## NEXT UP

- ▶ LSU opens SEC play on Saturday when the No. 12/ No. 13 Tigers travel to Jordan-Hare Stadium to face seventh-ranked Auburn. Kickoff for the early season matchup between Southeastern Conference Western Division rivals is set for 2:30 p.m. on CBS.
- ▶ LSU opens SEC play against Auburn for the 11th time. LSU is 5-5 against Auburn when it serves as the conference opener for the Tigers.
- ▶ LSU enters the contest 2-0 overall following wins over then-No. 8 Miami (33-17) and Southeastern Louisiana (31-0) last Saturday.
- ▶ LSU is 2-0 for the second straight year and for the 12th time in 13 years going back to 2006.
- ▶ **Ed Orgeron**, who took over the Tigers four games into the 2016 season, is 17-6 as LSU's head coach (6-2 in 2016; 9-4 in 2017, 2-0 in 2018). Over his last 31 games as a head coach, Orgeron has produced a 23-8 mark – a stretch the also includes a 6-2 record with Southern Cal in 2013.
- ▶ In 23 games under Orgeron, LSU's has gone without a turnover 12 times. Dating back to last year, LSU has turned the ball over only one time over the past 16 quarters, which includes no turnovers in 2018.

- ▶ LSU is 13-0 under Orgeron when the Tigers feature a 100-yard rusher (6-0 in 2016, 5-0 in 2017, 2-0 in 2018).
- ▶ **Nick Brossette** has gone over the 100-yard rushing mark in LSU's first two games and ranks No. 5 in the SEC with 131.0 yards a contest.
- ▶ All-America LB **Devin White** had his 9th career double-digit tackle game vs. SE Louisiana. He ranks third in the SEC in tackles with 9.5 a contest.
- ▶ LSU PK **Cole Tracy** ranks first among all active collegiate kickers with 73 career field goals. The graduate transfer kicked 68 field goals at DII Assumption College and has 5 so far this year.
- ▶ LSU ranks third in the SEC in rushing defense, allowing only 74.0 yards per game. The Tigers are giving up an SEC-best 1.9 yards per rush.
- ▶ By holding Southeastern Louisiana to 65 rushing yards, LSU has held opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards 12 times (in 27 games) since **Dave Aranda** took over as defensive coordinator in 2016. LSU is 12-0 in those games.
- ▶ Going back to 2001 when LSU's football program won its first SEC Championship since the 1980s, LSU has played 205 of its 223 games ranked in the Top 25, which includes 19 of 23 games under Orgeron. LSU is 12-6 as a Top 25 team under Coach O.

## BY THE NUMBERS

**0**

LSU has yet to turn the ball over in 2018 and the Tigers are one of just six teams nationally without a turnover this year. LSU has played 15 consecutive quarters without a turnover.

**3**

This is only the third time in school history that LSU will face a pair of Top 10 opponents in the first three weeks of the season. LSU opened the year with a 33-17 win over then-No. 8 Miami. LSU played two Top 10 opponents during first three weeks of season in 1995 and 1981.

**6**

Six of LSU's seven touchdowns this year have come from players that had never scored a touchdown for the Tigers. The list includes Nick Brossette, Ja'Marr Chase, Joe Burrow, Clyde Edwards-Helaire, and Jacob Phillips.

# Ed Orgeron

Ed Orgeron grew up a Tiger fan. He developed a passion for the Tigers at an early age, becoming a fan of some of the all-time LSU greats in the 1970s. Players like Bert Jones, Ronnie Estay, Tommy Casanova and Charles Alexander ignited a purple and gold fire under Orgeron that still burns today.

Now in his second full season as head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron has leveraged his passion and love for LSU into a determination and drive that sees him spend nearly every waking moment focused on LSU football and his vision for the program. Winning championships will always be the goal for the program, but it's what Orgeron and his staff are doing to develop and mentor players off the field, in an atmosphere that fosters inclusion and accountability, that will ultimately set Tigers apart.

His quick impact on the LSU program was evident in 2016 when he was elevated from defensive line coach to interim head coach just four games into the season. The results were immediate and impressive, turning a 2-2 team with little confidence following a loss at Auburn, into a squad that played with swagger and energy. Orgeron earned the title of permanent head coach on November 26, 2016, two days after LSU beat Texas A&M, 54-39, to wrap up the regular season with a 7-4 mark, which included a 5-2 mark under Coach O.

With a "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto and high-energy practices that focus on being crisp and efficient, the players have bought into the Orgeron system, both on and off the field and the results are hard to ignore. Orgeron has guided the Tigers to a 15-6 overall mark in his 21 games as the LSU head coach, which includes a 7-3 record against SEC Western Division opponents and six victories against teams ranked in the Top 25. Of LSU's six losses under Orgeron, three have come by six points or less and two others came against the nation's No. 1 ranked team. Furthermore, of Orgeron's 15 LSU wins, 10 have come against SEC foes and 12 have been by double-digits.

In 2017, Orgeron led the Tigers to a 9-4 overall mark, a second straight appearance in the Citrus Bowl and a No. 18 final national ranking. While LSU came up just short in claiming a 10-win season, Orgeron and the Tigers gave plenty of reasons to show that the program is on the rise. A total of 20 true freshmen – the second-highest figure nationally – saw playing time for the Tigers last year and the group of rookies combined for 44 starts.

## The Coach O Way

With the "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto, the Tigers seemingly became a different team overnight under Orgeron and the results that LSU sought soon followed. As the head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron said he was going to "flip the script" and he assigned a theme for the daily practices. The purpose of the descriptive practice themes for each day during the week is one of the ways that Orgeron and his staff hold the players accountable and focused both prior to and during the workout. The daily practice nicknames are as follows: Tell the Truth Monday, Competition Tuesday, Turnover/No Turnover Wednesday, No Repeat Thursday, and Focus Friday.

