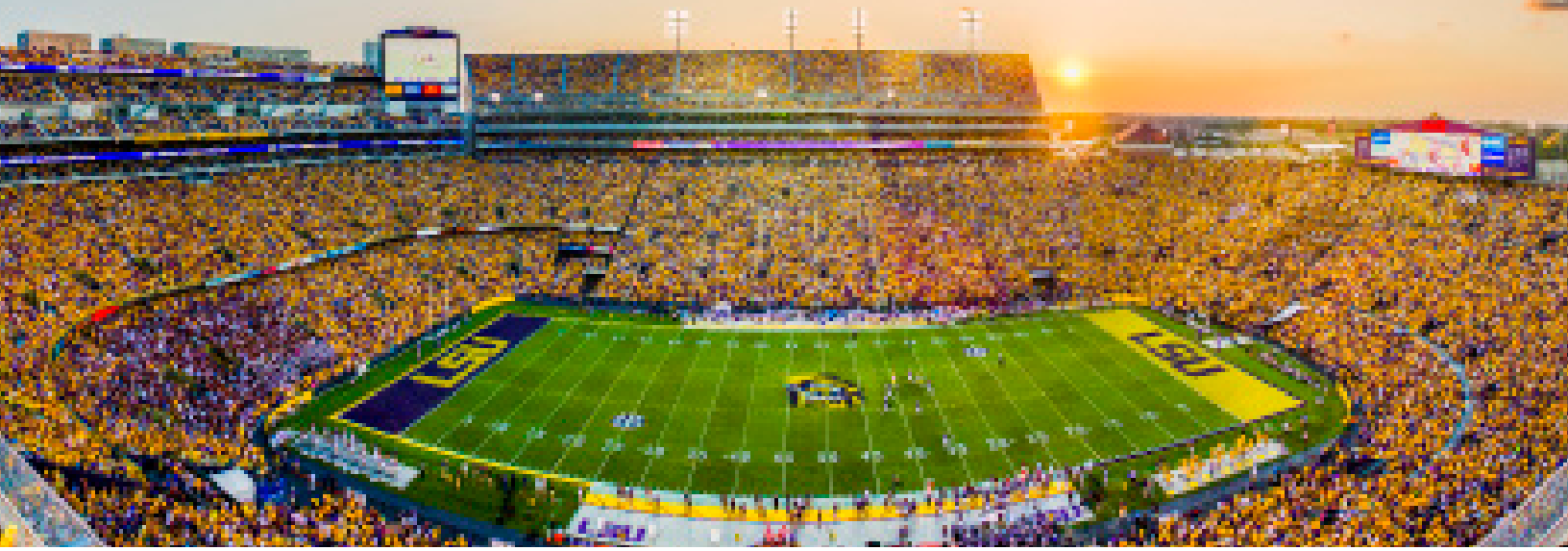

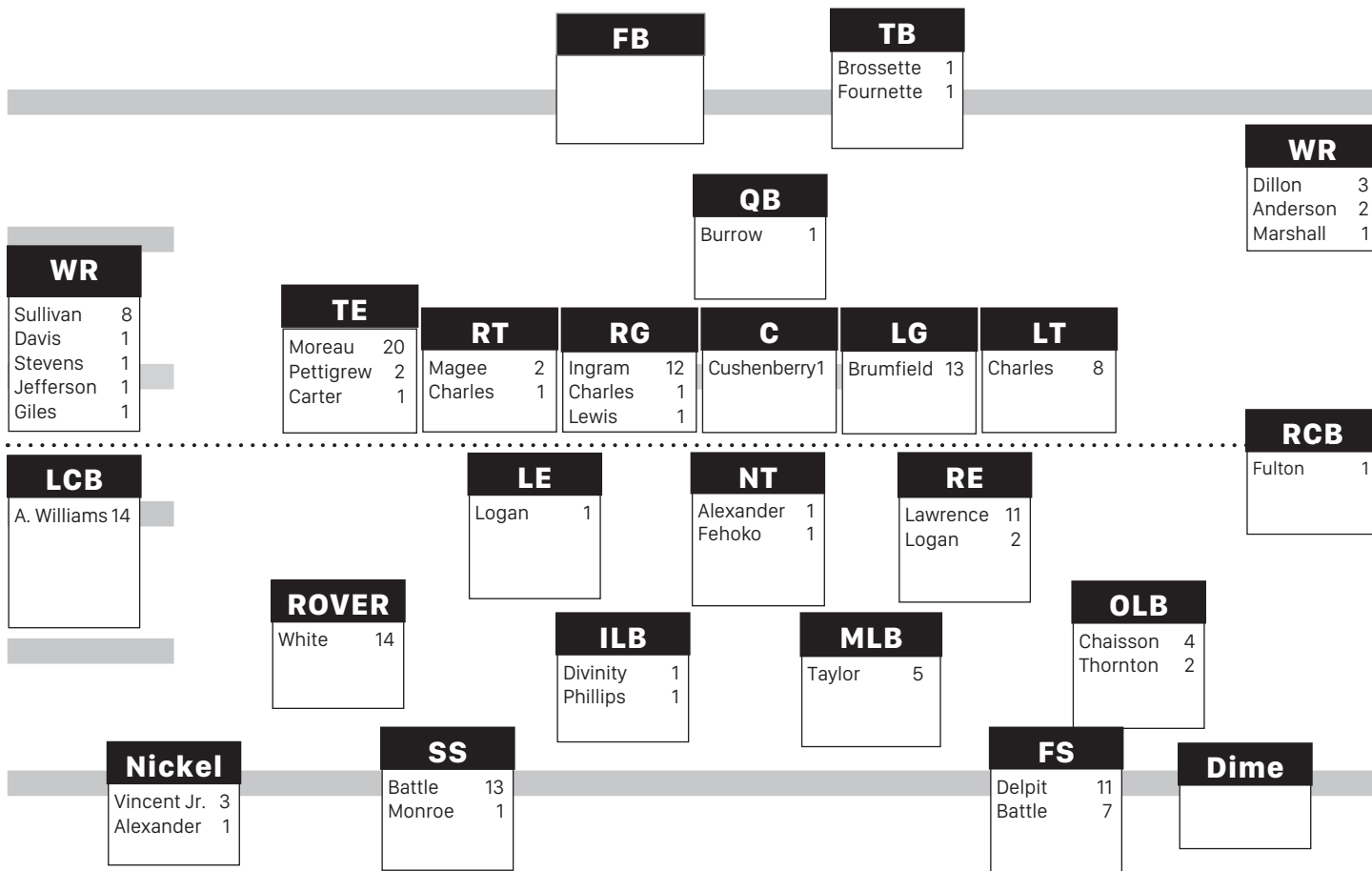

LSU Dominates Early, Storms Past No. 8 Miami, 33-17

No. 25-ranked LSU took a commanding 27-3 halftime lead and cruised to its second Top-10 victory under head coach **Ed Orgeron**, 33-17 over No. 8 Miami on Sunday night in AT&T Stadium. LSU (1-0), playing with 11 first-time starters, held the Hurricanes to 97 yards in the opening 30 minutes and led 33-3 entering the fourth quarter. Just before halftime, LSU sophomore linebacker **Jacob Philips** returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown that put the Tigers in firm command of the contest. The Tigers, who committed a nation-best eight turnovers in 2017, continued to protect the football - and kept Miami's "Turnover Chain" in its case. Senior running back **Nick Brossette** earned his first 100-yard game including touchdown runs of 1 and 50 yards. The Baton Rouge native had 125 yards on 22 carries. Graduate transfer quarterback **Joe Burrow** led the Tigers to six scoring drives without committing a turnover. Burrow finished 11-of-24 passing for 140 yards, while rushing four times for 14 yards. Sophomore **Justin Jefferson** set career-bests with 81 yards on five catches. Another graduate transfer, senior **Cole Tracy**, made all four of his field goal attempts and tied a school record with a 54-yarder that skidded over the crossbar in the third quarter. Tracy also had makes from 43, 21 and 21 yards in his Division I debut. Miami outgained LSU, 342-296. LSU scored 10 points off two Miami interceptions and held the Canes to 83 net rushing yards on 34 attempts. The Tigers recorded four sacks of Miami quarterback **Malik Rosier**. Rosier led the Hurricanes with 259 passing yards but was pressured throughout the contest by the aggressive LSU defense.