Orgeron has also opened the doors for former LSU players to come back and be active in the program. Having former players actively involved is a way for the current Tigers to get a better understanding of who helped build the foundation for the program, while also letting them see firsthand what it means to be a LSU Tiger and the responsibility that goes along with it.

## Offseason Moves

Coach O bolstered his staff during the offseason with the promotion of Steve Ensminger to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. It will be Ensminger's second stint as offensive coordinator under Orgeron as he held that spot for eight games during the head coach's transition year in 2016. Under Ensminger, LSU's offense thrived, setting numerous records and proving that he is the right man for the job.

He also added longtime NFL veteran and former LSU assistant Jerry Sullivan to the staff on a fulltime basis as the senior offensive assistant and passing game coordinator. James Cregg, another coach with NFL experience, joined the staff and his impact has already paid off as the offensive line is expected to be one of the strengths for the Tigers this year. Defensively, Bill Busch, who spent three years working alongside Dave Aranda at Wisconsin and Utah State, joined the Tiger staff as safeties coach. Greg McMahon, who won a Super Bowl with the Saints and spent 11 years coaching special teams for the franchise, was elevated from analyst in 2017 to LSU's special teams coordinator in 2018.

## Orgeron Coaching History

Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, is LSU's 33rd head football coach, and the first Louisiana native to serve as head coach of the Tigers since West Monroe native Jerry Stovall held the position for four seasons in the early 1980s.

Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 15-6 at LSU. His career mark as a collegiate head coach is 31-33, however he's 21-8 over his last 29 games. Orgeron went 6-2 as Southern Cal's interim head coach in 2013, taking over a USC team that stumbled to a 3-2 mark over the first five games of the year. Orgeron rallied the Trojans as USC closed out the regular season with wins in six of its final eight games.

In his first game as LSU's permanent head coach, Orgeron guided the Tigers to a 29-9 win over No. 13 Louisville and its Heisman Trophy quarterback Lamar Jackson in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl.

Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 mark over that span.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojans' defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. Orgeron coached under Paul Hackett at USC for three years from 1998 to 2000 and was one of just a handful of coaches retained by Pete Carroll when he took over as the Trojans' head coach in 2001.

He added the title of recruiting coordinator for USC in 2001 and helped the Trojans to top five signing classes for three straight years from 2002-04. Rivals.com and Sporting News named him the 2004 National Recruiter of the Year.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005-07.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988-92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line. During his tenure, the Hurricanes won the national championship twice (1989 and 1991), finished second in the AP poll once (1988) and third twice (1990 and 1992) while appearing in five New Year's Day bowls (1989 Orange, 1990 Sugar, 1991 Cotton, 1992 Orange, 1993 Sugar).

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87).

As a player, Orgeron was a four-year starter on the defensive line for Northwestern State, captaining the Demons as a senior in 1983. He received his bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Northwestern State in 1984. In 2007, Orgeron was named to the Northwestern State Top 100 Players which was part of the school's Centennial Football Celebration.

He starred in football, basketball and track at South Lafourche High in Galliano, La. On the big screen, Orgeron played himself in the 2009 Oscar-nominated movie, "The Blind Side."

Born July 27, 1961, he and his wife, Kelly, have three sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody. Tyler is a member of the LSU football coaching staff, while twins Parker and Cody just completed their second season as part of the McNeese State football team. Parker is a starting wide receiver for the Cowboys, while Cody is competing for snaps at quarterback heading into his redshirt sophomore season in 2018.

LSU To Celebrate 125 Seasons of Football In 2018

- ▶ LSU will celebrate its 125th season of football in 2018.
- ▶ Started in 1893, LSU is one of college football's most storied programs, winning three national titles (1958, 2003, and 2007) and claiming 11 SEC championships (1935, 1936, 1958, 1961, 1970, 1986, 1988, 2001, 2003, 2007, and 2011).
- ▶ LSU is the 12th-winningest program in NCAA history by victories with 788 and the Tigers are No. 14 all-time in terms of winning percentage (.650). LSU has an all-record of 788-412-47 in 125 seasons.
- ▶ To honor the 125 seasons of LSU Football, players will wear a 125 patch on their jerseys and the logo will also be painted on the field for all home games.

Home Team Has Won 16 Of Last 18 Games In Series

- ▶ The home team in the LSU-Auburn series has won 16 of the last 18 meetings dating back to 2000 when Auburn beat LSU 34-17 in Jordan-Hare Stadium. LSU won 27-23 last year in Tiger Stadium.
- ▶ The Auburn win at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2000 started a streak that saw the home team win eight straight games in the series. The streak was snapped in 2008 when LSU rallied for a 26-21 fourth quarter win at Auburn.
- ▶ The home team streak started again in 2009 with LSU winning in Tiger Stadium, followed by an Auburn victory in Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2010 and an LSU win in 2011 in Baton Rouge.
- ▶ Prior to the 2008 game, the last time a road team won in the series came in 1999 when Auburn posted a 41-7 victory over LSU in Tiger Stadium. Ironically, that was the fourth straight game in which the road team had won in the series. LSU beat Auburn at Auburn in 1996 and 1998, and Auburn won in Tiger Stadium in 1997 and 1999.

Expect The Unexpected When LSU and Auburn Get Together

- ▶ Since 1988, the LSU-Auburn series has become one of close calls and one in which the teams and the fans have come to expect the unexpected. The following is a listing of some of the notable happenings in the series since 1988:
- 1988:** LSU's Tommy Hodson hit Eddie Fuller in the back of the endzone on fourth down with 1:41 left to lift the Tigers to a 7-6 win over fourth-ranked Auburn. The noise from the stadium crowd after the play registered on a seismograph across campus prompting the game to be titled "The Earthquake Game."
- 1994:** Auburn intercepted five passes in the fourth quarter, returning three for TDs as the Tigers rally to post a 30-26 win over LSU in a game that become known as "The Interception Game."
- 1995:** LSU donned white jerseys at home for the first time since the early 1980's and promptly went out and upset fifth-ranked Auburn, 12-6. LSU preserved the win with an interception in the endzone on the last play of the game. The contest was dubbed the "Bring Back the Magic" game.
- 1996:** With the old Auburn Sports Arena burning to the ground a couple hundred yards away, LSU beat Auburn, 19-15, in a game titled "The Night the Barn Burned."
- 1997:** Titled "The Comeback," Auburn QB Dameyune Craig engineered a 10-play, 80-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to spark the Tigers to a 31-28 upset of 10th-ranked LSU.
- 2004:** Titled "The Call," Auburn appeared to have missed an extra point with 1:14 left that would have left the game tied at 9-9. However, LSU was called for a penalty on the extra point, thus giving Auburn a second chance at winning the game. The second PAT was good, and Auburn held on for a 10-9 win, snapping LSU's 10-game winning streak.
- 2005:** Auburn missed five field goals, including one in overtime, as LSU held on for a 20-17 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The win helped propel LSU to the SEC Western Division title and the game is now known as the "Field Goal Game."
- 2007:** "Can't See Me" Demetrius Byrd caught a 22-yard TD pass from Matt Flynn with just one second left to send LSU to a 30-24 win over Auburn in Tiger Stadium. The play seemed to have caught Auburn off-guard as the Tigers could have attempted a 39-yard field goal for the win. However, LSU took one final shot at the endzone as Flynn connected with Byrd for the score, who then gave the "Can't See Me" gesture to the LSU student section after coming up with the catch.
- 2008:** Freshman quarterback Jarrett Lee led LSU on a 7-play, 54-yard capped with an 18-yard TD pass to Brandon LaFell as the LSU Tigers rallied for a 26-21 win over Auburn. It marked the second straight year that LSU scored in the closing moments of the game to beat Auburn.
- 2010:** Cam Newton rushed for 217 yards and 2 TDs in fourth-ranked Auburn's 24-17 win over undefeated and sixth-ranked LSU in Jordan-Hare Stadium. As a team, Auburn rushed for 440 yards, the most ever given up by an LSU team.
- 2011:** LSU stepped out of its usual home attire and donned the Nike Pro Combat uniforms and responded with a 45-10 win in Tiger Stadium in what was the most lopsided victory (for either team) in the series.
- 2012:** Trailing 10-9 at the half, No. 2 LSU held off an unranked Auburn team using a third-quarter field goal to prevail 12-10. Drew Alleman's field goal proved to be the only points for either team in the second half. Sam Montgomery had a safety and finished with 3.5 tackles for loss.
- 2016:** Quarterback Danny Etling drove LSU the length of the field and connected with DJ Chark on 15-yard game-winning touchdown drive with no time remaining on the clock. The call was overturned by video review citing no time remaining on the clock and LSU fell to Auburn, 18-13. On the previous play, LSU was flagged for an illegal shift after picking up a first down at the Auburn 2-yard line with 0:01 to play. With the clock starting on the official's whistle, Etling - who rolled out of the pocket and found Chark for a tip-toe grab in the back-right corner of the endzone - was ruled to have received the snap after time had expired.
- 2017:** Trailing 20-0 early in second quarter, LSU rallied for a 27-23 win to mark the largest comeback victory in a SEC game in Tiger Stadium for the Tigers. DJ Chark's 75-yard fourth quarter punt return got LSU to with 23-21 and then Connor Culp provided the go-ahead points on a 42-yard field goal to put the Tigers up 24-23 with 2:36 to go. Culp added a 36-yard field with 38 seconds left for the final margin.

**LSU Managing Turnovers Early in 2018**

- ▶ After two games, LSU owns a +5 turnover margin with two forced fumbles and three interceptions.
- ▶ The Tigers are one of only seven teams in the country without a turnover on offense in 2018 and their margin ranks fifth in the country.
- ▶ A year ago, LSU tied the NCAA mark for fewest turnovers in a season and set the school record with eight.
- ▶ Dating back to November 4, 2017, LSU quarterbacks have thrown 155 consecutive passes without an interception.
- ▶ In its last 10 games, LSU only has three turnovers, which is the fewest in any 10-game span since 1937. It beat the previous best of 5.

**Brossette Carries the Load as LSU's Running Back**

- ▶ RB Nick Brossette has opened the season with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games.
- ▶ With 262 yards after two games, Brossette ranks 14th in the country in rushing yards.
- ▶ Brossette totaled a career-high 137 yards against Southeastern and 125 yards with a pair of touchdowns against Miami.
- ▶ Brossette became the fifth-straight 100-yard rusher in a season opener for LSU: Guice (2017), Fournette (2015, 16) and Kenny Hilliard (2014).
- ▶ The Baton Rouge native scored two touchdowns to set a new career high. He became the first LSU running back with two rushing touchdowns since Darrel Williams at Tennessee last year.

**Tracy Already with Two Kicks of 50+ Yards**

- ▶ PK Cole Tracy made his debut against Miami and finished 4-for-4 on field goals and 3-for-3 on extra points.
- ▶ The Assumption College graduate transfer tied the school record with a 54-yard field goal. The field goal tied Wade Richey vs. Kentucky (1996) and Ron Lewis vs. North Carolina (1985) for the longest in school history.
- ▶ Tracy connected on a 50-yarder against Southeastern to become first LSU player with a field goal of at least 50 yards in Tiger Stadium since 2010.
- ▶ He became the first LSU player to hit two field goals of 50+ yards in the first two games since Colt David in 2008.
- ▶ Tracy leads all active collegiate kickers with 73 career field goals. The graduate transfer kicked 68 field goals at DII Assumption College and has

**White Leads the LSU Defense**

- ▶ Regarded as one of the top linebackers in the country, junior Devin White has continued his top play in 2018.
- ▶ After two games, White owns 19 tackles with a tackle for loss and forced fumble.
- ▶ In the last two seasons, White has totaled nine double-digit tackle games. He added his first of 2018 in week two against Southeastern with 11.

**LSU's Defense Scores In Season-Opener For Second Time In Three Years**

- ▶ When Jacob Phillips returned an interception 45 yards for a TD against Miami, it marked the second time in three years the Tigers scored a defensive touchdown in the season-opener.
- ▶ LSU also scored a TD against Wisconsin at Lambeau Field to open the 2016 season when Tre'Davious White returned an interception 31 yards for a score.
- ▶ Dating back to the 1982 season, LSU has had an interception returned for a touchdown 55 times.
- ▶ The LSU defense has had at least one interception returned for a touchdown in 27 of the last 37 seasons.
- ▶ Only 11 of the 55 interceptions returned for a touchdown have been by a linebacker.

**Phillips, Tracy Named SEC Players of the Week vs. Miami**

- ▶ A pair of first-time LSU starters made a big impact for the Tigers in the season-opening win over No. 8 Miami and as a result, kicker Cole Tracy and linebacker Jacob Phillips were named SEC Players of the Week.
- ▶ Tracy, a graduate transfer playing in his first game as a Tiger, earned SEC Special Teams Player of the Week Honors after going 4-for-4 on field goal attempts in his LSU debut. Among Tracy's field goals included a school-record tying 54-yarder in the third quarter that extended the Tiger lead to 33-3.
- ▶ For the game, Tracy made field goals of 54, 43, 21 and 21 yards as well as three point-after conversions on his way to scoring 15 points, the fourth-highest single-game point total for a kicker in school history.
- ▶ Tracy's 54-yard field goal tied the previous mark set twice – Wade Richey vs. Kentucky in 1996 and Ron Lewis at North Carolina in 1985. Tracy also became the first kicker in school history to kick four field goals in his LSU debut.
- ▶ Phillips, a sophomore linebacker, earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors after recording seven tackles, an interception and a quarterback hurry. Phillips returned his first career interception 45 yards for a TD in the second quarter to put the Tigers up 27-3.
- ▶ In his first career start, Phillips helped pace a Tiger defensive unit that held the Hurricanes to 83 rushing yards and only 342 total yards. LSU also forced a pair of Miami turnovers and held the Hurricanes without a third-down conversion until midway through the third quarter.

**Coach O Tied with Les Miles for Most Top 25 During First 23 Games of LSU Career With 6**

- ▶ Ed Orgeron is tied with Les Miles for most Top 25 wins during the first 23 games of his LSU career with six.
- ▶ Orgeron, who is 17-6 as head coach of the Tigers, had three Top 25 wins in 2016, followed by two last year.
- ▶ Orgeron and the Tigers open 2018 with a 33-17 win over then-No. 8 Miami for his sixth Top 25 victory.

- ▶ The LSU Athletic Hall of Fame Committee also unanimously approved a proposal that a statue honoring Cannon be erect on campus in August 2017.

LSU Goes Into 2018 Riding Streak of 18 Consecutive Years With At Least 8 Wins

- ▶ LSU goes into the 2018 season having won at least 8 games for 18 consecutive years, which ties with Oklahoma for the longest current streak among Power 5 schools.
- ▶ Only Boise State has a longer active streak among FBS teams as the Broncos have won 8 games for 19 consecutive seasons.
- ▶ LSU's current streak of seasons with at least 8 wins dates back to 2000 when the Tigers posted an 8-4 overall mark.
- ▶ LSU's streak of seasons with at least 8 wins also ranks as the longest of its kind in the history of the SEC, bettering Tennessee 16 (1989-2004); Florida 14 (1990-2003); Georgia 13 (1997-2009); and Alabama 13 (1971-83).

LSU Is 72-9 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

- ▶ Dating back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 72-9 against non-SEC foes during that span.
- ▶ Of the nine losses, only three have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field and 2017 vs. Troy).
- ▶ The other six losses came in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame, 2018 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame).

Streak of 100-Yard Rushing Games Extended to 18

- ▶ Dating back to November 2016, LSU has rushed as a team for more than 100 yards in 19-straight games.
- ▶ In that stretch of 19 games, 12 players have rushed for more than 100 yards in a game. Darrel Williams and Derrius Guice each ran for more than 100 yards in a game in 2017 against Ole Miss and Texas A&M.
- ▶ A year ago, LSU rushed for more than 100 yards in every regular season game for just the 14th time since 1949.
- ▶ Only 10 times has an LSU team rushed for 100 or more yards in every game in a season including the bowl game.

Eight Tigers To Play in 2018 As a College Graduate

- ▶ During the 2018 season, eight Tigers are going to take the field as a college graduate, five of which are LSU graduates.
- ▶ LSU list of eight college graduates includes three graduate transfers – CB Terrence Alexander (Stanford), QB Joe Burrow (Ohio State) and PK Cole Tracy (Assumption College).

**Louisiana's Foster Moreau Carries on No. 18 Tradition**

► Senior tight end Foster Moreau was selected to continue the tradition of the prestigious No. 18 jersey. Moreau was presented with the jersey by coach Ed Orgeron in the first preseason meeting following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s.

► A native of New Orleans, Moreau was the final player to sign in the 2015 recruiting class. He is the second tight end to earn the honor. Richard Dickson wore the number in 2008 and 2009.

► Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007.

**Ensminger In Second Stint as LSU's OC**

► Steve Ensminger, a former quarterback at LSU, begins his second stint as the offensive coordinator for the Tigers in 2018.

► Ensminger served as LSU's offensive coordinator for eight games in 2016, a span that saw the Tigers thrive under his play-calling.

► Prior to Ensminger taking over play-calling duties in 2016, LSU's offense had scored only nine touchdowns and was averaging 18 points and 339.5 total yards per game. In eight games under Ensminger, LSU improved drastically in every offensive category as the Tigers averaged 32 points and 464.9 total yards per contest during that span. LSU scored 38 or more points five times under Ensminger, including 54 in a win over Texas A&M and 38 against both Arkansas and Ole Miss. The Tigers averaged 7.1 yards per play and converted 46-of-102 third-down opportunities during that eight-game stretch.

► Also under Ensminger, LSU's offense set school records for yards in a SEC game (634 vs. Missouri), single-game rushing yards by an individual (284 by Leonard Fournette vs. Ole Miss, 285 by Derrius Guice vs. Texas A&M), longest run from scrimmage (96 yards by Derrius Guice vs. Arkansas) and time of possession (42:33 vs. Missouri).

**Fulton Reinstated for 2018 Season**

- ▶ With just 10 days left before the season opener against Miami, head coach Ed Orgeron announced that cornerback Kristian Fulton was reinstated to the team by the NCAA.
- ▶ Fulton's reinstatement came two weeks after the NCAA denied an appeal by Fulton.
- ▶ On August 17, LSU Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Joe Alleva sent the NCAA a four-page letter request reclassification of Fulton's case.
- ▶ Fulton has played in three games with no starts in his two seasons. He was regarded as the No. 1 overall prospect in Louisiana and No. 3 corner in the nation.

**White, Williams Tabbed as Preseason All-Americans**

- ▶ Junior LB Devin White and sophomore CB Greedy Williams were named first team Associated Press Preseason All-Americans.
- ▶ White and Williams return as the leaders of an LSU defense that ranked among the best in the nation last year, allowing only 18.9 points and 316.2 total yards per game.
- ▶ Last year, White and Williams became the first set of players from the same team to lead the Southeastern Conference tackles and interceptions in the same year since 1993.
- ▶ White paced the league with 10.2 tackles a contest and ranked No. 2 in the conference in total tackles with 133.
- ▶ Williams, as a redshirt freshman, topped the conference in both interceptions (6) and passes defended (13).
- ▶ White earned second team All-America honors in 2017, in what was his first season as a starter, while Williams was a third team All-America selection.

**Von Rosenberg One of Nation's Oldest Players**

- ▶ At 27 years old, punter Zach Von Rosenberg is the sixth-oldest player in college football in 2018.
- ▶ Von Rosenberg played minor league baseball for six seasons before joining the team in the fall.
- ▶ James Stefanon of Colorado is the oldest player at 31 years old.

**This is #NFLSU**

- ▶ 2017 marked the fourth-straight year LSU led all of college football with players on opening day NFL rosters at 51.
- ▶ Sixty-five LSU players have been selected in the NFL Draft over the past 10 years, which ranks No. 2 nationally. LSU is one of just three schools in college football to have 60 or more drafted players since the 2009 NFL Draft.
- ▶ Over the last decade, LSU has produced nine first round NFL Draft picks. The Tigers have had at least one player selected in the first round 11 of the past 15 years.

**We are DBU:**

- ▶ Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL draft with 18, including six in the first round.
- ▶ At least one player has appeared in the Super Bowl for 17 consecutive years, which stands as the longest current streak in the SEC.
- ▶ Overall, 59 former Tigers have appeared on Super Bowl rosters, and LSU has had at least one Super Bowl in 39 of 52 championship games.

**LSU Is 75-0 When Rushing For 100 Yards and Holding Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards**

- ▶ In the last 155 games, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 125-20 when that happens.
- ▶ Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 76-5.
- ▶ An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 75-0.

**LSU Scores Historic GSR Rating**

- ▶ The University scored an all-time high of 90 percent in the most recent Graduation Success Rate released by the NCAA.
- ▶ The 90 percent rating was up two points from last year's mark and up a staggering 21 point since vice chancellor and director of athletics Joe Alleva took over at LSU.
- ▶ The football team recorded a program-best 78 percent, which is significantly higher than the national average of 44 percent.

**LSU Projected to Welcome Largest and Most Diverse Freshman Class Ever**

- ▶ The university is projected to welcome its largest and most diverse freshman class ever. Preliminary numbers show that LSU is expected to welcome at least 5,800 new freshmen to campus this year, which would break the previous record of 5,725 new freshmen enrolled in 2012.
- ▶ Among incoming freshmen, the diversity population is up at 30 percent over last year's freshman class. In addition, the class also comes in with a GPA of 3.64, up from last year's mark at this time of a 3.56.

**GAME-BY-GAME HIGHLIGHTS- 2018 SEASON**

**Week One - vs. #8 Miami (Fla.)**

- ▶ LSU led Miami 27-3 at halftime. The 24-point lead at the half was the largest against a ranked opponent since Sept. 15, 2015 against Auburn when the Tigers held a 24-0 lead against the SEC West foe. It tied the fourth-largest halftime lead against a Top 25 team in program history.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 11-of-24 for 140 yards in his first game as a Tigers. His start marked the first time since 1959 that an LSU quarterback started his first game with the team. His first play from the line of scrimmage was a pass. It was the first time since 1989 that LSU completed a pass on its first offensive play of the season.
- ▶ Senior **Nick Brossette** earned his first 100-yard game, including touchdown runs of 1 and 50 yards. He finished the night with 125 yards on 22 carries.
- ▶ Kicker **Cole Tracy** and linebacker **Jacob Phillips** were named SEC Players of the week. Tracy played in his first game as a Tiger and went 4-for-4 on field goal attempts along with an LSU record-tying 54-yarder. Phillips recorded seven tackles, an interception and a quarterback hurry. The sophomore returned his first career interception 45 yards for a touchdown.
- ▶ The LSU defense held the Hurricanes to only 343 total yards and 83 rushing yards.

**Week Two - vs. Southeastern Louisiana**

- ▶ The LSU defense pitched a shutout Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, 31-01, as the 11th-ranked Tigers forced three turnovers and held Southeastern Louisiana to 65 rushing yards.
- ▶ Kicker **Cole Tracy** continued his perfect start in 2018, making his only field goal from 50 yards. He became the first LSU kicker since 2008 to record 50-yard kicks in consecutive contests. He has made all five of his field goals and all seven PATs. The field goal was also the first 50-plus yard field goal by LSU in Tiger Stadium since Nov. 13, 2010.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 10-for-20 with 151 yards passing and two touchdowns. With the clock at 0:00 in the second quarter, Burrow threw a desperation pass into the end zone when a leaping **Stephen Sullivan** brought down the 40-yard pass to give LSU the 24-0 lead at the half. It was the first passing touchdown on the final play of a half since the Bluegrass Miracle in 2002 and the first in Tiger Stadium since 1989.
- ▶ The shutout was preserved with a **Greedy Williams** interception with 11:54 left in the first quarter. It was the seventh interception of Williams' career and the first of the season. It remained in tact again when Southeastern had a bad snap, and **JaCoby Stevens** recovered the ball at the SLU 18-yard line and ran it back 64 yards, which resulted in a touchdown four plays later by **Clyde Edwards-Helaire**, the first rushing touchdown of his career. The shutout was the first by LSU in Tiger Stadium since Sept. 13, 2014, when LSU blanked UL-Monroe 31-0.
- ▶ Linebacker **Devin White** led the LSU defense for the second consecutive game, recording 11 tackles, one tackle for loss and one forced fumble. His forced fumble was with 8:45 left in the first quarter, and it was recovered by Andre Anthony. Following the fumble recovery, the Burrow connected with **Ja'Marr Chase** to culminate the 34-yard drive and gave the Tigers the early 7-0 lead. The touchdown was the first touchdown for both the quarterback and the wide receiver.

**On This Day - September 15**

**September 15, 1973- No.15 LSU def. No. 10 Colorado, 17-6, in Tiger Stadium**

A Tiger Stadium record crowd of 71,238 watched the opener of the 1973 season as the Fighting Tigers dominated play and defeated favored Colorado, 17-6, to avenge a 31-21 loss two years prior and start a four-game win streak against The Buffs. The Bayou Bengals had the upper hand throughout the first half even through they went into halftime in a scoreless game. On its first possession of the third quarter, LSU started at its own 43. With Mike Miley at the controls it only took six plays to get into scoring territory with Miley throwing the final 30 yards to Ben Jones, who was wide open to give LSU the 7-0 lead. The next time the Tigers had the ball, they moved from their own 49 to the CU 9 where Rusty Jackson booted a 25-yard field goal. A fake punt enabled Colorado to set up its only score of the night, but a failed two point conversion left the score at 10-6. Gary Champagne ended the scoring with 1:46 left in the game when he intercepted the ball and hauled it in 25 yards to bring the final score to 17-6 in Tiger Stadium. The LSU defense held Colorado to 28 passing yards in comparison to its 161 yards in the air in the top-25 match up.

**September 15, 2007- No. 2 LSU def. Middle Tennessee, 44-0**

LSU outmatched Middle Tennessee without starting quarterback Matt Flynn and wide receiver Early Doucet. The LSU offense amassed 505 yards and was led by Ryan Perrilloux who spread the ball to 10 receivers on his was for a 20-for-25 night with 298 yards, three touchdowns and the first interception of the season by the Tigers. Jared Mitchell led all receivers with six grabs for 82 yards. The Tiger defense limited Middle Tennessee to just 90 yards of total offense with almost half of those coming in the fourth quarter against second and third string players. LSU's rushing attack was spread evenly with eight ball carriers combining for 198 yards while the Tiger defense held Middle Tennessee to a jaw-dropping nine rushing yards. The win set up an undefeated Southeastern Conference tussle between LSU and South Carolina, who were both 3-0 entering the contest.

**September 15, 2011- No. 3 LSU def. Mississippi State, 19-6, at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field**

LSU's suffocating defense allowed only 193 yards and had 15 tackles for loss, while Drew Alleman kicked four field goals to give the No. 3-ranked Tigers a 19-6 victory over Mississippi State on Thursday night. LSU (3-0, 1-0 SEC) beat Mississippi State (1-2, 0-2 SEC) for the 12th-straight time, and the Tigers out-gained Mississippi State 361-193, including a 148-52 advantage on the ground. Starting quarterback Jarrett Lee was nearly flawless, completing 21-of-27 passes for 213 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown to wide receiver Rueben Randle with 12 minutes left in the game. LSU running back Spencer Ware carried the load offensively, gaining 107 yards on 22 carries. Randle led the Tigers receiving corps with 98 yards on six catches. Freshman wide receiver Odell Beckham Jr. had a game-high eight catches for 61 yards. The Tigers defense was stellar and dominant. Before the game's final drive when the game was in hand, LSU did not allow a single yard in the fourth quarter. Morris Claiborne had two interceptions, while fellow corner Tyrann Mathieu led the team with 10 tackles. LSU had 16 tackles behind the line of scrimmage for minus-65 yards including six sacks for 37 yards. Defensive tackles Bennie Logan and Michael Brockers combined for six tackles for loss, tackle Anthony Johnson had two, while end Kendrick Adams and linebacker Ryan Baker added 1.5 each. Adams also had a fumble recovery.

## COMEBACK FOR THE AGES! LSU Beats No. 10 Auburn, 27-23

LSU overcame its largest home deficit against an SEC opponent in history, rallying from a 20-0 hole with 20 unanswered points in the final 15:32 to knock off No. 10-ranked Auburn, 27-23, on a scorching Saturday afternoon in Tiger Stadium. Connor Culp made a 42-yard field goal with 2:36 remaining in the game that gave the Tigers a 24-23 advantage and completed the comeback. Culp added another 36-yarder with 0:38 left to play that forced Auburn to play for a touchdown on its final desperate drive. Arden Key finished off the LSU defense's spectacular second-half performance with a sack on fourth down with 0:02 to play. Auburn extended its lead to 20-0 with 12:50 remaining in the second quarter, when Carlson hit a 48-yard field goal attempt. LSU responded by driving 90 yards on six plays, reducing the margin to 20-7 with 9:19 left in the first half when Stephen Sullivan scored from one yard out on a fourth-and-goal jet sweep. The march was highlighted by a 70-yard run by Russell Gage to Auburn's seven-yard line. After an exchange of punts, Auburn moved 62 yards on 10 plays, taking a 23-7 lead with 2:16 left in the first half on Carlson's 26-yard field goal. The Tigers' defense was brilliant in the third quarter, limiting Auburn to 21 total yards in the period. On the second play of the fourth quarter, Chark dashed 75 yards to paydirt on a punt return to bring the Tigers within two points at 23-21 with 14:33 to play. LSU's defense dominated the rest of the fourth quarter, holding Auburn to 1-of-9 passing for 0 yards and only 37 rushing yards on 10 carries. With 6:40 remaining, LSU took over at the Auburn 45 when the Tiger defense held Auburn without a first down inside its own 5-yard line. A 5-yard catch for a first down by Guice and 7-yard run by the back set up Culp's eventual game-winner from 42-yards. LSU led 24-23 with 2:36 to play. Auburn turned the ball over on downs with 1:38 remaining. Danny Etling guided the home standing Tigers to victory by completing 13-of-24 passes for 206 yards with a touchdown. His favorite target was DJ Chark, who set career highs with five catches and 150 receiving yards. Chark's 75-yard punt return for a touchdown with 14:43 to play sparked LSU's 13-point fourth quarter, as the speedy receiver amassed 233 all-purpose yards. Wide receiver Gage added three catches for 28 yards with a touchdown just before halftime that pulled LSU within nine of Auburn, 23-14. Auburn quarterback Jarrett Stidham was harassed for three sacks and three hurries by the LSU defense. Auburn had only 64 yards of total offense in the second half, as LSU out gained the visiting Tigers 363-354. LSU held Auburn to 3-of-14 on third downs and 0-of-2 on fourth down. Devin White had a career-best 15 tackles, his fifth-straight game with double-digit tackles. Attendance was announced as 101,601 on the hottest October kickoff on record in Tiger Stadium (90 degrees).

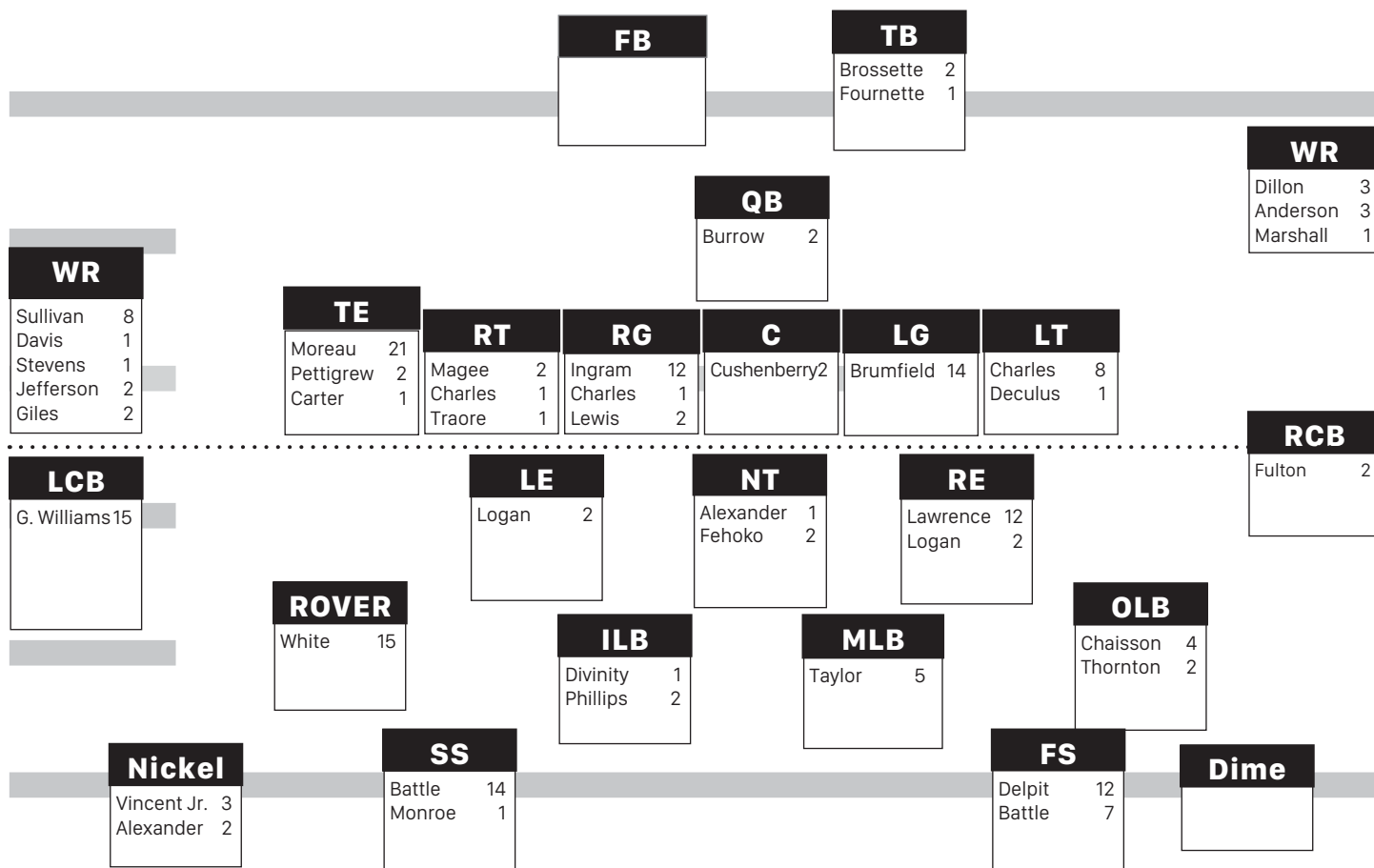

## LSU Dominates Early, Storms Past No. 8 Miami, 33-17

No. 25-ranked LSU took a commanding 27-3 halftime lead and cruised to its second Top-10 victory under head coach **Ed Orgeron**, 33-17 over No. 8 Miami on Sunday night in AT&T Stadium. LSU (1-0), playing with 11 first-time starters, held the Hurricanes to 97 yards in the opening 30 minutes and led 33-3 entering the fourth quarter. Just before halftime, LSU sophomore linebacker **Jacob Philips** returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown that put the Tigers in firm command of the contest. The Tigers, who committed a nation-best eight turnovers in 2017, continued to protect the football - and kept Miami's "Turnover Chain" in its case. Senior running back **Nick Brossette** earned his first 100-yard game including touchdown runs of 1 and 50 yards. The Baton Rouge native had 125 yards on 22 carries. Graduate transfer quarterback **Joe Burrow** led the Tigers to six scoring drives without committing a turnover. Burrow finished 11-of-24 passing for 140 yards, while rushing four times for 14 yards. Sophomore **Justin Jefferson** set career-bests with 81 yards on five catches. Another graduate transfer, senior **Cole Tracy**, made all four of his field goal attempts and tied a school record with a 54-yarder that skidded over the crossbar in the third quarter. Tracy also had makes from 43, 21 and 21 yards in his Division I debut. Miami outgained LSU, 342-296. LSU scored 10 points off two Miami interceptions and held the Canes to 83 net rushing yards on 34 attempts. The Tigers recorded four sacks of Miami quarterback **Malik Rosier**. Rosier led the Hurricanes with 259 passing yards but was pressured throughout the contest by the aggressive LSU defense.

## No. 11 LSU Posts Shutout in Home Opener, 31-0

The LSU defense pitched a shutout Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, 31-0, as the 11th-ranked Tigers forced three turnovers and held Southeastern Louisiana to 65 rushing yards. LSU was led by running back **Nick Brossette**, who had 137 of LSU's 184 net rushing yards on 19 carries. Quarterback **Joe Burrow** completed 10-of-20 passes for 151 yards with two touchdowns. Burrow also ran for a touchdown, as did running back **Clyde Edwards-Helaire**. LSU placekicker **Cole Tracy** continued his perfect start in 2018, as the senior transfer made his only attempt from 50 yards. Linebacker **Devin White** recorded his ninth double-digit tackles game with a team-high 11, while true freshman **Micah Baskerville** made his debut and added six tackles in relief of **Jacob Phillips**. Phillips was ejected for targeting late in the first half. Nose tackle **Breiden Fehoko** was dominant up front, collecting six tackles including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage. **Neil Farrell Jr.** came off the edge to make six tackles including 1.5 sacks. LSU had 10 tackles for loss in the game. **Greedy Williams** picked up his first interception of the season and added three tackles. LSU grabbed a 7-0 lead with 7:15 remaining in the first quarter when quarterback Joe Burrow connected with freshman wide receiver **Ja'Marr Chase** on a nine-yard touchdown pass. The aerial was the first TD throw of Burrow's LSU career and the first scoring reception of Chase's collegiate career. After a three-and-out by the Southeastern offense, LSU drove 46 yards in seven plays with the march ending on Burrow's one-yard TD run, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead at the 3:20 mark of the first quarter. LSU increased its advantage to 17-0 with 11:21 remaining in the first half when placekicker Cole Tracy nailed a 50-yard field goal, his second 50+ yard three-pointer of the season. Tracy became the first LSU kicker since Colt David in 2008 to make 50+ yard field goals in consecutive games. Burrow hit wide receiver **Stephen Sullivan** on a 40-yard Hail Mary touchdown pass on the final play of the first half to give LSU a 24-0 lead at intermission. The play culminated a 96-yard, seven-play march and marked the second career TD reception for Sullivan. SLU mounted a scoring threat early in the fourth quarter, advancing to the LSU 21-yard line, but cornerback Greedy Williams picked off a Chason Virgil pass at the Tigers' 6-yard line to stymie the drive. Taking over at their 49, the Lions took advantage of the short field and marched to the LSU 3-yard line. However, a bad pass from center on third-and-goal was recovered by LSU's **JaCoby Stevens** at the SLU 18 and returned to the LSU 18. The last of four-consecutive rushes by Edwards-Helaire resulted in a 7-yard touchdown and gave LSU a 31-0 lead with 2:03 to play.
